GAELS HEAD WEST TO FACE NEW MEXICO

The Iona College men's basketball team (1-0) embarks on a nine-game trip away from New Rochelle tonight when it faces the Mountain West's New Mexico at Dreamstyle Arena. Both teams won their respective season openers last week. The Gaels come into the season with a squad featuring just two returning performers and eight new faces. With the loss of all but two of their top three scorers from last year Iona seeks a sixth NCAA tournament appearance in the last nine seasons.

IONA VS. NEW MEXICO - SERIES HISTORY

The two teams meet for the second time in history and the first time in 59 seasons. Iona topped the Lobos 62-59 at the Westchester County Center in White Plains, N.Y., on December 21, 1959.

SCOUTING NEW MEXICO

- New Mexico held off Cal Sate Northridge 87-84 in its season opener on the road.
- Four players recorded double digit scoring totals led by Corey Manigault's 16. Makuach Maluach and Dane Kuiper posted 15 and Anthony Mathis had 12 in the win.
- New Mexico was picked to finish third in the 11 team Mountain West Conference in preseason media poll. The Lobos finished third in the MWC regular season before falling to San Diego State in the tournament's championship game.

IONA VERSUS THE MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

The Gaels are 7-4 all-time versus current Mountain West Conference members after splitting two games with Nevada in 2016. The Wolfpack have been the most frequent foes, with the series tied at 2-2 following Iona's win in the 2016 Great Alaska Shootout championship game. The Gaels are 1-2 vs. UNLV, and 1-0 vs. Air Force, Fresno State, New Mexico and Utah State.

THE LONG ROAD AHEAD

- Tonight's game is the first of nine straight games away from to the Hynes Center.
- Iona returns home on Dec. 30 to face Holy Cross.
- It will be the second time in nine seasons under Cluess the Maroon & Gold nine games in a row away from home, matching the single-season program record set in the team's NCAA at-large season of 2011-12.
- Iona played eight games in a row away from home in 1979-80 and 2006-07.
- The all-time program record is 10 games away from home, wrapping around the last two seasons (2015-16 & 2016-17 and 2016-17 & 2017-18).

HOOP DREAMS VS. REBOUND

- Iona junior **Tajuan Agee** is a relative of Arthur Agee, a former Chicago-area high school player whose life was chronicled in the 1994 documentary, "Hoop Dreams".
- New Mexico junior **Corey Manigault** is a nephew of Harlem playground legend Earl "The Goat" Manigault, who was portrayed in the 1996 movie "Rebound: The Legend of Earl Manigault."

IONA IN SEASON OPENERS

- The Gaels have posted a 50-22 record in their first game of the season since 1945.
- Iona opened the season at the Hynes Center for the first time in four seasons, third time in nine seasons under head coach Tim Cluess (3-0) and the 17th time in history (16-2).

MCGILL, CRAWFORD NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MAAC

- Seniors **Ricky McGill** and junior **E.J. Crawford** were selected to the Preseason All-MAAC team by the league's 11 head coaches.
- McGill was selected to the first team and Crawford the third team.

GAELS PICKED THIRD IN PRESEASON POLL

- Iona was selected to finish third in the MAAC Preseason Coaches Poll released Oct. 24 coming off a fourth-place finish in the regular season, a MAAC tournament title and the loss of nine performers from the 2017-18 season.
- The Gaels have won MAAC Regular Season Championships in three of head coach Tim Cluess' eight seasons (2011-12, 2013-14 and 2014-15).

WHO'S BACK?

- Iona returns just two performers from the 2017-18 MAAC Championship campaign: senior **Rickey McGill** and junior **E.J. Crawford**.
- The Maroon & Gold also return red shirt freshman **Andrija Ristanovic** who sat out the 2017-18 campaign with an injury.

WHAT'S NEW?

- Nine new faces highlight the 2017-18 Iona men's basketball roster.
- Junior transfers **Asante Gist** (Eastern Kentucky) and **Isaiah Still** (Robert Morris) came to New Rochelle last season and sat out due to NCAA transfer regulations.
- Additional junior transfers **Tajuan Agee**, **Jahnathan Maxwell**, **Niksa Nikolic** and **Ben Perez** join the squad with two years of eligibility.
- True freshman and local product **Payton Hudson** joins **Ristanovic** looking to make their collegiate debuts.
- Junior **Isaiah Ross** transferred from UMKC and will sit out the 2018-19 campaign.

