<u>HEAD COACH PAUL WEIR</u>

On Carlton Bragg:

"He did what I wanted him to do, which was affect the rim at both ends. I think he technically affected our two-point percentage at both ends which was good and it gave our team a little more experience on the floor, which we all need right now."

On Bragg's energy:
