SAN JOSÉ STATE UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL FACT SHEET (GAME #8 - New Mexico)

Upcoming game: San José State vs. New Mexico

Saturday, October 24, 2015,

Spartan Stadium, San José, Calif., 4:00 p.m. (PT)

San José State record: 3-4, 2-2 Mountain West. Most recently, the Spartans lost to San Diego State, 30-7, on October 17.

New Mexico record: 4-3, 2-1 Mountain West. The Lobos have three wins in their last four games after defeating Hawai'i, 28-27, on October 17.

San José State head coach Ron Caragher: In his third season as the San José State head coach. Has a record of 12-19 with the Spartans. Overall, he is in his ninth season as a major college head coach with a 56-41 record. Caragher's first six seasons as a head coach were at the University of San Diego. He is 0-0 as a head coach against New Mexico.

New Mexico head coach Bob Davie: In his fourth season at New Mexico. Has a coaching record of 15-29 with the Lobos. Overall, Davie is in his ninth season as a major college head coach and has a record of 50-54. He is 0-0 as a head coach against San José State.

Series history: The Spartans lead the series, 11-4-1. These teams are meeting for the first time since San Jose State defeated New Mexico, 20-12, in the inaugural New Mexico Bowl on December 23, 2006. The Spartans carry a two-game winning streak in the series and are winners of six of the last seven games between these teams. The Lobos last win in the series was a 36-30 victory in Albuquerque on October 9, 1976.

Two Spartan greats led the Lobos: Dud DeGroot, the most successful head coach in San Jose State football history, and **Bob Titchenal**, captain of the 1939 undefeated Spartan team, would eventually become the football head coach at the University of New Mexico.

DeGroot compiled a 60-19-8 record during the 1932 through 1939 seasons. In his first season at San Jose State, the Spartans were undefeated for the first time with a 7-0-2 record. In his final season, San Jose State was 13-0 scoring 322 points while yielding just 29. His Spartans had eight shutouts that season.

DeGroot was New Mexico's head coach from 1950 through 1952. His teams compiled a 13-15 win-loss record topped by the 1952 team that posted a 7-2 overall mark. The 1952 Lobos had five shutouts and gave up just 46 points.

Titchenal was an All-American center at San Jose State and would go on to play in the NFL for Washington (1940-42) and for San Francisco (1946) and Los Angeles (1947) in the All-American Football Conference. He was New Mexico's head coach from 1953 through 1955. The Lobos were 12-15-1 in those three seasons including losses to San Jose State in 1954 (26-14) and 1955 (14-0).

Titchenal was San Jose State's head coach from 1957 through 1964. The Spartans had a combined 33-45-1 win-loss record in those seasons and lost to the Lobos in 1962 (25-13). The best-known player he coached was quarterback **Dick Vermeil** who would go on to lead the St. Louis Rams to the Super Bowl XXXIV championship.

.500 is the target again: For the third time this season, San José State can return to the .500 plateau for the season with a victory. The Spartans did it twice so far with wins over Fresno State (49-23) on September 26 and at UNLV (33-27, OT) on October 10.

Play-by-Play Radio Coverage: KLIV (1590 AM, San José) originates San José State football broadcasts. Justin Allegri calls the play-by-play. Kevin Richardson offered commentary. Air time for the KLIV broadcast is 7:00 p.m. (PT).

Ron Caragher on KRTY FM:

San José State head coach Ron Caragher is heard weekly on KRTY (95.3, San José), Tuesdays at 6:30 a.m. (PT). Gary Scott Thomas and Julie Stevens serve as hosts. **Opportunity to exceed 2014 win total:** A San José State win over New Mexico would give the Spartans their fourth win of the season, one more than in 2013 when the team finished with a 3-9 overall record.

Three consecutive home games: The New Mexico game on October 24 is the second of three consecutive San José State home games over a four-week span. The Spartan hosted San Diego State in a Mountain West contest on October 17 and has BYU in a non-conference encounter on Friday, November 6.

The last time San José State played three consecutive home games was in the 2007 season when the Spartans posted a non-conference win over UC Davis, beat Idaho and lost an overtime game to #16-Hawai'i.

