ABOUT THE MATCHUP

- The Lobos enter Saturday night's matchup 3-1 in their last four games, most recently an exciting 85-81 victory on the road at UNLV on Wednesday.
- San Diego State is riding a two-loss streak, falling at home against Fresno State on Saturday (77-73) after dropping an 83-80 final on the road at Boise State.
- The Lobos lead the series with SDSU 46-38 including a 28-11 advantage at The Pit.
- UNM swept the Aztecs last season with wins both in Albuquerque (64-59) and in San Diego (68-62). Prior to last season however, SDSU had gone on a four-win streak.
- The Lobos are led by four players averaging double digits in conference play including junior Anthony Mathis (14.4), freshman Makuach Maluach (13.1), senior Joe Furstinger (12.3) and senior Antino Jackson (11.7).
- UNM has suited up just nine players over the last four games. Affectionately referred to as the "Nasty Nine," the limited Lobo roster is 3-1 averaging 80.0 points per game.
- San Diego State is led by three players averaging in double figures in conference play including senior Malik Pope (14.5), junior Devin Watson (14.0) and redshirt-freshman Jalen McDaniels (13.5).
- SDSU, while slow in league play, has had some impressive victories this season including vs. current No. 13/14 Gonzaga by a score of 72-70 on Dec. 21 at home.

SCOUTING SAN DIEGO STATE

SDSU enters Saturday's game coming off of two tough losses by a combined seven points against Boise State on the road, 80-83, and Fresno State at home, 77-73. Despite their 3-3 Mountain West record, the Aztecs have had an impressive non-conference season including wins over Georgia (75-68) and currently ranked No. 13/14 Gonzaga, 72-70.

After dropping their conference opener at Wyoming, 82-69, the Aztecs kicked in gear for three straight wins before their most recent two losses. Lobo fans can expect SDSU to be thirsty for a win upon their return to The Pit.

SDSU is led on the season by junior Devin Watson who averages 13.4 points per game followed by senior Malik Pope who adds 13.1 and a team-best 6.8 rebounds per game. Also averaging 6.8 rebounds per game is redshirt-freshman Jalen McDaniels who averages just 8.8 points per game on the season, but 13.5 per game in conference play.

SERIES HISTORY

The Lobos lead the series history between the two teams 46-38 including a 28-11 advantage inside The Pit. The Lobos swept the Aztecs last season with a victory on the road on Jan. 1, 2017 (68-62) before also claiming the win when SDSU traveled to Albuquerque on March 4, 2017. UNM topped the Aztecs 64-59 on Senior Night in The Pit.

Prior to the Lobos' last two victories, SDSU had won four straight games in the series and is a narrow 11-9 over UNM in the last 20 meetings.

FIRST YEAR COACH BATTLE

Both Lobo head coach Paul Weir and Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher are in their first seasons coaching their squads. In addition, both are new to the head coaching game. This season marks Dutcher's first season as a head coach while it is Weir's second.

MALUACH FEVER

Freshman Makuach Maluach has stepped up big time for the Lobos in his inaugural season and is currently averaging 13.1 points per game in conference play good for second on the Lobo squad. Maluach has posted six double-digit games this season including in the last four straight contests. He has also led UNM in scoring three times.

Against Fresno State, Maluach tallied a career-high 21 points against the Bulldogs.

The Lobos are 5-1 overall when Maluach scores in double digits.

FURSTINGER'S 5 - 5 DOUBLE-DOUBLES AND COUNTING

Senior Joe Furstinger has burst on the scene as a force to be reckoned with over the last few weeks. He posted his first career double-double against Rice, a 17-point, 12-rebound performance, before outdoing himself against Prairie View A&M with a new career-best 20 points and his second straight double-double.

NEW MEXICO NOTES

Fans, players and staff alike waited to see if Furstinger would continue the #JoeMentum in conference play and the senior did not disappoint. He dropped 12 points and 12 rebounds for his third straight double-double against Air Force and 10 points and 10 rebounds against Nevada for his fourth.

He posted his fifth in UNM's victory over Wyoming and came close once again against Fresno State, scoring eight points and grabbing eight boards, and again in UNM's big win over UNLV (14 pts, 9 rebs).

In his first 11 games of the season, Furstinger totaled 59 points. In the past nine, he has accumulated 123 including double digits in eight of the last nine games.

MATHIS BREAKOUT - 7 GAME STREAK

In his past two seasons, junior Anthony Mathis averaged just 2.3 and 2.9 points per game, respectively. This season, Mathis has registered 14 double-digit scoring games, leading the Lobos, and boasts a 10.8 points per game average. So far in conference play, Mathis is leading the Lobos with 14.4 points per game. He has collected 11 or more points in the past seven games for UNM, since the Lobos started conference play against Air Force.

In UNM's win over UNLV on Wednesday, Mathis scored the eventual game-winning 3-pointer with just 11 seconds left to give UNM a two-point advantage, 83-81.

Mathis has emerged as the Lobos' go-to 3-point shooter as he posts a 45.2% mark from behind the arc, ranking him third in the Mountain West on the season. He has scored 67 times from the floor this season, 52 of which have been threes.

3-POINT FRENZY - 10TH IN THE NATION

The Lobos are currently 10th in the nation in total made 3-pointers and 14th in 3-pointers per game. So far this season, Lobos have scored 215 3-pointers. Food for thought: the Lobo record for most 3-pointers in a season is 301. At its current pace, UNM could break the record.

In addition, the Lobos have attempted 611 3-pointers so far this season and the program record for most 3-point attempts on a season is 782, set in 1993-94.

DON'T FOUL WITH US!

The Lobos boast the highest free-throw shooting percentage in the Mountain West among all games played this season - 77.1%. UNM is also ranked 16th in the country in free throw percentage.

THE NASTY NINE

In the last four games, nine Lobos have suited up for competition, allowing for just four bench players, and have defied expectations. The Lobos have gone 3-1 over their last four games.

The eight scholarship players consist of seniors Joe Furstinger and Antino Jackson, juniors Jachai Simmons, Dane Kuiper, Chris McNeal and Anthony Mathis, as well as freshmen Makuach Maluach and Vladimir Pinchuk. Additionally, redshirt-junior and walkon Mike Mondragon saw minutes against San José State and UNLV.

In press conferences and radio interviews, Coach Weir explained his method to this madness - so to speak - designating deflections and other statistics in the most recent game as the primary determining factor in this season's Lobo starters.

ABOUT THE 2017-18 LOBOS

The 2017-18 Lobos have just five returning student-athletes from the 2016-17 squad and feature an outstanding nine newcomers. Under first-year head coach Paul Weir, the Lobos look to improve on their 17-14 overall record last season, 10-8 in Mountain West play.

Top returners for the Lobos include lone regular starter Sam Logwood who averaged 7.3 points per game for a .449 field goal percentage and a .671 percentage from the free throw line. All four other Lobos to return to UNM this season played in at least 10 games, including junior Dane Kuiper who started 13 games, averaging 6.0 points per game.

NEW COACH, NEW ERA

At the helm of the Lobos in the 2016-17 season will be head coach Paul Weir, officially named the 21st head coach in UNM men's basketball history on April 11, 2017. Weir spent the last season with New Mexico State where he finished 28-6 and led NMSU to a WAC Tournament Championship and an NCAA appearance. Weir is the first basketball coach to serve as the head coach for both New Mexico DI institutions.

LOBO TRANSFERS

Of the nine fresh faces to the UNM squad, the Lobos welcome in six new transfers, four of which will be eligible to compete in the 2017-18 season. Those that are eligible and will don the Lobo Cherry & Silver this season include junior Chris McNeal (Indian Hills), senior Antino Jackson (Akron), junior Jachai Simmons (Midland College) and junior Troy Simons (Polk State). The pair of transfers that will not see action this season is JaQuan Lyle (Ohio State) and Vance Jackson (UCONN) due to NCAA transfer rules.

LOBOS ON TV

The 2017-18 schedule includes many national and regional broadcasts of New Mexico basketball. The Lobos are currently slated for TV 22 times, including 13 of 16 Mountain West games. UNM had 22 of 26 UNM and MW controlled games selected for TV while three non-conference road games, at New Mexico State, at UTEP and at Colorado are expected to be broadcast as well. The Lobos will be on ATT SportsNet/ROOT eight times, on CBS Sports Network five times, ESPN3 five times, and ESPNU and the Mountain West Network on Stadium once. Additionally, two games (at UNLV on January 17 and January 27 at home against Colorado State) are flex games that will be either on ESPNU or ESPN3.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

After two years as WisePies Arena - The Pit, the famous home of Lobo basketball has been given a new name. While it will still be referred to as "The Pit," this season will be the first that the Lobos will compete in "Dreamstyle Arena" as part of an exciting \$10 million agreement for naming rights by Dreamstyle Remodeling of both of UNM's largest-capacity athletic venues. In addition to the official renaming of the Lobo basketball arena, the UNM football stadium, formerly referred to as "University Stadium" is now officially named "Dreamstyle Stadium."

