#GoLobos at a Glance (#GoLobos)

The Season:

The University of New Mexico Lobos are 1-2 on the season and 0-1 in the Mountain West after dropping a 28-14 decision to Boise State on Thursday night in front of a national audience on ESPN. The Lobos played most of the game with third-string quarterback Coltin Gerhart after Lamar Jordan was knocked out of the game after a targeting hit on him for the second straight week, and backup Tevaka Tuioti didn't make the trip due to injury. Tulsa also dropped to 1-2 after losing on a 35-yard field goal at the gun, 54-51 at Toledo.

The Coaches:

The University of New Mexico Lobos are coached by Bob Davie, who is 28-38 in his sixth season with the Lobos, and he is 63-63 overall in his 11th season. He spent his first five seasons as a head coach manning the Notre Dame Fighting Irish. After leading the Lobos to back-to-back bowl games, Davie has now been the head coach for five bowl teams, three at Notre Dame and two at New Mexico. He is looking to become just the second coach in UNM history to lead the Lobos to three straight bowl games. Philip Montgomery is 17-12 in his third season with Tulsa, coming to the Golden Hurricane after spending time as the offensive coordinator at Baylor. Montgomery is also looking to take Tulsa to a third straight bowl game.

All player interviews must be arranged through the UNM athletics communications office. The main time for interviews is after practice. Wednesday is the last day for player interviews. For lengthier interviews, please call the communications office to arrange, which we are happy to do, working around class schedules. These will normally take place in the communications suite in the Maloof Center.

Postgame: The UNM locker room is closed. Requested players will be brought to an area to be determined after home games and outside the locker room for road games.

For road games, all interviews will be posted to UNM's Media Dropbox account, along with selected highlights. These are provided for your usage, but please credit LoboTV.

Game Credentials

For media members picking up credentials at will call without parking passes, it is located in the Northeast corner of the stadium by Gate 7 or 8. For media members picking up with parking passes, credentials will be located at the University Drive entrance to the Baseball & Pit East lots with the parking attendant. This should allow you to get your credential without having to wait in line or deal with parking on the north side of the stadium.

