A LOOK AT THE 2015 MOUNTAIN WEST SCHEDULE

The 2015 Mountain West football schedule is comprised of 97 games, including 48 Conference matchups. The scheduling format for the 12-member football lineup consists of five intra-divisional games and three cross-divisional contests. Each institution will play four home and four road Conference games. This is the third year of the initial four-year cycle in which each member institution will play every other Mountain West opponent home and away. In 2015, the cross-divisional opponents will flip from the first two years, with teams playing their new opponents from the other division.

The 2015 schedule will play out over 14 weeks, concluding on Sat., Dec. 5 with the Mountain West Football Championship Game to be played at the home stadium of the highest-ranked of the two divisional champions.

The non-conference slate features 22 games against teams that earned bowl berths in 2014, including Arizona, Arizona State, Auburn, BYU (4 games), Minnesota, Mississippi, Michigan State, Navy, Northern Illinois, Ohio State, Penn State, South Alabama, Texas A&M, UCLA, Utah (2 games), Washington (2 games) and Wisconsin. Nine non-conference opponents finished ranked in last year's final USA Today/Coaches' and Associated Press Top 25 polls, including national champion Ohio State, #5 Michigan State, #10 UCLA, #13 Wisconsin, #14/12 Arizona State, #17/19 Arizona, #19/17 Ole Miss, #20/21 Utah and #23/22 Auburn.

NO FLY ZONE

The Boise State starting secondary has recorded more career interceptions than any other starting secondary in the nation. Made up of **Darian Thompson, Donte Deayon, Jonathan Moxey and Dylan Sumner-Gardner**, the Broncos have 32 career picks. Thompson and Deayon both have 15 career interceptions, which is tied for the second-most in Mountain West history and tied for second-most among active NCAA defenders. Moxey has the other two interceptions for Boise State.

TWO NEW HEAD COACHES JOIN MW RANKS IN 2015

For the second consecutive year, the Mountain West welcomes two new head football coaches. Colorado State will be under the direction of **Mike Bobo**, while **Tony Sanchez** takes over at UNLV. Both are first-year head coaches.

Bobo comes to Colorado State from the University of Georgia, where he had spent the previous 14 seasons, including the last eight as offensive coordinator. Bobo's 14-year stint at Georgia, where he was a quarterback in the late 1990s, began in January, 2001, when head coach Mark Richt hired him as quarterbacks coach. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2007. During his time at UGA, Bobo helped lead the Bulldogs to 135 victories, including two Southeastern Conference championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles and eight bowl victories. Prior to his time with the Bulldogs, Bobo began his coaching career at Jacksonville State (1999-2000).

Sanchez spent the last six seasons leading Bishop Gorman (Las Vegas) High School on an overall record of 85-5 and six consecutive state 4A championships. In his six seasons at Bishop Gorman, Sanchez saw 34 of his players earn collegiate football scholarships, including 25 to FBS programs. Prior to his stint in Las Vegas, he coached at Ocate High School in Las Cruces, N.M. and Irvin High School in El Paso, Texas. His lone collegiate coaching experience came in 1996 as he was an undergraduate assistant at New Mexico State, the school where Sanchez was a two-year letterwinner.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

The Mountain West is home to five of the 13 youngest head coaches at the FBS level. Boise State's **Bryan Harsin** (38), Nevada's **Brian Polian** (40), Colorado State's **Mike Bobo** (41), UNLV's **Tony Sanchez** (41) and Utah State's **Matt Wells** (41) are among the group of 13 coaches who were born in 1973 or later.

FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACHES IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

The Mountain West has welcomed 24 new head coaches over the last 16 seasons. Former BYU head coach Gary Crowton and current Boise State head coach **Bryan Harsin** have posted the most victories and highest win percentage among the group with 12 victories and an .857 win percentage in their inaugural years in 2001 and 2014, respectively. Harsin became the first to conclude his inaugural season by winning the Mountain West Championship Game, the first of two outright MW Championships in program history. Harsin is the only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State. Harsin is one of three first-year coaches to win at least 10 games in their inaugural season, joining Crowton (12 wins, 2001) and Urban Meyer (10 wins, 2003).

