

NEW MEXICO 86 SAN JOSE STATE 59

Matchup Notes:

- Starting Lineup: Zane Martin, Tavian Percy, Vante Hendrix, Makuach Maluach, Corey Manigault
 - Makuach Maluach started his 44th consecutive game on Tuesday.
- Lobos now lead the series 15-3 overall with a 9-1 advantage in The Pit.
- Attendance: 10,016

Post-game Notes:

- Four Lobos finished in double figures including: senior Corey Manigault (21), redshirt-junior Zane Martin (20), junior Makuach Maluach (15), redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix (10).
 - Four or more Lobos have scored in double figures in 15 of the 21 games played this season.
- The Lobos improved to 13-0 at home marking the longest home win streak since the 1998-99 season in which the Lobos went 16-0 at home before falling to Utah.
- The Lobos' 86-59 win over the Spartans ties their largest margin of victory this season (27 points).
 - The Lobos set this margin of victory against CSUN on November 9, 2019 defeating the Matadors 97-70.
- The Lobos' defense held the Spartans' offense to just 59 points marking the second-fewest points allowed by the defense all season behind the 59-50 win over Wisconsin on November 26, 2019.
 - New Mexico is now 7-1 when holding their opponents between 50-69 points including a 3-0 mark in conference play.
 - The Spartans were averaging 69.3 points per game coming into the contest.
- Makuach Maluach registered his first double-double on the season scoring 15 points, grabbing 13 boards.
 - So far this season, Maluach has secured as many as eight rebounds, most recently against Air Force on January 11, 2020.
- Zane Martin finished with a season-high 20 points topping his previous best of 19 against Houston Baptist on December 22, 2019.
- Vante Hendrix finished with a season-high five assists, surpassing his previous high of two which he tallied most recently against UNLV on January 18, 2020.
- The Lobos' defense held San José State's leading scorer Seneca Knight to 11 points on the night, nearly eight points below his conference average of 18.6 points.
