#### AGGIES PLAY AT NEW MEXICO ON CBS SPORTS NETWORK

• Utah State continues Mountain West play at New Mexico on CBS Sports Network on Saturday afternoon. USU is 17-4 (.810) all-time in the Mountain West and has won 28 of its last 32 (.875) league games dating back to 2011.

• Utah State has won 13 of its last 16 (.813) conference road games and 15 of its last 27 (.556) road games overall. Under head coach **Matt Wells**, USU is 7-3 in Mountain West road games and 8-10 overall in road games. During its last 13 conference road wins, USU is averaging 40.7 points and 494.3 yards per game, while its average margin of victory is 19.5 points per game.

#### **AGGIES ONE WIN AWAY FROM BOWL ELIGIBILITY**

- With a win at New Mexico, Utah State will be bowl eligible for the fifth-straight year. USU has played in four-straight bowl games and won each of its last three bowls, both of which are school records.
- Utah State concluded its 2014 season with a 21-6 win against UTEP in the GILDAN New Mexico Bowl.

Junior RB Devante Mays rushed for a career-best 176 yards on a career-high 22 carries and scored two touchdowns in Utah State's 58-27 home win against Wyoming last weekend. Mays leads the Mountain West and ranks ninth nationally with his 7.1 yards per carry.

#### WHAT TO WATCH FOR SATURDAY

- Utah State has scored 50 or more points in three of its last four games (56 at Fresno State, 52 vs. No. 21 Boise State, 58 vs. Wyoming), marknig only the second time in school history that USU has scored 50-plus points in three games in one season along with the 1961 team.
- Sophomore **Kent Myers** is 9-2 as Utah State's starting quarterback and the Aggies are 18-6 over the past three years with a backup quarterback as their starter.
- Utah State has won 15 of its last 16 games played during the month of November dating back to 2011, including six of its last seven on the road.
- Despite not forcing any turnovers in each of its last two games, Utah State has still forced 18 turnovers in its last six games with 10 fumbles and eight interceptions. On the season, USU ranks first nationally in fumbles recovered (10), 13th nationally in turnovers forced (18) and 23rd in the nation in turnover margin (+5).
- Utah State ranks 41st nationally in rushing defense (143.9 ypg), while New Mexico ranks 12th nationally in rushing offense (248.4 ypg).
- Utah State has won 19 straight games with a 100-yard rusher, including a 2-0 record this year, 23 of its last 24 games when it rushes at least 40 times, including a 4-0 record this year, and 20 straight games when it rushes for 200 yards, including a 3-0 record this year.

#### **UTAH STATE CONTINUES MOUNTAIN WEST PLAY AT NEW MEXICO**

Utah State (5-3, 4-1 MW) continues Mountain West play this week at New Mexico (4-4, 2-2 MW) on Saturday, Nov. 7 at 1:30 p.m. The game will be nationally televised by CBS Sports Network (Comcast Ch. 269/753HD, Dish Network Ch. 158, DirecTV Ch. 221) with Andrew Catalon (play-by-play), Randy Cross (analyst) and Rashan Ali (reporter) on the call. Live audio of the game is also available on www.UtahStateAggies.com. USU, which is 530-520-31 (.505) in its 118th season, has nine nationally televised games on ESPN, CBS Sports Network and the Pac-12 Network in 2015.

#### A LOOK AT UTAH STATE

Utah State is 5-3 on the season and 4-1 in Mountain West play following its 58-27 home win against Wyoming last weekend. Offensively, USU is led by sophomore QB **Kent Myers**, who is 69-of-106 (.651) passing for 893 yards (178.6 ypg) with nine touchdowns and one interception. Junior RB **Devante Mays** leads the team in rushing with 586 yards on 83 carries (7.1 ypc/73.2 ypg) with seven touchdowns, and senior WR **Hunter Sharp** has a team-best 28 receptions for 364 yards (13.0 ypr/60.7 ypg) with four touchdowns. Defensively, junior LB **Nick Vigil** leads the team with 89 tackles, which includes 3.0 sacks and 8.5 tackles for loss, while senior LB **Kyler Fackrell** has 53 tackles, which includes 3.0 sacks and 11.0 tackles for loss. As a team, Utah State is averaging 32.0 points and 369.9 yards of total offense (187.9 - passing, 182.0 - rushing) and allowing 24.6 points and 325.2 yards of total offense (181.2 - passing, 144.0 - rushing).

#### LOOKING AT UTAH STATE'S OFFENSIVE NUMBERS IN MOUNTAIN WEST PLAY

In its first five Mountain West games, Utah State is averaging 42.6 points and 416.4 yards of total offense per game (223.2 - rushing, 193.2 - passing), for an average of 6.5 yards per play. During its first three games of the year, USU averaged just 14.3 points and 292.3 yards per game (113.3 - rushing, 179.0 - passing), for an average of 4.4 yards per play.

#### **UTAH STATE SCORES SEASON-HIGH 58 POINTS AGAINST WYOMING**

- Utah State scored a season-high points last weekend in its 58-27 home win against Wyoming, which are its most points scored in a game since defeating Weber State 70-7 in 2013. Its 58 points are also the most in a conference game since winning at Idaho 63-17 in 1997.
- Utah State's 34 first downs ties the school record set in 1990 against Pacific and again in 1996 against Boise State. USU also had a season-low three penalties for a season-low 25 yards.
- Utah State ran 62 plays against Wyoming, but only had six third downs for the entire game, converting three of them.
- Utah State had 592 yards of total offense, its most since it had 646 yards at No. 19 Louisiana Tech in 2012, and the 14th-most in school history. USU had a season-high 296 passing yards against the Cowboys, its most since it passed for 311 yards against Air Force in 2014, a span of 17 games. USU's 296 rushing yards are its second-most in a game this year behind its 298 against Colorado State.
- Eight Aggies caught passes against Wyoming as Utah State was 16-of-19 passing in the game. Those eight different players with receptions are the second-most in a game this year.
- Utah State scored four touchdowns and converted one field goal during the first half as it scored on all five of its possessions in building a 30-14 halftime advantage. In all, USU scored seven touchdowns, to go along with one field goal, during its first nine possessions, as the only time it didn't score was when it fumbled the ball. For the game, USU punted just one time and had just two possessions that did not end in a score. Furthermore, USU's touchdown on its opening drive marked the first time this year it had scored on its first possession of the game.
- Utah State has now won four straight games against Wyoming, its longest winning streak in the series since also winning four-straight from 1972-75. Overall, USU is now 38-24-4 all-time against the Cowboys and those 38 wins are the most against any school in USU history.

# **UTAH STATE WINS 13TH STRAIGHT HOME GAME**

- With its 58-27 home win against Wyoming last weekend, Utah State has now won 13 straight home games, which is tied with the 1931-34 teams for the third-longest home winning streak in school history, and is also tied for the fifth-longest streak in the nation.
- Utah State has won 22 of its last 24 home games, including nine-straight Mountain West home games, and 15 of its last 16 conference home games. Under head coach **Matt Wells**, USU is now 14-2 at home, including a 10-1 Mountain West record.

# **UTAH STATE AVOIDS BACK-TO-BACK CONFERENCE LOSSES**

With its 58-27 home win against Wyoming last weekend, Utah State is now 10-2 following a loss under Wells, including a 2-1 record this year. USU has only lost back-to-back games twice in its last 56 outings and the last time USU lost back-to-back conference games was in 2011.

# **DID YOU KNOW?**

Utah State is one of just four FBS programs to win at least 30 games and record three bowl victories in the past three years joining Clemson, Michigan State and Oregon.

#### A QUICK LOOK AT NEW MEXICO

New Mexico is 4-4 on the season and 2-2 in Mountain West play following its 31-21 road loss at San José State two weeks ago in its last game. The Lobos are led by sophomore QB Lamar Jordan, who is 47-of-85 passing for 599 yards (85.6 ypg) with three touchdowns and two interceptions. Junior RB Teriyon Gibson leads the team in rushing with 502 yards on 78 carries (6.4 ypc/71.7 ypg) with five touchdowns, and junior WR Dameon Gamblin has caught 28 passes for 371 yards (13.2 ypr/46.4 ypg) with two touchdowns. Defensively, junior LB Dakota Cox has a team-best 61 tackles, which includes 3.5 sacks and 9.0 tackles for loss, while sophomore LB Kimmie Carson has 51 tackles, which includes 2.5 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss. As a team, New Mexico is averaging 29.9 points and 381.4 yards of total offense per game (248.4 -r ushing, 133.0 - passing) and allowing 28.0 points and 422.1 yards of total offense (212.8 - passing, 209.4 - rushing). New Mexico returns 14 starters (O-7, D-7) and 46 lettermen (O-22, D-21, S-3) from last year's team that went 4-8 overall and 2-6 in Mountain West play to finish fifth in the Mountain Division. Bob Davie is 15-30 in four seasons at New Mexico and 50-55 in nine seasons as a collegiate head coach.

#### **AGGIES AND LOBOS SERIES HISTORY**

Utah State trails in the all-time series against New Mexico, 11-10, including a 4-8 road record. The first game played in the series was on Dec. 1, 1951 in Albuquerque with UNM winning 17-13. USU has won the last two meetings between the two teams with a 28-21 home win on Nov. 15, 2014 and a 45-10 win in Albuquerque on Oct. 19, 2013. The last time New Mexico won a game in the series was on Oct. 4, 2003 in Albuquerque, 34-7.

#### **UTAH STATE AND NEW MEXICO AS CONFERENCE FOES**

Utah State and New Mexico have spent 14 years as league foes as both schools were members of the Skyline Conference from 1951 to 1961, along with its current membership in the Mountain West. The Lobos have been a member of the Mountain West since its inception in 1999, while USU joined the league prior to the 2013 season.

#### **UTAH STATE VS. NEW MEXICO SERIES 14TH-MOST PLAYED IN SCHOOL HISTORY**

Utah State and New Mexico will be meeting for the 22nd time in series history this weekend in what is tied for the 14th-most played series in school history.

Utah State is 40-18 (.690) all-time against Division I teams from the state of New Mexico, including a 30-7 record against New Mexico State and a 10-11 record versus New Mexico.

# **UTAH STATE CONNECTIONS WITH NEW MEXICO**

Utah State head coach **Matt Wells** was the tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator at Tulsa in 2005, when New Mexico run game coordinator/tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator Derek Warehime was an offensive line student assistant at Tulsa. Wells also coached at New Mexico from 2007-08 as the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator and again in 2010 as the wide receivers coach, working with New Mexico offensive line coach Jason Lenzmeier. USU defensive line coach **Ikaika Malloe** coached with New Mexico athletic performance director Ben Hilgart at Western Illinois in 2001 as Malloe was the special teams coordinator/defensive line coach and Hilgart was the assistant defensive line coach and strength and conditioning coach.

#### **UTAH STATE VERSUS THE MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE**

Utah State is 144-166-8 (.465) all-time against current members of the Mountain West with a 38-24-4 record vs. Wyoming, a 33-37-2 record vs. Colorado State, a 15-7 record vs. UNLV, a 16-20-1 record vs. San José State, an 11-17-1 record vs. Fresno State, a 10-11 record vs. New Mexico, an 8-6 record vs. Hawai'i, a 5-17 record vs. Nevada, a 5-15 record vs. Boise State, a 2-1 record vs. Air Force, and a 1-11 record vs. San Diego State.

#### **HOMEGROWN PLAYERS**

Utah State has 40 players in its program from the state of Utah, while New Mexico has 23 players on its roster from the Land of Enchantment.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Utah State is 8-6-1 all-time in games played on Nov. 7. USU is also 7-2 all-time under head coach **Matt Wells** during day games, including an 0-1 record this season.