In conjunction with the new name, The Pit was given a new floor this season, featuring both "New Mexico" and "The Pit" on the baselines, the new university interlocking UNM logo, fresh Mountain West logos customized in the Lobo cherry and silver, cherry free throw lines and dual Dreamstyle Arena logos on both sides of center court.

"The Pit" is nationally recognized as one of the top basketball venues. Need more evidence? How about Sports Illustrated ranking it as one of the top 20 sporting venues, of any sport, in the world for the 20th century. The Pit is truly a special place, and it has created an unparalleled environment for the New Mexico men's basketball program. Since the Mountain West conference began in 1999-2000, New Mexico has ranked in the top two in home attendance among MW teams in every year except one, including 12 seasons as the top-ranked MW team in overall attendance.

LOBOS FROM NEAR AND FAR

Just one Lobo on the 2017-18 roster hails from near as a New Mexico native, freshman Matt Vail. Of the remaining 13 players on the roster, two are from California (Joe Furstinger and Vance Jackson) and two more are from Indiana (Sam Logwood and JaQuan Lyle). That leaves nine players all from different states or countries.

The Lobo melting pot includes players from as close as Arizona (Connor McDougall) and Texas (Antino Jackson) and as far as Alaska (Dane Kuiper), New Jersey (Jachai Simmons), Oregon (Anthony Mathis), Pennsylvania (Troy Simons) and Tennessee (Chris McNeal).

Not only are the Lobos' home towns spread across the United States, but two come from overseas including freshmen Makuach Maluach from Sydney, Australia, and Vladimir Pinchuk from Schwelm, Germany.

Lobos Come Back for Road Win, Down UNLV 85-81

LAS VEGAS, NEV. --- Six Lobos scored in double digits on Wednesday night, leading The University of New Mexico men's basketball team to an 85-81 comeback victory over UNLV on the road. The win marks UNM's first on the road this season.

"To get a road win, for us is enormous and against a team of this caliber, a top-100 team, it's growth for us," head coach Paul Weir said. "There's a lot of reasons why these things shouldn't be happening, but we're not asking that in that locker room. We're just doing everything we can to make this team the best it can be."

The Lobos improve to 9-11, 4-3 MW with the victory while UNLV falls to 13-5, 2-3 in league play. UNM also claims

After falling behind by as many as 11 points with just 6:48 remaining in the second half, the Lobos executed a 13-3 run over two minutes to reduce the UNLV lead to just one, 70-69, with 4:22 left.

The Runnin' Rebels extended their lead back to five with 3:26 left, again with 2:14 left and yet again with 1:15 remaining on the clock on a three-pointer from UNLV's Jovan Mooring.

Sharp-shooting Lobo junior Anthony Mathis, who is firing at an outstanding clip of 45.2 percent from behind the arc on the season, responded with a clutch 4-point play, sinking a 3-pointer and a free throw to make it 81-80 with 1:07 left.

With 40 seconds left, Mooring attempted a three that would have put UNLV up four, but missed and Coach Weir followed with a timeout after the clock had reduced to just 27 seconds.

The Lobos needed just two points to claim the lead out of the timeout, burning 16 seconds looking for the right shot. With 11 seconds left, Mathis boldly drilled another three to give the Lobos a two-point advantage, 83-81.

UNLV stopped the clock with a foul and senior Joe Furstinger knocked in his seventh and eighth consecutive three throws with three seconds left on the clock for the 85-81 victory.

UNM was led once again by freshman Makuach Maluach who netted 19 points followed by senior Antino Jackson who tallied 17 and added five assists and four rebounds. Jackson finished 3-for-7 from 3-point land and went 4-for-4 from the free throw line.

Furstinger collected 14 points and nine rebounds - just missing his sixth double-double of the season. Mathis also added 14 points for UNM, going 3-for-9 from three and 3-for-3 from the charity stripe.

Junior Dane Kuiper racked up 10 points for his sixth time finishing in double figures this season, he also finished second on the team with five rebounds. Freshman Vladimir Pinchuck also tallied 10 points for just his second career game in double digits.

For the fourth straight game, just nine Lobos suited up for the contest, including walkon Mike Mondragon. Mondragon played a career-high four minutes.

"These guys are locked in," Weir said. "They're giving it everything they've got and I'm just really happy for them that they get to feel the feeling of a good road win together."

As a team, the Lobos shot 43.8 percent from the field compared to 48.4 percent for UNLV. The Lobos were also outrebounded 40-34, but UNLV went just 15.4 percent from behind the arc compared to UNM's 38.5 percent.

Despite the late UNLV 11-point advantage, the score was tied 10 times during the contest including five lead changes. UNLV outscored UNM 54-34 in the paint and 18-2 on the fast break. The Lobos outscored the Runnin' Rebels 13-12 off of turnovers and 25-18 in bench points.

The Lobos return home on Saturday, Jan. 20 as they take on San Diego State on CBS SportsNet at 5 p.m. MT. Saturday's game will also mark UNM's Domestic Violence Awareness Game during which fans can get \$10 tickets (bench rows 1-10) for arriving in purple (the designated color for domestic violence awareness).

Lobos Down San Diego State on Senior Night, 64-59

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. – It was a special night inside WisePies Arena – The Pit Saturday night, as the University of New Mexico men’s basketball team used a second-half surge to claim a 64-59 victory in front of a season-high announced crowd of 13,958 on Senior Night.

The Lobos finished the Mountain West regular season in fifth place with a 10-8 record and will play the No. 4 seed Fresno State Bulldogs on Thursday afternoon at 2:30 p.m. PT/3:30 p.m. MT in the quarterfinals of the Mountain West Tournament in Las Vegas, Nevada. On the year, the Lobos are now 17-13.

“Really proud of their effort and how hard they played tonight,” said head coach Craig Neal. “Just wanted to make it the best performance they had at home. We had great fans tonight and that brought a lot of energy for us.

“I think there’s something about senior games. We came out with a win and we needed it.”

Elijah Brown led all scorers with 29 points on a 6-of-19 shooting effort. He was 2-of-8 from the three and had a career-tying 15 made free throws of a career-high 17 attempts. Seniors Tim Williams, who returned after missing the last seven games due to a stress reaction in his left foot, and Obij Aget each added 10 points. Aget finished with 10 rebounds for his second double-double of the season.

The night started out slow for both teams as SDSU started off 1-of-9 from the field, while the Lobos were off to a 2-of-14 shooting night. Obij Aget turned up his game and scored the first six points for the Lobos, taking a 6-3 lead into the first media timeout of the game.

“I didn’t think we had bad shots, but we were a little anxious and San Diego State was a little anxious. We had opportunities, but we just couldn’t get it to go in.”

But the Lobos didn’t get a bucket until the 10:16 mark, trailing 10-8. SDSU took a 19-14 lead over the Lobos with 4:11 to go in the half, but the Lobos went on an 11-5 run to finish out the first half with a 25-24 lead. In that stretch, Brown had a three-point play that forced a SDSU timeout. SDSU took a 24-23 lead over the Lobos with 24 seconds on the clock but Brown hit two free throws to end the first half.

The Lobos came out on fire in the second half on both ends of the floor. On the defensive side, the Lobos held SDSU to just two scores within the first five minutes of the half. That allowed the offense to go on a 12-2 run and lead SDSU 39-28.

“We got some good stops early in the second half, and it’s probably the best second half start we’ve had in a long time.”

New Mexico would go on to extend the run to 16-2 and force the Aztecs to a timeout. The Lobos would go up by 15, their biggest lead of the night, at the 13:45 mark but the Aztecs regained their momentum, cutting the Lobos’ lead to six with 3:39 left to play.

“We had that big 16-2 run that really helped us but that was probably the best defense we played all year,” said Neal.

SDSU began to foul to regain possession, but the Lobos did what they do best, made their free throws. In the last minute, the Lobos were 6-of-8 from the free throw line, which helped secure the victory.

For the game, the Lobos shot 35.8 percent from the field, 25.0 percent from the three and 67.6 percent from the free throw line. San Diego State shot 31.5 percent from the field, 19.0 percent from the three and 56.8 percent from the foul line.

The Lobos will head to the Mountain West Tournament next week, taking on the Fresno State Bulldogs Thursday in the quarterfinals at 2:30 p.m. PT/3:30 p.m. MT. The game will air on CBS Sports Network.

Men's Hoops fall at home to Fresno State, 77-73

SAN DIEGO (AP) - Deshon Taylor scored 22 points, including two free throws with 15.7 seconds left for Fresno State, which erased a 10-point deficit to beat San Diego State 77-73 Wednesday night.

Fresno State (14-6, 4-3 Mountain West) trailed 52-42 less than five minutes into the second half. The Bulldogs slowly pulled back into it thanks to some big shots by Nate Grimes, who had 15 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks.

Grimes also came up with a huge defensive play in the closing seconds. With the Bulldogs up 75-73 after Jaron Hopkins made 1 of 2 free throws, Grimes blocked a shot in the key by Devin Watson with 21 seconds left. Taylor grabbed the ball, was fouled and made both free throws.

Ray Bowles added 13 points and Bryson Williams 11 for the Bulldogs.