20/20 VISION

- With its win over Fairfield in the 2018 MAAC championship game, Iona recorded its ninth straight and 22nd all-time 20+ win seasons in the 76-year history of the program.
- It extended a program record for consecutive 20+ win seasons, surpassing the previous high of four straight from 1981-85.
- Tim Cluess is the only (of 12 all-time) head coach in program history to earn 20 wins in each of his first eight seasons in New Rochelle. He is also the Iona coach to boast more than four 20+ win seasons as the leader of the Maroon & Gold (Pat Kennedy, 4).

NINE STRAIGHT 20-WIN SEASONS

- The Gaels continued their unprecedented run of 20-win seasons in MAAC history. The nine-year stretch more than doubles the previous MAAC mark of four set by the Maroon & Gold from 1981-85 and matched by La Salle (1986-90) and Siena (2006-10).
- In MAAC history, consecutive 20+ win streaks have happened only 17 times.
- Iona has recorded 19 of its 22 20+ win seasons as a member of the MAAC, the most of any league member. Siena has posted 12, Manhattan nine and Saint Peter's eight.

KING OF THE HILL, TOP OF THE LIST

- No team among the 14 NYC Metropolitan Area Division I basketball programs within 30 miles of the center of NY College basketball, Madison Square Garden has won more games than Iona College in the last 22 seasons (437; Hofstra #2, 399).
- Iona's 20 wins were the third most and .606 winning percentage was the fourth highest in 2017-18 in the Metro Area.
- Since head coach **Tim Cluess** took the reins in 2010-11, Iona's 183 wins and .665 win percentage are also the best in both categories. (Seton Hall, 151 wins; Wagner, .587 win pct.)
- Since 1995-96, the Maroon & Gold hold the lead in wins (437), 38 more than Hofstra, 47 more than No. 3 Seton Hall and the top win percentage (.595).
- Iona's eight postseason appearances (five NCAA, two NIT, one CIT) since 2010-11 are the most during the time frame, **twice as many** as LIU Brooklyn (4 NCAA), Seton Hall (3 NCAA, 1 NIT) and St. John's (two NCAA, two NIT).

ABOUT CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT TITLES

- Iona is one of four NCAA Division I programs to capture its last three straight conference tournament championships, joining Gonzaga (six straight), Kentucky (four straight) and South Dakota State (three straight).
- Only eight programs have won at least four tournament titles in the last seven seasons. Iona's four during the time frame is only eclipsed by Gonzaga (7), New Mexico State (6) and San Diego State (5) while matching the mark of Harvard, Kentucky, Stephen F. Austin, and Texas Southern.

ABOUT NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

- 37 of the 351 NCAA Division I programs have appeared in at least five of the last seven NCAA Tournaments. Only four of the 37 have come from mid-major conferences (Gonzaga [7], Iona [5], New Mexico State [6] and South Dakota State [5]).
- 21 teams in the 2018 NCAA Tournament have also appeared in the 2016 and 2017 brackets, the last three-in-a-row. Only Gonzaga, Iona and South Dakota State can stake the claim among members of mid-major conferences.

- Senior **Rickey McGill** is poised to become the 40th player in Iona men's basketball history to record 1,000 career points this season.
- He will be the 10th player under Tim Cluess to reach the mark and is currently 77 points shy of the mark.

BALANCED SCORING

- Eight different players recorded a single-game total of at least 19 points last season, tied with Grambling and New Mexico for most in the NCAA.
- 17 teams in NCAA Division I had six players reaching the mark, all tied for second place.
- The Gaels' seven players with 20 or points was

second in the NCAA, one less than Grambling and New Mexico, and tied with Gonzaga, Lehigh, Norfolk State, North Carolina State, and Winthrop.

- In the MAAC, Marist, Monmouth, and Siena each had five players to reach 19 points.

MCGILL NAMED ALL-MAAC

- Senior **Rickey McGill** was the lone Iona selection to the 2017-18 All-MAAC team. He was named to the Second Team following a similar honor on the preseason squad.

