#HIGHLIGHTS

(NOTES FROM AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST IN 140 CHARACTERS OR LESS)

- @GoAztecs' are the first Group of 5 team to reach bowl eligibility, winning six straight games to open the 2017 season. SDSU is 1 of 7 undefeated teams in the teams this season.
- The @MountainWest has three RBs ranked in the top-15 nationally in total rushing yds: SDSU's **Rashaad Penny** (993), Hawai'i's **Diocemy Saint Juste** (892) & UNLV's **Lexington Thomas** (625).
- @SJSUSpartanFB LB **Frank Ginda** leads the nation with 15.1 tackles per game. He is also the only FBS defender with more than 100 total tackles (106).
- @GoAztecs' eight-game win streak is the fourth-longest nationally and best in the Mountain West.
- @GoAztecs' win vs. #19/19 Stanford on Sept. 16 is the highest ranked opponent a MW team has defeated since Oct. 3, 2014 (Utah State over #19/18 BYU).
- @GoAztecs have won 35 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards as a team.
- @GoAztecs are ranked #19 in AP Top-25 & #18 in Amway Coaches Poll. The #19 AP rank matches the Aztecs' highest since 1978.
- @GoAztecs RB **Rashaad Penny** is the 1st player in @MountainWest history to win player of the week honors in four consecutive weeks (9/4-25).
- Penny leads the FBS in all-purpose yards per game (220.83), ranks second in total rushing yards (993) and is third in rush yards per contest (165.5) and scoring (12.0).
- Penny is the only FBS player to score a receiving, rushing and kick return TD in a single game this season.
- @GoAztecs have won 27 of their last 30 games. This .900 win percentage is third-best nationally in that timespan trailing only Alabama (.969) and Clemson (.939).
- @GoAztecs are 6-0 for the first time since 1975. It is the second consecutive year the @MountainWest has had a team jump out to a 6-0 start.
- @unlvfootball's **Devonte Boyd** needs 608 receiving yds to hold the @MountainWest career record.
- Boyd's 3,023 career receiving yards are the 3rd-most among active pass-catchers nationally.
- @USUFootball is tied for third nationally with 16 takeaways (9 fumble recoveries and 7 interceptions).
- @HawaiiFootball WR **John Ursua** leads the nation in receiving yards per game (130.6) and is second in receptions per game (9.2).
- @CSUFootball's 31-point win over Oregon State on Aug. 26 is the largest against an Autonomous 5 opponent in program history.
- @CSUFootball's 31-point victory is the 5th-largest by a @MountainWest member over an Autonomous 5 team since 2010.
- @CSUFootball has sold a program-record of more than 15,000 season tickets as of the beginning of August. The previous school record was 11,500.
- @BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the fourth consecutive season.
- @GoAztecs are the first team in MW history to be selected as unanimous divisional champs in back-to-back seasons.
- In the 18 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant 8 times.
- @wyo\_football DB **Andrew Wingard** ranks fourth nationally in career average tackles per game (9.52).
- @BroncoSportsFB has produced a 1,000-yd rusher in eight straight seasons, which is tied with Auburn as the longest active streak in the nation.

ONE OF THE NATION'S BEST RUNNING BACKS

San Diego State RB **Rashaad Penny** enters Week 6 first nationally in all-purpose yards per contest (220.83), total touchdowns (12), ranking second in total rushing yards (993) and ranking third in rushing yards per game (165.5).

Penny has registered six consecutive 100-yard rushing games, which ties for the fifth-most in Mountain West history. Former teammate Donnel Pumphrey holds the Conference record with nine straight 100-yard rushing performances. A 100-yard rushing performance at home against Boise State next Saturday will tie him for third-most in league history.

The senior from Norwalk, California, became the first player in Mountain West history to win Offensive Player of the Week honors in four consecutive weeks (Sept. 4-25). Penny became the 11th MW player and second Aztec to earn Walter Camp weekly honors after his Sept. 9 performance at Arizona State. Penny rushed for a career-high 216 yards and 3 total touchdowns.

TOUCHDOWNS

New Mexico senior running back **Richard McQuarley** scored five rushing touchdowns against Air Force on Sept. 30. The five scores on the ground are tied for the most in a single game by an FBS player this season and the second-most in Mountain West history. This figure also ties a UNM program record.

Fresno State junior wide receiver **KeeSean Johnson** caught three touchdowns on Sept. 30 against Nevada. Johnson's three receiving TDs are tied as the third-most nationally in a single game and the second-most in MW history.

THROUGH THE AIR

Colorado State senior quarterback **Nick Stevens** ranks in the top-15 nationally in several passing categories this season. Stevens ranks sixth in total passing yards (1,871), 11th in passing touchdowns (14) and 12th in passing yards per game (311.8). The native of Murrieta, California, also ranks 13th in total offense (324.3). He leads the Mountain West in all four statistical categories.

Stevens completed 21 consecutive passes, his final 12 passes against Hawai'i on Sept. 30 and first nine on the road vs. Utah State on Oct. 7, which is the second-longest streak in Mountain West history.

The senior from Murrieta, California, has now thrown multiple touchdown passes in 12 of the Rams' last 13 games.

MOUNTAIN VS. WEST

The Mountain Division holds an all-time record of 51-29 (.638) against opponents from the West Division since divisional play was established in the Mountain West in 2013.
