HEAD COACH PAUL WEIR

On the team's performance and win:

"I told the guys [in the locker room] that this win isn't on me. I'm obviously going to get a lot of credit when we win and a lot of blame when we lose, but these guys have perseverance and resilience that is really amazing. They have had that mentality all season and they are a really fun group to coach."

On sweeping the series for the first time since the 2015-16 season:

"We'll soak it in over time but for now we are just counting it as another win. We weren't thinking about the sweep or the rivalry as we prepared for the game because I didn't want us to get overly emotional. We're a great basketball team and I think our biggest obstacle is ourselves."
