Post-game Notes:

- Tuesday's game marked senior Anthony Mathis' fourth game in which he has scored 20 points or more.
 - Eleven of his 20 total points came at the free-throw line where he shot 100 percent. Eleven points is Mathis' career high for most free throws made in a game, as well as a new individual season high for the Lobos. Earlier this season, junior Corey Manigault posted ten free throws at Bradley on Dec. 1.
 - This is the fourth game this season Mathis has been perfect from the foul line. The last time Mathis was flawless at the line was on Dec. 4, at New Mexico State.
 - This is the second game this season Mathis has registered five assists, which tied a career high.
- Three Lobos finished in double figures including: Anthony Mathis (20), Keith McGee (11), and Vance Jackson (10).
 - This is the eighth game this season the Lobos have had three or more players in double figures.
- McGee finished 3-for-5 behind the arc, tying his previous season high. Tuesday's contest marked McGee's second game of the season scoring three, 3-point baskets.
- Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg matched his rebounding total from his first game as a Lobo with seven boards.
- UNM went on a 9-0 run with 8:31 left in the first half to tie the game at 17 after being down by as many as nine. During that run, Mathis made three free-throws, with McGee and Jackson scoring back-to-back threes.
- Nearly half of the Lobos' points came from the free-throw line (26).
- Three of the Lobos' five losses on the season have been decided by ten or fewer points.
- The Lobos registered a season-high nine steals, surpassing their previous high of eight, which they achieved three times this season (at Bradley, vs. New Mexico State and at CSUN).
- Tuesday's game marked the second of the season in which the Lobos never held a lead. The last game in which the Lobos did not lead was at New Mexico State on Dec. 4.
- The Lobos set a season high for free throws made with 26.
