## Post-game Notes:

- The Lobos had three 20-point scorers in Saturday's game: Senior Corey Manigault (28), redshirt-junior Zane Martin (23) and redshirt-junior Vance Jackson.
  - The last time UNM had three 20-point scorers was a season ago vs. NM State on Nov.
    17, 2018: Jackson (27), Anthony Mathis (22) and Manigault (20).
  - Manigault and Martin hit the double-digit mark in the first half, Manigault with 14 and Martin with 10.
- Redshirt-junior Keith McGee also hit the double-figure mark with 13 points on the day.
- The game marks Manigault's sixth-straight double-digit game and McGee's fifth-straight.
- Manigault's 28 points marks a new career high. His previous career high was set on Nov. 16,
  2019 vs. McNeese where he recorded 24 points.
  - Manigault also registered a new career high in assists with four. His previous career high was three against Iona on Nov. 13, 2018.
- Martin's 23 points tied his UNM career high which was set on Jan. 25, 2020 vs. Nevada.
- McGee collected six rebounds during the game to mark a new career high at UNM. His previous career high was five (done twice), last vs San José State on Feb. 26, 2019.
- The Lobos held their largest lead of the game at 6:31 in the second half, holding a 29-point advantage over the Cowboys with a score of 82-53 en route to the 29-point final.
- The Lobos outrebounded Wyoming 46-27 for the largest Lobo rebound margin of the season (19).
  - UNM recorded 18 second-chance points off of 13 offensive boards while Wyoming had just six off of four offensive rebounds.
- The Lobos led in bench points with 19 compared to the Cowboys' seven.
- UNM also held the advantage in assists (18-13) and steals (7-4).
- UNM registered 12 threes on the evening marking just the fifth time this season that the Lobos have registered 10 or more from deep, the fourth time in the last six contests.
