THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 7-1 overall and has won its last five. The Buffaloes ended the home portion of their nonconference schedule with a perfect 6-0 mark after claiming an 84-72 win over UIC in their last outing.

Beginning with Tuesday's game at New Mexico, Colorado has six straight and nine of its next 11 games away from home. The Buffaloes will break for finals, play three games at the Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu, Dec. 22-25, and open the Pac-12 schedule at the Arizona schools the first week of January.

The six-game swing away from home will be Colorado's longest in the regular season since Dec. 6-31, 1986. All six of those were true road games (1-5) and started a bigger stretch of eight of nine away from home. The Buffaloes played six consecutive neutral site

games in March 2012 between the Pac-12 Conference Tournament Championship and the first two rounds in the NCAA Tournament ironically Colorado's last trip to The Pit in Albuquerque.

Two home contests in an 11 game span will be the fewest for the Buffaloes since December 1974-January 1975 when they also played seven straight and nine of 10 outside of Boulder.

Colorado leads the Pac-12 Conference in scoring (85.1 ppg), field goal percentage (.495), scoring margin (+16.2) and rebounding defense (29.8 rpg) while ranking second in rebounding margin (+10.2) and third in overall rebounding (40.0 rpg), defensive boards (29.4 drpg) and 3-point percentage (.373)

Nationally, Colorado is 14th in rebound margin, 19th in scoring offense and 27th in field goal percentage.

Colorado has had six players lead, or share the team lead, in scoring. The Buffaloes have sported at least four double-digit scorers in seven of eight games (all wins). On the season, Colorado has seven players that have scored in double-figures in at least three games.

Colorado has three players averaging double-figures in scoring and six averaging at least nine per game. Five of those six are shooting 48 percent or better from the floor with all six averaging at least 5.9 field goal attempts per game.

Defensively, Colorado is allowing 68.9 points per game while opponents are shooting 43.0 percent from the field.

Sophomore guard **McKinley Wright IV** paces the Buffaloes at 15.1 points, 6.3 assists and 1.9 steals per game. He had a game-high 21 points against UIC, the eighth 20-plus point game of his career. Wright averaged 16 points, 7.5 assists and 6.0 rebounds last week in wins over UIC and South Dakota.

After enduring a three-game stretch where he made 9 of 24 (.375) from the field, Wright has rebounded to make 25 of 47 attempts over the last three games (.532).

Wright has stepped it up defensively as well. He tied a career-high and the team's season best with three steals against UIC. Wright has two or more steals in six of eight contests including seven over the last three. With 15 on the season, he is nearly half way to his 32-game total of 31 steals as a freshman.

He is second in the Pac-12 in assists, fourth in steals, seventh in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.9) and free throw percentage (.857), 11th in scoring and 14th in field goal percentage (.500). Wright has scored in double figures in 34 of 40 career games while dishing out at least five assists in 28 contests.

Junior forward **Lucas Siewert** is second on the team in scoring (12.1 ppg) and rebounding (5.9 rpg) while leading the Buffaloes in shooting, both overall (.610) and from 3-point range (.560). Siewert

was held to a season-low with four points, on limited shots, against South Dakota, but he sprinkled the box score with six rebounds and a pair of assists.

Siewert logged his first two career double-doubles in back-to-back games. He had 16 points against Colorado State and, for the second-straight game, achieved his personal best of 10 rebounds. Siewert recorded his first career double-double with a career-high 18 points and 10 rebounds in the win over Portland. Siewert had a perfect shooting night against Air Force, making all six of his field goal and both of his free throw attempts, finishing with 17 points.

He has made 32 of his last 59 3-point attempts dating back to last season (.542). On the Pac-12 charts, Siewert is fourth in 3-point percentage, fifth in overall field goal percentage,13th in 3-pointers made (1.8 3mpg), 17th in rebounding and 26th in scoring.

Sophomore **Tyler Bey** leads Colorado at 8.5 rebounds and 1.3 blocks per game while matching Siewert at 12.1 points an outing. Bey recorded his fourth career double-double and second of the season with 15 points and a personal-best 15 rebounds against UIC. It was his fifth career game with double-figure rebounds.

He is shooting 66.7 percent over the last three games (18 of 27) and made his second career 3-pointer against UIC. Inside the 3-point arc, Bey is shooting 64.2 percent on the season (34 of 53).

On the Pac-12 leaderboard he is fifth in defensive boards (6.5 drpg), sixth in overall rebounding, eighth in blocks, ninth in field goal percentage (.545), 12th in offensive rebounds (2.0 orpg), 15th in free throw percentage and 26th in scoring.

Junior guard **Shane Gatling** has started his first eight games for the Buffaloes, averaging 9.9 points per contest. He scored 13 points vs. CSU, his best in a Colorado uniform. Gatling has upped his scoring average to 11.8 points over the last four games.

Gatling is second on the team in steals with 10; his 1.3 per game averaging ranking ninth in the Pac-12. Gatling also ranks 10th in the Pac-12 in free throw percentage (.818). He was a perfect 6 of 6 from the line against South Dakota and has made 18 of his last 20 (.900) from the charity stripe.

Senior guard **Namon Wright** is fifth on the team in both scoring (9.3 ppg) and rebounding (3.6 rpg) while shooting 49 percent from the field and 46 percent from 3-point range. He ranks ninth in the Pac-12 in 3-point shooting.

Wright had a team season-high 25 points in the opener, his most in a Colorado uniform. Wright scored 28 points against Florida as a freshman at Missouri on Feb. 24, 2015.

Freshman forward **Evan Battey** is averaging 9.1 points and 4.0 rebounds while shooting 48 percent. Battey had a game-high 14 points and a personal-best four assists against South Dakota. He made 8 of 10 free throws against the Coyotes. Coming into that game he had been just 8 of 14 through the first six games.

