PRACTICES

Air Force football practices are open to the public with the following guidelines which include refraining of scouting for an opponent or reporting during practices to include injuries or tactics. Cell Phone Use - Out of respect for those attending or participating in practices, while on the practice field during workouts please silence cell phones. If you need to make or take a call, please exit the field before doing so.

Video/Photography - Photos and video may be taken during pre-practice and periods 1-5 Mondays and Tuesdays.

Player and Coaches Availability - Player interviews prioritize each cadet's academic, military, squadron and leadership obligations in addition to any needed physical rehabilitation. Because treatment time may be necessary, players must physically complete the previous practice or game.

Player Availability - Seniors are available after practice on Monday and before practice on Tuesday between 1 and 1:45 p.m. in the media room in the Cadet Field House. Up to eight players are available on Monday and eight different players Tuesday. Juniors, sophomores and freshmen are available after games in which they play.

LAST YEAR VS. NEW MEXICO

(Nov. 10, 2018) Air Force defeated New Mexico, 42-24, to snap a two-game losing streak overall and a three-game streak to the Lobos. Air Force, who led 21-17 at the half, broke open a close game in the second half with a pair of Donald Hammond III to Kade Waguespack touchdown passes in the third quarter. Air Force put the finishing touches on the win with a three-yard TD run in the fourth quarter to make up the final margin. The Falcons rolled up season highs in total yards with 623 and rushing yards with 478 while holding the Lobos to 305 total yards, including just 55 in the second half. Hammond led the way with a career-high 136 yards rushing and a score while hitting five of six passes for a career-best 145 yards and a career-high two TDs. Kadin Remsberg added a career-high 99 yards rushing. The defense was led by Kyle Johnson's nine tackles. Grant Theil added a career-best seven tackles and his first-career interception and forced fumble in his first-career start.

THE LAST TIME AT NEW MEXICO

(Sept. 20, 2017) New Mexico defeated Air Force, 56-38, in Albuquerque, N.M., to record its third straight win in the series and fourth in the last five meetings. The game featured a one-hour, one-minute weather delay, the second straight week for Air Force to experience one in a game. The Lobos rolled up 509 total yards, including 363 rushing to race past the Falcons. Richard McQuarley led the rushing attack with 179 yards and five touchdowns on 11 carries. Air Force scored 21 points in the second quarter to take a 21-14 halftime lead. The Lobos answered with 21 third-quarter points to race out to a 35-24 lead on their way to the win. Air Force finished with 396 total yards, including 238 rushing and 158 passing. Arion Worthman rushed for 90 yards and a TD on 30 carries and hit 9-17 passes for 158 yards and a career-best three touchdowns. Tim McVey added 74 yards and a TD on 14 carries.

AN AIR FORCE WIN WOULD.....

- Air Force would improve to 9-2 overall and 6-1 in Mountain West play...The Falcons would be 9-2 for the first time in the Troy Calhoun era (2007) and first overall time 1998...AF would be 6-1 in the MW for the first time since 2015.
- Air Force would have its ninth win which would be the most since finishing the 2016 season with 10
- Air Force would have its sixth conference win which would be the most since finishing second with a 6-2 mark in 2015
- Air Force would improve to 23-14 all-time vs. New Mexico, including a 19-12 mark in conference play...the Falcons would improve to 10-10 all-time at New Mexico
- Air Force would snap a three-game losing streak at New Mexico and post its first win in Albuquerque since 2011

AIR FORCE LAST TIME OUT

Air Force defeated Colorado State, 38-21, to win the Ram-Falcon Trophy. The Falcons spotted Colorado State 14 points after the Rams scored on its opening drive and returned a fumble for a score to go up 14-0 with 3:32 remaining in the first quarter. The Falcons scored on a Donald Hammond III to Ben Waters touchdown pass and added a Jake Koehnke field goal to cut it to 14-10 at the half. The second half was all-Falcons. Geraud Sanders gave Air Force the lead for good on a 50 yard touchdown pass from Hammond and Waters added a second touchdown reception to put the Falcons in front 24-14. Colorado State cut the lead to 24-21 with a Patrick O'Brien to Dante Wright touchdown pass with 6:36 left. Hammond scored on a one-yard run to make it 31-21 with 2:32 remaining and Zane Lewis recorded a 99-yard interception return for a score to make up the final margin. Hammond finished with 126 yards passing and a career-high three touchdowns. Kadin Remsberg led the rushing attack with 17 carries for 101 yards. Timothy Jackson added 73 yards on 17 carries. The Falcons finished for 353 total yards, including 227 rushing. Colorado State finished with 386 total yards. O'Brien hit 28-43 passes for 347 yards and two scores to lead the Rams.

