## A LOOK AT THE 2018 MOUNTAIN WEST SCHEDULE

The 2018 Mountain West football schedule is comprised of 97 games, including 48 Conference matchups. The scheduling format for the 12-member football lineup consists of five intra-divisional games and three cross-divisional contests. Each institution will play four home and four road Conference games. 2018 marks the second year of the current four-year cycle and the sixth year overall featuring the current rotation.

The 2018 schedule will play out over 14 weeks, concluding on Sat., Dec. 1 with the Mountain West Football Championship Game featuring the two divisional champions.

The nonconference slate features 24 games against teams that earned bowl berths in 2017, including Arizona State, Arkansas State, Army (three games), Florida Atlantic, Michigan State, Missouri, Navy (two games), New Mexico State (three games), Oklahoma State, Oregon, Stanford, Toledo (two games), Troy, UCLA, USC, Washington State (two games) and Wisconsin.

Five nonconference opponents finished ranked in last year's final Associated Press Top 25 and USA Today/Coaches' polls, including #7/6 Wisconsin, #12/10 USC, #14/14 Oklahoma State, #15/16 Michigan State and #20/19 Stanford.

### **RECEIVING VOTES**

Five Mountain West teams are receiving votes in the national top 25 polls, led by San Diego State. The Aztecs currently sit at No. 29 in the AP Top 25 and No. 31 in the Amway Coaches' Poll.

Also receiving votes is Boise State, Fresno State, Hawai'i and Utah State.

#### **BOWL ELIGIBILITY**

A Hawai'i victory at BYU on Saturday would make the Rainbow Warriors bowl eligible for the first time since 2016. The eight games played would be the fewest for UH to achieve bowl eligibility since 2007.

Additionally, Fresno State, San Diego State and Utah State are all two victories away from also reaching bowl eligibility.

### HAWAI'I BRINGS BACK THE RUN-N-SHOOT OFFENSE

This season, Hawai'i brought back the Run-N-Shoot offense, a style they used from 1999-2011. Below are some of the Rainbow Warrior's offensive highlights:

- In the season opener at Colorado State, UH threw for 418 yards and rushed for another 199 yards. The 617 yards of total offense is the Rainbow Warriors' highest output in a single-game since Nov. 23, 2013 (624 yards at Wyoming).
- In the Conference-opener against the Rams, sophomore QB Cole McDonald set a program record for passing yards (418) in a starting debut. The record was previously held by now-head coach Nick Rolovich, who threw for 367 yards vs. Portland State in 2001.
- In a home-opening victory against Navy, McDonald threw for 428 yards and six touchdowns. He is the first Mountain West QB to throw for 400 yards in backto-back games since Colorado State's Garrett Grayson in September of 2014.
- Hawai'i ranks 11th nationally in passing offense (322.3 yards per game).
- The Rainbow Warriors are off to their best five-game start (6-1) since 2007, when they went 12-0 in the regular season and earned a spot in the Sugar Bowl.

## NOT JUST A FLASH IN THE PAN

Below are a couple notes about Mountain West teams with continued success:

- On Saturday, Sept. 8, the Mountain West won three games against the Pac-12 (Nevada beat Oregon State, Fresno State over UCLA and San Diego State defeated Arizona State) in the same weekend for the first time since September of 2008.
- The Mountain West has won four consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy, Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).
- In the last three seasons, San Diego State has racked up 36 victories, which is the most among the Group of 5 and sixth-best nationally, trailing only Alabama (47), Clemson (46), Ohio State (41), Oklahoma (39) and Wisconsin (38).
- Head coach Rocky Long has led the Aztecs to a bowl game in his first seven seasons. Long is the all-time winningest head coach in Mountain West history (133-99).
- Boise State has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West. Since 2010, BSU has compiled a 12-9 (.571) record against current Autonomous 5 programs. The Broncos have defeated Arizona, Arizona State, Georgia, Oregon, Oregon State, Utah, Virginia, Washington and Washington State.
- Boise State has been nationally-ranked for at least one week for the 17th consecutive season.
- Boise State has made 16 consecutive postseason appearances, the longest streak among Group of 5 institutions and sixth-best nationally.
- Over the last 14 seasons, the Mountain West owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences (.560), trailing only the SEC (.628).

### **MOUNTAIN WEST'S 20TH FOOTBALL SEASON**

Led by the vision of then-Colorado State President Dr. Albert Yates, the Mountain West was formed when presidents of eight institutions - Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming - decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference.

Mountain West football began its 20th season last Saturday as Hawai'i defeated Colorado State, 43-34. The Rams, who are an original member of the MW, played in the first-ever Conference game on Sept. 16, 1999 as BYU hosted CSU.

