- New Mexico leads the series 61-23 with a 35-2 advantage in The Pit
- The Lobos are now 12-0 at home this year tying their best home record since the 2005-06 season. If the Lobos extend the winning streak to 13 games, they will be closing in on the 1998-99 season in which they went 16-0 in The Pit before falling to Utah 39-57 on February 1, 1999.

Post-game Notes:

- Five Lobos finished in double figures including: redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle (20), redshirt-junior Zane Martin (18), senior Corey Manigault (16), redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg (11), redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix (10)
 - Lyle has finished with over 20 points six times this season and has only missed hitting double figures in three games on the year.
 - Zane Martin came one point shy of tying his previous UNM career high in scoring. He scored 19 against Houston Baptist on December 12, 2019. Saturday's game marks the ninth time on the season that Martin has reached the double-digit mark.
 - Manigault's 16-point effort included his third career three-point basket and marked his best offensive performance since the start of conference play.
 - Saturday's game marks the sixth time this season five or more Lobos have finished in double figures.
- Makuach Maluach lead the team in rebounding with a season-high-tying eight boards. He has collected eight or more rebounds in three games this season.
- Corey Manigault tied his UNM career high in blocks with three. The last time Manigault blocked three shots was against Eastern New Mexico on November 6, 2019.
- New Mexico set a new team high on the season in blocks with eight.
 - The Lobos previously blocked seven shots against Eastern New Mexico on November 6, 2019.
- The Lobos' defense held the Falcons leading scorer #34 Ryan Swan to 10 points on the night, nearly five below his season average (14.6) and over nine points below his MW average (19.3).
- Despite averaging 41.5 percent beyond the arc on the year, New Mexico's defense held the Falcons to the just 28.6 percent from 3-point range (8-28).
 - o Air Force didn't make a shot from three until 13:10 to go in the first half.
- The Lobos made 18 free throws to the Falcons 10. The Lobos are now 14-2 overall and 4-1 in the Mountain West when making more free throws than their opponent.
- UNM held the lead for 30:19, more than seven times longer than Air Force.