Team Notes

- Air Force improved to 8-2 overall and 5-1 in Mountain West play.
- Air Force is 8-2 for the first time since the 2014 season.
- Air Force recovered from a 14-point deficit to win the game, the largest comeback since a 34-30 win over UNLV, Oct. 14, 2017. Air Force trailed 27-0 in the second quarter of that game.
- Air Force had a season-high eight sacks, the most in the Troy Calhoun era. The Falcons entered the game with 14 sacks on the season.
- The Falcons have won five straight games which is the longest streak since ending the 2016 season six consecutive wins.
- Air Force won its eighth game which is the most in a season since the 2016 team had a 10-3 mark.
- Air Force won its fifth conference game which is the most since winning five in 2016.
- Air Force improved to 36-21-1 all-time vs. Colorado State, including a 25-15 mark in conference play. The Falcons improved to 15-10 all-time at Colorado State. Air Force won its fifth straight in the series and 12th of the last 14 overall.
- Air Force improved to 2-0 this season following an open week. The Falcons improved to 6-7 in such games under head coach Troy Calhoun.
- Air Force won the Ram-Falcon Trophy for a series-best 25th time.
- Air Force has defeated Colorado and Colorado State in the same season for the first time since 1968. The Falcons defeated Colorado, 30-23, in overtime earlier this season. This season marked the first time since 1972 the Falcons have played both in the same year.
- Air Force head coach Troy Calhoun improved to 95-69 in his 13th season, including an 11-2 mark vs. Colorado State. Calhoun's 95 wins ranks third all-time at Air Force, trailing only Ben Martin, who had 96 from 1958-77, and Fisher DeBerry, who had 169 from 1984-2006.
- Air Force improved to 5-0 this season when having a 100-yard rusher.
- Air Force's 227 yards rushing was the fewest in a win this season.

Individual Notes

- Senior TE Rhett Myers made his first career start.
- Junior QB Donald Hammond III accounted for four touchdowns, throwing for a career-high three and rushing for one. He completed 5 of 11 for 126 yards and three touchdowns. Hammond threw a 31-yard touchdown pass to Ben Waters, a 50-yard strike to Geraud Sanders for the go-ahead TD and a 28-yard TD pass again to Waters. Hammond carried 12 times for 42 yards and one rushing TD. His previous career high for touchdown passes was two last year against New Mexico.
- Senior WB Ben Waters hauled in two catches--both for touchdowns—for 59 yards. The two TD receptions are a career-high.
- Junior TB Kadin Remsberg carried 17 times for 101 yards rushing. It was his third career 100 yard rushing game and the second this season.
- Senior DB Zane Lewis had a 99-yard touchdown return on an interception, tying his own school record. It's his second-career 99 yard TD off an interception, doing so against Nevada

last year. Lewis also had a career-high three pass breakups.

- Senior LB Jake Ksiazek recorded his first career sack. He had a career high 3.0 sacks in the game, the most by a Falcon since Ryan Watson had 3.0 against Utah State in 2016. In addition, Ksiazek forced two fumbles. He entered the game with no career fumbles forced.
- Senior PK Jake Koehnke made a 31-yard field goal in the second quarter. He is a perfect 10-for-10 on the season.
- Sophomore DL Christopher Herrera had a career high seven tackles. His previous high was two against Army earlier this season.
- Junior DB Milton Bugg III had a career high 10 tackles. His previous high was seven vs. Hawaii earlier this season.

- Air Force is bowl-eligible for the first time since 2016 and the 10th time in 13 seasons under head coach Troy Calhoun.
- Air Force is 8-2 for the first time since the 2014 season.
- State champions: Air Force has defeated Colorado and Colorado State in the same season for the first time since 1968. The Falcons defeated Colorado, 30-23, in overtime earlier this season. This season marked the first time since 1972 the Falcons have played both in the same year.

AIR FORCE ONE OF SIX AWARDED FOR ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

The Air Force Academy, University of Alabama, Clemson University, University of Louisville, Rice University and the University of Utah will share the American Football Coaches Association's 2019 Academic Achievement Award, which is presented by the Touchdown Club of Memphis.

All six schools recorded a perfect 1,000 for their single-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) for 2017-18. This is first honor for Air Force and Louisville, the second honor for Alabama, Clemson and Utah and the third honor for Rice. The award will be presented to the head coach at each institution during the Honors Luncheon on Monday, January 13, at the 2020 AFCA Convention in Nashville, Tennessee.

This is the second year that the NCAA's single-year APR has been used to select a winner.

The APR holds institutions accountable for the academic progress of their student-athletes through a team-based metric that accounts for the eligibility and retention of each student-athlete for each academic term.