- In the 19 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant eight times.
- A @HawaiiFootball victory on Saturday at BYU would make the Rainbow Warriors bowl eligible for the first time since 2016.
- .@AFFootball head coach Troy Calhoun is one Conference victory away from becoming only the second MW coach all-time to reach the 50-win plateau, joining @SDSUFootball's Rocky Long.
- .@USUFootball is one of four teams nationally that is averaging more than 50 points per game. The Aggies are outscoring their opponents 50.2-23.0.
- .@USUFootball is looking for its first 5-1 start since 1978. Additionally, the Aggies are looking to begin @MountainWest play 2-0 for the first time since 2013.
- @UNLVFootball's Armani Rogers is one of just three FBS quarterbacks to average at least 100 yards rushing. Rogers' 122.0 yards per game output is best among all FBS quarterbacks.
- .@UNLVFootball is the only FBS team with multiple players averaging at least 100 rushing yards per game. QB Armani Rogers is averaging 122.0 per game, while RB Lexington Thomas is averaging 100.2.
- .@UNLVFootball RB Lexington Thomas is 749 rushing yards shy of becoming the
  program's career leading rusher. Earning that would also place Thomas in fifthplace all-time in @MountainWest history.
- .@FresnoStateFB WR KeeSean Johnson leads the nation with at least one reception in 41 consecutive games.
- @SDSUFootball ranks second nationally in rush defense, limiting opponents to just 61.8 yards per game. In the season opener, the Aztecs held Stanford's Bryce Love to 29 rushing yards.
- The Aztecs' 36 victories in the last three years are the sixth-most nationally and the most among the Group of 5, trailing only Alabama (47), Clemson (46), Ohio State (41), Oklahoma (39) and Wisconsin (38).
- .@wyo\_football's Andrew Wingard enters the week with 415 career tackles, just 40 shy of setting the @MountainWest record (New Mexico's Carmen Messina -454).
- The @MountainWest has three quarterbacks ranked in the top 15 nationally for total passing yards: @HawaiiFootball's Cole McDonald (2nd; 2,100), @CSUFootball's K.J. Carta-Samuels (11th; 1,623) and @BroncoSportsFB's Brett Rypien (14th; 1,559).
- @USUFootball has opened the season with a 4-1 record for the first time since 2012.
- .@USUFootball PK Dominik Eberle tied two NCAA single-game records on Sept. 8
  against New Mexico State: points scored kicking (24) and most field goals from
  50-plus yards (3).
- .@FresnoStateFB defeated UCLA 38-14 on Sept. 22, earning its first victory against an Autonomous 5 opponent since Sept. 15, 2012 (Colorado, 69-14).
- @FresnoStateFB defeated Idaho 79-13 in the season opener. The 79 points are the second-most scored in a single game in @MountainWest history.
- @FresnoStateFB is off to its best five-game start (4-1) since going 4-0 in 2013.
- The @MountainWest has won four consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy and Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).
- @BroncoSportsFB has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West.
- .@BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the fifth consecutive season, while @FresnoStateFB is favored to win the West Division for the first time since 2014.
- .@BroncoSportsFB Brett Rypien is the FBS' active leading passer with 11,435 yards. He is the only active FBS QB with more than 11,000 career passing yards.
- @BroncoSportsFB Brett Rypien ranks second in @MountainWest history with 11,435 career passing yards. Rypien needs 1,256 passing yards to take the top spot.
- .@CSUFootball scored 25 unanswered points on its way to defeating Arkansas (34-27) on Sept. 8. This is the first @MountainWest victory against a SEC opponent since 2011 (Boise State over Georgia).
- In the season-opener against Troy, @BroncoSportsFB senior cornerback Tyler Horton tied an FBS single-game record with two fumble returns for touchdowns.
- .@SDSUFootball has compiled a 36-10 record over the last three seasons. The
  Aztecs are searching for their fourth consecutive 10-win season, which would be
  the longest-stretch in program history.

## FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

**Host Determination:** The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. The host site will be determined no later than the Sunday following the conclusion of the regular season.

**Host Tie Breaker**: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

1. Head-to-head result between the tied divisional champions.

#### 2. If still tied:

If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings will be used;

If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;

If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;

If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.

- 3. If still tied, the best record against common Conference opponents.
- 4. If still tied, the team with the highest overall winning percentage (Conference and non-conference excluding exempt games).
- 5. If still tied, a coin toss will be conducted by the Commissioner.

The 2018 Mountain West Football Championship game will be played on Saturday, December 1. The contest will be played at the home stadium of the regular season Mountain West divisional champion with the highest win percentage in Conference games only.