ALL-MAAC FIRST TEAM SELECTION STREAK SNAPPED

- For the first time in the **Tim Cluess**-era, Iona enters the MAAC Championship without an All-MAAC First Team selection, snapping a stretch of seven straight seasons.
- **Mike Glover** (2011,2012), **Scott Machado** (2011,2012), **Lamont Jones** (2013), **Sean Armand** (2014), **David Laury** (2015) and **A.J. English** (2014, 2014, 2016) and **Jordan Washington** (2017) each earned the honor under Cluess.
- Last season, Iona tied the MAAC record for consecutive seasons with a player on the All-MAAC First Team.
- Siena had seven straight from 2006-2012, Manhattan (2000-2005) and La Salle (1987-1992) recorded six straight and the Gaels (1997-2001) had five.

PLAYING WITH FIRE

- Iona played 10 games last season where it faced a double-digit deficit in the contest and erased the lead before the final buzzer.
- After dropping its first two in the scenario (at Albany, vs. Coastal Carolina), Iona won six of its last eight, with both defeats coming at the hands of Canisius.
- The Gaels are 6-4 when trailing by 10 or more in a contest and erasing the deficit.

CLOSE SHAVES

- Iona has played **14** games decided by five or less points in 2017-18, posting **eight** wins.
- The school record is 16 games, reached in 2012-13 and 2004-05.
- In 2014-15, the Gaels recorded an 11-4 mark in close games, earning the most wins in program history.
- Iona has recorded four seasons with 15 or more games decided by five or less points, three of them under head coach Tim Cluess, with a **25-20** mark.

EFFICIENT, EFFECTIVE, AND FAST PACED

- Iona ranked No. 80 in the nation on Ken Pomeroy's Adjusted Offensive Efficiency (110.3) last season.
- Offensive Efficiency is measured by calculating the amount of points a team would score in 100 possessions. Ken Pomeroy's formula adjusts for the quality of opposing defenses, the site of each game, and when each game was played.
- Iona ranked No. 56 (54.1%) in Effective FG%.
- EFG% adjusts for the fact that a three-point field goal

LET IT RAIN

• Since 2000-01, Iona has produced **128** games with 10 or more three-point field goals. Five came in the seven seasons under head coach **Jeff Ruland** and seven came with **Kevin Willard** at the helm (three years).
 • Under **Tim Cluess**, Iona has posted **116** games (22 in 2013-14, 18 in 2014-15, 15 in 2015-16, 20 in 2016-17) with double-digit trifectas including **14** last season.
 • The Gaels shattered a school record with 24 3FG on Nov. 26 vs. Delaware State, beating the previous mark of 18, reached twice (at Albany, Nov. 23, 2010; vs. Liberty, Dec. 18, 2012).
 • The Maroon & Gold set its No. 2 total of 20 3FG made in an 82-68 win at Holy Cross on Dec. 19, 2017. The first 10 field goals made in the contest were from distance as the team set a first half program record with 12 in the win.
 • Iona's top 25 three-point field goal efforts have come with Cluess as head coach.
 • Against Liberty, Iona's 41 three-point attempts set a new standard. No. 2 was 40 vs. Fairfield this season and No. 3 came in a 24-for-39 effort vs. Delaware State.
 • Through **one game** this season, Iona has made a three-pointer in **331** straight and **777** out of its last **779** games. The school record is 385 straight from Jan. 5, 1994 - Dec. 16, 2006.
 • The Gaels have failed to hit a three-pointer in just 18 of their **1,008** games played since the line was adopted for the 1986-87 season.

WIDE MARGINS

• The Gaels are **105-28** in games decided by 10 or more points since head coach **Tim Cluess** took the reins in 2010-11.
 • Iona's loss to Monmouth was just the fifth double-digit defeat in six-plus seasons. The program is **66-5** in MAAC regular season games decided by 10 or more points under Cluess.
 • The Rider defeat was just the 13th loss by 15 points or more for Cluess as an NCAA head coach.
 • Iona's 126-76 win over Delaware State was the second 50+ point victory in program history and first since the 1967-68 (46 years) campaign.
 • In his 10+ seasons as an NCAA coach, Cluess has mentored his team to a **167-31** mark in 10+ point contests.