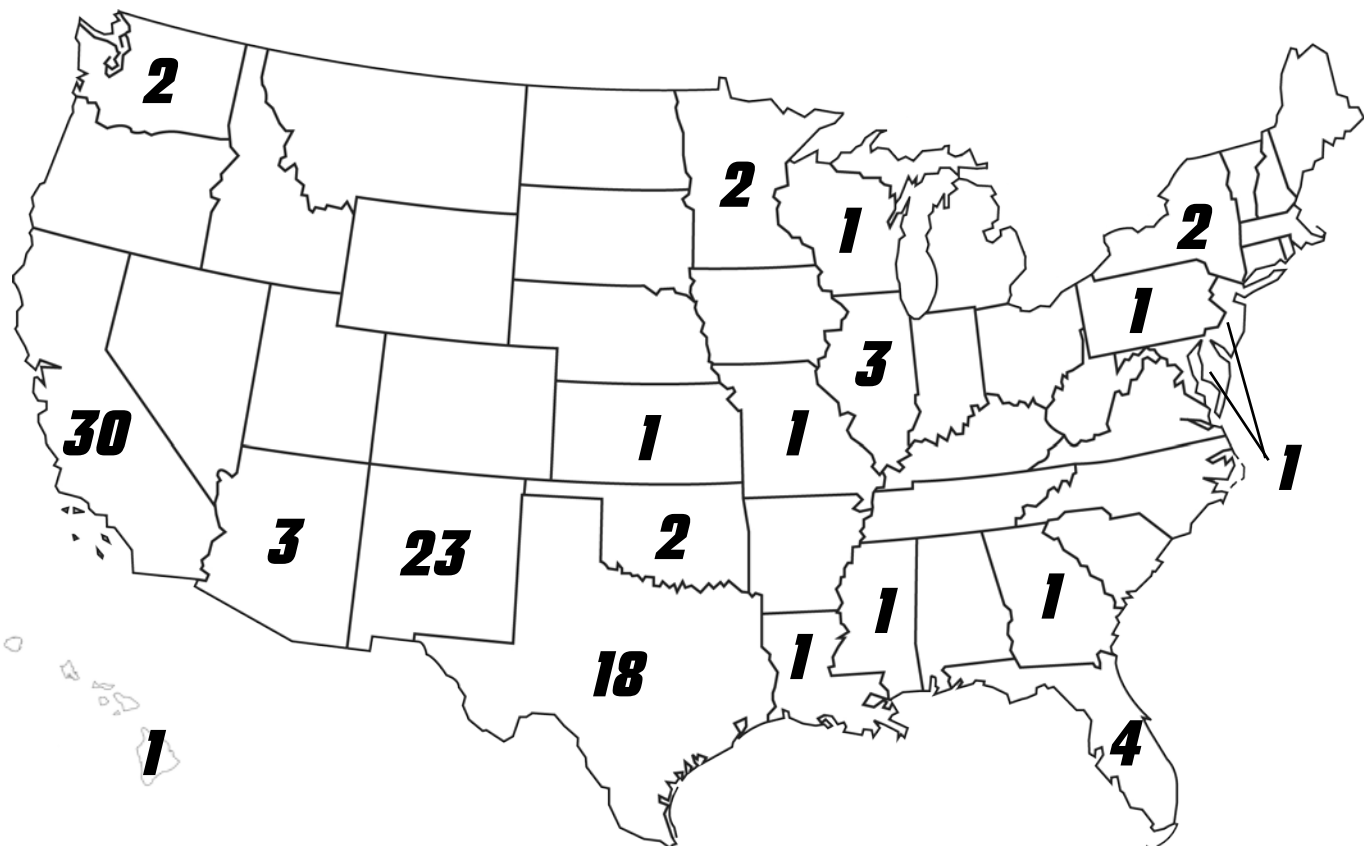

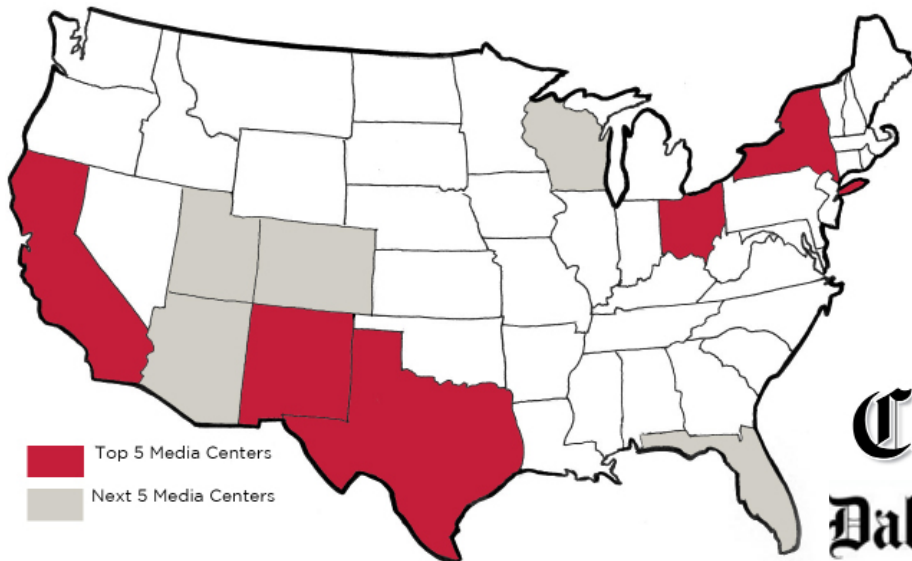

Carry You There

The Lobos have pulled off an interesting trick, and against Boise State it continued. The Lobos, in their last six games, have had six different leading rushers. No repeats either, it's been six straight different student-athletes. It started against Colorado State in 2016 when Tyrone Owens led the team with 157 yards rushing against the Rams. The next week it was Teriyon Gipson leading the team with 217 yards rushing against Wyoming. In the bowl game it was Lamar Jordan's turn to lead the team in rushing, doing so with 81 yards against UTSA.

