SCENE SETTER (through the games of Sun., Feb. 3)

- San Diego State reaches the halfway point of the conference campaign and concludes a stretch of three games in seven days on Tuesday when the Aztecs play at New Mexico.
- The Aztecs have won a season-best three straight games and have been victorious in four of their last five contests (one loss was a four-point defeat at Fresno State).
- Since Jan. 15 (includes SDSU's last five games), the Aztecs own a scoring margin of +11.8 which is tied for 24th nationally.
- SDSU's defense continues to improve at a dramatic rate. The Aztecs, who allowed four opponents in a six-game stretch to shoot above 50 percent from the field earlier in the year, rank among the nation's elite in several key defensive categories during the past month (see chart, right). Since Jan. 8, SDSU ranks in the top 25 nationally in opponent two-point field goal percentage (9th), field goal percentage difference (16th) and opponent field goal percentage (17th).
- Since Dec. 29, 2018 (which includes **Jalen McDaniels'** last 10 games), the sophomore is averaging 19.9 points, 10.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists, while shooting 53.7 percent from the field. He is one of only two players in the nation that is averaging 19-10-2 and is shooting at least 50 percent from the field (the other is Belmont's Dylan Windler).
- The Aztecs, who defeated the Lobos, 97-77, at Viejas Arena on Jan. 15, are looking to sweep the regular-season series for the first time since 2016. The Aztecs have done that eight times in school history (1982, 1983, 1984, 2006, 2007, 2011, 2015 and 2016).
- The Aztecs and Lobos, both charter members of the Mountain West, rank first and second in men's basketball titles. San Diego State owns a conference record 11-league crowns, while New Mexico has claimed eight championships. No other current league member has more than three.
- Brian Dutcher will be on the SDSU sideline for the 45th time in games played between the teams (41 times as part of Steve Fisher's staff and four times as head coach). The Aztecs are 23-21 in those contests.
- San Diego State has handed New Mexico seven of its last 42 losses at The Pit (since Feb. 25, 2006). SDSU is 7-6 (53.8 percent) during that timeframe, while the rest of the nation is 35-163 (17.8 percent).
- As previously noted, San Diego State won its third straight game on Saturday, claiming a 67-56 decision at San José State. The Aztecs trailed for only 56 seconds in the game and led by double digits the final 7:40 of the game.

- **McDaniels**, who entered the contest with an SDSU MW-era best six straight double-doubles, had 22 points and a team-high nine rebounds. It was the seventh 20-point scoring game of the season and career for the forward.
- Senior guard **Devin Watson** connected on five three-point field goals and tallied 27 points with six assists. The point total was a season best and the highest in his Aztec career. Watson has 15 or more points in each of his last three games, matching the longest stretch of his SDSU career set in late November of his junior season.
- Senior guard **Jeremy Hemsley** produced another impressive game with 11 points and a plus-minus rating of +17 against the Spartans. Hemsley has reached double figures in scoring in four straight games, his longest streak since a five-game stretch during February of his sophomore season.
- Although currently in fourth place in the Mountain West, SDSU is only 1-game back in the loss column of second place.
- San Diego State is one of just two Mountain West teams that has not dropped a league home game (Nevada).

TRENDS (through the games of Sun., Feb. 3)

- In Mountain West play, the Aztecs rank 1st in free throw percentage (77.1), 2nd in field goal percentage defense (41.3), 3rd in scoring margin (+6.4), scoring defense (66.4), field goal percentage (46.8), rebound margin (+1.9) and turnover margin (+1.4).
- **Jalen McDaniels** is making his case as a league player of the year candidate, in league games ranking 1st in scoring (20.0), 4th in rebounding (10.3), 1st in free-throw percentage (84.4 percent) and 5th in field goal percentage (52.5 percent). He is the only player in the league to rank in the top five of all four of those categories.
- San Diego State's sophomore class of **McDaniels**, **Matt Mitchell** and **Jordan Schakel** is averaging 35.0 points per game. If the season ended today it would come close to being the highest scoring sophomore class in school history, currently held by the 1999-00 sophomore class that included six players (35.1). Keep in mind that Schakel has missed the last three games due to the injury.
- The Aztecs are 32-4 the last 36 times they have had a higher field goal percentage than their opponent.
- San Diego State is 11-2 this season and 30-5 under Brian Dutcher when holding

the opposition to 45.0 percent field goal shooting or less.

- SDSU is 26-1 in the Dutcher era when holding the opposition to 45 percent field goal shooting and 35 percent three-point field goal shooting.
- The Aztecs are 9-0 when outrebounding its opponent this season, something SDSU has done in four of its last seven games.
- San Diego State is 22-9 in its last 31 games - regardless of location - dating back to last season.
- San Diego State is 20-7 in its last 27 contests against teams that were not ranked in the AP Top 25 at game time.
- Last month, SDSU used a starting lineup comprised of one senior, three sophomores and one true freshman (for consecutive games). This marked the first time the Aztecs have started four underclassmen since February 12, 2005 vs. UNLV. Against the Runnin' Rebels that day, SDSU started two freshmen (Tyler Smith and Matt Thomas), two sophomores (Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter) and a junior college transfer (Mohamed Camara). That team finished 11-18 and marks the last time the Aztecs finished a campaign below .500. SDSU would make the postseason each of the next 11 seasons.

 - He is one of only seven active players with at least 1,600 points and 450 assists, and he has the fewest minutes played of any of those players.
 - One of only five players in the nation to average at least 16 points, 4.9 assists and 2.7 three-point field goals per game this season.
 - Has scored or assisted on 38.8 percent of San Diego State's field goals this season.
 - Averages an astonishing 1.418 points per possession and shoots 47.3 percent (26-of-55 3FGs) from the field on his 55 catch-and-shoot possessions this season. The 1.418 PPP ranks 33rd nationally among all players with at least 55 such possessions.
 - San Diego State is 6-1 this season when Watson records at least seven assists.
- Sophomore forward **Matt Mitchell** - 11.0 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.2 assists, 0.7 steals, 44.9 FG pct., 32.5 3FG pct., 75.0 FT pct.
 - San Diego State is 5-0 this season and 10-1 in his career when he scores at least 15 points.

 - Has shown good mobility off the pick-and-roll, making 5-of-7 field goal attempts in 10 roll possessions.
- Senior guard **Jeremy Hemsley** - 9.7 points, 2.9 rebounds, 2.5 assists, 1.2 steals, 36.2 3FG pct.

 - Averaging 1.207 points per all possessions which ranks 75th nationally among all players with at least 125 possessions.
 - Scored 150 points this season after scoring a total of 106 points in 33 games as a freshman last season.
 - Among active DI players, ranks 12th in fewest turnovers per 40 minutes (0.89, min. 903 minutes).
 - Made his first 16 free-throw attempts on the season and has made 31-of-37 overall (.838).

SERIES HISTORY VS. NEW MEXICO

- This is the 88th meeting between New Mexico and San Diego State with the Lobos owning a 47-40 advantage in the series.