AIR FORCE AT HOME

Air Force is 5-0 at home this season. The Falcons have scored 40-plus points in three of five games and have a 180-75 scoring margin which is an average of 36.0 to 15.0.

Air Force is 59-20 in Falcon Stadium under head coach Troy Calhoun, including a school-record 15-game winning streak from 2014 to Oct. 22, 2016. Air Force went 20-4 at home from 2014-17. The 20 wins is the best four-year mark in school history, breaking the record of 19 set from 1982-85 and 1998-2001 when the program went 19-4 those years.

Air Force set a record for the best three-year run from 2014-16 with a 17-1 record, breaking the mark of 15-2 from 1983-85.

Air Force was picked to finish third in the Mountain West Mountain Division in the pre-season media poll, announced during the 2019 Mountain West Football Media Days. Boise State was selected first with 120 points and 15 first-place votes while Utah State was second with 108 points and six first-place votes. Air Force had 73 points, followed by Wyoming with 66, Colorado State 52 and New Mexico 22.

Fresno State was picked to win the West Division with 122 points and 17 first place votes. San Diego State was picked second with 106 points and three first-place votes, followed by Nevada with 74 points, Hawaii with 67, including one first-place vote, UNLV with 51 points and San Jose State with 21.

Senior defensive back Jeremy Fejedelem and junior defensive lineman Jordan Jackson were each named to the preseason all-Mountain West team.

Johnson has a 3.94 GPA and is majoring in management with a minor in Spanish. He is ranked No. 14 in his class for academics and 10th in order of merit which includes military and athletic performance. Last summer he worked as an investigative analyst at the Center for Advanced Defense Studies as an intern analyst for the Washington DC-based think tank. His work included combining open source research and powerful analytical tools to provide valuable data to the federal intelligence community about illicit networks in Latin America.

SANDERS HONORED FOR ACADEMICS, COMMUNITY WORK

Air Force senior QB Isaiah Sanders has received four major national recognitions for his work with the community, his academics and athletics.

- **1** - Sanders has been named to the *American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) 2019 All-state Good Works Team*. Sanders was selected for the 11-man FBS team from a total of 137 student-athletes nominated. He is the first Air Force player ever selected to the team.
- **2** - Sanders was named a *semifinalist for the 2019 Wuerffel Trophy*, presented by the Chick-fil-A® Foundation. The Wuerffel Trophy, known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service," is presented annually to the Football Bowl Subdivision player who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement. Named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback, Danny Wuerffel, from the University of Florida, the Wuerffel Trophy has honored over 1,200 nominees since its inception in 2005.
- **3** - Sanders was also named one of 185 *semifinalists for the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy® Presented by Mazda*. Celebrating its 30th year in 2019, the award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.
- **4** - Sanders was named one of 20 *semifinalists for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year award*. Compiled by a subset of the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Selection Committee, the semifinalists have demonstrated a record of leadership by exhibiting exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field. The winner will receive a \$10,000 contribution in his name to his school's athletic scholarship fund. The contribution will be made by Jason Witten's SCORE Foundation, the official charity of Jason and his wife Michelle.

Sanders has been active in the football team as a motivational leaders while starting games each of the last three seasons. He serves as the team's community service representative, and has helped coordinate and participate in a service event where team members fix up a playground for a local childcare organization. He has also served as the cadet-in-charge of our Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) group, which has reached up to approximately 50-60 cadets in attendance and meets weekly, by helping plan events and run weekly meetings. Sanders is also the vice president of Undivided, a non-profit that focuses on strengthening communities and on helping community members create positive change in their spheres of influence. He has gone out in the community, whether at local high schools' FCA events, retreats, or the Academy's SPIRE groups, and performed personal spoken word pieces and/or presented biblically-related messages for an estimated 1,000-plus people within the past two years. He was also the keynote/featured speaker at a retreat for high schoolers looking to go deeper in their faith.

SANDERS GETS IT DONE ON THE FIELD AS WELL

Senior QB and Colorado Springs native Isaiah Sanders has had several record-setting performances at Air Force.

- He led the team in passing last season, hitting 48-of-78 passes for 844 yards and four scores. He completed 61.5 percent of his passes which is the third-best single season mark in school history and best since Shaun Carney hit 64.2 percent in 2007. Sanders had a 161.66 efficiency rating which is the fourth-best mark in school history and best since Arion Worthman set the school record with a 200.16 mark in 2016.
- Sanders averaged 135 yards and 2.5 touchdowns rushing and 213.5 yards and 1.5 touchdowns passing in two games at UNLV and vs. Boise State. He rushed for 270 yards and four touchdowns and hit 19-26 passes (73.1 percent) for 427 yards and three touchdowns. He is the first Falcon since Karson Roberts in 2015 to throw for 200-plus yards in back-to-back games and his 427 yards are the most since Roberts threw for a school record 550 yards vs. Utah State and Boise State that year.
- Sanders rushed for 97 yards and a touchdown on 28 carries while hitting 10 of 15 passes for 210 yards and a career-best two touchdowns vs. Boise State. He just missed becoming the only player in Air Force history to rush for 100 yards and pass for 200 yards in a game twice.
- Sanders had a career night at UNLV, recorded 390 yards of total offense which is the second-most in school history. He rushed for a season-high 173 yards and matched his career high with three touchdowns with a career-long run of 45 yards. Sanders hit nine-of-11 passes for a career-best 217 yards and a touchdown, connecting on a career-long 69 yard pass for a score. He opened the game with nine straight completions which is the best at Air Force since

