Media At Practice

Practice is only open for media for the first 30 minutes, and it is closed to the public. Contact Frank Mercogliano for more information about the class schedules for players needed for interviews (some players are not available due to class after practice, but we will make all efforts to get everyone the interviews they need).

Bob Davie Interview Opportunities

Coach Davie has several media availability times during the week. During game week, he is available after practices on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. He also meets with the local media on Tuesday at noon as part of UNM's weekly fall sports media luncheon (other fall sport coaches meet with the media at noon prior to Davie speaking).

Schedules for the two short weeks (two Friday games) will be announced at a later date.

New Mexico Media Luncheon

The New Mexico Media Luncheons are Tuesdays from noon to 1:30 p.m. Coach Davie is available at approximately 12:30 pm. Audio and video clips from Davie are available at www.golobos.com. The press conferences are also streamed on GoLobos.com by LoboTV. Please note that the Mountain West no longer will conduct a football coaches teleconference. The luncheon is on the Zia II level of the West press box.

New Mexico Player Interview Opportunities

All player interviews must be arranged through the UNM athletics communications office. The main time for interviews is after practice. Wednesday is the last day for player interviews. For lengthier interviews, please call the communications office to arrange, which we are happy to do, working around class schedules. These will normally take place in the communications suite in the Maloof Center.

Postgame: The UNM locker room is closed. Requested players will be brought to an area to be determined after home games and outside the locker room for road games.

For road games, all interviews will be posted to UNM's Media Dropbox account, along with selected highlights. These are provided for your usage, but please credit LoboTV.

Game Credentials

Regular UNM media will receive game credentials prior to the start of the season. For media members with season credentials, that pass also serves as a parking pass. This year media will park in the Baseball South lot only.

Visiting team media should request single-game credentials through their team's media relations office. Parking passes for the Baseball South and media lots will be needed.

Media members not associated directly with a team can email requests to fmercog@unm.edu. Please have these Wednesday of game week (Tuesday for Friday night home games).

For media members picking up credentials at will call without parking passes, it is located in the Northeast corner of the stadium by Gate 7 or 8. For media members picking up with parking passes, credentials will be located at the University Drive entrance to the Baseball South lots with the parking attendant. This should allow you to get your credential without having to wait in line or deal with parking on the north side of the stadium.

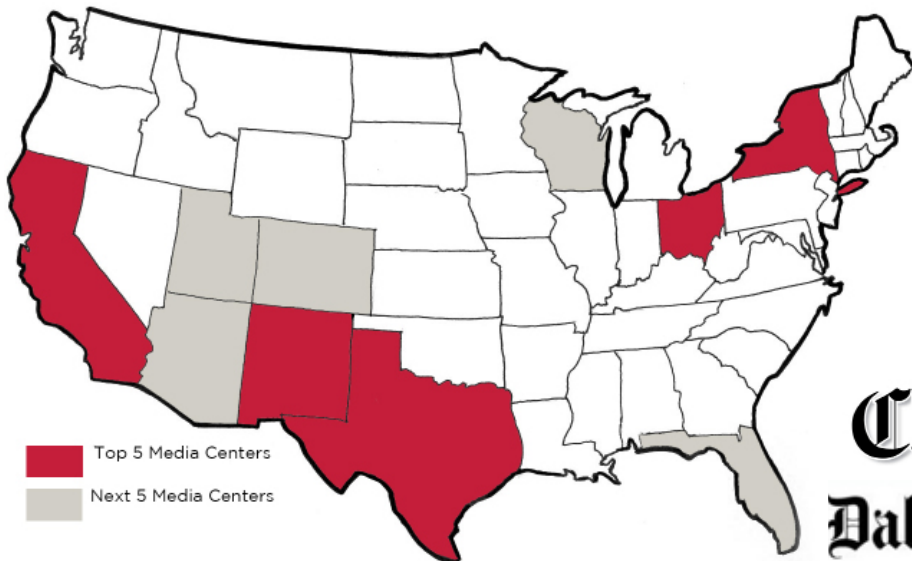

If you are going to make a first start, make it a good one, and Bryson Carroll did just that. Carroll's big day on national television was an amazing first career start for the sophomore that entered the 2019 season having played just three career games. Carroll rushed for 192 yards against Colorado State. It was the fifth-best rushing game by a Lobo in the Bob Davie era, and it was the most yards since Teriyon Gipson's 217 yards against Wyoming in the final game of the 2016 season. Overall, the 193 yards was the 15th-most rushing yards in a single-game all time in Lobo history. Carroll's did day is the subject of this week's Opening List.

Halfway There

New Mexico through six games has 2,552 yards of total offense in the first season under offensive coordinator Joe Dailey. With half a season to go, that would double up to 5,104 yards, and that would be just the ninth time in school history that a Lobo offense would have reached the 5,000-yard mark. Additionally it would rank seventh if UNM stays on the pace its on. Of the top eighth offensive seasons in school history, three have come in the Bob Davie era (2013, 2015 and 2016).

