Postgame interviews will be conducted in the weight room in Cashell Fieldhouse. Coach Norvell will be available to media after the NCAA's 10-minute cooling off period, followed by selected student-athletes.

#### ROAD GAMES

Norvell and selected student-athletes will be available in the designated visiting media interview area after the cooling off period.

#### MEDIA WORK AREA

The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, ethernet and phone lines available during the game and up to one and half hours after the conclusion of each game. The postgame interview area in Cashell Fieldhouse is similarly equipped. Media may work in either location but are asked to work in the Cashell location if working more than 90 minutes post-game. The Mackay press box will also serve as a game and media operations location post-game so the Cashell location will likely be a quieter work environment after the conclusion of the press conference.

#### THE GRITIRON LUNCHEON

Nevada head coach Jay Norvell and selected players will be available at the Wolf Pack's Gritiron luncheon. Three luncheons will take place throughout the season; Monday, Sept. 16, Monday, Oct. 14 and Monday, Nov. 18 all held at the Basin Street Club at Mackay Stadium. Doors open at 11:30 a.m. and the cost is \$20. This luncheon is open to the media and general public.

Media parking permits for gameday are available via the Nevada Communications Office are generally for level two of the West Stadium Parking Complex. Local television satellite trucks have designated parking near the main (southwest) entrance to the stadium. These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.

#### CLEAR BAG POLICY

The University of Nevada, in an effort to provide a safer environment for the public and to expedite entry into the athletic venues, has implemented a new policy limiting the size and type of bag allowed for all events.

## Approved Bags:

- Clear plastic, vinyl, or PVC tote bags that do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"
  - One-gallon clear plastic storage bags
- Small Clutch Purses 4.5" X 6.5" or smaller

Exceptions: An exception will be made for medically necessary items and diaper bags after proper inspection. These bags will be tagged to inform venue security that the bag has been cleared by the gate inspection member and to limit any disturbance to the patron once inside the stadium. Accredited media may bring bags for working purposes into the facility but must enter at the press box elevator or gate 2 on the west side of the stadium and make bags available for search.





## HEAD COACH JAY NORVELL (@CoachJayNorvell)





Jay Norvell, an innovative offensive mind and former All-Big Ten defensive back as a player, is in his third season as the head coach of the Nevada Wolf Pack football team after producing one of the top turn-around seasons in the history of the program and one of the best in the country during the 2018 campaign.

Norvell guided the Wolf Pack to and 8-5 overall mark in 2018 and produced what had only been done five other times in school history: — winning a bowl game. Nevada put a cap on a memorable season with a 16-13 come-from-behind overtime victory in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl to beat Arkansas State. The dramatic win gave Nevada a plus-five improvement on the win total from 2017 to 2018 and showed that the foundation laid in Norvell's first year has the program poised for greater heights.

In 2018, Norvell also saw 10 Nevada players honored by the league's postseason awards, the second most in school history. That group was highlighted by the Pack's first-ever "Of The Year" winner as running back Toa Taua was named's the conference's Freshman of the Year after a breakout campaign. Defensive end Korey Rush and linebacker Malik Reed were named First Team All-Mountain West and seven other players were honored by the league.

With another strong recruiting class entering in 2019, Norvell has the Pack headed to new heights in the Mountain West.

In year one, Norvell established a foundation for his vision of the program, installing new systems on offense, defense and special teams. The foundation was cemented in the final game of the season as Norvell led the Wolf Pack to a 23-16 victory over UNLV in the Battle of the Fremont Cannon to retain possession of the Fremont Cannon.

Overall, the record was 3-9 with three of the Pack's losses coming by an average of just four points. Norvell's first career victory as a head coach came at Mackay Stadium on Oct. 7, 2017 when the Pack topped Hawai` i 35-21. That victory launched a seven-game stretch where Nevada closed the 2017 season scoring more than 34 points per game and capturing three victories.

The laying of the foundation for Norvell's program including overhauls in all three phases of the game. An entirely new coaching staff installed a version of the Air Raid system on offense that includes a power run facet and the attacking 3-3-5 stack defensive scheme.

