

POSTGAME NOTES: TENNESSEE TECH 104, NEW MEXICO 96

- Lobos are 1-1 on the season in white jerseys

In-Game Notes

- Chris McNeal scored the most points in a single game by the Lobos this season with 29 points.
 - McNeal had 18 points in the first half on 5-9 shooting, 5-8 from three.
 - McNeal has scored in double digits in three out of four games, 20 in two.
- First time the Lobos have scored 90 points or more in three of their first four games since the 2006-2007 season, where they opened with three straight games scoring over 90 points.
- First time the Lobos have had two players score over 20 points since Tim Williams and Elijah Brown both had 26 vs. Nevada on January 7, 2017 (McNeal 29, Logwood 21).
- Last time the Lobos scored between 90-99 points was over a year ago on Nov. 16, 2016 against Houston Baptist (95).
- Lobos hit 16 threes on 39 attempts (41.0%), marking the third time they have made 16 or more this season.
- Second time Joe Furstinger has had four blocks in a game this season, tying his career high.
- Tennessee Tech's Aleksa Jugovic shot 11-12 from the field, 7-7 from three, for 31 points.
 - Jugovic shot 8-8 in the first half, 6-6 from three, for 24 points.

- Tennessee Tech's Curtis Phillips had eight steals. The last player to have five or more against the Lobos was Wyoming's Jeremy Lieberman on February 25, 2017.
- Lobos had only four turnovers in the first half
- Tennessee Tech shot 15-of-19 from the field over the final 10:40 of the first half.
 - TTU opened the game 0-10 from the field