2013 and is fifth-best ever in school history. He became just the second player in Air Force history to rush for 100 yards and throw for 200 yards in a game.

- His first-career start came vs. Utah State in the 2017 season finale. He recorded a school-record 44 carries for career highs of 196 yards and three touchdowns to lead Air Force to a win.

KOEHNKE NAMED LOU GROZA SEMIFINALIST

Air Force senior PK Jake Koehnke has been named one of 20 semifinalist for the Lou Groza National Collegiate Placekicker Award, according to the Palm Beach County Sports Commission.

Koehnke is tied for the national lead in field goal percentage, hitting all 10 of his attempts this season. He has hit 11 straight dating back to last season. Koehnke is one of just five kickers nationally to be perfect on the year in field goals.

Koehnke hit a career-long 57 yard field goal vs. Utah State which ties as the sixth-longest in Air Force history and is the longest since 2007. He tied a school record with four field goals at Navy, including a three of 40-plus yards. He is the first Falcon with four field goals in a game since Erik Soderberg in 2009.

He has hit 19 of 22 field goals in his career. His 86.4 career field goal percentage ranks second in school history.

KAUPPILA ON NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

Air Force senior Garrett Kauppila is a member of the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee. He is one of two players from the Mountain West on the committee.

During its June 2018 in-person meeting, the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee voted to change its structure to provide football student-athletes increased opportunities for providing feedback to the committee. This led to the formation of a Student-Athlete Connection Group. The goal of the Student-Athlete Connection Group is to gather broad-based feedback from Division I football student-athletes on issues the Football Oversight Committee is reviewing. Members of the group will be asked to participate in quarterly teleconferences to provide feedback to the oversight committee. There may also be opportunities to share feedback via surveys.

FIFITA ON POLYNESIAN CFB PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Air Force senior defensive lineman Mosese Fifita has been selected for the 2019 Polynesian College Football Player of the Year watch list, announced by the Polynesian Football Hall of Fame. The award goes annually to the most outstanding Polynesian college football player that epitomizes great ability and integrity. Fifita is one of 62 players from 32 different schools selected.

Fifita is fifth on the team in tackles with 38 which is tops among defensive linemen. He has 5.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He has had a hand in four turnovers with two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Fifita is third in the MW and 16th nationally in fumbles recovered with a .20 average. He had a career-high six tackles and a quarterback hurry vs. Army. He played in all 12 games for Air Force last season, collecting 25 total tackles. He had a career-best six tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack vs. Boise State.

FEJEDELEM AMONG THE LEADERS

Senior safety Jeremy Fejedelem is third on the team in tackles with 54. He leads all current Falcons in career tackles with 192. Fej has led the Falcons in tackles twice this season. He had seven tackles vs. Army and five tackles and a forced fumble vs. Colorado State.

He had nine stops at Boise State, including four unassisted. Fejedelem had one of his best days as a Falcon in Air Force's 30-23 overtime win at Colorado, recording a career-high 14 tackles, including a career-high 12 solo stops. He also had a sack and a career-best two tackles for loss.

Fejedelem is a preseason all-Mountain West selection and is on the Senior Bowl Watch List. The Senior Bowl is Jan. 29 in Mobile, Ala.

Fejedelem led the Falcons and ranked eighth in the Mountain West in tackles with 104, an average of 8.7 per game, in 2018. He had a team-best six games of 10-plus tackles and led the Falcons with three interceptions. He is the first Falcon since linebacker Jordan Pierce (117) in 2014 with 100 tackles in a season and the first defensive back to do it since safety Chris Thomas had 107 in 2008.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN JORDAN JACKSON

Junior defensive lineman Jordan Jackson is a preseason all-Mountain West selection. He has recorded 31 total tackles, including 13 unassisted. He is third on the team in sacks with 3.5

FORMER GREAT ERNIE JENNINGS FINALIST FOR CFB HALL OF FAME

Former Air Force All-American wide receiver Ernie Jennings is on the 2020 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame. Jennings was a consensus first-team All-American in 1970 and finished eighth in the voting for the Heisman Trophy. He helped lead the Falcons to the 1971 Sugar Bowl and holds nearly every single-season and career receiving records at the Academy.