Sam Bittner hit a huge 3-pointer from the right corner for Fresno State with 4:53 left that tied it at 68. Grimes then made four free throws to give the Bulldogs a 72-68 lead.

San Diego State's Malik Pope was kneed in the groin with 5:36 left and was down for several minutes. He had to be helped off the court. He scored 10 points.

Redshirt freshman Jalen McDaniels had 14 points and 13 rebounds for his fourth double-double for SDSU (11-6, 3-3). Trey Kell also had 14 points, Matt Mitchell scored 13 and Watson 11.

Mitchell scored six points during a 12-6 run opening the second half that gave SDSU a 52-42 lead. He made two free throws, a jumper and a jump hook, and Pope hit a 3-pointer.

McDaniels had some nice plays early that helped SDSU to a 40-36 halftime lead. Less than three minutes in, he blocked a shot by Williams to start a fast break that he finished with a slam dunk off a pass from Kell. Late in the half, he rebounded Kell's missed shot for a slam dunk and free throw that gave SDSU a 33-31 lead.

BIG PICTURE

Fresno State: The Bulldogs won at Viejas Arena for the second straight year. They won 63-55 here last season. FSU has won three of four.

San Diego State: The Aztecs, trying to rebound from an 83-80 loss at Boise State, hurt themselves from the free-throw line by making only 24 of 36.

THE GREATEST GAME EVER PLAYED

The Pit was the site of one of the greatest college basketball games ever played. It hosted the 1983 national championship game that saw the NC State Wolfpack upset Hakeem Olajuwon, Clyde Drexler and the Houston Cougars. Coach Jimmy Valvano and the Wolfpack downed the Cougars on a last second put back by Lorenzo Charles. The iconic shot of the late Valvano running onto the court looking for a hug is one of the lasting images in college basketball history.

- The Lobos have averaged an astounding 15,410 fans the past 49 years, an amazing 95% of capacity
- The Pit has ranked in the top 25 in attendance nationally nearly every season since the 1966-67 season with 35 seasons in the top ten in the NCAA in attendance
- Led the Mountain West in attendance in 10 of the conference's 15 years of existence
- The floor is named Bob King Court in honor of the former head coach who led the Lobos from 1963 to 1972.

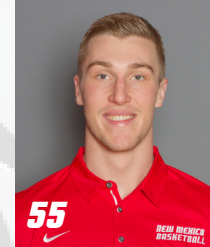

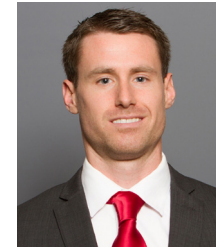

Game 1 - New Mexico 147, Northern N.M. 76 Nov. 11, 2017 | Dreamstyle Arena

Lobos Break Record in Season Opener, Win 147-76

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team shocked a crowd of over 10,500 fans in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit in its first regular-season outing under first-year head coach Paul Weir on Saturday night. The Lobos shattered the UNM record for points scored in a game (136), claiming a 147-76 victory over Northern New Mexico.

The 71-point victory margin also ties the nearly 45-year-old record for largest victory margin, which occurred on December 29, 1972 against Dartmouth at The Pit.

Northern New Mexico is now 2-8 on the season while the Lobos start out 1-0 for the 15th straight season.

"I am extremely thankful to every fan that came through the door tonight and hopefully they'll continue to come out and support us as we try and earn their trust and their respect as a basketball program," Coach Weir said. "Obviously (this was) the kind of offensive game we've been looking for. Our last scrimmage was a very similar outcome, so we're thankful that we're shooting the ball the way we are."

The fiery Lobo offense dominated early and refused to let up. UNM got out to a 15-point lead less than five minutes into the first half, taking a 22-7 advantage with 15:38 still remaining in the first half. The Eagles went on an ensuing 7-0 run, testing the Lobo defense and cutting the home lead to eight, but UNM quickly pushed back ahead and extended the lead to 20 on three from junior Troy Simmons with 9:43 left.

The Lobos concluded the first-half performance with a trio of back-to-back-to-back 3-pointers, two from junior Anthony Mathis and a third from junior transfer Chris McNeal. McNeal collected four threes in the first half alone and helped pace UNM to a 74-point first-half showing, just two points shy of the UNM record for most points in a single half. The record is 76, which occurred on November 23, 1990 against Texas-Arlington.

The Lobos shot 61 percent from the field in the first half (25-41) and 50 percent from 3-point range (10-20). Three players had reached double digits including McNeal (13), senior Sam Logwood (12) and freshman Makuach Maluach (11).

Junior Dane Kuiper opened the second half with a pair of free throws to put the Lobos up 40, 75-35.

Simons and freshman Vladimir Pinchuk shined in the second half, putting up 11 and 10 points, respectively en route to the victory.

McNeal burst on the scene in his first regular-season game as a Lobo with the first UNM double-double in points and assists since March 2, 2014. He posted a team-best 24 points on the night to go along with 10 assists.

Led by McNeal, eight of the 11 Lobos hit the floor scored in double digits including Simons (19), Maluach (18), Kuiper (17), Mathis (16), Logwood (14), Pinchuk (12) and senior Antino Jackson (12).

As a team, the Lobos collected 40 assists and 22 steals, both ranking high in Lobo history. Forty assists ties the record for most in a game, which the Lobos had done twice previously, the first on December 16, 1978 against Central Florida and again on November 23, 1990 against Texas-Arlington. Twenty-two steals is the second-most in a game in team history (25 is the record).

On the night, UNM shot 64.7 percent (55-85) from the floor including 46.2 percent from three and 86.4 percent from the free-throw line. The Lobos' 55 field goals is just four shy of the record for most in a game. The Lobos posted 59 in the November 23, 1990 game against Texas-Arlington.

The Lobos also posted an outstanding 18 3-pointers on the night, just two short of the record 20 set on November 13, 2004 against Santa Clara, while defensively UNM posted six blocks and collected 32 defensive rebounds (45 overall). Senior Joe Furstinger led the way with three blocks.

Game 2 - New Mexico 103, Omaha 71 Nov. 14, 2017 | Dreamstyle Arena

Lobos Top Omaha with Second Straight 100+ Game

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team posted its first back-to-back 100+ point games since December 1998 on Tuesday night as the Lobos routed the visiting Omaha Mavericks 103-71 in their Nike N7 game. Junior transfer Troy Simmons paced the Lobos with 24 points that included six 3-pointers on the night.

The Nike N7 jersey auction in Dreamstyle Arena raised over \$2,500 for the NB3 Foundation and American Indian Student Services (AISS).

Four Lobos scored in double figures including Simons and seniors Antino Jackson (19), Sam Logwood (18) and Joe Furstinger (11). Furstinger's 11 points marks a new career-best for the senior, who has tallied a previous high of nine points twice in his career, including Saturday's game against Northern New Mexico. He also tied his career-best in free throws (5) and blocks (4).

Coach Weir earned his 30th career victory on the night as the Lobos improve to 2-0. Omaha falls to 0-3 on the season.

The Lobos opened the game with an 8-0 run over the first 2:30, half which came from Furstinger. Omaha followed with a 7-0 run as the Lobos struggled to find a consistent offensive flow, closing the gap to make it 19-16 UNM midway through the first half.

Alternating scoring droughts for both teams caused the score to remain close through the remainder of the first half, sending UNM into the locker room up by just one, 35-34. The Lobos shot an unimpressive 34.1 percent from the field and 20 percent from 3-point range compared to 37 percent from the floor and 35.7 percent from the arc for the Mavericks.

The second half was another story as the Lobos stormed past Omaha and didn't look back. In the second half, the Lobos shot 55.6 percent from the field and an outstanding 68.4 percent from 3-point range, hitting 13 triples en route to a 68-point second-half performance while limiting Omaha to just 37 points.

"I thought in the second half, we kept our defensive energy up and our offensive energy ended up coming around," head coach Paul Weir said. "I was much more pleased with our defensive energy in the second half."

"As far as our style of play, it's how we want to play and it went the way we wanted to. We were able to shoot the way we wanted to and hopefully we continue playing this way moving forward."

Simons' six 3-pointers combined with five from Jackson, three from junior Anthony Mathis, two from junior Chris McNeal and another from freshman Makuach Maluach - his first as a Lobo.

The UNM advantage was held within single digits until midway through the second half when the Lobos pulled away - fast. Sparked by a pair of stunning free throws and a three from McNeal, the Lobos took off on a 9-0 run in just one minute, taking a reachable 63-57 game to a 72-57 contest. McNeal's three was set up after he snagged a steal and, just 10 seconds later, Simons grabbed another steal in the Lobos' full-court press and posted the layup.

The 15-point lead was stretched to a 30-point blowout with four minutes left, 92-62 on a pair of Logwood free throws. Logwood went 10-for-11 from the stripe on the night, doubling his previous career-best five free throws in a single game.

It was a Jackson three that put the Lobos over 100 with 1:09 left. With seven seconds left on the clock, Omaha's Alex Albery hit a three to cut the 35-point Lobo lead to 32 to close the game.