#### **MORE CONNECTIONS WITH NEW MEXICO**

Utah State head coach **Matt Wells** spent three years (2007, 2008, 2010) as an assistant coach at New Mexico as he was the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator in 2007 and 2008, and the wide receivers and kickoff return coach in 2010. During the 2007 season, Wells helped guide the Lobos to a 9-4 record, including tying for third-place in the Mountain West with a 5-3 mark, followed by a 23-0 win against Nevada in the New Mexico Bowl. In 2010, Wells coordinated a UNM kickoff return unit that finished 27th in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) with a 23.5 yards per return average. The kickoff return unit established six new school records, while tying one. Under Wells' tutelage, his kickoff return units broke or tied 16 school records, as well as breaking or tying four NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) records. In his first coaching stint at New Mexico, Wells coached a pair of first-team all-Mountain West receivers in Travis Brown and Marcus Smith in 2007. Smith led the MW in receiving, setting a school record with 91 receptions for 1,125 yards and four touchdowns, while Brown tallied 76 catches for 1,031 yards with six scores. It was the first time in New Mexico history that two different receivers had 1,000 receiving yards in the same season. Smith was a fourth-round draft pick of the Baltimore Ravens in 2008.

#### STATS FOR CURRENT AGGIES WITH MULTIPLE GAMES VS. NEW MEXICO

The following is a look at what current Utah State players have done against New Mexico in two games played. Senior DE **Jordan Nielsen** has six tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss. Senior NG **Travis Seefeldt** has six tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sacks. Junior TE **Wyatt Houston** has four catches for 77 yards (19.3 ypc) and a touchdown. Junior RB **Kennedy Williams** has four carries for nine yards (2.2 ypc), one catch for three yards and one kickoff return for 31 yards. Junior PK **Jake Thompson** has 12 kickoffs for 737 yards (61.4 ypk) and one touchback. Junior LB **Nick Vigil** has 16 tackles, including 1.0 tackles for loss. Junior FS **Devin Centers** has seven tackles and one pass breakup. Junior DE **Ricky Ali'ifua** has five tackles, including 2.0 tackles for loss and 1.0 sacks, and one quarterback hurry. And, junior FS **Marquan Ellison** has one tackle.

## **UTAH STATE IN THIRD SEASON IN MOUNTAIN WEST**

Utah State is in its third year as a member of the Mountain West and has been a Division I-A football playing school in each of its 117 seasons of competition. USU joined the Mountain States/Skyline Conference in 1938 until 1961. USU then played as a football independent from 1962-77 when the Aggies became members of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association in 1978. The PCAA changed its name to the Big West Conference in 1988. Following the 2000 season when the Big West no longer sponsored football, USU spent two years as an independent (2001-02) and two years in the Sun Belt Conference (2003-04), before joining the Western Athletic Conference for eight seasons from 2005-12.

#### **UTAH STATE TO PLAY FIRST SATURDAY GAME IN A MONTH**

Utah State will be playing on Saturday this weekend against New Mexico, marking its first Saturday game in one month since it played at Fresno State (Oct. 10). Overall, this will be just its fourth Saturday game this season. USU is 2-1 thus far this year in games played on Saturday and is 16-7 in Saturday games under head coach **Matt Wells**.

# AGGIES DOMINATING THE SECOND QUARTER THIS SEASON

Utah State's most productive quarter in 2015 has been the second as the Aggies have out-scored their opponents by 49 points (111-62) going into halftime. In its last four games, USU has out-scored its opponents 73-31 in the second quarter as it had a 28-7 advantage against Boise State, a 22-0 advantage against Fresno State, a 17-7 disadvantage at San Diego State, and a 16-7 advantage against Wyoming.

#### AGGIE SENIORS LOOKING TO SET SCHOOL RECORD FOR WINS

Utah State's 2015 senior class has 35 career wins, which is the second-most in school history, and needs three more victories to break last year's senior class record of 37 wins. The previous record was 31 wins set in 2013.

#### AGGIES HAVE FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK EACH OF LAST FOUR YEARS

Utah State has had at least a five-game winning streak in each of its last four seasons as the 2011, 2013 and 2014 teams all won five-straight games, while the 2012 team won its last seven games. The 1961 team holds the school record with nine-straight wins. Prior to its current run the last four seasons, USU's last five-game winning streak was in 1993.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Utah State has returned a pair of blocked extra points for two-point conversions in its last 10 games as senior LB **Torrey Green** returned a blocked PAT by senior NG **David Moala** against Southern Utah in the first game of the 2015 season, while sophomore CB **Jalen Davis** returned a blocked PAT by senior NG **Travis Seefeldt** at Boise State in last year's regular season finale.

**LOGAN, Utah** - Junior WR's **JoJo Natson** and **Devonte Robinson** each scored rushing touchdowns to help Utah State (8-3, 5-1) post a 28-21 Mountain West home win against New Mexico (3-7, 1-5) on Nov. 15, 2014.

Utah State rushed for 272 yards on the afternoon as part of its 422 yards of total offense as it also passed for 150 yards. New Mexico finished the game with 400 yards of total offense, with 246 yards rushing and 154 yards passing. The 246 rushing yards by the Lobos are the most allowed by an Aggie defense since 2010.

Freshman QB **Kent Myers** was 13-of-21 passing for Utah State for 150 yards with one touchdown and his first career interception, and added career-highs in both rushing attempts (10) and yards (39).

Natson rushed for 70 yards on five carries, including a 48-yard touchdown, and Robinson added a 59-yard touchdown run. Freshman RB **LaJuan Hunt** also scored a rushing touchdown from 1-yard out and finished the game with 55 yards on eight carries.

Redshirt freshman QB Lamar Jordan paced New Mexico with 80 rushing yards on 23 carries, while completing 8-of-18 passes for 154 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

Sophomore LB **Nick Vigil** had 13 tackles, while senior LB **Zach Vigil** had 10 stops. Senior SS **Frankie Sutera** added seven stops and intercepted his seventh pass of the season, which ranks tied for the third-most interceptions in a single-season in school history.

Hunt got Utah State on the scoreboard midway through the first quarter on a 1-yard run to give the home team a 7-0 lead. During the drive, Hunt recorded a career-long rush of 47 yards to set up the touchdown as the Aggies drove 49 yards in just four plays.

New Mexico tied the game late in the first quarter on a 1-yard touchdown run by David Anaya to cap a 6-play, 33 yard drive following Myers first career interception.

On the first play of the second quarter, Robinson rushed 59 yards for his first career rushing touchdown to give the home team a 14-7 lead. New Mexico answered right back on its next series as Romell Jordan scored on a 72-yard run on UNM's second play to tie the game at 14-14. For USU, that was the longest rushing play allowed dating back to the 2007 season.

Utah State regained the lead late in the second quarter as Myers hit sophomore TE **Wyatt Houston** from 10-yards out to cap a 9-play, 79-yard drive giving USU a 21-14 lead

heading into halftime. Houston finished the game with three receptions for a career-high 54 yards.

Utah State scored the only points of the third quarter on Natson's 48 yard run to cap a 4-play, 91-yard drive to give USU its largest lead of the game at 28-14.

New Mexico finally got on the board in the second half late in the fourth quarter on a 59-yard touchdown pass from Lamar Jordan to Tyler Duncan to cap a 9-play, 99-yard drive that took 4:10 off the clock.

However, that would be the last time the Lobos would touch the ball as Utah State rushed nine times for 48 yards on its next drive to take the final 4:17 off the clock in posting the seven-point win.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - Senior RB Joey DeMartino rushed for a career-high 144 yards and scored four touchdowns, and the Aggie defense held the nation's second-ranked rushing offense to less than half of its season average, in Utah State's 45-10 Mountain West road win at New Mexico on Saturday, Oct. 19, 2013.

Utah State evened its record at 4-4 with the win and improved to 3-1 in MW play, while New Mexico fell to 2-5 on the season and 0-3 in the league with the loss.

Utah State finished the game with a season-high 337 rushing yards as part of its 492 yards of total offense as it also passed for 155 yards.

Utah State's defense limited New Mexico to just 300 yards of total offense, including a season-low 160 yards on the ground. UNM entered the game ranking second in the nation with an average of 349.3 rushing yards per game.

True freshman QB Darell Garretson finished the game 15-of-23 passing for 144 yards with one touchdown in his first career start, while DeMartino recorded his third-career 100-yard rushing game as he finished the contest with 144 yards on just 12 carries and tied his career-high with three rushing touchdowns. DeMartino also had a career-high three receptions for a career-best 41 yards, including his first career touchdown reception.

Senior WR Travis Reynolds finished with four receptions for 42 yards and extended his streak with at least one reception to 17 straight games.

Defensively, senior CB Nevin Lawson and senior LB Jake Doughty each had six tackles for USU, while senior DT Connor Williams had a team-high 1.5 sacks as USU notched a season-high six sacks against the Lobos.

New Mexico RB Kasey Carrier ran for just 69 yards on 14 carries after entering the game ranking first in the Mountain West and eighth in the nation with an average of 138.7 rushing yards per game. Clayton Mitchem finished 6-of-10 passing for 76 yards for UNM.

Utah State got on the board early as DeMartino scored on an 8-yard run on its first offensive play of the game following a Mitchem fumble on New Mexico's third offensive play that was recovered by Williams inside the Lobo's 10-yard line.

DeMartino scored Utah State's second touchdown of the game on its next possession on a 21-yard pass from Garretson to make the score 14-0, and junior PK Nick Diaz added a 24-yard field goal late in the quarter to give the visitors a 17-0 advantage after one

Following a 32-yard New Mexico field goal, DeMartino scored his second rushing touchdown of the game on a 32-yard run after he rushed for 42 yards on the first play of the drive to extend USU's lead to 24-3.

Utah State scored its final touchdown of the half on a 65-yard punt return by sophomore

WR JoJo Natson to give the Aggies a 31-3 lead at intermission. For Natson, it was his first-career punt return for a score and the first time USU returned a punt for a touchdown since 2007.

DeMartino scored his fourth and final touch down of the game on USU's first series of the third quarter as he ran in from 38 yards out to cap a 4-play, 74-yard drive for a 38-3 Aggie lead.

Utah State's final touch down came midway through the fourth quarter as junior P Jaron Bentrude kept the ball on a rugby punt and raced 72 yards down the right sideline to push USU's lead to 45-3.

New Mexico concluded the scoring with a 2-yard run by Carrier with 45-10.

#### **UTAH STATE IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST AND NCAA RANKINGS**

- Utah State's defense currently ranks among the top 40 in the nation in 12 categories, including ranking third in the Mountain West and 20th nationally in passing defense (181.4 ypg). The Aggies also rank third in the MW and 29th in the nation in pass efficiency defense (114.0), fourth in the MW and tied for 26th nationally in total defense (325.2 ypg), fourth in the MW and 41st in the nation in rushing defense (143.9 ypg), fourth in the MW and tied for 56th in the nation in scoring defense (24.6 ppg), and fifth in the MW and tied for 36th in the nation in sacks (2.5 pg).
- Offensively, Utah State ranks third in the Mountain West and tied for 16th nationally in sacks allowed (1.1 pg), third in the MW and 54th nationally in scoring (32.0 ppg), fourth in the MW and 52nd nationally in completion percentage (.604), fifth in the MW and 65th nationally in passing efficiency (132.9), sixth in the MW in passing (187.9 ypg), seventh in the MW and 52nd nationally in rushing (182.0 ypg), and ninth in the MW and 90th in the nation in total offense (369.9 ypg).
- On special teams, Utah State ranks third in the Mountain West and 44th in the nation in punt returns (10.3 ypr), 11th in the MW in kickoff returns (19.5 ypr), and 12th in the MW in net punting (35.1 ypk). USU has also blocked an extra point and two punts this season to rank first in the MW and tied for fourth nationally with its two blocked punts.

