NEWS AND NOTES (through games of Oct. 27)

- San Diego State looks to respond to its first loss in 57 days on Saturday when it faces New Mexico in Albuquerque.
- Despite the loss last Saturday in Reno, San Diego State still controls its own destiny within the West Division of the Mountain West.
- The teams will meet for the 42nd time with the Aztecs owning a 26-15 advantage. San Diego State has won the last six games in the series (UNM's last win came on Oct. 18, 2008 with Rocky Long coaching the Lobos).
- The composite score of the 41 all-time meetings: San Diego State 1,053, New Mexico 1,046.
- SDSU has won its last two visits to Albuquerque (2014 and 2010), but prior to that lost its previous four contests. All-time, the Aztecs are 12-7 playing at New Mexico.
- SDSU head coach and New Mexico graduate **Rocky Long** has been on the winning sideline of this game each of the last 14 times the teams have met (four as the SDSU head coach, two as the SDSU defensive coordinator and eight as the UNM head coach).
- During the series win streak, **Long's** teams have outscored the opponent, 444-202, and have limited the opposition to an average of 14.4 points and 284.1 yards of offense.
- In addition to Long, defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett** is also a graduate of New Mexico. Arnett was a linebacker for Coach Long from 2005-08 in Albuquerque and earned first-team Academic All-America honors in 2008.
- The Aztecs are 37-8 in their last 45 overall games and 25-5 in their last 30 regular-season games against MW opponents (27-5 in last 32 against MW opponents, including MW championship games).
- San Diego State has played six consecutive games that have been decided by seven points or less. This is the longest active streak in the FBS and the longest streak for the Aztecs since a seven-game stretch in 2013.
- Among schools that have played at least four games decided by seven points or less this season, SDSU has the nation's best record (5-1, .833).
- San Diego State has put together a win streak of at least six games in each of the last four seasons. Only four teams in the country have a 6-plus game win streak in 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 - San Diego State, Alabama, Clemson and Ohio State.
- SDSU, which has played in a school-record eight consecutive bowl games (including all seven seasons under Rocky Long), is bowl eligible for a ninth straight year.
- San Diego State is one of only seven schools nationally to record 10 or more victories in each of the last three seasons (San Diego State, Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State and Wisconsin).
- No SDSU opponent has accumulated 400 yards of total offense this season. San Diego State's streak of holding seven consecutive opponents to less than 400 yards is tied for the fourth-longest active FBS streak (leader: Michigan, 14).
- The Aztecs have won 25 consecutive games when owning a turnover advantage. That is the nation's longest active streak, three more than No. 2 (Oklahoma, 22).

PRACTICE

- San Diego State's 6-2 start is even more impressive when considering the Aztecs have had 26 entire games missed to would-be starters this season and 33 when you include parts of games. Of those 33 games, 28 have been on the offensive side of the ball and include injuries to the school's all-time winningest quarterback **Christian Chapman** and preseason Maxwell Award Watch List member **Juwan Washington**.
- San Diego State is one of the youngest teams in the nation. Last Saturday, the Aztecs played 14 freshmen (true and redshirt) and only 12 seniors.
- SDSU has had 13 seniors see the field this season, logging a total of 54 starts (6.8 per game) and 86 games played (10.8 per game).
- Four San Diego State seniors have started every game in 2018 - AZT **Parker Baldwin**, LB **Romley Lakalaka**, DE **Anthony Luke**, and RT **Ryan Pope**. Only one of those players (Pope) is on the offensive side of the ball.

MISSING IN ACTION

As previously noted, San Diego State continues to put together another successful season despite dealing with significant injuries. Last Saturday, the Aztecs got the win despite the fact that five starters who missed the entire game, all on the offensive side of the ball. Below is a look at those players who missed all or part of the game against the Wolf Pack and their status (as of early this week) for Saturday's game against the Lobos.

SERIES NOTES

- Saturday marks the 42nd meeting between New Mexico and San Diego State, with the Aztecs owning a 26-15 series advantage.
- San Diego State has won the last six games played between the teams, although the Lobos won the eight encounters immediately prior to the Aztecs current win streak.
- Despite the Aztec victories in the last six games, New Mexico has still outscored San Diego State, 363-283 (25.9-20.2), in the last 14 games.
- San Diego State owns a 12-7 lifetime record against New Mexico in Albuquerque. The Aztecs have won on their most two recent visits, claiming a 30-20 win in 2010 and a 24-14 victory in 2014.
- SDSU and New Mexico met in 34 consecutive seasons from 1978 through 2011. That streak came to an end in 2012. On Saturday, the Aztecs and Lobos will meet for the 38th time in the last 41 seasons.
- San Diego State head coach Rocky Long has been on the winning sidelines of the San Diego State-New Mexico series each of the last 14 times these teams have played. He was victorious in his final eight seasons while the head coach in Albuquerque, winning every game between the teams from 2001-08. In 2009, he joined the Aztecs as the defensive coordinator and posted wins in 2009 and 2010. In 2011, he took over as SDSU's head coach and posted and has won all four meetings since gaining that title.

- In addition to winning the last 14 meetings, his team has outscored the other by a 444-202 margin (242 points). His average margin of victory is 17.3 points. Additionally, his defensive unit has held the opposition to 14.4 points and 284.1 yards, while forcing 2.2 turnovers during the streak (last 14 SDSU-UNM games).
- Current SDSU head coach and former New Mexico head coach Rocky Long dominated this series the previous 18 seasons. While at UNM, Long's teams went 9-2 against the Aztecs, winning in each of his final eight seasons in Albuquerque. Long helped New Mexico hold San Diego State to nine points or less in four of his last seven seasons and 17 points or less in eight of the last nine meetings.
- Prior to the 2009 victory at home, which started the current six-game winning streak, SDSU's last win over New Mexico was Nov. 4, 2000 (SDSU 17, UNM 16).
- San Diego State's 26 victories are the second most for the program against any Division I opponent. The Aztecs' 29 victories over rival Fresno State are first.
- Seventeen points would have been enough to win eight of the last 15 games between the teams. The losing team has scored a total of 218 points in the last 15 games combined (average of 14.5 points per game).
- Of the last 22 series meetings, 10 have been decided by a touchdown or less. Of those 10 games, one game was decided by one point, five games were decided by three points, one game was decided by five points, one game was decided by six points and two games were decided by seven points.
- The Aztecs won 13 consecutive games in the series from Nov. 17, 1984 through Oct. 19, 1996, with the streak broken on Oct. 11, 1997.
- The composite score of the previous 41 meetings is San Diego State 1,053, New Mexico 1,046, making the average score SDSU 25.7, New Mexico 25.5.
- The last 16 times there has been a difference in the amount of turnovers between the two teams, the team committing fewer turnovers is 12-3 (one time TO total was the same).
- **SERIES TIDBITS:** San Diego State has defeated New Mexico in six consecutive meetings for the first time in the Mountain West era and first time since a school-record 13-game winning streak from 1984-96... New Mexico has scored 279 points in the last 10 meetings (29.7 ppg), but only 101 points in the last six meetings (16.8 ppg) since Rocky Long has been affiliated with SDSU... San Diego State has scored more than 24 points just four times in the last 16 meetings... San Diego State has had a turnover advantage against New Mexico just twice since 2002... In the last 11 meetings, the Aztecs own a -13 turnover margin... In the last 10 meetings, San Diego State has had an average field position disadvantage four times, including games with a margin disadvantage of -22, -20, -13 and -7... In 2011, the Aztecs rushed for five touchdowns as part of a 230-yard effort on the ground... In the last four encounters against UNM, San Diego State has rushed for 1,126 yards 14 touchdowns... SDSU-NEW MEXICO CONNECTIONS

- SDSU head coach Rocky Long was head coach at the University of New Mexico for 11 years. While leading the Lobos from 1998-2008, coach Long compiled a UNM-record 65 victories and had five bowl game appearances, and was named the 2002 Mountain West Coach of the Year. He also coached New Mexico from 1978-80, serving as the secondary and offensive backs coach.
- UNM is coach Long's alma mater and he was a three-year starter at quarterback. He earned team MVP honors three times and was named Western Athletic Conference offensive player of the year as a senior.
- Aztec defensive coordinator Zach Arnett grew up in Albuquerque, N.M., and was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker at UNM from 2005-08. Arnett played under SDSU head coach Rocky Long who was the UNM head coach at the time.
- UNM defensive coordinator and linebackers coach Kevin Cosgrove coached with SDSU offensive coordinator Jeff Horton at Wisconsin from 1999-2003, during which time Cosgrove was the defensive coordinator and Horton the quarterbacks coach. Horton and Cosgrove also coached together at Minnesota in 2010 when Horton served as the offensive coordinator and, later in the season, interim head coach while Cosgrove was the co-defensive coordinator.
- Horton also has ties with UNM defensive line coach Stan Eggen. The two spent time together on the UNLV coaching staff in 1991, when Horton was the assistant head coach and Eggen served as the defensive ends/linebackers coach, and again from 1994-96

when Horton was head coach and Eggen was defensive coordinator/linebackers coach.

