#HIGHLIGHTS

(NOTES FROM AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST IN 140 CHARACTERS OR LESS)

- The @MountainWest has five bowl eligible teams, including @BroncoSportsFB, @CSUFootball, @FresnoStateFB, @GoAztecs and @wyo_football.
- @GoAztecs were the first Group of 5 team to reach bowl eligibility, winning six straight games to open the 2017 season.
- @GoAztecs have a chance to be the first FBS team to have an individual lead the nation in total rushing yards in back-to-back years since Texas in '97 & '98.
- @CSUFootball's **Michael Gallup** is one of ten semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award, given annually to the nation's top pass-catcher.
- @USUFootball's **Jalen Davis** is a semifinalist for the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to the nation's best defensive back.
- @GoAztecs RB **Rashaad Penny** is a semifinalist for the @MaxwellFootball Award, given annually to the nation's best player.
- @BroncoSportsFB has produced a 1,000-yd rusher in eight straight seasons, which is tied with Auburn as the longest active streak in the nation.
- @BroncoSportsFB RB **Alexander Mattison** has rushed for 919 yards this season. The Broncos have at least two games remaining.
- The @MountainWest has 4 RBs ranked in the top-20 nationally in total rushing yds: SDSU's **Rashaad Penny** (1,602), Hawai'i's **Diocemy Saint Juste** (1,349), CSU's **Dalyn Dawkins** (1,211) & UNLV's **Lexington Thomas** (1,146).
- The @MountainWest is one of two conferences with at least four 1,000-yard rushers through 10 weeks, trailing only the Pac-12 (5).
- @SJSUSpartanFB LB **Frank Ginda** is first nationally with 13.8 tackles per game. He also leads all FBS defenders with 152 total tackles.
- @SJSUSpartanFB LB **Frank Ginda** currently ranks 5th on the @MountainWest's single-season total tackles list. He is only 11 tackles shy of setting the MW single-season record.
- @GoAztecs' win vs. #19/19 Stanford on Sept. 16 is the highest ranked opponent a MW team has defeated since Oct. 3, 2014 (Utah State over #19/18 BYU).
- @GoAztecs have won 37 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards as a team.
- @GoAztecs RB **Rashaad Penny** is the 1st player in @MountainWest history to win player of the week honors in four consecutive weeks (9/4-25).
- Penny leads the nation in all-purpose yards per game (203.3), and is second in rushing yards (1,602) and total touchdowns (18).
- @CSUFootball's **Michael Gallup** leads the nation in receiving yds (1,298) and receiving yards per game (118.0). He is fourth nationally with a 7.9 receptions per game average.
- @CSUFootball's **Michael Gallup** is the FBS' active career leader in receiving yards per game (107.1).
- @CSUFootball's **Nick Stevens** ranks eighth nationally with 3,174 passing yards. Stevens' 3,174 passing yards are the second-most among Group of 5 QBs.
- @UNLVFootball's Devonte Boyd's 3,181 career receiving yards are the 3rd-most among active pass-catchers nationally.
- @wyo_football DB **Andrew Wingard** ranks third nationally in career average tackles per game (9.5).
- @wyo_football is tied for first nationally with Washington State and Central Michigan with 27 takeaways.
- @CSUFootball's 31-point win over Oregon State on Aug. 26 is the largest against an Autonomous 5 opponent in program history.
- @CSUFootball's 31-point victory is the 5th-largest by a @MountainWest member over an Autonomous 5 team since 2010.
- @BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the fourth consecutive season.
- @GoAztecs are the first team in MW history to be selected as unanimous divisional champs in back-to-back seasons.
- In the 18 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant 8 times.

WIN IMPROVEMENT

Fresno State entered the 2017 campaign coming off an 1-11 season and the hiring of head coach Jeff Tedford. The Bulldogs, who have compiled a 7-3 record this year, have the nation's best win improvement (+6).

Arizona, Florida Atlantic, Marshall, Michigan State, Notre Dame and Virginia, have all improved its win total by four games from 2016 to 2017.

Last season, Wyoming tied for the nation's largest improvement in wins from 2015 to 2016 at plus-six.

NATIONAL RUSHING LEADER

In 2017, San Diego State's **Rashaad Penny** ranks second nationally with 1,602 rushing yards. Last season, Aztecs' Donnel Pumphrey finished the season as the nation's leader in total rushing yards with 2,133 yards. The Aztecs have an opportunity to become the first FBS program to produce individual national rushing leaders in back-to-back years since 1997-98 (Texas).

Dating back to 1990, only Iowa State ('95-96) and Texas ('97-98) have accomplished this feat.

MORE SUCCESS ON THE GROUND

The Mountain West is one of two conferences with at least four 1,000-yard rushers this season, trailing only the Pac-12 (5). San Diego State's **Rashaad Penny** (1,602), Hawai'i RB **Diocemy Saint Juste** (1,349), Colorado State's **Dalyn Dawkins** (1,211) and UNLV's **Lexington Thomas** (1,146) all rank in the top-20 nationally.

Saint Juste is the first Rainbow Warrior to register 1,000-yard rushing seasons in back-to-back years. The Hawai'i program record for rushing yards in a single season is 1,498, set by Travis Sims in 1992. Saint Juste is 150 yards shy of setting the program record.

Thomas is the Rebel running back to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark since 2013 (Tim Cornett). Additionally, he is the programs 10th 1,000-yard single-season rusher all-time.

UNDEFEATED IN MW PLAY

Boise State is the only Mountain West team with an undefeated record in league play. The Broncos are 6-0 in MW play for the first time since joining the Conference. The Last time Boise State opened league action with a 6-0 record was in 2010 as a member of the WAC (6-0).

The Broncos are one of six teams nationally undefeated in conference play as of Monday, Nov. 6.

SINGLE-SEASON TACKLES LEADER

San José State linebacker **Frank Ginda** leads the nation with 152 total tackles this season, which ranks fifth-most in a single season by a MW defender. Ginda is 11 tackles shy of setting the Conference record, which is currently held by New Mexico's Carmen Messina (162; 2009).

MOUNTAIN VS. WEST

The Mountain Division holds an all-time record of 57-30 (.655) against opponents from the West Division since divisional play was established in the Mountain West in 2013.

- Added a third touchdown on the day when he returned a blocked punt six yards for the go-ahead score in the first quarter, putting Nevada ahead 14-7.
- This was Baber's second career game with three interceptions, becoming the first player in Mountain West history to record multiple career outings with three picks. His three interceptions tied the Conference's single-game record.
- Is just the third player in NCAA history to score three touchdowns via return (joining Johnny Jackson in 1987 and Antonio Perkins in 2003). He is the second player this season to return two interceptions for touchdowns in the NCAA.
- Is the seventh player this season to have three interceptions in a single game.
