THE SERIES

• This is just the second meeting between the Quakers and the Lobos in men's basketball.

• UNM won the first meeting, 54-51. That game also was played at "The Pit" (now Dreamstyle Arena) and was the championship game of the Lobo Invite after Penn beat Northwestern the first night. The first Penn-UNM game took place 25 years and 51 weeks ago (December 29, 1992).

• Penn also played at The Pit in the 1981 Lobo Classic, losing to Fordham (77-73 in 2OT) and Marshall (65-64).

• Penn has played just one other game against a current Mountain West program. That came on December 30, 1978, when host San Diego State whipped the Quakers, 110-86. *The 110 points were the most ever allowed by a Penn team at the time, and remains tied for third nearly 40 years later.*

FAST START FOR PENN

While Penn enters today's game at 9-2 overall, the Quakers started this season 4-0. Amazingly, it was the first time that had happened since the 1978-79 season, which coincidentally was the year that the Red and Blue made it to arguably the most famous Final Four of all time with Magic Johnson's Michigan State, Larry Bird's Indiana State, and Mark Aguirre's DePaul teams. *You could*

make a case for Penn being the NCAA's original "Cinderella," as the Quakers were the nine seed in a 10-team East Regional. (Yes, if you're paying attention...the team that SDSU dropped 110 points on later made the Final Four!)

FUN STUFF TO KNOW

• Penn's December 11 game with Villanova was **Steve Donahue's** 100th as the Quakers' head coach.

• At 9-2, Penn is off to its best 11-game start since the 1994-95 team also started 9-2; *that team lost to Saint Joseph's in Game 12. The last Penn team to go 10-2 through 12 was the 1993-94 unit.*

• Penn is 3-0 in true road games this season and has won four such games in a row dating back to last season.

• Penn's win over then-No. 17 Villanova on December 11 was its first over the Cats since Dec. 10, 2002 and the first over an AP-ranked team since a 73-70 win over No. 7 Temple on Nov. 23, 1998.

• Penn's 83-65 win at La Salle on December 8 was its biggest Big 5 win since a 71-47 win over the Explorers back on January 14, 2004.

• When Penn beat Miami on December 4, it snapped a 13-game losing streak to ACC programs that dated back to 2000-01 and was the Quakers' first over a Power 5 program since 2003 (at USC).



100 • Games coached by head coach **Steve Donahue** at Penn.

38.3 • Penn's win percentage in its first 47 games under **Donahue** (18-29).

73.6 • Penn's win percentage in its last 53 games under **Donahue** (39-14).

0 • Two-point baskets scored so far this season by senior **Jackson Donahue** (no relation to Coach Donahue); all ten of his field goals this season have come from beyond the arc.

0 • Losses suffered by Penn this season in the contiguous United States; the Quakers' losses to Kansas State and Oregon State came at the Paradise Jam which was played on St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands.

3 • Points scored by junior **Ryan Betley** in Penn's season opener, when he drained a three-pointer on Penn's first possession of 2018-19; less than five minutes later he ruptured his patellar tendon, and so last year's leading scorer will miss the remainder of the season.

4 • Penn players with at least 28 assists this season: seniors **Antonio Woods** (31) and **Max Rothschild** (28) and juniors **AJ Brodeur** (team-high 44) and **Devon Goodman** (29); senior **Jake Silpe** has 21.

5 • NCAA Division 1 players this year from China, including freshman **Michael Wang**. He shares the distinction with Michael Ou (Cal State Northridge), Johnny Wang (Cal State Fullerton), Kevin Zhang (Tulane) and James Zhao (California).

14.5 • Penn's average margin of victory in its eight Division 1 wins this season.

24 • Penn wins last season, most since the Quakers had 25 in 2001-02. All time, the Red and Blue have had nine seasons with 24 or more victories.

25 • Consecutive Philadelphia Big 5 games won by Villanova—a city record that covered six years and three days—before Penn beat the 17th-ranked Wildcats, 78-75, on December 11.

26 • Ivy League titles won by Penn. That is behind only Princeton (27). The rest of the league has 20 combined.