# **UTAH STATE LEADING THE NATION IN FUMBLES RECOVERED**

Despite not forcing a turnover in each of its last two games, Utah State still leads the nation with its 10 forced fumbles, while ranking 13th nationally with its 18 turnovers forced. USU also ranks third in the Mountain West and 28th nationally in opponent's third down conversions (.325), third in the MW and 33rd nationally in first downs allowed (18.13 pg), third in the MW and 39th nationally in tackles for loss (6.9 pg), and fourth in the MW and 47th nationally with its eight passes intercepted. USU has also scored two defensive touchdowns this year, to rank fourth in the MW and 46th in the nation, and has scored 10 defensive touchdowns in its last 30 games. And, USU ranks tied for ninth in the nation in forcing three-and-outs with 5.38 per game.

#### **DEFENSIVE NOTABLES**

- Utah State has forced at least one turnover in 38 of its last 45 games and 95 turnovers in its last 45 games. Overall, USU has forced at least three turnovers in 11 of its last 21 games.
- Utah State has intercepted 44 passes in its last 32 games, including multiple interceptions in 14 of those 32 games, and has at least one interception in 20 of its last 28 games.
- Utah State has held its opponent out of the end zone in the first quarter in 34 of its last 50 games, and scoreless in the first quarter in 23 of its last 50 games. Overall, USU has led at the end of the first quarter in 34 of its last 50 games and is 29-5 in those contests.
- Utah State's defense has held 23 of its last 48 opponents without a first-half touchdown, while seven of its last 48 opponents have been held scoreless in the first half. USU has led at the half in 37 of its last 48 games and is 33-4 in those contests.

#### **FACKRELL LEADS THE NATION IN FUMBLES RECOVERED**

Senior LB **Kyler Fackrell** has recovered four fumbles this season to lead the nation and also ranks first in the Mountain West and tied for 27th nationally in tackles for loss (1.38 pg), tied for third in the MW and tied for 44th nationally with two fumbles forced, and 24th in the MW in tackles (6.6 pg).

#### **VIGIL RANKS EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN TACKLES**

Junior LB **Nick Vigil** ranks first in the Mountain West and tied for eighth nationally in tackles (11.1pg), tied for third in the MW and tied for 44th nationally with two fumbles forced, and tied for sixth in the MW and tied for 70th nationally in fumbles recovered with one.

## MAYS RANKS NINTH NATIONALLY IN RUSHING YARDS PER CARRY

Junior RB **Devante Mays** ranks first in the Mountain West and ninth nationally with 7.1 yards per carry, fourth in the MW and 43rd nationally with seven rushing touchdowns, and eighth in the MW and 74th nationally in rushing (73.2 ypg).

# OTHER AGGIES IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST AND NCAA RANKINGS

Junior WR Andrew Rodriguez ranks tied first in the Mountain West and tied for fourth nationally with his one punt return for touchdown, and first in the MW and 17th nationally in punt returns (13.2 pg). Sophomore QB Kent Myers ranks fifth in the MW and 76th nationally in passing touchdowns with nine. Senior WR Hunter Sharp ranks fifth in the MW in receiving (60.7 ypg), sixth in the MW in receiving touchdowns with four, and seventh in the MW in receptions (4.7 pg). Sophomore CB Jalen Davis ranks fifth in the MW in passes defended (1.12 pg), and tied for sixth in the MW in interceptions (0.25 pg). Junior FS Devin Centers ranks tied for sixth in the MW in interceptions (0.25 pg). Senior SS Marwin Evans ranks tied for third in the MW and tied for 44th nationally in fumbles forced (0.25 pg), and tied for 48th in the MW in tackles (4.6 pg). Senior DE **Jordan Nielsen** ranks tied for fourth in the MW and tied for ninth in the nation in fumble recoveries (0.25 pg). Redshirt freshman FS Jontrell Rocquemore ranks tied first in the MW and tied for fourth nationally with his one punt return for touchdown, and tied for sixth in the MW in fumble recoveries (0.13 pg). Senior CB Tyler Floyd ranks tied for sixth in the MW in fumble recoveries (0.13 pg). Senior LB LT Filiaga ranks tied for 25th in the MW in tackles (6.5 pg). Junior PK Brock Warren ranks seventh in the MW in field goals (0.75 pg) and 10th in the MW in scoring (6.0 ppg), and redshirt freshman P Aaron Dalton ranks 11th in the MW in punting (39.6 ypk).





#### **FACKRELL NAMED ONE OF 10 SEMIFINALISTS FOR BUTKUS AWARD**

Senior LB **Kyler Fackrell** has been named one of 10 semi-finalsts for the 31st annual Butkus Award honoring the nation's best linebacker, it was announced on Monday, Nov. 2. Joining Fackrell as a semifinalist was Kendall Beckwith (LSU), Su'a Cravens (USC), Leonard Floyd (Georgia), Deion Jones (LSU), Blake Martinez (Stanford), Raekwon McMillan (Ohio State), Antonio Morrison (Florida), Reggie Ragland (Alabama) and Jaylon Smith (Notre Dame).

#### FACKRELL NAMED MW DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AGAINST BOISE STATE

Senior LB **Kyler Fackrell** was named the Mountain West's Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, Oct. 19 following Utah State's 52-26 home win against No. 21 Boise State. Against the Broncos, Fackrell recorded 2.5 tackles for loss as part of his season-high 11 total stops, and added a career-best two fumble recoveries, to go along with one forced fumble and two quarterback hurries. Overall, it was Fackrell's first double-digit tackle outing of the season and the seventh of his career.

#### MYERS NAMED HONORABLE MENTION NATIONAL PERFORMER FROM CFPA

- Utah State sophomore QB **Kent Myers** tied his career high with four total touchdowns in Utah State's 58-27 home win against Wyoming last weekend, earning honorable mention national performer honors from College Football Performance Awards. Joining Myers as receipents of this week's CFPA Award included Cincinnati's Gunner Kiel, Oklahoma's Baker Mayfield, Clemson's Deshaun Watson and Florida State's Travis Rudolph.
- Against the Cowboys, Myers tied his career high with three touchdown passes and added a 5-yard touchdown run. Against Wyoming, Myers was 14-of-17 passing for 246 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions, while rushing for another 48 yards on 11 carries with one touchdown. In the first half against Wyoming, Myers was 10-of-10 passing for 171 yards with one touchdown.
- Myers also had four total touchdowns in a 52-26 home win against No. 21 Boise State earlier this season with three touchdown passes and one rushing touchdown, and in a 41-7 home win against San José State last season with three rushing touchdowns and one passing touchdown. Overall, Myers has nine touchdown passes this season and 14 in his career, to go along with three rushing touchdowns this season and eight in his career. Myers also now has two career 200-yard passing games and two career multi-touchdown games passing the ball.
- In two career games against Wyoming, Myers is 27-of-33 (.818) passing for 396 yards (198.0 ypg) with three touchdowns and no interceptions, while also rushing for 73 yards on 19 carries (3.8 ypc) with one touchdown.

#### MYERS NAMED MW OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AGAINST COLORADO STATE

- Utah State sophomore QB **Kent Myers** was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week on Monday, Oct. 5 after setting a school record for rushing yards by a quarterback with a career-high 191 yards on a career-best 16 carries in Utah State's 33-18 Homecoming win against Colorado State. The previous record was 121 yards set by redshirt senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** against Louisiana Tech (17 carries) in 2012 and **Tony Adams** against Colorado State (12 carries) in 1972. For Myers, it was his first career 100-yard rushing game.
- Myers' 191 rushing yards are the most by a FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision) quarterback this year. It is also the most rushing yards by an Aggie since **Kerwynn Williams** rushed for 235 yards against Toledo in the 2012 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.
- Myers had four explosive runs (34, 34, 27, 26) against Colorado State as he scored his first rushing touchdown of the season and sixth of his career from 26 yards out.
- Myers was also 12-of-21 passing for 137 yards with one touchdown and no interceptions against Colorado State, including a 42-yard touchdown pass to senior WR **Hunter Sharp**.

#### RODRIGUEZ NAMED MW SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK AGAINST SOUTHERN UTAH

- Redshirt junior WR **Andrew Rodriguez** was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week following Utah State's 12-9 season-opening home win against Southern Utah on Sept. 3, 2015. Rodriguez returned a USU and Mountain West record eight punts for 136 yards against the Thunderbirds, including one 88 yards for a touchdown with 4:54 to play in the game to turn a 9-5 Aggie deficit into a 12-9 come-from-behind win. The previous school record for punt returns in a game was seven by **Kelley Deist** against Southern Mississippi in 1974, while the previous MW record was also seven by Scott Harding (Hawai'i) in 2014.
- That 88-yard punt return for Rodriguez is a Maverik Stadium record and the third-longest in USU history trailing **Kevin Robinson**, who returned a punt 90 yards for a touchdown at Troy in 2004 and **Dale Leatham**, who also returned a punt 90 yards for a touchdown at Wichita State in 1950. Robinson held the previous Maverik Stadium record as he returned a punt 87 yards for a touchdown against San José State in 2005.
- Rodriguez's 88-yard punt return is also tied for the second-longest in Mountain West history trailing Dallas Davis (Colorado State), who returned a punt 89 yards against Utah in 1999 and tied with Anthony Wright (Air Force), who returned a punt 88 yards against Army in 2009.

# MAYS RUSHES FOR CAREER-HIGH 176 YARDS AGAINST WYOMING

Junior RB **Devante Mays** had his best game as an Aggie last weekend against Wyoming as he carried the ball a career-high 22 times for a career-best 176 yards, and scored on a pair of touchdown runs of 11 and two yards. Against the Cowboys, Mays averaged 8.0 yards per carry. For Mays, it was his first career 100-yard rushing game.

#### MAYS EXCELLING AS UTAH STATE'S FEATURED BACK

- Junior RB **Devante Mays** has excelled as Utah State's featured back during its last four games as he has carried the ball 57 times for 419 yards (7.4 ypc/104.8 ypg) with seven touchdowns. On the season, Mays is averaging 7.1 yards per carry as he has rushed for 586 yards on 83 attempts, and that 7.1 yards per carry average would currently rank third all-time in a single-season in school history if he had 100 carries, trailing only **Tom Larscheid** (8.4 ypc in 1960) and **Michael Smith** (7.6 ypc in 2011). On the season, Mays has a team-leading eight explosive plays.
- With his seven rushing touchdowns in his last four games, Mays is the first Aggie running back to rush for at least one touchdown in four straight games since **Joey DeMartino** scored rushing touchdowns in six straight games during the 2013 campaign.

## HOUSTON CATCHES CAREER-HIGH TWO TOUCHDOWNS AGAINST WYOMING

Junior TE **Wyatt Houston** had a career-game against Wyoming as he tied his career-high with four receptions for a career-best 66 yards and added a career-high two touchdowns from eight and 25 yards. Overall, Houston now has three touchdown receptions this year and seven in his career.

#### HOBBS THROWS FIRST CAREER TOUCHDOWN PASS AGAINST WYOMING

Sophomore QB **Damion Hobbs** threw his first career touchdown pass in his last game against Wyoming as he connected with sophomore WR **Jaren Colston-Green** from 34 yards out. In the game, Hobbs was 2-of-2 passing for 50 yards, and also carried the ball once for two yards.

# SWINDALL HAS BEST GAME OF THE SEASON AGAINST WYOMING

Senior WR **Brandon Swindall** had his best game of the season in his last outing against Wyoming as he caught a season-high three passes for a season-best 50 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown reception, his first of the year and seventh of his career. Swindall played in just one game last season before missing the rest of the year with a torn Achilles and then missed the first two games of the year and was limited in three others with a hamstring injury.