- San Diego State snapped a three-game series losing streak against New Mexico with an 82-75 victory in the championship game of the 2018 Mountain West tournament and the Aztecs won the earlier meeting this season, 97-77, in San Diego.
- Since 2010, San Diego State has won 13 of the 23 meetings (13-10) with New Mexico.
- Since the 2005-06 campaign, San Diego State has won 19 of the last 31 meetings (19-12).
- Brian Dutcher has been on the Aztec sideline for 23 of SDSU's 40 all-time wins vs. New Mexico and eight of the school's 11 victories at The Pit.
- Since 2006, San Diego State has beaten the Lobos on Bob King Court seven times. Since that MW championship season, the Aztecs are 7-6 at The Pit.
- San Diego State has handed New Mexico seven of its last 42 losses at The Pit (since Feb. 25, 2006). SDSU is 7-6 (53.8 percent) during that timeframe, while the rest of the nation is 35-163 (17.8 percent).
- San Diego State has won seven of the last nine (7-2) and nine of the last 12 (9-3) at home vs. New Mexico.
- Twelve of the last 15 meetings between SDSU and UNM at Viejas Arena have been decided by 10 points or less, and 20 of the last 24 have also had a winning margin of 10 or less.
- At neutral sites, New Mexico has won five of the eight all-time meetings (5-3).
- San Diego State has made at least 11 free throws in each of the last seven meetings against the Lobos (115 total; 16.4 FTM/gm).
- The Aztecs have held New Mexico to 42.9 percent shooting or less in each of the last 10 meetings between the teams. During that stretch New Mexico is 201-of-537 from the field (37.4 percent).
- Since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, five of New Mexico's 19 lowest field goal percentage games have come against San Diego State.
- Devin Watson is averaging 16.3 points and has made 8-of-13 (61.5 percent) of his three-point attempts in three career games against New Mexico.
- Jalen McDaniels averages 14.3 points and 7.7 rebounds while connecting on 59.4 percent from the field against UNM.

SAN DIEGO – Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels scored 24 points and added 11 rebounds and senior guard Devin Watson made three three-pointers in the opening four minutes of the second half as San Diego State cruised to a 97-77 victory over New Mexico at Viejas Arena.

McDaniels recorded his personal best third consecutive double-double and reached the 20-point plateau for the fifth time this season as the Aztecs won their eighth straight conference home game.

The Aztecs tied their Mountain West Conference high for points in a regulation game (97) and set a program best for assists in an MWC game with 30.

San Diego State never trailed but led by only two points in the closing moments of the first half when freshman forward Aguek Arop stole the ball and made a 65-foot heave at the first half buzzer to give the Aztecs a five-point advantage.

SDSU led by eight points with 14:47 to play before utilizing an 11-3 run to provide further cushion. McDaniels had nine points during the decisive run and had 14 of his 21 points after intermission.

San Diego State shot 55.1 percent for the game and has now won 57 straight home games when shooting at least 50 percent from the field.

In all five players reached double figures for the Aztecs. Watson ended the game with 21 points on 5-of-7 shooting from three-point range. In just his third career start Nathan Mensah was 7-for-7 from the field and ended the game with 16 points and seven rebounds.

New Mexico was led by Anthony Mathis with 21 points and

SAN DIEGO STATE SNAPSHOT

- San Diego State has started six players and three different combinations of players this season - a true freshman (Nathan Mensah), three sophomores (Jalen McDaniels, Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel) and two seniors (Devin Watson and Jeremy Hemsley).
- The Aztecs have a wealth of experience in the backcourt with a pair of seniors, **Devin Watson** and **Jeremy Hemsley**.
- **Watson**, who is in his third year with the program after playing two seasons at the Univ. of San Francisco, is second on the team this season in scoring (16.0), and leads the team in minutes played (33.7), assists (4.9) and has connected on 56-of-142 attempts from beyond the arc (39.4 percent). He is one of only seven players in the nation to average at least 16 points, 4.9 assists and 2.7 three-point field goals per game this season. The senior has scored or assisted on 38.8 percent of San Diego State's field goals this season.
- **Hemsley** has played extensively for San Diego State the last four seasons, logging 121 games and 82 starts. He is averaging 30.4 minutes (second on the team), 9.7 points, and is considered the team's best defender.
- A majority of the time, the other three starters come from the Aztecs' sensational sophomore class of **Jalen McDaniels**, **Matt Mitchell** and **Jordan Schakel**. The group has been sensational to date and is a major reason why Aztec fans are excited about the future.
- **Mitchell** has six career games with 20 or more points, four of them come in the last 20 games, including three in the last 12 games. He also has recorded eight games with at least three assists this season. For the year, he is averaging 11.0 points, good for third on the team, with 3.7 rebounds and 2.2 assists per contest. He has attempted 64 free throws and at one point made 15 straight.
- **Schakel** has already surpassed his offensive production from his entire freshman season. The sophomore is averaging 8.3 points, 3.9 rebounds and has connected on 31-of-74 three-point field goals this season (41.9 percent). He has 150 points this season after scoring 106 points in 33 games last season.
- After spending the summer working out for NBA teams, **McDaniels** has returned to campus with an improved jumper and a more consistent and well-rounded game. The sophomore has scored in double-digits in 21 of his last 22 games. He leads the team in scoring (16.8) and rebounding (8.5) and has played particularly well of late, averaging 19.9 points, 10.1 rebounds and shooting 53.7 percent from the field over his last 10 games. He has recorded six double-doubles in his last seven games.
- SDSU has five freshmen on the roster, with two contributing significantly. True freshman forward **Nathan Mensah** is averaging 11.3 points and 10.9 rebounds per 40 minutes of action and has started the last seven games. Only 24 players in the nation have more rebounds than he does (105) in fewer minutes (384). He has played at least 10 minutes in all 21 games.
- Redshirt freshman guard **Adam Seiko** has seen action in 20 games and is averaging 14.0 minutes per appearance. He has just 10 turnovers in 279 minutes of action this season and has shown the ability to hit the three-pointer, going 12-for-28 from bonus distance (42.9 percent).

SEASON SCENE SETTER

- Dutcher welcomes back three returning starters in redshirt sophomore forward **Jalen McDaniels** (2018 all-MW third team by media, honorable mention by coaches) sophomore forward **Matt Mitchell** and senior guard **Devin Watson**. The trio played in all 33 games a year ago with Watson starting every game, Mitchell receiving the opening nod 32 times (starting the final 31 outings) and McDaniels starting 21 of the final 22 contests (did not start on Senior Night).
- The aforementioned threesome ranked No. 2, 3 and 4 in scoring in 2017-18 with Watson leading the way at 12.2 points and falling seven points shy of tying outgoing senior Malik Pope for the team lead in the category. Mitchell and McDaniels, meanwhile, each finished with 10.5 scoring averages.
- SDSU returns from last year its leader in rebounding average (McDaniels - 7.5), assists (Watson - 124), steals (Mitchell - 36), field-goal percentage (McDaniels - .586), free-throw percentage (McDaniels - .788), three-point field-goal percentage (Watson - .389), three-pointers (Mitchell and Watson - 49) and minutes (Watson - 1,031).
- Senior guard **Jeremy Hemsley** and junior forward **Nolan Narain** are back for their respective seasons after receiving the starting nod at different times throughout the 2017-18 campaign. Hemsley (7.3 ppg, 1.22 a/to) played in 32 of 33 games last year, starting seven times, and enters '18-19 with 63 starting assignments in 101 career games, which is the most on the active roster. Narain, meanwhile, started once in 23 games and averaged career highs in every category (4.7 ppg, 2.0 rpg, .688 FG).
- Sophomore guard **Jordan Schakel** returns as one of the team's top three-point threats. Hailing from Torrance, Schakel ranked fourth on the team last year in three-point makes (27) and percentage (.346; min. 40 3FGA), while playing in all 33 games (13.8 mpg). Schakel averaged 3.2 points and 2.1 rebounds, and took great care of the ball, committing just nine turnovers in 455 minutes. In fact, he only had one multi-turnover game all season and finished the year with 26 straight one-turnover-or-less outings.