SAN DIEGO – Rashaad Penny ran for 203 yards and two touchdowns in his final game at SDCCU Stadium in a 35-10 San Diego State victory over New Mexico.

It was the fourth straight win for the Aztecs (10-2, 6-2 MW), who reached double-digits in wins for a third consecutive season for the first time in program history.

Penny scored on a 20-yard run in the second quarter and a 51-yard scamper in the third en route to breaking 2,000 yards for the season. SDSU became the first team in NCAA FBS history with back-to-back 2,000 rushing yard seasons by different players (Donnel Pumphrey in 2016, Penny in 2017).

Penny became the first FBS player since Tulane's Matt Forte in 2007 with at least 200 yards rushing in four consecutive games. The four straight games with at least 200 rushing yards is one short of tying an NCAA FBS record.

San Diego State scored the first 21 points of the game and, after a missed field goal by the Lobos' (3-9, 1-7 MW), the final 14 in the win.

The Aztecs scored on their first drive of the game when Christian Chapman found Kahale Warring from nine yards out. Key plays on the drive were a 41-yard run by Penny and a 24-yard pass from Chapman to Nick Bowden on a third-and-10 situation.

SDSU's next score came after a 10-play, 81-yard drive over four minutes late in the second quarter. On the drive, Chapman was 5-for-6 for 61 yards before Penny punched it in from 20 yards out, putting San Diego State up, 14-0, at the half.

Penny went to work once again on the Aztecs' first possession of the second half, accounting for all 65 yards on the ground, ending with a 51-yard score.

UNM finally got on the scoreboard after SDSU's Quest Truxton fumbled a punt. Jason Sanders cashed in for New Mexico with a 46-

After forcing a three-and-out, New Mexico made it a two-score game at 21-10 when Tekava Tuioti connected on a 62-yard pass to Jay Griffin IV on a third-and-6.

Forcing another three-and-out, the Lobos quickly got into San Diego State territory in the fourth quarter, but were stopped at the 18-yard line. Sanders' 35-yard field goal attempt then sailed wide right, keeping the score at 21-10.

Chapman later found Fred Trevillion with a 47-yard touchdown pass and Juwan Washington scored on a 60-yard run for the final points of the game.

Each of UNM's final two possessions of the game ended with interceptions by Aztec true freshman Tariq Thompson.

Washington added 84 yards on the ground for SDSU on just nine carries (9.3 avg.), while Chapman was 14-for-21 for 198 yards and two touchdowns.

Kyahva Tezino registered a career-high 14 tackles with 2.5 for a loss to lead the San Diego State defense, which held New Mexico to under 100 yards rushing for the first time since 2012. Thompson added eight tackles, two interceptions, two pass breakups and a tackle for loss.

The Aztecs now have 10 seasons with at least 10 victories.

MEET THE BACKFIELD

Entering the season, one of San Diego State's strengths was its offensive backfield. With the program's all-time winningest quarterback, Christian Chapman, and a Maxwell Award Watch List and 1,000-yard rusher, Juwan Washington, the Aztecs looked to have one of the best backfields not only in the Mountain West, but nationally.

Due to injuries at quarterback, running back and fullback, SDSU has relied heavily on three players that had not started prior to injury to their position mates.

KICKING IT WITH JBII

San Diego State football's John Baron II has established himself as one of the top placekickers in the country. The senior has already earned the Mountain West Special Teams Player-of-the-Week honors four times this season and, despite playing his home games at sea level, he is first in the nation's among all FBS players in career field goal percentage (min. 25 FGM).

He has earned conference player of the week accolades four times this season, following San Diego State games against Arizona State on Sept. 15, Eastern Michigan on Sept. 22, at Boise State on Oct. 6 and San José State on Oct. 20. He has won the honor five times in his career.

On the season, Baron is 14-for-16 in field goal attempts (.875) and 15-for-15 on PATs, leading the team with 57 points. Among the FBS leaders, Baron ranks in a tie for first in PAT percentage (1.000, T-1st in MW), a tie for 10th in field goals per game (1.75, 2nd in MW), a tie for 11th in field goal percentage (.875, 2nd in MW), a tie for 19th in touchback percentage (69.0, 2nd in MW) and a tie for 29th in touchbacks (29, 3rd in MW). He's also kicked off 42 times for 2,615 yards (62.3 avg.) with 28 going for touchbacks. If you take away his three squib kicks for 100 yards, the left-footer is averaging 65.1 yards per kickoff (39 KO for 2,540 yards) with a 74.4 touchback percentage (29 TB in 39 KO).

Among the all-time kickers in NCAA FBS history, Baron ranks sixth in field goal percentage (.870) for his career, going 47-for-54. Among active FBS kickers, he ranks first in field goal percentage (.870, min. 25 FG) and road field goal percentage (.917, min. 10 FGM), tied for 11th in field goals (47), 12th in field goals per game (1.34) and tied for 13th in points (264) (15th in points regardless of position). Among the all-time SDSU kickers, he is second in field goal percentage (.870), third in PATs (123), third in points (264) and PAT percentage (.984), and fourth in field goals (47), while also ranking sixth overall at SDSU in scoring (264 points).

Baron has already set the school record for most field goals from 50+ yards in a single season (4) and in a career (5).

Baron

Here is a look at Baron's recent performances in games.

- Baron helped the Aztecs to a 16-13 win over San José State on Oct. 20 by accounting for 10 of SDSU's 16 points in the game. He was 3-for-3 on field goal attempts, tying his season high with three field goals, and made his lone PAT. The senior first connected on a 36-yarder with 16 seconds left in the first half to give San Diego State a 10-6 lead. Baron then made a 22-yarder in the third quarter to put the Aztecs up, 13-6. He finished his night with a 51-yarder with 4:36 left in the game, which proved to be the game-winning kick in a 16-13 game. Baron also kicked off five times for 322 yards (64.4 avg.) with three touchbacks.
- At Boise State, Baron was 2-for-2 in field goals, with makes from 36 and 41 yards, and made his only extra point attempt and had four touchbacks on five kickoffs (his non-touchback resulted in the Broncos starting at its own 26-yard line).
- In the victory over Eastern Michigan, Baron was 3-for-4 on field goal attempts and 2-for-2 on PATs. The senior hit a 34-yarder in the first quarter to put SDSU on top, a 50-yarder to tie the game at 20-20 with 1:16 left in the fourth quarter and a 38-yarder to win the game in overtime. Baron also kicked off five times for 275 yards (55.0 avg.) and four touchbacks. If you take away the one squib he kicked off, he would've averaged a perfect 65.0 average (four for 260 yards) on the other four attempts.
- The week before, Baron helped the Aztecs down No. 23/25 Arizona State making both of his field goal attempts and both PATs. Baron's first field goal was a career-long 54-yard kick, which put SDSU up, 17-14, midway through the third quarter and gave San Diego State a lead it would not relinquish. The 54-yard field goal is tied for the second longest in school history. He later added a 36-yard field goal to give the Aztecs a 20-14 lead. Baron also kicked off six times for 361 yards (60.2 avg.) with two touchbacks. If you take away the squib kick he booted with seconds remaining in the first half, he would have averaged a perfect 65.0 yards per kickoff.

ROCKY LONG HITS THE CENTURY MARK

When San Diego State faced San José State on Oct. 20, it marked the 100th game of the Rocky Long era (counts time as a head coach only). The three-time conference coach of the year has already left his mark on the Aztec program. In addition to his success at SDSU, Long is the all-time winningest coach in Mountain West history and owns a career record of 134-99.

Below are a few of the many accomplishments and notables from Long's time as head coach.

- Has compiled a 70-31 record at SDSU. The 70 victories are the second most in school history (Don Coryell, 104) and are double that of the previous three head coaches (Brady Hoke, Chuck Long and Tom Craft), combined (35). In the program's previous 100 games, the Aztecs were 38-62.
- Long has guided San Diego State to seven bowl games in his first seven seasons as head coach and has been part of eight straight bowl appearances for SDSU. That equals the total number of bowl appearances the Aztecs had in their previous 87 seasons prior (1921 through 2009).
- The Aztecs have 21 conference championships but had only two in the 37 years from 1975 until 2011. Long has guided SDSU to conference championships in three of the last six seasons (2012, 2015 and 2016).
- San Diego State has nine victories over AP Division I nationally-ranked teams in school history. Rocky Long has been the head coach for three of them, was the defensive coordinator for one and also has a win over a team that was ranked in the coaches poll (but not the AP poll).
- San Diego State did not appear in the AP Top 25 poll for 20 years until Long guided the Aztecs into the national ranking in 2016. In school history, SDSU has spent 22 weeks in the AP poll, eight of those weeks have come under Long (four in 2016, four in 2017).
- San Diego State is one of just seven schools in the nation to record 10 or more victories each of the last three seasons (Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, San Diego State and Wisconsin).
- San Diego State has recorded a six-game win streak in each of the last four seasons (2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018). San Diego State joins Alabama, Clemson and Ohio State as the only teams in the nation to accomplish that.