RICHIE GUERIN'S #14 HANGS IN THE RAFTERS

- Iona honored the legacy of **Richie Guerin '54** by retiring his number 14 on Jan. 31, 2014 the first ever in school history.
- Guerin is an Iona College Goal Club (1983), Marine Corps Sports (2004), and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame (2013) inductee who starred for the Maroon & Gold from 1951-1954.
- He rewrote the basketball record books at Iona, scoring 1,375 points and graduated as the leading scorer in school history.
- A two-time All-Metropolitan selection with the Gaels, he scored a then school-record 40 points against John Carroll in 1954 and was the first Gael to score 40 or more points in a game.
- Following his playing days at Iona, Guerin played with the National Basketball Association's New York Knicks from 1956-1963 and was a player-coach of the St. Louis/Atlanta Hawks franchise for nine years.
- In 13 years as a professional player, Guerin accumulated 14,676 points (17.3 per game), 4,278 rebounds (5.1 per game), and 4,211 assists (5.0 per game) over 848 games.

GAEL GREATS

In addition to Naismith Hall of Famer **Richie Guerin '54**, here are additional significant names in Iona basketball history:

- **Jim Valvano** - legendary head coach at Iona from 1975-80 who "Dared To Dream" to win a national championship with the Gaels and finally did in 1983, albeit with North Carolina State. Succumbed to cancer in 1993 eight weeks after an impassioned speech at the ESPY Awards that year which in which he announced creation of The V Foundation for Cancer Research and its motto, "Don't Give Up... Don't Ever Give Up."
- **Jeff Ruland '91** - All-American during his time at Iona and, two-time NBA All-Star with the Washington Bullets, Philadelphia 76ers and Detroit Pistons. Following his career, returned to Iona and served as head coach from 1998-2007 where he won three MAAC Championships.
- **Pat Kennedy** - head coach from 1980-86. Went on to coach at Florida State, DePaul, Montana, and Towson following a highly successful tenure in New Rochelle. He was most recently head coach at Div. II Pace University in Pleasantville, NY, located 19 miles North of Iona.
- **Warren Isaac '65** - Iona's only 50-point scorer, Isaac played six seasons in Europe following his tenure at Iona. A New York City school legend, Isaac started for Power Memorial paving the way for NBA Hall of Famer Kareem Abdul-Jabbar a 1965 graduate of the high school.
- **Tim Welsh** - head coach from 1995-98 who went on to coach in the Big East with Providence for 10 seasons. Currently an ESPN college basketball analyst. Holds the highest career winning percentage ever at Iona.
- **Kevin Willard** - Iona coach from 2007-10, now head coach at Big East's Seton Hall. Helped turn around a program which won two games in the season prior to his arrival to 20 wins in his final season in Maroon & Gold.
- **Steve Burt '84 & Steve Burt '06** - All-time NCAA father/son scoring leaders, both netting over 2,000 career points. Burt, the father, had a four-

season NBA career and most notably appeared off the bench for the Phoenix Suns in the 1992 NBA Playoffs. He was inducted into the prestigious NYC Basketball Hall of Fame this past fall. Burt, the son, continues to play professionally in Europe.

- **Sean Green '91** - Played 84 NBA games over three seasons for the Indiana Pacers, Philadelphia 76ers and Utah Jazz from 1991-94. Currently a high school basketball coach in Southern California.
- **Scott Machado '12** - The last Gael to appear in an NBA game. Machado played in regular season NBA contests in 2012-13 with the Houston Rockets and postseason with the Golden State Warriors. The MAAC & Iona's all-time assist leader. He currently plays professionally in the NBA G-League.
- **Bob Santini '53** - Iona's first NBA player, appeared in four games with the New York Knicks in 1955-56.

