**SIMPLE GUIDELINES:** Prioritize each cadet's educational and leadership training; make sure under-class cadets have ample chance to acclimate with their class schedules and military squadrons; and simple to observe and follow cadets during practices and games

**PRACTICES:**

**Air Force Football Practices:** Open practice guidelines include refraining of scouting for an opponent or reporting during practices to include injuries or tactics.

**Cell Phone Use:** Out of respect for those attending or participating in practices, while on the practice field during workouts please silence cell phones. If you need to take or make a call, please exit the field before doing so.

**Video/Photography:** Video and photography during practices can be done by those who are first cleared through the Air Force communications staff. Video and photographers may shoot/film during pre-practice and periods 1-5 on Mondays and Tuesdays.

**Player and Coaches Availability:** Player interviews prioritize each cadet's academic, military, squadron and leadership obligations in addition to any needed physical rehabilitation/treatment. Because treatment time may be necessary, players must physically complete the previous practice or game.

**Players:** Up to eight players (seniors, no quarterbacks) are available following practice Mondays. Eight different players (seniors, no quarterbacks) are available on Tuesdays before practice in the media room. All players (any class) that play in a game are available following each game. Players are not available while leaving the field after games.

**Coaches:** Head Coach Troy Calhoun is available each Monday after practice. He is available on Tuesdays during his weekly media conference in the media room from 12:30 to 1 p.m. and after each game. Assistant coaches are not available. Coaches are not available leaving the field after games.

LAST YEAR VS. NEW MEXICO

**(Sept. 30, 2017)** New Mexico defeated Air Force, 56-38, in Albuquerque, N.M., to record its third straight win in the series and fourth in the last five meetings. The game featured a one-hour, one-minute weather delay, the second straight week for Air Force to experience one in a game. The Lobos rolled up 509 total yards, including 363 rushing to race past the Falcons. Richard McQuarley led the rushing attack with 179 yards and five touchdowns on 11 carries. Air Force scored 21 points in the second quarter to take a 21-14 halftime lead. The Lobos answered with 21 third-quarter points to race out to a 35-24 lead on their way to the win. Air Force finished with 396 total yards, including 238 rushing and 158 passing. Arion Worthman rushed for 90 yards and a TD on 30 carries and hit 9-17 passes for 158 yards and a career-best three touchdowns. Tim McVey added 74 yards and a TD on 14 carries.

LAST TIME IN FALCON STADIUM

**(Oct. 18, 2014)** Air Force defeated New Mexico, 35-31, in Falcon Stadium to remain undefeated at home with a 4-0 mark. Shayne Davern had a career-best 85 yards on 16 carries to lead the Falcons. The Falcons finished the game with 428 total yards, with a balanced 269 rushing and 159 passing. New Mexico finished with 390 total yards, including 367 rushing. Jhurell Pressley led the way with 148 yards rushing and two touchdowns. The teams exchanged leads in the first half and ended tied at 21-21 at halftime. New Mexico took a 28-21 lead midway through the third quarter, but Air Force answered with a TD run to tie it and a Kale Pearson to Jalen Robinette 50-yard touchdown pass to take a 35-28 lead. New Mexico added a fourth-quarter field goal to make up the final margin. The Falcons sealed the game by holding New Mexico on a fourth down deep in its own territory.

#### AIR FORCE AT HOME

Air Force is 52-20 in Falcon Stadium under head coach Troy Calhoun, including a school-record 15-game winning streak from 2014 to Oct. 22, 2016. Air Force went 20-4 at home over the previous four seasons. The 20 wins is the best four-year mark in school history, breaking the record of 19 set from 1982-85 and 1998-2001 when the program went 19-4 those years.

Air Force set a record for the best three-year run from 2014-16 with a 17-1 record, breaking the mark of 15-2 from 1983-85. The Falcons were 14-3 from 1998-2000 and 1997-99 and 14-5 from 2009-11 to round out the top five marks in school history.

Air Force has finished undefeated at home just five times overall in school history, three coming under Calhoun.