Not Exactly in the Plan

In a perfect world for a football coach, you have 22 starters, 11 on the offense and 11 on the defense.

Through the first half of the season, New Mexico has certainly not started just 22 players. In fact, it's nearly double.

UNM has started 21 different players on offense and 18 different ones on defense, meaning that Bob Davie has started 39 different players, quite the trick when the team has used 80 players this season, meaning that nearly half of the players used by UNM have started on either offense or defense.

UNM on offense has started three quarterbacks, three running backs, two tight ends, six receivers and seven offensive linemen. On defense, UNM has used six defensive linemen, four linebackers and eight defensive backs.

Here is a listing of the teams that have used the most different starters on offense and defense (Yes kickers and punters are people too, but they aren't included on this list).

Briggs Flipped

Two weeks ago, Cade Briggs became the first true freshman to start on either offense or defense for UNM when he started at left guard for the Lobos against San Jose State. Now, he's the first true freshman to start in two positions.

Briggs on Friday night against Colorado State started against the Rams at right guard as Chris Estrella returned to left guard with the return of Javon Mosely to left tackle.

Briggs became the third true freshman to "start" a game, as Aiden Kneller has now started three games as the long snapper, and Chad Alexander has started the last three games as a true freshman.

Flipping the Switch

Through the first three games of the season, UNM struggled with "sudden change", when the team turns the ball over and the defense is called upon to quickly come on the field. The Lobos turned the ball over five times in the first three games, four times at Notre Dame and once against New Mexico State. All five of those turnovers turned into a touchdown, and going back to the San Diego State game last year, it meant that of UNM's previous 12 turnovers, 11 turned into opponent touchdowns.

UNM's defense has turned that around in the last three weeks, as the offense has turned the ball over 11 times, and the defense has allowed just five scores, and only two touchdowns. That's despite a turnover at the Lobo 25-yard line and two turnovers inside the Lobo 5-yard line.

Scorigami Update

Scorigami is a concept originally thought up by Jon Bois for the NFL. A scorigami is a score that has never happened before. In terms of Lobo scorigami, UNM has had two of its five games end in scorigami this season.

Moran's Long Wait

New Mexico has plenty of players on the 2019 roster that have earned two red-shirts due to injuries, and none have had a harder road than Kentrail Moran. The highly touted recruit out of O'Fallon, Illinois missed the 2016 season as a redshirt and then played sparingly in just six game, rushing 14 times for 32 yards.

Last year he played in the season opener and carried five times but got hurt and missed the entire season with an injury, netting him a second redshirt.

After all those injuries and all those comebacks, he got a chance on Friday in goal line situations against Colorado State in just his second game of the season. With Ahmari Davis out for the game, Moran was tasked with getting UNM into the end zone, and he delivered both times.

The first time was from one-yard out, and the second time was from four yards out. The two touchdowns were the first two on the season and in his career for the sophomore.

Not a Good Streak

For the fourth straight season, UNM has suffered a quarterback injury in the months of August or September. Brandt Hughes injured his shoulder in the opening half against Sam Houston State and was replaced by Sheriron Jones. It marked the fourth straight season this has happened in August or September.

Last year Tevaka Tuioti was knocked out of the Wisconsin game, giving way to Sheriron Jones (it happened two weeks later against Liberty as well). In 2017, Lamar Jordan was knocked out of the game in Boise on September 14, giving way to Coltin Gerhart. In 2016, Austin Apodaca was injured in the September 17 game at Rutgers, and Lamar Jordan replaced him.

The last time UNM escaped September unscathed was in 2015 when Lamar Jordan started 12 of 13 games, with the one switch a coaches decision.

History

When Tevaka Tuioti started against New Mexico State, it marked three different starting quarterbacks in the first three games of the season. It had never happened in the history of UNM football, as far back as records go for such things (the last 1950s).

Kress Hits the Century Mark

Jordan Kress had a heck of a game with three catches for 122 yards and a pair of touchdowns. It marked the first time that a Lobo recorded a 100-yard receiving game since the final game of the 2017 season when Jay Griffin IV had 106 yards receiving.

Still Clean After All These Plays

The Lobo offensive line was the final team in the FBS to allow a sack, and against Liberty UNM allowed two for a grand total of six yards. UNM currently is tied for third in the nation in fewest sacks allowed with four, behind Air Force and Boston College, which have allowed three each. The Lobos have been led by Rimington candidate Kyle Stapley, who has allowed just one sack, one hit and two hurries in 198 pass blocking sequences. His pass blocking efficiency rating according to Pro Football Focus is 98.7% and that's the eighth-best mark in the Mountain West among all linemen with 150 pass blocks.