NOTABLE ALUMNI (ATHLETICS/POP CULTURE)

- **Ignacio Maganto** - was selected by the LA Galaxy with the 21st pick in the first round of the 2015 MLS SuperDraft, the first Major League Soccer draft pick in Iona history. Maganto scored his first MLS goal with the Galaxy in the spring of 2015.
- **Jason Motte** - Major League Baseball relief pitcher recorded the final out of the 2011 World Series with the world champion St. Louis Cardinals. Has also appeared in Major League games with the Chicago Cubs, Colorado Rockies and Atlanta Braves.
- **Dennis Leonard** - Kansas City Royals Hall of Famer and 12-year MLB veteran who won 20 games on three occasions from 1977-80. He was inducted in May 2015 into the New York Baseball Hall of Fame.
- **Mariano Rivera III '15** - Earned his degree in May 2015 and was selected in the fourth round by the Washington Nationals.
- **Jared Finkel** - Drafted by the Minnesota Twins in 2017, was a Midwest League (Class A) All-Star in 2018 for the Cedar Rapids Kernels.
- **Don McLean** - Singer-songwriter noted most famous for his 1971 single "American Pie".
- **Kyle Flood '93** - Former head football coach at Rutgers University.
- **Brendan Malone '62** - Current Detroit Pistons assistant coach.

Spotlight on the Newcomers

TAJUAN AGEE

Tajuan Agee, a 6-8 forward, comes to New Rochelle after two strong years at Tyler JC in Tyler, TX. Agee appeared in 62 games over two seasons, scoring 508 points and grabbing 330 rebounds. As a sophomore in 2017-18, he posted 10.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 1.7 assists per game. Agee's Tyler squad earned the No. 17 seed in the NJCAA Division I Championship, following a Region XIV Championship run.

Agee played scholastically for Hyde Park High School near Lakeshore Drive in Southeast Chicago. He earned All-State and All-City honors as a senior, averaging 20 points and 12 rebounds per game. Growing up, Agee played the guard position until his junior year of high school.

ASANTE GIST

Asante Gist, a 5-11 guard, enrolled at Iona for the spring 2018 semester and will be eligible to compete following the completion of the Gaels' first semester in December. Gist was one of the leaders of the EKU backcourt in a season and a half, he posted 542 points (14.6 ppg) including a freshman program record 494 as a rookie in 2016-17. In 31 contests in his first season, Gist averaged 15.9 points and 3.8 assists and connected on 64 three-point field goal attempts. As a sophomore he appeared in six contests prior to transferring to Iona.

Gist played for legendary coach Bob Hurley Sr. at St. Anthony High School in Newark, NJ and was selected to play in the prestigious Jordan Brand Classic Regional Game at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, NY. Gist was the first player to win the New Jersey Tournament of Champions with two different teams, with the 32-0 St. Anthony squad as a senior in 2016 and as a freshman with Roselle Catholic.

PAYTON HUDSON

Payton Hudson, a 6-0 guard, played scholastically in 2018-19 for Our Savior Lutheran School in the Bronx.

He previously played two varsity seasons at Archbishop Stepinac in White Plains, N.Y. As a junior in 2016-17, Hudson averaged 8.5 points and 2.2 assists as the team's sixth man. The Crusaders finished with an 18-11 overall mark. Hudson scored 11 points in the team's final contest in heartbreaking CSHAA semifinal defeat to Molloy. Hudson connected on 85 three point field goals at a 37% clip in 53 games over two seasons at Stepinac including a team-best 53 as a junior. On February 10, 2017, he tied a school record with 10 trifectas made vs. Bishop Scanlan.

JAHNATHAN MAXWELL

Jahnathan Maxwell, a 6-8 forward, played his sophomore campaign at Odessa College in west Texas for current Iona assistant coach Tra Arnold. He averaged 8.4 points and 4.7 rebounds and helped the Wranglers to the No. 7 seed in the NJCAA Division I Championship after missing the first 16 games of the season due to injury. The Region V finalist squad fell to eventual national runner up Southern Idaho in the first round. Maxwell played 21 games for Southwest Tennessee CC in Memphis, leading the Saluqi to 19 wins with a 9.0 ppg and 5.8 rpg average. In 40 games over two seasons, he shot 50.0% from the field and 36.4% from beyond the arc.

Prior to his junior college stint, Maxwell played for Genesis Academy in Lynchburg, VA. Following his senior season, he played for the U.S. All-Stars in the Capital Classic, in a game that pitted Washington metropolitan area's top seniors against other all-stars from across the country. In the contest he was teammates with St. John's standout Shamorie Ponds and former Arizona star and current Toronto Raptors signee Rawle Alkins.