Battey is playing his first meaningful regular season games since his junior year of high school in the spring of 2016. He had eight points on 3 of 6 shooting with one rebound, steal, block and assist in his collegiate debut vs. Drake.

Sophomore wing **D'Shawn Schwartz** is averaging 7.7 points and is one of six Buffaloes averaging at least three rebounds a game. Schwartz averaged 13.0 points in wins over South Dakota and UIC last week, registering back-to-back games with double figure scoring

HOW IT HAPPENED. The Buffs knew the Lobos would apply pressure, and they did — to the tune of a season-high 23 Colorado miscues that led to 28 Lobos points. But CU held UNM to just 29.6 percent shooting (21-for-71) from the floor — including a 9-for-34 effort in the second half — while also posting a 58-31 edge on the boards to make the difference.

"I was really pleased with the second half," Boyle said. "We rebounded the ball well. If we'd rebounded like that last Saturday we'd be 8-0 right now instead of 7-1. But good bounce-back win. We have to keep getting better and learning."

The Buffs led by two at intermission before putting together their decisive 12-3 run midway through the second half, with freshmen providing the fuel for the burst. Lazar Nikolic scored the first five points, including a dunk on a beautiful alley-oop from **Deleon Brown**, McKinley Wright added four and **D'Shawn Schwartz** drained a 3-pointer to give the Buffs a 61-51 edge with 7:31 to go in the game.

"Laz is sneaky athletic," Wright said of his freshman classmate. "One of the guys with the most bounce on our team people don't know about yet. CU fans saw it tonight and they'll see more of it later in the season."

The Lobos briefly pulled back to within eight, but CU then produced a 7-0 run to take a 68-53 lead with 2:35 left to put the game away. Collier — the only Buff to have more assists than turnovers (2-0) — had four points in the run to help the Buffs seal the win.

"Dom was really good in the second half," Boyle said. "He played within himself. He didn't force the issue. He let the game come to him and I was really pleased with Dom's effort, especially in that second half."

The Buffs jumped out to an early lead in the first half, building the margin to as much as 11 midway through the period. But the Lobos refused to go away, staying in the game with 3-pointers, finally tying the game at 33-33 with 40 seconds to go.

Colorado regained the lead on Schwartz drive with 25 seconds to go, taking a 35-33 lead into the locker room at the half.

The Lobos hit six 3-pointers in the first half, but managed to connect on just 3 of 15 tries from beyond the arc after intermission.

for the first time in his young career. He made a strong season debut against Omaha. Schwartz registered career highs with 15 points and seven rebounds.

Junior guard **Deleon Brown** is averaging 3.7 points per game while shooting 36 percent from the field. He had four points, three rebounds and two steals against UIC. Sophomore forward **Alexander Strating** grabbed a personal-best six rebounds at Air Force. He had just eight rebounds in his previous eight career games. Strating appeared in just five games for a total of seven minutes as a redshirt freshman in 2017-18. This year, he has appeared in seven games, averaging 1.1 points and 1.7 rebounds in 6.4 minutes an outing.

Daylen Kountz and **Eli Parquet**, members of Colorado's 2018 signing class, have been gaining valuable early minutes. Kountz enjoyed his first collegiate double-figure scoring game with 11 points on 5 of 6 shooting at Air Force. He is second on the team in assists with 12 (1.5 apg). Parquet is averaging 2.0 points and has hit 4 of his 8 3-point attempts and is one of seven Buffs with at least two blocked shots.

ABOUT THE LOBOS: New Mexico is 4-3 overall having lost its last two. The Lobos return home for the first time in four outings and are 2-1 at The Pit. UNM averages 80.7 points while shooting 44 percent from the field. Defensively, New Mexico allows 86.1 points while allowing opponents to shoot 49 percent. The Lobos haven't allowed fewer than 75 points in a game this season.

Senior guard Anthony Mathis leads New Mexico in scoring at 14.0 points per game while shooting 46 percent from the floor. He's even better beyond the arc, hitting 47 percent (24-51). Sophomore forward Vance Jackson leads New Mexico in rebounds (7.1 rpg) while ranking second in scoring (12.9 ppg). Cory Manigault is New Mexico's third scorer in double figures at 12.8 per outing.

Paul Weir is in his second season as the head coach of New Mexico with a record of 23-18. He is in his third overall season as a collegiate head coach with a mark of 51-24.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be 15th meeting between Colorado and New Mexico with the series tied at seven games apiece. The Buffaloes won last season's meeting in Boulder, 75-57, on Dec. 6, snapping a three-game New Mexico win streak in the series. New Mexico holds a 3-2 edge in Albuquerque as the two teams meet at The Pit for the first time since a 106-65 Lobos win on Nov. 14, 2006.

Colorado has been at The Pit since that last meeting with the Lobos, however. The Buffaloes played in Albuquerque for the first and second rounds of the 2012 NCAA Tournament. No. 11 seed Colorado knocked off UNLV before falling to No. 3 Baylor in the second round.

Tad Boyle is 1-1 as a head coach against New Mexico. Paul Weir is 0-1 as a head coach against Colorado.

SECOND HALF SUCCESS: Colorado has scored at least 79 points in seven out of eight games and 80-plus in its last five, the latter the program's longest streak since Nov.-Dec. 2015, when it scored 80 in 10 straight (all wins).

Colorado's offensive numbers are in large part due to its second half success. The Buffaloes are averaging 49.2 points on 55.2 percent shooting from the field during the second half this season. Against Colorado State, the Buffaloes scored 57 second-half points, tying their season high for the most in any one half. Colorado has scored 50-plus points in the second half in five of eight games.