Below is a look at San Diego State's team record and accomplishments the decades prior to Long's arrival along with what SDSU did while Long was the defensive coordinator and head coach.

THOU SHALL NOT RUN

San Diego State has spent the last several seasons among the nation's elite at stopping the run. Since the beginning of the 2015 season, the Aztecs rank third nationally in rushing yards allowed per game (110.5) and second in rushing yards per attempt (3.2).

In 2018, San Diego State is second in rushing yards per carry (2.4) and second in rushing yards allowed per game (80.9).

In five of the eight games this season, the opposition is averaging 1.8 yards per carry or less.

That has been on display so far this season. In the opener, the Aztecs held 13th-ranked Stanford to 50 yards rushing on 28 carries for a 1.8 average and no rushing touchdowns. In Stanford's other seven games to date, the Cardinal has rushed 204 times for 711 yards, 3.5 per rush average, and 101.6 yards per game.

Against Sacramento State, the Hornets carried 31 times for 53 yards for a 1.7-yard per carry average. In its other seven games Sacramento State carried 272 times for 1,581 yards, 5.8 yards per carry, 224.4 rushing yards per game and 16 rushing touchdowns.

In the contest against Arizona State, the Aztecs held the Sun Devils to season lows in rushing yards (36) and yards per rush (1.5).

Below are a few tidbits on the significance of that season-opening performance against No. 13 Stanford:

- Stanford's 50 yards rushing were its fewest in a game since being held to 29 yards at No. 10 Washington on Sept. 30, 2016.
- The 50 yards rushing were its fewest against an unranked team since rushing for -8 yards at Oregon State on Oct. 27, 2007.
- No team (ranked or unranked) had held the Cardinal to as few as 50 yards rushing in a Stanford home game since No. 23 Arizona State held them to -2 yards on Sept. 29, 2007.

- Also, Bryce Love was held in check by the Aztec defense, amassing just 29 yards on 18 carries (1.6 average). In his career up to that point, he had 22 games with at least seven carries and his 29 yards rushing are 12 fewer than he had in any of those contests. In fact, entering the SDSU game, he had at least 100 yards rushing in 14 of the last 15 games he had seven or more carries. The 1.6 yard average is the lowest of his career for any game in which he had at least five carries.

THE NATION'S BEST LINEBACKER

Junior linebacker Kyahva Tezino has not only established himself as a leader on the defensive side of the ball, he is beginning to assert himself as one of the most impactful players in college football.

According to *Pro Football Focus*, Tezino has the third-highest grade for an inside linebacker in the nation this season. He has been credited with 48 defensive "stops" by PFF, and has yet to be called for a penalty in 546 defensive snaps this season.

Against Air Force, Tezino recorded his second consecutive game with nine defensive stops (defined by *Pro Football Focus* as an offensive failure). Those nine stops were tied for the most in the country that week.

In the road victory over Boise State, he may have been the most dominant player on the field. Tezino was strong against the run with (according to *Pro Football Focus*) nine defensive stops, with six coming on run attempts. He performed well in coverage as well with just 21 total receiving yards allowed in coverage on three receptions. Once again, he was sensational providing pressure with one sack, four quarterback hits and two hurries.

Since being named a starter on Oct. 28, 2017 (13 games), Tezino has totaled 128 tackles and 13.0 tackles for loss. If those 13 games counted as a season, Tezino would have the eighth most tackles in a single-season. If you prorate that into a 14-game season (conference championship and bowl game), he would have 138 tackles, the fifth highest total in school history.

Tezino has led the team in tackles nine of the 13 games since he's become starter, posting five double-digit tackle games over that span (three this season).

Over his last three games, Tezino has totaled 33 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss.

MEET CHASE JASMIN

Sophomore running back Chase Jasmin has been featured prominently in the last five games. A native of Agoura Hills, Calif., Jasmin started the season as the backup to Juwan Washington, but has moved up the depth chart following the injury to the Maxwell Award Watch List candidate against Eastern Michigan.

Through seven games, Jasmin has proved to be more than an adequate backup but has shown abilities seen only in elite backs. Although he has 106 carries for 460 yards, a 4.3 average, and four touchdowns this season, he has made the most of his opportunities.

Below are a few notes on Jasmin's performance to date:

- According to *Pro Football Focus*, Jasmin ranks fifth in Elusive Rating (78.2) among Mountain West running backs this season.
- Of his 106 carries this season, he has 27 avoided tackles. That is the fourth-highest figure in the Mountain West despite starting just three games (Juwan Washington is still tied for second with 29 despite not playing since the second quarter

- He already has seven carries of 15+ yards, meaning that he logs a rush of at least 15 yards every 15.1 carries. In addition, he also has posted 12 carries of at least 10 yards this season.
- Through the first two games of this season, Jasmin had played a total of 70 offensive snaps in his career. That has changed recently as he posted career highs in the category in three consecutive games vs. Arizona State (26 snaps) and Eastern Michigan (32 snaps), and Boise State (53 snaps).

DEATH, TAXES AND TRENTON THOMPSON

Sophomore safety Trenton Thompson is playing the best football of his career. He has played 323 snaps through eight games this season after playing a total of 61 snaps entering the season.

Tidbits on the ultra reliable Thompson:

- Thompson has 35 tackles this season (3rd on the team) with zero missed tackles.
- In 2018, Thompson has more tackles without a missed tackle than any other safety in the Mountain West.
- In his career, the sophomore has played 384 defensive snaps and has been credited with just one missed tackle (Nov. 5, 2016 vs. Hawai'i).
- As if one missed tackle was not impressive enough, Thompson also has been whistled for two career penalties (one came last week at Nevada).

AGNEW MAKING HIMSELF AT HOME AT QB

Junior quarterback Ryan Agnew is off to a 5-1 start as a starter at the position for San Diego State, leading the Aztecs to victories over No. 23/25 Arizona State, Eastern Michigan, at rv/No. 24 Boise State, Air Force and San José State. He suffered a loss last week despite setting career highs in completions (20), passing yards (283) and passing touchdowns (3).

- Prior to entering the game against Sacramento State on Sept. 8 (for the injured Christian Chapman), Agnew had attempted a total of nine passes and no more than three in a given game.
- He became the first quarterback from a Group of 5 school to defeat a nationally-ranked school from a Power 5 school in his first start since Sept. 26, 2009 when B.J. Daniels, USF defeated 18th-ranked Florida State.
- In his six games as a starter, Agnew is 68-of-138 (49.3 percent) for 1,000 yards, seven touchdowns and two interceptions. He has a quarterback rating of 124.0. In addition, he has rushed for 75 yards total in his six starts.
- Since becoming a starter (Sept. 15), Agnew is sixth nationally in yards per completion at 14.71.
- Agnew passed for at least 113 yards in each of his first five starts. The Aztecs reached the 129-yard passing mark in just two of the eight games prior to Agnew's starts.
- Agnew's three touchdowns at Nevada were the most by an Aztec since Christian Chapman threw three vs. Hawai'i on Nov. 5, 2016.

RENO, Nev. -- San Diego State saw its six-game winning streak snapped in a 28-24 loss at Nevada Saturday night in Reno, Nev.

The Aztecs (6-2, 3-1 Mountain West) jumped out to a 24-15 lead at the half, but the Wolf Pack (5-4, 3-2 MW) scored all 13 points in the second half in the upset win.

SDSU went up by 14 early thanks to a pair of touchdown passes by Ryan Agnew. Agnew drove San Diego State 75 yards on 12 plays on the first drive of the game, culminating with a 2-yard touchdown pass to Chase Jasmin just 5 minutes, 44 seconds into the game. The Aztecs converted all three third downs on the drive, including Jasmin's pass from Agnew on a third-and-goal situation from the 2-yard line.

After forcing a 3 and out, SDSU mounted an 8-play, 80-yard drive, ending with a 16-yard pass from Agnew to Kahale Warring. On the drive, Agnew was 3-for-4 for 59 yards with a 29-yard pass to BJ Busbee, a 14-yarder to Elijah Kothe and the 16-yard TD pass to Warring.

Nevada, however, scored 15 straight points, beginning with a safety after San Diego State left guard Daishawn Dixon was whistled for a holding penalty in the end zone, making it 14-2 Aztecs.

After a kickoff out-of-bounds, the Wolf Pack started on the 50 and answered when Ty Gangi connected with a short pass to Toa Tava on a second-and-25 play. Tava tiptoed down the sidelines and raced into the end zone to close SDSU's lead to 14-9 after the first quarter.