NIKSA NIKOLIC

Niksa Nikolic, a 6-8 forward, played two seasons at Southeastern CC in West Burlington, IA. He appeared in 59 games averaging 6.0 points and 5.3 rebounds per game while shooting 56.0 percent from the field. Nikolic helped turn around a program that was winless in conference play as a freshman, to a 22-win sophomore campaign that saw the Blackhawks advance to the NJCAA Region XI Semifinals.

Nikolic played scholastically at Prva Sportska Košarkaška Gimnazija-Koledž Beograd a boarding school in Zeleznik, a suburb of Belgrade. The school name is roughly translated to The First Sports Basketball High School-College Belgrade.

BEN PEREZ

Ben Perez, a 6-3 guard, spent a successful season at South Plains in Levelland, TX in 2017-18. Perez averaged 9.9 points, 3.6 rebounds, and 1.9 assists and connected on 73 three-point field goals in 35 games as a sophomore. He shot 41.7% from distance. The former San Diego State University recruited walk-on appeared in 25 games for the Aztecs before transferring to South Plains to gain experience and exposure for an eventual return to NCAA Division I. He was described as arguably SDSU's top-three point shooter under former coach Steve Fisher.

Perez was initially recruited out of high school by the Gaels after a season at Air Force Prep Academy in Colorado Springs, CO, and San Marcos High School where he led his team in scoring his final two years. He was an All-CIF first team selection following his last season at San Marcos.

ISAIAH ROSS

Isaiah Ross, a 6-4 guard, appeared in 66 games with 27 starts and averaged 9.6 points, 2.5 rebounds and 1.3 three-point field goals per game over two seasons with the University of Missouri-Kansas City of the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). As a sophomore he ranked No. 2 on the team in scoring with a team best 70 three-pointers made and a 77.9% free throw percentage. He was fourth on the team and led all UMKC freshmen in scoring (8.0 ppg) and second with 64 3FG.

Ross his final scholastic season at Hillcrest Prep in Arizona where he teamed with current Phoenix Suns center DeAndre Ayton and Sacramento Kings forward Marvin Bagley III in 2015-16. He was a four-year standout at Davenport West High School in Iowa. Where he averaged 17 points per game as a senior.

ISAIAH STILL

Isaiah Still, a 6-6 wing, joined the program for the fall 2017 semester and sat out last season due to NCAA Transfer regulations. After two seasons at Robert Morris, the Northern New Jersey native returns to the metropolitan area to play for the Gaels. Still appeared in 60 games and scored 775 points over two seasons with the Colonials. He was the team's leading scorer as a sophomore averaging 15.7 points per game, earning All-NEC Second Team honors. As a freshman he posted 9.9 points and was named to the NEC All-Rookie team. During his tenure in Moon Township, Still averaged 12.9 points, 4.2 rebounds, and 1.7 assists.

Prior to Robert Morris, he attended Union Catholic High School, earning NJ.com All-Non-Public Third Team honors while averaging 19.6 points, 7.2 rebounds and 1.7 steals per game as a senior.

- Tim Cluess was named 12th head coach of the Iona College men's basketball program on April 8, 2010 and returns for his ninth season with the Gaels.
- Came to New Rochelle with an impressive 20-year coaching resume after spending four seasons as head coach at LIU Post in Brookville, NY.
- One thing can be said, he is a winner. After spending 14 years as head coach at St. Mary's High School in Manhasset, NY, he spent the five years prior to arriving at Iona in the college ranks at Suffolk Community College and LIU Post.
- He amassed a 120-33 record and had unprecedented success at both schools.
- When combining his high school record, Cluess has won nearly 75 percent of his games coached.
- Has led the Gaels to 20+ wins in each of his first eight seasons in New Rochelle, the only coach in school history to accomplish the feat. The Gaels won 25 games in three of them.
- Iona has appeared in eight straight postseason tournaments including a Collegen Insider.com Postseason Tournament championship game appearance in 2011, the NCAA First Round in 2012 with the MAAC's second ever at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament, the 2013 NCAA Second Round, the 2014 and 2015 National Invitation Tournaments before returning to the 2016, 2017 and 2018 NCAA Tournaments.
- The Gaels were crowned MAAC Tournament Champions in 2013, 2016, 2017 and 2018 and MAAC Regular Season Champions in 2012, 2014 and 15. The Cluess-led program set a school record with 17 conference wins in 2013-14 and 2014-15.