#### **ROCQUEMORE SCORES SECOND DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWN THIS SEASON**

- Redshirt freshman FS **Jontrell Rocquemore** scored his second defensive touchdown of the season last weekend in Utah State's 58-27 home win against Wyoming as he recovered a blocked punt from junior LB **Brock Carmen** in the end zone. Rocquemore's first touchdown of the year was on a 97-yard fumble return against Washington, which ranked as the second-longest in school history.
- On the season, Rocquemore is one of just seven defenders at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level to score multiple touchdowns this year. Louisiana Tech's Bryson Abraham leads the nation with three defensive touchdowns, while Trae Elston (Mississippi), Williams Jackson III (Houston), Tiquan Lang (Marshall), Calvin Munson (San Diego State), Ocie Rose (Florida Atlantic) and Rocquemore all have two defensive touchdowns this season.

#### **VIGIL RECORDS 11TH CAREER DOUBLE-DIGIT TACKLE GAME**

- Junior LB **Nick Vigil** recorded his fifth double-digit tackle game this year and the 11th of his career with 13 tackles last weekend against Wyoming. Overall, it was the seventh time in eight games this season that Vigil has led the Aggies in tackles.
- On the season, Vigil is tied for the team lead with 3.0 sacks and ranks second with his 8.5 tackles for loss, while also ranking first overall with 89 total tackles. He also ranks tied for first on the team with his two forced fumbles and has one fumble recovery. For his career, he now has 269 tackles, which includes 14.5 sacks and 33.5 tackles for loss, while adding seven forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

# **DID YOU KNOW?**

Utah State has won 40 of its last 55 games (.727) to rank as the third-most wins in the West behind Oregon (47) and Boise State (43) over the last four-plus seasons.

Senior SS Marwin Evans had a career-high two pass breakups, while adding 0.5 tackles for loss, giving him 6.5 tackles for loss this year and in his career... Sophomore DE lan Togiai had his first career 0.5 tackles for loss... Junior LB Brock Carmen blocked his first career kick on a punt in the second quarter and added a career-high four tackles... Redshirt freshman LB Chasen Andersen had a career-high three tackles... Junior TE Chris Copier had a career-long 35-yard reception, which was also his first career reception... Sophomore WR Braelon Roberts had a career-high 27 receiving yards... Junior WR Andrew Rodriguez had a career-long 25 yard reception... Sophomore WR Jaren Colston-Green scored his first career touchdown on a 34-yard pass and finished the game with a career-high two receptions for a career-best 54 yards... Redshirt sophomore RB Tonny Lindsey had a career-high 39 rushing yards, including a career-long run of 17 yards... Junior PK Brock Warren was 1-of-1 on field goal attempts as he made a 22-yarder and is now 6-of-6 on field goal attempts this year and 6-of-7 in his career, including 3-of-3 from 20-29 yards this year and in his career.

#### FACKRELL RECORDS EIGHTH CAREER DOUBLE-DIGIT TACKLE GAME

- Senior LB **Kyler Fackrell** recorded his second double-digit tackle outing of the season and the eighth of his career with his 10 stops at San Diego State two weeks ago. Fackrell ranks second on the team this season with 53 tackles, is tied for the team lead with 3.0 sacks and has a team-best 11.0 tackles for loss. He also has a team-leading 10 quarterback hurries and four fumble recoveries on the season, while tying for the team lead with two forced fumbles. For his career, Fackrell has registered 11.0 sacks and 32.0 tackles for loss as part of his 224 tackles, to go along with six fumble recoveries, five forced fumbles and four interceptions.
- Three weeks ago, Fackrell was named the Mountain West's Defensive Player of the Week following Utah State's 52-26 home win against No. 21 Boise State. Against the Broncos, Fackrell recorded 2.5 tackles for loss as part of his season-high 11 stops, and added a career-best two fumble recoveries, to go along with one forced fumble and two quarterback hurries.

#### **FACKRELL AND VIGIL UNSTOPPABLE IN MOUNTAIN WEST PLAY**

- Utah State's linebacker duo of senior **Kyler Fackrell** and junior **Nick Vigil** have taken their play to another level since beginning Mountain West play. Over the past five games, the duo has combined for 92 tackles, including 4.0 sacks and 11.5 tackles for loss, while adding three forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and 10 quarterback hurries.
- In five Mountain West games, Fackrell has recorded 37 tackles, which includes 1.0 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss, while adding four fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and eight quarterback hurries. Vigil has recorded 55 tackles, which includes 3.0 sacks and 4.5 tackles for loss, while adding two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and two quarterback hurries.

#### SHARP CATCHES ANOTHER TOUCHDOWN PASS AGAINST SAN DIEGO STATE

Senior WR **Hunter Sharp** caught his team-leading fourth touchdown of the season and the 11th of his career on a 45-yard completion against San Diego State two weeks ago. For his career, Sharp has 94 catches for 1,303 yards in 20 career games (13.9 ypr/65.2 ypg) to rank 24th all-time in school history in career receiving yards. Furthermore, Sharp is just six receptions shy of becoming the 18th player in school history to catch 100 career passes and is also one of just 33 players in school history with 1,000 career receiving yards. Overall, Sharp has caught at least one pass in 18 straight games, which is the longest streak by an Aggie since **Travis Reynolds** caught a pass in 21 straight games during the 2012 and 2013 seasons.

# **LOOKING BACK AT MYERS' FRESHMAN SEASON**

As a true freshman in 2014, sophomore QB **Kent Myers** completed 79-of-119 (.664) passes for 866 yards with five touchdowns and three interceptions, while rushing for 310 yards on 56 carries (5.5 ypc) and a team-leading five touchdowns.

- Myers was named the Offensive Most Valuable Player of the Gildan New Mexico Bowl after USU's 21-6 win against UTEP as he rushed a career-high 15 times for 70 yards, including a 48-yard touchdown run, and was 5-of-12 passing for 68 yards with an interception.
- Myers set a school and Mountain West single-game record in his first career start at Hawai'i (11/1) with his completion percentage of 93.3 percent as he finished the game 14-of-15 passing for a season-high 186 yards with a season-best three touchdowns and no interceptions. He also completed his first 12 pass attempts against Hawai'i, which is a school record, as well.
- Myers accounted for four touchdowns, including a career-high three rushing touchdowns from 28, 60 and 2 yards, respectively, in a 41-7 home win against San José State (11/21). He carried the ball four times for a career-high 92 yards to become the first quarterback in school history in the modern era to rush for three touchdowns in a game. Myers was also 15-of-22 passing for 108 yards and one touchdown against SJSU as he was named a Manning Award Star of the Week.

Utah State's 2015 schedule features nine teams who played in bowl games a year ago as Utah played in the Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl (W, 45-10 vs. Colorado State); Washington played in the TicketCity Cactus Bowl (L, 30-22 vs. Oklahoma State); Colorado State played in the Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl (L, 45-10 vs. Utah); Fresno State played in the Hawai'i Bowl (L, 30-6 vs. Rice); Boise State played in the Vizio Fiesta Bowl (W, 38-30 vs. Arizona); San Diego State played in the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl (L, 17-16 vs. Navy); Air Force played in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl (W, 38-24 vs. Western Michigan); Nevada played in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl (L, 16-3 vs. Louisiana-Lafayette); and BYU played in the Miami Beach Bowl (L, 55-48 vs. Memphis in 20T).

#### **UTAH STATE'S NINE BOWL TEAMS RANK TIED FOR FIFTH-MOST NATIONALLY**

Utah State's nine bowl teams from the previous year on its 2015 schedule rank tied for the fifth-most nationally. Alabama, Arkansas, Vanderbilt and Virginia all have 10 bowl teams on its schedule this year, while Georgia Tech, Kentucky, LSU, Michigan State, Ole Miss, Purdue, South Carolina, Texas A&M, USC and Utah State all have nine bowl teams on its 2015 ledger.

#### **UTAH STATE'S 2015 SCHEDULE IS ONE OF THE TOUGHEST IN THE NATION**

According to *Phil Steele's* Magazine, Utah State has the toughest schedule in the Mountain West in 2015 and the 35th-toughest schedule in the nation as its opponents were a combined 88-68 (.564) last year.

#### **UTAH STATE COACHING CHANGES FOR 2015**

Utah State's coaching staff had just two changes during the offseason as third-year head coach **Matt Wells** hired **Josh Heupel** as the assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach and **Kevin Clune** as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. Heupel replaces **Kevin McGiven**, who was named the quarterbacks coach at Oregon State, while Clune replaces **Todd Orlando**, who was named the defensive coordinator at Houston.

#### **UTAH STATE ONE OF JUST SEVEN PROGRAMS WITH NEW COORDINATORS**

Utah State is one of just seven FBS programs to have new offensive and defensive coordinators for the 2015 season, despite having the same head coach as the previous year, along with Bowling Green, Central Florida, Hawai'i, New Mexico State, Utah and Vanderbilt.

# WELLS' 24 WINS MOST BY ANY AGGIE COACH IN HIS FIRST TWO-PLUS YEARS

Utah State head coach **Matt Wells** already ranks as the eighth-winningest coach in school history with his 24 wins, while his 66.7 winning percentage (24-12) ranks second all-time in school history with a minimum of 15 games coached behind **John Ralston** (1959-62), who won 73.3 percent of his games (31-11-1). Furthermore, Wells' 19 wins is a school-record for a coach in his first two seasons, bettering the 15 wins **Phil Krueger** produced in 1973 and 1974.

# LOOKING INSIDE UTAH STATE'S ROSTER

Utah State's 15 returning starters (O-8, D-7) in 2015 are its most since it also returned 15 starters (O-8, D-7) for the 2013 season. Furthermore, USU's 23 seniors on its 2015 roster are its most since it had 24 seniors in 2010.

#### **FIRST TIME STARTERS**

#### AGGIE DEFENDERS PLAYING OFFENSE AS WELL IN 2015

Utah State has had several defenders get to play both offense and defense this season as senior NG **David Moala**, junior DE **Ricky Ali'ifua**, junior DE **Siua Taufa** and sophomore DE **Ian Togiai** have all seen time as either fullbacks or tight ends on offense, along with playing their normal positions on defense.

#### AGGIE DEFENSIVE LINEMEN CONTINUE TO RECOVER FROM CAR CRASH

On June 28, 2015, Utah State had four defensive linemen, along with a former USU softball player, involved in a car crash in Cache Valley. Those four football players injured in the accident were senior NG **Travis Seefeldt**, senior DE **John Taylor**, redshirt junior DE **Edmund Faimalo** and redshirt freshman DE **Adewale Adeoye**. Taylor and Faimalo have both played in each games this season, while Adeoye continues to improve and is practicing with the team. As for Seefeldt, he will most likely miss the 2015 season and apply for a medical redshirt with the NCAA and Mountain West.

#### AGGIES ANNOUNCE CORPORATE SPONSORSHIP WITH MAVERIK, INC.

Utah State University and Maverik, Inc., owners of convenience stores throughout the Intermountain West, jointly announced Saturday, April 11, 2015, a long-term naming rights partnership to its football stadium, which was known as Romney Stadium. Utah State's football venue is now known as Merlin Olsen Field at Maverik Stadium. The partnership with Utah State and Maverik is a multi-year agreement, which includes top-tier advertising rights and prominent signage on the exterior and interior of the stadium. Additionally, the venue will feature a Maverik concessions outlet that will sell a number of Maverik proprietary food products. Renovations to Maverik Stadium will focus on greatly improving the overall fan experience. On the west side, a new four-story premium seating and press box structure will be built to include a state-of-the-art media and game operations area, 24 luxury suites, 20 loge boxes, over 700 covered club seats and a premium club area that will also be used to host a student-athlete training table. This project will be completed in time for the 2016 season. Major concourse work will include significantly increased restrooms, upgraded concessions and an enlarged concourse for better pedestrian traffic flow. Renovations will also include new video boards on both the north and south ends of the stadium, along with a new public address system. The additional expansion of Maverik Stadium's seating capacity is also planned for the future.

