(NOTES FROM AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST IN 140 CHARACTERS OR LESS)

- @BroncoSportsFB has defeated an Autonomous 5 team in five of six seasons since joining the @MountainWest.
- @AFFootball is tied for 4th nationally with a 7-game win streak, trailing only USC (10), Western Kentucky (9) & Coastal Carolina (8).
- @UNMLoboFB has won 8 of its last 9 games, matching its best 9-game stretch since 2004-05.
- @GoAztecs have won 33 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards as a team.
- @unlvfootball's **Devonte Boyd** needs 900 receiving yds to hold the @MountainWest record for career receiving yds.
- Boyd's 2,735 career receiving yards are the 3rd-most among active pass-catchers nationally.
- @AFFootball has finished in the top-5 nationally in rushing yds/game for 2 straight seasons. The Falcons rank 3rd after Week 1, rushing for 473 yds on Sat.
- An @AFFootball score at Michigan on Sept. 16 would be the Falcons' 300th consecutive game w/o being shut out. They would become only the 5th FBS program to eclipse the 300-game mark all-time.
- @HawaiiFootball has won 5 straight games, its longest win streak since 2010 (6).
- @GoAztecs RB **Rashaad Penny** rushed for 197 yds vs. UC Davis, the 4th-most nationally in a single game this season.
- @CSUFootball's 31-point win over Oregon State on Aug. 26 is the largest against an Autonomous 5 opponent in program history.
- @CSUFootball's 31-point victory is the 5th-largest by a @MountainWest member over an Autonomous 5 team since 2010.
- @CSUFootball has sold a program-record of more than 15,000 season tickets as of the beginning of August. The previous school record was 11,500.
- @BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the fourth consecutive season.
- @GoAztecs are the first team in MW history to be selected as unanimous divisional champs in back-to-back seasons.
- @BroncoSportsFB has won 24-consecutive nonconference home games, the last loss came on Dec. 28, 2005 vs. Boston College.
- @MountainWest institutions have recorded Top-25 victories in three of the last four years.
- @SJSUSpartanFB is 1 of 3 teams nationally to play at least 3 opponents ranked in the preseason top-25 polls in the first 4 weeks.
- @SJSUSpartanFB is seeking its first win against a ranked opponent since Nov. 29, 2013 (#16 Fresno State, 62-52).
- In the 18 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant 8 times.
- @wyo_football DB **Andrew Wingard** ranks 2nd nationally in career average tackles per game (9.67).
- @BroncoSportsFB has produced a 1,000-yd rusher in eight straight seasons, which is tied with Auburn as the longest active streak in the nation.
- Against Western Carolina, @HawaiiFootball blocked 3 kicks, a program record. In 2016, UH led the @MountainWest with 4 blocked kicks all season.

BOISE STATE'S AUTONOMOUS 5 SUCCESS

Boise State has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in five of six seasons since joining the Mountain West. This year, the Broncos travel to Washington State (Sept. 9) and host Virginia (Sept. 22).

Since 2010, BSU has compiled an 11-6 (.647) record against current Autonomous 5 programs. The Broncos have defeated Arizona, Arizona State, Georgia, Oregon State, Utah, Virginia, Washington and Washington State.

JOSH ALLEN ATTENTION

Wyoming junior quarterback **Josh Allen** is one of the nation's top quarterbacks heading into the 2017 season, and he has the national interest to accompany the talent.

After the 2017 NFL Draft, ESPN NFL Insider Adam Scheffter said of Allen, "one personnel director told me this weekend, you can put it in the books, Josh Allen will be the No. 1 pick in the NFL draft next year."

If Allen were selected with the top pick, the Mountain West would have the most No. 1 overall selections among Group of 5 conferences.

JOHN URSUA'S BIG DAY

Hawai'i sophomore WR **John Ursua** caught 12 passes for 272 yards at UMass on Aug. 26. This is the fourth-most receiving yards in program history and fourth-best in Mountain West annals. Ursua's 272 receiving yards are the most by a MW pass-catcher since Thomas Sperbeck's (Boise State) 281 yards on Nov. 14, 2015.

According to Pro Football Focus, Ursua caught all 12 passes from the slot.

The Mountain Division holds an all-time record of 48-28 (.632) against opponents from the West Division since divisional play was established in the Mountain West in 2013.