Fast forward to 2017, and Romell Jordan led the team in rushing with 65 yards against Abilene Christian in the opener, following by Jay Griffin IV with 61 against New Mexico State. Then against Boise State it was Coltin Gerhart with 49 yards against Boise State.

In order to get this odd streak to seven, UNM could be led in rushing by Daryl Chestnut, Richard McQuarley, quarterback Tevaka Tuioti or a receiver other than Jay Griffin IV.

Give a Little

At some point, the odds need to give a little regarding a very weird statistical anomaly. New Mexico this season has fumbled the ball five times, and they have lost all five of those. This season, 18 teams have lost every fumble that they have committed, but only New Mexico and Syracuse have fumbled five times and lost all five. There are three times (Arkansas State, Illinois and Virginia) that have also fumbled at least five times, but they have actually lost none.

This season in the FBS there have been 511 fumbles, and 270 of those resulted in a turnover, or 52.8% of the time. In the last five seasons, UNM not only hasn't been close to the 100% rate, New Mexico under Bob Davie has never lost even half the fumbles committed, making the first three games a very strange start indeed.

The Great Divide

The game vs. Tulsa will definitely showcase a great divide between styles. Tulsa's play clock operator doesn't have a bunch to do when they are on offense, as the Golden Hurricane have run 278 plays on offense in its first three games, averaging 92.7 plays for game. That total is good for second nationally, one play behind USF, which has run 279 plays and is averaging 93.0 plays per game.

New Mexico ranks 91st nationally (out of 130 teams) with 200 plays, an average of 66.7 plays per game.

The irony is both teams are averaging exactly 5.9 yards per play.

Fired Up

SportsOnEarth.com's Matt Brown has named Bob Davie's Lobos as the Most Entertaining Team to watch in the Mountain West, and one of the Most Entertaining Teams in all of college football.

Here's some of what Brown had to say about the team. "Davie has done a fantastic job with the Lobos, embracing an explosive running offense that led the nation in both yards per carry (6.6) and yards per

game (350) last season, when they went 9-4 for their best season in nearly a decade. They have a veteran quarterback in Lamar Jordan, and while they lose top rusher Teriyon Gipson, they have three players who ran for over 650 yards last year, plus solid experience on the offensive line."

Brown added, "The Lobos are in a tough Mountain West Mountain Division that should be entertaining as a whole, with star QBs in Boise State's Brett Rypien and Wyoming's Josh Allen, a potentially dangerous Colorado State offense and Air Force's option attack. So, yes, nearly this entire division would be a good answer here, but New Mexico exists as a wild card that is capable of piling up yards and springing upsets, making the Lobos intriguing to follow."

Tearing It Down

For the third straight game, the Lobo defense took the opponents rushing attacking, tearing it down to size. The Lobos allowed just eight yards against Abilene Christian, and then 99 against New Mexico State. On Thursday night the Lobos allowed Boise State just 127 yards. UNM is now allowing an average of 78.0 yards per game, and that number is good for seventh nationally in rushing defense.

While there is a lot of season left, UNM's best defensive season against the rush was in 2003, when the team allowed an average of 86.1 yards per game (1,119 yards in 13 games)

The eight yards rushing allowed should hold up for a while in the national top 10 list for the fewest yards allowed rushing in a game this year. Additionally, UNM is keeping some pretty good company in the top 10 list of rushing defenses so far. Here are the top 10 this season for fewest rushing yards allowed in a single game, and then fewest rushing yards per game as a team.

Look at You

The Lobos now have won 11 conference games over the last two seasons, and that's the most conference wins in back-to-back seasons in school history.