#### LAST WEEK

Army defeated Air Force, 17-14, in West Point to at least retain the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy. Army took a 14-0 lead into halftime. The Black Knights opened the game with a 21-play, 75-yard drive that took 12:55 off the clock to take a 7-0 lead. Sophomore Donald Hammond III came in at quarterback and led the Falcons to a scoring drive to close the third quarter to cut the lead to 14-6. Following an Army field goal, the Falcons scored on a six-yard touchdown run by Joseph Saucier. His two-point conversion run cut the lead to 17-14. Air Force got the ball back following an Army punt, but were stopped on fourth down near midfield. Army ran out the clock to end the game. The Black Knights had 286 total yards, including 242 rushing. Air Force had 322 total yards, including 197 passing. Hammond hit 7-15 passes for 120 yards and rushed for 33 yards and a touchdown to lead the Falcons.

#### LAST WEEK'S POST-GAME NOTES

##### Team Notes

- Air Force uses game captains. The captains for the Army West Point game were seniors Cody Gessler (DL), Marcus Bennett (WR), Micah Capra (DL) and Brody Bagnall (ILB).
- Air Force blocked its second kick this season (Punt by Jeremy Fejedelem. It is the 36th blocked kick under coach Troy Calhoun and the 134th since 1990. Air Force has blocked at least one kick in each of Calhoun's 12 seasons.

##### Individual Notes

- Junior QB Isaiah Sanders started for the third straight game and fifth time this season.
- Senior DL Micah Capra recorded a career-high 10 tackles. His previous high was five last season vs. Wyoming.
- Sophomore WR Brandon Lewis recorded career highs with three catches for 32 yards. His previous highs came last week vs. Boise State with one catch for a career-long 28 yards.
- Junior Jeremy Fejedelem posted his third straight game, and fifth this season, with 10 or more tackles. He finished with 11 tackles. His career high of 14 came against Utah State earlier this season. Fejedelem recorded the first blocked kick (punt) of his career in the third quarter.
- Donald Hammond's seven completions are a career high. His previous was six vs. Navy earlier this season. His 15 attempts tied his career high set against Nevada.
- Kyle Johnson tied his career high with 12 tackles. He also had 12 vs. UNLV earlier this season.

## Team Notes

### AIR FORCE AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN APR, AGAIN

Air Force ranks second nationally among FBS programs in multiyear Academic Progress Rate (APR) with a 993. Northwestern leads the nation with a 997. The Falcons were also recognized for posting a score in the top 10 percent of their sport for the seventh consecutive season. The APR is an annual scorecard of academic achievement calculated for all Division I sports teams. The APR measures eligibility, graduation and retention each semester or academic term and provides a clear picture of the academic performance for each team in every sport. All teams must meet an academic threshold of 930 to qualify for the postseason and can face penalties for continued low academic performance.

**OFFENSE/DEFENSE SHINE AGAINST NATION'S BEST**

The Air Force offense and defense each shined against the nation's leaders recently. The defense stood out against Navy, holding them to just 129 yards rushing. The Midshipmen came into the game leading the nation with a 355.8 average. The offense rushed for 214 yards at San Diego State. The Aztecs ranked second nationally in rushing defense with a 61.8 average entering the game. Air Force's 214 yards are the most allowed by SDSU this season. Air Force also had two runs of 20-plus yards, the first two allowed by the Aztecs this season in over 150 opponent carries.

**AIR FORCE 16-3 WITH TWO OR MORE TURNOVERS LAST FIVE YEARS**

Air Force is 16-3 over the last five seasons when the defense forces two or more turnovers. The losses came at home vs. Hawaii, 34-27, in overtime in 2016 and earlier this season at Utah State, 42-32, and at home vs. Nevada, 28-25. ## CALHOUN / HOWARD HONORED

Air Force football head coach Troy Calhoun and former Falcon great Dr. Chris Howard are among five individuals and one program named as finalists for the 2018 Armed Forces Merit Award presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA).

This year's recipient will be announced prior to Veteran's Day on Thursday (November 8). The announcement of the 2018 recipient will be made jointly by Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl Executive Director Brant Ringler and FWAA Executive Director Steve Richardson on an 11 a.m. (CT) teleconference.

Three of the five individual being for the 2018 Armed Forces Merit Award presented by the FWAA were also finalists in 2017 when Kansas State and its football team was announced last November as the sixth recipient of the Armed Forces Merit Award for the university's partnership with the United States Army that created a bond between the school's athletic department and the Iron Rangers at Fort Riley.