THE PROGRAM (through the games of Thurs., Jan. 31)

- Head coach **Brian Dutcher** is in his second season at the helm after guiding San Diego State to a 22-11 record in his first season. He was the only first-year head coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament in 2018. In 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat.
- San Diego State had advanced to the NCAA tournament seven times in the last nine seasons, making Sweet 16 appearances in both 2011 and 2014. Only 26 schools nationally have played in at least seven of the last nine NCAA tourneys.
- The Aztecs' NCAA appearance in 2018 was their first since 2015, and their 12th postseason berth in the last 13 years (8 NCAA, 4 NIT).
- SDSU claimed its Mountain West-leading 11th conference title last year and broke a tie with New Mexico by claiming its fifth MW tournament crown. The Aztecs, who played in their fourth Mountain West championship game in the last five seasons, won the tourney for the first time since 2011.
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2010-11 season, posting a cumulative record of 223-79. SDSU's .738 winning percentage is the 15th-best nationally over the last nine years.
- SDSU enters the this season having won at least 20 games and advanced to the postseason in 12 of the last 13 years (8 NCAA, 4 NIT). In the last 13 seasons, the Aztecs have averaged 25.2 victories.
- The Aztecs have won the Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) five times in the last eight years.
- San Diego State has won at least 19 games in 13 consecutive seasons.

DEFENSE A KEY

A key component to San Diego State's success this season can be traced to defense.

With significant roster turnover six freshmen or sophomores making up the nine-man rotation, San Diego State struggled early on the defensive end of the court. However, that has started trending in the right direction of late.

Over its past seven games, the Aztecs are holding opponents to 39.2 percent field goal shooting, including 42.3 percent from inside the arc. Since Jan. 8, San Diego State ranks first or second in points allowed, opponent field goal percentage, opponent two-point field goal percentage, opponent effective field goal percentage and field goal percentage difference among the 11 teams in the Mountain West Conference. Full numbers are available on page 1 of the notes packet.

Opponent field goal percentage is a key stat to track as the Aztecs are 11-2 this season when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field and 9-1 when the opponent is held to 32.0 percent or below from three-point range.

87 POINTS AND 50 PERCENT FG SHOOTING

Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 21-0 when scoring at least 87 points and shooting 50 percent or better from the field.

The Aztecs have done that five times this season and 10 times in the Brian Dutcher era (54 games) after doing so only 10 times in the

previous 248 games.

San Diego State has done it eight times in the last 30 games.

SDSU did it twice in the last five games, connecting on 55.1 percent of its field goal attempts en route to a 97-77 win over New Mexico and following that up soon after with 56.1 percent shooting in a 94-77 victory over UNLV.

JALEN IS BACK FOR MORE

- After a phenomenal freshman debut, Jalen McDaniels is back for his sophomore campaign with the Aztecs. McDaniels, who spent the offseason auditioning for NBA teams, withdrew from the draft just prior to the deadline.
- McDaniels, who focused on being a better long-range shooter while working with NBA teams this past summer, is looking to better on a remarkable debut campaign.
- McDaniels has earned two of the last three Mountain West Player of the Week honors and has won it three times in his career.
- Currently, McDaniels is averaging 16.8 points, 8.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game. No SDSU player has averaged 15 points, seven rebounds and 2.5 assists in a single-season since Jamaal Franklin during the 2012-13 campaign (17.0 ppg, 9.5 rpg). Only two Aztec players have produced a season with those averages in the last 23 seasons (Kawhi Leonard in 2010-11 and Jamaal Franklin, 2012-13).
- Against UNLV, McDaniels posted a stat line of 30 points, 13 rebounds, five steals and four assists. He became just the sixth player in the last 23 years to record at least 30 points, 13 rebounds, 5 steals and 4 assists in the same game and the first since LSU's Ben Simmons on Dec. 2, 2015 (Simmons went onto be the No. 1 pick in the 2016 NBA Draft).
- He has six double-doubles in his last seven games. His streak of six straight double-doubles allowed him to pass current Toronto Raptors star Kawhi Leonard for the most consecutive double-doubles for an Aztec player in a single-season in the Mountain West era.
- Jalen posted a special game in the 2018-19 season-opening victory against Arkansas-Pine Bluff. The sophomore became the first SDSU player in nearly seven years and just the fourth Aztec player, regardless of class, in the last 22 seasons to produce a game with at least 15 points, nine rebounds, five assists and three steals. He joined:

- In his last 10 games, McDaniels is averaging 19.9 points and 10.1 rebounds, while connecting on 53.7 percent of his field goal attempts.
- McDaniels is 14-of-25 from the field (56.0 percent) in 34 post-up possessions. His 1.147 points per possession in those situations is 21st nationally among all Division I players with at least 30 possessions.
- McDaniels has scored in double figures in 21 of 22 games this season and has reached double figures in a career-high 11 consecutive games (broken in the victory over Brigham Young).

Below is a look at a few of his accomplishments last season:

- For starters, McDaniels averaged 10.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and shot 58.6 percent from the field and 78.8 percent from the line last season. He led the team in rebounding as a freshman last season.
- McDaniels was one of just four freshman in the nation to average 10.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and connect on at least 58 percent from the field. Other than McDaniels, Iowa State's Cameron Lard is the only other 2017-18 freshman who returned for his sophomore campaign.
- He is the only San Diego State player, regardless of class, to post those numbers over an entire season in at least 22 seasons.
- For comparison sake, SDSU great Kawhi Leonard averaged 12.7 points and 9.9 rebounds as a freshman in 2009-10. However, McDaniels had an edge in field-goal percentage as Leonard connected on 45.5 percent from the field and 72.6 percent from the line.

HEMSLEY CLIMBING CHARTS IN 4TH SEASON

- In his senior season, Jeremy Hemsley is in rare company. A native of Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., Hemsley will spend this season climbing the Aztecs career statistical charts in many categories.
- Here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on:
- First off, Hemsley is a member of the 1,000-point, 200 rebound, 200 assist club. In school history, there have been 33 players to score 1,000 points at San Diego State and 24 to record 200 rebounds, but in the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era only nine players have reached the 1,000-200-200 club. The players to accomplish that since 1999-2000 are (listed chronologically): Tony Bland, Brandon Heath, Lorenzo Wade, D.J. Gay, Chase Tapley, Xavier Thames, Winston Shepard, Trey Kell and Hemsley.
- Hemsley has 1,280 points. That ranks 11th on the school's all-time list.
- Hemsley has 250 assists. That ranks 19th on the school's all-time list.
- Hemsley has 140 three-point field goals. That ranks 7th in school history.
- Hemsley has played 3,236 minutes. That ranks 11th on the school's all-time list.
- Hemsley has 262 made free throws. That is 19th on the school's all-time list.

tational on Nov. 20 and followed that up by ringing in the New Year with a 19-point second-half comeback against CSUN on Jan. 1.