Utah State redshirt senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** will miss the next four-to-six weeks due to a medial collateral ligament (MCL) sprain to his right knee, it was announced on Sept. 22 by Aggie head coach **Matt Wells**. The injury occured in USU's last game at Washington (9/19) and was to his uninjured knee. Keeton, who has played in just six games since tearing his anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in his left knee against BYU on Oct. 4, 2013, needs just one touchdown to set the USU career record, which he currently shares with **Jose Fuentes** (2000-2002) as both players have 60 career touchdown passes. Overall, Keeton has 19 career multi-touchdown games.

#### **KEETON IN THE AGGIE RECORD BOOK**

Redshirt senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** ranks among the top 10 in school history in the following categories:

- First all-time with a career completion percentage of 64.2 percent (623-of-970).
- First all-time with an interception percentage of 0.022 as he has thrown just 22 interceptions in 970 pass attempts.
- Tied for first all-time with 60 career touchdown passes along with Jose Fuentes (2000-2002).
- Second all-time with 6,924 passing yards. Fuentes holds the school record with 9,168 yards.
- Second all-time with 623 career completions. Fuentes holds the school record with 704.
- Second all-time with 970 career pass attempts. Fuentes holds the school record with 1,270.
- Second all-time with 8,233 yards of total offense (6,924-passing, 1,309-rushing). Fuentes holds the school record with 8,791 yards.
- 17th all-time with 1,309 career rushing yards (295 carries, 4.4 ypc). **Demario Brown** (1996-99) holds the school record with 4,053 yards, while **Diondre Borel** (2007-10) holds the school record with 1,398 yards by a quarterback. Overall, Keeton is one of just 27 players in school history to rush for 1,000 yards and just the second quarterback.
- Set single-season school records as a sophomore in 2012 for touchdown passes (27), passing yards (3,373), total offensive yards (3,992), completions (275) and completion percentage (.676), and broke his own completion percentage record as a junior (.694).
- Is the only quarterback in school history to have five touchdown passes in three games as he tied the single-game school record against both Air Force (9/7/13) and Weber State (9/14/13) during his junior season, as well as against Wyoming (10/8/11) as a freshman.
- Set a then single-game school record with an 88.0 percent completion percentage against Southern Utah (8/30/12) during his sophomore season as he was 22-of-25 passing.
- Tied the then school record for rushing yards by a quarterback with 121 yards on a careerhigh tying 17 carries in a 48-41 overtime win at No. 19 Louisiana Tech (11/17/12) during his sophomore season. **Tony Adams** set the record in 1972.

#### **KEETON AMONG ACTIVE FBS QUARTERBACKS**

In just 34 career games, redshirt senior **Chuckie Keeton** ranks among the top 10 FBS quarter-backs in the following 10 categories:

- Fifth in completion percentage (.642), trailing USC's Cody Kessler (.685), Washington State's Luke Falk (.685), Western Kentucky's Brandon Doughty (.681) and Bowling Green's Matt Johnson (.661).
- Sixth among QBs with 6,000 passing yards & 1,000 rushing yards (6,924 passing/1,309 rushing), trailing Oregon's Vernon Adams Jr. (11,601 passing/1,334 rushing), TCU's Trevone Boykin (10,080 passing/1,961 rushing), Mississippi State's Dak Prescott (7,631 passing/2,304 rushing), Ohio State's Braxton Miller (5,295 passing/3,261 rushing) and North Carolina's Marquise Williams (6,521 passing/2,033 rushing).
- Ninth in touchdown passes (60), trailing Oregon's Vernon Adams Jr. (120), Western Kentucky's Brandon Doughty (93), TCU's Trevone Boykin (83), USC's Cody Kessler (77), California's Jared Goff (75), Michigan State's Connor Cook (64), Buffalo's Joe Licata (63) and Central Michigan's Cooper Rush (62).
- Tied for 10th with Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon in total TDs responsible for (75), trailing Oregon's Vernon Adams Jr. (132), TCU's Trevone Boykin (108), Navy's Keenan Reynolds (102), Mississippi State's Dak Prescott (96), Western Kentucky's Brandon Doughty (95), Ohio State's Braxton Miller (88), USC's Cody Kessler (82), North Carolina's Marquise Williams (78) and California's Jared Goff (76).

#### **MORE NOTABLES ON KEETON**

- Utah State redshirt senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** is one of just two FBS quarterbacks to start five season openers along with Tulsa's T.J. Rubley (1987-91).
- Keeton is the second-winningest QB in school history with his 20 wins, trailing **Tony Adams** (1970-72), who won 22 games, and ahead of **John Pappas** (1966-68), who won 18 games.
- Keeton is one of just three active quarterbacks at the FBS level who holds their school's single-season passing record along with Jared Goff (California) and Brandon Doughty (Western Kentucky). Keeton set the USU record with 3,373 passing yards during his sophomore season in 2012.





#### WHAT MIGHT HAVE BEEN FOR KEETON IN 2013

- Redshirt senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** was putting up some gaudy numbers during his junior season before missing the final eight games with a knee injury suffered against BYU on Oct. 4. Through his first five games, Keeton ranked second in the nation with 17 touchdown passes, while also ranking first in the Mountain West and second in the nation in points responsible for (22.8 pg), second in the MW and 22nd in the nation in passing efficiency (161.6), third in the MW and eighth in the nation in completions (26.4 pg), third in the MW and 11th in the nation in completion percentage (.710), third in the MW and 18th in the nation in total offense (317.2 ypg), and fourth in the MW and 25th in the nation in passing (272.4 ypg). Keeton concluded his junior campaign completing 136-of-196 passes for 1,388 yards (231.3 ypg) and 18 touchdowns and two interceptions, while rushing for 241 yards on 55 carries (40.2 ypg/4.4 ypc) and two more scores. Those 18 touchdown passes rank tied for ninth all-time at USU, while his completion percentage of 69.4 percent ranks first all-time.
- In 2014, Keeton played in just two and one-half games before re-injuring his surgically repaired left knee in the first half against Wake Forest (9/13). He missed the rest of the season and received a medical redshirt from both the NCAA and Mountain West.

#### SHARP LED THE NATION IN 70-YARD RECEIVING TOUCHDOWNS LAST YEAR

Senior WR **Hunter Sharp** led the nation with his four touchdown receptions of 70-plus yards (81, 72, 75, 70) last season and is one of just two Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players in the last five years to accomplish this feat along with USC's Marqise Lee in 2012. Sharp's 81-yard touchdown reception was at Arkansas State (9/20), his 72-yard touchdown reception was at BYU (10/3), his 75-yard touchdown reception was at Hawai'i (11/1).

#### SHARP TIED FOR NINTH IN SINGLE-SEASON RECEPTIONS LAST YEAR

Senior WR **Hunter Sharp** caught 66 passes for 939 yards and seven touchdowns last season, which is tied with **James Murphy** (1980) for ninth-place all-time in school history in single-season receptions.

#### **CENTERS ONE OF 18 FBS DEFENDERS WITH MULTIPLE TOUCHDOWNS IN 2014**

Junior FS **Devin Centers** returned two fumbles for touchdowns last season, against Wake Forest (9/13) and Hawai'i (11/1), and was one of just 18 players at the FBS level with multiple defensive touchdowns on the season.

#### **FACKRELL IN THE AGGIE RECORD BOOKS**

- Senior LB **Kyler Fackrell** has intercepted four passes during his career for 125 return yards, which ranks tied for ninth all-time in school history along with **Rob Fuhriman** (1972-74). Fackrell is the only linebacker among USU's top 10 career leaders in this category. The school record for career interception return yards is 373 set by **Henry King** (1965-66).
- Fackrell's 99-yard interception return for a touchdown against Hawai'i in 2013 rank as the third-longest in school and Mountain West history. Those 99 interception return yards also rank 10th on USU's single-season lists.

#### **UTAH STATE TRENDS UNDER WELLS**

Under head coach **Matt Wells**, Utah State is 19-1 when scoring first; 21-2 when leading at the half; 23-1 when leading after three quarters; 17-0 when it scores 30 or more points; 22-2 when it scores 20 or more points; 18-2 when it allows 20 or less points; 22-4 when it out-gains its opponent; 5-1 when it has no turnovers; 23-6 when it has less than three turnovers; and 16-4 when it controls the time of possession.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Utah State's 2015 schedule marks the sixth-straight season, the seventh time in the last eight years, and the eighth time in the last 19 years that it will play six home games. Overall, the Aggies have had six home games on the slate just 12 times: 2015, 2014, 2013, 2012, 2011, 2010, 2008, 1998, 1996, 1995, 1978, 1952.

• Utah State returns 15 of its 26 regular starters from 2014, eight on offense and seven on defense. In addition, the Aggies return one of their kickers from last season along with their long snapper. USU also returns 38 letterwinners from a year ago, 12 on offense, 24 on defense and two specialists.

#### **ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH**

There are nine Division I schools that are located in cities with an elevation of at least 4,000 feet above sea level and Utah State ranks sixth on the list with an elevation of 4,710 feet. USU is the fifth-highest Mountain West Conference school. This season the Aggies will play at three other locations on the list (Air Force, New Mexico and Utah), giving USU nine games this season at 4,000 feet above sea level.

#### AGGIES DEFENSE AMONG THE BEST IN THE NATION THE LAST THREE YEARS

- Utah State's defense has been among the best in the nation the past three seasons as it has ranked among the top-25 teams each year in scoring defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense. In 2012, USU ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense (15.4 ppg), eighth nationally in passing efficiency defense (104.4) and 13th nationally in rushing defense (113.8 ypg). In 2013, USU ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense (17.1 ppg), eighth nationally in rushing defense (106.7 ypg) and 15th nationally in passing efficiency defense (113.2). And in 2014, USU ranked 12th nationally in scoring defense (19.1 ppg) 17th nationally in passing efficiency defense (111.4) and 24th nationally in rushing defense (130.7 ypg).
- Utah State is one of just three teams to rank among the top-12 nationally in scoring defense in each of the past three seasons along with Alabama and Stanford as USU allowed 15.4 points per game in 2012 and 17.1 points per game in 2013 to rank seventh nationally both seasons, and 19.7 points per game in 2014 to rank 12th nationally. During the past three seasons, USU ranks third nationally, allowing an average of just 17.44 points per game, trailing only Alabama (14.44 ppg) and Michigan State (16.93 ppg).

#### **MORE NOTABLES ON UTAH STATE'S DEFENSE**

- Utah State is one of just five defenses nationally to hold opposing offenses under five yards per play the last three years, along with Alabama, Stanford, TCU and Wisconsin. Over the past three seasons, USU's opponents have averaged just 4.55 yards per offensive play.
- Utah State has the fourth-best rushing defense nationally over the past four seasons, allowing just 3.13 yards per carry, trailing only Alabama (2.85 ypc), Michigan State (3.00 ypc) and Stanford (3.03 ypc).
- According to FootballScoop.com, Utah State's defense was ranked as the most disruptive in the Mountain West and 12th-most disruptive nationally during the 2014 season as 19.8 percent of the plays it faced resulted in either a sack, a tackle for loss, a forced fumble, or a tipped or intercepted pass.

### **UTAH STATE DEFENSE NOTABLE**

According to *Lindey's* Sports magazine, Utah State has the 10th-best linebacker group in the nation entering the 2015 season.