The building season was then punctuated in three notable ways:

- Eight Wolf Pack players were named to the All-Mountain West teams including first-teamers Austin Corbett and Malik Reed.
- Norvell and his staff then brought in one of the top recruiting classes in the Mountain West, signing 16 in the new early signing period and adding nine more in February for a 25-player class that could be one of the best in school history.
- The Pack saw Corbett become the second-highest draft pick in school history when Cleveland selected the local product with the 33rd overall pick in the NFL Draft.

Norvell was hired as the 26th head football coach in Nevada program history on Dec. 9, 2016, ushering in a new era of Wolf Pack football.

The appointment marked the first head coaching tenure for Norvell, but he arrived at Nevada well versed in the game of football, bringing a resume at the time that included a 31-year coaching career that spans college football's top levels and the National Football League. Norvell, 53, has coached in both the BCS National Championship Game with the Oklahoma Sooners and Super Bowl XXXVII with the Oklahoma Raiders.

Throughout his three decades of coaching, he has stops at lowa, Northern Iowa, Wisconsin, Iowa State, the Indianapolis Colts, the Oakland Raiders, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas, UCLA, and most recently, Arizona State.

An All-Big 10 defensive back during a stellar playing career at lowa, Norvell has made his coaching mark on the other side of the ball, coordinating offensive schematics while at Oklahoma, Texas and Arizona State. He's tutored a number of top players, including NFL wide receivers Kenny Stills, Sterling Shepard and Marvin Harrison as well Ryan Broyles, who left Oklahoma as the NCAA's all-time receptions leader.

Throughout his career Norvell has had a hand in postseason football as well with 14 bowl game appearances, including the 2009 National Championship, four NFL playoff games and the Super Bowl appearance.

A 1986 graduate of lowa, Norvell was an All-Big Ten defensive back and recorded a league-high seven interceptions in 1985 as he helped the Hawkeyes put together a 10-2 record, a conference championship and a spot in the Rose Bowl. He was a member of the Chicago Bears in 1987 before he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater.

Norvell, who hails from Madison, Wis., has a wife, Kim, and son, Jaden. He is the author of a book, "Complete Wide Receiver," which was published in 2012.

### **LAST TIME THEY MET**

These two teams met back in November of 2016 in Albuquerque where the Lobos pulled out a 35-26 victory over the Wolf Pack.

New Mexico QB Austin Apodaca accounted for two second-half touchdowns to help the Lobos. Apodaca hit Emmanuel Harris for a 44-yard touchdown in the third quarter and followed that up with a 4-yard run in the fourth quarter to seal the game.

And New Mexico came out strong after the extended break, scoring two quick touchdowns.

The Wolf Pack rallied for two scores of their own, but missed on an extra point, and failed on a 2-point try that would have tied it at 28-all midway through the fourth quarter.

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

The Wolf Pack has won three of its four games in Mackay Stadium this season, boasting a 3-1 record after defeating Purdue 34-31, Weber State 19-13 and San Jose State 41-38. The Wolf Pack accumulated over 400 yards off offense in each of those wins.

#### **HOT START**

Nevada's 3-1 finish in nonconference play put it off to its best start since the 2014 season when it also began with the same record.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

Nevada has suffered back-to-back losses for the first time all year after two tough road contests at Utah State and Wyoming. However, Nevada will look to get back on track this Saturday as it returns home to Mackay Stadium, where it is 3-1 this season, to face New Mexico. Against the Cowboys, Brandon Talton drilled his 14th field goal of the season for Nevada's only points on the afternoon. Defensive back Berdale Robins recorded his second interceptions in as many games, ensuring that Nevada has recorded at least one takeaway in 12 of its last 13 games.

## **DANCES WITH WOLVES**

New Mexico will enter Mackay Stadium on Saturday night with a sense of urgency as they currently sit 0-4 in Mountain West play, being outscored 135-83 in four MW games. Over the course of the season, New Mexico has averaged 25 points per game while giving up 37 per game. The Lobos have put in a lot of their work on the ground, rushing for 1,693 yards this season led by Ahmari Davis, who has accumulated 743 on 123 attempts and six touchdowns. Davis is averaging over 106 per game this season. On defense, Alex Hart leads the team with 55 tackles while Jacobi Hearn leads the Lobos with six sacks. In terms of taking the ball away, the Lobos have only recorded two interceptions but five fumble recoveries.