RARE TRIO-DOUBLE: Colorado had three players record dou-

OFFENSE SOARS AT AIR FORCE: Colorado's 93 points at Air Force was its most in a true road game since scoring 98 in a triple-overtime win at USC on Jan. 29, 2015. It was the most in regulation since a 104-95 loss at Texas on Feb. 9, 2002. The Buffaloes made 14 3-point field goals at Air Force (29 attempts), tying for the fifth-most in a single game in team history and matching their best-ever total on the road. Colorado also had 14 at New Mexico on March 15, 1995, in the Postseason NIT.

Wins over Air Force and Portland marked the first time the Buffaloes have scored 90 or more points in back-to-back games since Jan. 24 & 29, 2015 at home vs. Washington State (90-58) and at USC (98-94, 3OT). One season earlier was the last time the Buffaloes achieved that feat in a pair of regulation games: Nov. 16 & 18, 2013, vs. Jackson State (94-70) and Arkansas State (93-70).

NONCONFERENCE NUMBERS: Colorado is 83-27 (.755) in nonconference regular season games under head coach Tad Boyle including a mark of 36-10 (.783) over the past three-plus seasons. The Buffaloes were 8-4 during the non-league slate in 2017-18.

Colorado's best nonconference record under Boyle is 11-2, achieved twice. First in 2013-14 and then again in 2015-16. Both seasons ended with NCAA Tournament berths. Boyle also had an 11-win nonconference schedule in 2010-11, his first year at Colorado, as the Buffaloes were 11-4 before beginning their final season in the Big 12 Conference.

ROAD BUFFS: Colorado will play three true road games during the nonconference schedule in 2018-19, and potentially a fourth. After opening with two at home, Colorado played back-to-back at San Diego (Nov. 20) and Air Force (Nov. 24) and will head to New Mexico (Dec. 11).

Colorado is one of just 15 schools from the Power 5 and Big East Conferences to have at least three true road games scheduled before conference play. Stanford leads everyone with four.

If Colorado and Hawai'i have the same result in their respective first round games at the Diamond Head Classic, then the Buffaloes will meet the Warriors on their home floor and join Stanford with a fourth road game.

WRIGHT ALREADY MOVING UP IN CAREER ASSISTS: Sophomore McKinley Wright IV had 175 assists in 32 games as a freshman which not only set Colorado's freshman record for assists in a season but was the second-best overall season mark in team history since the category became an official statistic in 1974-75.

With three assists against Portland, he became the 28th player in team history to reach 200. He is currently 24th on CU's all-time list and three away from reaching the career Top 20.

Wright's 5.5 assists per game in 2017-18 ranked as the seventh-best single-season average in team history. His current pace, at 5.7 per game, would put him atop list for career average at Colorado. Billy Law currently holds that mark at 5.3 per game from 1990-92.

Wright has four double-figure assists games each resulting in points-assists double-doubles. His three points-assists double-doubles last year tied the school single-season record previously set by Jay Humphries (1982-83 and '83-84) and Toney Ellis (1976-77). Humphries holds the career mark in that category with six.

RIGHT AT HOME: Colorado has won 39 of its last 46 and 49 of 57 in the friendly confines of the CU Events Center. In the Tad Boyle era, Colorado is a sparkling 119-22 at the CU Events Center (.844). The Buffaloes are 432-173 (.714) all-time at the CEC. Colorado has won at least 10 games at home each of the last nine seasons.

FOR OPENERS: Colorado improved to 81-35 (.698) in all-time season openers, regardless of location. The Buffaloes are 7-2 under Boyle and 34-5 in overall season openers since the 1980-81 season. The Buffaloes are 92-24 all-time in home openers and have won their last 11, making Boyle a perfect 9-0 in home openers. The Buffaloes have won 16 of their last 17.

The Buffaloes' 100 points were their most in a season-opening game since a 113-89 win over Cal State Northridge on Nov. 23, 1990. It was Colorado's most points in regulation since defeating Oregon, 100-91, on Jan. 5, 2014. The Buffaloes scored 112 last season in a double-overtime win over South Dakota State.

Colorado shot 58.9 percent from the floor (33 for 56), its best mark since hitting 59.2 (29 for 49) against Arizona State on March 1, 2015. **LATE START? NOT REALLY:** While the majority of college basketball tipped off on Nov. 6, Colorado waited a full week to begin its season on Nov. 13. In fact, the Buffaloes were the last NCAA Division I team to officially tip off their season. There was no rhyme or reason to the later opening date, other than that's the way the Buffaloes' opponents and their open dates fell. Furthermore, Colorado plays three of its games between Dec. 22-25, at the Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu, when much of the country has wrapped up their nonconference schedule the previous week.

But is it really unique to start on that late of a calendar date? Not really. It fact, Colorado started one day later, Nov. 14, just four years ago, beginning with a 65-48 home win over Drexel to tip off the 2014-15 campaign. That season, the Buffaloes also played in the Diamond Head Tournament over the Christmas holiday.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado was 2-4 against ranked opponents last season highlighted by a sweep of No. 4 (AP)/6 (Coaches) Arizona State and No. 14/16 Arizona, January 4 & 6.

Colorado claimed wins over ranked teams in back-to-back outings for the first time since defeating #9 Missouri in Boulder and No. 21 Kansas State in Manhattan Jan 8 & 12, 2011. It's the first time in program history Colorado has defeated AP Top 15 teams in backto-back games

Colorado's thrilling 90-81 overtime win Arizona State snapped a three-game skid and was Colorado's highest AP ranked win since defeating No. 3 Texas, 93-80, in Boulder on Feb. 4, 2003.

