**2018 MW FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME**

Fresno State has clinched the MW West Division and a spot in the 2018 MW Football Championship Game, while Boise State and Utah State will face off on Saturday, Nov. 24 (8:15 p.m. MT on ESPN) with the winner hosting the Bulldogs in the champ game.

The 2018 Mountain West Football Championship Game will be played at the home venue of either Boise State or Utah State. If the Aggies win, they will have a better Conference win percentage than the Bulldogs, while the Broncos would host with a win due to a head-to-head victory over Fresno State on Nov. 9.

**NATIONALLY RANKED**

For the first time since Oct. 10, 2010, the Mountain West has three teams ranked in a national poll. When the Amway Coaches Poll was announced on Sunday, Nov. 18, Utah State checked in at No. 15, Boise State was No. 22 and Fresno State was No. 23.

In the AP Top 25, Utah State remaining at No. 14, while Boise State moved up to No. 21. Fresno State is just outside the top 25, receiving 100 votes.

This is the first season since 2012 that Utah State has been ranked and only the fourth team to be ranked in program history. This is the eighth week Boise State has been ranked in 2018.

**BOWL ELIGIBILITY**

Boise State, Fresno State, Hawai'i, Nevada, San Diego State and Utah State are eligible for the postseason after reaching the six-win mark. Boise State is bowl-eligible for the 17th consecutive season, which is the longest streak among the Group of 5. Fresno State is bowl-eligible for the second consecutive year under head coach **Jeff Tedford**. Hawai'i is bowl-eligible for the second year under **Nick Rolovich** and the first time since 2016. Nevada is eligible for the postseason for the first time since 2015. San Diego State is bowl eligible for the ninth consecutive season, while Utah State has earned postseason eligibility for the fifth time under head coach **Matt Wells**.

As we enter the final week of the regular season, Wyoming can become bowl-eligible with a victory at New Mexico (12:30 p.m. MT on AT&T SportsNet).

- The Mountain West has sent at least five teams to bowl games in 11 consecutive seasons.
- Over the last 14 seasons, the Mountain West owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences (.560), trailing only the SEC (.628).

**MOVING UP THE CHARTS**

Boise State QB **Brett Rypien** is the new Mountain West all-time leading passer. Rypien, who has thrown for 3,270 yards this season, claimed the top spot in a victory against then-nationally-ranked Fresno State on Nov. 9. Below is a look at the MW top 5:

#22/21 Boise State hosts #15/14 Utah State on Saturday, Nov. 24 at 8:15 p.m. MT on ESPN. The winner will host #23/RV Fresno State in the 2018 Mountain West Football Championship game.

Saturday's game is the first MW matchup between two nationally-ranked teams since Nov. 12, 2011 when No. 5 Boise State hosted No. 24 TCU. Below is a look at the nationally-ranked Mountain West matchups since 2008:

**UTAH STATE'S HOT START**

Utah State is off to a 10-1 start and is 7-0 in Mountain West play for the first time since joining the league. The Aggies are currently riding a 10-game win streak, which leads the league and is tied as the fifth-longest active streak nationally. This is the longest win streak in program history.

Utah State has scored at least 40 points in eight of its 10 victories this season and scored 60-plus points on four occasions. The Aggies rank second nationally in scoring offense, averaging 49.3 points per contest. The Mountain West record for total points in a season is 608 by BYU in 2001. Utah State is sitting at 542 points scored through 11 games.

**NOT JUST A FLASH IN THE PAN**

Below are a couple notes about Mountain West teams with continued success:

- On Saturday, Sept. 8, the Mountain West won three games against the Pac-12 (Nevada beat Oregon State, Fresno State over UCLA and San Diego State defeated Arizona State) in the same weekend for the first time since September of 2008.
- The Mountain West has won four consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy, Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).
- In the last three seasons, San Diego State has racked up 39 victories, which is the most among the Group of 5 and sixth-best nationally, trailing only Alabama (52), Clemson (51), Ohio State (45), Oklahoma (44) and Wisconsin (41).
- Head coach **Rocky Long** has led the Aztecs to a bowl game in his first seven seasons. Long is the all-time winningest head coach in Mountain West history (136-102).
- Boise State has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West. Since 2010, BSU has compiled a 12-9 (.571) record against current Autonomous 5 programs. The Broncos have defeated Arizona, Arizona State, Georgia, Oregon, Oregon State, Utah, Virginia, Washington and Washington State.
- Boise State has been nationally-ranked for at least one week for the 17th consecutive season.
- Boise State has made 16 consecutive postseason appearances, the longest streak among Group of 5 institutions and sixth-best nationally.
- Over the last 14 seasons, the Mountain West owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences (.560), trailing only the SEC (.628).