Calhoun, in his 12th season as head coach at Air Force, and Howard, president at Robert Morris University, along with Texas Tech University strength and conditioning coach Rusty Whitt lead the list of five individuals named as 2018 finalists after advancing to the final round of voting in 2017. Both Calhoun and Howard are Air Force veterans and Whitt served in the U. S. Army. Other individuals named as finalists are defensive back and Air Force veterans Darren Palmer of UNLV and wide receiver and National Guard reservists Casey Stewart of Shenandoah University in Winchester, Va. The lone program advancing to the finals is Athletes Of Valor, an organization that works with active duty military and veterans to help them get recruited to college and play sports.

The Armed Forces Merit Award's selection committee is made up of five FWAA members and two representatives from the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl. A total of 56 "candidates" were nominated for the 2018 award that was created in June 2012 "to honor an individual and/or a group with a military background and/or involvement that has an impact within the realm of college football.

## DEBERRY, CALHOUN THE ONLY TWO

Air Force has had only two head coaches the last 35 years which is the fewest in the nation over that time span. Fisher DeBerry led the program for 23 years (1984-2006) while Troy Calhoun has been at the helm since 2007 and is in his 12th season.

## CALHOUN BECOMES SECOND COACH WITH 50 MW WINS

Air Force head coach Troy Calhoun became just the second coach in Mountain West history with 50 conference wins when Air Force defeated UNLV, 41-35, Oct. 19. He joined San Diego State's Rocky Long in the 50-win club.

## BLOCKED KICKS

- Air Force has blocked two kicks this season
  - The team blocked punts at FAU and at Army
  - Jeremy Fejedelem blocked the first kick of his career with the block at Army
  - Garrett Kauppila recorded a blocked punt at FAU. The block is the second of Kauppila's career (punt vs. SDSU in 2017)

Air Force and Colorado State compete each year for the Ram-Falcon Trophy. The 2018 season marks the 39th year of the trophy competition with Air Force holding a 23-15 lead. The trophy's origin is tracked back to Shelly Godkin, a former ROTC commander at Colorado State. He watched the teams play in 1978 and sought to translate his impressions into a trophy symbolic of an annual game. The first Ram-Falcon trophy game was in 1980. Air Force defeated Colorado State, 45-28, Oct. 28 to win the trophy for the second straight year and 10th in the last 12 years.

## AIR FORCE VS. NON-CONFERENCE FOES UNDER CALHOUN

Air Force is 35-24 against non-conference opponents under head coach Troy Calhoun, including a 2-2 mark this season. The Falcons are 23-4 at home, 7-15 on the road and 5-5 in neutral site games. Air Force defeated Stony Brook (38-0) and Navy (35-7) at home while falling, 33-27, at Florida Atlantic and 17-14 at Army this season.

## COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF'S TROPHY

The 2018 season marks the 47th year of Commander-in-Chief's trophy competition. The trophy goes annually to the winning academy with the best record in the round-robin competition. The winning team goes to the White House to receive the trophy from the President of the United States. The Falcons have a series-best 60-34 overall record and 20 titles. Air Force split this season's series. The Falcons defeated Navy, 35-7, Oct. 6 in Falcon Stadium and lost at Army, 17-14, Nov. 3. Army clinched retaining the trophy with the win and can win it outright with a win over Navy in December.

## Individual Notes

### BAGNALL NOMINATED FOR GOOD WORKS TEAM

Air Force senior linebacker Brody Bagnall is one of 169 nominees for the 2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for his work on and off the field. Players across America are being honored today for their work in communities by the Allstate Insurance Company and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA).

Bagnall has been active in the Colorado Springs community organizing cleanups for property owners in areas where wild fires have caused damage. He has also helped in other communities helping coach football in Portland, Ore., during breaks from the Academy. Bagnall has also been active at Air Force, serving as a tutor in the science and mathematics departments and volunteering to lead the worship team for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

He has served in several leadership areas as well, including the leadership counsel for the football team at Air Force, serving as an element leader in his squadron and as a training staff non-commissioned officer where he helped cadets in physical fitness standards.