MOUNTAIN WEST IN THE POSTSEASON

The Mountain West sent a record seven teams into postseason bowl games in 2014, posting a 3-4 record (.429). Overall, the Mountain West has earned 69 bowl bids since 1999 and holds a 38-31 (.551) all-time record. The league has also posted an overall postseason mark of at least .500 in eight of the last 11 seasons.

The 2014 postseason marked the eighth straight year the MW has sent at least five teams to bowls and 11th time since the league's inception in 1999. It also marked the second straight year that six or more MW squads advanced to the postseason.

Over the last 11 seasons, the Mountain West has captured the Bowl Challenge Cup four times and owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences with a 31-23 mark (.574) during that span. The MW is the only conference to win the trophy four times since the award's inception in 2002-03.

For the second consecutive year, the Mountain West had seven bowl-eligible teams - Boise State (12-2), Colorado State (10-3), Air Force (10-3), Utah State (10-4), Nevada (7-6), San Diego State (7-6) and Fresno State (6-8). This ties the conference record for most bowl-eligible teams. The MW has boasted at least five bowl-eligible teams 11 times since the league's inception in 1999.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- On Sept. 12 at BYU, Boise State lost only its 12th game when nationally ranked in either the AP or Coaches Poll. Overall, the Broncos have compiled a 92-12 record when ranked.
- Boise State owns the fourth-longest home win streak in the nation, rattling off 15 consecutive victories. The Broncos last home loss came against San Diego State (21-19) on Nov. 3, 2012.
- The Broncos haven't suffered a home loss in non-conference play since losing in the 2005 MPC Computers Bowl against Boston College (27-21), a streak of 20 consecutive games.
- Broncos defensive backs **Darian Thompson** and **Donte Deayon** have both registered 15 career interceptions, which are the second-most in Mountain West history behind Eric Weddle's (Utah) 18. The Boise State teammates are tied for the second-most active career INTs among all FBS defenders.
- Idaho State is only the second FCS opponent Boise State will face since joining the Mountain West in 2011. The other FCS-level team it faced was Tennessee-Martin in 2013, and the Broncos were victorious 63-14.
- The last time Boise State suffered back-to-back losses was in the 2013 Hawai'i Bowl (Oregon State) and the 2014 season-opener vs. Ole Miss. The Broncos haven't lost back-to-back games in the same season since 2007, when they dropped the final two contests at Hawai'i (39-27) and vs. East Carolina (41-38).
- Boise State boasts the highest win percentage since 2000. The Broncos have won 168 of 197 contests for a mark of .853.
- Entering week three, the Broncos have the 11th-best rush defense nationally, allowing only 50.5 yards on the ground per game. In the opener, Washington ran for 29 yards, while BYU rushed for 72 yards on Sept. 12. The last time Boise State allowed a 100-yard rusher was Nov. 15, 2014 when San Diego State's **Donnel Pumphrey** ran for 147 yards.
- Idaho State has not defeated a current FBS-level opponent since defeating Utah State, 27-24, on Nov. 18, 2000.
- Boise State had rushed for at least 100 yards in 10 straight games before last Saturday's game at BYU (64 rushing yards). The last time they failed to eclipse the century mark was a road loss at Air Force on Sept. 27, 2014.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- On Sept. 12 against Tulsa, New Mexico did not have a 100-yard rusher for the first time since Nov. 15, 2014 at Utah State.
- The last Lobos victory over an autonomous 5 institution was on Sept. 13, 2008 as New Mexico defeated Arizona 36-28.
- In the first two games of the season, New Mexico has been flagged for 20 penalties for 209 yards. In their Sept. 12 contest against Tulsa, the Lobos racked up 154 penalty yards, which was the fifth-most in a single-game in Mountain West history.
- The Lobos have won four of their last five non-conference road contests, with the lone loss coming at Pittsburgh (49-27) on Sept. 14, 2013.
- The New Mexico defense leads the Mountain West and ranks eighth nationally in sacks, averaging four per game. On the other side of the ball, Arizona State allows five sacks per game, which ranks tied for last in the FBS with Penn State.
- Arizona State WR D.J. Foster has registered at least one catch in 42 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the FBS. Foster is also second nationally among active players with 4,160 all-purpose yards.
- Foster needs 20 receiving yards to become the fourth player in NCAA history to reach 2,000-plus rushing and receiving yards in his career.
- The Sun Devils are 17-4 at Sun Devil Stadium under 4th-year head coach Todd Graham.