## **NEVADA VS THE LOBOS**

Things have been dead even between these two schools, having only met seven times in the past with an all-time series record of 3-3-1. Nevada has never lost at home to the Lobos, holding a 2-0-1 record in Mackay Stadium.

#### **OUARTERBACK CAROUSEL**

After Malik Henry earned the start against San Jose State, Nevada has now started three different quarterbacks this season in eight contests. Carson Strong has started five, Malik Henry has started two and Cristian Solano has started one.

Strong was named the starting QB for week one midway through fall camp and led the Nevada offense against Purdue, making him the first freshman since Mo Jones in 1998 to get the nod under center in week one. Strong dazzled in his debut, completing 30-of-51 passes for 295 yards and three touchdowns, including orchestrating a game-tying and game-winning drive in a come-from-behind victory over Purdue to open the season. He threw for a career-high 299 yards against Weber State, making him 2-0 in Mackay Stadium to start his career before losing at home to Hawai'i.

To close the nonconference season at UTEP, Solano earned his second-career start and led Nevada to a 37-21 victory. In the contest, Solano threw for 182 yards and two touchdowns while leading the team with 100 rushing yards, the first Wolf Pack player to break the century mark this season.

Henry put teams on notice with his first FBS start against the Spartans, throwing for 352 yards and one touchdown that came on the first play of the second half as he found Romeo Doubs down the sideline for a 75-yard score. Of Henry's 22 completions, he spread the ball around to nine different receivers on the afternoon. Henry is now 1-1 in his career after orchastrating a 41-38 victory over San Jose State, but falling at Utah State this past Saturday.

#### **STOUT RUN DEFENSE**

The Nevada run defense has been dominant this season, ranking 54th in the nation only allowing 149.6 rushing yards per game. Against San Jose State, it only allowed 15 yards for a season best.

## (DOM)INANT

Dom Peterson has proven to be one of the Pack's most productive defensive linemen in 2019, as he is the team leader with four sacks and seven tackles for loss on the year. He also anchors a defensive line that ranks 54th in the nation in rushing yards allowed, only surrendering 149.1 per game.

## "TYSON'S PUNCH-OUT"

Tyson Williams has been a wrecking ball as a starter at safety for the Wolf Pack this season, as he leads the team with 47 tackles on the season and has one tackle for loss. He recorded his first-career interception at UTEP and ran it back an extra 14 yards.

#### **COOKIE MONSTER**

Elijah Cooks has been Nevada's most productive receiver this season, leading the Wolf Pack with four touchdowns and 424 yards on 36 receptions. Cooks has caught a pass in all seven games this season and has caught at least four in six of them. Nevada is 3-0 this season when Cooks records six or more receptions.

Cooks played a huge role in Nevada's season-opening victory, hauling in a career-high seven receptions for 60 yards and tying his single-game best with two touchdowns. The first was a leaping acrobatic catch midway through the third quarter for Nevada's second score of the game, while the biggest of his career came with 52 seconds left in regulation to tie the game against the Boilermakers.

#### **VAST IMPROVEMENT**

In his second season at the helm of the program, Jay Norvell turned the Wolf Pack around in a big way. Nevada went from three wins in 2017 to eight wins in 2018, the most it had won since joining the Mountain West. To put it in perspective, Nevada improved by 4.5 games in 2018 to rank as the seventh-best improvement mark in the NCAA. The Pack posted a 5-3 conference record as well to finish second in the West Division. Norvell and the rest of the team capped off the year with a thrilling come-from-behind overtime victory in the 2018 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl, the program's sixth bowl win.





Now in his third season, Norvell has already led Nevada to its second-ever Big Ten victory with a season-opening victory against Purdue and a 3-1 record against nonconference opponents to open the year, its best record to open a season since 2014.