### BAGNALL SECOND IN TACKLES

Senior linebacker Brody Bagnall is second on the team and tied for 13th in the Mountain West in tackles with 66, an average of 7.3 per game. He also has 4.5 tackles for loss, 1.0 sacks and a fumble recovery. Bagnall has four games of 10-plus tackles this season which is second on the team. Bagnall had 10 tackles, a career-best 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack at UNLV. He had a career-high 13 tackles and a tackle for loss vs. Navy. Bagnall had 10 tackles each vs. Nevada and at Utah State which was his previous career high.

### JUNIOR LB KYLE JOHNSON

Junior ILB Kyle Johnson is third on the team in tackles with 51 and second in tackles for loss with 7.0. He has a career-best 12 tackles in two of the last three games. Johnson had 12 tackles and 0.5 tackles for loss at Army. He recorded a career-best 12 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss at UNLV. Johnson had nine tackles and a career-best 2.5 tackles for loss at San Diego State.

Johnson made his first-career start earlier this season in the 38-0 win over Stony Brook. He recorded three total tackles and made the first interception of his career, returning it 32 yards for his first-career touchdown. He is the first Falcon with a pick-six since Shaq Vereen vs. Colorado State last season.

### J.J. AMONG MOUNTAIN WEST LEADERS

Sophomore defensive lineman Jordan Jackson is fifth in the Mountain West in tackles for loss with 9.5. Jackson has had at least one tackle for loss in six games this season. Jackson has 39 total tackles overall. He had six tackles, a sack and a pass breakup on UNLV's last play on fourth down deep in AF territory. Jackson had career highs in total tackles (seven), solo stops (five) and tackles for loss (3.5) earlier this season vs. Navy. His 3.5 TFL are the most by a Falcon this season.

### WORTHMAN CAREER UPDATE

Senior quarterback Arion Worthman has a 10-7 record in his career as a starter while averaging 85.2 yards rushing and 98.9 yards passing per outing.

Worthman rushed for 66 yards and a touchdown vs. Stony Brook while completing 2-8 passes for 29 yards. He did not see action in week two at FAU. Worthman rushed for 26 yards on eight carries at Utah State while completing 2-4 passes for 23 yards. He started the Nevada game

and hit 2-4 passes for 25 yards and had -4 yards rushing on 10 carries. He did not see action vs. Navy.

Worthman had a career day vs. UNLV last season, recording a career-high 30 carries for a season-best 166 yards and a career-best five touchdowns. His five touchdowns tie as the second-most in school history. He is tied with Marty Louthan, who scored five vs. Navy in 1983. Worthman's 30 points scored is also the second most in school history and most since Dee Dowis scored 36 vs. San Diego State in 1989.

Worthman had another career day at Navy, breaking a 47-year-old Air Force record for total offense with 396 yards. Worthman rushed for 139 yards and two touchdowns with a season-long run of 52 yards. He hit nine of 16 passes for a career-best 257 yards and two touchdowns. His nine completions matched a career-high while recording a season-long pass of 60 yards. He also recorded his first-career catch, good for 24 yards. Worthman broke the total offense record of 380 yards set in 1970 by Bob Parker vs. Colorado State.

Worthman became 47th player in Air Force history to top the 1,000-yard rushing mark for his career at Navy Oct. 7 and ranks 23rd with 1,583 yards. Worthman is the school's career leader in quarterback efficiency with a 159.71 rating.

#### JUNIOR ISAAH SANDERS

Junior quarterback and Colorado Springs native Isaiah Sanders has played in eight games this season, starting a team-best five. He ranks 10th in the Mountain West in rushing with a 58.2 average and in total offense with a 163.8 norm. He is second on the team in rushing with 466 yards and a team-best six touchdowns on 120 carries. He leads the team in passing, hitting 48-of-78 passes for 844 yards and four scores. He is completing 61.5 percent of his passes and has a 161.66 efficiency rating.

Sanders rushed for 97 yards and a touchdown on 28 carries while hitting 10 of 15 passes for 210 yards and a career-best two touchdowns vs. Boise State. He just missed becoming the only player in Air Force history to rush for 100 yards and pass for 200 yards in a game twice.

Sanders had a career night at UNLV, recorded 390 yards of total offense which is the second-most in school history. He rushed for a season-high 173 yards and matched his career high with three touchdowns with a career-long run of 45 yards. Sanders hit nine-of-11 passes for a career-best 217 yards and a touchdown, connecting on a career-long 69 yard pass for the score. He opened the game with nine straight completions which is the best at Air Force since 2013 and is fifth-best ever in school history. He became just the second player in Air Force history to rush for 100 yards and throw for 200 yards in a game.