11 wins (1 time): **2015-16 (5-3, 6-2 - Bob Davie)**

10 wins (4 times): 1970-71 (5-1, 5-1 - Rudy Feldman); 1982-83 (6-1, 4-3 Joe Morrison/Joe Lee Dunn); 2002-03 (5-2, 5-2 - Rocky Long); 2003-04 (5-2, 5-2 - Rocky Long)

Rocky Long's 2002-04 Lobos have the record for most conference wins in three year span, with 15. UNM is four wins short of tying that mark.

This Time Around

The New Mexico Lobos at one time, not all that long ago, were not thought of very highly. In 2012, every publication that came out with a ranking of all 127 college football teams ranked the Lobos in the exact same spot.

USA Today? 127.
Orlando Sentinel? 127.
Anyone else? 127.

Well, those Lobos do not exist. Nothing shows the progress of the New Mexico Lobos under Bob Davie than the 1-128 list published by College Football News, which listed the Lobos No. 51 in the nation, predicting an 8-4 regular season record. The publication has New Mexico listed as the fourth team from the Mountain West, and the Lobos are listed ahead of 24 Power 5 conference teams, including Mississippi State (53), Syracuse (54), Ole Miss (56), Pitt (57), Michigan State (59), Missouri (62), Kentucky (67), Baylor (68), Vanderbilt (69) and Texas Tech (70).

Sure About It

The postseason media was truly kind to New Mexico and its 9-4 bowl winning season. USA Today gave a letter grade to all 128 FBS teams, and the Lobos came out with an A, one of just 15 teams with either an A or an A+. In addition, USA Today also ranked the top 10 coaching performances of the 2016 season, and Bob Davie's work with the team was listed among the top 10.

It's easy to see why with a rushing offense that has finished in the top 10 in all five of Coach Davie's seasons, and a defense that has now chopped 50 yards or more from its defensive average the last three seasons. Last year the Lobos led the nation in rushing yards per game, total rushing yards, and yards per carry, as well as setting school records for total offense, rushing offense, and scoring offense.

Runaway Run

Last year, New Mexico led the nation in explosive runs, leading the entire country in runs of 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60 and 70 yards. While UNM has still gotten some really big runs as the Lobos sit in the top 10 in total numbers of rushes of 40, 50, and 60 yards, it's the difference in the 10 yards runs that is most alarming.

Last year in leading the nation, UNM had 129 runs of 10 yards or more, an average of 9.9 runs per game. This season through three games, UNM has had just 15 such runs, an average 5.0 runs per game. Should UNM stay on this average, the Lobos would record just 65, or one less than half of last year's total.

Waiting for This

While it has seemed like Jason Sanders flew under everyone's radar in 2016, perhaps he is starting to get some much due respect in 2017. Sanders, who was nearly perfect kicking last season and was the nation's top kickoff man, was one of 30 kickers named to the initial Lou Groza Watch List, as announced by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission.

Sanders is the fifth Lobo kicker to make a Groza Watch List, joining Vladimir Borombozin (2001), Wes Zunker (2003), Kenny Byrd (2005 and 2006) and James Aho (2009). Sanders is one of five Mountain West kickers on the list, joining San Diego State's John Baron II, San Jose State's Bryce Crawford, Fresno State's Kody Kroening and Air Force's Luke Strelbel.

Sanders is already off to a good start in 2017 after his stellar 2016. He did miss on a 53-yard yard kick at the end of the first half against Boise State, ending a string of 12 straight makes. He added two extra points and had 10 touchbacks on 14 kickoffs. Sanders now has made 90 career extra points and is 10 away from tying for the UNM career record. Of his four kickoffs that haven't been touchbacks, the average starting field position of those four possessions is the 14-yard line.

Sanders now has hit 79 of his last 98 kickoffs for touchbacks.

The Award is named for National Football League Hall of Fame kicker Lou "The Toe" Groza, who played 21 seasons with the Cleveland Browns. Groza won four NFL championships with Cleveland and was named NFL Player of the Year in 1954. Although an All-Pro offensive lineman as well, Groza ushered in the notion that there should be a place on an NFL roster for a kicker.