A High Percentage of Pick Sixes

If you are only going to get one, make it a good one. Through six games, UNM's defense has just one interception to its credit, but UNM made it count. The interception came on the first pass of the game by New Mexico State, and it was picked off by Jerrick Reed II, who somehow zigged and zagged through a host of Aggies to find the end zone. It was UNM's first pick six since September 15, 2018 when Marcus Hayes picked off a pass and went 60 yards for a touchdown, at New Mexico State. UNM's one interception is tied for the least in the NCAA.

2018 Lobos Set Program Record for Scholar-Athletes

The Lobo football team had an amazing year academically in 2018-19, and that bore out in several ways, but perhaps the most pertinent is with the Mountain West Scholar-Athlete Program.

The Lobos had 14 student-athletes named to the Mountain West 2018-19 Scholar-Athlete list, and the 14 is the most in program history, topping the previous record set a year ago as Davie's Lobos had eight in 2017-18.

In order to qualify for the Mountain West Scholar-Athlete award, a student-athlete must play in at least one game in a season, and have a 3.50 cumulative grade point average. UNM's 14 scholar-athletes was the most not only for UNM, but it's the most scholar-athletes in football by any current team in the Mountain West. The last time a program had 14 or more scholar-athletes was in 2005-06, when the Brigham Young Cougars had 20 student-athletes honored.

Dyer Continues UNM's Strong Punting Game

Tyson Dyer continued what is shaping up to be an amazing season punting the football. Dyer was amazing once again on Saturday, punting seven times for 43.3-yard average, which was his lowest average of the season. However, it's what he did with those seven punts, as all seven were pinned inside the 20-yard line.

Dyer now has had 20 of his 32 punts pinned inside the 20, and that's already more than he had all of last season (19). Also, he has pinned an opponent inside the 20 in 15 of his last 16 punts, with the lone punt that didn't pinned San Jose State at the 35 after a more of more than 50 yards.

Dyer's 47.1 average would be just off the Lobo record for single-season punting, and he is now is over 100 career punts, which makes him eligible for the Lobo career record. Dyer is averaging 45.13 yards per punt for his career, and he as of right now would just be short the current career-record holder of Corey Bojorquez. Dyer currently is averaging 45.13 for his career and Bojorquez is averaged 45.15. Additionally, Dyer is third among all active punters in career punting:

Lobo Captains

UNM's captains for 2019 are Alex Hart, Trent Sellers, Kyle Stapley and Aaron Blackwell. With the selection of Hart, he becomes just the third three-time captain in the history of Lobo Football, having served as a captain in both 2017 and 2018. Ironically, he was a teammate of the other two, as Lamar Jordan (2014-16) and Dakota Cox (2014-16) also were three-time captains.

UNM already has players that will benefit from the four-game rule this season. Elijah Lilly played in three games before season-ending surgery, and quarterback Brandt Hughes played a half before suffering a season ending injury. Patrick Peek also played four games and will now redshirt to get one more year at UNM.

And You Thought the 80s were the Only Time Period Where You Could Wear Two Redshirts

Traditionally, you can only redshirt once. However, you can now redshirt twice, and four Lobos are now double redshirts. All four Lobos were able to utilize a rule that allows for an injury redshirt after redshirting as an academically eligible freshman. Daevon Vigilant earned his second redshirt for his 2017 season in which he was injured for the season in the opening game of the year.

Last year, both Q' Drennan and Tevaka Tuioti were able to get a second redshirt despite playing in 2018. Drennan was hurt on the season-opening drive after a 40-yard reception, and since he was redshirted in 2015 as an academically eligible freshman, he earned a second redshirt and will be in graduate school as a junior in eligibility for 2019.

Tuioti, who was injured against Wisconsin, missed the New Mexico State game and then suffered a season-ending injury in the fourth game of the season (his third) against Liberty. Since he also redshirted as an academically eligible freshman in 2016, he earned a second redshirt and in 2019 he will be a sophomore.

Additionally, Kentrail Moran has back to back injuries and is a double redshirt.

You Get a Scholarship...and You Get a Scholarship!

On June 6, five Lobos, including three New Mexico natives, were awarded scholarships by head coach Bob Davie in a surprise announcement during Thursday meetings, bringing cheers from their teammates.

The five Lobos earning scholarships were Bobby Cole (a redshirt running back from Chatsworth, California), Andrew Erickson (a redshirt freshman receiver from Albuquerque's Manzano High School), Micah Gray (a redshirt sophomore running back from Clovis High School), Hayden Wilson (a redshirt sophomore offensive lineman from Rio Rancho's Cleveland High School) and Nic Wilson (a redshirt freshman cornerback from San Bernardino, California).

"I'm proud of the work that all five of these young men have done at UNM," said Davie. "Whether it's the hard work they have put in on the field, or in the classroom, or in the community, they have represented themselves, this program and our institution in outstanding fashion. I'm excited for them and their families. They have earned this."