Colorado's 17 wins over ranked opponents in Boyle's eight seasons is by far the best streak in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 17-32, have accounted for 28 percent of wins over ranked opponents (61) since 1949-50.

WALTON TO MISS 2018-19: Redshirt sophomore forward/center Dallas Walton will miss the 2018-19 season after suffering a torn ACL in his right knee in October, during a preseason practice session.

Walton averaged 5.7 points, 3.4 rebounds and 1.1 blocks in just under 19 minutes per game as a freshman in 2017-18. He led Colorado with 34 blocked shots, ranking 10th in the Pac-12 Conference. All but seven of his blocks came during conference play, ranking sixth in the league during that span (1.4 bpg).

Walton took a redshirt year in 2016-17 in part to continue his rehabilitation and strength training after experiencing two ACL tears in his left knee in a 10-month span during his junior year of high school

COLORADO, ASU TO MEET IN 2019 PAC-12 CHINA GAME: Colorado will play a nonconference game against Arizona State in China, in November 2019.

The Buffaloes and Sun Devils will meet in the fifth edition of the Pac-12 China Game presented by Alibaba Group. Longtime Pac-12 partner Federation of University Sports of China (FUSC), which operates under China's Ministry of Education, will serve as the co-host for the game.

The matchup between Colorado and Arizona State, tentatively scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 9 and for national broadcast in both the U.S. and China, will not count as a conference contest. The teams are slated to meet only once during the 2019-20 Pac-12 regular season as part of the league's annual 18-game rotation model.

This will be the first time the Pac-12 China game has featured two

conference teams. The previous editions, including this year's California-Yale contest, has had one Pac-12 team and one from another NCAA Division I conference.

The Pac-12 China Game is the flagship event of Pac-12 Global, designed to grow the global popularity of Pac-12 athletic programs and universities, fostering cultural exchange through sport, and creating unique educational experiences for Pac-12 student-athletes.

This will be the first intercollegiate regular season event for a Colorado Athletics program in China, or the Eastern Hemisphere for that matter. The Buffaloes have played in a handful of regular season events outside the United States. Both basketball programs have played in Puerto Rico; the men in 1998-99 and the women in 2005-06. Colorado's men's and women's golf teams have both competed Mexico and Puerto Rico, and the women will play a tournament in the Dominican Republic in March 2019.

Many Colorado student-athletes have taken advantage of out-ofseason foreign tours or World University Games competitions over the last couple of decades. Nine Buffaloes that would be on next year's roster in China were part of the team's preseason foreign tour to Italy in August 2017.

BUFFS SEVENTH IN PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to finish seventh in the annual Pac-12 Conference Preseason Media Poll.

The Buffaloes had 161 points, just behind Arizona State at 165. Oregon was picked to win the 2018-19 Pac-12 title with 288 points and 16 of 25 first place votes. UCLA was second (264) with six first place votes, Washington was third (249) with two first place votes. Arizona picked up the remaining first place vote and was picked fourth overall (205), just two votes ahead of USC.

Colorado returns nine letterwinners to a team that finished 17-15 and tied Arizona State for eighth place in the final 2017-18 Pac-12 standings at 8-10.



BOULDER — Colorado coach **Tad Boyle** had two directives for his Buffaloes in their season opener Tuesday night against Drake: play hard and play with confidence.

The Buffs did both, carving out a 100-71 win over the Bulldogs by utilizing hot shooting, balanced scoring and some solid defense. The 100 points was the most by CU in a season opener since a 113-89 win over Cal State-Northridge in 1990.

CU's effort showed up in the numbers: four players in double-figure scoring, 58.9 percent shooting (33-for-56) from the floor, a 44-29 rebounding edge, just 12 turnovers and 15 assists.

As for the confidence, "That's something you can't teach, you can't coach, but you want your players to have a little bit of swagger in terms of how they feel about themselves when they step on the floor," Boyle said. "You have to have that to be successful in college. You don't want it to be too much, but you want them to believe in what they've worked on over the summer and certainly through the fall. Overall I was pleased with the first game."

Senior Namon Wright led the Buffs, coming off the bench to finish with 25 points — his best effort as a Buff — along with eight rebounds. Sophomore McKinley Wright IV added 17 points and six assists, junior Shane Gatting scored 12 points and junior Lucas Siewert chipped in 11. Tyter Bey just missed a double-double, finishing with a career-high 14 rebounds and nine points.

Nick Norton led Drake with 18 points.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Bulldogs hit the Buffs early from the 3-point line with three treys in the first six minute and the first half featured eight lead changes before Colorado seized control with a 15-2 run over the last four minutes to take a 45-34 lead at the half.

"Early we got caught asleep a little bit," McKinley Wright said. "They hit two wide-open ones out the gate and we kind of talked about it in the timeout. We did a good job the rest of the way of running them off the 3-point line and making them go in the lane for tough twos."

Namon Wright, who was 5-for-8 from 3-point range, sparked the 15-2 run with seven points, including a 3-pointer. McKinley Wright added a pair of assists and four points in the surge, including a driving layup at the buzzer.

The Buffs then put the game away early in the second half. CU scored the first seven points of the half to bump its cushion to 52-35, and after a Drake timeout, the Buffs quickly bumped the edge into the 20s. Namon Wright had six points in the early surge and the Bulldogs never came closer than 17 again, with CU's big lead hitting 34.

"Having a good point guard, having good teammates, just being confident in shooting the ball when I'm open and just playing defense," Wright said of his game. "A few of the baskets I got from playing defense — getting in the lane or we were running in transition. We were just playing as a team and we were running when we got stops."

After hitting seven 3-pointers in the first half, the Bulldogs managed just four more after intermission.