The Lobos are averaging 29.5 turnovers forced per game to start the season to go along with 44.5 field goals and 58.5 bench points. In the last two games, UNM has hit 35 3-pointers, at least 17 per game. Last season, it took nine games to reach that mark.

UNM rebounded the Mavericks 48-37 including 19-9 offensive boards and forced 26 turnovers on the night.

Game 3 - New Mexico 56, NMSU 75 Nov. 17, 2017 | Pan American Center

Lobos Suffer First Loss in Defeat at NMSU

LAS CRUCES, N.M. --- In an arena full of palpable tension and in front of a crowd of angry Aggie fans, The University of New Mexico Lobos suffered their first loss of the season on the road at New Mexico State Friday night. While the Lobos kept the score in reach for the first two-thirds of the game, the Aggies pulled away, doubling their lead in the last five minutes and eventually dominating with a final score of 75-56.

Junior Anthony Mathis led the Lobos with 14 points on the night, just two shy of his career high of 16. He went 4-for-5 from the field including 3-for-4 from behind the arc and 3-for-4 at the free throw line.

As a team, the Lobos (2-1) shot slightly under NMSU (2-1) at 38.5 percent to 39.1 percent while the Aggies dominated the boards, collecting 50 rebounds split evenly between offensive and defensive. In comparison, UNM collected a total of 25, including nine offensive rebounds.

"Their dominance of the offensive glass set a tone, gave them a lot of energy, and we just couldn't overcome it," head coach Paul Weir said. "You've got to give New Mexico State a lot of credit, they just never allowed us to ever implement and do what we wanted to do, it just took the wind out of our sails."

"I think your first road game of the season is always a good measuring stick, to see where you're at, and now we have to learn and grow from it and just get better."

The Lobos dominated the first five minutes of play, getting out to a 8-1 lead before allowing NMSU its first bucket from the floor at the 15:49 mark. At that point, the Lobos led 8-3 with senior Sam Logwood accounting for six points.

Junior Chris McNeal followed with a three to continue to build the Lobo lead to eight (11-3). A 2:10 scoring drought ensued, interrupted by an Aggie free throw.

A 3-pointer by Sidy N'Dir at the 12:51 mark sparked an NMSU comeback that included two jumpers and two dunks within 2:18 to make it just a one-point lead for the Lobos, 16-15 - and that was when the momentum turned. Another dunk 20 seconds later began a 6-0 run for NMSU.

The Lobos battled back and a layup by freshman Vladimir Pinchuk made it a three-point game headed into halftime.

The Aggies opened the second half with a pair of threes to take a nine-point lead, the largest of the game and began to run away but the Lobos battled. UNM chipped away at a 12-point deficit with back-to-back threes in less than a minute from Mathis and freshman Makuach Maluach but NMSU pushed the lead back out to 10.

With just six minutes left and the Lobos down by just seven, 54-47, junior Troy Simons was ejected due to technical foul accumulation (two). A Lobo bench technical followed four minutes later and the Aggies put the game out of reach for the win.

UNM entered the game averaging 17.5 3-pointers and 44.5 field goals per game but managed just six and 20, respectively, on the night.

The Lobos will return home to Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on Tuesday, Nov. 21 when they take on Tennessee Tech in non-conference action at 7 p.m. The game will be available to watch live on the Mountain West Network and will be broadcast on 770 KKOB-AM.

Men's Basketball Upended by TTU in Final Minute

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- For the first time since 2006-07, the Lobos have opened their first four games with three scoring over 90 points, but it wasn't enough on Tuesday night as Tennessee Tech pulled ahead in the final minute for a 103-96 win over New Mexico in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

Junior Chris McNeal led UNM with 29 points on the night marking the third time this season he has scored in double digits, the second over 20 points. McNeal went 8-for-16 from the field and 7-for-11 from behind the arc to go along with 6-of-8 from the free throw line.

Tennessee Tech (4-1) started the game going 0-for-10 from the field over the first 5:31, allowing the Lobos (2-2) to go on an 8-0 run and claim a nine-point advantage (10-1) with 14:29 left to play in the first half. The Lobos extended their lead to 14 over the next four minutes (24-13, 10:10) until TTU's Aleksa Jugovic scored a trio of 3-pointers in the next three Golden Eagle possessions to cut the UNM lead to eight.

TTU closed the final 10:40 of the first half shooting 15-of-19 from the field. In the first half, Jugovic couldn't miss, going 8-for-8 from the field including 6-for-6 from 3-point range and 2-for-2 from the charity stripe. His efforts helped make it a one-point game with 10 seconds left in the half until a Dane Kuiper three with two seconds on the clock stretched the Lobo lead to four at the half.

"You have to tip your cap to them," head coach Paul Weir said. "They shot the heck out of the ball tonight and made a lot of shots at the back of it. Some of them were tough and some of them were probably on us. They were good, and they were better than us tonight."

McNeal got hot toward the end of the first half, drilling three-straight threes in under a minute and picked up where he left off. He opened the second half with a three 17 seconds in to give the Lobos what would be their largest lead of the second half, seven (58-81), before the teams battled throughout the remainder of the contest.

With the Lobos trailing by one point with 1:06 left to play, 94-93, the Golden Eagles took off on an 8-0 run over 35 seconds to get out to a nine-point lead, 102-93 with 21 seconds left. Kuiper drained another three with 12 seconds left to give the Lobos hope, 102-96, but the six-point margin was too much for the final seconds.

McNeal paced the Lobos with 29 points and was followed by senior Sam Logwood with 21. The last time UNM had a pair of 20-point scorers was almost a year ago on January 7 against Nevada.

The third Lobo to score in double figures on the night was junior Anthony Mathis who notched 11, going 4-for-7 from the field and 3-for-6 from three. The outing marked the third time this season that the registered double digits.

Senior Joe Furstinger neared a double-double on the night, scoring seven points and bringing down nine rebounds. He also tied his career-high in blocks with four.

As a team, the Lobos shot 40.6 percent from the field compared to 55.7 percent for TTU. Similarly, UNM went 41 percent from three compared to 54.5 percent to the Golden Eagles, but the Lobos did have the advantage in free throws, shooting 82.8 percent (24-29) from the line compared to just 75 percent (24-32) for TTU.

After suffering drastically on the glass against New Mexico State, the Lobos stepped up their rebounding game but were still out rebounded 39-32.

TTU registered 42 points in the paint to 20 for UNM and held a 49-9 fast-break point advantage. The Lobos edged the Golden Eagles in second-chance points, 13-9, and in points off of turnovers, 24-22.

"We looked like the ninth-place team in the Mountain West tonight," Weir said. Which I never thought we were going to be and we just have to do everything in our power to make sure that this is not going to be our final destination. All I can tell you is that we are going to do whatever we can to work our way out of whatever we're in right now."

"We're not discouraged," McNeal said. "We're just going to try and bounce back, come back tomorrow and work even harder. Try to turn this around."

Lobo Comeback Falls Short vs (RV) TCU

NICEVILLE, FLA. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team lost a heartbreaker on Friday night after nearly pulling off an upset over (RV) TCU at the Emerald Coast Classic in Niceville, Fla. The Lobos came back from a 13-point deficit and looked to junior Chris McNeal for a game-winning 3-pointer with 1.9 seconds left in regulation, but it went wide and UNM fell 69-67.

Senior Sam Logwood led New Mexico with a career-high 27 points, leading a trio of Lobos who scored in double figures including McNeal and junior Antino Jackson (12 apiece).

The Lobos will face either St. Bonaventure or Maryland Saturday at 2 p.m. MT (3 p.m. CT).

As a team, despite being outshot and out-rebounded, the Lobos (2-3) forced 16 turnovers on TCU (5-0) and committed just nine to keep them in the game. UNM had 14 points off of turnovers (TCU had 11) and edged TCU 16-14 in second-chance points while the Horned Frogs dominated the paint, outscoring UNM 46-24 down low.

"You have to tip your cap to TCU, it's a big team, a good rebounding team that just kind of continued to punish us inside and they did a really good job," head coach Paul Weir said.

"We're going to play teams very similar to TCU this year, they're going to be bigger than us, stronger than us, they're going to be more experienced than us," Weir said. "They have a lot of things we don't, so we're trying to accentuate the things we have, which to me would be speed, shooting, depth and conditioning and trying to bring those into the game as much as we can."

The Lobos shot a season-low 34.3 percent from the field and 20 percent from 3-point range to hang in with the national vote recipient TCU. The Horned Frogs went 47.5 percent from the field and 28.6 percent from three while the Lobos dominated at the charity stripe, going 15-for-18 for 83.3 percent while TCU was just 9-for-17 (52.9 percent).

The victory marked TCU's ninth straight dating back to last season when the squad captured the NIT Championship.

New Mexico jumped out on top early, getting out to a 9-2 lead with 17:46 left in the first half before TCU chipped away and cut the lead to one.

The Horned Frogs followed with an 11-1 run over three minutes to take a seven-point advantage, 31-24 with 4:08 left in the half. TCU got up by as much a nine before a layup with eight seconds on the clock from senior Joe Furstinger made it seven, 40-33 at the half.