Gray and Cole saw playing time in 2018 as redshirt freshmen, mostly on special teams, but both had a solid spring camp and saw plenty of action toting the football at running back as well as participating on special teams. For Erickson, Hayden Wilson and Nic Wilson, all three were freshmen last year and all had terrific seasons on the scout team in 2018, and then turned in great spring camps in 2019.

Overall, the five bring the total of former walk-ons elevated to scholarship status under Bob Davie to 23, and Erickson, Gray and Wilson bring the total of New Mexico natives elevated to scholarship status to 15. Gray and Wilson both served as the New Mexico Man last season, with Gray earning the honor on September 29 against Liberty and Wilson on November 24 against Wyoming. Of the 30 New Mexico Men that started their careers as walk-ons at UNM, 13 have now earned scholarships.

The New Mexico Man tradition was started by Davie in 2012. In the program a walk-on, or former walk-on player is designated as the "New Mexico Man" each home week during the season. The selected player leads the team onto the field with the New Mexico state flag before home games as well as in Las Cruces at the Rio Grande Rivalry game between the Lobos and New Mexico State. During the game, the New Mexico Man wears a special uniform patch in the shape of the state of New Mexico on their jersey.

Of the previous 18 student-athletes put on scholarship by Davie, 12 were natives of New Mexico. Those names include David Anaya, Javohn Jones, Xavier Madrid, Jeric Magnant, Zack Rogers, Steven Romero, John Russo, Andrew Shelley, Thomas Vieira, Michael Walsh, Randy Williams and Reece White. Overall, UNM has 18 New Mexico natives on the 2019 roster. The 18 New Mexico players is the most of any Division I team, with 11 on full scholarship.

Building Blocks

While it has been a long time since UNM has blocked a punt (October 31, 2009 by Victor James against San Diego State), UNM is getting pretty adept at blocking kicks. UNM has three blocks on the season, and that total is tied for the third in the NCAA behind Appalachian

Oddly, UNM had a third block in the game that bounced right into the arms of Moana Vainikolo and it would have went for about a 65-yard touchdown, but the play was blown dead due to a false start on the kicker.

It's the most blocked kicks for the Lobos since the 2009 season when UNM recorded four blocked kicks. Overall, UNM has blocked 13 field goals and extra points in the Bob Davie era.

A Semester and Year to Remember

The Lobos turned in a pair of semesters in the classroom like no other, combining for the best academic year for the Lobo football team in the history of the program. For the Fall semester, the team turned in a 2.83 GPA for the Fall, which was the best Fall semester in the history of the program. The team then topped that in the Spring with a 2.92, which is the second-highest GPA in the program's history, behind only a 2.96 GPA in the Spring of 2003. The combined GPA of 2.88 is the best combined GPA for the two semesters in the history of the program.

Ch-Ch-Ch-Changes

UNM made some changes to its coaching staff for the 2019 season.

The Lobos have a new offensive and defensive coordinator for the 2019 season. Joe Dailey is in his first season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach after coming to UNM from Liberty University. With Dailey handling the quarterbacks, Apollo Wright has moved over from quarterbacks to running backs. UNM's defensive coordinator is Jordan Peterson, who has served as the safeties coach for the past three seasons, and he takes over for Kevin Cosgrove, who is now with LSU.

UNM also has two new defensive coaches, both coaching linebackers. Dan Carrel and Dillon Sanders will coach linebackers, taking over for Cosgrove and Archie McDaniel. Carrel came to UNM from Houston, and Sanders came to UNM from Kentucky.

Now That's Explosive

The Lobos has had one play of 30 or more yards against Colorado State, and that kept UNM seventh nationally. UNM is also tied for 10th nationally with 10 plays of 40 or more yards.

- *World War I (World War II hadn't started yet, so World War I was referred to as the Great War.)
- *Daylight Savings Time (started in 1942)
- *Anne Frank's Diary (she started writing it on her 13th birthday in 1942)
- *Stephen Hawking (he was born in 1942)
- *Color Film (Eastman Kodak invented it in 1942)
- *Chemotherapy (This was first tested in 1942 by Alfred Gilman, Louis S. Goodman and Frederick S. Philips)

Bob Davie enters his eighth season at The University of New Mexico, where he has led the program to back-to-back bowl games, a 2016 Gildan New Mexico Bowl title, and increased respect in the form of nationally televised games and increased media attention.

The 2018 season saw him complete his 32nd season as a collegiate football coach, and it marked his 42nd season overall in the sport, including 10 years as a broadcaster at ESPN.

The 2018 season saw UNM put a scare into the nation's No. 5 team in Wisconsin, and pick up a record breaking win over UNLV, winning with the largest road margin of victory for the Lobos in the Mountain West. The Lobos also had a win in the Rio Grande Rivalry, winning 42-25 over New Mexico State, giving Davie a 5-2 record against UNM's rivals to the south.