#### **OFFENSIVE NOTABLES FROM 2014**

- Utah State returns its leading rusher in sophomore RB **LaJuan Hunt** (540 rushing yards) and leading receiver in senior WR **Hunter Sharp** (939 receiving yards). The last time USU returned its leading rusher and receiver from the previous season was in 2006 when it returned sophomore FB **Ryan Bohm** (340 rushing yards) and senior WR **Tony Pennyman** (741 receiving yards).
- •Sophomore RB **LaJuan Hunt** was the first Aggie freshman to lead the team in rushing since 2007 when **Derrvin Speight** gained 504 yards on 129 carries (3.9 ypc). In fact, Hunt's 540 rushing yards on 111 carries (4.9 ypc) is the most by a true freshman in school history and the third-most by a freshman all-time, trailing **Abu Wilson**, who rushed for 795 yards on 164 carries (4.8 ypc) in 1992, and **Demario Brown**, who rushed for 700 yards on 119 carries (5.9 ypc) in 1996. Hunt's best game of 2014 was at Hawai'i (11/1) as he carried the ball 34 times for 145 yards, both of which are career-highs. Those 34 carries are the most by an Aggie since **Joey DeMartino** had 35 carries against Colorado State in 2013 and the most by a USU freshman in school history. The 145 rushing yards are the most by an Aggie since **Kerwynn Williams** had 235 rushing yards against Toledo in the 2012 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, and the most by a USU freshman since **Abu Wilson** rushed for 157 yards against New Mexico State in 1992. Furthermore, Hunt's 145 rushing yards marked the first time last season that USU had a 100-yard rusher.

#### **WHAT UTAH STATE MUST REPLACE FROM 2014**

Utah State lost nine players who earned various all-Mountain West honors in 2014, including DE **B.J. Larsen**, PR **JoJo Natson**, SS **Frankie Sutera**, LB **Zach Vigil** and OT **Kevin Whimpey**, who all earned first-team honors, PK **Nick Diaz**, who was named to the second-team, and P **Jaron Bentrude**, NG **Elvis Kamana-Matagi** and FS **Brian Suite**, who were all named to the honorable mention team. Vigil was also named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and earned second-team All-American honors from *USA Today Sports*, third-team All-American honors from *Phil Steele*, fourth-team All-American honors from *Athlon Sports*, and honorable mention All-American honors from *Sl.com*. Other starters lost include WR **Ronald Butler**, TE **Jefferson Court**, RB **Joe Hill** and CB **Rashard Stewart**.





#### AGGIES' 10 WINS IN 2014 SECOND-MOST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- Utah State concluded the 2014 season with a 10-4 record, marking just the second time in school history that USU has won double-digit games, trailing only the 2012 team that finished with an 11-2 record.
- Utah State recorded its fourth-straight winning season last year, which is its longest since posting five-straight winning seasons from 1971-75.
- Utah State received 11 votes in the final Associated Press poll to rank 32nd nationally and eight votes in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll to rank 34th nationally. Overall, it is the third time in as many years that USU has finished the season ranked among the top teams in the nation as the 2012 team was 16th in the final AP poll, while the 2013 team received two votes in the final AP poll to rank tied for 37th nationally.

#### AGGIES WIN THIRD-STRAIGHT BOWL GAME

- With its 21-6 win against UTEP in the 2014 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, Utah State has now won three-straight bowl games for the first time in school history. In 2013, USU posted a 21-14 win against No. 24 Northern Illinois in the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl and in 2012 it recorded a 41-15 win against Toledo in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.
- Utah State played in its fourth-straight bowl game for the first time in school history and its 10th bowl game all-time last season with its appearance in the Gildan New Mexico Bowl. Overall, USU is 4-6 all-time in bowl games. Utah State's other bowl win was in 1993 when it posted a 42-33 victory against Ball State in the Las Vegas Bowl II.

#### **UTAH STATE BOWL HISTORY**

Following its 21-6 win against UTEP in the 2014 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, Utah State now has a 4-6 bowl record all-time as it lost to San Jose State, 20-0, in the 1946 Raisin Bowl (Fresno, Calif.); lost to Pacific, 35-21, in the 1947 Grape Bowl (Lodi, Calif.); lost to New Mexico State, 20-13, in the 1960 Sun Bowl (El Paso, Texas); lost to Baylor, 24-9, in the 1961 Gotham Bowl (New York City); defeated Ball State, 42-33, in the 1993 Las Vegas Bowl II; lost to Cincinnati, 35-19, in the 1997 Humanitarian Bowl; lost to Ohio, 24-23, in the 2011 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl; defeated Toledo, 41-15, in the 2012 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, defeated No. 24 Northern Illinois, 21-14, in the 2013 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl; and defeated UTEP, 21-6, in the 2014 Gildan New Mexico Bowl.

#### **LOOKING BACK AT UTAH STATE'S 2014 SEASON**

Utah State ended its 2014 season with a 10-4 record after posting a 21-6 win against UTEP in the Gildan New Mexico Bowl. USU finished tied for second place in the Mountain Division of the Mountain West with a 6-2 record. Offensively, USU was led by freshman QB **Kent Myers**, who was 79-of-119 passing for 866 yards (123.7 ypg) with five touchdowns and three interceptions. Freshman RB **LaJuan Hunt** rushed for 540 yards on 111 carries (4.9 ypc) with one touchdown, and junior WR **Hunter Sharp** had 66 catches for 939 yards (14.2 ypr) and seven touchdowns. Defensively, senior LB **Zach Vigil** had a team-high 156 tackles, including 20.5 tackles for loss and 9.0 sacks, while sophomore LB **Nick Vigil** had 123 tackles, including 16.5 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks. As a team, USU averaged 26.9 points and 378.8 yards of offense (198.7-passing, 180.1-rushing) and allowed 19.7 points and 356.1 yards of offense (225.4-passing, 130.7-rushing). All-time, USU has a 525-517-31 (.504) record in 117 seasons.

#### **UTAH STATE GOES UNDEFEATED AT HOME DURING 2014 SEASON**

Utah State went 6-0 at home last season, tying the 2012 team for the most home wins in a single season in school history. Overall, it is just the fifth time in the 47-year history of Maverik Stadium that a USU team has gone undefeated at home joining the 1968 (4-0), 1972 (5-0), 1982 (4-0) and 2012 (6-0) teams.

#### **UTAH STATE RECORDS SECOND-BEST ATTENDANCE EVER IN 2014**

For the third-straight season, Utah State averaged over 20,000 fans, marking the first time in school history it has accomplished that feat. During the 2014 season, USU averaged 20,467 fans (122,803) to rank second all-time in school history behind the 2013 season that saw an average of 23,263 fans (139,576).

# 2013 Mountain West Coach of the Year

Third Season as Utah State Head Coach (24-12 Overall, 17-4 Mountain West) Fifth Season Overall at Utah State

- Matt Wells has wasted little time putting his stamp on the Aggie football program in his first three seasons as head coach, as USU is 24-12 including a 17-4 Mountain West record. Those 24 wins are a school-record by a USU coach in his first 36 games. USU has also played in fourth-straight bowl games and won three-straight bowls, including two in a row under Wells.
- Wells led Utah State to 10 wins in 2014 to rank as the second-most in school history behind the 2012 team that finished with an 11-2 record.
- During the 2014 season, Wells mentored 15 players who earned 16 all-Mountain West honors, which were the most in the league and tied for the third-most in school history.
- Wells led Utah State to the inaugural Mountain West Championship game after winning the Mountain Division of the conference with a 7-1 record in 2013. He also led USU to just its third-ever bowl victory as it posted a 21-14 win against No. 24 Northern Illinois in the 2013 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl.
- Wells was named the 2013 Mountain West Coach of the Year as he set the school record for wins by a first-year head coach as the Aggies finished the 2013 season with a 9-5 record.
- During his first year as Utah State's head coach, Wells mentored 14 Aggies who earned various all-Mountain West honors, including three All-Americans as Tyler Larsen was named a second-team All-American by *USA Today Sports*, Nevin Lawson was named a third-team All-American by *College Sports Madness*, and Kyler Fackrell was named an honorable mention Sophomore All-American by *College Football News*.
- Wells coached a school-record four players who were invited and participated in the 2014 NFL Combine in Larsen, Lawson, Maurice Alexander and D.J. Tialavea, while a total of 11 players from the 2013 roster were invited to NFL camps, including Alexander (St. Louis Rams) and Lawson (Detroit Lions), who were both selected in the fourth round of the 2014 NFL Draft.
- Overall, Wells is the second USU coach and fifth in school history to garner conference coach of the year honors along with Bruce Snyder (1978), Chuck Shelton (1991), John L. Smith (1997) and Gary Andersen (2012). Wells is also the fourth individual to earn MW Coach of the Year honors in his first season along with BYU's Gary Crowton (2001), Utah's Urban Meyer (2003) and Air Force's Troy Calhoun (2007).
- Wells, who is the 17th-youngest head coach at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level and one of just 14 coaches to lead his alma mater, is just the second Utah State graduate to be appointed its head football coach joining Chris Pella, who graduated from USU in 1965 and coached the Aggies from 1983-85.
- Prior to being named the head coach at his alma mater, Wells spent the previous two seasons as an assistant at Utah State, including serving as the team's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2012. In 2011, Wells coached USU's quarterbacks and was the team's recruiting coordinator.
- During his four years at Utah State, Wells has been part of a USU program that has played in four straight bowl games for the first time in school history, and won three-straight bowl games for the first time ever, while posting a 37-17 record.
- As offensive coordinator in 2012, Utah State concluded its most successful season in school history with a school-best 11-2 record. USU also won its first outright conference championship since 1936.

Sophomore QB Kent Myers (2) was 14-of-17 passing for 246 yards to go along with a career-high tying three touchdown passes in Utah State's 58-27 home win against Wyoming. Myers also rushed for 48 yards on 11 carries against the Cowboys, including a 5-yard touchdown run.

LOGAN, Utah - Junior RB Devante Mays rushed for a career-high 176 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries as Utah State bounced back from its first Mountain West loss of the season with a 58-27 victory against Wyoming on Oct. 30, 2015 on Merlin Olsen Field at Maverik Stadium.

Sophomore QB Kent Myers completed his first 10 passes of the game and finished 14-of-17 for 246 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns for Utah State (5-3, 4-1 MW), which defeated Wyoming (1-8, 1-4) for the fourth straight time.

Sophomore RB Brian Hill finished with 201 yards rushing and one touchdown on 26 carries for the Cowboys, who lost for the second time in a row.

The Aggies, who were held to just 239 yards in a 48-14 loss at San Diego State last weekend, finished with 592 yards (296 rushing and 296 passing) of total offense against Wyoming, its most since gaining 646 yards against Louisiana Tech in 2012 and the 14thmost in school history.

Wyatt Houston had his best game as an Aggie. The junior TE caught a career-high-tying four passes for a career-best 66 yards and a career-high two touchdowns, the final a 25-yarder with 9:52 left in the game that gave Utah State a 51-21 lead.

Junior LB Nick Vigil led the Aggies' defensive effort as he recorded 13 tackles, including 1.0 tackles for loss. Senior SS Marwin Evans added seven tackles, to go along with a career-high two pass breakups.

The Aggies scored points every time they touched the ball in the first half as Mays scored on runs of 11 and 2 yards, respectively, while Houston caught an 8-yard touchdown pass from Myers. In addition, junior PK Brock Warren booted a 22-yard field goal.

Of Utah State's 11 offensive possessions on the night, seven ended with a touchdown and one ended with a field goal. The Aggies only punted once on the night.

Utah State capped the first-half scoring when junior LB Brock Carmen blocked a punt, which redshirt freshman FS Jontrell Rocquemore recovered in the end zone to give the hosts a 30-14 lead at the break. It was Rocquemore's second touchdown of the season as he also returned a fumble 97 yards for a score at Washington on Sept. 19.

Wyoming's two touchdowns during the first 30 minutes of action came courtesy of a 9-yard pass from redshirt freshman QB Nick Smith to junior WR Jake Maulhardt and a 47yard run by Hill that pulled the Cowboys within 21-14 with 6:54 left in the second quarter.

Maulhardt finished with four catches for 30 yards and two touchdowns. Smith was 10of-18 for 83 yards and the two touchdowns.

Utah State also scored on its first possession of the second half when Myers scored on

a 5-yard touchdown run, making it 37-14 with 10:09 remaining in the third.