Nevada took its first lead of the game midway through the second quarter as Gangi's 26-yard strike to Brendan O'Leary-Orange capped a 6-play, 53-yard drive.

After a missed PAT by Ramiz Ahmed, San Diego State grabbed the lead back on an 11-play, 73-yard drive that used up 4:27 of the clock, finishing with a 26-yard chip shot field goal by John Baron II. The key play in the drive was a 15-yard pass from Agnew to BJ Busbee on a third-and-13 situation.

After a 3 and out, the Aztecs went 63 yards on just three plays and a penalty. Starting on their own 37-yard line, Agnew found Chance Bell on a 14-yard pass, followed by a 4-yard run by Bell. After a pass interference penalty while defending Kobe Smith, Agnew found Warring with a 30-yard touchdown pass, marking Warring's first career game with multiple touchdown catches.

SDSU went into the half up by a 24-15 score. At the half, San Diego State had outgained the Wolf Pack, 320-168, while possessing the ball 18:48 out of the 30 minutes. The 320 yards in the first half were more than the Aztecs had in their previous three games (293 vs. San José State, 297 vs. Air Force, 267 at Boise State).

After the break, the Wolf Pack made it a 2-point game when Devonte Lee's 2-yard score finished an 8-play, 75-yard drive. Gangi

was 4-for-5 for 68 yards on the drive.

After forcing a 3 and out, Nevada returned a SDSU punt 31 yards to get all the way to the Wolf Pack 36. The San Diego State defense was able to hold Nevada out of the end zone, but Ahmed's 32-yard field goal put the Wolf Pack back on top at 25-24.

Early in the fourth quarter, Nevada was forced to punt after another stop by the Aztec defense. SDSU's Jordan Byrd, however, misplayed the ball and Jomon Dotson jumped on it at the San Diego State 17. The Aztecs limited the Wolf Pack to another field goal by Ahmed, this time from 34 yards to make it 28-24, Nevada.

SDSU got into Wolf Pack territory on each of its final three drives of the game, but came up empty, including a Hail Mary that was knocked down near the end zone as time expired.

Agnew set career highs with 283 passing yards and three touchdowns for San Diego State, while Warring had a career bests of six catches, 95 yards and two touchdowns.

The duo of Chase Jasmin (85 yards) and Bell (78) combined for 163 rushing yards.

The Aztecs outgained Nevada, 456-297.

Besides a 6-game winning streak, other streaks that were snapped included a 7-game conference winning streak, 8-game road winning streak at MW, West Division opponents and a 5-game MW road winning streak (regardless of division).

Other streaks that were snapped were a 28-game winning streak when recording at least 400 yards of total offense, a 26-game winning streak when holding an opponent to under 300 yards of total offense, a 14-game winning streak when leading at the half and a 13-game winning streak when recording at least 20 first downs.

Parker Baldwin and Kyahva Tezino led the SDSU defense with six tackles apiece.

WASHINGTON OFF TO BIG START

Junior running back Juwan Washington was enjoying a tremendous start to his role as the featured back in the San Diego State offense. He ranked among the national leaders in nearly every category after joining Rashaad Penny and Marshall Faulk as the only Aztec players to produce 150-yard rushing efforts in the opening two games of the season.

After opening with games of 158, 156 and 138 yards rushing, he suffered a broken clavicle late in the second quarter of the fourth game of the season against Eastern Michigan. The current estimate is that he will miss approximately six weeks.

Among his early season highlights prior to the injury:

- Washington's entered the Eastern Michigan game with these national rankings: first in forced missed tackles (28, nine more than any other player in the country; *courtesy Pro Football Focus*), third in rushing yards after contact (291), fourth in rushing yards per game (150.7), fifth in all-purpose yards per game (190.0) and ninth in rushing TDs (5).
- Washington joins Marshall Faulk (1992) and Rashaad Penny (2017) as the only running backs in SDSU history to open a season with consecutive 150-yard rushing games.
- Against Sacramento State, Washington became the 20th player in school history with at least 1,500 career rushing yards.
- Against Stanford, Washington averaged 6.6 yards per carry, which is the highest by any Aztec player with at least 15 carries against an AP Top 25 opponent since Ronnie Hillman (24 carries, 191 yards) averaged 8.0 yards per carry against No. 22 Air Force on Oct. 16, 2010. By comparison, recent SDSU running backs best against top 25 foes were Donnel Pumphrey's 5.9 average at No. 21 North Carolina on Sept. 6, 2014 and Rashaad Penny's 5.5 average against No. 19 Stanford on Sept. 16, 2017.
- Washington has carried 57 times on first down for 314 yards (an average of 5.5 yards per carry). In his career, the junior has averaged 6.0 yards per carry on first down.
- This season he has six rushes of at least 20 yards and now has 19 rushes for at 20+ yards in his career.

CHAPMAN WAS WINNING GAMES, CLIMBING CHARTS

Earlier this season, senior quarterback Christian Chapman made his 31st consecutive start against Sacramento State and broke the school record for most victories by a quarterback (24). Unfortunately, Chapman was unable to finish the game, suffering a MCL sprain that at the time was expected to keep him out somewhere between three and six weeks.

In addition to being the signal-caller over San Diego State's most successful period in program history, the Carlsbad native is in extremely rare company.

Below are a few of his accomplishments.

- Chapman is 24-7 as a starter. The 77.4 winning percentage is the highest in San Diego State's Division I era (min. 15 starts.).
- With 24 career victories, Chapman surpassed Ryan Lindley (23), current SDSU defensive GA coach, for the most wins as a starter at quarterback in the Division I era for the Aztecs.
- Chapman has the longest active streak in FBS in games with fewer than two interceptions as a starting quarterback at 31.
- His streak of 31 straight quarterback starts without more than one interception is the second-longest streak since 2012, only trailing Navy's Keenan Reynolds (45 games).
- Chapman has 4,528 career passing yards. That ranks 14th on the school's career list.
- San Diego State is 11-0 when he has a passer rating of 165.0 or higher.
- Chapman has nine career games with multiple touchdown passes and has never thrown more than one interception in a game (38 career games).

- San Diego State has won seven of its last nine road games (7-2).
- The Aztecs have won 15 of their last 19 true road games (started Oct. 10, 2015 at Hawai'i) and 17 of their last 22 games away from San Diego (also defeated Houston in 2016 Las Vegas Bowl and Cincinnati in 2015 Hawai'i Bowl).
- SDSU has won 39 consecutive regular-season games (does not include bowl games) when rushing for at least 200 yards (last regular-season loss: San José State, Sept. 22, 2012).
- San Diego State has won a nationally-leading 25 straight games when having a turnover advantage (last loss: vs. Navy, Dec. 23, 2014) and is 28-2 the last 30 times it has been even or had a turnover advantage in a game.
- The Aztecs have won 25 consecutive games when forcing at least two turnovers in a game.
- San Diego State is 7-1 the last eight times it has been an "underdog".
- SDSU is 60-12 this decade when holding its opponent to a passing rating of 130.0 or less.
- San Diego State is 31-3 the last 34 times when owing an edge in time of possession.
- The Aztecs are 34-5 since the start of the 2015 campaign when holding an opponent below 400 yards.
- SDSU is 30-4 the last 34 times it has committed one turnover or less.
- Christian Chapman** is a SDSU DI-era record 24-7 (.774) as the starting quarterback. That is the highest win percentage in the school's Division I era (since 1969) (min. 15 starts). On Sept. 8, he passed Ryan Lindley (2008-11) for the most victories by an Aztec quarterback in the Division I era.
- San Diego State has the nation's best turnover ratio (+39) since the beginning of the 2015 season. The Aztecs have one turnover or less in 15 of the last 20 games.

THE PROGRAM

Below are a few tidbits on the San Diego State football program. The Aztecs are coming off three straight seasons with at least 10 wins.

- San Diego State is one of 17 teams nationally to play in a bowl game each of the last eight seasons (2010-17) and one of just two from the Group of 5 (also Boise State).
- With 10 victories last season, San Diego State has recorded its third straight campaign with double-digit wins. It marks the seventh time in the Division I era and the 10 time in school history that it has recorded a double-digit win season. Prior to 2015, San Diego State went 37 seasons without recording a 10-win campaign.
- San Diego State is one of seven teams to win at least 10 games each of the last three seasons (others: Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Wisconsin). <<< See chart on page 4, left
- San Diego State has put together a win streak of at least six games in each of the last four seasons. Only four teams in the country have a 6-plus game win streak in 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 - San Diego State, Alabama, Clemson and Ohio State.
- Since the beginning of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State has won 38 games. That is the sixth-highest win total nationally during that span, trailing only Alabama (49), Clemson (48), Ohio State (42), Oklahoma (41) and Wisconsin (39).
- Among California's seven FBS schools, San Diego State owns the second-highest winning percentage this decade. The Aztecs' record of 79-35 trails only Stanford and ahead of USC, UCLA, Fresno State, California and San José State. <<< See chart on page 4, left
- San Diego State has advanced to eight consecutive bowl games. The Aztecs join Stanford as the only football teams in California - FBS or NFL - to advance to the postseason in each of the past eight seasons.
- With bowl game appearances in a school-record eight straight seasons, the Aztecs have equaled their total number of bowls played in the 87 prior seasons (1921 through 2009).
- Aztec head coach Rocky Long is in his eighth season as head coach and 10th year on The Mesa. The Mountain West's all-time winningest coach, Long has guided SDSU to 70 victories.
- Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 (.322) and owned the nation's 106th-best winning percentage. Since 2010, San Diego State is 79-35 (.699) and owns the nation's 17th-best winning percentage.
- With 79 wins in their last 114 games (79-35 since the beginning of the 2010 campaign), the Aztecs have equaled their win total from the previous 196 games (79-117).
- San Diego State won 32 games from 2015-17. That is the most prolific three-year period in school history. The previous mark was set when the Aztecs won 30 games from 1966-68 just prior to the Division I era.

BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense this season - senior quarterback Christian Chapman, sophomore center Dominic Gudino, junior left guard Daishawn Dixon, sophomore right guard Keith Ismael, senior right tackle Ryan Pope, sophomore left tackle Tyler Roemer, senior wide receiver Fred Trevillion. Of those seven players, only three are seniors (also two juniors, three sophomores).
- Jeff Horton is in his eighth season at San Diego State and his fourth as SDSU's offensive coordinator (served the previous four seasons as an assistant head coach and running backs coach). Among his other experience, he served as the head coach at Nevada and UNLV and interim head coach at Minnesota. In addition to being the offensive coordinator, he is also an associate head coach.
- Junior quarterback Ryan Agnew is scheduled to make his sixth career start at quarterback for the Aztecs this Saturday. He is the first player other than Chapman to start a game for the Aztecs since Nov. 28, 2015.
- Agnew became the 43rd different player to start at quarterback for the Aztecs in the Division I era (see page 205 of the media guide for details). Of the 42 players making their inaugural SDSU start in the Division I era, Agnew became the 20th to win their first start. The last three players making their first start Maxwell Smith (Aug. 30, 2015) and Christian Chapman (Dec. 5, 2015) were victorious.

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

- Twice this season the Aztecs have accumulated more than 36 minutes of TOP. SDSU is 17-3 with 13 straight wins under Rocky Long when getting at least 36 minutes of time of possession.
- SDSU has scored 27 or more points in 20 of the last 29 games and in 32 of the last 44 games.
- San Diego State has scored 30 or more points in 25 of their last 43 games (1,371 points total, 31.9 ppg).
- The Aztecs are 33-3 the last 36 times they have scored at least 30 points and 45-8 in the Rocky Long era when scoring 30-plus points.
- Since Oct. 3, 2015, San Diego State is 34-5 when scoring at least 20 points.
- **Since the beginning of 2014, SDSU is 37-6 when committing one turnover or less and 8-11 when having two or more turnovers in the game. San Diego State has one turnover or less in 36 of the 49 games since the start of the 2015 campaign.**
- San Diego State has one turnover or less in 15 of its last 20 games.
- **SDSU is 30-3 in the last 33 games when owning an edge in time of possession.**
- **San Diego State is 66-16 in the Rocky Long era when scoring just 20 or more points.**
- The Aztec offense had the second-fewest interceptions last season (4).
- Chapman had started 31 consecutive games, the longest streak on either side of the ball, before missing the Arizona State game with a knee injury.
- Daishawn Dixon, Keith Ismael and Tyler Roemer have played all 543 snaps on offense this year.
- Juwan Washington has all of his 22 touchdowns (18 rushing, three kick return, one receiving) over his last 24 games played.

RUSHING OFFENSE

- San Diego State has a 100-yard rusher in three games this season (4, 100-yard rushers total) and has at least one in 25 of its last 35 games since 2016 (33, 100-yard rushers total) and 34 of the 49 games since Jeff Horton took over as the offensive coordinator in 2015 (45, 100-yard rushers total). Since Horton arrived as the running back coach in 2011, SDSU has a 100-yard rusher in 70 of the 101 games and 85, 100-yard rushers overall.
- **San Diego State is 41-1 the last 42 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards and is 39-0 in its last 39 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards.**
- Juwan Washington has 19 career rushes for 20-plus yards.
- Washington ranks eighth in the MW in rushing yards (513) and tied for ninth in rushing touchdowns (5), despite missing the last 4 ½ games.
- When the game is within seven points in the fourth quarter, Washington has rushed 16 times for 98 yards (6.1 avg.) with two touchdowns.
- **Washington was one of just three Aztec running backs in program history to start the season with at least two straight 150-yard rushing games (Marshall Faulk, 1992 and Rashaad Penny, 2017).**
- According to *Pro Football Focus*, Washington ranks in a tie for 19th in FBS with 29 forced missed tackles and is tied for 54th in 15-yard runs (8), despite missing the last 4 ½ games.
- Washington became the 16th Aztec to rush for 100-plus yards in a season opener (17th occasion overall) when he rushed for 158 yards at No. 13/13 Stanford.
- Washington's 158 yards rank as the sixth most in a season opener by SDSU in the Division I era (since 1969) and the eighth most against a nationally ranked opponent.
- Washington's 6.6 yards rush average was the highest by any Aztec player with at least 15 carries against an AP Top 25 opponent since Ronnie Hillman (24 carries, 191 yards) averaged 8.0 yards per carry vs. No. 22 Air Force on Oct. 16, 2010.
- Chase Jasmin ranks fifth in the Mountain West in rushing yards per game (68.13), sixth in rushing yards (545) and seventh in rushing yards per carry (4.47).
- Jasmin is also tied for 28th with 27 forced missed tackles (according to Pro Football Focus).
- **San Diego State had two 100-yard rushers vs. No. 23/25 Arizona State (Washington - 138 and Jasmin - 112) for the 29th time in program history (the Aztecs are 28-1 in those occasions, including a 15-0 mark in the Rocky Long era) and now have multiple 100-yard rushers eight times in the last 29 games.**
- Washington and Jasmin became the 20th different combination in program history to record a 100-yard rushing game in the same game.
- Jasmin became the 77th different player in school history with a 100-yard rushing game.
- If you take away the 14 times that Ryan Agnew has been sacked this year (for 99 yards), he has rushed 26 times for 195 yards (7.5 avg.).
- If you take away the seven times Christian Chapman has been sacked this year (for 62 yards), he has rushed once for six yards (6.0 avg).

PASSING OFFENSE

- Since the start of the 2017 season, San Diego State has thrown eight interceptions. That is tied for the fifth-fewest picks in the nation (Alabama, 5).
- Christian Chapman is 24-7 as a starting quarterback, winning both the 2015 and 2016 MW Championship game and the 2015 Hawai'i Bowl and 2016 Las Vegas Bowl.
- In five career postseason appearances (MW championships and bowl games), Chapman is 4-1 and has completed 39 of 62 attempts (62.9 pct.) for 554 yards and three touchdowns against two interceptions for a 147.48 pass efficiency rating.
- Chapman has the longest streak of games with one or less interceptions (31) among active FBS quarterbacks.
- Chapman's streak is also the longest in FBS play since Navy's Keenan Reynolds went 45 games without more than one interception in a game from 2012-15.
- Chapman's all-time SDSU Division I era (since 1969) ranks (min. 15 starts): first in quarterback victories (24) and in quarterback winning percentage (.774), and sixth in pass efficiency rating (143.7).

- Chapman has nine career games with multiple touchdown passes and has never thrown more than one interception in a game.
- Chapman has four second-half come-from-behind wins, tied with David Lowery and Mark Halda for the fourth most in SDSU's Division I era (since 1969).
- Chapman's 31 consecutive starts at quarterback were the program's most since Ryan Lindley started a school-record 44 straight from Oct. 18, 2008-Dec. 17, 2011.
- For his career, Chapman has 35 touchdown passes against 11 interceptions.
- Chapman's 167 attempts without an interception last year were only 11 shy of Dan McGwire's school record of 178 set in 1990.
- Ryan Agnew ranks 10th in FBS play (1st in MW) in passing yards per completion (14.67).
- Agnew also ranks sixth in the MW in passing yards per attempt (7.48, 62nd in FBS), seventh in passing yards per game (165.67) and total offense per game (179.28), ninth in pass efficiency rating (123.52) and passing yards (1,159), and 10th in passing touchdowns (7) and completion percentage (50.97).
- Against No. 23/25 Arizona State, Agnew became the first quarterback from a non-Power 5 school to beat a nationally ranked team from a Power 5 school in his starting debut since USF's B.J. Daniels against No. 18 Florida State on Sept. 26, 2009.
- Agnew became the third straight Aztec starting quarterback to win his Aztec debut (also Maxwell Smith vs. San Diego on Aug. 30, 2015 and Chapman vs. Air Force on Dec. 5, 2015) (SDSU quarterbacks were just 1-13 in the previous 14 starting debuts).
- Agnew also became the first Aztec quarterback to beat a nationally ranked team in his starting debut (other quarterbacks were 0-4 when their debut was against a ranked squad).
- For his young career, Agnew is 5-1 and has three second-half come-from-behind victories.
- Fred Trevillion ranks second among active FBS players in career catch average (23.7, min. 27 receptions).
- Trevillion led the country with a 27.2-yard catch average (min. 10 rec.) last season.
- Ethan Dedeaux set career highs with six receptions and 90 yards in just his second career start and game played against Sacramento State. His 90 yards were the most by an Aztec freshman since at least 1996 and the fifth most since Jeff Horton took over as offensive coordinator in 2015.
- Kahale Warring had six catches for 95 yards and two touchdowns at Nevada. Among SDSU tight ends in a game since 1996, those numbers rank in a tie for first in touchdowns (2), and a tie for fifth in receiving yards (95) and receptions (6). Among tight ends in a FBS game this year, those numbers rank in a tie for second in touchdowns (2), a tie for 22nd in catches (6) and a tie for 27th in receiving yards (95).