36 • Points needed by **Brodeur** to reach 1,000 for his career; he would become the 41st player in program history to achieve the milestone.

55 • Points scored by the freshman **Wang** over the last three games (23 vs. Miami, 18 at La Salle, 14 vs. Villanova).

58 • Points scored by all-tournament pick **Goodman** at the Paradise Jam (career-high 27 vs. Northern Iowa, 18 vs. K-State, 13 vs. Oregon State).

71.5 • Penn's assist-to-basket ratio over the last three games (63 assists/88 FG).

72 • Points scored by **Brodeur** over the last five games, all double-digit games; he has 51 in the last three contests (18 vs. Miami, 17 at La Salle, 16 vs. Villanova).

107 • Three-point baskets by Penn this season, a 9.7 per-game average; the Quakers have hit double figures in that category five times in 11 games.

112 • Penn's point total against Stockton on Nov. 24, the fourth-highest total in program history and most since scoring 114 vs. Haverford on December 18, 1993.

291 • Three-point baskets by Penn last year, a program record. *The Quakers have also set program marks each of the last two years in trey attempts (690 in 2016-17, 830 last season).*

1,000 • Combined win percentage of Penn (5-0) and Old Dominion (7-0) since both teams were stranded together for nearly 24 hours at Cyril E. King Airport on St. Thomas, Virgin Islands trying to fly back from the Paradise Jam.

Notemeal from Villanova

• The win was Penn's first over Villanova in almost exactly 16 years (December 10, 2002).

• It was Penn's first win over an AP-ranked team since a 73-70 win over Temple on November 23, 1998.

• It was Penn's first win over a ranked Villanova squad since a 71-70 win over the 17th-ranked Wildcats on December 6, 1988.

• Penn improved to 4-6 all-time when playing a team ranked 17th in the Associated Press (AP) national poll, including a 2-1 mark over Villanova when the Cats are No. 17.

• The game was Steve Donahue's 100th as Penn's head coach.

• Villanova's 22 rebounds were an opponent low in the Donahue era and the fewest by an opponent since Princeton had just 19 boards in an 82-67 Penn win on January 30, 2012.

• For the first time this season against a Division 1 team, Penn put five different players in double figures.

• Senior **Antonio Woods** finished with 16 points and four assists; both numbers were one shy of his season highs.

• Junior **Devon Goodman** tied his season high with five rebounds.

Notemeal from La Salle

• This was Penn's third-straight win over La Salle and the Quakers improved their lead in the overall series to 41-31.

• Penn's 18-point margin of victory was its biggest in a Big 5 win since a 71-47 win over La Salle back on January 14, 2004. That win also took place at the Explorers' Tom Gola Arena.

• Penn had 25 assists on its 31 baskets, a 80.7 ratio that was a season high. The Quakers have had more than 20 assists in three of their last four games.

• Junior **AJ Brodeur** scored 17 points, giving him 52 points in two games at Gola Arena. He also had five assists, one shy of his season high.

• **Woods** recorded season highs in points (17) and assists (5).

Notemeal from Miami

• The win was Penn's first over Miami since December 28, 1953. *The Hurricanes, who now lead the overall series 6-4, had won four in a row over the Quakers since then.*

• The win was Penn's first over an Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) program since November 19, 2001 (79-74 over Georgia Tech) and the first over a Power 5 program—ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, SEC—since a 99-61 at Southern Cal on January 11, 2003.

• Penn set season highs in field-goal percentage (.596) and three-point FG percentage (.565), and the Quakers' 50 first-half points were a high this season against a Division 1 opponent.

• Penn committed just nine turnovers, tying a season low for this season.

• Penn's 2.56 assist/turnover ratio (23/9) gives the Quakers a 2.20 ratio over the last three games (66 assists/30 turnovers).