- New Mexico LB **Dakota Cox** is second among all active FBS defenders averaging 10 tackles per contest. In 23 games, Cox has racked up 230 total tackles.
- The Lobos have scored 87 points in the first two games of the season. This marks the most points scored in the opening two games since 2003. That year, UNM hung 72 points on Texas State and then scored 28 at Texas State for a total of 100 points in two games.
- UNM WR **Dameon Gamblin** finished the Tulsa game with 131 yards receiving, the most by a wideout in the Bob Davie era. Gamblin already has 11 receptions for 176 yards in 2015. Last season, 16 receptions were the most by a Lobo pass-catcher and 293 were the most receiving yards. A UNM receiver hasn't registered more than 300 receiving yards since 2008.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Air Force has scored in a school record 273 consecutive games. This is the third-longest active streak, behind Florida (335) and TCU (276), and the eighth-longest of all-time. The last time the Falcons were shutout was Dec. 31, 1992 in the Liberty Bowl against Ole Miss.
- The Falcons rank second nationally averaging 411 rushing yards per game. In two contests, Air Force has ran the ball 132 times and scored 10 rushing touchdowns, which is also second-most in the FBS.
- Last Saturday, in Air Force's MW opener, Falcons RB **D.J. Johnson** rushed for 103 yards and scored three touchdowns, all in the fourth quarter. This performance earned him Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- Michigan State is ranked fourth in both the Coaches and AP poll. This is the highest-ranked opponent Air Force has faced since Oct. 23, 2010 when the Falcons traveled to TCU. They lost that game 38-7. The Falcons are 0-15 against teams ranked in the top-5 in at least one of the major polls.
- The Falcons are a perfect 7-for-7 in the red zone through two games in 2015. Last season, AFA ranked 18th nationally, converting on 54-of-60 trips.
- Through two weeks, the Falcons have scored 12 touchdowns by 10 different players.
- Air Force hasn't defeated an autonomous 5 member since the 2010 Independence Bowl against Georgia Tech, winning 14-7.
- The Spartans have scored 30-plus points in 10 consecutive games, which is a program record. Michigan State ended the 2014 season with eight-straight 30-plus scoring efforts and then scored 37 points in the 2015 season opener at Western Michigan and 31 against Oregon on Sept. 12. It hasn't been held under 30 points since Oct. 4, 2014 (27 points vs. Nebraska).
- Michigan State head coach Mark Dantonio is 31-11 against non-conference opponents, including a 22-2 record at home. Dantonio has compiled a 22-1 record against institutions not in the autonomous 5 conferences.
- Sept. 19 will mark the Spartans first game against a service academy since losing to Army in 1984 (10-6).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- A UNLV victory at Michigan would help the Rebels avoid their first 0-3 start since 2012. That season, they were defeated by Minnesota, Northern Arizona and Washington State to open the year.
- UNLV picked off three passes against UCLA for the first time since Oct. 8, 2011 when the Rebels traveled to Nevada. They lost that game 37-0.
- The Rebels have lost eight consecutive games, which is the second-longest losing streak among FBS teams and the longest by the Rebels since 2007, when they also lost eight straight contests. The last UNLV victory came on Oct. 10, 2014 vs. Fresno State, a 30-27 overtime win.
- UNLV has lost 11 straight games to autonomous 5 opponents. The last win came over Iowa State in a home contest on Sept. 20, 2008 (34-31).
- In 2014, UNLV led the nation along with Missouri and Boston College for fewest lost fumbles with just three. This set a new program record. This season, the Rebels have lost one fumble (against UCLA).
- The Rebels have a 2-12 record all-time against current members of the Big Ten. UNLV has defeated Wisconsin twice, but lost to the Badgers eight times. The Rebels also lost twice to both Minnesota and Northwestern.
- Michigan hasn't lost at home to an institution outside of the autonomous 5 conferences since Toledo defeated the Wolverines 13-10 on Oct. 11, 2008.
- The Wolverines are holding their opponents to 15.5 points per contest, allowing Utah to score 24 points and Oregon State to score seven. The Rebels offense is averaging 16.5 points per game, scoring 30 points at Northern Illinois and three points against nationally-ranked UCLA.
- Michigan defender Chris Wormley ranks second in FBS, averaging three tackles for loss per contest.
- The Sept. 19 contest features two head coaches who are in their third game at their respective schools. UNLV's **Tony Sanchez** compiled an 85-5 record at Bishop Gorman and won six consecutive 4A state championships, while UM's Jim Harbaugh coached the NFL's San Francisco 49ers.