UNM also led the nation in kickoff coverage and had the top punt returner in the nation, continuing the hallmark of tremendous special teams play under Davie. The team also turned in the best academic year on record with a 2.83 GPA in the Fall and a 2.92 in the Spring, two of the five highest GPAs in program history. Additionally, UNM set records as a program with 27 Academic All-Conference performers and 13 Mountain West Scholar-Athletes.

While the 2017 season did not see the results on the field that Davie and the Lobos got used too, it still had many successful moments. The season culminated with four Lobos making it into NFL camps, including the program's first draft choice in eight years with Jason Sanders as a seventh-round selection of the Miami Dolphins. Additionally, Lamar Jordan signed a free agent contract with the Atlanta Falcons and Corey Bojorquez did likewise with the New England Patriots.

The Lobos finished among the national leaders in kickoff coverage and punt coverage, and running back Richard McQuarley tied the school record with five touchdown runs against Air Force.

In addition, the Lobos continued their streak in which the team returned a kickoff for a touchdown in each of Bob Davie's first six seasons as Elijah Lilly took one back against Texas A&M. The touchdown was the 10th in those six seasons, and that was tied for the third-most in the nation over that time period, and UNM's streak of one kickoff return for a touchdown from 2010-17 was the second-longest streak nationally.

UNM was also strong off the field, with a program record 23 Mountain West All-Academic selections and a 2.85 GPA in the Spring semester, the highest under Davie at the time.

It's safe to say that his first five years at New Mexico has seen him orchestrate one of the best rebuilding jobs in the history of the sport. When he arrived on campus in 2012, he inherited a program that had gone just 3-37 in the previous 40 games and had the lowest number of scholarship players in Division I. Knowing that back story makes UNM's stretch all the more remarkable.

Over the 2015 and 2016 seasons, New Mexico went 16-10, tying a school record for the most wins in back-to-back seasons in school history. The Lobos tied a school record with six conference wins in 2016, and UNM's 11 conference wins over those two seasons were the most in school history. New Mexico's 12-5 Mountain West record over a 17-game stretch was tied for the best in the Mountain Division and is the second-best in the league overall.

Perhaps there is no better stat to show how far Davie has brought the Lobos than this: after no wins over Bowl eligible teams from 2008-14, the Lobos defeated seven bowl eligible teams over those two seasons.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — The University of New Mexico got a pair of second half touchdowns from Sheriron Jones and then staved off a late comeback attempt with a fourth down sack by Jacobi Hearn as the Lobos defeated Sam Houston State, the No. 22 team in the FCS, 39-31 in front of 13,749 fans at Dreamstyle Stadium.

After the game, UNM's post-game press conference was canceled after head coach Bob Davie needed medical attention after meeting with his team. Director of Athletics Eddie Nuñez released the following statement.

"Immediately following tonight's football game between The University of New Mexico and Sam Houston State University, Lobo Head Coach Bob Davie was taken to the hospital as a result of what appeared to be a serious medical incident. The University will release more information as it becomes available. We ask that you keep the Davie family in your prayers."

The Lobos are idle next week and then head to Notre Dame on Saturday, September 14.

UNM led for most of the game as starting quarterback Brandt Hughes threw for 218 yards in the first half. Hughes led UNM to a pair of touchdowns by Ahmari Davis on the ground and three Andrew Shelley field goals, but he suffered a shoulder injury and gave way to Jones in the second half.

Jones, who started seven games last year, entered with UNM down 23-22 after the Bearkats took the opening second half kickoff and went 75 yards in seven plays for what amounted to SHSU's only lead of the game. After a quick three-and-out, UNM got the ball right back and Jones went to work. Anu Somoye made a ridiculous grab near the Bearkat sideline, one of a career-high three catches, to put UNM in Sam Houston territory. Jones then found Aaron Molina twice to get UNM inside the five, but UNM had to settle for a fourth Shelley field goal, giving UNM the lead for good at 25-23.

Jones then gave UNM a 16-point lead with back-to-back touchdowns. After he hit Jordan Kress for 47 yards, Jones rushed to 10 and then 11 to make it 32-23. Sam Houston State punted, Davis rushed 53 yards to the Bearkat seven. Jones then raced to the pylon on the next play for his second career touchdown. That made it 39-23, and then UNM had to deal with Sam Houston State's late comeback attempt.

Down 16, the Bearkats mounted a long, 86-yard touchdown drive that took 12 plays and culminated with a Donovan Williams 4-yard run. Sam Houston went for two and got it, making the score 39-31 with just 3:01 to go. Sam Houston State then hit a little dribble kick and kicker Connor Crow recovered to give the Bearkats a chance. A trick play moved the ball to the Lobo 22, but UNM's defense held firm from there. Alexander "Moana" Vainikolo and Adebayo Soremekun teamed up for a four-yard loss, and then after an incompletion Patrick Peek delivered another tackle for loss to make it 4th and 15. JUCO transfer then clinched a victory with a backside sack of quarterback Ty Brock, and UNM took three knees to end the game.