• Penn had 13 three-point baskets, 11 of them coming in the first half. *The Quakers now have 41 treys in the last three games (15 vs. Stockton, 13 at Delaware State, 13 vs. Miami).*

• Freshman **Michael Wang** scored 23 points, a season/career high; *he became the third player to reach 20 points this season, and the eighth different player on the roster to have a 20-point game during his Penn career.*

• **Wang** went 5-of-6 on three-point shots, matching the best percentage by a Penn player in the Donahue coaching era set originally last year by Sam Jones at Dayton.

What is #Whānau?

A Maori tribal word emanating from New Zealand, **Whānau** (pronounced "fah-now") is often translated as 'family' but its meaning is more complex. It includes physical, emotional and spiritual dimensions. Whānau can be multi-layered, flexible and dynamic. This is the word that Penn men's basketball uses when breaking down at the start/end of practice or breaking huddles after timeouts during games.

- **Wang's** five treys were a season/career high and tied for most by a Penn player this season; Devon Goodman hit five treys against Northern Iowa on November 16.
- **Brodeur's** had six assists, a season high and one shy of his career best.

- **Goodman and Woods** both had four assists, matching their season highs in that category.

- Senior **Jake Silpe** scored 10 points, his second double-digit game this year, grabbed a season-high six rebounds, and was one assist shy of his season best with five.

Notemeal from DSU

- Penn hit 13 three-point shots, giving the Quakers 28 in the last two games. *The Red and Blue have hit double figures in that category in four games already this season.*

- Penn had 52 rebounds, a season high and four shy of the team high in the Steve Donahue coaching era.

- Penn had seven blocked shots, a season high and one shy of the team high in the Donahue era.

- Delaware State shot just 23.8 percent from the field (15-63); that is a low by a Division 1 opponent in the Donahue era.

- For the first time this season, Penn took more three-point shots (32) than two-point shots (28).

- Freshman **Bryce Washington** led Penn in scoring with 16 points, a season/career high, and doubled his previous season/career high with eight rebounds. He also had three blocked shots after entering the game with one block in his first seven contests.

- **Brodeur** had his second double-double in a row, his third this season, and his 12th at Penn.

- **Brodeur** tied a career high with 13 rebounds and matched a season best with five assists.

- Senior **Jackson Donahue** had nine points for the second-straight game, on three three-pointers. *All ten of his made field goals this season have come from beyond the arc.*

- Sophomore **Jarrod Simmons** set a season high with five rebounds.

Notemeal from Stockton

- Penn's 112 points were the fourth-most in program history, and the most since the Quakers scored 114 against Haverford on December 18, 1993. *Penn scored 115 against Muhlenberg during the 1969-70 season and 113 against Columbia during the 1974-75 season.*

- Penn also set team highs in the Donahue era in field goals (42) and assists, and tied a team high in three-point field goals (15).

- Nine different players hit three-pointers in Saturday's game, one shy of

the NCAA Division 1 record that Penn set last year against Delaware State.

- Penn had nine turnovers, its first game in single digits in that category this season.

- Penn had five players reach double figures in the same game for the first time this season.

- **Brodeur** had his 11th career double-double with, coincidentally, 11 points and 11 rebounds. Penn is 10-1 when the junior has a double-double.

- **Wang** scored 13 points and collected seven rebounds and three assists.

- **Washington** had 11 points, his second double-figure scoring game.

- **Silpe** had six assists, a season high and two shy of his career best, and his four steals were one shy of his career best set earlier this season.

- **Donahue** scored a season-high nine points on three three-pointers.

- Sophomore **Mark Jackson** and freshman **Alex Imegwu** scored their first career points.

Notemeal from Oregon St. (Paradise Jam)

- **Goodman** scored 13 points; he led the Quakers in scoring in all three games in this tournament (58 points in total) and was named to the all-tournament team.

- **Woods** had 11 points, his fourth double-figure scoring game this season and the 34th of his career.

- **Brodeur** once again was held to single digits in scoring (5 points), but he had nine rebounds which was one shy of his season high.

Notemeal from Kansas St. (Paradise Jam)

- After going 20-0 in such games dating back to the start of the last season, Penn lost despite shooting more free throws than its opponent; the Quakers took 22 foul shots and KSU took 18. (Both teams made 14.)