"Overall we started contesting shots better in the second half," Boyle said. "You can't let a good 3-point shooting team get rhythm and get hot because then you've got your hands full. The 3-point line is a great equalizer in college basketball. We've got to understand that. There's some room for improvement there."

But Boyle also liked the killer instinct his team showed early in the second half, something that wasn't always present last season.

"That's something we lacked a lot last year," McKinley Wright said. "We'd have halftime leads and come out and let the team get right back in the game. This year, our focus is kind of put teams away when we have them down. I think we showed that tonicht now we have to keep them going."

BOULDER — Three nights after a runaway win in the season opener, Tad Boyle's Colorado Buffaloes found themselves in a nail-biter Friday night against visiting Omaha.

But with their backs to the wall, the Buffs came up with big plays down the stretch to wrap up a 79-75 win at the CU Events Center to improve to 2-0 while Omaha fell to 1-3.

"They found a way to win, they found a way to buck up and gets stops when they needed to get stops," Boyle said. No Colorado play was bigger than **Tyler Bey's** steal, layup and free throw with

No Colorado play was bigger than **Tyler Bey's** steal, layup and free throw with 29.9 seconds remaining that gave CU a 77-72 lead. Omaha answered with a Zach Jackson 3-pointer to close the gap to two with 17 seconds to go, but Colorado held on down the stretch, with **McKinley Wright IV** clinching the victory with two free throws with 7.4 second on the clock.

CU finished with five players in double-figure scoring, led by Bey and Lucas Siewert with 16 apiece. D'Shawn Schwartz added a career-high 15 points to go with a career-best seven rebounds, McKinley Wright added 13 points and Namon Wright chipped in 11.

The Buffs hurt themselves with 16 turnovers, which Omaha converted into 19 points. But the Buffs had a 36-27 edge on the boards and hit 19 of 23 free throw attempts while Omaha was 8-for-12 from the line.

HOW IT HAPPENED: After taking a 33-29 lead at intermission, Colorado threatened to take control with a 5-0 burst to open the second half. But the Mayericks responded with a 20-10 run to take a 59-58 lead, setting the stage for a see-saw final seven minutes in a game that featured 17 lead changes and 24 lies.

Colorado finally took the lead for good with 2:25 remaining when Siewert followed a **Deleon Brown** miss to give CU a 72-70 lead. But the Mavericks, who shot 53 percent from the field in the second half — including 6-for-10 from 3-point range — kept it close right down to the end.

"They came in and brought it to us," McKinley Wright said. "They gave us their best effort. We weren't great from the start but we found a way to dig it out. A win is a win. We'll take it."

Wright, playing against long-time friend and high school teammate JT Gibson, was not at his best. He had an uncharacteristic five turnovers — the Buffs finished with 16 — and was just 3-for-7 from the field.

But even on an ⁴off" night, Wright still had some game-deciding moments. He hit a huge bucket with 1:51 to go that gave the Buffs a 74-70 lead, then added his two clinching free throws in the final seconds.

Siewert, who had 11 points on 4-for-4 shooting in CU's 100-71 win over Drake, was 6-for-10 from the floor against the Mavericks, including 4-for-6 from 3-point range for his 16 points. Along with his putback that gave Colorado the lead for good in the final minutes, the CU junior had back-to-back 3-pointers early in the second half that helped end an 8-0 Mavericks run.

The Buffs seemed out of synch for much of the first half, particularly on the offensive end. Colorado had four turnovers in the first five minutes, which the Mavericks gladly converted into eight points en route to building an 11-6 lead.

CU finally found some offensive rhythm and put together a 7-0 run to take the lead, capped by a Siewert 3-pointer, only to hit another lull and allow the Mavs to momentarily regain a 22-21 edge with 7:42 to go in the half.

But two minutes later, the Buffs finally took the lead again when a Namon Wright basket gave CU a 26-24 lead. Bey added two baskets in the final two minutes — one fueled by a Brown steal and another off a nice pass down the lane from McKinley Wright — to give the Buffs a 33-29 edge at the half.

SAN DIEGO — Freshman Evan Battey scored a career-high 18 points and the Colorado Bulfaloes had their chances to collect an important road win Tuesday night, but the Bulfs fell short in the final minutes, dropping a 70-64 decision to San Diego.

The Buffs led at several junctures of the game, including 61-60 with just 1:56 to go after a pair of free throws from McKinley Wright IV.

But Colorado couldn't get a stop on the other end and the Toreros scored six straight points to regain control. A Shane Gatting 3-pointer with 22 seconds left pulled Colorado back to within two, 66-64, but USD hit four free throws in the final 20 seconds to put the game away.

Wright added 14 points to go with Battey's 18, but they were the only Colorado players in double figures. The Buffs hurt themselves by hitting just nine of their 15 free throw attempts, with two misses on the front end of one-and-one situations proving costly in the final four minutes. USD, meanwhile, hit 18 of 21 free throw tries, including eight straight in the final minute.

The biggest difference came in second-chance points. The Toreros outrebounded Colorado 41-35, including a 15-10 edge on the offensive boards. San Diego converted those offensive rebounds into 18 points.

CU was also slowed all night by foul trouble, with **Tyler Bey** missing most of the first half with two fouls and fouling out with his fifth in the final minute.

"We lost this game in two areas," head coach Tad Boyle said. "One I have to get better at as a coach, and that's our execution offensively. We have to execute better than we executed down the stretch. The area the players have to get better in is second shots. They shoot 36 percent, we shoot 42 percent, but they get 15 offensive rebounds... It was a game we could have won, I feel like we should have won, and our players feel like that. But the bottom line is we didn't win and we all have to take responsibility for that."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado trailed by five at intermission, 35-30, but put together a 12-0 run early in the second half to build a 45-37 lead. Battey had five points in the surge and Lucas Siewert added a 3-pointer.