BULLET NOTES - DEFENSE

- For just the second season since arriving at San Diego State prior to the 2009 campaign, Rocky Long will not serve as the team's defensive coordinator (although he will continue to call the defense).
- Zach Arnett is in his first year as defensive coordinator and enters his eighth season as the linebackers coach.
- San Diego State returns seven starters off last season's squad which was one of the top units nationally. Returning in 2018 are senior AZ Parker Baldwin, junior LB Troy Cassidy, junior DE Myles Cheatum, senior DT Noble Hall, senior LB Ronley Lakalaka, junior CB Ron Smith, sophomore WAR Tariq Thompson.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

- Since Nov. 14, 2015 (includes 40 SDSU games), San Diego State ranks fifth in total offense allowed per game (307.3) and 11th nationally in points allowed per game (19.1).
- Since the beginning of 2009, when Rocky Long took over as defensive coordinator, the Aztecs rank 10th nationally in yards per rush allowed (3.6), 15th in yards per touch (6.3), 16th in rushing yards per game (134.8), 18th in yards allowed per game (344.3), 26th in points allowed per game (23.0) and 38th in turnovers forced (221).
- SDSU has returned six interceptions for touchdowns since the beginning of the 2016 season (tied for 8th nationally).
- In its eight games this year, San Diego State's defense has allowed just 305.6 yards and 19.6 points per game. In the other games for SDSU's eight opponents, they are averaging 419.0 yards and 31.3 points per game.
- Opponents this year have had 97 drives where they have tried to score on SDSU's defense (excludes kneel downs to end half/game). The Aztecs have forced 3 and outs (or better) in 42 of those drives (43.3 pct.). The 43.3 pct. is the fifth-best mark in the country, while the 5.25 3 and outs per game is tied for 12th in FBS play.
- The Aztec defense ranked second in the country in fourth down defense (22.2 pct.) a year ago. This year SDSU's opponents are 4-for-11 (36.3 pct.). Of the last 35 fourth-down chances against the Aztec defense dating back to 2016, opponents have converted just eight times (22.9 pct.).
- SDSU has held an opponent scoreless on its opening drive 38 times since 2015 (49 games).
- Ronley Lakalaka has the most starts among any player on the Aztec defense (33).
- Ron Smith has started in 27 straight games, the longest streak on offense or defense.
- Parker Baldwin has played in 49 consecutive games, the longest streak on the team.
- Baldwin's 49 games played are also the most on the team.
- Darren Hall was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week for his play against Eastern Michigan, when he had four tackles (all solo) and an interception in overtime to give SDSU the ball back for a game-winning field goal. Hall, who entered the game with just 22 career snaps (one in 2018), logged 43 snaps vs. EMU, allowing just 21 passing yards on four targets.
- D. Hall was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week for the second time in three weeks (SDSU was off in between) for his play at rv/No. 24 Boise State, recording game- and career-high nine tackles, leading the Aztecs for the first time of his career. Also had an interception (his second in as many defensive snaps, while recording his first career sack, tackle for loss and forced fumble. Played

- a career-high 71 snaps after entering the game with just 44 for the season and 65 for his career.
- Kyahva Tezino** was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week for the first time of his career for his play against Air Force, posting a game- and season-high 15 tackles, including 10 solo stops, while adding a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry.
- Tezino** has played 546 of the team's 547 snaps on defense (99.82 pct.), the most on the defensive side of the ball.
- Tezino's numbers over his last 13 games (all starts) - 128 tackles and 12.0 tackles for loss; numbers over his first 17 games (no starts) - eight tackles and 1.5 tackle for loss.**
- Tezino** has five double-digit tackle games (three this year).
- Tezino** had three straight games with double-digits in tackles (41 total) prior to tying for the team lead with seven in an Aztec 28-14 win over Sacramento State.
- Tezino** has led the team or tied for the team lead in tackles 10 times for his career (all over the last 13 games), including six of the eight games this year.
- Tezino** leads the team with 72 tackles.
- Tezino** ranks in a tie for 46th in FBS (7th in MW) in total tackles per game (9.00).
- Tariq Thompson** became the first Aztec true freshman to start on defense in the 2017 opener (Sept. 2) against UC Davis since Leon McFadden started at Colorado State on Oct. 24, 2009.
- Ta. Thompson** was also the first SDSU true freshman to start on defense since McFadden started the 2009 opener at UCLA.

RUSHING DEFENSE

- Through the first six weeks of the season, the Aztecs were one of only three teams to not allow a run for at least 20 yards.
- SDSU ranks second in FBS play in defensive rush average (2.4) and in rush defense (80.9).**
- Kyahva Tezino** leads the Aztecs with 55 tackles on rushing plays.

PASSING DEFENSE

- Under head coach **Rocky Long**, San Diego State is 41-6 in games in which the opponent has a passing efficiency rating of 116.50 or less.
- Since the beginning of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State's 70 interceptions are the most in the country (by a margin of four), while its 10 interception returns for touchdowns are third in the country, trailing only Alabama (16) and Ohio State (12).**
- Since 2010, the Aztecs are 51-10 when holding the opponent to 200 or fewer passing yards.
- Darren Hall** ranks in a tie for fourth in the Mountain West in both interceptions (2, T-55th in FBS) and interceptions per game (0.28, T-56th in FBS).
- Ron Smith** leads the team with 21 stops on passing plays.
- R. Smith** had 16 pass breakups a year ago, the second most in SDSU single-season history.
- Tariq Thompson** ranks in a tie for second among active FBS leaders in interceptions per game (0.33).
- Ta. Thompson** ranks in a tie for fourth in the MW (T-55th in FBS) in interceptions (2) and a tie for seventh in interceptions per game (0.25).
- Ta. Thompson's** five interceptions last year tied for the most by a freshman in FBS play and he was one of only two true freshmen with five interceptions.
- Ta. Thompson** had an 83-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. Northern Illinois, SDSU's longest since Leon McFadden had a 96-yard interception score at Fresno State on Sept. 29, 2012 and the fourth longest by an Aztec since at least 1996.
- Kyree Woods** had four pass breakups against No. 23/25 Arizona State, which are tied for the ninth most in a FBS game this season.

- ESPN Team Efficiencies ranked San Diego State's special teams unit as the 23rd best in the country in 2015, 13th in 2016 and 28th in 2017.
- Former SDSU captain **Doug Deakin** is in his eighth season with the program and his first as special teams coordinator. He also coaches the tight ends.

- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 10 kickoff returns for touchdowns, the most in FBS play over that time and three more than No. 2 (Kansas State, Memphis and Pittsburgh are second with seven).**
- Among the all-time kickers in NCAA FBS history, John Baron II ranks sixth in field goal percentage (.870).**
- Among active FBS kickers, **Baron** ranks first in field goal percentage (.870, min. 25 FG) and road field goal percentage (.917, min. 25 FGM), tied for 10th in field goals (47), 12th in field goals per game (1.34), and 13th in points (264) (15th in points regardless of position). Baron also ranks sixth overall at SDSU in scoring (264 points).
- Among all-time SDSU kickers, **Baron** ranks second in field goal percentage (.870), third in PATs (123) and points (264), and fourth in field goals (47) and PAT percentage (.984).
- For his career, Baron is 4-for-4 in field goal attempts when the score is within three points in the fourth quarter (2-for-2 from 50-plus). This season, he's 3-for-3 (2-for-2 from 50-plus).**
- Baron** leads the team this year with 57 points.
- If you take away **Baron's** three squib kicks for 100 yards, he is averaging 65.1 yards per kickoff (39 KO for 2,540 yards) with a 74.4 touchback percentage (29 TB in 39 KO).
- Baron** had a 50-yard field goal in three consecutive games from Sept. 8-22, which was tied for the third-longest streak since 1996, one shy of Florida State's **Graham Gano** (4 from Sept. 27-Oct. 25, 2008) and West Virginia's **Josh Lambert** (4 from Sept. 20-Oct. 18, 2014).
- Among the FBS leaders, **Baron** ranks in a tie for first in PAT percentage (1.000, T-1st in MW), 10th in field goals per game (1.75, 2nd in MW), a tie for 11th in field goal percentage (.875, 2nd in MW), 19th in touchback percentage (69.0, 2nd in MW), a tie for 29th in touchbacks (29, 3rd in MW) and 44th in kickoff average (62.9, 4th in MW).