- Penn made just 15 field goals, a team low in the Donahue era, and had just four three-pointers which is one above the team low in the Donahue era.

- **Woods** had a career-high 10 rebounds, leading all players in that category.

Notemeal from N. Iowa (Paradise Jam)

- Penn improved to 4-0 for the first time since the 1978-79 season, which also was the season that Penn advanced to the Final Four.

- Penn won despite grabbing just 19 rebounds, a team low in the Donahue era. UNI's rebound margin was 22 on the night (41-19). *Amazingly, the last time Penn had fewer than 20 rebounds in a game, the Quakers also won. It was on February 25., 2012, when they had 17 boards in a 55-54 win at Harvard.*

- On the flip side, Penn had 13 steals which was one shy of the team high in the Donahue era. The Quakers had 14 against Cornell on February 12, 2017.

- **Goodman** set career highs with 27 points and five steals—which matched a Penn player high in the Donahue era—and also matched a career best with five three-point baskets.

- **Washington** scored 12 points, all in the second half and all on three-point baskets (going 4-of-4 beyond the arc).

Notemeal from Lafayette

- The win was Penn's largest over Lafayette since a 105-73 victory during the 2005-06 season.

- Penn tied a team high in the Donahue era with 35 made field goals; the Quakers did it twice last year, against Northern Illinois and Delaware State.

- Penn's 13 treys were a season high, and they came from seven different players.

- Lafayette had opponent lows in the Donahue era in rebounds (25), free throws made (1) and free throws attempted (3).

- **Simmons** had 11 points, his first double-figure scoring game since scoring 12 against Delaware State last December 27.

- Senior **Max Rothschild** matched a career high with six assists.

NCAA Evaluation Tool

Known as NET, this new tool replaced the NCAA's Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) and relies on results, strength of schedule, game location, scoring margin, net offensive and defensive efficiency, and quality of wins and losses. The NET was built to create a ranking system that is as accurate as possible while also evaluating team performance fairly. ONE KEY: game date and order were omitted, giving equal importance to early and late-season games. Here, we list

Notemeal from Rice

• Penn shot 82.1 percent from the foul line on Friday (23-28), just three days after shooting 33.3 percent at the charity stripe in its opener (6-18).

• The win was head coach **Steve Donahue's** 50th at Penn and his 250th overall as a head coach.

• **Silpe** scored a career-high 16 points, surpassing his previous high of 13 set as a freshman vs. Dartmouth. *He also matched a career high with five steals, set in that same Dartmouth game.*

• **Goodman** scored 15 points, with 12 of them coming in the second half.

• **Washington** made his first collegiate start in place of the injured Ryan Betley and opened Penn's scoring with a three-pointer. He ended up with three treys for nine points.

Notemeal from G. Mason

• Junior AJ Brodeur led all players in both points (19) and rebounds (10) on Tuesday, his 10th career double-double and his 44th double-figure scoring game. *Penn is now 9-1 when Brodeur has a double-double.*

• **Woods** was hampered by foul trouble but scored all of his 10 points in the game's final 5:22. He had 10 of Penn's last 13 points.

• In his first college game, **Wang** hit three-pointers on his first two touches on offense and finished with 14 points.

• After sitting out all of last year, senior **Tyler Hamilton** provided a nice spark off the bench by playing 19 minutes and contributing six points, three rebounds and two assists.

2018-19 Schedule Notes

• Penn played eight games in November, one shy of the program record set last year. That number was helped by the Quakers playing in an exempt event for the second-straight year (the Paradise Jam).

• Penn played the earliest game in program history, by calendar date, when the Quakers opened at George Mason on Tuesday, Nov. 6.

• Penn's home opener also was a homecoming for Rice's head coach, former Penn assistant Scott Pera, as well as former Penn player Dylan Jones.

• When Penn played Lafayette (Nov. 13), Coach Donahue matched up against Fran O'Hanlon, with whom he shared bench space as assistants at Penn.

• For the second time in three years, Penn will host the reigning NCAA champion when Villanova comes to "the Cathedral of College Basketball" on Tuesday, Dec. 11.