In the second half, TCU pushed the lead out to 17 before the Lobos roared back on a 12-3 run sparked by a jumper and a three from McNeal to get back within four, 61-57 with 8:31 left to play. The run was full of TCU turnovers and Lobo buckets to shift the momentum in favor of UNM.

McNeal hit a big three with the Lobos down five with 12 seconds left to bring the game within two, 69-67. Weir called his only full timeout to draft a play, but McNeal called the Lobos' final timeout on the inbound before the final shot went wide.

Five players in double figures, Lobos claim 78-56 win

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Paced by five Lobos in double figures, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team rebounded from a four-game losing skid on Wednesday night in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit, topping Evansville by a score of 78-59 while shooting 49 percent from the floor (30-61).

Senior Sam Logwood and junior Troy Simons led the Lobos (3-4) with 14 points each, with Logwood adding five rebounds. Junior Chris McNeal added 13 points while junior Anthony Mathis and freshman Makuach Maluach chipped in 10 points apiece. The Lobos also posted 23 assists on 30 made baskets, 10 of which came from senior Antino Jackson.

"Obviously it was really good to get a win," head coach Paul Weir said. "I thought we played a lot better tonight. We had a little lull there in the middle of the second half... but you've got to give Evansville credit. I've coached against and scouted against a lot of teams, and Marty Simmons is as good of a basketball coach as I've ever had to scout against. He eats basketball for breakfast. The guy is just awesome."

Jackson's 10 assists marks the second time this season that a Lobo has posted 10 or more assists, despite scoring just two points on the night compared to his usual 9.3 average.

"We've talked about it all week: your shots can't dictate your effect on the game," Weir said. "Antino's ability to push the ball and transition in the second half really helped us win the game."

After entering Wednesday's game ranked fourth in the nation in forced turnovers (21.33) and eighth in turnover margin (6.5), New Mexico forced over 20 turnovers (21) for the fourth time this season while only committing 11, including just three in the second half.

Evansville (5-2) entered the matchup second in the country in three-point percentage (47.8) and the Lobos held the Purple Aces to just 3-of-13 from behind the arc, including 0-for-6 in the first half. Wednesday marked the first time this season that Evansville has been completely denied from the arc in a half.

In addition, the Purple Aces entered the game ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 58.2 points per game. Prior to the Lobos' 78 points, the most Evansville had allowed in a game this season was 63.

The Lobos got off to a quick start as Simons opened the game with an early three-pointer, and UNM followed with an 11-0 run four minutes into the game to take a 16-5 lead, highlighted by back-to-back threes from junior Dane Kuiper. Evansville answered with a 9-0 run to close the gap to 16-14 with six minutes left in the first half.

The Lobos extended the lead back to nine at 25-16 on a pair of Logwood free throws three minutes later, and held a similar margin the rest of the half to enter the break leading 35-27.

New Mexico shot 40 percent from the floor, including 6-of-15 from behind the arc and a perfect 5-for-5 from the charity stripe, compared to Evansville's 33.3 field goal percentage, no three-pointers and 77.8 from the free throw line.

The Lobos opened up a 52-40 lead eight minutes into the second half with threes from McNeal, Simons and Mathis to fire up the crowd and claim the momentum. Four minutes later, another three from Mathis extended the Lobo lead to 19, 62-43.

Senior Joe Furstinger followed with a dunk 30 seconds later and the Lobos continued to run away with the game. An eight-point run fueled by a pair of Logwood layups, a McNeal jumper and a swift jumper from freshman Vladimir Pinchuk increased the lead to 24 with 1:43 left before the final 78-59 score.

The Lobos were able to capitalize on Evansville turnovers, scoring 20 points, while also outscoring the Purple Aces 20-2 on the fast break.

"It feels great (to get the win)," Maluach said. "There's not a better feeling than winning in front of your home crowd. We're a resilient group and we like each other a lot. When we win, we win together, and when we lose, we lose together. Hopefully we will win more games than we lose."

New Mexico travels to face UTEP in El Paso, Texas on Saturday, Dec. 2 at 7 p.m.

Logwood Scores 22, Lobos Falter at UTEP

EL PASO, TEXAS --- Senior Sam Logwood of The University of New Mexico men's basketball team led the Lobos with 22 points on Saturday night for his third game this season registering 20+, but it wasn't enough to earn UNM the win as the Lobos fell to UTEP 88-76 in Don Haskins Center.

Midway through the second half, the Lobos (3-5) got a 14-point Miner lead down to five (61-56) on a 13-4 run before UTEP (2-6) rallied back with an 8-0 run of its own to reclaim the double-digit lead, push it to 15 (71-56) and hold out for the win.

The Lobos knocked down a pair of 3-pointers from juniors Dane Kuiper and Anthony Mathis in the final 45 seconds to reduce the Miner lead to nine (84-75), but UNM was forced to foul and UTEP's free throws sealed the Lobos' fate.

After discussing the Lobos' lackluster play in the first half, head coach Paul Weir spoke about the second-half spark that led UNM to outscore the Miners 45-43 over the final 20 minutes.

"Unfortunately, it was a halftime speech that got us to where we needed to be," coach Weir said. "But just like the Maryland game, it was just too late to come back from 15 on the road, it just doesn't happen every time. We'd like it to, but it just doesn't."

"I don't think I'll think offense was the problem... I think our inability to play defense is getting very troubling. Tonight we just couldn't stop those guys, it's concerning and we just need to improve."

As a team, UNM shot 37.5 percent from the floor compared to 53.7 percent for the Miners however, despite the lopsided overall percentages both teams fired at nearly the same rate from three. UNM went 11-of-31 from behind the arc (35.5 percent) while UTEP was 9-of-24 (37.5 percent). UNM has registered at least 10 3-pointers in five of its seven games.

The Lobos entered the game ranked third in the nation in free throw percentage, but had their lowest performance of the season from the stripe, going 23-for-35 (65.7 percent).

Defensively, the Lobos outscored UTEP 37-33 and turned them over 14 times, while committing 14 turnovers of their own. The Miners tallied 16 points off of UNM's turnovers compared to 11 for the Lobos.

Not only did Logwood register his fifth game scoring in double figures this season, but Mathis tallied 13 points for his sixth double-digit game and senior Antino Jackson scored 10 points for his third.

Logwood also added seven rebounds to go along with junior Troy Simons' eight and freshman Vladimir Pinchuk's seven.

The Lobos will return to action on Wednesday, Dec. 6 when they travel to take on Colorado at 7 p.m. MT on the Pac-12 Network.

BOULDER, COLO. --- Despite a strong first-half performance, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team suffered a 75-57 loss on the road at Colorado on Wednesday night, letting a two-point halftime margin slip away over the final 10 minutes of the game.

Junior Anthony Mathis led the Lobos (3-6) with 15 points, just one shy of his career-high, as the only Lobo to score in double figures. Mathis went for 5-for-9 from the field including 3-for-6 from three and 2-for-3 from the free throw line.

The Lobos started out strong, turning the Buffalos (7-1) over three times in just the first three minutes, exhibiting an outstanding defense that burst on the scene with arguably the most energy and intensity it has had all season. UNM held the Buffs scoreless for the first two minutes of the game and eventually forced 23 turnovers.

"I think defensively, it was a little bit of a step forward for us tonight, particularly the first 28-29, actually 31-32 minutes," head coach Paul Weir said. "I thought our defensive energy was really good and man if we could just find a way to convert some layups and some free throws I really think it would put us over the top."

The Lobos struggled from the floor going 21-for-71 for a season-low 29.6 percent field-goal percentage while shooting 29.0 percent from three (9-31) on the night.

"We got a lot of really good looks I thought around the rim, (Colorado) just did a really good job of protecting the glass," Weir said. "

Lobos Fall to NMSU in Last-Minute Heartbreaker

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- With 6:40 to go in one of the biggest and most intense rivalries in The University of New Mexico history, the Lobos led the New Mexico State Aggies by eight, 56-48, on Saturday night in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit before dropping a heartbreaker by a final score of 65-62. The Lobos missed a tough, last-second three-pointer that would have tied the game.

The Lobos (3-7) outshot the Aggies (7-2) from 3-point range 28.6 percent to 20.0 percent and from the free throw line (70.6-50.0) in the outstanding defensive effort while scoring 14 points off of 17 NMSU turnovers.

UNM was led by senior Antino Jackson who compiled 14 points, his second-highest total of the season, including three from behind the arc. Junior Troy Simons posted 13 points and a team-best seven rebounds.

"I think this was just a newer team trying to find its way against a veteran team that's won a lot of games," head coach Paul Weir said. "I think that NMSU knows how to win those (close) games and has the experience to do it, and we're still trying to figure that out."

"These guys are fighting and I can't say anything negative about them ... they are giving it all they've got, we just have to find a way to improve and find a way to win games like this before the season is over."

Despite being down their leading scorer in arguably one of the biggest games of the year, the Lobos battled and went up on the Aggies, who reached the NCAA Tournament last season as the WAC Champions, by as much as nine points with 10 minutes left in the game. Nine points was the largest lead of the game by either team.