The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame announced the names on the 2020 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, including 76 players and five coaches from the Football Bowl Subdivision and 101 players and 33 coaches from the divisional ranks.

The announcement of the 2020 Class will be made in January 2020 in the days leading up to the College Football Playoff (CFP) National Championship in New Orleans. The 2020 College Football Hall of Fame Class will officially be inducted during the 63rd NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 8, 2020, at the New York Hilton Midtown.

AIR FORCE PLAYING COLORADO, COLORADO STATE

Air Force is playing in-state schools Colorado and Colorado State in the same season for the first time since 1972. The Falcons defeated Colorado State, 53-13, in Fort Collins Oct. 7 and lost at home vs. Colorado, 38-7, that year. Air Force defeated Colorado, 30-23, in overtime Sept. 14 and won at Colorado State, 38-21, Nov. 16.

THE RAM-FALCON TROPHY

Air Force and Colorado State compete each year for the Ram-Falcon Trophy. The 2019 season marks the 40th year of the trophy competition with Air Force holding a 25-15 lead. The trophy's origin is tracked back to Shelly Godkin, a former ROTC commander at Colorado State. He watched the teams play in 1978 and sought to translate his impressions into a trophy symbolic of an annual game. The first Ram-Falcon trophy game was in 1980.

THE KUTER TROPHY

The General Laurence S. Kuter Trophy, named after the first PACAF commander, is a tribute to the friendship between Hawai'i and Air Force and to the cooperation between the people of Hawai'i and their Air Force. The trophy was conceived by the University of Hawai'i, sponsored by the Pacific Air Command, and the Air Force Academy helped design it. The Kuter trophy is presented to the winner of the annual football game between the two schools.

for 26 yards and quarterback hurries with four. He also has a forced fumble and a blocked kick.

Jackson had a career-high nine tackles and a sack vs. Army. He had eight tackles and a TFL at Navy. He had four tackles, two quarterback hurries a forced fumble and his first solo sack of the season vs. San Jose State. Jackson added one tackle and a quarterback hurry at Colorado, but his biggest play was his first-career blocked kick. Jackson blocked a PAT attempt in the fourth quarter to keep the Air Force lead at seven.

He led the team in tackles for loss with 12.5 and sacks with 4.5 last season. He finished seventh in the conference in tackles for loss with an average of 1.04 per game.

BIRDOW/REMSBERG CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Senior fullback Taven Birdow and junior running back Kadin Remsberg each hit the 1,000-yard rushing mark in their careers this season. Birdow became the 48th player in school history to top the 1,000-yard mark. He ranks 42nd in career rushing with 1,224 yards. He is third on the team in rushing this season with 574 yards and five touchdowns.

Remsberg became the 49th player in Air Force history and ranks 35th in school history with 1,361 yards. He leads the Falcons and ranks fifth in the MW in rushing with 778 yards (77.8 avg) and seven touchdowns.

QUARTERBACK DONALD HAMMOND III

Junior quarterback Donald Hammond III is fourth on the team in rushing with 415 yards and a team-best nine touchdowns. He has hit 38-83 passes for a team-best 838 yards and eight touchdowns. Hammond rushed for 42 yards and a touchdown and hit 5-11 passes for 126 yards and matched his career high with three touchdowns vs. Colorado State.

Hammond rushed 37 yards and two touchdowns and hit 2-3 passes for 81 yards and a score vs. Fresno State. He recorded career highs in passing at Navy, hitting 10 of 25 passes for 205 yards. He also rushed for a season-high 77 yards and a touchdown with a season-long run of 42 yards. Hammond entered the game during Air Force's first drive against San Jose State and finished off the scoring drive. He finished the game with 25 yards rushing and hit 5-9 passes for 131 yards and a touchdown.

Hammond hit 7-12 passes for 155 yards and two touchdowns at Colorado. He connected on an 81 yard scoring strike which ties as the fourth longest in school history and is the longest by a Falcon since 2005. Hammond engineered a 35-0 halftime lead vs. Colgate in the season opener before taking the rest of the game off. Hammond rushed for 26 yards and matched his career high with three rushing touchdowns. He did not attempt a pass in the game.

BUGG III AMONG THE LEADERS

Junior defensive back Milton Bugg III leads the team, ranks fourth in the MW and 33rd in the nation in interceptions with three which is a .33 average. Bugg is fourth on the team in tackles with 46, including 33 unassisted. Bugg recorded a career-best 10 tackles and had two pass breakups at Colorado State. The 10-tackle game is the first of his career.