**MOUNTAIN WEST'S 20TH FOOTBALL SEASON**

Led by the vision of then-Colorado State President Dr. Albert Yates, the Mountain West was formed when presidents of eight institutions - Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming - decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference.

Mountain West football began its 20th season last Saturday as Hawai'i defeated Colorado State, 43-34. The Rams, who are an original member of the MW, played in the first-ever Conference game on Sept. 16, 1999 as BYU hosted CSU.

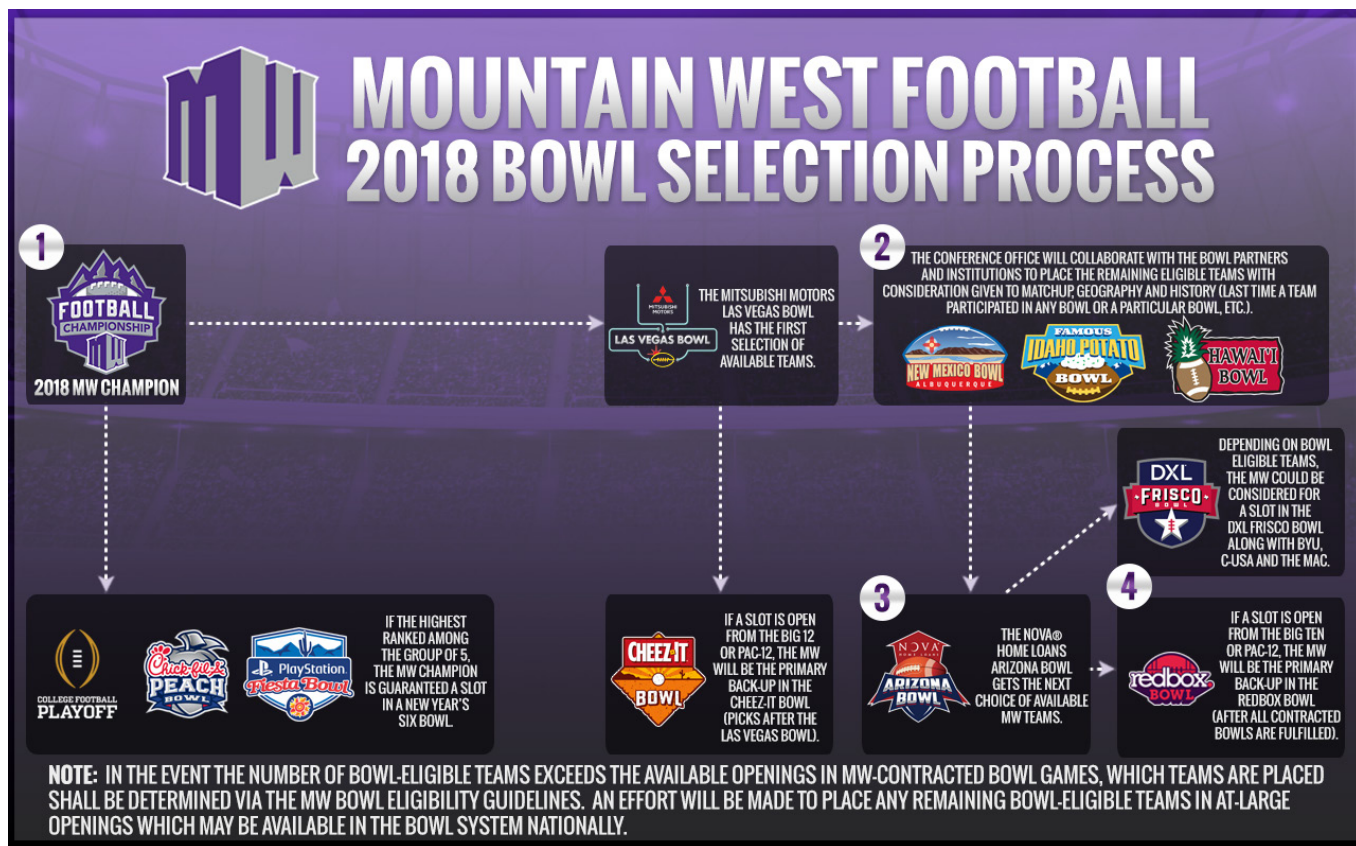

- The @MountainWest has won four consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy and Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).

- @USUFootball has opened the season 10-1 for the first time in program history. In league play, the Aggies are 7-0 for the first time since joining the @MountainWest.
- 49 FBS teams are averaging fewer points per game than @USUFootball's average margin of victory (27.2).
- @USUFootball QB **Jordan Love** ranks in the top 20 nationally in passing TDs (25; 12th), passing efficiency (162.2; 12th), passing yards (2,845; 18th) and completion percentage (66.4; 17th).
- @FresnoStateFB ranks fourth nationally in scoring defense, limiting opponents to 13.5 points per game.
- @USUFootball leads the nation with 10 non-offensive touchdowns (4 special teams, 6 defense).

- @BroncoSportsFB **Brett Rypien** is the FBS' active leading passer with 13,146 yards and last Saturday became only the 17th QB in FBS history to eclipse the 13,000-yard mark.
- @FresnoStateFB WR **KeeSean Johnson** leads the nation with at least one reception in 47 consecutive games, tied as the second-longest streak in @MountainWest history.
- @wyo\_football's **Andrew Wingard** enters the week with 449 career tackles, just six shy of setting the @MountainWest record (New Mexico's Carmen Messina - 454).
- @wyo\_football RB **Nico Evans** ranks third nationally in rushing yards per game (131.4) and is 10th in total rushing yards (1,183).
- @SDSUFootball ranks sixth nationally in rush defense, limiting opponents to just 97.3 yards per game. In the season opener, the Aztecs held Stanford's Bryce Love to 29 rushing yards.