- **Baron** also is tied for fourth among kickers in the MW in points per game (7.13) and tied for sixth among all players.
- **Baron** has a long field goal of 54 yards, which ranks in a tie for second in school history and a tie for fifth in FBS this year.
- **Baron** is one of just two FBS kickers this season with four field goals from 50-plus yards and the only one who has made all four attempts from 50-plus yards.
- For his career, **Baron** has never missed a field goal in an Aztec loss.
- **Baron** has made multiple field goals 16 times, including five times this year.
- **Baron** was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week for his play against No. 23/25 Arizona State, where he was 2-for-2 in field goals and 2-for-2 in PATs, making a career-long 54-yard field goal in the third quarter (T-2nd longest in school history and T-5th in FBS play this season).
- **Baron** became the first player to be named the MW Special Teams Player of the Week in back-to-back weeks since UNLV punter Logan Yunker accomplished the feat in 2013 (Sept. 23-30), going 3-for-4 on field goal attempts and 2-for-2 on PATs against Eastern Michigan, hitting a 34-yarder in the first quarter to put SDSU on top, a 50-yarder to tie the game at 20-20 with 1:16 left in the fourth quarter and a 38-yarder to win the game in overtime.
- **Baron** was named the MW Special Teams Player of the Week for a third time in four weeks against his play at rv/No. 24 Boise State (SDSU did not play in between), making both of his field goal attempts (36 and 41 yards) and his lone PAT. Became the first player to win the special teams award three times in a season since Utah's Shaky Smithson in 2010 and the first to win it three times in four weeks since Utah's Louie Sakoda won it three straight weeks from Oct. 8-22, 2007.
- **Baron** picked up his fourth MW Special Teams Player-of-the-Week award for his play against San José State, going 3-for-3 on field goal attempts, including a game-winning 51-yarder with 4:36 left in the game, and 1-for-1 on PATs. Became first player to win the MW Special Teams Player of the Week four times in a season since Utah's Sakoda in 2018.
- **Baron** had made 25 straight field goals of 50 yards or less before missing one against Stanford on Sept. 16, 2017. The 25 straight makes of 50 yards or less is still a Mountain West record.
- Among the active career FBS leaders, **Juwan Washington** ranks in a tie for fifth in kick return touchdowns (3) and 25th in kick return average (25.0).
- **Brandon Heicklen** ranks fifth in the Mountain West in net punt average (39.2, 45th in FBS) and eighth in punt average (41.8, 54th in FBS).
- **Heicklen** has the most punts on the season (41) in FBS play without a touchback and is one of 14 overall without a touchback (min. 2.5 punts per game).
- If you take away the nine times **Heicklen** has punted inside his opponent's territory (for 302 yards), he has punted 32 times for a 44.16 average.
- **Taylor Hawkins** leads the Aztecs with six tackles on special teams and five stops on the punt return unit.
- **Marc Ellis**, **Elijah Kothe** and **Seyddrick Lakalaka's** two tackles are the most on the kickoff unit.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Was one of four NCAA players who visited U.S. servicemen in Vietnam in the summer of 1971, spending two weeks visiting different U.S. bases
- Bobby Knight paid Long a home visit and recruited the two-sport athlete to play basketball at Army
- Left New Mexico as the all-time leading rusher (2,071 yards) and threw just 23 interceptions in 30 career games

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has the most all-time victories in the Mountain West with 132 (three of his previous 135 wins came in the WAC).
- Was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2002, 2012 and 2015.
- In his 19th season as a head coaching experience and has spent 20-plus seasons as a defensive coordinator.

AT SAN DIEGO STATE

- Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- In 2012, led the Aztecs to a share of the Mountain West title at 7-1. It was San Diego State's first Mountain West championship and first league title since 1998. The Aztecs then won the MW title in 2015, defeating Air Force, 27-24, in the MW Championship game and again in 2016 in a 27-24 win at Wyoming.

COACHING PRIOR TO SAN DIEGO STATE

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.
- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico as a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

PERSONAL:

- Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at the university level. Roxanne was hired in July of 2012 as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school in Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year, having compiled a 306-79 (.795) record in 10 years, including a pair of regional finals appearances in 2008 and 2009.

SDSU Winning Streaks Snapped

- Three-game winning streak against Power 5 schools.
- Six-game winning streak in road games.
- Five-game winning streak as an "under-dog."
- Three-game winning streak against Pac-12 opponents.
- Eight-game winning streak in the month of September.
- Four-game winning streak in season openers. SDSU is now 50-41-5 all-time in season openers, including a 26-24-1 mark in the Division I era (since 1969).

- The Aztecs had scored in 21 consecutive quarters, the second-longest active streak in FBS (Louisville, 25), before being held scoreless in the second quarter.
- SDSU did not start with the ball for just the 13th time in the last 85 games.

- San Diego State dropped to 47-14 in the Rocky Long era when scoring first.
- The Aztecs dropped to 42-9 in the Rocky Long era when leading after the first quarter.

Aztecs Fall in Opener at No. 13/13 Stanford

STANFORD, Calif. -- San Diego State kept Heisman Trophy candidate Bryce Love in check, but unable to stop the K.J. Costello-JJ Arcega-Whiteside connection in a 31-10 loss in the 2018 opener at Stanford Stadium.

Costello threw for 332 yards and four touchdowns, and Arcega-Whiteside caught six passes for 226 yards and three scores to give the Cardinal (1-0) its 20th consecutive non-conference home win.

The Aztecs (0-1), who last year defeated Stanford, 20-17, in San Diego, held Love to just 29 yards on 18 carries (1.6 avg.). Love, who entered the game with at least 100 rushing yards in 14 of the last 15 games, posted the lowest average of his career with a minimum of five carries.

Committed to stop the run, SDSU held the Cardinal to just 50 yards total on the ground on 28 attempts (1.8 avg.), its fewest in a home game since Sept. 29, 2007.

Costello, however, connected on touchdown passes of 38, 19 and 80 yards to Arcega-Whiteside, and later on a 19-yard strike to Colby Parkinson.

After a slow start, San Diego State used a methodical 8-play, 92-yard drive to get on the scoreboard late in the first quarter on a 4-yard run by Juwan Washington. Washington had 84 yards alone on the drive, including a 40-yarder which got the Aztecs into Stanford territory for the first time of the game.

After exchanging punts for the next few series, SDSU was forced to start at its own 1-yard line when Jack Bailey's 63-yard punt went out-of-bounds. Three plays later, quarterback Christian Chapman was sacked in the end zone for the safety.

Late in the second quarter, it appeared San Diego State would have a chance to add to its 7-2 lead when Andrew Aleki deflected a Costello pass into the hands of Noble Hall. Hall started running the other way, but Cardinal wide receiver Trenton Irwin raced back, forced a fumble and jumped on the loose ball, giving Stanford some life. The Cardinal took advantage in just three plays when Costello found Arcega-Whiteside in the end zone from 38 yards out, taking a 9-7 lead into halftime.

Costello stretched its lead to 16-7 on its first drive of the third quarter as Costello found a wide-open Arcega-Whiteside in the end zone with a 19-yard pass.

The Aztecs mounted a 10-play, 62-yard drive of their own, mainly through the air, culminating with a 30-yard field goal by John Baron II. Chapman was 5-for-7 on the scoring drive for 61 yards.

On Stanford's ensuing drive and facing a punt on 3rd and 15, Costello rolled out to his left and fired a deep pass to Arcega-Whiteside, who caught it over a fallen Kyree Woods and raced 80 yards for the touchdown. Following a successful 2-point conversion, the Cardinal ran its lead to 24-10.

SDSU got back into Stanford territory, but was stopped on a 4th and 1 on the 32-yard line as the fourth quarter began.

The Cardinal put the game away on its next drive with Costello's fourth touchdown pass of the game found Parkinson from 19 yards out.

Costello finished the game 21 of 31 for 332 yard and four touchdowns.

Washington led San Diego State's rushing attack with 158 yards on 24 carries (6.6 avg.), the sixth-highest total by an Aztec back in a season opener and the eighth most against a nationally ranked opponent.

Parker Baldwin and Kyahva Tezino each had 11 tackles apiece to pace the SDSU defense.