The Lobos picked up 485 yards of offense on 72 plays, averaging 6.7 yards per play. UNM also had plenty of big plays with eight of 25 yards or more. Sam Houston outgained UNM with 558 yards, but it needed 95 plays to do it. UNM had a solid pass rush with three sacks and six hurries.

SOUTH BEND, Ind. — The No. 7 Notre Dame Fighting Irish showed exactly why they were in the College Football Playoff a year ago, throwing for 434 yards and scoring on six straight drives after a respectable start by UNM's defense as New Mexico was on the wrong end of a 66-14 loss in the home opener for the Fighting Irish.

The Lobos fell behind early after getting a stop on Notre Dame's opening drive, forcing a punt. UNM moved the ball from its own two to the 30-yard line, but on third and eight, Sheriron Jones had his pass deflected and in went right to Kyle Hamilton who returned it 34 yards for a touchdown.

From there, the Lobo defense was stout, forcing two more punts and allowing just a 1-yard touchdown on fourth-and-goal at the 11:47 mark of the second quarter. Notre Dame then moved well into the lead with three straight long scoring passes. First Avery Davis took a forward toss on a jet sweep for a 59-yard touchdown, and then Javon McKinley broke several tackles on a 65-yard pass. Chase Claypool also scored on a 37-yard touchdown.

UNM was hampered by three interceptions from Jones, who was 4-for-15 passing for 19 yards. He was replaced by Tevaka Tuioti in the second half, and Tuioti showed why he was the presumptive quarterback heading in to the season, moving UNM well, although UNM turned the ball over on downs at the Notre Dame 35-yard line on one drive, and suffered a fumble and a 28-yard loss on a field goal attempt when the snap sailed over holder Tyson Dyer's head.

UNM's major highlight came from the smallest guy on the field. Bryson Carroll, who led UNM in rushing with xx yards on just x carries, scampered for 47 yards and a touchdown with just 29 seconds left in the first half. It was Carroll's first career touchdown. In the fourth quarter, Bobby Cole scored on his first career touch, a brilliant 37-yard run to the corner of the end zone.

Tyson Dyer had a solid day punting the football, averaging 46.5 yards per punt with three inside the 20-yard line. He also had his first career rush, faking a punt and running two yards for a first down.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- In a game that at times defied logic, and featured brilliant plays after brilliant plays, it came down to a fourth down battle of wills, and New Mexico's will won out. Ahmari Davis leaped over a pile of linemen on fourth-and-inches with just over two minutes on the clock at the Aggie 37-yard line and picked up 17 yards to seal a wild 55-52 win for the Lobos. The win pushed UNM to 2-1 on the season and dropped New Mexico State to 0-4.

The game featured plenty of offense as the two teams combined for 107 points, the second-most ever in the rivalry (the record is 113 back in 1917), and the seventh-most in UNM history. The game was also Lobo Scoringami, as it was the first 55-52 game in the history of the program. UNM has now won two straight in the rivalry, and six of eight overall.

UNM found themselves down 38-34 in the third quarter when Josh Adkins slung a pass to Tony Nicholson for a 3-yard touchdown, Nicholson's second score of the game. It was one of three TD passes by Adkins, who also ran for three, becoming just the third quarterback in the FBS this season to rush for three scores and throw for three in the same game.

UNM went to work after that, methodically moving down the field on what ended up as a 12-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. The final 20 came from Jordan Kress, who caught his second touchdown of the game on a 20-yard pass from Tevaka Tuioti. It was one of three touchdowns for Tuioti, who threw for a career-high 355 yards.

After Kress made it 41-38, the Aggies had a chance to tie, but Devin Sanders blocked Dylan Brown's 44-yard field goal attempt, getting just enough of it to have it fall short. That play turned huge when Tuioti hit Cedric Patterson III on the sidelines, and he outraced everyone for his second career catch and first career touchdown. That made it 48-38, and after an errant third down snap forced New Mexico State to punt, UNM's offense went to work again. The key play on the drive was Tuioti hitting a free Elijah Lilly for 29 yards down to the 16-yard line.

After a fumble that Tuioti fell on, UNM got a break on a face mask penalty, and Daevon Vigilant made the Aggies pay with a 1-yard touchdown run to make it 55-38. However, New Mexico State didn't quit. It answered with a 4-yard pass to Jason Huntley with 7:37 to go, and then after an interception, Adkins scored his third rushing TD of the day with 5:22 left and it was 55-52.

UNM's offense wouldn't let the Aggies touch the football again. Tuioti twice kept the ball on zone reads for first downs of 18 and 11 yards, putting the ball across midfield. Bryson Carroll then rushed for four but lost nine on the next play, and UNM faced third-and-15 at midfield. Tuioti then faked a rush and hit Anselem Umeh, who stretched for what looked like a first down with just 2:12 to go, but the ball was ruled just short of the line to gain on a replay review.