Freshman Makuach Maluach earned his first career start on the night. At the 10-minute mark, Maluach slammed a crowd-pleasing, one-handed dunk with unmatched enthusiasm from an excited Lobos crowd.

NMSU responded with three points from the game's leading scorer Zach Lofton, who tallied a game-high 22 points on the night, to cut the Lobos lead to six and eventually whittle UNM's advantage to three, 56-53 with 5:21 left.

The Aggies cut the deficit to one, 57-58 on a Lofton jumper and overtook the Lobos at the 2:34 mark on a Lofton layup, holding on for the win.

Lobo junior Anthony Mathis, who has been hot from behind the arc as of late, got a good look with the seconds winding down, but was forced to shoot from deep at the last second and missed. Mathis is 48.2 percent (27-56) on the season from three. Senior Joe Furstinger nearly got the putback before time expired.

As a team, UNM shot 39.9 percent compared to 42.6 percent for NMSU. The game marked just the second time this season that UNM committed more turnovers than its opponent (19-17). NMSU outscored the Lobos in the paint, 36-20, but UNM collected more points on the fast break, 11-8. Both teams tallied 13 second-chance points on the night.

The Lobos will have seven days to recuperate from Saturday's game vs. NMSU before taking on Arizona on Saturday, Dec. 16 at Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on CBS Sports Network at 6 p.m.

Kuipers scores 24, Lobos battle but fall to #23 Arizona

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team battled No. 23 Arizona to an 89-73 loss at Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on Saturday night in front of an enthusiastic, season-high crowd of 13,207. The Lobos rallied back from a 19-point deficit to trail by just seven with 3:56 remaining, but it wasn't enough to overcome the Wildcats, who shot 64.0 percent from the field.

"I thought the game was played and moving at the pace we wanted," head coach Paul Weir said. "There's another part of our energy level, defensively, that wasn't good enough. It has to get better."

"You do have to give Arizona some credit. They shot the heck out of the basketball tonight. I know those guys are skilled enough to shoot threes and they are special. They really showed how good of a team they are, made a lot of big shots - that is a good basketball team."

The Lobos (3-8) were unable to complete the comeback against the ranked Wildcats despite junior Dane Kuiper's career-best 24-point performance. Kuiper, who was celebrating his birthday, shot 70 percent (7-10) from the field and 75 percent (6-8) from behind the three-point arc, adding a perfect 4-4 from the free throw line. Troy Simons added 12 points on 40 percent (4-10) shooting. Senior Sam Logwood posted eight points in his first game back with the team after his brief leave of absence.

The Lobos shot 38.7 percent as a team, including 35.3 percent from behind the arc and 92.9 percent from the free throw line, but Arizona outscored New Mexico 42-20 in the paint and rebounded the Lobos 35-23. UNM held the Wildcats to six offensive rebounds and seven second-chance points. In the second half, UNM matched Arizona, both netting 40 points.

After trailing by 15, 72-57, with 9:28 to go in the second half, the Lobos cut the Wildcat lead to eight at 74-66 on baskets from Simons, Logwood and Kuiper. It marked the first time since the 11:57 mark of the first half that the Lobos trailed by less than ten. Kuiper managed to cut the lead to seven twice, first on a three with 5:05 to go and then on a pair of free throws with 3:56 remaining, but the Lobos were unable to close the margin any further.

Arizona (8-3) widened the lead back to double digits and then continued with a commanding 12-point advantage with 1:05 to go, finishing the game on a 7-0 run en route to the 89-73 final.

The Lobos trailed 11-5 three minutes into the game but went on a 5-0 run behind a layup and a 3-point play from Simons to bring the game within one, 11-10. Arizona answered with an 11-3 run over the next two minutes to stretch its lead back to nine, 22-13, but freshman Makuach Maluach hit a three-pointer to cut the lead to six, 22-16.

After another 9-0 streak by the Wildcats, Kuiper added a layup and 3-pointer to keep the Lobos within ten, 31-21.

The Wildcats took their largest lead of the first half on four Allonzo Trier free throws with 18 seconds left as they made the score 49-31. Senior Antino Jackson hit a jumper as time expired to enter halftime trailing by 16, 49-33.

"We just couldn't get a break to go our way," Weir said. "When you're down 16 points, it's just hard to spot somebody that much."

The Lobos shot 41.4 percent from the field in the first half, including 35.7 percent from three. They added another four points from the free throw line, getting a perfect 4-for-4 in the half.

UNM and Arizona opened the second half trading 3-point plays to make the score 52-36. Junior Chris McNeal hit his first three of the night off an offensive rebound to cut Arizona's lead to 13, 54-41, with 16:25 on the clock.

Junior Anthony Mathis, who is shooting 48.3 from behind the arc this season, drilled back-to-back threes with 12 minutes to go to make the score 66-54 and prevent Arizona from pulling away, setting up the UNM comeback attempt.

The game marked the first time since Jan. 16, 1999 that Arizona traveled to play in Albuquerque, when the Lobos beat the Wildcats 79-78. When the two teams met last year in Tucson, then-ranked No. 18 Arizona topped New Mexico 77-46. Saturday's contest also marks UNM's first ranked opponent of the season.

New Mexico will stay at home to face Rice in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit, continuing the Lobos' five-game home stand, on Tuesday, Dec. 19 at 7:30 p.m.

Lobos Win Second Straight 87-78 over PVAMU

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Senior Joe Furstinger led The University of New Mexico men's basketball team to its second straight victory, a resounding 87-78 final over Prairie View A&M, on Friday night in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. Furstinger registered a career-high 20 points and tallied his second straight career double-double on the night.

One game after setting a career-high 17 points against Rice, Furstinger broke it against the Panthers, shooting 50 percent from the field and adding perfect 12-12 from the free throw line while grabbing 10 rebounds. Twelve free throws tie for third in the Mountain West in a single game this season and also elevates his free throw percentage to 90.2% (37-41) good for first in the league as of stats through Dec. 21.

The Lobos (5-8) shot 46.7 percent from the field, including 36.7 percent from behind the arc. For the second straight game, UNM outrebounded its opponent. The Lobos posted a 39-29 edge on the boards, compiling 15 on offense, the second most in a game this season.

Senior Antino Jackson finished the night with 17 points while junior Dane Kuiper tallied 14 as the third Lobo to reach double figures on the night. Also helping to lead the Lobos was junior Jachai Simmons who posted six points and dished four assists, tying his season high.

Simmons put the Lobos on the board with a dunk in the first minute of play, followed by a Panther jumper and a three from Jackson to put New Mexico ahead 5-2 under two minutes into the game. The Lobos took a five-point lead, 11-6, on a pair of Furstinger free throws with 16:31 on the clock and Prairie View went on a 5-0 run to tie the score at 11, the first of five ties on the night. A Logwood layup put the Lobos back up by two, 13-11, with 15:19 to play in the half.

The Panthers (2-11) tied the score again at 16 and took their first and only lead of the night, 19-18, on a three with 13:35 remaining. The lead lasted just five seconds as Furstinger regained the lead for the Lobos, 24-21, with two free throws, a layup and a dunk within 55 seconds. Within his first seven minutes on the floor, Furstinger had registered 12 points.

Furstinger hit two more free throws to close scoring for the half with the Lobos leading by eight, 49-41, capping his outstanding 16-point first half that included 10-for-10 from the free throw line.

In the opening 30 seconds of the second half, the Lobos extended their lead to 10, 51-41, as Furstinger made yet another pair of free throws to set his new career-high (12).

Prairie View went on a 9-0 run to make it 51-50 before UNM responded with a 16-2 run over the next four minutes, making it 67-52 UNM. During the stretch, the Lobos nailed four 3-pointers off the hands of junior Troy Simmons, Jackson and a pair from Kuiper.

Kuiper's back-to-back threes gave UNM the 15-point lead, the Lobos' largest of the night to that point, with 11:41 on the clock.

The Lobos allowed Prairie View within seven before another Kuiper three and layup put New Mexico up by its largest margin 20, 84-64, with 4:14 to go.

The Panthers chipped away over the final four minutes, narrowing the Lobo lead to nine at the final buzzer, 87-78.

UNM will finish its five-game home stand Wednesday, Dec. 27 at 7 p.m. with its Mountain West opener against Air Force in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

Lobos Open MW Play with 29-point win over Air Force

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team earned its third straight victory on Wednesday night to kick off Mountain West play with a 29-point win over the visiting Air Force Falcons in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

Senior Joe Furstinger registered his third straight double-double, the first Lobo to achieve the feat since the 2015-16 season. With his 12 points and 12 rebounds, Furstinger was one of six Lobos to score in double figures on the night including junior Jachai Simmons who captured his first double-digit game of the season with 15 points.

Simmons led the Lobos (6-8, 1-0 MW) offensively on the evening, followed by junior Dane Kuiper (13), junior Anthony Mathis (11) and seniors Sam Logwood (10) and Antino Jackson (10).