Big Notes

- Christian Chapman won his 24th career game, the most by a starting quarterback in SDSU's DI history (since 1969), passing Ryan Lindley's 23 victories from 2008-11 (wins count for quarterbacks who start the game).
- Rocky Long recorded his school-record 18th second-half comeback victory as coach at SDSU (No. 2 is Claude Gilbert at 13).
- SDSU had a 100-yard rusher in its seventh straight game (eight, 100-yard rushers total), and has one in 24 of its last 29 games since 2016 (31, 100-yard rushers total) and 33 of the 43 games since Jeff Horton took over as the offensive coordinator in 2015 (43, 100-yard rushers total).
- San Diego State improved to 16-3 in its last 19 home games dating back to Oct. 3, 2015. During that stretch, the Aztecs have outscored the opposition, 609-342.
- SDSU won its fifth straight home opener.
- The Aztecs improved to 13-4 in their last 17 games, 19-6 in their last 25 and 32-7 in their last 39.
- SDSU had its streak of games with one or less interceptions snapped at 40. It was the longest active streak in FBS (second was 21) and second-longest streak in FBS since 1996.

Team Notes

- San Diego State had lost nine consecutive games when trailing after three quarters prior to tonight. The Aztecs' last win when trailing after three quarters came on Nov. 23, 2013 against Boise State (W, 34-31 in OT).
- SDSU's 15 passing first downs were its most since recording 15 against Air Force on Nov. 21, 2014.
- SDSU's 271 passing yards were its most since throwing for 291 in the 2016 opener against New Hampshire (Sept. 13, 2016).

Aztecs Rally Past Sacramento State, 28-14

SAN DIEGO -- Jwan Washington rushed for 156 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, as San Diego State rallied for a 28-14 triumph over Sacramento State before a crowd of 45,755 at SDCCU Stadium.

Washington, who also finished with a personal-best 36 carries, posted two of his scores in the final four minutes and change to help the Aztecs (1-1) capture their fifth straight home opener and win for the ninth time in their last 10 September games.

SDSU was forced to overcome the loss of starting quarterback Christian Chapman, who completed 6-of-11 passes for 112 yards before leaving with 4:47 left in the second quarter due to a knee injury. Backup Ryan Agnew took over for the rest of the game, recording 159 yards on 11-for-17 passing -- all career highs.

Trailing 14-13 at the 9:18 mark of the fourth quarter, Agnew directed the Aztecs on a 13-play, 82-yard scoring drive, punctuated by Washington's four-yard scamper into the end zone. Moments later, Agnew hit tight end Parker Houston for a two-point conversion that put the host school up for good 21-14 with 4:05 to go.

The Aztec defense displayed its mettle on the ensuing possession, sacking Sacramento State quarterback Kevin Thomson on two occasions, including one by Kyahva Tezino on a 4th-and-3 situation that gave the ball back to SDSU on the Hornet 25 with 2:57 to go. On the second play after the possession change, Washington hit pay dirt with a 20-yard burst up the middle that put the game out of reach.

Earlier in the first quarter, San Diego State opened the scoring on its second drive of the contest, marching 69 yards in nine plays, with Washington darting in from five yards out to provide the Aztecs a 7-0 edge at the 4:39 mark. SDSU overcame an 11-yard sack and an ineligible receiver penalty, as Washington uncorked a 30-yard run on a 2nd-and-26 situation to give the Aztecs a first down at the Sacramento State 18.

SDSU extended its advantage to 10-0 early in the second quarter, capitalizing on a short Hornet punt after John Baron drilled a career-long 52-yard field goal, which is tied for the eight-longest in program history.

Sacramento State responded with their longest foray of the game, consuming 7:26 of the clock before BJ Perkinson capped the 14-play, 75-yard drive with a 1-yard plunge, which narrowed the gap to 10-7 at the 6:07 mark.

The Aztecs salvaged another field goal on their next drive, as Chapman exited after two plays. On his first snap of the night, Agnew completed a 13-yard pass to Dedeaux and later flashed his mobility with 14-yard scramble down the left sideline on a 3rd-and-6 play. The march stalled at this juncture, but Baron split the uprights from 32 yards out to give the host a 13-7 cushion heading into the locker room.

The Hornets wasted no time cashing in on an Angew interception in the third quarter as Thomson found a wide-open Perkinson, who streaked past the Aztec defense for a 64-yard touchdown reception on the first play after the interception, giving the visitors their first lead of the night at 14-13 with just under nine minutes remaining in the period.

SDSU, however, responded with the two Washington touchdowns to secure the win.

For the second straight game, SDSU had its run defense clicking, as the Hornets were held to just 53 yards on the ground. Tezino and Kyree Woods led the Aztec charge with seven tackles apiece, while Parker Baldwin, Trenton Thompson, Ron Smith and Ronley Lakalaka finished with six stops each.

Dedeaux led the receiving corps with six catches for 90 yards, while Wilson and Kahale Warring had three grabs apiece in the victory.

SDSU outgained Sacramento State 429-234 and maintained a 12-minute edge in time of possession (36:02-23:58), improving to 27-2 in the last 29 games when holding the ball longer than its opponent.

- **At San Diego State:** Athletic, mobile quarterback with an accurate arm ... Can throw on the run and in the pocket ... Is listed as the starting quarterback heading into the New Mexico game this weekend for the seventh time of his career with Christian Chapman out 3-to-6 weeks because of a knee injury suffered against Sacramento State on Sept. 8.

Also ranks sixth overall at SDSU in scoring (264 points) ... For his career, is 4-for-4 in field goal attempts when the score is within three points in the fourth quarter (2-for-2 from 50-plus) ... Has never missed a field goal in an Aztec loss.
- **2018 (Senior):** Is on the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award Watch List for a second consecutive season ... Also is a preseason all-Mountain West third-team selection by *Phil Steele Magazine* ... Is almost perfect on the season, going 14-for-16 on field goal attempts (.875) and 15-for-15 on PATs ... Also has kicked off 42 times for 2,640 yards (62.9 avg.) with 29 going for touchbacks ... If you take away his three squib kicks for 100 yards, is averaging 65.1 yards per kickoff (39 KO for 2,540 yards) with a 74.4 touchback percentage (29 TB in 39 KO) ... Had a 50-yard field goal in three consecutive games from Sept. 8-22, which was tied for the third-longest streak since 1996, one shy of Florida State's Graham Gano (4 from Sept. 27-Oct. 25, 2008) and West Virginia's Josh Lambert (4 from Sept. 20-Oct. 18, 2014) ... Has been chosen as a team captain in a team-high seven games this season ... Made his only field goal attempt - a 30-yarder - and PAT at No. 13/13 Stanford in the opener, where he was one of the team's four captains for the game ... Also kicked off four times for 257 yards (64.3 avg.) with three touchbacks ... The only kickoff that didn't result in a touchback came after a Stanford safety, which made Baron have to kick off from the SDSU 20 (instead of the SDSU 35) ... Was 2-for-2 in field goal attempts and 2-for-2 in PATs against Sacramento State ... Made a then career-long 52-yard field goal in the second quarter ... Also kicked off six times for 386 yards (64.3 avg.), recording five touchbacks in six chances ... Was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week for his play against No. 23/25 Arizona State, where he was 2-for-2 in field goals and 2-for-2 in PATs while serving as a team captain ... Was rated as a 5-star kicker by *kohls-kicking.com* and was ranked as the 12th-best kicker in the class of 2014 by the website ... Was a two-star recruit by *Rivals.com* and 247sports ... Also played soccer at Chaparral, where he was named the defensive MVP ... A scholar-athlete.

Among the active career FBS leaders, ranks in a tie for fifth in kick return touchdowns (3) and 25th in kick return average (25.0) ... Has 19 career rushes for 20-plus yards ... Has 22 touchdowns (18 rushing, three kick return, one receiving) over his last 24 games ... Is out for six weeks with a broken right clavicle, suffered in the second quarter against Eastern Michigan on Sept. 22.
- **2018 (Junior):** Is on the preseason Maxwell Award Watch List (college player of the year) and the Paul Hornung Award Watch List (most versatile player) ... Is a preseason first-team all-Mountain West selection at running back by *Athlon Sports* and *Street & Smith's*, and second team by *Phil Steele Magazine* ... Recorded his second straight 100-yard rushing game of the season and fourth of his career ... Joined Marshall Faulk (1992) and Rashaad Penny (2017) as the only Aztecs to start a season with consecutive 150-yard rushing games ... Set career-high for rushing attempts (36), touchdowns (3) and all-purpose yards (201) ... For his efforts, was named to the *Pro Football Focus* Mountain West Team of the Week and was an Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Honorable Mention Player of the Week ... Ran for 138 yards and one touchdown on 27 carries, while adding 26 receiving yards on two catches against No. 23/25 Arizona State ... Also added a 14-yard kick return ... Was named to the Paul Hornung Award weekly Honor Roll and to the *Pro Football Focus* Mountain West Team of the Week for his performance ...