Sanders averaged 135 yards and 2.5 touchdowns rushing and 213.5 yards and 1.5 touchdowns passing in two games at UNLV and vs. Boise State. He rushed for 270 yards and four touchdowns and hit 19-26 passes (73.1 percent) for 427 yards and three touchdowns. He is the first Falcon since Karson Roberts in 2015 to throw for 200-plus yards in back-to-back games and his 427 yards are the most since Roberts threw for a school record 550 yards vs. Utah State and Boise State that year.

Sanders started for the first time in his career in last season's finale vs. Utah State in Falcon Stadium. The Palmer Ridge High School graduate led the Falcons to a 38-35 victory. Sanders set a single-game school record with 44 rushing attempts, surpassing the previous record of 42 set by Brian Bream against Stanford in 1970. Sanders finished with 196 yards rushing and three rushing touchdowns, including the game-winning TD with 1:38 left. Sanders was 4-of-12 passing for 33 yards and one interception. Sanders earned the National Football Foundation, Colorado Chapter, player of the week honor and was named the Mountain West offensive player of the week by CollegeSportsMadness.com.

#### FEJEDELEM LEADS FALCONS IN TACKLES

Junior defensive back Jeremy Fejedelem leads the Falcons and ranks fifth in the Mountain West in tackles with 88, an average of 9.8 per game. He also has 2.0 tackles for loss and 1.0 quarterback sacks. Fejedelem leads the team with five games of 10-plus tackles, including three straight. Fejedelem has averaged 12.3 tackles the last three games. He had 11 tackles, 0.5 tackles for loss and his first-career blocked kick (punt) at Army. Fejedelem recorded a team-best 13 tackles against Boise State, his second straight game with 13 stops. He had a team-high 13 tackles and his second interception of the season at UNLV. He had eight tackles and his first-career interception at San Diego State. He added nine tackles and his first-career sack vs. Navy. Fejedelem led the team with 11 tackles and a tackle for loss vs. Nevada. He had his best day as a Falcon at Utah State, leading the team with a career-best 14 tackles, which is the most by a Falcon this season.

#### MARCUS BENNETT LEADS FALCONS IN RECEIVING, AGAIN

Senior Marcus Bennett is leading the Falcons in receiving for the second straight season. Bennett has 17 catches for 346 yards and two touchdowns with a long of 49 yards. He is averaging 20.4 yards per catch. Bennett had two catches for 44 yards at Army. He led the Falcons with four catches for 52 yards and a touchdown at Nevada. He had a career-best five receptions for 74 yards at Utah State. Bennett had two catches for 87 yards with a long of 49 yards at Florida Atlantic. He leads all active Falcons in career receiving with 36 catches for 749 yards and is averaging 20.8 yards per catch which ranks fifth in school history.

Bennett had a career day last year at Navy, recording career highs in every receiving category with five catches for 161 yards and two touchdowns. He also hauled in a career-long 59 yard reception and a 51-yarder, both for TDs. Bennett is the first Falcon since Jalen Robinette in 2016 to record a 100-yard game. His 161 yards receiving rank as the 11th most in school history and

are the most by a Falcon since Robinette had 182 vs. New Mexico in 2016.

#### FAGAN LEADS THE WAY

Junior fullback Cole Fagan leads the Falcons in rushing with 523 yards and has scored four touchdowns. He has led the team in rushing three times, including a team-best 37 yards at Army. He rushed for 67 yards and a touchdown on 14 carries vs. Boise State. Fagan rushed for 77 yards and a touchdown with a career-long run of 49 yards at UNLV. Fagan rushed for a career-best 90 yards and recorded a then-career-long run of 42 at San Diego State. The 42-yard dash is the longest allowed by the Aztecs this season and just the second of 20-plus yards. Fagan has led the Falcons in rushing in two games this season, leading the way with a then-career-high 80 yards at Florida Atlantic.