- Under Polian, the Wolf Pack are 0-4 against a nationally-ranked opponent. The last time Nevada defeated a team in the Top 25 was on Sept. 17, 2010, when it beat No. 22 California 52-31.
- Nevada WR **Hasaan Henderson** surpassed the 1,000-yard receiving mark in last Saturday's game against Arizona. Henderson now has 85 receptions for 1,023 yards and six touchdowns in 24 career games.
- Nevada's last victory against a team from an autonomous 5 conference was on Sept. 5, 2014 vs. Washington State (24-13).
- Texas A&M is Nevada's first game against a current member of the SEC since a 31-21 loss to Missouri on Sept. 25, 2009. The Wolf Pack has never played against a SEC team at the time they were in the conference.
- The Aggies have won 19 consecutive non-conference home games at Kyle Field, a streak that started on Sept. 27, 2008. Texas A&M lost a week prior (Sept. 20) to Miami (41-23).
- A Nevada victory on Sept. 19, would hand Texas A&M its first loss to an institution outside of an autonomous 5 conference for the first time since Aug. 30, 2008 when it was beat by Arkansas State (18-14).
- In 2014, the Wolf Pack ranked sixth nationally in red zone scoring percentage (92.45). Through two weeks in 2015, Nevada has scored on all eight trips into the red zone. They were 5-for-5 in week one against UC Davis and 3-for-3 against Arizona.