In the last five seasons there have been 1,740 teams to play Division I basketball (351 in 2018-19, 351 in 2017-18, 347 in 2016-17, 346 in 2015-16 and 345 in 2014-15). The 2018-19 San Diego State team is just the sixth to overcome two deficits of at least 19 points in a single season.

Furthermore, the comebacks rank among the most epic in school history. Only twice in recorded history (since the start of the 1996-97 season) has SDSU rallied from a bigger deficit to win a game and the 19-point second half rally against CSUN ranks as the second largest comeback after intermission in school history.

A look at the largest rallies and largest second half rallies in school history can be found on page 172 of the media guide.

BRIAN DUTCHER TURNS 30

Second-year head coach Brian Dutcher picked up career victory number 30 earlier this month against CSUN and did so in just his 46th game as head coach.

By doing so in just 46 games, he became the fastest Aztec head coach to record 30 wins since the program's first head coach, C. E. Peterson went 30-13 during his first 43 games in the 1921-22 and 1922-23 seasons.

It is worth noting that the strength of schedule has changed from those initial seasons on The Mesa. While Dutcher has already defeated three top 25 teams, Peterson counted among his first 30 victories San Diego Rowing Club, First National Bank (twice) and eight high schools.

Furthermore, Dutcher became the first Aztec head coach with a winning record when recording win number 30 since Tim Vezie was 30-25 (he started coaching the Aztecs in the 1974-75 season).

Two-time national coach of the year Steve Fisher, with Brian Dutcher serving as an assistant on that staff, was 30-43 at SDSU when he claimed his 30th victory with the Aztecs.

TOUGH AT HOME

■ San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last nine seasons and has a NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that the Aztecs have been a very tough out at Viejas Arena.

■ Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the 10th-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 139-19 home record, winning 88.0 percent of its home games during that span. Here are a few tidbits on the recent home success.

■ In its last 161 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 142-19 mark, including a 70-9 record against non-conference competition at Viejas.

■ Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 94-15 at home, including a 44-8 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (42-6 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).

■ The Aztecs are 36-7 in their last 43 non-conference home games.

LAST TIME OUT

San Diego State 66, Air Force 51

SAN JOSE, Calif. — Devin Watson and Jalen McDaniels combined to score 49 points and San Diego State picked up its third straight victory, knocking off San Jose State 67-56 on Saturday night.

San Diego State swept the season series with the Spartans last year and now have won 10 of the last 11 meetings between the programs.

The Aztecs took control early, with Matt Mitchell and McDaniels hitting back-to-back 3s to start the game and rolling to a quick 16-3 lead over the first five minutes. San Jose State rallied and Michael Steadman scored at the basket with just over two minutes left in the first half to get within a field goal, but Watson scored on a layup to send San Diego State into intermission with a 25-21 advantage.

McDaniels hit two jumpers and a 3 to push the Aztecs lead to 32-23 to start the second half.

Watson hit 5 of 11 from long range and finished with 27 points to lead the Aztecs (13-8, 5-3 Mountain West). McDaniels had 22 points and grabbed nine rebounds.

Craig LeCesne had 14 points and Steadman pulled down 11 rebounds for San Jose State (3-18, 0-9).

Watson scored a season-high and game-high 27 points and it was his eighth game this season with 20 or more points and the 31st time in his career. He led the Aztecs in scoring for the eighth time this season and the 17th time in his career and led the Aztecs in assists for the 16th time this season and the 28th time in his career. Watson scored in double figures for the fifth straight game, 18th time this season and 83rd time in his career. He now has 1,608 career points.

The Aztecs were in eighth place in the Mountain West Conference entering play on Jan. 26 (one week ago today). The Aztecs are now alone in fourth place in the league.

NOTING THE SAN JOSE STATE GAME

■ San Diego State extends its season-long win streak to three games.

■ The Aztecs are 4-1 in their last five games with a lone defeat being a four-point loss at Fresno State (a team that started today 6-2 in league play).

■ Devin Watson scored a season-high 27 points and added six assists and four rebounds.

■ Jalen McDaniels scored 22 points (his seventh career 20-point game) and added nine rebounds.

■ The Aztecs were in eighth place in the Mountain West Conference entering play on Jan. 26 (one week ago today). The Aztecs are now alone in fourth place in the league.

■ San Diego State is 10-1 in its last 11 meetings with San José State.

■ The Aztecs have been victorious on five of their last six trips to The Event Center.

■ SDSU snaps a four-game losing streak in road games but is 4-4 in its last eight road contests.

■ Brian Dutcher claims his 35th victory in just his 54th game as head coach.

■ San Diego State is 3-0 in Mountain West Conference "quick turnaround" games (games played two days after the previous game). The Aztecs next game at New Mexico fits into that category as well.

Team Notes

■ San Diego State held San José State to 35.2 percent field goal shooting and has now held five of its last seven opponent to less than 40 percent field goal shooting.

■ San Diego State had a season low eight turnovers.

■ SDSU enjoyed a 16-0 run early in the first half — points by Jalen McDaniels (5), Matt Mitchell (3), Jeremy Hemsley (3) and Devin Watson (3).

■ San Diego State had a season-low two bench points (previous: 3 at Fresno State, 1-22-19).

Trends

■ San Diego State is 25-1 under Brian Dutcher when holding opponents to 45 percent or less in field goal percentage and 35 percent or less from three-point range.

■ San Diego State is 32-4 the last 36 times when owning an advantage in field goal percentage.

■ San Diego State is 94-15 the last 99 times the Aztecs have led at intermission.

■ **Devin Watson (27 points, 6 assists, 4 rebounds, 9-18 FGs, 5-11 3FGs, 4-5 FTs)**

Scored a season-high and game-high 27 points... It is his eighth game this season with 20 or more points and the 31st time in his career... Led the Aztecs in scoring for the eighth time this season and the 17th time in his career... Led the Aztecs in assists for the 16th time this season and the 28th time in his career... Scored in double figures for the fifth straight game, 18th time this season and 83rd time in his career... Has 1,608 career points.

■ **Jalen McDaniels (22 points, 9 rebounds, 10-18 FGs, 2-4 3FGs)**

His double-double streak is snapped at six straight games but still posts his fifth 20+ scoring game in his last nine games (had two in his 45 career college games)... Has seven 20+ scoring games this season and in his career (SDSU is 6-1 in those games)... Made five of his last 10 three-point field goal attempts (50.0 percent) over his last three games... Led the Aztecs in rebounding for the 17th time this season and the 35th time in his career... Posted his 10th straight double-digit scoring game (one short of his career high)... In his last 10 games he is averaging 19.9 points, 10.1 rebounds, 2.1 assists and has connected 53.7 percent from the field.

■ **Jeremy Hemsley (11 points, 2 assists)**

Recorded his fourth straight double-digit scoring game for the first time this season and the first time since a four-game stretch Jan. 24-Feb. 6, 2018... Has 1,280 career points and moved past Al Skalecky into 11th place on SDSU's all-time scoring list... His two threes give him 140 for his career and he is now alone in seventh place on the school's career list... Made multiple threes in consecutive games for the first time this season... Is 4-for-9 from bonus distance over the last two games.

PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST POLL

■ San Diego State has been picked second in the annual Mountain West preseason media poll.

