#HIGHLIGHTS

(NOTES FROM AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST IN 140 CHARACTERS OR LESS)

- .@GoAztecs' were the first Group of 5 team to reach bowl eligibility, winning six straight games to open the 2017 season.
- The @MountainWest has three RBs ranked in the top-15 nationally in total rushing yds: Hawai'i's Diocemy Saint Juste (1,094), SDSU's Rashaad Penny (1,046) & UNLV's Lexington Thomas (716).
- The @MountainWest is the only FBS conference with multiple 1,000-yard rushers through seven weeks: @HawaiiFootball Diocemy Saint Juste (1,094) and @GoAztecs Rashaad Penny (1,046).
- .@SJSUSpartanFB LB Frank Ginda is tied for first nationally with 14.4 tackles per game. He is also the 1 of 2 FBS defender with more than 100 total tackles (115).
- .@GoAztecs' win vs. #19/19 Stanford on Sept. 16 is the highest ranked opponent a MW team has defeated since Oct. 3, 2014 (Utah State over #19/18 BYU).
- .@GoAztecs have won 35 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards as a team.
- .@GoAztecs RB Rashaad Penny is the 1st player in @MountainWest history to win player of the week honors in four consecutive weeks (9/4-25).
- Penny ranks third nationally in all-purpose yards per game (199.29), total rushing yards (1,046) and fifth in rush yards per contest (149.4) and scoring (11.1).
- .@CSUFootball's Michael Gallup leads the nation in receiving yds (948), second in receiving yds/game (135.4) & third in receptions per game (8.3).
- .@CSUFootball's Michael Gallup is the FBS' active career leader in receiving yards per game (110.0).
- .@CSUFootball's Nick Stevens ranks sixth nationally with 2,255 passing yards. He is one of 11 FBS QBs with more than 2,000 passing yards this season.
- In his last 2 games, @AFFootball's Arion Worthman has accounted for 634 yards of total offense and nine touchdowns.
- .@unlvfootball's Devonte Boyd needs 586 receiving yds to hold the @MountainWest career record.
- Boyd's 3,045 career receiving yards are the 3rd-most among active pass-catchers nationally.
- .@wyo football DB Andrew Wingard ranks third nationally in career average tackles per game (9.69).
- .@USUFootball is tied for third nationally with 17 takeaways (9 fumble recoveries and 8 interceptions).
- .@CSUFootball's 31-point win over Oregon State on Aug. 26 is the largest against an Autonomous 5 opponent in program history.
- .@CSUFootball's 31-point victory is the 5th-largest by a @MountainWest member over an Autonomous 5 team since 2010.
- @CSUFootball has sold a program-record of more than 15,000 season tickets as of the beginning of August. The previous school record was 11,500.
- .@BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the fourth consecutive season.
- .@GoAztecs are the first team in MW history to be selected as unanimous divisional champs in back-to-back seasons.
- In the 18 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant 8 times.
- .@BroncoSportsFB has produced a 1,000-yd rusher in eight straight seasons, which is tied with Auburn as the longest active streak in the nation.

WIN IMPROVEMENT

Fresno State entered the 2017 campaign coming off an 1-11 season and the hiring of head coach Jeff Tedford. The Bulldogs matched their 2016 win total after defeating Incarnate Word (66-0) to open the season and since then have compiled a record of 4-2. This three-game win improvement is already one of the best in the country.

Last season, Wyoming tied for the nation's largest improvement in wins from 2015 to 2016 at plus-six.

THROUGH THE AIR

Colorado State senior guarterback Nick Stevens ranks in the top-15 nationally in several passing categories this season. Stevens ranks sixth in total passing yards (2,255), eighth in passing touchdowns (18) and 10th in passing yards per game (322.1). The native of Murrieta, California, also ranks ninth in points responsible for (114) and 12th in total offense (333.1). He leads the Mountain West in all five statistical categories.

More about Stevens:

- One of 11 FBS quarterbacks with more than 2,000 passing yards on the season. His 2,255 passing yards are second-most among Group of 5 signal-callers. .
 - Has thrown multiple touchdown passes in 13 of the Rams' last 14 games.
- Completed 21 consecutive passes, his final 12 passes against Hawai'i on Sept. 30 and first nine on the road vs. Utah State on Oct. 7, which is the second-longest streak in Mountain West history.
- In MW play, has completed 66-of-90 passes for 1,028 yards and 11 touchdowns with zero interceptions.

SUCCESS ON THE GROUND

The Mountain West is the only FBS conference with multiple 1,000-yard rushers this season. Hawai'i RB Diocemy Saint Juste (1,094) and San Diego State's Rashaad Penny (1,046) are two of four 1,000-yard FBS rushers.

Saint Juste has rushed for 200 yards on three occasions this season, joining Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor as the only player to have two 200-yard performances this year. Additionally, the native of Boynton Beach, Florida, is the first Rainbow Warrior to register 1,000-yard rushing seasons in back-to-back years.

The Hawai'i program record for rushing yards in a single season is 1,498, set by Travis Sims in 1992.

UNLV's Lexington Thomas ranked No. 14 nationally with 716 rushing yards.

MOUNTAIN VS. WEST

The Mountain Division holds an all-time record of 54-30 (.643) against opponents from the West Division since divisional play was established in the Mountain West in 2013.