Byron Bell **Tennessee Titans** **Offensive Tackle**
Bell was an undrafted free agent and is his sixth season in the NFL and second with Tennessee after four with the Panthers. He has started 72 games in his NFL career, playing in 78 of 80 games.

Jhurrell Pressley **Atlanta Falcons** **Running Back**
Pressley was signed to the practice squad of Green Bay before being released, and then he was signed to Atlanta's practice squad. He is entering his second NFL season.

Glover Quin **Detroit Lions** **Safety**
Quin is in his ninth season in the NFL, and fifth with Detroit. Glover was a 4th round draft choice, and the 112th overall pick by the Houston Texans in 2009. He has played in 118 out of a possible 119 games in his career with 541 total tackles, 3.0 sacks, five forced fumbled, four fumble recoveries, 20 interceptions and 73 passes defended.

Marquis Bundy **New York Giants** **Wide Receiver**
Bundy is in his first season with the Giants after spending part of the 2016 season with the Arizona Cardinals, getting signed to the practice squad after week 12. He joined the Giants in 2017 camp and is on their practice squad.

Something Going Round

Corey Bojorquez joined Jason Sanders on a watch list, getting listed to the Ray Guy Watch List. Bojorquez is averaging 45.9 yards per punt this season, with six of his 15 punts going for over 50 yards, including a 77-yarder against New Mexico State. He has also pinned three punts inside the 20.

Bojorquez may very well push Ben Skaer's UNM record for punting average in a season, as Ben averaged 45.8 yards per punt in 2013. Bojorquez currently has a 43.0 career average and that would top Mike Nesbitt, who averaged 42.9 yards per punt over the 1992-93 seasons.

Last season Corey Bojorquez hit an 80-yard punt, which is the second-longest in UNM history. The Lobo punter was at it again this season with a 77-yarder in the second quarter against NMSU. That punt was the sixth-longest in school history

Look at You

Over its last 18 Mountain West games going back to 2014, the Lobos are 12-6 in conference play. This 12-6 mark is a winning percentage of .667. So, how much progress have the Lobos made under Bob Davie? There might be no better single stat than this... New Mexico has won 12 conference games in the last 18. To get to the previous 12 conference wins, you would have to go back 61 games as UNM was 12-49, which is a winning percentage of .197, and it's also back into the presidency of George Bush.

Speechless

Not only does New Mexico succeed on the field, but they succeed in the classroom as well. For 2016, the Lobos picked up 19 Mountain West All-Academic selections, tying for the second-most in the history of the program and equaling the 19 from last season. The school record was under Coach Davie as well, in 2014 when the team picked up 20. Overall the 58 honorees over the last three years is the best three-year stretch in school history.

The Lobos in 2016 had a team GPA of 2.68, and that was the second-best grade point average over the past 30 Fall semesters. In addition, the Lobos also had a First Team CoSIDA Academic All-America selection in Garrett Adcock, the first since Vince Natali in 2007.

The Lobos also had five players, Dakota Cox, Javohn Jones, James McNeely, Jake Rothschilder and Kyle Rothschilder all earn Mountain West scholar-athlete.

The University of New Mexico now has had nine in the last six seasons, and it could have been 10, but Elijah Lilly's 100-yard return for a touchdown was called back against the Aggies due to a holding call. Thinking 'Bout Somethin'

Bob Davie is one of only two Lobo coaches to record two non-conference wins in each of his first five seasons at the helm of the Lobos. The only other Lobo coach to ever win at least two non-conference match-ups in the same season was Ted Shipkey, who did it from 1937-41, and no coach has ever done it over his first six seasons. With the win over Abilene Christian, Coach Davie is halfway there. Here are a few things that did not exist the last time a Lobo coach won at least two non-conference games in his first five seasons:

World War I (World War II hadn't started yet, so World War I was referred to as the Great War.)