But the Toreros slowly chipped away at the cushion by answering Colorado's run with a 17-6 surge that gave USD a 60-56 edge with just under five minutes to play. The run included a pair of San Diego buckets off of offensive rebounds, as well as a five-point possession.

Colorado answered with a 5-0 burst to take a 61-60 lead, with Wright scoring all five points. USD regained the edge on an Isaiah Pineiro dunk with 1:31 to go, and the Buffs then turned it over on their ensuing possession. Bey then fouled Pineiro — his fifth — with 58 seconds remaining and Pineiro hit two free throws to give USD a three-point lead.

Colorado then missed a pair of shots on its next possession and the Toreros put the game away at the free throw line in the final 30 seconds.

The Buffs were hampered by foul trouble for much of the first half, with starters Bey and **D'Shawn Schwartz** each playing just seven minutes before being tagged with their second fouls.

The Buffs managed to stay in the game thanks to nine first-half points from Battey, including a pair of 3-pointers. But Battey also drew his second foul with just under four minutes to play, and Lucas Siewert also had two fouls by the end of the half.

Colorado jumped out to a 6-0 lead, but the Toreros quickly came back and turned it into a see-saw game that saw seven ties and seven lead changes in the first half. With Battey, Bey and Schwartz on the bench with two fouls for Colorado, the Toreros scored the last five points of the half in the final minute to take a 35-30 lead at intermission.

USAFA, Colo. - On an afternoon when Colorado's leading scorer was held in check in the points column and its leading rebounder was forced to exit early with an injury, the Buffaloes went to their "go-to-player" - the open man.

Colorado shot nearly 60 percent from the field and four players scored in double figures as the Buffaloes sprinted to a 93-56 win over Air Force Saturday at Clune Arena

Junior forward Lucas Siewert tied a career-high with 17 points to lead four double-digit scorers as Colorado emphatically put an end to a six-game losing streak in true road contests that dated back to last season.

Colorado drilled a season-high 14 3-pointers, hitting 48 percent beyond the arc. Namon Wright had 13 points while D'Shawn Schwartz and Daylen Kountz each had 11.

Leading scorer McKinley Wright IV was held to five points, but dished out five assists and grabbed six rebounds. Tyler Bey played only seven minutes after taking a rough fall on his right shoulder on an alley oop attempt in the first half and did not return

Step up Siewert, and the rest of the Buffaloes whose depth took center stage "The go-to-guy on this team is the open man," Colorado head coach Tad Boyle said. "Some nights we're going to need McKinley to score for us and other nights he needs to distribute for us. He rebounded the ball well, especially when Tyler went out."

Siewert was a perfect 6 of 6 from the field, including three from 3-point range He also matched his personal best with eight rebounds.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Boyle implored his team to put the foot down on the gas pedal, and keep it there. Minus a brief lapse late in the first half, the Buffaloes did iust that.

Colorado came out firing from long range, making five of its first six 3-point attempts to build an early 17-4 lead in the first six minutes. Siewert made two of those, with another coming from Bey, the first of his career.

Colorado's first seven field goals were all 3-pointers. Air Force missed 13 of its first 16 shots, which allowed the Buffs to run. When they did, they moved the ball fast, and well, which led to open looks.

After the early success outside, the Buffaloes began to attack the paint. Evan Battey scored a pair of baskets on post moves and Kountz had a driving layup to give Colorado a 33-18 advantage.

The Falcons made a run toward the end of the first half, after the Buffs had cooled off. Air Force used an 8-0 run to trim CU's lead to seven at 33-26 with 1:31 left in the half.

McKinley Wright IV ended that run with a driving layup with just under a minute left. He finished off the half with a free throw and Colorado's was back up to double digits, 36-26.

Once the second half started, Colorado put down the gas pedal, and left it on for good. The Buffaloes opened on an 18-3 run and doing so at an incredibly efficient pace. Colorado missed its first field goal attempt of the period, but made its next 12 before its next miss.

Schwartz, who played limited minutes early with two quick fouls, began the run with five straight points. From there the floodgates opened. Colorado scored on six of its next seven possessions, culminating with a Siewert steal and coastto-coast dunk that gave Colorado its largest lead of the game at 55-29.

Gatling hit a pair of 3-pointers, his second capping off Colorado's string of 12-straight made field goals and gave the Buffaloes a 64-38 advantage with 10:19 remaining in the game. Colorado ended up shooting 73.3 percent in the second half (22-30) alone and totaled 18 assists on 34 baskets overall.

BOULDER — Colorado coach Tad Boyle is a firm believer that good defense eads to a productive offense

The Buffs (4-1) followed that recipe Wednesday night, breaking open a tight game in the second half to run away with a 93-69 win over Portland (5-4) at the CU Events Center, Junior Lucas Siewert scored 18 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for his first career double-double and McKinley Wright IV added 22 points and even rebounds for the Buffs.

The Buffs finished with five players in double figures, with Evan Battey (10 points, five rebounds), Tyler Bey (12 points, six rebounds) and Shane Gatling (11 points) joining Siewert and Wright. It was Wright's seventh career 20-point game, and the third time in five games thus far that the Buffs have surpassed the 90-point

Josh McSwiggan led Portland with 22 points.

Siewert scored 15 of his 18 points in the first half to keep the Buffs in what was a close game for the first 20 minutes. Wright scored 15 of his 22 after halftime, igniting a 16-1 run that broke open a 51-51- tie game and ultimately sparking a 28-4 surge that turned the game into a rout.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led by just three at the half, 39-36, after alowing the Pilots to shoot 48 percent from the field (15-for-31). That included a 10-for-14 stretch that led to a 20-7 Portland run that erased a 12-point CU lead.