- Utah State has won 36 of its last 49 games, which is the third-most wins during that span behind only Oregon (42) and Boise State (37).
- Utah State QB **Chuckie Keeton**, who became the second FBS quarterback to ever start five season openers (Tulsa's T.J. Rubley, from 87-91), has tied the program record for most career touchdowns with 60.
- The last time the Aggies defeated a Pac-12 team was on Sept. 7, 2012 at home against Utah (27-20). USU has lost three in a row to Pac-12 opponents.
- The Aggies are just one of four FBS institutions to win 30-plus games and register three bowl victories in the last three years. Utah State joins Clemson, Michigan State and Oregon on the list.
- Utah State is 7-8 on the road under head coach **Matt Wells**, including a 1-5 record in non-conference games. In all, USU has won 14 of its last 24 road games.
- Aggies LB **Nick Vigil** has recorded two straight double-digit tackle games this year, and five his last six games dating back to last season.
- The Aggies lead the Mountain West and rank 15th in FBS in third-down defense, only allowing their opponents to convert 22-percent of the time (7-32).
- Utah State WR **Hunter Sharp** returns after missing the first two games. In 2014, Sharp hauled in 66 receptions for 939 receiving yards and seven receiving touchdowns.
- Washington has won 10 consecutive home non-conference games dating back to Sept. 18, 2010, when the Huskies lost to Nebraska (56-21).
- Dating back to the beginning of the 1981 season, Washington has compiled a 61-13 (.824) at home against non-conference foes. In that time, three of the 13 losses have come against teams now in the Mountain West: Air Force, Fresno State and Nevada.
- The Huskies have only allowed 16 points this season, all of which were scored by Boise State. UW posted a shutout in its last game (49-0) against Sacramento State. Its scoring defense ranks seventh nationally.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Colorado State has defeated an autonomous 5 institution in three consecutive years, a streak that ties for second nationally. The Rams beat Colorado in 2012, Washington State in 2013 and Colorado and Boston College in 2014.
- The Rams have converted on 10-of-11 trips inside the red zone through two games in 2015.
- Rams WR **Rashard Higgins** has caught a pass in 27 consecutive games, every contest he has played in.
- Higgins has only played in one game in 2015, the season opener against Savannah State. He caught seven passes for 84 yards and one touchdown before head coach **Mike Bobo** pulled the starters.
- Colorado State has used two QBs in both games this season. Sophomore **Nick Stevens** has started both contests, completing 28-of-47 passes for 340 yards and five touchdowns. Redshirt-freshman **Coleman Key** has connected on 15-of-21 throws for 183 yards and two TDs.
- After not punting in the season opener, CSU's **Hayden Hunt** punted nine times in Week 2 against Minnesota. The Rams lead the nation with a net punting average of 48.6 yards.
- Hunt was named Ray Guy Award Player of the Week after averaging 49.6 yards on nine punts in Week 2. Four of his punts were downed or kicked out of bounds inside the Gophers 20-yard line.
- Against UMass on Sept. 12, Colorado rushed for 390 yards on 59 attempts and scored five rushing touchdowns. The 390 rushing yards were the most by CU in a single game since Oct. 12, 2002 (at Kansas).
- Buffs WR Nelson Spruce now owns the program record for career receptions with 219. Additionally, he is just 122 receiving yards short of the school record for career receiving yards. Spruce currently has 2,427 receiving yards.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- San José State's RB **Tyler Ervin** has rushed for at least 100 rushing yards in back-to-back game for the first time in his collegiate career. Ervin opened the 2015 season with 127 rushing yards against New Hampshire and followed it up with 121 yards on the ground at Air Force.