Undaunted, acting coach Saga Tuitele went for it at the 37, and Davis leapt the line, and then rumbled to the 20-yard line. On the next play, needing one more first down to clinch the game, Davis got hit at the line and a veritable rugby scrum ensued. When it was finally over, Davis had 11 yards and a first down, and UNM had its 72nd Rio Grande Rivalry win.

UNM got on the board on the second play of the game when Jerick Reed II intercepted Adkins and returned it 43 yards for a touchdown. Reed was making his first career start.

NMSU scored twice to take a lead at 14-7, but UNM tied with when Davis scored from two yards out. The Lobos then matched every score for State. The Aggies got a 33-yard field goal, and UNM answered with an Andrew Shelley 48-yarder. NMSU scored to make it 24-17, but Kress tip-toed the sidelines for a 55-yard touchdown. UNM looked like it would have a 31-24 lead at the break when Davis scored with 1:07 to go, but NMSU went the length of the field, helped by a 53-yard catch and run to tie the game at 31-31 with two seconds left, setting up the wild finish.

LYNCHBURG, Va. --- After a wild offensive affair just a week ago, offense was at a premium on Saturday in Lynchburg, Virginia, and the Liberty Flames had just enough of it to top New Mexico 17-10 in front of 17,101 fans at Williams Stadium. The loss dropped UNM to 2-2 on the season, and it denied UNM its first 3-1 start in 12 years.

The Lobos looked to get on the board first after the defense turned in a fourth-down stop inside of Liberty territory, but Tevaka Tuioti, threw an interception (one of two) in the end zone on third down, ending UNM's scoring threat. UNM's defense held firm, bending but not really breaking, allowing just an Antonio Gandy-Golden touchdown on the final play of the first quarter, and a late play-action touchdown pass near the end of the second quarter.

Golden's first score came after a 51-yard catch set up the Flames inside the 10, and he caught a short 3-yard pass from Buckshot Calvert two plays later. Liberty's only other touchdown came after another long pass play set up Liberty inside the five, and this time Clavert threw a 2-yard pass with just 23 seconds left in the half.

UNM got a huge red zone stop early in the second quarter down 7-3 when Erin Austin chased down Liberty quarterback Buckshot Calvert as he was at the one-yard line and forced a fumble into the end zone, which was recovered by De'John Rogers for a touchback.

The Lobos got on the board on the strength of a season-long 52-yard field goal by Andrew Shelley, who got the kick-off after Tyson Dyer handled a low snap. The field goal was tied for the sixth-longest in UNM history. It wasn't the only big play for Dyer, who time and again punted UNM out of trouble, averaging 47.8 yards per punt, punting five times and pinning Liberty inside the 20 all five times.

UNM was down 17-3 after a field goal and drove inside the Liberty 45, but a pass from Tuioti to Anselem Umeh was high, and UNM had to punt. After a missed field goal, UNM again drove down the field, but Tuioti overthrew Jay Griffin IV for a second interception. UNM's defense continued to hold, giving UNM a chance to get back in the game, and UNM drove inside the 15-yard line but on fourth down from the 10 yards line needing eight yards for a first down, Tuioti rushed and got seven-and-half yards, turning the ball over on downs at the Liberty 3-yard line.

UNM eventually got the ball back in the final minutes and went the length of the field, with Tuioti hitting Aaron Molina for a 14-yard touchdown with 43 seconds left to make it 17-10. UNM then attempted an onside kick and the ball hung tantalizingly in the air but just before Jordan Kress could snag it, a Liberty receiver snatched it first to seal the game.

The Lobos now flip coasts on a short week to open conference play at San Jose State.

SAN JOSE, Calif. --- Sheriron Jones came off the bench and led a game effort for New Mexico, but the Lobos suffered five fumbles (losing two) and four interceptions, and that hurt any chances of a road win. UNM couldn't overcome a 26-0 deficit in losing 32-21 at San Jose State at CEFCU Stadium. The loss dropped New Mexico to 2-3 on the season and 0-1 in the conference.

San Jose State improved to 3-2 on the year and 1-1 in the Mountain West. New Mexico lost its Mountain West opener for the just the second time in the last five years.

The game started well for UNM as Erin Austin and De'John Rogers teamed up for a big play for the second straight week. UNM's Austin hit Josh Love when he went back to pass, forcing a fumble that Rogers recovered. UNM moved the ball inside the 15 but stalled, and Andrew Shelley missed from the far right hashmark from 29 yards, his first miss of the season.