Seeking an offensive rebound: San José State looks to bounce back on the scoreboard against New Mexico State after being limited to season lows of one touchdown, seven points and 148 yards of total offense in the October 17 loss to San Diego State. The last time a Spartan team was limited to less than 200 yards of total offense was a November 20, 2010 loss at Hawai'i. That night San José State was limited to 164 yards of total offense.

Interceptions factor into equation: In each of San José State's four losses, the Spartans were on the short end of two intercepted passes per game. In San José State's three wins, the Spartans were intercepted just once. San José State enters the New Mexico game with a minus-7 turnover ratio.

Red Zone offense still producing TDs: San José State raised its rate of touchdowns when in the "red zone" to 79.2 percent with its one touchdown in the San Diego State game. Only North Carolina State and Georgia Tech have a higher rate of scoring touchdowns once in the "red zone."

The Spartans rank tied with Nevada for 18th nationally in red zone offense with their .917 conversion rate (22-of-24) scoring either a touchdown or a field goal.

Punting stays up: San José State enters the New Mexico game second nationally in net punting with a 44.96 yard figure. The Spartans are second for the third week in a row. Punter **Michael Carrizosa** continues is the individual national leader among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players with a 50.2 per punt average.

Last two road wins came in overtime: San José State ended a seven-game road losing streak dating back to the 2014 season with its 33-27 overtime win at UNLV on October 10. Prior to defeating UNLV, the Spartans previous road win was a 27-20 overtime victory at Wyoming on October 18, 2014.

San José State overtime trivia: San José State now has a 3-5 record in overtime games after outlasting UNLV, 33-27, on October 10. Two of the Spartans' three overtime wins are against UNLV. The most recent overtime game is the first time San José State won an overtime game by being on offense second. All three Spartan overtime wins were done in the first overtime.

Outstanding 2015 for Tyler Ervin: Tyler Ervin ranks among the most productive Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players this season.

After seven games, he is eighth nationally in rushing yards (896) and 12th in rushing yards per game (128.0). He is tied for fifth in total touchdowns scored (13) and is tied for sixth in rushing touchdowns (11).

Ervin is tied for seventh in scoring at 11.1 points per game. He scored at least one touchdown in each of the team's first six games this season.

Best & most by Ervin in 2015: Tyler Ervin has the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) individual best single-game mark for most rushing yards in 2015 games played through October 17. Ervin gained 300 yards on 42 carries and accounted for 345 all-purpose yards in the September 26 Fresno State win.

His number of carries were surpassed by Iowa's Jordan Canzeri who had 43 rushes for 256 yards and a touchdown against Illinois on October 10.

Ervin's career-high in all-purpose yardage now is second to Stanford's Christian McCaffrey who accounted for 369 yards against UCLA on October 15.

Tyler Ervin establishes school rushing mark: Tyler Ervin set a San José State single-game rushing record with 300 yards gained on 42 carries in the win over Fresno State (9/26). Ervin's total broke the previous record of 286 set by Nathan DuPree in an October 31, 1992 game at UNLV.

His 42 carries were a personal single game high. He previous high of 22 carries was in the 2014 Utah State game.

With four pass receptions for 45 yards, Ervin accumulated 345 yards in all-purpose running against Fresno State. His all-purpose yardage total was more than Fresno State's 247 yards of total offense.

Closing in on 1,000 rushing yards: Tyler Ervin's 896 rushing yards after seven games leave him 104 shy of becoming the 11th San José State player to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. Of the 10 previous Spartans to gain 1,000 yards in a season, **Deonce Whitaker** (1,577 in 2000) and **Johnny Johnson, Jr.** (1,219 in 1988) did it in their ninth game.

Most rushing touchdowns in a season in three seasons: After seven games, San José State has 16 rushing touchdowns. This year's Spartans already surpassed the team's 11 rushing touchdowns in 2014 and 12 by San José State in 2013.

In 2012, San José State rushed for 17 touchdowns in 13 games. The last time a Spartan team scored 20 or more touchdowns in a season by running the ball was in 2004 with 22 rushing touchdowns.

Team passing completion percentage: San José State enters the New Mexico game with a team passing completion percentage of 66.8 percent - tops in the Mountain West.

In the New Hampshire (9/3) and Fresno State (9/26) wins, the Spartans completed 85.7 percent and 86.9 percent of their passes, respectively, and did not throw an interception in either game.