■ The preseason favorite, according to the media that regularly cover the conference, is Nevada, which won the 2017-18 regular-season title. The Wolf Pack earned 207 points and 18 first-place votes to finish in front of SDSU, the reigning Mountain West tournament champions who garnered 188 points and one first-place tally.

■ The Aztecs won the MW tournament crown a season ago when they beat New Mexico in the final. The Lobos' run to the championship game set them up for a third-place finish in this year's preseason poll. UNM picked up 153 points to finish ahead of fourth-place Boise State (139 points) and fifth-place Fresno State (138).

■ UNLV (6th; 122 points), Wyoming (7th; 88) and Colorado State (8th; 80) were the next three teams to fall in line behind the Bulldogs with Utah State (9th; 78), Air Force (10th; 42) and San José State (11th; 19) rounding out the poll.

■ SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll and received at least one first-place vote in each of the last five years. It is also the 10th time in 20 seasons the Aztecs have been picked first or second in the poll. All 10 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 14 years.

■ Despite being considered the second-best team in the league, San Diego State did not have a player voted to the preseason all-conference team or as one of the of-the-year award winners (player, freshman, newcomer).

■ The Aztecs are set to return three of their top four scorers from last season (Devin Watson, Matt Mitchell, Jalen McDaniels) and four of their top six (Watson, Mitchell, McDaniels, Jeremy Hemsley) off a 2017-18 team that went 22-11, won their Mountain West-high 11th conference title and advanced to the NCAA tournament for the seventh time in the last nine years.





BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach • 35-19 record as head coach at San Diego State and overall

2nd Season • 20th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, is entering his second season as head coach after a first year in which he led the Aztecs to their Mountain West-high 11th conference title and back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2015. Dutcher, who took over the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his time at San Diego State, Dutcher helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 13 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2011-12 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, SDSU was again an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

Last season, SDSU won six consecutive games to end the regular season and all three in the MW tournament to capture the program's 11th league crown to return to the NCAA tournament. Despite the NCAA first-round exit, SDSU finished the campaign with a 22-11 record, with the 22 wins representing the most by a first-year Aztec men's basketball head coach and the second-most among first-year coaches last season.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.







SAN DIEGO - Senior guard Devin Watson connected on a career-high six three-point field goals and had a team-high 20 points as San Diego State opened its 2018-19 campaign with a 76-60 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff at Viejas Arena.

It was the sixth straight season-opening win for SDSU and the Aztecs have now won 14 consecutive home openers (regardless of the game being a season opener).

San Diego State led 39-36 with 17:38 to play when the Aztecs went on a 15-2 run to open up a comfortable 16-point lead. Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had seven points during the spurt and was one of three Aztecs (Jordan Schakel and Watson) to connect on a trey during the decisive run.

The lead grew to 23 points (following a 30-10 run) before the Aztecs settled for the 16-point final margin.

San Diego State's trademark stellar defense on full display, limited Arkansas-Pine Bluff to 35.7 percent field goal shooting and forced the Golden Lions into 18 turnovers.

Watson recorded his fifth game with the Aztecs with at least 20 points, a figure he has reached 24 times in his career. His six treys are the fourth most by an Aztec player in Viejas Arena history.

Hemsley added 14 points, three assists and three steals. Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels narrowly missed a double-double with 15 points and team highs with nine rebounds and five assists. Sophomore forward Matt Mitchell rounded out four Aztec players in double figures with 10 points and five rebounds.

McDaniels became just the fourth Aztec player in the last 22 seasons to record at least 15 points, nine rebounds, five assists and three steals in a game, joining Jamaal Franklin, Kawhi Leonard and Chase Tapley.

San Diego State, which improved to 2-0 for the first time in four seasons, received a game-high 21 points from Matt Mitchell. The sophomore also added five rebounds and three assists.

Classmate Jordan Schakel had a career-high 16 points on 3-of-3 three-point field goal shooting and 7-of-7 from the charity stripe, and had seven rebounds.

Sophomore Jalen McDaniels added 14 points and a game-high nine rebounds, while Devin Watson poured in 14 points and had eight assists for SDSU. Senior Jeremy Hemsley scored 10 points and freshman Nathan Mensah came off the bench to score 11 points and pull down five rebounds.

San Diego State scored the first eight points of the game and led by as many as 41 points in claiming the team's eighth straight home win.

The Aztecs produced its highest point total in nearly five years (118 vs. Saint Katherine College, Dec. 27, 2013) connected on 52.3 percent from the field and was 27-of-36 from the free throw line.

Meanwhile, SDSU limited the Tigers to 33.3 percent field goal shooting and forced 14 turnovers on the evening.

San Diego State won for the 68th straight time when shooting at least 50 percent from the field and has won 71 consecutive contests when shooting 50 percent and committing 13 or fewer turnovers.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - Duke made five of its first seven attempts from beyond the arc to build a 13-point advantage in the opening 10 minutes of the game and the top-ranked Blue Devils defeated San Diego State, 90-64, in the opening day of the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.

San Diego State held Duke without an opening possession and quickly got a transition follow basket from sophomore Matt Mitchell to put the Aztecs on top, 2-0. It was the only lead of the day for SDSU.

The Blue Devils feature one of the nation's most dangerous lineups and on this day that fearsome unit made nine first-half three-point field goals to build a 49-32 halftime advantage.

Senior Jeremy Hemsley and sophomore Jalen McDaniels made consecutive lay ups early in the second half to cut the deficit to 13, but the Aztecs were not able to draw any closer.

Despite the loss, there were plenty of positive takeaways for SDSU. The Aztecs made 27 trips to the line and drew 25 fouls on the Blue Devils. McDaniels and Mitchell tied for team-high honors by drawing five fouls apiece.

San Diego State was led by senior guard Devin Watson's 15 points. Hemsley added 12 points and McDaniels and Mitchell each chipped in with 11 points apiece.

Duke was led R.J. Barrett who had 20 points and five assists. The Aztecs held Zion Williams, a projected NBA lottery pick, to 13 points on 5-of-11 attempts from the line.

The game marked just the fourth all-time matchup for the Aztecs against the nation's top ranked team. On two occasions, the opponent has been the Blue Devils.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - San Diego State made one of the most dramatic comebacks in school history, overcoming a 19-point deficit, to defeat Xavier, 79-74, on the second day of the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.

The Aztecs trailed 32-13 with 9:21 to play in the first half against a Musketeers' program that is the defending Big East Conference champions, was a No. 1-seed in the NCAA tournament and finished the campaign 29-6.

SDSU scored the next seven points as part of a 27-5 run to cut the deficit to three points at half.

After allowing the opening basket of the second half, the Aztecs went on a 17-2 run to open up a nine-point advantage. In all, SDSU outscored Xavier, 45-17, over approximately a 20-minute period in the middle of the game.

San Diego State was led by sophomore sensation Jalen McDaniels. McDaniels scored a career-high 26 points on the strength of 9-of-14 shooting, including a career-high three three-point field goals. He added eight rebounds and three blocked shots.

Senior guard Devin Watson tallied 21 points, including four three-point field goals, and added a game-high seven assists. Sophomore guard Jordan Schakel made three three's en route to a 13-point, five-rebound performance.

San Diego State shot 53.8 percent from the field and ran its winning streak to 68 games when shooting at least 50 percent from the floor. Equally impressive was the fact the Aztecs outbounded their bigger Big East opponent, 33-29.