But following a halftime talk from Boyle, the Buffs produced a much better effort on the defensive end in the second half, which in turn led to an offensive outburst that put the game away. Colorado broke away from a 51-51 tie with 14 ninutes to go with a 16-1 run, then built the lead to as much as 32 late in the game.

"I got after them pretty good at halftime and they responded in the second half," Boyle said. "One of the things we talked about at halftime is they have to take ownership of what we're trying to do defensively and I felt like they really did in the second half. It started with McKinley but it didn't end with McKinley. We got some eally good defensive possessions, broke the game open, and had a runaway."

Wright started the 16-1 run with a 3-pointer, then added a pair of free throws less than 30 seconds later. Bey added six points in the run and Namon Wright had four, including a steal and breakaway dunk.

"Vintage McKinley Wright," Boyle said. "He just says, 'OK guys, it's time to get this train moving,' and the train starts moving.

Fueling the run was a CU defensive effort that held the Pilots without a field goal for more than four minutes.

"Once we get stops, we get out in transition and that's when we're at our best," McKinley Wright said. "We're trying to focus on defense this year. We're one of the best teams in the country when we get out and run."

Colorado finished with a 25-11 edge in fast-break points while shooting 48.4 percent from the field (31-for-64) to go with a commanding 44-27 edge on the boards. The Pilots, meanwhile, shot just 37.5 percent from the field after halftime and finished 27-for-63 from the field.

Siewert continued to be a weapon inside and out, hitting two of his four 3-point ries to go along with three baskets inside and six free throws

The Buffs threatened to break the game open in the first half, going on a 15-3 un to take a 26-14 lead with just more than nine minutes to go in the period. Siewert, McKinley Wright and Deleon Brown all had 3-pointers in the surge

But just when it looked like the Buffs might blow the game open, their defense vent south. The Pilots battled back with a 20-7 run to take a 34-33 lead with just under two minutes to go, hitting 10 of 14 field goal attempts in the burst.

Colorado finally recovered to regain the lead and take a 39-36 edge at interission

BOULDER - Big plays on both ends of the floor made the difference for Colorado down the stretch Saturday, as the Buffs fought back to collect an 86-80 win over rival Colorado State at the CU Events Center.

Colorado improved to 5-1 while CSU fell to 4-4 as CU ended a two-game losing streak to the Rams.

In a see-saw game that featured 12 lead changes and four ties, the Buffs found themselves down by one when a 10-0 CSU run gave Colorado State a 75-74 lead with 2:26 to play.

But the Buffs answered with a 3-point play from Evan Battey seconds later to regain the lead, then produced a decisive sequence to put the game away in the final two minutes. It included drawing an offensive foul on the defensive end,

a breakaway slam dunk from Shane Gatling for a four-point lead after Lucas Siewert rebound, a huge block from Tyler Bey on the defensive end, and six consecutive free throws from Bey in the final 23 seconds.

"At the end of games, especially games like tonight, players make plays," CU head coach Tad Boyle said. "I can call the plays, CSU can call their plays, but the players who make the plays is the team that wins the game."

The Buffs had their fair share of players doing just that.

Bey was one of three Buffs with a double-double, scoring 21 of his career-high 23 points in the second half as well as grabbing seven of his 10 rebounds after intermission. McKinley Wright IV recorded an 18-point, 11-assist double-double and Siewert had a 16-point, 10-rebound effort for Colorado. Gatling finished with 13 points to give the Buffs four players in double-digit scoring while Battey added seven points, five rebounds and a pair of big second-half assists.

The Rams also had four players in double figures, led by Kris Martin with 21 points and J.D. Paige with 17.

The Buffs won despite Colorado State shooting 51.7 percent from the field (30-for-58). CU overcame a cold-shooting first half to shoot 61 percent in the second half (21-for-34), including a stretch in which the Buffs hit 12 field goal tries in a row

The Buffs also had a 40-29 edge on the boards.

HOW IT HAPPENED: After trailing for much of the first half and early in the second, Colorado finally regained the lead with a stretch that saw the Buffs hit 12 consecutive field goal tries. CU put together a 10-2 run that turned a 41-40 deficit into a 50-43 lead, with Wright starting the run with a 12-foot jumper before Siewert and Bey each added four points.

Colorado State came back several times to narrow CU's cushion, but each time Colorado answered. The Buffs finally built their lead to 10 points. 67-57, with 7:16 to go on a Gatling 3-pointer and Bey slam dunk.

But the Rams had one more rally in their pocket. A J.D. Paige drive threepoint play cut Colorado's lead to two, 74-72, with three minutes to play before a 3-pointer from Anthony Mastinton-Bonner capped a 10-0 run to give the Rams a 75-74 lead with 2:23 remaining.

That set the stage for the final two minutes, with Battey's drive to the hoop past CSU big man Niko Carvacho and ensuing free throw giving the Buffs the lead . for good.

The Buffs struggled from the floor for the entire first half while the Rams had no such issues. Colorado shot just 33 percent, hitting 12 of its 36 field goal tries - including 3-for-14 from 3-point range - while the Rams hit 50 percent of their shots, going 13-for-26 and 5-for-11 from beyond the arc.

As a result, the Buffs trailed for most of the half and entered the locker room down by three, 32-29, at intermission.

BOULDER - Every night, it seems, Tad Boyle's Colorado Buffaloes turn to a different weapon, as CU has had six different players lead the team in scoring in seven games.

Tuesday night, it was redshirt freshman Evan Battey and sophomore D'Shawn Schwartz with the honors, as both tossed in a team-high 14 points in an 82-58 win over South Dakota at the CU Events Center.