#### CLEVELAND CAREER UPDATE

Senior receiver Ronald Cleveland has missed the last two games due to injury. He is fifth on the team in rushing with 171 yards and two touchdowns on 39 carries. He is second in receiving with 15 catches for 241 yards and two touchdowns. Cleveland recorded his first-career 100-yard game with three catches for 100 yards at UNLV, scoring on a career-long 69 yard pass. He also rushed for 40 yards on six carries.

Cleveland is second among active Falcons in rushing and receiving. He has 754 yards and seven touchdowns rushing on 106 carries. He has caught 30 passes for 664 yards and seven touchdowns. He ranks fourth in school history in career receiving average with a 22.1 mark. His seven touchdown catches are tops among active Falcons while his seven rushing scores are third.

#### KOEHNKE STEPS IN

Junior kicker Jake Koehnke ranks 10th in the Mountain West in field goals (.62) and ninth in extra point percentage (.952). He has hit 5-7 field goals and 20-21 PATs this season. Koehnke has 37 kickoffs with 16 touchbacks. He has punted 11 times for a 41.4 average with a long of 52 yards. He has two touchbacks, three fair catches and three inside the 20.

He kicked a 38 yard field goal and punted three times for a career-best 48.3 average with a long of 52 yards vs. Boise State. Koehnke recorded his first-career game with multiple field goals at UNLV, hitting from 32 and 26 yards. He also hit all five PATs and kicked off eight times with three touchbacks. Koehnke also punted once for 51 yards.

He got his first-career start vs. Nevada and kicked a career-long 43 yard field goal. Koehnke stepped in during the Utah State game for injured starter Matt Philichi. He hit one of two field goals, missing from 40 yards and connecting from 31.

#### DONALD HAMMOND III STEPS IN AT ARMY

Sophomore quarterback Donald Hammond III came on in relief at halftime at Army. He rushed for 33 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries while hitting seven of 15 passes for a 120 yards. Hammond has played in six games this season, starting two. He has rushed for 135 yards and a team-best six touchdowns on 42 carries. Hammond has hit 20-of-41 passes for 344 yards with two touchdowns. He has a 135.66 efficiency rating.

He started for the first time of his career vs. Navy and responded with the best game of his young career. Hammond recorded career highs in rushing with 60 yards and three touchdowns. He also hit six of 10 passes for a career-best 142 yards and a touchdown which came on a career-long 61-yard pass. Hammond started at San Diego State, but left the game in the first quarter due to injury and did not return.

He came on in relief in the third quarter vs. Nevada and rushed for 28 yards and a touchdown while hitting 6-15 passes for 71 yards and his first-career touchdown pass. Hammond led the Falcons on a 12-play, 58-yard touchdown drive and followed with an 11-play, 67-yard touchdown drive to lead the Falcons.

## AIR POWER LEGACY SERIES

The Air Force football continues its Airpower Legacy Series this season with a helmet and uniform honoring the AC-130. The team debuted the uniform in the season opener



Sept. 1 vs. Stony Brook and are now 6-0 when wearing the special uniforms. The helmet features the AC-130 on one side, plus squadron patches on the other. The AC-130 gunship is a heavily armed, long-endurance ground-attack variant of the C-130 Hercules transport fixed-wing aircraft. It carries a wide array of anti-ground oriented weapons that are integrated with sophisticated sensors, navigation, and fire-control systems. Unlike other military fixed-wing aircraft, the AC-130 relies on visual targeting. Because its large profile and low operating altitudes (around 7,000 ft) make it an easy target, it usually flies close air support missions at night.

The Airpower Legacy Series began in the 2016 season with the football team wearing an alternate uniform for the Georgia State game to celebrate the Tiger Shark teeth



nose-art which has been represented on multiple Air Force aircraft dating back to World War II. During the WWII era, fighter plane pilots were called "Flying Tigers" and were part of the U.S. Army Air Corps, which later became the Air Force. The helmets worn for the game featured a shark-teeth design like those painted on the aircraft.

While 2016 focused on the past, the Falcons honored the present, and future, of air power in 2017 with the F-35 theme. The F-35 completed its first flight was in 2006. In 2012, the F-35 program increased to 30 aircraft. In 2016, the F-35A was declared combat ready by Gen. Hawk Carlisle, the commander of the Air Combat Command.



The helmet has five different designs. On one side of every helmet will be the familiar Air Force logo often seen on aircraft, which includes the length-wise bars intersecting the roundel. On the other side will be a decal representing one of the five Air Force F-35-A operational fighter squadrons in the Air Force.