- For the first time in the 21st century, the Spartans have a running back that has eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark in back-to-back games to open a season.
- Oregon State's offensive coordinator Dave Baldwin was the SJSU head coach from 1997-2000, where he compiled an 18-27 record.
- The Spartans have lost five consecutive road games and eight of their last 10 road contests. Their last non-conference road win was at Navy on Sept. 29, 2012 (12-0).
- SJSU hasn't defeated an autonomous 5 institution since Sept. 9, 2006 when it earned a one-point win over Stanford (35-24).
- The Spartans defense ranks first nationally in pass defense, allowing only 42 passing yards per game. Over the last 14 games, SJSU is allowing just 107 passing yards per contest. It has been ranked top-5 nationally in this category every week since Sept. 20, 2014.
- SJSU has the top passing attack in the Mountain West through two games, averaging 281 passing yards per contest. In both games, the Spartans have used two QBs in **Joe Gray** and **Kenny Potter**. Gray has completed 27-of-38 passes for 341 yards and one touchdown, while Potter is 20-of-29 for 219 yards and a touchdown.
- Oregon State has won four of its last five non-conference games at home, with the lone loss coming on Aug. 31, 2013 against Eastern Washington, who narrowly defeated the Beavers 49-46.
- A victory on Saturday would give the Spartans their first road win against a team from the Pac-12 since Sept. 9, 2000, when SJSU defeated Stanford 40-27.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- The South Alabama football program started in 2009 and then moved up to the FBS level in 2011. It has an all-time record of 37-29.
- San Diego State RB **Donnel Pumphrey** has been held under 100 rushing yards in the first two games of 2015. Pumphrey looks to get back on track against a South Alabama defense that allows 217.5 rushing yards per contest. This is the first time he has been held to under 100 rushing yards in back-to-back games since the final two games of the 2013 season.
- SDSU is 10-3 when Pumphrey rushes for at least 100 yards and 13-5 in games in which he has a rushing touchdown.
- The Aztecs have won nine straight regular-season home games. SDSU was tripped up by No. 15/18 Fresno State on Oct. 26, 2013 (35-28). The only loss at home since that point was in the 2014 Poinsettia Bowl to Navy.
- Through two games, the Aztecs defense has seven takeaways, including six interceptions. DB **Damontae Kazee** has three INTs and LB **Calvin Munson** has two, both of which were returned for touchdowns. The six INTs are tied for the most in the nation with California.
- The Aztecs turnover margin, an average of plus-2 per game, ranks sixth nationally and first in the Mountain West.
- A victory over South Alabama will give San Diego State its first 2-1 start to a season since 2012. That year, the Aztecs lost the season opener at Washington, but then defeated Army and North Dakota at home.
- South Alabama has lost four consecutive road games, including losses at Nebraska last weekend and South Carolina in 2014, and have been outscored by nearly 30 points in those four contests.
- The Jaguars haven't played a current member of the Mountain West since Dec. 1, 2012 when they traveled to Honolulu to play Hawai'i. UH won 23-7.
- San Diego State head coach **Rocky Long** is serving as the Aztecs defensive coordinator for the seventh consecutive year, including all five years as the teams head coach. He is the only head coach in the nation that is both the head coach and defensive coordinator. Five other FBS head coaches also serve as offensive coordinators.