The comeback was the third largest in SDSU recorded history and the largest in Brian Dutcher's tenure as SDSU's head coach.

Xavier raced out to the big lead by making eight of its first 10 and 13 of its first 19 field goal attempts. As if that was not bad enough, the Musketeers converted on five of its first seven attempts from beyond the arc.



SAN DIEGO - San Diego State dominated both ends of the court from the opening tip and recorded its widest margin of victory against a Division I opponent in 32 years as the Aztecs defeated Jackson State, 87-44.

The Aztecs, coming off a 30-point loss six days earlier, scored the first 11 points of the game, raced to a 24-5 advantage and built a 49-21 halftime lead.

Five San Diego State players scored in double figures, led by sophomores Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel. Mitchell had 15 points to go along with six rebounds and three assists and Schakel had 15 points and four steals.

Classmate Jalen McDaniels had 14 points and junior forward Nolan Narain came off the bench to add 11 points and four rebounds.

Offensively, San Diego State was efficient, connecting on 50.9 percent of its field goal attempts, including 57.6 percent of its two-point field goal attempts. The Aztecs had 20 assists on 29 field goal attempts.

San Diego State has now won 70 consecutive games when shooting 50 percent or better from the floor.

Defensively, the Aztecs limited Jackson State to 25.9 percent from the field, the lowest mark for an SDSU opponent in the Brian Dutcher era. This was just the 33rd time this season that a Division I opponent was held to less than 30 percent field goal shooting and was forced into more than 20 turnovers (23).

With the victory, San Diego State has followed each of its last four defeats with a victory in the next game.

NORMAL, Ill. - San Diego State received strong play from its starting senior backcourt and used a relentless team effort on the glass and on the defensive end to pick up a road win at Illinois State, 75-65.

The game was part of the eighth annual Mountain West - Missouri Valley Challenge and the SDSU victory helped the Mountain West salvage a tie in the 10-games played between the teams this season.

The Aztecs snapped the Redbirds 10-game homecourt winning streak thanks in part to Devin Watson's season-high 23 points and game-high seven assists and classmate Jeremy Hemsley timely shooting en route to 17 points and five rebounds.

Possibly overlooked was another outstanding performance by sophomore Jalen McDaniels who reached double figures for a personal-best eighth straight game. McDaniels recorded his 10th career double-double with 12 points and a personal-high 15 rebounds.

The Aztecs had their best rebounding game of the season, with a 47-36 rebound advantage in the contest. It marked the second straight game in which the Aztecs enjoyed a double-digit advantage on the glass after being outrebounded in three of the first five contests of the season. The -11 rebound margin marked the worst of the season for the Redbirds.

SDSU limited Illinois State to 31.0 percent field goal shooting, its lowest percentage in nearly 21 months, since No. 21 Wichita State limited the Redbirds to 29.3 percent on March 5, 2017.

San Diego State led for 37:20 of the contest, including the entire second half. The Aztecs were never really in danger in the second half, but when Illinois State cut the deficit to 55-49 with 11:37 to play, the Aztecs responding with an 8-0 run. Hemsley converted on a basket and followed it with a try on the next possession and Watson made a three-pointer of his own to push the lead back to 14 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego connected on seven three-point field goals after intermission and shot 56.0 percent after the break to overcome a halftime deficit and defeat San Diego State, 73-61.

The Toreros snapped the Aztecs 11-game win streak in the series in games played indoors and won enemy ground for the first time since 2000.

The Aztecs played stellar defense in the first half, limiting USD to 35.7 percent field goal shooting and 0-for-11 from beyond the arc. Despite the strong performance on that side of the floor, the Aztecs, which led by as many as nine points, only entered halftime with a seven-point lead.

San Diego used a 16-5 run to open the second half to build a four-point advantage. The Aztecs took their final lead of the evening on a pair of free throws by sophomore Jordan Schakel with 10:57 to play.

USD responded with a 10-0 run to take an eight-point advantage with 7:23 to play.

The Aztecs made a final push, cutting the deficit to four points on a Devin Watson basket with 3:04 to play, but USD drew a foul late in the shot clock, converted two free throws and SDSU could draw no closer.

BERKELEY, Calif. - California converted four of its final five three-point field goal attempts over the final 4:21 of the contest to overcome a late eight-point deficit and defeat San Diego State, 89-83.

The Aztecs led 78-71 with 3:53 to play in the contest, but the Bears outscored the SDSU 18-5 over the final stretch to hand SDSU just its second loss to California in the last six meetings.

The loss was the second in a row for San Diego State, which had responded from its previous four losses with a victory in the following game.

San Diego State produced a tremendous offensive game. The Aztecs posted 83 points, connected on 54.7 percent of its field goals and a remarkable 57.1 percent of its three-point field goals (12-of-21).

This marked just the second time since Dec. 27, 2013 that San Diego State scored at least 83 points, made at least 12 three-point field goals, and shot at least 55.6 percent from the field (other was vs. Colorado State, 1-24-18).

Unfortunately, California enjoyed a big offensive night as well, connecting on 52.7 percent from the floor and making 13 three-point field goals.

The Aztecs were led by sophomore Jalen McDaniels, who had a team-high 20 points and added six rebounds and five assists. Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley was sensational, connecting on 5-of-6 three-point field goals en route to 19 points and six rebounds.

Sophomore Jordan Schakel (14 points) and senior guard Devin Watson (13 points) rounded out the double-figure scoring Aztecs.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used a 23-0 run in the first half to cruise to a 99-46 victory at Viejas Arena over Division II member Cal State Dominguez Hills.

The 53-point victory was the fifth largest margin of victory in school history and the largest since an 83-point win over St. Katherine College on Dec. 27, 2013.

Four Aztecs scored in double figures led by sophomore forward Matt Mitchell's 20 points. Mitchell connected on 3-of-6 from beyond the arc en route to his fourth career 20-point scoring effort and second of the 2018-19 campaign.

Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels added 13 points, six rebounds and four assists for San Diego State.

The Aztecs, who were meeting Dominguez Hills for the first time, broke a two-game losing streak.

The game was tied at nine with 13:40 to play in the first half when the Aztecs went on their monster spurt. SDSU got points from eight different players during the 23-0 run - Jordan Schakel 5, Nolan Narain 4, Nathan Mensah 3, Adam Seiko 3, Devin Watson 3, Jeremy Hemsley 2, Matt Mitchell 2 and Jalen McDaniels. Dominguez Hills was held without a point for 7:45 during the SDSU run.

San Diego State dominated every statistical category, including rebounding (53-27), field goal percentage (49.3-30.9), three-point field goal percentage (51.9-12.5), assists (28-10) and turnovers forced (18-10).

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used an 18-3 run early in the first half, built a 20-point first half lead and were never threatened in a 90-81 victory over Brigham Young.

The Aztecs tied a school record by claiming its third consecutive victory in the series and defeated the Cougars in San Diego for the first time since Feb. 23, 2008.

San Diego State posted 90 points on the strength of 52.8 percent shooting from the field, 12 three-point field goals and 22 free throws. The Aztecs had 20 assists on their 28 made field goals.

It marked the second straight game SDSU has scored at least 90 points for the first time since Nov. 30 and Dec. 2, 2000.

Four San Diego State players reached double figures, led by senior guard Devin Watson.