#### **CLUTCH GENE**

In its four wins this season, Nevada has been near perfect in the final quarter of those games, outscoring its opponents 43-10.

## **GIVE THEM SOMETHING TO TALTON 'BOUT**

True freshman kicker Brandon Talton has quickly become a household name among Wolf Pack fans, as he has begun his career 14-for-16 on field goals this season. Talton is one of 11 kickers this season to make 14 field goals. His 1.75 field goals per game rank 11th in the NCAA and first in the Mountain West. His four field goals against Weber State were the most by a Nevada kicker since 2008 when Brett Jaekle accomplished the feat.

Talton drilled the third-longest field goal in program history with three seconds left against Purdue in the season opener to complete a 17-point second-half comeback. His 56-yarder was one of two made on the day, as he also drilled a 34-yard field goal in the third quarter. The 56-yard kick was the fourth-longest in Mountain West history and the longest ever hit by a MW freshman. Talton was awarded a scholarship after the game thanks to his heroics. Talton was also named the Mountain West Co-Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts in week one. Talton was also named the MW STPOW following that Weber State win and also after defeating San Jose State with a game-winning 40-yard field goal as time expired.

### **COMEBACK KIDS**

Nevada rallied from a 17-point deficit midway through the third quarter of its game against Purdue to stun the Boilermakers and tie the second-largest comeback in Nevada history since 1996. The Wolf Pack's other 17-point comeback was during the Miracle at Mackay, when it came back to defeat No. 3 Boise State in overtime.

Nevada also trailed against Weber State 10-9 at the half, before limiting the Wildcats to three second-half points in a 19-13 Wolf Pack win.

#### **TURNOVER TOWEL**

Now in year three of the 3-3-5 stack defense under coordinator Jeff Casteel, the Wolf Pack has emerged as a ball-hawking defense. In 2018, Nevada ranked fourth in takeaways within the Mountain West Conference. Through eight games in 2019, Nevada is 15th in the nation, and third in the MW, with 16 takeaways. The Pack's six fumbles recovered so far this season is 32nd in the nation and the nine interceptions – three by senior cornerback Daniel Brown – is 15th nationally and second in the Mountain West.

Going into this week's game against New Mexico, Nevada has taken the ball away in 11 of its last 12 games, with its nine-game streak being snapped at Hawai'i. In that stretch, Nevada is

Nevada senior punter Quinton Conaway has made a name for himself as he enters his final season with the Wolf Pack. Conaway recorded a career year in 2018 and has begun scattering his name throughout the Nevada record book. Additionally, Conaway has posted strong academics during his time at Nevada as he was selected to the Google Cloud Academic All-District team last season.

Conaway is currently 55th in the nation averaging 42.1 yards per punt. He is also firmly cemented in the Nevada record books, while continuing to work his way up. Following Nevada's win over Weber State, Conaway moved up to sixth all time in career punting yards with the Wolf Pack and then moved into fifth after his game at Utah State.

#### **TAUA OF POWER**

The reigning Mountain West Freshman of the Year has picked up right where he left off. On the year, Toa Taua leads Nevada with 534 yards on 126 rushing attempts and four touchdowns. On the Wolf Pack's final drive against Weber State that iced the game, Taua eclipsed the 1,000 yard rushing mark for his career after totaling a season-high 85 against the Wildcats, and has now totaled 1,385 for his career.

Taua had a career day against San Jose State, rushing for 160 yards on a career-high 34 carries and a touchdown. On the game's final drive to get Nevada into field goal position, Taua amassed 33 yards on the group to set up Talton for the game-winning field goal.

## **BROTHERLY LOVE**

After earning a new role in the offseason to coach the Pack's running backs this year, assistant coach Vai Taua is now the only coach in the FBS to be coaching his brother, sophomore back Toa Taua. The Taua's are becoming a household name with Wolf Pack fans as Toa became Nevada's first of the year' award winner since joining the Mountain West, notching the conference's freshman of the year honor. Vai on the other hand has his name scattered throughout the Nevada record book, ranking second all-time in rushing yards and fourth in rushing touchdowns.