• By calendar date, Penn's January 5 game at Princeton will represent the earliest meeting between these Ivy rivals since they met on January 5, 1980.

• For the first time in history, the Penn-Princeton series will be done before the Quakers play another Ivy League game. (Penn's home game with the Tigers will take place on Saturday, Jan. 12.) The last time both Penn-Princeton regular-season games were played before February was 1977-78.

• When Penn plays at Temple (Jan. 19), head coach Steve Donahue will match wits one final time against his former boss at Penn, Fran Dunphy, who will retire after the season.

• For the third-straight season, both Penn basketball programs will be part of Ivy League doubleheaders that do not involve Princeton. Like last year, this season they will take place against Cornell and Columbia, as both Quaker teams are on the road to face the Big Red and Lions on Feb. 1-2 and then host Columbia and Cornell Feb. 22-23.

STEVE DONAHUE, JOHN R. ROCKWELL HEAD COACH



PASSION. GRATITUDE. UNITY. COMPETITIVENESS. HUMILITY.
Now in his fourth season as the John R. Rockwell Head Coach of the University of Pennsylvania men's basketball program, these are the five "core values" that Steve Donahue has established for the players, coaches and staff affiliated with the program that are under his stewardship.

Steve Donahue was introduced as the John R. Rockwell Head Coach of Men's Basketball on March 17, 2015 and is in his fourth season as the 20th head coach in program history.

Donahue is the only person in Ivy League history to lead two different programs to conference championships, Cornell (2008, 2009, 2010) and Penn (2018). In addition, he is one of just seven coaches in Ancient Eight history to win 100 conference games—he finished the 2017-18 season with 101 total—and the only one among those seven to do it at two different schools (78 at Cornell, 23 at Penn)

Donahue's third year at Penn was one of the most memorable in the program's illustrious history. The Quakers went 24-9 overall, the most wins since the 2001-02 team had 25. In Ivy League play, Penn went 12-2 during the regular season and clinched a share of its first Ancient Eight title since 2006-07. Following the regular season, the Red and Blue defeated Yale and then co-champion Harvard in the Ivy League Tournament to earn the program's first NCAA Tournament bid since 2007. The Quakers traveled to Wichita, Kan., where they fell to top-seeded Kansas, 76-60.

After the season, Donahue was named Ivy League Coach of the Year, NABC District 13 Coach of the Year, and ECAC Coach of the Year.

The Quakers went 11-17 overall in Donahue's first season—their highest win total since the 2011-12 season—and finished 5-9 in the Ivy League. Senior center Darien Nelson-Henry was a second-team All-Ivy selection. In 2016-17, Penn earned a spot in the inaugural Ivy League Tournament and took top-seeded Princeton to overtime before falling in a semifinal. Overall, the Red and Blue went 13-15 and freshman AJ Brodeur set a single-season record for blocked shots (66) to earn second-team All-Ivy and All-Big 5.

Donahue's hiring marked a return to Penn for the Delaware County native; he was an assistant coach for the Quakers under Fran Dunphy from 1990-91 until 1999-2000. During that 10-year span, Penn won six Ivy League titles—including four separate undefeated conference campaigns—and compiled a 182-91 overall record that included a 114-26 mark in Ivy play.

Donahue left Penn to become head coach at Cornell ahead of the 2000-01 season. He stayed in Ithaca for 10 years, gradually building the Big Red program up until the table was set for a three-year run that included a trio of Ivy League titles; a 72-21 overall record that included a 38-4 Ivy mark; and three NCAA Tournament appearances that included a run to the Sweet 16 in 2010. Donahue was the Clair Bee National Coach of the Year and National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 4 Coach of the Year in 2009-10; and the NABC District 4 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District II Coach of the Year in 2007-08, when his team went 14-0 in Ivy League play to become just the third program in Ancient Eight history to achieve an unbeaten conference season (also Penn and Princeton).

While at Cornell, Donahue coached and/or recruited seven of the school's top 13 all-time leading scorers; two Ivy League Player of the Year selections; two Ivy League Rookie of the Year selections;

eight NABC All-District selections; six Academic All-District players; and two Academic All-Americans.