Senior WR Brandon Swindall gave the Aggies a 44-21 lead early in the fourth quarter when he hauled in a 19-vard touchdown pass from Myers. Swindall finished with three catches for 50 yards.

Utah State's final touch down came on a 34-yard pass from sophomore QB **Damion Hobbs** to sophomore WR **Jaren Colston-Green**, making it 58-21 with 6:34 remaining. Colston-Green caught his first two career passes as an Aggie for 50 yards.

Wyoming added a late touchdown to go.

Sophomore QB Kent Myers (2) was 8-of-19 passing for 93 yards with one touchdown and one interception in Utah State's 48-14 loss at San Diego State. Myers also rushed for 22 yards on 11 carries against the Aztecs.

**SAN DIEGO, Calif.** - Utah State junior RB **Devante Mays** rushed for 88 yards and a touchdown on a career-high 15 carries, but it still wasn't enough in a 48-14 loss to San Diego State on Oct. 23, 2015 at Qualcomm Stadium.

Aztecs junior RB Donnel Pumphrey rushed for 181 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries against the Aggies, who had a difficult time stopping the run without the services of senior starting NG **David Moala**, who missed his first game of the season due to an injury suffered against Boise State a week ago.

Both teams came into the game unbeaten in Mountain West play and leading their respective division with a 3-0 league mark, but the Aztecs took control early and never looked back en route to defeating the Aggies for the ninth straight time, including eighth consecutive time at home.

San Diego State (5-3, 4-0 MW) scored on six straight possessions in the first half and finished with 429 yards of total offense, compared to just 239 by Utah State (4-3, 3-1). The Aggies committed four turnovers, which the Aztecs turned into 17 first-half points. Conversely, Utah State did not force a turnover for the third time this year after forcing 18 turnovers in its last four games.

Chase Price nearly gave San Diego State a second 100-yard rusher in the game as the senior RB rushed for 97 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries. The Aztecs rushed for 336 yards and five touchdowns on 61 carries (5.5 ypc).

Senior WR **Hunter Sharp** scored the Aggies' other touchdown on a 45-yard pass from sophomore QB **Kent Myers** in the second quarter. Sharp finished with four catches for 63 yards, while Myers completed 8-of-19 passes for 93 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

San Diego State scored the first 24 points of the game and never looked back. After the two teams traded punts to begin the game, the Aztecs scored on their second series when senior QB Maxwell Smith threw an 18-yard touchdown pass to sophomore WR Mikah Halder to make it 7-0 with 9:35 left in the first quarter.

Less than a minute later, San Diego State was on the board again. Following a fumble recovery by junior LB Calvin Munson at the Utah State 14-yard line, the Aztecs needed just two plays to find the end zone as Smith scored on a 1-yard run for a 14-0 lead.

San Diego State made it 17-0 late in the first courtesy of a 41-yard field goal by Donny Hageman. The senior placekicker was also good from 21 yards out with 1:29 left in the opening half to give the Aztecs a commanding 34-7 lead at the break.

Pumphrey scored on touchdown runs of 4 and 62 yards, respectively, in the second quarter. The second one came right after Sharp's 45-yard touchdown pass from Myers that pulled the Aggies within 24-7 with 5:14 remaining until halftime.

Utah State took the second-half kickoff and went 65 yards in six plays, capped by a 26-yard touchdown run by Mays to pull within 34-14.

San Diego State tacked on two more touchdowns in the fourth quarter courtesy of a 1-yard run by Price and a 7-yard run by sophomore RB Rashaad Penny.

Senior LB **Kyler Fackrell** and junior LB **Nick Vigil** led Utah State's defensive effort with 10 tackles apiece, while senior DE **Jordan Nielsen** added a career-best nine stops.

Sophomore QB Kent Myers (2) was 17-of-24 passing for 157 yards to go along with a career-high tying three touchdown passes in Utah State's 52-26 win against No. 21 Boise State. Myers also rushed for a team-best 63 yards on 14 carries against the Broncos, including a 39-yard touchdown run.

LOGAN, Utah - Behind a stellar defensive showing, Utah State remained undefeated in Mountain West play as it rolled to a 52-26 victory over 21st-ranked Boise State on Oct. 16, 2015 on Merlin Olsen Field at Maverik Stadium.

The Aggies (4-2, 3-0 MW) forced a school-record tying eight turnovers, including seven in the first half, with five interceptions and three fumbles, turning them into 35 points.

This was the Aggies' first home win against an Associated Press-ranked team since defeating No. 25 Fresno State 20-19 in 1991. However, USU is 3-3 against top-25 opponents over the past three years under head coach Matt Wells.

Sophomore QB Kent Myers completed 17-of-24 passes for 157 yards and a career-hightying three touchdowns as the Aggies extended their home winning streak to 12 in a row. Myers also tied for the team high in rushing with 63 yards and a score on 14 carries.

Redshirt senior RB Kelsey Young rushed for 60 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries for Boise State (5-2, 2-1), while freshman QB Brett Rypien completed 25-of-50 passes for 299 yards and three interceptions.

Junior RB Devante Mays also rushed for 63 yards and a touchdown for the Aggies, who outgained the Broncos 334 to 333. Senior WR Hunter Sharp caught seven passes for 42 yards and two touchdowns to help Utah State snap a 12-game losing streak to Boise State dating back to the 1997 season.

Junior LB Nick Vigil led the Aggies on defense with 14 tackles, including 2.0 sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss. He also had two quarterback hurries, a fumble recovery and forced fumble. Senior LB Kyler Fackrell added 11 tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries, two quarterback hurries and a forced fumble.

The Broncos, who were the last team to defeat the Aggies at Maverik Stadium (34-23 on Oct. 12, 2013), struck first courtesy of a 46-yard field goal by junior PK Tyler Rausa.

Utah State answered as Myers threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to junior TE **Wyatt Houston** on fourth down, giving the Aggies a 7-3 lead with 7:33 left in the quarter. The score was set up by a career-long 51-yard reception by sophomore RB LaJuan Hunt.

The Aggies made it 10-3 the very next time they touched the ball as junior PK Jake Thompson drilled a career-long tying 52-yard field goal with 3:22 remaining in the first quarter.

Utah State's defense set up the next two scores. A fumble recovery by Fackrell turned into a 10-yard touchdown pass from Myers to Sharp, making it 17-3 late in the first. On Boise State's next possession, senior DE Jordan Nielsen recovered a fumble at the Broncos' 15. Four plays later, Hunt scored from four yards out to give Utah State a 24-3 lead early in the second quarter.

Following a 1-yard touchdown run by Young, Utah State scored 21 points in the final

1:25 of the first half, capped by a 90yard interception return by senior SS Marwin Evans. The defense, again, set up the other two scores as Vigil and senior CB Bryant Hayes each recovered a fumble. Myers then turned the turnovers into a 39-yard touchdown run and a 21-yard touchdown pass to Sharp.

The Aggies and Broncos traded touchdowns in the third quarter as Mays scored on a 1-yard run to give the hosts a 52-17 lead at the end of the quarter.

Sophomore CB Jalen Davis and senior LB Torrey Green also had infinished with 10.0 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks.

Junior RB Devante Mays (32) rushed for a career-high 92 yards on just nine carries, and scored a career-best three touchdowns, in Utah State's 56-14 road win at Fresno State. Mays had touchdown runs of 5, 41 and 23 yards against the Bulldogs.

FRESNO, Calif. - Junior Devante Mays rushed for a career-high 92 yards and three touchdowns, while sophomore LaJuan Hunt added two scores, to lead Utah State to a 56-14 victory against Fresno State on Oct. 10, 2015 at Bulldog Stadium.

The two running backs combined for 133 yards rushing and five scores as the Aggies (3-2, 2-0 Mountain West) won their second straight game and racked up a season-high 482 yards of total offense, including 201 on the ground.

Utah State had seven total rushing touchdowns on the night as sophomore QB **Damion** Hobbs and redshirt freshman RB Justen Hervey each had a 5-yard score in the fourth quarter to give the Aggies their final margin of victory.

Sophomore QB Kent Myers was 18-of-25 passing for a career-best 260 yards and one touchdown for Utah State, which snapped a six-game losing streak to the Bulldogs (1-5, 0-2). The Aggies also ended a seven-game road losing streak in the series.

Senior WR Hunter Sharp caught six passes for 99 yards and fellow senior WR Devonte Robinson added four receptions for 80 yards, including a 44-yard touchdown that gave the Aggies a 29-7 lead at halftime.

Junior LB Nick Vigil led Utah State's defensive effort with nine tackles and a forced fumble. The Aggies finished with 5.0 sacks as part of their 10.0 tackles for loss on the night.

Fresno State's Kilton Anderson was 10-of-23 passing for 112 yards with one touchdown and three interceptions. Senior Marteze Waller had 26 carries for 70 yards and a score.

After Fresno State tied it at 7-all, the Aggies moved in front for good on a 5-yard touchdown run by Mays to make it 14-7 with 10:04 remaining in the second quarter. It was the first touchdown of his Aggie career.

Utah State continued to pour it on as Hunt scored on a 3-yard touchdown run, followed by a safety when senior SS Marwin Evans sacked Anderson in the end zone, knocking the ball loose in the process. The Aggies tried to jump on the ball for a touchdown, but knocked it out of the back of the end zone for a safety and 22-7 advantage.

The Aggies weren't done, though, as Robinson hauled in the long touchdown pass from Myers with just 58 seconds left in the opening half.

Mays scored on third-quarter touchdown runs of 41 and 23 yards, respectively, to give Utah State a 43-7 lead as USU scored 36 unanswered points.

Former Fresno State LB Brock Carmen set up Hobbs' first career rushing touchdown when he intercepted a pass and returned it 19 yards to the Bulldogs' 9-yard line.

Hervey capped the scoring with his 5-yard run following a diving interception by junior CB Jentz Painter.

Utah State struck first when Hunt scored on a 15-yard touchdown run, making it 7-0 with 6:36 remaining in the opening quarter. Sharp set up the score when he caught a 43-yard pass from Myers on third-and-15.

However, Fresno State pulled even just before the end of the quarter. After the Bulldogs recovered a muffed punt by the Aggies, Anderson threw a 21-yard touchdown pass to redshirt freshman Jamire Jordan four plays later to make it 7-7.

Utah State's defense forced a turnover on the game's very first play asjunior FS Devin Centers intercepted a pass by Anderson deep down the middle.

Sophomore QB Kent Myers (2) rushed for a career-high 191 yards on a career-best 16 carries, including a 25-yard touchdown run, in Utah State's 33-18 Homecoming win against Colorado State. Myers was also 12-of-21 passing for 137 yards with one touchdown against the Rams.

LOGAN, Utah - Sophomore Kent Myers set a single-game rushing record for a quarterback at Utah State with 191 yards in a 33-18 Homecoming victory against Colorado State on Oct. 3, 2015 at Merlin Olsen Field at Maverik Stadium.

Myers, making his first start of the season, carried the ball a career-high 16 times and averaged a stellar 11.9 yards per rush to help the Aggies (2-2, 1-0 Mountain West) snap a two-game losing streak. He broke the old record of 121 yards, which was held by Tony Adams and redshirt senior QB Chuckie Keeton, who missed his first game since injuring his knee against Washington.

Myers' 26-yard touchdown run with 56 seconds left in the second quarter gave Utah State the lead for good at 17-10. One play earlier, he rushed for 34 yards on third-and-4 from the Colorado State 45-yard line.

Sophomore QB Nick Stevens was 21-of-46 for 252 yards with one touchdown and one interception for the Rams (2-3, 0-1). Stevens' favorite target on the night was junior WR Rashard Higgins, who caught 10 passes for 114 yards, including a 16-yard touchdown early in the second quarter that gave Colorado State a 10-3 lead.