#### **DEGREES COMPLETED**

A total of 10 Nevada football student-athletes have already obtained a college degree prior to the start of the 2019 season, with one player earning two degrees. That number ranks in the top 20 in the nation. SMU leads the way with 22 players having already earned a bachelor's degree.

#### **TEAM CAPTAINS**

Last season, Coach Norvell and his program chose three captains to lead the team, one from each unit of offense, defense and special teams. This year, Coach Norvell and the Wolf Pack have selected four team captains to lead the squad into 2019. The four team captains are seniors Kelton Moore, Kaleb Fossum, Hausia Sekona and Lucas Weber.

## **LOCK-DOWN BROWN**

Nevada cornerback Daniel Brown has cemented himself as one of the top defensive backs in the conference, as he is currently tied for 16th in the FBS with three interceptions this season. Brown has recorded three of Nevada's picks this season, as they are ranked 15th in the nation with nine picks. Two of his interceptions came in the season-opener against Purdue, the second with under a minute remaining in regulation that set up the game-winning field goal for the Pack. His third came against Weber State.

## SCHOLARSHIP ALERT

There were not as many scholarships to award as there typically has been in the past, but one member of the Wolf Pack did hear his name called during fall camp. Junior offensive lineman Nathan Edwards, a local product out of Galena High School, was offered a scholarship midway through camp. Edwards is projected to become more of a force with The Union and get the start at center in week one against Purdue. True freshman placekicker Brandon Talton was also awarded a scholarship recently, as Coach Norvell put him on scholarship after his gamewinning 56-yard field goal against Purdue in week one.

### **NARBONNE HIGH SCHOOL**

Three members of the Wolf Pack hail from Narbonne High School, including Dom Peterson, Daniel Brown and Lawson Hall.

## **VOICES OF THE PACK**

For the 2019 season there will be no change to the voices of the Wolf Pack, as John Ramey and Mike Edwards return for year three behind the mic. Ramey will handle the play-by-play duties, while Edwards will serve as the broadcast's color analyst.

Ramey joined the Wolf Pack Radio Network after seven seasons with UCLA, calling baseball, men's and women's soccer and select men's and women's basketball games. Edwards, a Nevada Hall of Fame inductee in 2018, was a two-time first team All-Big West Conference performer as a member of the Union in the 1990s.

## **PROGRAM HISTORY**

Nevada is in its 113th season of collegiate football, seeking win No. 556 in the program's strong history. The Wolf Pack sports an all-time record of 555-492-33 (.549). Since joining the FBS in 1992, Nevada is 179-156 overall and 115-85 in conference play.

### **NEVADA TABBED FOR THIRD PLACE FINISH IN WEST DIVISION**

The conference coaches voted Nevada to finish third in the Mountain West's West Division in the preseason All-MW poll. The Wolf Pack earned 74 points, finishing ahead of Hawai'i, UNLV and San José State. Reigning conference champions Fresno State earned 17 first place votes and 122 points overall to lead the West Division. San Diego State garnered three first place votes and was picked to finish in the runner-up spot. Boise State earned 15 first place votes and was predicted to finish first in the Mountain Division ahead of Utah State.

## **WOLF PACK RADIO COVERS THE SILVER STATE**

The Wolf Pack Radio Network has additional affiliates throughout the state with a 60 minute football pre-game show this season. 

RENO, Nev. (AP) - When Nevada quarterback Carson Strong and kicker Brandon Talton attended high school in Vacaville, Calif., neither paid too close attention to each other.

But last year, when they met up in Vacaville at a football game, Strong pitched Nevada to Talton.

A year later on Friday, Strong got his first start at Nevada, and he would not have won without Talton kicking a 56-yard field as time expired, booting the Wolf Pack to a 34-31 victory over Purdue and capping a 17-point comeback for the second win in program history against a Big Ten school.

Talton, a walk-on playing his first collegiate game Friday, said his previous long in a game was 47 yards.

Strong got the nod as starter about two weeks ago and became the first freshman quarterback to start a season opener for Nevada since 1998.