Bugg returned to the lineup at Hawaii after missing the Fresno State game due to injury. He recorded a career-high seven tackles, had a pass breakup and his third interception of the season, returning it 92 yards for a touchdown. The 92-yard return is the fourth-longest in Air Force history.

Johnson is the first Falcon with multiple defensive touchdowns since linebacker Corey Nelson returned interceptions for touchdowns in 1999 (27 yards) and 2000 (68 yards), both coming against Army.

Johnson had eight tackles and a TFL vs. Colorado State. He recorded a season-high 11 tackles vs. Army. He is second on the team in tackles with 63 and has 4.5 tackles for loss for 22 yards and 1.5 sacks for 13 yards.

SENIOR WR SANDERS THIRD IN THE NATION

Senior receiver Geraud Sanders is having the best year of his career in 2019. Sanders leads the Falcons in receiving with 23 catches for 557 yards and five touchdowns. Sanders is second the MW and third nationally in yards per catch with a 24.2 average. He had two catches for 59 yards and a 50-yard touchdown catch at Colorado State.

Sanders had his second-career 100-yard game in the win at Hawaii with three catches for 116 yards, including a career-long for 75 yards for a score. The 75 yard catch is the second-longest by an AF player this season and is the 12th longest in school history.

He had his first-career 100-yard game in the win over San Jose State with three catches for a then-career-best 108 yards and scored on a then-career-long 64 yard reception. He had a career-best five catches for 86 yards and a touchdown at Boise State. Sanders had four catches for 56 yards and a score at Colorado. He caught Air Force’s only pass vs. Colgate, good for 41 yards.

MEEKS LEADS THE TEAM

Junior linebacker Demonte Meeks leads the team and ranks 11th in the Mountain West in tackles with 73, which is an average of 7.1 per game. He also leads the team in tackles for loss with 8.0 for 34 yards and is second in sacks with 4.0 for 26 yards.

Meeks had nine tackles and a sack at Colorado State. He had a team-best eight tackles, a half sack and a quarterback hurry vs. Utah State. He had one of his best days as a Falcon at Hawaii, leading the team in tackles with eight, including a career-best seven unassisted. He added career highs of 2.0 sacks for 12 yards, 4.0 tackles for loss for 18 yards and a forced fumble. He tied for the team-lead with six tackles vs. Fresno State. He also had a tackle for loss for one yards. Meeks recorded a career-high 11 tackles and a tackle for loss at Navy. The 10-plus tackle effort is the first of his career.

WHAT A DAY FOR SCHMIDT

Senior backup quarterback Mike Schmidt had the best day of his career while leading Air Force past Hawaii, 56-26. Schmidt entered the game on Air Force’s sixth play on the opening drive. He recorded career highs in every rushing category with 14 carries for 120 yards and three touchdowns while recording a career long run of 61 yards. His 100-yard game is the first of his career, as he entered the game with three carries for 28 yards in his career. His previous highs in rushing were one carry vs. Fresno State and 21 yards vs. VMI in 2017. Schmidt also recorded career highs in every passing category, hitting 5-6 passes for 147 yards and a touchdown, including a career-long pass of 75 yards for a touchdown. The 75 yard pass play is the second-long this season by Air Force and is the 12th longest in school history. He entered the game without a passing attempt in his career. He completed the first pass attempt of his career which covered 39 yards and set up Air Force for a first-and-goal. Schmidt scored his first-career touchdown on the next play on a one-yard run. His 267 total yards are the most by a Falcon this season and he is the first Falcon to rush and pass for over a 100 yards each in a game this season and first overall since Isaiah Sanders vs. UNLV in 2018. Schmidt was Mountain West offensive player of the week and College Sports Madness Mountain West player of the week for his performance.

LEWIS TIES RECORD

Senior defensive back Zane Lewis tied his own school record with a 99 yard interception return for a touchdown in Air Force’s 38-21 win over Colorado State. Lewis finished the game with six total tackles, the pick and a career-best three pass breakups. Lewis recorded his first 99 yard INT return for a score last season vs. Nevada. Lewis joins teammate Kyle Johnson with a pair of pick-sixes in his career. They are the first Falcons with multiple defensive touchdowns since linebacker Corey Nelson returned interceptions for touchdowns in 1999 (27 yards) and 2000 (68 yards), both coming against Army.

KSIAZEK NAMED MW DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Air Force senior defensive lineman Jake Ksiazek was named Mountain West defensive player of the week for his performance against Colorado State. He recorded career highs in every category in Air Force’s 38-21 win. He had four tackles, including 3.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery and was a part of three turnovers. He recorded 17 total yards in losses with his three sacks and his fumble recovery led to a field goal to pull AF to within four points and was in AF territory. Ksiazek’s three sacks are the most by a Falcon since Ryan Watson had 3.0 vs. Utah State in 2016. He entered the game without a sack or TFL this season or in his career.