Daylight Savings Time (started in 1942)

Anne Frank's Diary (she started writing it on her 13th birthday in 1942)

Stephen Hawking (he was born in 1942)

Color Film (Eastman Kodak invented it in 1942)

Chemotherapy (This was first tested in 1942 by Alfred Gilman, Louis S. Goodman and Frederick S. Philips)

Breaking 5,000

The Lobos hit the 5,000-yard mark for the season in the penultimate game of the 2016 season and it marked the eighth time in school history that UNM has broken the 5,000-yard mark. UNM then set the school record for total yards in the bowl game. After doing it just once from 1995-2011, the 5,000-yard mark has now happened in three of Bob Davie's five seasons. Here are all eight seasons of 5,000 yards for New Mexico football.

UNM over a 12 game season needs to average 416.7 yards per game in total offense. UNM is currently averaging 396.0 yards per game, and over the course of a 13-game season (counting a bowl), that would equate to 5,148 yards for the season, which would tie for sixth-best in school history.

Look at You

New Mexico set a pair of school records in terms of scoring in 2016, with a 36.7 points per game, and 477 points. UNM has averaged 30 or more points in a season eight times, but no season has finished above 34.0 until last year. UNM is currently averaging 26.7 points per game.

Bob Davie completed his fifth season at The University of New Mexico, where he has led the program to back-to-back bowls, a 2016 Gildan New Mexico Bowl win and tremendous national respect. The Lobos under Davie have now won 11 of their 14 regular season home games and have set a school record with 11 conference wins over the last two seasons. Last year UNM qualified for the 2015 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, the first bowl game for the Lobos since 2007.

Davie's 26 wins in his first five seasons already has him seventh on the career wins list at UNM, and he has helped the program achieve levels not seen in Albuquerque for many years. Yet it's how he has been able to do it that is what has Lobo fans excited for the program.

Davie has completely flipped and turned his rosters over, combining an energetic mix of talent from Texas and California while averaging nearly 25 native New Mexican players per season on the roster, with many of those major contributors.

After a big season in 2015 which saw UNM go 7-5 and tie for second place in the Mountain Division of the Mountain West, his team not only met that mark but surpassed it in 2016 as New Mexico went 8-4 overall and 6-2 in the Mountain Division, tying for first place and delivering UNM's first division title since 1997. The Lobos defeated four 2016 bowl teams in Air Force (45-40), Hawai'i (28-21), Wyoming (56-35) and UTSA (23-20), giving the program seven wins over bowl teams in the last two years after going seven straight seasons without a win over a bowl team. The 2016 Lobos feature the nation's best rushing attack, as UNM leads the nation in rushing yards, yards per game, yards per rush, and runs of 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60 and 70 yards. The 2016 squad has also set school records for total points scored, points per game, and total offense, nearly hitting the 6,000-yard mark.

The Lobos also tied for the most conference wins in a single season, going 6-2, a mark that was also accomplished in 1982 and 1997. In addition, the Lobos have excelled on national television, winning four games on ESPN's various networks, including a pair of games in November on ESPN2 with a 24-21 win at Utah State and 56-35 over Wyoming, a game in which UNM totaled 690 yards of total offense and 568 yards on the ground.

Defensively, UNM showed vast improvement in its rushing defense, going from 98th nationally to top 40. Dakota Cox led the team in tackles, marking the first time that a Lobo has ever led the team in tackles four straight seasons. Once again, New Mexico got three defensive scores, making UNM one of eight teams in the last two years to register three defensive touchdowns in 2015 and 2016. UNM's defense also had a stretch in 2016 where it allowed 350 yards or less in three straight game, the first time since 2007 it accomplished that feat. The Lobos had eight players earn All-MW honors, including four on the second team.

Last season was the start of UNM's resurgence under Davie, going 7-5 in the regular season and 5-3 in the Mountain West, good for second place in the Mountain West's Mountain Division and a berth in the 2015 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, which UNM fought down to the wire in a 45-37 loss to Arizona. UNM picked up four All-Mountain West honors, including a Second Team selection as a returner for Carlos Wiggins. The Lobos also picked up 19 Mountain West All-Academic honors, the second-highest total in program history.