- Cowboy RB **Brian Hill** rushed for 242 yards vs. EMU. He has now rushed for more than 100 yards in five of his last seven games. The 242 rushing yards are the second-most among FBS rushers in 2015.
- Cowboys DE **Eddie Yarbrough** has racked up 30 career tackles for loss, third-most by a Wyoming defender all-time. Among active defenders, the 30 TFLs are the eighth-most nationally.
- Wyoming is looking to avoid its first 0-3 start since 2012. That season, the Cowboys were defeated by Texas, Toledo and Cal Poly.
- The Cowboys haven't beaten an institution from an autonomous 5 conference since Nov. 8, 2008 at Tennessee (13-7), a streak of eight consecutive losses.
- Wyoming looks to snap a five-game losing streak, dating back to a 45-17 win at Fresno State on Nov. 1, 2014.
- Washington State has averaged 392.5 passing yards per game in 2015, the fifth-most nationally. They have thrown the ball 111 times for 785 yards and six touchdowns.
- Cougars QB Luke Falk threw for 478 yards and rushed for 29 in last Saturday's victory at Rutgers. The 507 yards of total offense are the most in FBS this season.
- The Cowboys have only turned the ball over once this season, a fumble against Eastern Michigan.
- Washington State is currently on a six-game home losing streak, with its last victory coming on Nov. 23, 2013 against Utah (49-37).
- The Cowboys have played three QBs this season, including two different starters. It is the first time Wyoming has had different starters in back-to-back games since October 2012. **Cameron Coffman** started the season opener, completing 19-of-37 passes for 282 yards and two TDs. **Josh Allen** started the second game against Eastern Michigan, completing only three passes. **Nick Smith** finished the game, throwing for 51 yards.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Fresno State has dropped 20 consecutive games against Top 25 teams. The last win over a ranked opponent was in the 2004 MPC Computers Bowl, as the Bulldogs beat No. 18 Virginia in overtime (37-34).
- Head coach **Tim DeRuyter** has compiled an 18-2 record at Bulldog Stadium in his four years at Fresno State. In those 20 games, the Bulldogs have averaged 508.7 yards of total offense and scored 40.8 points.
- Utah is the 13th team from an autonomous 5 conference to visit Bulldog Stadium since 2000. In those games, the Bulldogs are 8-4.
- Fresno State RB **Marteze Waller** ranks No. 8 among all active FBS players in career rushing yards. Waller has racked up 2,433 yards on the ground. This is the second-most in the Mountain West, behind San Diego State's **Donnel Pumphrey**, who has rushed for 2,766 yards.
- Utah has only allowed 364 yards of total offense per game, and its rushing defense hasn't allowed a 100-yard rusher since Nov. 22, 2014 vs. Arizona.
- The Bulldogs allowed 73 points at Ole Miss on Sept. 12. This was the most points allowed by a Fresno State defense since Oct. 6, 1990, when Northern Illinois also scored 73 points.
- Through two games, the Bulldogs offensive line, which has 83 combined starts, has only allowed one sack.
- At home against the Utes, Fresno State is 3-0 and has won all three games by at least 14 points.
- The Utes haven't lost to an institution outside of the autonomous 5 conference since Sept. 7, 2012 when they were defeated by Utah State 27-20. Overall, in non-conference (including bowls) action, Utah has won 10 of its last 11 games.
- The Bulldogs are 23-1 under **Tim DeRuyter** when scoring more than 30 points.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Hawai'i passed for 85 yards against No. 1 Ohio State on Sept. 12. This is the first time the Rainbow Warriors had fewer than 100 passing yards in a single game since Oct. 31, 1998 at UTEP.
- The Rainbow Warriors have a 2-0 record against FCS-level opponents since joining the Mountain West in 2012. They defeated Lamar 54-2 in 2012 and beat Northern Iowa 27-24 in 2014.
- UC Davis hasn't defeated a FBS member since Oct. 2, 2010 when the Aggies took down San José State 14-13. Since then, UC Davis has dropped eight consecutive contests, and 10 of its last 11, against FBS opponents.
- A win on Sept. 19 would give Hawai'i a three-game home win streak, its longest home win streak since 2011. That year, the Rainbow Warriors won four straight, defeating Charleston Southern, Louisiana Tech, Nevada and Idaho.
- UC Davis has lost 10 of its last 11 games, including losses against Mountain West opponents Colorado State and Nevada.
- Hawai'i is 8-0 when leading after three quarters under head coach **Norm Chow**.
- The Rainbow Warriors are searching for their first 2-1 start since 2009. That season, Hawai'i beat Central Arkansas and Washington State before losing to UNLV.
- Hawai'i is averaging 233.5 yards of total offense, which ranks 125th nationally. In the opener, the Rainbow Warriors racked up 371 yards of offense before travel to Ohio State, where they managed 165 yards offensively. The Rainbow Warriors haven't recorded more than 400 yards of total offense since Nov. 22, 2014. In its last 15 games, Hawai'i has only passed the 400-yard mark four times.
- In their first two games, the Rainbow Warriors have gone up against some top QB competition in Colorado's Sefo Liufau and Ohio State Cardale Jones and J.T. Barrett. The Hawai'i defense has held its opponents to a passing efficiency rating of 93.66, 17th-best nationally.