JACKSON FIRST EVER

Sophomore Timothy Jackson rushed for 73 yards on 17 carries at Colorado State in his third straight start. He had a career-high 155 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries vs. Army in his second consecutive start to record his fourth straight 100-yard rushing game. He is the first fullback in school history to hit the 100-yard mark in fourth straight games. Jackson is the first Falcon at any position to do it since Cody Getz opened the 2012 season with five straight. Jackson is second on the team in rushing with 734 yards and third in rushing touchdowns with six. He leads the team and ranks fourth in the MW in rushing yards per game with an 81.6 average.

Timothy Jackson notes

- Started last three games and has averaged 125.3 yards and has two touchdowns
- During his four-game 100-yard streak, averaged 133.3 yards per game on 19.5 carries and scored a touchdown in each game
- Jackson is the first fullback in Air Force history with four 100-yard games in a season since Pat Evans had five in 1984
- He is one of just four fullbacks in Air Force history with four or more 100-yard games in a season...his four this season are tied for third in school history

AIR FORCE HONORS C-17 WITH AIRPOWER LEGACY SERIES

The Air Force football team will continue its Air Power Legacy Series this season by honoring the C-17 aircraft, a large military transport. The team will wear special uniforms honoring the C-17 for the Hawaii game, Oct. 19.

The helmet is matte gray and designed after the nose of the plane. The gray uniform with black lettering features the nine active C-17 Air Force base's tail flashes in place of the nameplate on the back of the jersey.

This season's uniform combination is the first to utilize reflective material which is one the side of the aircraft. The uniform has reflective material on the helmet and shoulders, sides of the jersey and side of the pants.

The C-17 uniform is the fourth in the series. The Airpower Legacy Series began in the 2016 season with the Tiger Shark nose-art which has been represented on multiple Air Force aircraft dating back to World War II. While 2016 focused on the past, the Falcons honored the present, and future, of air power in 2017 with the F-35 theme, the Air Force's newest fighter. The team honored the AC-130 which is a ground-attack aircraft in 2018.

Active C-17 Air Force Bases being honored

- **Charleston Air Force Base** is located in the City of North Charleston, South Carolina. The facility is under the jurisdiction of the 628th Air Base Wing, a subordinate element of the Air Mobility Command.
- **Dover Air Force Base** is home to the 436th Airlift Wing. Dover, Delaware
- **Elmendorf Air Force Base** is in Anchorage, Alaska. Originally known as Elmendorf Field, it became Elmendorf Air Force Base after World War II. In 2010, it was amalgamated with nearby Fort Richardson to form Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson.
- **Hickam Air Force Base** is home to the Pacific Command, PACAF, 15th Wing and the Hawaii Air National Guard.
- **Joint Base Lewis-McChord** is home to I Corps and the 62nd Airlift Wing located south-south west of Tacoma, Washington. The facility is an amalgamation of the United States Army's Fort Lewis and the United States Air Force's McChord Air Force Base which merged on 1 February 2010 into a Joint Base.
- **McGuire Air Force Base**, the common name of the McGuire unit of Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, is located in Burlington County, New Jersey, approximately 16 miles south-southeast of Trenton. McGuire is under the jurisdiction of the Air Mobility Command.
- **March Air Reserve Base**, previously known as March Air Force Base is located in Riverside County, California between the cities of Riverside, Moreno Valley and Perris.
- **Travis Air Force Base** is in Fairfield, California. Situated in the San Francisco Bay Area and known as the "Gateway to the Pacific," Travis Air Force Base handles more cargo and passenger traffic through its airport than any other military air terminal in the United States.
- **Wright-Patterson Air Force Base** is located just east of Dayton, Ohio. It includes both Wright and Patterson Fields, which were originally Wilbur Wright Field and Fairfield Aviation General Supply Depot.

The C-17 aircraft

The C-17 is a large military transport aircraft. It was developed for the United States Air Force (USAF) from the 1980s to the early 1990s by McDonnell Douglas. The C-17 commonly performs tactical and strategic airlift missions, transporting troops and cargo throughout the world; additional roles include medical evacuation and airdrop duties.

The C-17 is designed to operate from runways as short as 3,500 ft (1,100 m) and as narrow as 90 ft (27 m). In addition, the C-17 can operate from unpaved, unimproved runways. The thrust reversers can be used to move the aircraft backwards and reverse direction on narrow taxiways using a three- (or more) point turn.

A C-17 accompanies the President of the United States on his visits to both domestic and foreign arrangements, consultations, and meetings. The C-17 is used to transport the Presidential Limousine, Marine One, and security detachments. There have been several occasions when a C-17 has been used to transport the President himself, temporarily gaining the Air Force One call sign while doing so.