Watson scored 23 points and added eight assists, four rebounds and three steals. The senior got to the free throw line 16 times (making 12) and recorded his fifth 20-point game of the season.

Sophomore Matt Mitchell scored 22 points, on the strength of 9-of-12 shooting from the field. Mitchell was instrumental in getting the Aztecs off to a good start, scoring six of SDSU's first seven points. It marked the 10th time in his career he has scored at least 15 points, with San Diego State posting a 9-1 record in those games.

Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had 14 points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals, while sophomore Jordan Schakel had 12 points, career-high eight rebounds and two assists.

San Diego State led 10-9 with 16:56 left in the first half before going on an 18-3 run to open up a 16-point advantage. After that, the Aztecs led by at least eight points the final 35:18 of the contest.

Brown's Travis Fuller, who played at La Costa Canyon High in northern San Diego County, rebounded to set up a 3-pointer by Cambridge.

Brown made 3s on its next four possessions, with Cambridge and Okolie alternating shots from behind the arc. Okolie's second 3 made it 41-20. The run continued with nine more points by Brown, with Cambridge hitting another 3 and Okolie making a turn-around jumper and a layup.

Cambridge went down hard after committing his third foul with 14 minutes left and got up favoring his right knee. He came out of the game but later returned.

Jalen McDaniels scored 19 and Arop 11 for SDSU, which was coming off a 90-81 win against Brigham Young.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State overcame a 19-point second half deficit to defeat CSUN, 65-60, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs overcame their second 19-point deficit to win for the second time this season. Against the Matadors, the Aztecs trailed 46-27 with 15:12 to play but closed the game on a 38-14 run to win their fourth straight game in the series.

Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels led the way for the Aztecs, recording his second double-double of the season with team-highs 20 points and 13 rebounds. Senior guard Devin Watson added 14 points (12 in the second half) and six assists, while senior guard Jeremy Hemsley tallied 13 points (10 in the second half).

For the second consecutive game, San Diego State struggled to score in the first half. The Aztecs connected on just 9-of-32 shots in the first half (28.1 percent) and 2-of-15 from three-point range (13.3 percent) prior to intermission. That helped enable CSUN to close the half on a 12-4 run in the final 4:29 of the first half and open a 32-21 halftime advantage.

Entering the game, SDSU had overcome a double-digit half-time deficit to win on three occasions in the last 23 seasons.

The deficit grew to 19 points in the opening minutes of the second half and the Aztecs trailed by 15 with 11:17 to play. SDSU got the deficit to eight points with a 7-0 run, on the strength of a bucket by McDaniels and consecutive field goals by Hemsley (5 points).

CSUN pushed the lead to 10 points but SDSU erased that with a 10-0 run. This time Watson (two treys) and Matt Mitchell (4 points) keyed the run.

CSUN led for the final time, 60-58, with 2:12 to play but SDSU took the lead for good by scoring on consecutive possessions, first on a Hemsley three (1:57) than a driving layup by Watson (1:02) put SDSU up for good.

The 19-point second-half deficit marked the second largest ever overcome by San Diego State in recorded history (since 1996-97).

Alex Hobbs added 18 points for the Broncos (7-8, 2-0 Mountain West Conference), who have won three of their last four games.

Boise State led by 23 late in the first half and went into the break with a 46-25 lead. San Diego State opened the second half with a 12-2 run to cut the deficit to eleven but that was as close as the Aztecs (8-6, 0-1) would get.

The loss snapped a San Diego State six-game Mountain West regular-season win streak and a nine-game win streak against teams from the Mountain West Conference.

Devin Watson had 24 points on 7-of-14 shooting from the field. It was his sixth 20-plus scoring game of the season, 10th while at San Diego State and 29th of his career. Watson led the Aztecs in scoring for the sixth time this season in 15th time in his career.

Jalen McDaniels added 14 points for San Diego State, which made just 3-of-21 from 3-point range. With the 14 points in Boise, McDaniels tallies 53 points in his last three games, averaging 18.3 points per game. He also tallied a team-high five rebounds for SDSU against the Broncos.

SAN DIEGO - Jalen McDaniels had 22 points and 12 rebounds, and Matt Mitchell scored 20 as SDSU ran past Wyoming 84-54 Tuesday night. Jordan Schakel scored 14 points and Devin Watson had 12 points and eight assists for the Aztecs (9-6, 1-1), who lost 88-64 Boise State on Saturday night.

After making only 3 of 21 3-point shots at BSU, the Aztecs made their first five from behind the arc — two each by Mitchell and Schakel — in taking a 23-9 lead against the Cowboys. They made 9 of 15 en route to a 48-25 halftime lead and 12 of 24 overall.

Jalen McDaniels notched his third double-double of the season and 12th of his career and led SDSU in scoring for the fifth time this season and 14th time of his career.

The Aztecs beat Wyoming for the 11th straight time at Viejas Arena. Four of SDSU's last 10 MWC wins have been by 30 points.

It was Wyoming's worst loss since Jan. 29, 2011, when fourth-ranked SDSU won 96-57.

Justin James scored 18, Hunter Thompson 11 and Trevon "TJ" Taylor 10 for Wyoming (4-12, 0-3), which lost for a third straight game and six of its last seven.

The Cowboys were without five players, including two of their top five scorers, Hunter Maldonado and Jake Hendricks. They added walk-on guard KC Henry, a redshirt sophomore, to the roster.

Nolan Narain was a scratch because he was still sore after a collision in the Boise State loss and senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had the flu and was sent home.

USAFA, Colo. — Lavelle Scottie and Ryan Swan recorded double-doubles for Air Force and the Falcons withstood a frantic second-half rally to defeat San Diego State, 62-48.

The Air Force victory, which snapped a three-game San Diego State win streak in the series, came in large part due to the performances of Swan (15 points and 15 rebounds) and Scottie (16 points and 11 rebounds).

SDSU was unable to win despite holding the Falcons to 39.0 percent field goal shooting and 32.1 percent from three-point range.

Neither team shot the ball well early, with San Diego State connecting on just 5-of-22 attempts (22.7 percent) from the floor in the first half and Air Force making 9-of-30 shots (30.0 percent). However, the Falcons were able to build a 28-14 halftime advantage on the strength of eight offensive rebounds in the first half (leading to 13 second-chance points) and forcing seven Aztec turnovers.

The Falcons pushed the lead to 16 points by scoring the first basket of the second half before the Aztecs started to chip away. Trailing 45-30 with 10 minutes to play, the Aztecs used a 14-3 run over the next four minutes to cut the deficit to four points. Jalen McDaniels capped the run with a shot to cut the Air Force advantage to 48-44.

However, on its next three offensive possessions, the Aztecs missed a pair of free throws and had consecutive turnovers (one of which led to an uncontested layup) to allow Air Force to open the game back up.

McDaniels continued his strong play, posting his second consecutive double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds. Senior guard Devin Watson added nine points, four rebounds and four assists. Freshman forward Nathan Mensah, making his second career start added four points and five rebounds.

SAN DIEGO — Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels scored 24 points and added 11 rebounds and senior guard Devin Watson made three three-pointers in the opening four minutes of the second half as San Diego State cruised to a 97-77 victory over New Mexico at Viejas Arena.

McDaniels recorded his personal best third consecutive double-double and reached the 20-point plateau for the fifth time this season as the Aztecs won their eighth straight conference home game.