Strong hadn't started a football game since 2017. He sat out his senior year at Wood High in Vacaville and again last year as a redshirt. He completed 30 of 51 passes for 295 yards and 3 touchdowns.

Nevada went into the break trailing 24-7, and trailed 31-17 at the start of the fourth quarter. The 17-point Nevada comeback tied the second largest comeback for the program since 1996.

With the game tied and 32 seconds remaining, Purdue quarterback Elijah Sindelar threw an interception to defensive back Daniel Brown. Nevada tied the game with 52 seconds left on Strong's 20-yard pass to Elijah Cooks.

Purdue quarterback Elijah Sindelar recorded a career high 423 passing yards four touchdowns, but the Boilermakers lost the turnover battle, 5-0, and two of those turnovers were Sindelar interceptions.

Rondale Moore displayed his big play capability in his first half, but was contained for most of the second half. He finished with 11 catches for 124 yards and one touchdown.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) — No. 16 Oregon rebounded from its season-opening loss to Auburn with a 77-6 win over Nevada.

True freshman Brandon Talton kicked a pair of first half field goals for Nevada. Redshirt freshman Carson Strong, who threw for 295 yards and three touchdowns in his debut, threw for 89 against the Ducks and was intercepted twice. Talton's 24-yard field goal gave Nevada the early lead midway through the opening quarter.

Herbert hit Breeland with a 66-yard scoring pass on the ensuing drive to put the Ducks in front. Herbert has thrown a touchdown pass in 30 straight games, the longest active streak in the nation.

But the senior quarterback has had to deal with a depleted receiver corps because of injuries heading into the season. Graduate transfer Juwan Johnson, a projected starter, was on the sidelines for the second straight game with an unspecified injury.

Talton added a 45-yard field goal for the Wolf Pack before CJ Verdell muscled his way into the end zone from 2 yards out to give the Oregon a 14-6 lead. After Sampson Niu intercepted Strong, Oregon scored two plays later on Herbert's 16-yard pass to Ryan Bay

The game further slipped away from Nevada when Oregon took over on the Wolf Pack 7 after a muffed punt, and Herbert found Brady Aiello with a 1-yard scoring pass to make it 28-6.

Herbert threw his fourth touchdown of the game before the end of the first half, a 24-yard pass to a wide-open Bryan Addison in the end zone. He added another in the third quarter to Daewood Davis, recently moved to receiver from cornerback because of the injuries, and Cyrus Habibi-Likio ran for an 11-yard TD to extend the lead to 49-6.

Redshirt freshman Tyler Shough replaced Herbert with about eight minutes left in the third quarter and threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to Jaylon Redd. Shough added a 21-yard TD pass to Hunter Kampmoyer and Darrian Felix added a 62-yard in the final quarter.

The Ducks lead the series 7-1. The Wolf Pack's only victory came in the first meeting between the two teams in 1947.

Talton's 34-yard field goal with 4:49 to play capped the scoring.

Nevada finished with 453 total yards while limiting the Wildcats to just 137. Weber State went three-and-out on each of its three fourth-quarter possessions.

LARAMIE, Wyo. (AP) - Xazavian Valladay rushed for a career-high 206 yards, Sean Chambers threw for 158 yards and two touchdowns, and Wyoming defeated Nevada 31-3 on Saturday.

Wyoming, bowl eligible for the fourth consecutive season, has won seven consecutive home games.

Wyoming (6-2, 3-1 Mountain West) had 258 rushing yards and 221 passing yards for a total of 479. The bulk of the Cowboys' passing yards came from Chambers, who was 6 of 9 for 158 yards and two touchdowns. Backup Tyler Vander Waal was 3 of 10 for 63 yards with a touchdown.

Wyoming led 24-3 at halftime and Vander Waal's 25-yard pass to tight end Jackson Marcotte capped the scoring with 11:54 remaining in the third quarter.

Nevada's score came on a 28-yard field goal by Brandon Talton late in the first quarter. Carson Strong completed 26 of 40 passes for 247 yards for the Wolf Pack (4-4, 1-3).

Valladay's previous best was 192 yards at New Mexico last season, also a 31-3 victory for the Cowboys.