Jason nearly hit his second point-assist double-double of the season, adding nine assists to his 10 points.

Both UNM and Air Force (6-7, 0-1 MW) opened their first conference game of the season a bit lackluster offensively as the score was 2-0 Air Force nearly five minutes into the game until Furstinger scored the Lobos' first point on a free throw at the 15:18 mark. Head coach Paul Weir attributed the early score to outstanding Lobo defense.

"That first four minutes of the game might have been my favorite four minutes of our season," Weir said. "I think it was like 2-0 and all we were doing was playing defense, and we didn't care about where the ball was going in. It was going to be a war, and I loved that."

The Lobos began pouring on the points however and over the next eight minutes jumped out to a 13-point lead on a 12-0 run. The run was kicked off by back-to-back Kuiper three-pointers and capped with an exciting Simmons-Chris McNeal-Simmons steal and alley-oop as well as a Furstinger dunk.

On the alley-oop, Simmons and McNeal demonstrated teamwork at its finest as Simmons snatched the ball on defense, quickly passed to McNeal and the pair rushed down court. McNeal dished back to Simmons for the fast-break alley-oop that made the crowd of 10,000 shriek.

Jason hit a three with three seconds left in the first half to put the Lobos up 16, 36-20 at the break. The last time UNM held a team to less than 20 points in the first half was two seasons ago on Jan. 9, 2016 when the Lobos held Utah State to 18.

The Lobos opened the second half on a 10-3 run to get out to a 22-point lead with 15:07 left to play and extended the lead to 28 on back-to-back threes from Simmons with 4:47 to go.

The largest Lobo lead of the night was 31 with 39 seconds left.

UNM will hit the road for a pair of back-to-back conference matchups. The Lobos will face the team picked to finish first in the league this season, Nevada, on Saturday before traveling to Boise State on Wednesday, Jan. 3. Saturday's game at Nevada will be broadcast on AT&T SportsNet while Wednesday will be on ESPN3.

Late Run Not Enough, Lobos Fall at Boise State

BOISE, IDAHO--- A 15-1 second-half run was not enough to turn the game around on Wednesday night as The University of New Mexico men's basketball team suffered a 90-62 loss at the hands of the (RV) Boise State Broncos on the road.

The Broncos (13-2, 3-0 MW) took an early 13-0 lead four minutes into the game after a flawless defensive effort left the Lobos (6-10, 1-2 MW) scoreless until junior Anthony Mathis opened the scoring with a 3-pointer at the 15:40 mark.

The three would mark Mathis' first of three on the night as the junior went 3-for-7 from behind the arc, 5-of-11 from the floor for a total of 13 points.

The Lobos were led by senior Joe Furstinger who posted 15 points for his fifth straight game scoring in double digits. He finished four rebounds shy of his fifth straight double-double.

Leading the way for Boise State was sophomore Justinian Jessup who posted a career-high 23 points for the Broncos.

"Boise just played a lot harder than we did, especially to start the game," head coach Paul Weir said. "We just couldn't finish around the rim. Their length around the rim really bothered us and we left a lot of points there."

The Lobos shot 34.9 percent from the floor (22-63) compared to 59.4 percent for the Broncos (38-64). UNM was also outshot behind the arc, 22.2-44.4 percent. The Lobos did, however, hold the advantage from the free throw line, shooting 80 percent (12-15) compared to 50 percent (6-12).

UNM also held an edge in turnovers, forcing 17 while committing just 13.

Wednesday's game snaps the Lobos' four-win streak over the Broncos as UNM has swept Boise State over the past two seasons.

Boise State led by 23 at the half, 45-22, and extended the lead to its largest of the night, 35, with 11:31 left on the clock in the second half. The lead marks the most of any opponent so far this season.

The Lobos exploded for a 15-1 run to close the gap to 21 points on five points from Furstinger, threes from Mathis and junior Dane Kuiper and two points apiece from seniors Sam Logwood and Antino Jackson. The run lasted 3:08 and was ended by a layup from Boise State's Robin Jorch to make it 70-47 with 7:51 left.

The Broncos ran away with the game from there, posting a 9-0 run with three minutes left to put the game out of reach.

UNM will return to action on Saturday, Jan. 6 at home against San José State at 7 p.m. on the Mountain West Network.

Lobos Rout San José State, 80-47

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.--- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team returned to 500 in Mountain West play on Saturday night with an 80-47 victory over San José State in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. The Lobos improve to 7-10, 2-2 in the league while the Spartans fall to 3-12, 0-4 MW.

Freshman Makuach Maluach led the Lobos in scoring for the first time in his young career, tallying 15 points while going 6-for-9 from the floor, 2-for-2 from behind the arc. He was one of five Lobos to score in double figures including junior Chris McNeal (12), junior Anthony Mathis (12), senior Antino Jackson (11) and senior Joe Furstinger (10).

The Lobos have had five or more players score in double digits in five games this season.

Furstinger just missed another double-double, posting 10 points and a game-high nine rebounds. He did, however, post his sixth straight game scoring in double figures, collect a career-best five steals, drilling his third career 3-pointer and adding four assists and two blocks to his stat line.

Mathis and junior Jachai Simmons each notched a career-high in rebounds, bringing down six and four, respectively.

As a team, the Lobos outshot the Spartans 46.7 percent to 31.8 percent and went 13-for-36 from behind the arc (36.1 percent) compared to 3-for-11 (27.3 percent) for SJSU. The last time the Lobos held an opponent to less than 35 percent from the floor was on March 4, 2017 against San Diego State (31.5 percent).

"I thought we played much better defense and were able to get some stops, particularly at the start of both halves," head coach Paul Weir said. "We were a little more contained and a little more control-oriented."

"On the defensive end, we worked really hard to keep the ball out of the post."

The Lobos entered Saturday night's contest ranked 15th in the nation in both turnover margin (4.6) and turnovers forced (17.56) and did not disappoint in the categories against SJSU. UNM forced 20 turnovers and committed just six, a season-low for the Lobos. UNM accumulated 28 points off of turnovers compared to just one point for SJSU.

"Generating turnovers is great we've done a great job of that this year," Weir said. "It's completing it on the other end and getting points out of (turnovers) that we need. Tonight was probably one of the first nights that we were able to do that almost all season."

The Spartans' 47 points marks a season low for a Lobos opponent. SJSU tallied 23 points in the first half and 24 in the second, marking the second- and third-lowest allowed by the Lobos in a half this season.

The Lobos got out to as much as a 12-point lead, 18-6, in just the first 8:13, posting an 11-0 run over 1:24 that included back-to-back 3-pointers by Jackson and another from Maluach.

SJSU responded with a 7-0 run of their own to pull the game back within five, 18-10 and again 20-15 with 7:47 left in the first half.

From there, the Lobos took off and never looked back, getting back out to a double-digit lead with 3:29 left in the half, never relinquishing it.

McNeal put the Lobos up by 16 at the half, 39-23, and the Lobos continued to build in the second, allowing the Spartans no closer than 20 points over the final 16:54 of the game. UNM's largest lead of the game, 35, came with 37 seconds left on the clock on a dunk by Simmons, assisted by redshirt-junior Mike Mondragon. Mondragon also scored his first career points in his two minutes on the floor.

The Lobos will remain at home as they take on Wyoming on Wednesday, Jan. 10 in Dreamstyle Arena at 7 p.m. The game will be broadcast on the Mountain West Network.

Lobos Win Second Straight, Topple Wyoming 75-66

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.--- Behind a season-high 20 points from senior Antino Jackson and senior Joe Furstinger's fifth double-double of the season, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team posted a 75-66 victory over Wyoming in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on Wednesday night.

New Mexico (8-10, 3-2 MW) claimed its second consecutive win after a 33-point rout of San José State on Saturday. The Cowboys (11-6, 2-2 MW) dropped their second conference game of the season after taking down (RV) Boise State in overtime on Saturday at home.

The Lobos trailed by five at the half, 32-27, but rallied in the second for a comeback victory. Prior to Wednesday's matchup, UNM was 0-9 when trailing at the half while Wyoming was 6-0 when leading.

Four Lobos scored in double figures on the night including Jackson with his most as a Lobos (20), Furstinger (17), freshman Makuach Maluach (17) and junior Anthony Mathis (16). Junior Chris McNeal also added five points on the night.

"These guys, they defy logic. I didn't want to get too emotional or too prideful or whatever, but this is amazing of a group as I've ever been around," head coach Paul Weir said. "To win a game like this tonight against a team that has beaten the best teams in our league, this is big for us."

The Lobos shot 46.0 percent from the field, including 41.7 percent from behind the arc and 76.0 percent from the free-throw line. Jackson led the squad firing at a clip of 58.3 percent (7-12), 57.1 percent (4-7) from three while adding four assists and season-best four steals.

Maluach put the Lobos on the board with a jumper in the first minute of play, and UNM took a 7-2 lead with a Furstinger three and Maluach layup. The Cowboys answered with a 7-0 run to lead the Lobos 9-7 with 15:16 left in the first half.

Jackson hit back-to-back threes to put the Lobos ahead 13-11, followed by a Mathis three to extend the lead to five, 16-11, with 12:10 left in the half.