The Aztecs tied their Mountain West Conference high for points in a regulation game (97) and set a program best for assists in an MWC game with 30.

San Diego State never trailed but led by only two points in the closing moments of the first half when freshman forward Aguek Arop stole the ball and made a 65-foot heave at the first half buzzer to give the Aztecs a five-point advantage.

SDSU led by eight points with 14:47 to play before utilizing an 11-3 run to provide further cushion. McDaniels had nine points during the decisive run and had 14 of his 21 points after intermission.

San Diego State shot 55.1 percent for the game and has now won 57 straight home games when shooting at least 50 percent from the floor.

In all five players reached double figures for the Aztecs. Watson ended the game with 21 points on 5-of-7 shooting from three-point range. In just his third career start Nathan Mensah was 7-for-7 from the field and ended the game with 16 points and seven rebounds.

New Mexico was led by Anthony Mathis with 21 points and Vance Jackson with 16 points.

FRESNO, Calif. — Braxton Huggins had a career-high 20 points with eight rebounds and five assists, Nate Grimes added 13 points and 16 rebounds and Fresno State rallied from a 20-point, first-half deficit to beat San Diego State 66-62 on Tuesday night.

Fresno State took its first lead, since 2-0, midway through the second half when Grimes's putback made it 52-51. Sam Bittner was fouled on a 3-pointer with 1:06 remaining and hit 2 of 3 free throws for a 63-58 lead, and Huggins made two more on their next possession.

Bittner, who had five points at halftime, sparked the second-half comeback with three early 3-pointers and finished with 18 points for Fresno State (14-4, 5-1 Mountain West). Deshon Taylor, averaging 16.6 points per game, fouled out on a charging call with 2:04 remaining.

Fresno State has won six of the last eight games in the series.

Jalen McDaniels had 19 points and 10 rebounds for San Diego State (10-8, 2-3). Jeremy Hemsley added 14 and Devin Watson 13.

Hemsley scored 10 points in the first half to help SDSU build a 39-26 lead as Fresno State was held to 8-of-27 shooting (29.6 percent). McDaniels' putback with 12.7 seconds remaining in the game was SDSU's only field goal in the final four minutes.

McDaniels continued his solid play by recording his fourth consecutive double-double. Prior to this stretch, the sophomore had never posted more than two straight double-doubles. During his last seven games, McDaniels is averaging 19.4 points, 9.7 rebounds and is shooting 56.0 percent from the field.

Hemsley moved into 13th place on the school's all-time scoring list. The senior passed Kyle Spain and Xavier Thames and now has 1,242 career points.

SAN DIEGO — Jalen McDaniels had a career-high 30 points and 13 rebounds for his fifth straight double-double as San Diego State defeated UNLV 94-77 on Saturday night at Viejas Arena.

SDSU (11-8, 3-3 Mountain West) led by 11 points at halftime, and unlike in its last game against Fresno State, it didn't squander an early double-digit advantage. The Aztecs extended their bulge to 19 points about five minutes into the second half and cruised in for the win.

UNLV (11-8, 5-2) was led by Joel Ntambwe's 19 points in losing its sixth straight game at SDSU and for the 13th time in the teams' last 14 meetings. The Rebels squandered a chance to pull into a tie atop the conference standings with Nevada being idle and Fresno State losing at Colorado State.

McDaniels, who entered the game averaging nearly 20 points over his last seven games, was bothersome to the Rebels. Kawhi Leonard, during the 2010-11 season, was the last Aztecs player with five consecutive double-doubles.

UNLV entered the game among the conference leaders in numerous offensive categories but missed seven of its first eight shots as the Aztecs raced to a nine-point lead in the opening four minutes.

Amauri Hardy hit a 3-pointer, UNLV's sixth of the game, to cut the deficit to 29-27 but the Rebels missed a chance to tie the game on their following possession. McDaniels sandwiched a pair of 3-point plays around a layup by Watson to push the lead back into double figures about 2 1/2 minutes later.

McDaniels scored a career-high with 30 points (previous: 26 vs. Xavier, 11-20-18) and became just the sixth player in the last 23 years to record at least 30 points, 13 rebounds, five steals and four assists in the same game. The last was LSU's Ben Simmons on Dec. 2, 2015, who went onto be the No. 1 NBA Draft pick in 2016.

SAN DIEGO — With a revenge win against Air Force well in hand, all that was left Wednesday night was for San Diego State's Jalen McDaniels to secure his sixth straight double-double.

McDaniels got it all right, on a jumper with 2:38 to go. He finished with 11 points and 11 rebounds in SDSU's 66-51 victory, the first time in more than a month the Aztecs have won consecutive games.

His six straight double-doubles are the most at SDSU since Michael Cage had a school-record eight straight in 1983-84. McDaniels came in tied with Kawhi Leonard (2010-11) with five, the most at the school in the Mountain West era, which started in 1999-2000.

Devin Watson scored 15 points, Jeremy Hemsley 14 and Matt Mitchell 11 for the Aztecs (12-8, 4-3), who avenged a 62-48 loss at Air Force on Jan. 12. McDaniels came in leading the Aztecs with 16.8 points and 8.4 rebounds.

SDSU was coming off a 94-77 home win against UNLV on Saturday night. This is the first time SDSU won consecutive games since beating Cal State Dominguez Hills on Dec. 12 and BYU on Dec. 22, both at home. SDSU hit 7 of 12 3-pointers in taking a 36-19 halftime lead.

Unlike the game at Air Force earlier this month, the Aztecs never trailed. With the Falcons struggling against a zone defense, the Aztecs quickly built an 18-7 lead thanks in part to 3-pointers by Mitchell, Adam Seiko, McDaniels and Hemsley. Air Force got within single digits only once more.

SDSU outrebounded Air Force 38-27 and had 18 assists. In the loss at Air Force, the Aztecs had only one assist in the first half.

SAN JOSE, Calif. — Devin Watson and Jalen McDaniels combined to score 49 points and San Diego State picked up its third straight victory, knocking off San Jose State 67-56 on Saturday night.

San Diego State swept the season series with the Spartans last year and now have won 10 of the last 11 meetings between the programs.

The Aztecs took control early, with Matt Mitchell and McDaniels hitting back-to-back 3s to start the game and rolling to a quick 16-3 lead over the first five minutes. San Jose State rallied and Michael Steadman scored at the basket with just over two minutes left in the first half to get within a field goal, but Watson scored on a layup to send San Diego State into intermission with a 25-21 advantage.

McDaniels hit two jumpers and a 3 to push the Aztecs lead to 32-23 to start the second half.

Watson hit 5 of 11 from long range and finished with 27 points to lead the Aztecs (13-8, 5-3 Mountain West). McDaniels had 22 points and grabbed nine rebounds.

Craig LeCesne had 14 points and Steadman pulled down 11 rebounds for San Jose State (3-18, 0-9).

Watson scored a season-high and game-high 27 points and it was his eighth game this season with 20 or more points and the 31st time in his career. He led the Aztecs in scoring for the eighth time this season and the 17th time in his career and led the Aztecs in assists for the 16th time this season and the 28th time in his career. Watson scored in double figures for the fifth straight game, 18th time this season and 83rd time in his career. He now has 1,608 career points.

The Aztecs were in eighth place in the Mountain West Conference entering play on Jan. 26 (one week ago today). The Aztecs are now alone in fourth place in the league.