- The Aztecs' 39 victories in the last three years are the sixth-most nationally and the most among the Group of 5, trailing only Alabama (52), Clemson (51), Ohio State (45), Oklahoma (44) and Wisconsin (41).
- Earlier this season, @AFFootball head coach **Troy Calhoun** became one of just two head coaches to win 50 Mountain West games, joining @SDSUFootball's **Rocky Long**.
- @USUFootball PK **Dominik Eberle** tied two NCAA single-game records on Sept. 8 against New Mexico State: points scored kicking (24) and most field goals from 50-plus yards (3).
- @FresnoStateFB defeated UCLA 38-14 on Sept. 22, earning its first victory against an Autonomous 5 opponent since Sept. 15, 2012 (Colorado, 69-14).
- @FresnoStateFB defeated Idaho 79-13 in the season opener. The 79 points are the second-most scored in a single game in @MountainWest history.
- @BroncoSportsFB has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West.
- In the season-opener against Troy, @BroncoSportsFB senior cornerback **Tyler Horton** tied an FBS single-game record with two fumble returns for touchdowns.

FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

**Host Determination:** The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. The host site will be determined no later than the Sunday following the conclusion of the regular season.

**Host Tie Breaker:** In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

1. Head-to-head result between the tied divisional champions.
2. If still tied:  
If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings will be used;  
-OR-  
If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;  
-OR-  
If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;  
-OR-  
If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.
3. If still tied, the best record against common Conference opponents.
4. If still tied, the team with the highest overall winning percentage (Conference and non-conference excluding exempt games).
5. If still tied, a coin toss will be conducted by the Commissioner.

2018 MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The 2018 Mountain West Football Championship game will be played on Saturday, December 1. The contest will be played at the home stadium of the regular season Mountain West divisional champion with the highest win percentage in Conference games only. ABC, ESPN or ESPN2 will broadcast the matchup.