Season-high pass interceptions: For the first time this season, the San José State defense came up with two pass interceptions in a game in the UNLV triumph (10/10). **Maurice McKnight**, with his first of the season, and **Jimmy Pruitt**, with a team-high third of the year, had the interceptions.

The last time San José State did not win a game in which it had two or more interceptions was an October 8, 2011 loss at BYU. That night, the Spartans came up with two interceptions.

Pass defense keeps high ranking: The Spartans enter the week of October 19, the national leader in fewest passing yards allowed per game (121.0) and 17th in passing efficiency defense (98.2 rating). Opponents are completing 51.4 percent of their passes against San José State - the second best mark among Mountain West teams.

Wallace, III, was a 2014 second-team All-Mountain West selection and Pruitt received honorable mention accolades. Wallace had his first interception of the season in the Oregon State game. Pruitt has interceptions at Air Force, against Fresno State and

30-plus first downs twice in 2015: In San José State's two wins this season, the Spartans had 34 first downs against New Hampshire and 33 first downs against Fresno State. In the team's two losses at Air Force and at Oregon State, San José State had just 27 first downs combined.

Recognized through the years as more of a pass-oriented team, the 2015 Spartans have more first downs rushing (58) than passing (54).

UNLV, BYU and Georgia State play road games in the four continental U.S. time zones. Fresno State, San Diego State and Louisiana Monroe have road contests in four different time zones with a road game at Hawai'i.

Ten first-time starters: Center Keoni Taylor, Chris Gonzalez at right guard, defensive end Nick Oreglia, defensive tackle Loni Fa, linebacker Frank Ginda and defensive back Andre Chachere made their first Spartan start in the September 3 game vs. New Hampshire. Quarterback Kenny Potter and linebacker Epie Sona made their first major college starts in the Mountain West opener at Air Force on September 12. Wide receiver Justin Holmes started for the first time against Fresno State on September 26. Tight end Josh Oliver made his first major college start in the San Diego State contest.

Sharing the load: Of the 23 times San José State passed for at least 400 yards in a game, the 422 yards in the New Hampshire win marked the first time two quarterbacks each accounted for at least one-third of the passing yardage output. Starter **Joe Gray** passed for 253 yards (59.9 percent); **Kenny Potter**, 167 yards (39.6 percent); and **Malik Watson**, 2 yards (0.5 percent), against New Hampshire.

Offensive outburst at start of the season: San José State was credited with 707 yards of total offense in its win over New Hampshire. The total is the fifth best single-game figure in school history, the sixth time the Spartans gained at least 700 yards in a game and ranks 13th among 2015 single-game performances through October 10.

Less than 200 yards allowed: The Spartan defense had a solid night in its opener forcing New Hampshire to give up the football on six possessions without gaining a first down and yielding just 186 yards of total offense.

Season captains named: Running back **Tyler Ervin,** cornerback **Jimmy Pruitt,** offensive tackle **Wes Schweitzer** and linebacker **Christian Tago** were named team captains for the 2015 season. Tago is the only non-senior among the four.

Seven get the scholarship word: During preseason camp, head coach Ron Caragher announced seven players would be placed on scholarship. Cornerback Dominic Barnes, running back Chris Dadson and wide receiver/holder Chris Kearney received the news early in the month. Defensive ends Mikal Berry and Nick Oreglia, quarterback Mitch Ravizza and offensive lineman Michael Talafus were informed following the August 15 practice. Of the seven, Kearney is the only senior and Berry is the one sophomore.

Dual-sport Spartans: Since the end of the 2014 football season, wide receiver **Tyler Winston** and quarterback **Mitch Ravizza** played a second NCAA Division I sport. Winston played 21 minutes and scored 4 points as a reserve guard in the San José State men's basketball game against Seattle University (12/13/14). Ravizza completed his third season as a utility player/pinch runner on the Spartan baseball team.

New assistant coaches: Offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Al Borges**, special teams coordinator/tight ends coach **Dan Ferrigno** and offensive line coach **Adam Stenavich** are in their first season as San José State assistant football coaches. Combined, the new Spartan assistants have 63 seasons (Ferrigno, 34; Borges, 28; Stenavich, 1) of major college coaching experience.