The 2015 Mountain West Football Championship game will kick off at 4:30 p.m. PT/5:30 p.m. MT on Saturday, December 5. ESPN2 will broadcast the title match-up.

HOST SITE DETERMINATION

Host Determination. The Conference Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Committee ranking. The site determination shall be made no later than the Sunday following the final week of regular-season games, utilizing the latest available CFP poll.

If one divisional champion was ranked ahead of the other divisional champion in the CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If, in that same scenario, the divisional champion that was the highest-ranked in the CFP poll loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite of selected computer rankings following the games of November 29 will be used to determine the host.

If no Mountain West teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee poll, a composite of selected computer rankings following the games of November 28 will be used to determine the host.

Host Tie Breaker. In the event of a tie in the latest CFP Selection Committee ranking or the composite of selected computer rankings, the following comparison procedure shall be used (in order as necessary) to determine the site of the game:

- If one team was the winner of a Conference game between the two teams, it shall be the Championship Game host.
- If a tie still exists, winning percentage against common Conference opponents shall determine the Championship Game host.
- If a tie still exists, winning percentage against the next highest-placed common opponent in the Conference based upon (in order): 1. order of finish in the respective divisions, 2. record in all Conference games, and 3. most recent composite of selected computer rankings, proceeding through the Conference, will break the tie.
- Coin toss.

Divisional Champions. A divisional champion shall be the team with the highest winning percentage in all Conference games, both inter-divisional and intra-divisional, in the division. (Adopted January 2013)

- Tie Games. A tie football game shall count as half-a-game won and half-a-game lost in the standings

[Note: A team ineligible under NCAA or Mountain West rules for post-season (bowl) competition shall not compete in the Championship Game.]

DIVISIONAL TIEBREAKERS

Tie Between Two Teams. In the event of a percentage tie for a divisional championship between two teams, if one team was the winner of the Conference game between the two teams, it shall be the divisional champion.

If no game was played between the two tied teams, or that game ended in a tie, the following comparison procedure shall be used to break the tie:

- Winning percentage in games played within the division.
- Winning percentage against the next highest-placed team in the division (based upon the team's record in all games played in the Conference), proceeding through the division.
- Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
- Highest CFP ranking (or the composite of selected computer rankings if neither team is ranked in the CFP rankings) following the final week of Conference regular-season games.
- Overall winning percentage against FBS opponents.
- Coin toss.

Tie Between More Than Two Teams:

In the event of a percentage tie for a divisional championship between more than two teams, the following comparison procedure shall be used to eliminate all but two tied teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure shall be used:

- Winning percentage in games played among the tied teams.
- Winning percentage in games played against division opponents.
- Winning percentage against the next highest-placed team in the division (based upon the team's record in all games played in the Conference), proceeding through the division.
- Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
- Highest CFP ranking (or the composite of selected computer rankings if neither team is ranked in the CFP rankings) following the final week of Conference regular-season games

MW BOWL SYNOPSIS

The number of postseason appearances for the Mountain West will be driven by on-the-field performance, starting with the opportunity to play in the national semifinals or another New Year's Day bowl game as part of the College Football Playoff arrangement.



COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The highest-rated champion from among the five non-contracted conferences (American, C-USA, MAC, MW, Sun Belt, or chosen by the playoff selection committee) is guaranteed a slot in the system. In the 16 seasons since the league's inception, the Mountain West's champion or a current MW member has secured that position 12 times, placing teams in the Fiesta (3), Rose and Sugar (2) Bowls during that period.

The MW also has agreements with six (6) different bowl games that in any given year will generate as many as six (6) postseason opportunities for its member institutions. These include primary positions in some or all years with the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Gildan New Mexico Bowl, Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl, San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl and Hawai'i Bowl - and a secondary position with the Cactus Bowl.

The Mountain West will collaborate with the bowl partners to place all eligible teams with consideration given to matchup, geography and historical considerations (e.g., last time a team participated in any bowl or a particular bowl). NOTE: The MW is the primary backup for the Ticket City Cactus Bowl if the Big 12 or Pac-12 does not fill.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

In its second season, the College Football Playoff format remains unchanged: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and the national championship game played in a different city every year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

THE SELECTION COMMITTEE

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performances during the regular season, including strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game.

THE ROTATION

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.