SERIES HISTORY

The Air Power Legacy Series began in the 2016 season with the football team wearing an alternate uniform for the Georgia State game to celebrate the Tiger Shark teeth



nose-art which has been represented on multiple Air Force aircraft dating back to World War II. During the WWII era, fighter plane pilots were called "Flying Tigers" and were part of the U.S. Army Air Corps, which later became the Air Force. The helmets worn for the game featured a shark-teeth design like those painted on the aircraft.

While 2016 focused on the past, the Falcons honored the present, and future, of air power in 2017 with the F-35 theme. The F-35 completed its first flight in



2006. In 2012, the F-35 program increased to 30 aircraft. In 2016, the F-35A was declared combat ready by Gen. Hawk Carlisle, the commander of the Air Combat Command. The helmet had five different designs. On one side of every helmet will be the familiar Air Force logo often seen on aircraft, which includes the length-wise bars intersecting the roundel. On the other side was a decal representing one of the five Air Force F-35A operational fighter squadrons in the Air Force.

The team honored the AC-130 in 2018. The Falcons debuted the uniform in the season opener Sept. 1 vs. Stony Brook and wore them again at home against



New Mexico. The helmet featured the AC-130 on one side, plus squadron patches on the other. The AC-130 gunship is a heavily armed, long-endurance ground-attack variant of the C-130 Hercules transport fixed-wing aircraft. It carries a wide array of anti-ground oriented weapons that are integrated with sophisticated sensors, navigation, and fire-control systems. Unlike other military fixed-wing aircraft, the AC-130 relies on visual targeting. Because its large profile and low operating altitudes (around 7,000 ft) make it an easy target, it usually flies close air support missions at night.

HEAD COACH TROY CALHOUN

Troy Calhoun is in his 13th season as head coach at Air Force where he has a 95-69 overall record and a 57-44 mark in Mountain West play. He has led Air Force to nine bowl games, including a school-record six straight from 2007-12.

Calhoun has led the program to two 10-win seasons (2014, 2016), a pair of nine-win seasons (2007, 2010) and three with eight wins (2008, 2009 and 2015). He has led the Falcons to the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy four times. Calhoun led the Falcons to an 8-6 overall record in 2015 and the Mountain Division championship and first-ever MW title game appearance. Calhoun is the only coach in the 100-plus year history of service academy football to lead teams to at least seven wins and a bowl game in each of his first five seasons. Calhoun has twice been semifinalist for the National Coach of the Year award for his efforts on and off the field (2007, 2010).

Calhoun came to his alma mater in 2007 and took over a program that had three straight losing seasons. Air Force finished the 2007 season 9-4 overall and placed second in the Mountain West Conference with a 6-2 mark in Calhoun's first year. The Falcons earned their first bowl bid in five seasons, advancing to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl in Fort Worth, Texas. The five-game turnaround from the previous season was the largest in the nation by a first-year head coach and tied as the third-largest overall in the nation.

Calhoun was named the conference's coach of the year for his efforts. In addition, he was named coach of the year in Region 5 by the American Football Coaches Association and was one of eight finalists for national coach of the year honors.

Calhoun brought a wealth of experience and impressive resume at the collegiate and professional levels that is flooded with success at every stop to the Academy. Calhoun came to the Academy after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Houston Texans in 2006. The Texans were one of only two NFL teams to triple their number of wins from the previous year.

Calhoun became a well-rounded NFL coach, working as a defensive assistant, special teams assistant and offensive assistant with the Denver Broncos from 2003-05. He began his NFL coaching career by serving as the defensive assistant under defensive coordinator Larry Coyer in 2003.

Prior to the NFL, Calhoun was an offensive coordinator for six seasons on the collegiate level. He began his coaching career at Air Force, where he worked as a graduate assistant from 1989-90. He started at quarterback for the Academy in 1986 and was one of only two freshmen to letter for the 1985 team that finished fifth in the final polls with a 12-1 record that included wins over national powers Notre Dame and Texas.

Calhoun served his country from 1989-95 as an active duty officer in the Air Force. He was the Falcons' recruiting coordinator and the junior varsity offensive coordinator in 1993-94. He moved to Ohio University in 1995 where he served as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons. Calhoun was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1997. Calhoun moved to Wake Forest in 2001 and remained there prior to his stint with the Broncos.

Groomed on the basics of integrity and passion, Calhoun is a native of Roseburg, Ore., and was raised in a home where both kids graduated from the Air Force Academy and were varsity letter winners on nationally-ranked teams. He and his wife, Amanda, live in Colorado Springs and have two children, Tyler (17) and Amelia (15).