Wyoming went on another burst, posting an 8-0 run midway through the half to take a 23-18 lead with 7:47 on the clock. The Lobos traded baskets with the Cowboys on a pair of Maluach free throws and a Mathis three-pointer to keep the margin at five, trailing 28-23 with 3:02 to go.

The Lobos closed the Cowboy lead to three, 30-27, with a Jackson layup, but a Wyoming bucket at the end of the half left UNM down five at the break.

New Mexico ended the first half with 13 turnovers, forcing only seven, while shooting 41.7 percent (10-24) and 35.7 percent (5-14) from behind the arc. In addition, UNM had allowed Wyoming to shoot 44.8 percent from the field and 50 percent from three (4-8) including 16 points from Justin James.

"It was a pretty spirited half time, I was pretty upset and I think some of our players were pretty upset with some things that we were doing," Weir said. "We were fortunately able to clean that up in the second half and obviously get a really big win."

The Lobos scored the first 11 points of the second half as Jackson hit back-to-back 3-pointers to put the Lobos ahead 33-32 with 18:10 on the clock. A minute later, Jackson added a layup to give UNM a 35-32 lead, and Mathis drilled a three to make the score 38-32 with 16:27 to play.

"I honestly really praise Coach on my second-half efforts," Jackson said. "He really got me going and I was able to help my team. My team was telling me that they need me a lot, and I'm the point guard now, so I have to be there for the guys."

Wyoming closed the Lobos lead to three, 42-39, but a McNeal three widened the margin back to six, 45-39 with 14:12 left. Following a Wyoming layup, the Lobos increased the margin to seven, 48-41, with free throws from Furstinger and Mathis.

New Mexico took a 10-point lead, 59-49, on a Maluach three with 7:20 to go, then extended it to 12, the largest Lobos lead of the night, 63-51, on a Furstinger layup at the 6:16 mark.

Wyoming chipped away at the 12-point lead but never got closer than six the rest of the way. UNM went 8-for-10 from the free throw line over the final 1:12 of the game.

The Lobos improved to 50 percent from both the field and from three in the second half.

"I think it's our best win of the season. I don't really think there's much question about that," Weir said. "I think that this team is finally starting to buy into and see that you can win on emotion, you can win with passion, you can win with toughness, you can win with work ethic."

New Mexico will hit the road to face Fresno State (12-6, 2-3 MW) on Saturday, Jan. 13 at 5 p.m. MT. The game will be available to watch live on ESPN3.

Pair Scores Career-High, Lobos Nipped by Fresno State

FRESNO, CALIF. --- Despite career-high scoring performances from true freshman Makuach Maluach and junior Anthony Mathis, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team fell by a nine-point margin, 89-80, on the road at Fresno State on Saturday night.

The Lobos (8-11, 3-3 MW) had three players score in double digits as they blasted their way back from a 14-point deficit in the first half. UNM trailed by just two at halftime, 42-40, and led by five with 10:14 left in the second half, but a late Bulldog run put Fresno State ahead for good in the final eight minutes.

The score was tied 11 times and the lead changed nine times throughout Saturday night's matchup.

New Mexico fired at a clip of 51.9 percent (28-54) on the night, just the third time this season that the Lobos have shot over 50 percent and the first time they have lost when doing so. Fresno State (13-6, 3-3 MW), however, shot an arena-record 65.3 percent from the floor, and a program-record 75 percent (9-12) from three.

"To spot a team like that 27 points (nine threes) on the road, it's going to be really hard to come back from," head coach Paul Weir said. "I just think it opened up the rest of the game. When you shoot the ball like that, you're a really tough team to guard. They just didn't miss out there.

"Their size, their strength, their overall athleticism just really wore on us."

Maluach led the Lobos with 21 points on the night followed by Mathis who notched 18. Junior Chris McNeal also contributed double digits, tallying 16 points, his most since UNM's contest vs. Maryland on Nov. 25 and his fourth highest point total as a Lobo.

Mathis went 6-for-9 from the floor including 4-for-6 from three while Maluach was 8-for-15 overall, 5-for-5 from the charity stripe.

Senior Joe Furstinger neared another double-double, but fell short of his seventh straight game scoring in double digits. He registered eight points and eight rebounds as UNM's next leading scorer.

Senior Antino Jackson added seven points while leading UNM in assists (5) and steals (3).

The Lobos drilled the first shot of the game on a Dane Kuiper three before Fresno State went on a 14-0 run to take an 11-point lead at the 14:58 mark. The Bulldogs extended it to 14, their largest lead of the game, with 11 minutes left in the half before UNM began to whittle it away.

The Lobos went into the bonus with 8:18 left and eventually closed the gap to four on a Maluach layup at the 2:29 mark, 38-34. After a Bulldog layup, Furstinger hit a jumper followed by a pair of Maluach free throws to make it 40-38 with 1:06 left. McNeal hit a layup to tie it with 28 seconds left, 40-40.

A quick jumper with four seconds left put UNM down by two at the half, 42-40.

Maluach scored eight points in the first half and added nine in just the first six minutes of the second. The Lobos claimed a five-point lead 64-59 with 10:14 left on a Jackson 3-pointer and another Maluach layup before Fresno State tied the game for the 11th time at the 8:40 mark, 66-66.

Following the tie, the Bulldogs began to slowly pull away, going on a 12-0 run to take a 78-66 advantage. The Lobos would get no closer than seven the rest of the way.

UNM will remain on the road, traveling to UNLV on Wednesday, Jan. 17 to take on the Runnin' Rebels on ESPN3 at 8 p.m. MT.

Lobos Come Back for Road Win, Down UNLV 85-81

LAS VEGAS, NEV. --- Six Lobos scored in double digits on Wednesday night, leading The University of New Mexico men's basketball team to an 85-81 comeback victory over UNLV on the road. The win marks UNM's first on the road this season.

"To get a road win, for us is enormous and against a team of this caliber, a top-100 team, it's growth for us," head coach Paul Weir said. "There's a lot of reasons why these things shouldn't be happening, but we're not asking that in that locker room. We're just doing everything we can to make this team the best it can be."

The Lobos improve to 9-11, 4-3 MW with the victory while UNLV falls to 13-5, 2-3 in league play. UNM also claims

After falling behind by as many as 11 points with just 6:48 remaining in the second half, the Lobos executed a 13-3 run over two minutes to reduce the UNLV lead to just one, 70-69, with 4:22 left.

The Runnin' Rebels extended their lead back to five with 3:26 left, again with 2:14 left and yet again with 1:15 remaining on the clock on a three-pointer from UNLV's Jovan Mooring.

Sharp-shooting Lobo junior Anthony Mathis, who is firing at an outstanding clip of 45.2 percent from behind the arc on the season, responded with a clutch 4-point play, sinking a 3-pointer and a free throw to make it 81-80 with 1:07 left.

With 40 seconds left, Mooring attempted a three that would have put UNLV up four, but missed and Coach Weir followed with a timeout after the clock had reduced to just 27 seconds.

The Lobos needed just two points to claim the lead out of the timeout, burning 16 seconds looking for the right shot. With 11 seconds left, Mathis boldly drilled another three to give the Lobos a two-point advantage, 83-81.

UNLV stopped the clock with a foul and senior Joe Furstinger knocked in his seventh and eighth consecutive three throws with three seconds left on the clock for the 85-81 victory.

UNM was led once again by freshman Makuach Maluach who netted 19 points followed by senior Antino Jackson who tallied 17 and added five assists and four rebounds. Jackson finished 3-for-7 from 3-point land and went 4-for-4 from the free throw line.

Furstinger collected 14 points and nine rebounds - just missing his sixth double-double of the season. Mathis also added 14 points for UNM, going 3-for-9 from three and 3-for-3 from the charity stripe.

Junior Dane Kuiper racked up 10 points for his sixth time finishing in double figures this season; he also finished second on the team with five rebounds. Freshman Vladimir Pinchuck also tallied 10 points for just his second career game in double digits.

For the fourth straight game, just nine Lobos suited up for the contest, including walkon Mike Mondragon. Mondragon played a career-high four minutes.

"These guys are locked in," Weir said. "They're giving it everything they've got and I'm just really happy for them that they get to feel the feeling of a good road win together."

As a team, the Lobos shot 43.8 percent from the field compared to 48.4 percent for UNLV. The Lobos were also outrebounded 40-34, but UNLV went just 15.4 percent from behind the arc compared to UNM's 38.5 percent.

Despite the late UNLV 11-point advantage, the score was tied 10 times during the contest including five lead changes. UNLV outscored UNM 54-34 in the paint and 18-2 on the fast break. The Lobos outscored the Runnin' Rebels 13-12 off of turnovers and 25-18 in bench points.

The Lobos return home on Saturday, Jan. 20 as they take on San Diego State on CBS SportsNet at 5 p.m. MT. Saturday's game will also mark UNM's Domestic Violence Awareness Game during which fans can get \$10 tickets (bench rows 1-10) for arriving in purple (the designated color for domestic violence awareness).