An overall hallmark of the program under Davie has been special teams, as UNM's nine touchdowns on kickoff returns over his first five seasons are tied with Kansas State for the most in the FBS over that time frame.

And the success and improvement isn't just on the field ... it's off it. Under Davie, the Lobos have picked up 69 Mountain West All-Academic selections, including a program record 20 in 2014, and 19 in 2015, the second-best total for football in school history. UNM also had five Mountain West Scholar-Athletes in 2013, the second-best total among the MW's 12 football programs. In 2016, Garrett Adcock was UNM's first CoSIDA Academic All-American in eight years, earning first team honors.

Over his time, the Lobos have posted the second-highest single semester GPA in program history (Spring of 2016) and two of the top three Fall semester GPAs in program history (Fall of 2013 and Fall of 2015).

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — Lamar Jordan threw for a career-high 213 yards and a touchdown as New Mexico rolled to 481 yards of offense, and combined that with a stellar defensive effort for a 38-14 season-opening win over Abilene Christian. The win was UNM's eighth in the last nine games dating back to last season, and its third in a row.

Defensively, UNM put forth a terrific effort, scoring a touchdown and limiting the Wildcats to just eight yards rushing and 4.98 yards per passing attempt. The touchdown came in the fourth quarter after the Wildcats recovered a fumbled punt at the UNM 6-yard line. On fourth down from the UNM 5-yard line, Dallas Sealey's pass was picked off by Jake Rothschilder, and the defensive captain weaved his way 91 yards for his first career score.

UNM's defense actually got off to a slow start. After Richard McQuarley was stopped on fourth and goal at the 1-yard line, Abilene Christian drove 99 yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead. However, UNM would roll to the next 38 points in putting the contest away.

First, the Lobos answered on a five-play, 71-yard drive highlighted by a Jordan to Chris Davis 27-yard pass. Another pass, this to Delane Hart-Johnson, set up Daryl Chestnut's first touchdown of the evening, a four-yarder for a 7-7 tie. After a missed 51-yard field goal by ACU, UNM went to the air again with Hart-Johnson hauling in a 47-yard bomb. Tyrone Owens then scored two plays later to make it 14-7, and the score stayed that way through halftime.

In the third UNM scored on its opening possession with a 75-yard drive that took eight plays. On that eighth play, Chestnut got a crucial block from Romell Jordan, springing him like a bullet for a 54-yard touchdown. Rothschilder on the next drive sacked Sealey, forcing a fumble that Alex Hart recovered, leading to a 25-yard Jason Sanders field goal, making it 24-7.

It stayed that way until the fourth and Rothschilder's 91-yard touchdown. UNM got its last score when on fourth and six from the Abilene Christian 36, Jordan lofted a pass down the sideline that was hauled in by Jay Griffin IV for his first career catch and touchdown, making it 38-7.

ACU tacked on a touchdown with 14 seconds left to account for the final score.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — It was nearly the greatest comeback in Lobo football history.

Nearly.

Down 30-5 in the fourth quarter, New Mexico, behind backup redshirt freshman quarterback Tevaka Tuioti, went on a furious rally, but it fell just short as a potential tying 2-point conversion was knocked away and New Mexico State escaped with a 30-28 win in front of 32,427 fans, the largest home crowd for the Lobos since the 2009 Rio Grande Rivalry matchup.

After entering the fourth quarter down 30-5, the Lobos scored the final 23 points of the game as they found their rhythm late. Backup quarterback Tevaka Tuioti spurred the UNM comeback with a five-yard touchdown pass to Chris Davis, but the failed two-point conversion kept the score at 30-11. Two minutes later, Jay Griffin IV ran the ball 61 yards into the end zone, and this time a successful two-point attempt made the score 30-19. The Lobos then cut the lead to eight points on their next possession with a 22-yard field goal. The field goal came about after it looked like Tyrone Owens was going to waltz into the end zone, but he got tripped up by the feet on one of his own linemen.