School, appeared in six regular season games in the NBA with the Houston Rockets and five postseason games with the Golden State Warriors in 2012-13.

• Machado is one of several Iona Gaels to have played for Cluess to continue their playing careers in the professional ranks including: **Sean Armand, Vangelis Bebis, Taylor Bessick, Tre Bowman, Sam Cassell Jr., Randy Dezouvre, TK Edogi, A.J. English, Mike Glover, Jayon James, Ra'Shad James, Lamont Jones, David Laury, Zach Lewis, Ibn Muhammad, Chris Pelcher, Taaj Ridley, Alejo Rodriguez, Aaron Rountree, Jon Severe, Jan Svandrlík, Jordan Washington, and Isaiah Williams.**

• Prior to Iona, Cluess' LIU Post Pioneers earned a 23-6 overall record in his last season, earning victories in 19 of their last 21 contests. The squad earned its fourth straight berth in the East Coast Conference championship game. Cluess was named the ECC Co-Coach of the Year for the third straight time.

• In 2008-09, LIU Post had its finest season in history, setting a school record with 30 victories. Standing among the top 10 teams in the nation from January through March in 2009, the Pioneers were ranked as high as No. 2 that year.

• The squad posted an undefeated regular season, winning all 24 games for the first time in school history. LIU Post won its second straight ECC regular season and tournament championship titles and defeated Bentley in overtime in front of thousands on their home court to win the NCAA East Region Championship title and advance to the Elite Eight Tournament in Springfield, Mass.

• For his outstanding efforts, Cluess was named the Basketball Times Division II Co-Coach of the Year as well as Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association Division II Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

• The 2007-08 season saw Cluess' squad post a 26-5 overall record, including an 18-2 clip in the conference. LIU Post claimed its first regular season and conference titles since the 2003-04 season with a 60-57 win to advance to the NCAA Northeast Regional at Bentley College. He was voted the ECC Coach of the Year by his peers, and was named the MWBA Division II Coach of the Year.

• In 2006-07, his first year at the helm, Cluess guided the Pioneers to a 19-11 record and an

appearance in the ECC Championship game. He improved the team's win total by six from the season before he took over the program.

• Cluess was named the eighth head men's basketball coach in the 50-year history of the Pioneers' program in April of 2006, after spending the 2005-06 campaign as the head men's basketball coach at Suffolk Community College in Brentwood, NY. He led a team of eight players to a 22-10 record overall, as well as a Region XV championship and a fourth-place finish in the NJCAA Division III Tournament. The trip to the national tournament was the first in the Longhorns' history, and Cluess was tabbed the District 5 Coach of the Year.

• Prior to his ascent to the college ranks, Cluess was a standout head coach at St. Mary's High School in Manhasset, NY from 1991-05, where the Gaels went a remarkable 264-78 (.772) during his tenure.

• St. Mary's won a record eight consecutive Nassau-Suffolk CHSAA league championships from 1997-98 to 2004-05. In that final season with Cluess as their mentor, the Gaels went 25-1 and finished the season ranked in the Top 20 nationally after holding the No. 1 ranking for eight weeks of the campaign.

• Cluess helped develop more than 50 players who moved on to the collegiate and professional ranks at St. Mary's including former North Carolina standout and current San Antonio Spur Danny Green.

• He won four state titles and two Federation championships at the Manhasset school. Cluess was a seven-time coach of the year in the high school ranks and earned tournament wins in national tournaments such as the Beach Ball Classic and the Las Vegas Prep Classic.

• Cluess played professional basketball in Europe and Australia after a collegiate career at both St. John's and Hofstra.

• He attended St. John's from 1978-81, before completing his coursework at Hofstra from 1982-83.

• Cluess holds a bachelor's degree in Accounting from Hofstra and currently resides in Floral Park, N.Y. with his wife, Karen, and their two children – Kevin, 22 and T.J., 20.