That miss started a roll for the Spartans, a run that was keyed by several big yardage plays by San Jose State. The Spartans got a pair of long passes to set up a 9-yard touchdown by quarterback Nick Nash for a 6-0 lead, and UNM's Adebayo Soremekun blocked the extra point. After UNM blocked a field goal, San Jose State scored again when Bill Humphrey's caught a 5-yard pass from Josh Love to make it 13-0.

UNM drove the field after that and had a chance to get on the board, but Tevaka Tuioti threw an interception in the end zone, the first of UNM's six turnovers. On the next play, Love hit Bailey Gaither, who earlier had blocked a punt, and Gaither traversed 80 yards for a 20-0 lead.

UNM then suffered two turnovers inside the Lobo 25, the first by Bryson Carroll as the Lobo 2-yard line, and the second was an interception by Sheriron Jones, but UNM's defense held twice, forcing a pair of Matt Mercurio field goals and it was 26-0 San Jose State.

UNM got on the board just before the half when Jones, who had a career-high 104 yards rushing, hit Jordan Kress at the front pylon for a 34-yard touchdown, making it 26-7 at the break.

UNM had a chance to cut the lead further early in the second half when UNM drove inside the 10, but Ahmari Davis fumbled on a second effort play, and UNM turned the ball over. UNM's defense held, and Sheriron Jones led a quick 60-yard, 4-play drive with a 4-yard touchdown run to make it 26-14 late in the third quarter.

However, San Jose State tacked on two more field goals, including a 49-yarder that followed a blocked kick that UNM seemingly would have scored a touchdown on, but the play was ruled dead due a false start by Mercurio. He also added a short field goal later in the quarter.

Jones didn't stop however, and he threw his second TD pass of the game, a 38-yarder on a scramble to Cedric Patterson III to make it 32-21, and UNM nearly recovered the pooch kick from Donovan Murphree at the Spartan 30-yard line. UNM got the stop it needed, but on a third-and-10 play, Jones dropped back and threw his third interception of the game, and UNM's fourth.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Colorado State went 85 yards at the end of the first half, aided by three personal fouls, and scored on fourth-and-goal from the 1-yard line with five seconds left to take a lead it would never relinquish as the Rams defeated the Lobos for the 10th straight time, winning 35-21 at Dreamstyle Stadium. The loss dropped UNM to 2-4 on the season at the halfway point, and 0-2 in the Mountain West. Colorado State moved to 2-5 overall and 1-2 in the league.

UNM struggled to overcome mistakes in the game, including three fourth quarter turnovers, 11 penalties for 102 yards (CSU had 10 for 117 yards) and just three of 12 third down conversions.

The Lobos were down plenty of starters on both sides of the ball, but still got some tremendous efforts, the biggest from the littlest player on the field. Five-foot-seven Bryson Carroll rushed for 193 yards, the 15th-best rushing total in UNM history. Carroll had several big runs including a 56-yard run to the one-yard line with UNM trailing 7-0. That run should have been 57-yards and a touchdown, but Carroll actually fumbled at the 1-yard line when he let go of the ball before crossing into the end zone.

Luckily, neither team fell on the ball, so UNM retained possession at the 1-yard line and Kentrail Moran, rushing in short yardage situations in place of Ahmari Davis who was injured, scored his first career touchdown to make it 7-6 after Andrew Shelley hit the upright on the point-after try.

UNM took it's only lead on a long drive on the ground that was aided when Colorado State was called for roughing the punter. It ended with Moran's second touchdown of the game, making it 12-7, and Sheriron Jones hit Marcus Williams for a two-point conversion to make it 14-7.

After each team punted, CSU tied the game on one-play as Patrick O'Brien hit Warren Jackson for an 87-yard touchdown.

That left it tied until CSU took over at its own 15-yard line with 2:03 to go. UNM got a sack and then a short gain made it third-and-11, and UNM called a timeout to try to get the ball back. Instead, CSU got a first down and moved to midfield when it faced another third-and-11 at the Ram 44. O'Brien was pressured and threw incomplete, but UNM was called for roughing the pass, moving the ball to the Lobo 41.

UNM then was whistled for pass interference twice in three plays, setting up the Rams at the Lobo 3-yard line. It took four plays, but on fourth-and-goal at the 1-yard line, Marvin Kinsey, Jr. just did break the plane for a back-breaking touchdown with just five seconds left in the game.

CSU moved it to 28-14 in the third with another Kinsey short TD run, but UNM made a game comeback attempt. UNM broke through in the fourth quarter, converting its first two third downs, including a bruising 10-yard run by Jones on third-and-seven at the 14 that looked for certain like a loss of yardage. Carroll then barreled in from four yards out and UNM was down 28-21.

CSU missed a field goal with 8:38 to go, and UNM needed 72 yards for a tie. They got just five. Carroll rushed for five before a muffed fly swap exchange to Emmanuel Logan-Greene was recovered and turned into a Jackson 26-yard touchdown catch for a 35-21 lead. That turnover was the first of three in the fourth quarter for UNM.