## HEAD COACH TROY CALHOUN

Troy Calhoun is his 12th season as head coach at Air Force where he has an 85-66 overall record and a 50-42 mark in Mountain West play. He has led Air Force to nine bowl games, including a school-record six straight from 2007-12. Calhoun led the program to a 10-3 mark in 2016, just the seventh 10-win season in school history. Air Force won the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy for a record 20th time and won a bowl game for the second time in three seasons. He led the Falcons to an 8-6 overall record in 2015 and the Mountain Division championship and first-ever MW title game appearance. The Falcons were 6-2 in conference play.

Calhoun is the only coach in the 100-plus year history of service academy football to lead teams to at least seven wins and a bowl game in each of his first five seasons. Calhoun has twice been semifinalist for the National Coach of the Year award for his efforts on and off the field (2007, 2010).

Calhoun came to his alma mater in 2007 and took over a program that had three straight losing seasons. Air Force finished the 2007 season 9-4 overall and placed second in the Mountain West Conference with a 6-2 mark in Calhoun's first year. The Falcons earned their first bowl bid in five seasons, advancing to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl in Fort Worth, Texas. The five-game turnaround from the previous season was the largest in the nation by a first-year head coach and tied as the third-largest overall in the nation.

Calhoun was named the conference's coach of the year for his efforts. In addition, he was named coach of the year in Region 5 by the American Football Coaches Association and was one of eight finalists for national coach of the year honors. Calhoun followed with back-to-back 8-5 overall records and fourth place conference finishes with 5-3 marks in 2008 and 2009. The team earned bids to the Armed Forces Bowl each season and posted the school's first bowl victory since 2000 with a 47-20 win over Houston in 2009.

In 2010 the Falcons posted a 9-4 overall record and recorded their fourth straight top four conference finish with a 5-3 mark. The Falcons were nationally ranked for the first time since 2003 and posted a victory as a ranked team for the first time since 2002. The team capped the season with a 14-7 win over George Tech in 2010 Independence Bowl to earn a second-straight bowl victory. Air Force posted a 7-6 record in 2011 and qualified for the Military Bowl. The Falcons were 6-7 in 2012 while finishing fourth in the conference with a 5-3 mark. Air Force played in its fourth Armed Forces Bowl to extend the school's record of consecutive bowl games to six dating back to 2007. Calhoun led the Falcons to new heights in 2014, posting a 10-3 overall record and a fourth place finish in the Mountain Division with a 5-3 mark. The eight-game turnaround from a 2-10 mark in 2013 is a school record and tied as the best in the nation. The Falcons capped the season with a record 19th Commander-in-Chief's Trophy and a victory over Western Michigan in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Calhoun brought a wealth of experience and impressive resume at the collegiate and professional levels that is flooded with success at every stop to the Academy. Calhoun came to the Academy after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Houston Texans in 2006. The Texans were one of only two NFL teams to triple their number of wins from the previous year.

Calhoun became a well-rounded NFL coach, working as a defensive assistant, special teams assistant and offensive assistant with the Denver Broncos from 2003-05. He began his NFL coaching career by serving as the defensive assistant under defensive coordinator Larry Coryer in 2003.

Prior to the NFL, Calhoun was an offensive coordinator for six seasons on the collegiate level. He began his coaching career at Air Force, where he worked as a graduate assistant from 1989-90. He started at quarterback for the Academy in 1986 and was one of only two freshmen to letter for the 1985 team that finished fifth in the final polls with a 12-1 record that included wins over national powers Notre Dame and Texas.

Calhoun served his country from 1989-95 as an active duty officer in the Air Force. He was the Falcons' recruiting coordinator and the junior varsity offensive coordinator in 1993-94. He moved to Ohio University in 1995 where he served as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons. Calhoun was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1997. Calhoun moved to Wake Forest in 2001 and remained there prior to his stint with the Broncos.

Groomed on the basics of integrity and passion, Calhoun is a native of Roseburg, Ore., and was raised in a home where both kids graduated from the Air Force Academy and were varsity letter winners on nationally-ranked teams. He and his wife, Amanda, live in Colorado Springs and have two children, Tyler (16) and Amelia (14).