The win, Colorado's fourth in a row, improved the Buffs to 6-1 while South Dakota fell to 4-4. It was CU's fourth straight game with at least 80 points and fifth in seven outings this season, as five Buffs hit double-figure scoring.

Tyler Bey added 13 points and seven rebounds to CU's totals while McKinley Wright had 11 points, six rebounds and five assists, and Shane Gatling finished with 11 points.

The Buffs continued their smooth-shooting ways, hitting 48 percent of their field goals (26-for-54), while also producing a 41-33 edge on the boards. CU also held the Coyotes to just 34 percent shooting shooting from the field (19-for-56), and nine different Buffs finished with at least 10 minutes of plaving time

Battey, who continues to shake the rust from his game after a two-year layoff from competitive play, also had four assists - all in the first half - and four rebounds

"When we start hitting on all cylinders, this is a dangerous team." Boyle said. "We just have to understand that on any given night it might be someone else's night. We have to be OK with that. If we are, then we will be OK."

Tyler Peterson led the Coyotes with 15 points.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs never trailed in the game, and built a 10-point lead midway through the first half before the Coyotes cut the margin back to five. Colorado, though, finished the half with an 18-10 surge, with Battey getting three assists in the run. The first went to Schwartz, who delivered a ferocious dunk, the second went to Lucas Siewert for a layup, and the third went to Gatling on the wing for a 3-pointer.

"I've always been a good passer and they know that," Battey said. "They cut, they space out so I can hit them.

After taking a 13-point lead into intermission, 41-28, the Buffs quickly blew the game open in the first three minutes of the second half. CU bumped the lead to 49-30 in the first two minutes of the period, then pushed the cushion into the 20s on a pair of baskets from Bey after a South Dakota timeout did nothing to halt Colorado's run. CU led 53-32 with 16:45 still to play, and the Buffs' cushion never dipped below 20 again the rest of the night.

Maybe the only blemish on Colorado's night was 13 turnovers, with nine of those coming in the first half. But the Buffs reduced their mistakes in the second half while also ratcheting up the defensive pressure, including a stretch in which they limited South Dakota to just 1-for-8 shooting.

Boyle was particularly pleased with CU's defensive effort. The Buffs, who allowed Colorado State to shoot better than 50 percent from the field in last weekend's 86-80 Colorado win, entered the game 10th in the Pac-12 in field goal defense.

The Coyotes had no such luck, hitting just 19 of their 56 field goal tries. South Dakota did not make consecutive field goal attempts until less than four minutes remained in the game, and the Coyotes missed 17 straight 3-point tries after hitting three of their first five

BOULDER - While Colorado's defense may not have been at its best Saturday afternoon, McKinley Wright IV was, particularly down the stretch.

That was enough for the Buffs. The sophomore point guard scored CU's final 10 points of the game, including all eight in a decisive 8-0 CU run, to lift the Buffs to an 84-72 win over Illinois-Chicago.

Colorado won its fifth straight to improve to 7-1 while UIC dropped to 4-6. CU also surpassed the 80-point barrier for the fifth straight time and sixth time this season

Wright finished with 21 points, nine assists and six rebounds. Sophomore forward Tyler Bey collected his second double-double of the year with a 15-point, 15-rebound effort (a career high), and Shane Gatling and D'Shawn Schwartz each scored 12 for Colorado.

Marcus Ottev led the Flames with 22 points, as UIC shot 56.6 percent from the field (30-for-53). A big difference came at the free throw line, where Colorado hit 25 of 33 attempts while UIC was 6-for-10 from the stripe.

The Buffs finished with 16 turnovers, but forced 24 UIC miscues, which Colorado converted into 20 points. The Buffs also scored 50 points in the second half, the fifth time this season they have scored at least 50 after intermission.

"That was a hard-fought win against a really talented UIC team," head coach Tad Boyle said, "We have a lot of room for improvement after a game like this, but we'll take

HOW IT HAPPENED: Wright's run started after UIC's Godwin Boahen hit a 3-pointer to pull the Flames within four, 74-70, with just more than three minutes to play.

Wright hit two free throws at the 2:20 mark to bump CU's margin to six, then hit a basket in the lane after a steal 20 seconds later. He drew an offensive foul on UIC's next possession and followed it up with another basket to give CU a 10-point cushion with 1:35 to play.

Wright also had a key rebound in the final minute, hit two free throws with 40 seconds left to give Colorado a 12-point cushion, and then iced the game with two more free throws with 30 seconds remaining.

"He's just a winner," Boyle said. "He makes winning plays. We expect so much of him and he just makes big plays down the stretch."

The Buffs never trailed in the game, and led for nearly 38 of the 40 minutes. But every time Colorado threatened to build a comfortable cushion, the hot-shooting Flames had an answer. CU led by five at the half, had 10-point leads at several junctures after intermission, and pushed the lead to 11 with 4:33 to go.

But the Buffs could not put the game away until the final two minutes. It was the second time in a week that the Buffs allowed an opponent to shoot better than 50 percent from the field, as CSU also managed the feat in an 86-80 Colorado win on Dec. 1

"It seems like they couldn't miss," Wright said. "We have to do a better job of helping each other and having each other's back. We'll watch film and get better."

Colorado did do a good job on UIC leading scorer Tarkus Ferguson, holding him to just three points, 14 under his average. But along with Ottey's 22 - most of which came on drives to the rim — the Flames also got 20 from Jordan Blount and 15 from Boahen. The Flames did most of their damage in the paint, outscoring Colorado 42-30 near the rim.

Still, the Buffs made plays when necessary. CU held a solid 36-28 edge on the boards, which helped the Buffs to a 16-2 edge in second-chance points. Four of Bey's 15 rebounds were on the offensive end, and he finished with 33 minutes, 16 seconds of playing time, also a career high.