Myers, who improved to 6-1 as the Aggies' starter, was 12-of-21 for 137 yards and a touchdown in the passing department. Senior WR Hunter Sharp led Utah State with four catches for 63 yards and a touchdown, a 42-yarder that tied the score at 10-all with 11:47 left in the second quarter.

The Aggies recorded a season-high 435 yards of total offense, including 298 yards on the ground. Junior RB **Devante Mays** had 10 carries for 60 yards, both career highs, while sophomore RB LaJuan Hunt scored on a 33-yard touchdown run, one of eight explosive plays Utah State had on the night.

After falling behind 10-3, the Aggies scored 23 unanswered points to move in front for good.

Senior LB LT Filiaga led Utah State with 10 tackles, while junior LB Nick Vigil added nine stops and a career-best two pass breakups. Senior LB Kyler Fackrell had an unforgettable Homecoming night as he recorded six tackles, including a career-best 3.0 tackles for loss and 1.0 sacks, to go along with a fumble recovery that he returned 12 yards and an eye-popping six quarterback hurries, which doubled his previous career high.

Utah State's defense forced three turnovers on the night as senior DE Jordan Nielsen recovered a fumble and sophomore CB Jalen Davis intercepted a pass in the end zone. Special teams play also shined for the Aggies, who were a perfect 4-for-4 on field goal

attempts. Junior PK **Jake Thompson** opened the game's scoring with a 48-yard field goal, while fellow junior PK Brock Warren made all three of his tries from 23, 40 and 34 yards, respectively. In addition, redshirt freshman P Agron Dalton punted four times for an average of 45.0 yards, including a career-best 58-yarder.

After Utah State opened its largest lead of the night, 26-10, following Warren's third field goal early in the fourth quarter, Colorado State pulled within 26-18 with 11:37 to go following a 15-yard touchdown run by Stevens and successful two-point conversion.

However, Hunt's 33-yard touch-



down run with 2:18 remaining gave Senior LB Kyler Fackrell (9) had a career-high 3.0 tackles the Aggies their final margin of victory. for loss to go along with 1.0 sack as part of his six tackles against the Rams, while adding a career-high six quarterback hurries and a fumble recovery.

Senior WR Hunter Sharp (4) caught six passes for 74 yards in Utah State's 31-17 road loss at Washington. Sharp also returned two kickoffs for 78 yards, including a career-long return of 60 yards, and added one punt return for minus three yards.

SEATTLE, Wash. - Washington scored the first 10 points of the game and Utah State could never recover as the Huskies cruised to a 31-17 victory on Sept. 19, 2015 in front of an announced crowd of 59,464 at Husky Stadium.

Freshman QB Jake Browning completed 22-of-31 passes for 368 yards with three touchdowns and one interception for Washington (2-1), which racked up 442 yards of total offense against the Aggies (1-2).

Redshirt senior QB Chuckie Keeton was 17-of-33 for 171 vards and two interceptions for Utah State, which gained just 254 yards of offense and fell to 0-3 all-time against Washington. Sophomore RB LaJuan Hunt led the Aggies' ground attack with 40 yards on 13 carries.

Senior WR Hunter Sharp lead Utah State with six catches for 74 yards and made a touchdown-saving tackle following an Aggie interception that ultimately led to a USU score.

With Utah State trailing 31-10 late in the third quarter and facing a third-and-14 play from the Huskies' 16-yard line, Keeton's pass was intercepted at the 1-yard line by Washington's Brandon Beaver, who appeared to be headed for a pick-six. However, Sharp tracked the junior defensive back down from behind and tackled him at the Aggies' 3-yard line.

Just two plays later, senior LB Kyler Fackrell forced a fumble by Washington QB Jeff Lindquist and redshirt freshman FS Jontrell Rocquemore scooped it up and returned it 97 yards for a touchdown, pulling the Aggies to within 31-17 with 9:47 left in the game. It was the second-longest fumble return in school history.

Defensively, junior LB Nick Vigil led the Aggies with nine tackles, including 1.0 tackles for loss. Senior LB Torrey Green set career highs in tackles (7) and tackles for loss (3.0), and tied his career-high with 1.0 sacks, while senior CB Deshane Hines also had a career high in tackles with seven, to go along with a forced fumble. Senior LB LT Filiaga tallied seven tackles, as well.

The Aggies recorded 7.0 tackles for loss on the day and forced three total turnovers as senior CB Tyler Floyd recovered a fumble and junior FS Devin Centers intercepted a pass by Browning on the first play of the second half.

Cameron Van Winkle drilled a 48-yard field goal late in the first quarter to give Washington a 3-0 lead. Then on a third-and-11 play from the Huskies' 19-yard line, Browning dumped off a short pass to running back Dwayne Washington, who turned it into an 81-yard touchdown with 13:51 left in the second quarter, making it 10-0. Washington led all receivers in the game with 131 yards and two touchdowns on five receptions.

The Aggies cracked the scoreboard for the first time when junior PK Brock Warren nailed a 22-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 10-3 with 10:31 left in the opening half.

Washington opened up a twotouchdown lead when it ran a fake field goal to perfection to give the hosts a 17-3 lead with 4:20 left until halftime.

However, Utah State answered the score just before the end of the half courtesy of a 1-yard touchdown run by senior NG David Moala, pulling the Aggies to within 17-10 at the break.

Browning threw a pair of thirdquarter touchdown passes to Washington and Drew Sample, respectively, as the Huskies opened a 31-10 lead.

Redshirt senior QB Chuckie Keeton (16) was 22-of-35 passing for 256 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions in Utah State's 24-14 road loss at Utah. Keeton, who also carried the ball 12 times for 46 yards, tied the school record for career touchdown passes with 60 in the game.

**SALT LAKE CITY, Utah** - Utah State redshirt senior QB **Chuckie Keeton** tied the school record for career touchdown passes, but it wasn't enough in a 24-14 loss at 24th-ranked Utah in front of 46,011 fans on Sept. 11, 2015 at Rice-Eccles Stadium.

Keeton tossed a pair of first-half touchdown passes to tie the career mark of 60 set by **Jose Fuentes** (1998-2002). He finished the game 22-of-35 for 256 yards and two interceptions for the Aggies. Keeton also led the team in rushing with 46 yards on 12 carries.

Senior WR **Devonte Robinson** was Keeton's favorite target on the night as he had a career-high tying six receptions for a career-best 119 yards, including a long of 51 yards, another career mark.

Utah senior RB Devontae Booker finished with 120 yards rushing and a touchdown on 31 carries as the Utes. Senior starting QB Travis Wilson was 9-of-12 passing for 76 yards, but left the game in the second quarter with a shoulder injury. He was replaced by senior Kendal Thompson, who was 8-of-10 passing for 56 yards and led Utah on two second-half scoring drives.

Keeton tied Fuentes' school record with a 15-yard touchdown pass to redshirt freshman WR **Zach Van Leeuwen** that tied the score at 14-all with just 24 seconds left in the second quarter. It was Van Leeuwen's first career touchdown catch as an Aggie.

Keeton and the Aggies started the second half with the ball, but went three-and-out on their opening drive. The Utes countered with a 12-play, 69-yard scoring drive on their first series of the half. Thompson capped the march with a 2-yard touchdown run to give Utah the lead for good, 21-14.

Of the three possessions Utah State had in the third quarter, the Aggies went three-and-out each time as Utah held the ball for 10 minutes, 41 seconds in the quarter.

The Utes made it 24-14 early in the fourth quarter when junior PK Andy Phillips booted a 37-yard field goal.

Senior LB **LT Filiaga**, who began his career at Utah, recorded a career-high 12 tackles in his return to Rice-Eccles Stadium for his fourth career double-digit tackle game. Junior LB **Nick Vigil** also had 12 stops for his second straight double-digit tackle outing and eighth of his career. Senior NG **David Moala** added a career-high eight tackles, including 1.0 tackle for loss.

Utah State, which outgained Utah 373-327, twice drove into the red zone in the fourth, but didn't come away with any points due to an interception and fumble. USU finished with 256 passing yards and 117 rushing yards, while Utah had 132 yards through the air and 195 on the ground.

Utah took the opening kickoff and marched 75 yards in 10 plays, capped by a 12-yard touchdown run by Wilson. One play earlier, Utah State senior SS **Marwin Evans** was ejected for targeting.

The Aggies tied it at 7-all when sophomore RB **LaJuan Hunt** caught an eight-yard touchdown pass from Keeton with 13:57 remaining in the first half. The score capped an 11-play, 85-yard drive.

Utah then regained the lead midway through the second quarter as Booker scored on a 4-yard run to cap a nine-play, 73-yard drive.

For the game, Utah controlled the ball for 33:52 as compared to 26:08 for the Aggies.

Redshirt junior WR Andrew Rodriguez (82) had two catches for 20 yards and returned a school and Mountain West record eight punts for 136 yards, including an 88-yard return for a touchdown, in Utah State's 12-9 win against Southern Utah.

LOGAN, Utah - Redshirt junior WR Andrew Rodriguez returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter to lead Utah State to a come-from-behind 12-9 season-opening victory against Southern Utah in front of 21,209 fans on Merlin Olsen Field at Maverik Stadium on Sept. 3, 2015.

Rodriguez's return, which gave Utah State (1-0) its only lead of the game, was the third-longest in school history and tied for the second-longest in Mountain West history. In all, Rodriguez returned eight punts in the game, which is a USU and MW record.

Utah State junior LB Nick Vigil recorded a game-best 13 tackles, including 2.0 tackles for loss. In his first game back since suffering a season-ending knee injury at Tennessee on Aug. 31, 2014, senior LB Kyler Fackrell added five tackles, including a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss and a career-high tying 2.0 sacks.

Senior LB LT Filiaga, who was also playing in his first game since suffering a season-ending injury at Wyoming on Nov. 7, 2014, tallied six tackles for the Aggies, who limited Southern Utah (0-1) to just 163 yards of total offense and 2.5 yards per play.

Sophomore CB Jalen Davis finished with four tackles, to go along with a career-high three pass breakups and a career-high tying 2.0 tackles for loss and 1.0 sacks. He also returned two punts for 35 yards as the Thunderbirds punted 15 times on the night.

In his first action since reinjuring his surgically repaired knee against Wake Forest on Sept. 13, 2014, redshirt senior QB Chuckie Keeton completed 16-of-33 passes for 110 yards and one interception as the Aggies won their 10th-straight home game.

With his 33 pass attempts against Southern Utah, Keeton moved into third place all-time in school history as he now has 902 career attempts, trailing only Jose Fuentes (1,270) and Diondre Borel (922).

Sophomore RB LaJuan Hunt led the Aggies offensively as he rushed for 80 yards on 23 carries, while junior RB **Devante Mays** added 51 yards on the ground on just four carries. Utah State finished with 250 yards of total offense.

Southern Utah QB Ammon Olsen completed 17-of-34 passes for 111 yards and a 27-yard touchdown pass to WR Mike Sharp to give the Thunderbirds a 6-0 lead with 13:21 left in the first quarter. However, USU senior NG David Moala blocked the ensuing extra-point try and senior LB Torrey Green returned it for a two-point conversion, making it 6-2.

Junior PK Brock Warren made the first field goal of his Utah State career when he drilled a 30-yarder with 4:59 left in the first quarter, trimming Southern Utah's lead to 6-5. The Thunderbirds answered with a field goal of their own with four seconds left in the

first half as Keita Calhoun converted from 36 yards out to give Southern Utah a 9-5 lead at halftime. The score remained the same until Rodriguez's game-changing punt return for a

quarter.

Utah State, which did not score an offensive touchdown for the first time since Oct. 5, 2012, was 1-for-15 on third-down conversions, while Southern Utah finished the game 1-for-18. The two teams combined for 29 punts.

Sophomore WR Braelon Roberts led the Aggies in receiving as he caught a career-best four receptions for 25 yards, while senior WR **Devonte** Robinson added three catches for 29 vards.