UNM got the ball back after a three-and-out with 2:38 on the clock needing 80 yards. After an incomplete pass, Tuioti hit Delane Hart-Johnson near midfield. Then Griffin caught a pass to move inside Aggie territory. After a false start, Rafael Hidalgo, seeing his first career action, made a 13-yard catch, and Romell Jordan picked up the first down on third-and-two.

With 1:11 left on the game clock, Tuioti completed a 19-yard touchdown pass to the Griffin IV, giving the Lobos a chance to tie with a two-point conversion, but the attempt failed and the Aggies recovered the UNM onside kick to run the clock out.

The Lobos compiled 226 of their total 430 yards of offense in the fourth quarter, and Tuioti threw his first career touchdown pass with 12:42 on the clock before adding another score to finish the night with 151 passing yards.

The Lobos struggled to take care of the ball, finishing the night with four turnovers for the first time since a 40-7 loss to BYU on Nov. 20, 2010. Lamar Jordan failed to find his stride, throwing two interceptions while compiling 103 yards in the air. Jay Griffin IV led the Lobos with 61 yards rushing and 95 receiving, while Chris Davis added another 81 on the ground including his first career touchdown.

On the other side, the NMSU offense compiled 500 total yards of offense, with Tyler Rogers throwing for 401 yards and four scores. Larry Rose III rushed for an additional 99 yards on 21 carries.

BOISE, Idaho --- The New Mexico Lobos' defense kept them in the game, but in the end it wasn't enough to overcome a stout Boise State defense as the Lobos dropped a 28-14 decision in Boise to fall to 1-2 on the season and 0-1 in the Mountain West.

UNM stayed close the whole way, but got into trouble on offense when Lamar Jordan took a vicious late hit after throwing the ball away from Chase Hatada, who was ejected for targeting. Unfortunately, UNM lost the services of Jordan for the game as he was injured and couldn't return. With Tevaka Tuioti, the author of UNM's near comeback last week vs. New Mexico State back in Albuquerque with an injury, that left it up to Coltin Gerhart. Gerhart was not just taking his first snaps for UNM, but his first snaps since high school in 2013.

UNM fell behind after fumbling the ball on the opening drive, a drive which saw UNM move into Bronco territory. BSU got a 28-yard touchdown run from Montell Cozart in his first start at quarterback for a 7-0 lead. UNM answered early in the second quarter when Tyrone Owens took a pitch and scored from 5 yards out to make it 7-7, but BSU answered right back with an 8-play, 91-yard drive capped by a short touchdown catch by Jake Roh.

It stayed that way until just before half, when Jordan was knocked out of the game. Gerhart came in and led UNM into BSU territory, but a 53-yard field goal attempt by Jason Sanders was long enough but wide to the left. That kept the game 14-7, and it stayed that way until the fourth.

UNM's defense kept them in the game until early in the fourth quarter, when after getting pinned at its own 1-yard line, UNM was forced to punt from there, and BSU took the ensuing possession for a short 17-yard touchdown drive, capping it off with a trick-play touchdown as the tight end Roh took a direct snap for a 6-yard touchdown. Roh added another touchdown catch to make it 28-7 with 3:11 left.

Down 28-7, Gerhart threw a 14-yard touchdown to Anselem Umeh for his first career touchdown pass and Umeh's first career catch to make it 28-14. BSU recovered the onside kick and then took a pair of kneel-downs to end it.

UNM took a lot of chances, converting a fake punt for a first down and going 2-for-4 on fourth down, with one of the misses actually a conversion before the McQuarley fumble. UNM also tried a flea flicker in the fourth quarter that looked open but Gerhart was hit as he threw and the ball was picked off.

However, it was UNM's stout defense that kept it close, throwing five three-and-outs and allowing just 5.4 yards per play. UNM's offense was limited to just 267 yards on the night, outgaining Boise State 277-264.