Following that Sweet 16 campaign, Donahue became head coach at Boston College. He spent four years at The Heights, going 21-13 his first season and getting the Eagles to the NIT. In 2012-13, Olivier Hanlan was consensus ACC Rookie of the Year.

Prior to his arrival at Penn for the 1990-91 season, Donahue was an assistant under legendary coach Herb Magee at Philadelphia University for two seasons and helped the Rams to a pair of 20-win seasons and the NCAA Division II Tournament. Before that, Donahue was as an assistant for current Lafayette head coach Fran O'Hanlon at Monsignor Bonner High School, helping guide Bonner to a Catholic League title. He began his coaching career at Springfield (Pa.) HS.

A 1984 Ursinus College graduate, Donahue was a four-year letter man in basketball and baseball for the Bears and captain of the basketball team as a senior. His freshman season, Donahue helped the hoops team finish 23-8 and advance to the NCAA Division III Tournament semifinal round. His sophomore year, the Bears were NCAA quarterfinalists.

Donahue and his wife, Pamela, have four children: Taylor, Matthew, Katie and Jack.

Twos, Threes, and Frees

In a Philadelphia Daily News article published in September 2015, Coach Donahue explained his offensive philosophy thusly: "I want to get a layup or a dunk. When I'm attacking the basket, I ask my guys, 'Are you 95 percent certain that you're going to make this or get fouled?' If they're not, there are mechanisms in place to find my second thing: a standstill, in-rhythm three. The third thing is a post-up with two feet in the lane, one on one. If you get that, great; if not, it should be kicked. So everything we do evolves from that."

With that in mind, we decided to chart the number of two-point field-goal attempts, three-point field-goal attempts, and foul shots that Penn has taken this season as well as the field-goal breakdown throughout Donahue's career as head coach.

• **Penn entered the 2018-19 season 18th on the NCAA Division I list of all-time winningest programs?** The Quakers had 1,771 victories in program history at the start of the season.

• **From 1970-79, Penn went 223-56 overall, a .799 win percentage?**

The only schools with better win percentages during that decade were UCLA (273-27, .910) and Marquette (252-40, .863). UNC was fourth (.786), while Kentucky was fifth (.764).

• **Penn was a part of arguably the most famous Final Four in history?**

The Quakers joined Magic Johnson's Michigan State team and Larry Bird's Indiana State team in Provo, Utah, that year. Penn was beaten by the Spartans in the semifinal round. The fourth team in that Final Four? DePaul, which beat Penn 96-93 in overtime in the consolation game.

• **Penn's 1970-71 team holds a unique distinction in the annals of college basketball?**

That Quaker squad went 28-1 overall, losing in the NCAA Tournament East Regional final to Villanova. The Wildcats would later vacate the win due to the use of an ineligible player in the game. Thus, in the NCAA's eyes, Penn's record that year is 28-0—making them the only “undefeated” team in history to play in the NCAA Tournament but not win it. (There have been undefeated teams that did NOT play in the NCAA Tournament, most notably Kentucky in 1953-54 and N.C. State in 1972-73.)

• **Penn is one of just two teams to defeat the University of North Carolina in an NCAA Tournament game played in the state of North Carolina?** On March 11, 1979, the ninth-seeded Quakers

defeated the top-seeded Tar Heels, 72-71, in an East Regional second-round game played at Reynolds Coliseum in Raleigh. (That day is known by fans on Tobacco Road as “Black Sunday,” as second-seeded Duke also lost at Reynolds, to St. John's.) UNC's only other loss in its 35 other in-state NCAA Tournament games came on March 18, 2018, an 86-65 loss to Texas A&M.

• **Penn holds the second-longest conference winning streak in NCAA Division I history?**

The Quakers won 48 straight Ivy League games from 1992-96, including three straight 14-0 seasons in 1992-93, 1993-94 and 1994-95. The overall record for conference wins is held by UCLA, which won 50 straight Pac-8 games from 1971-74.

• **Penn's 1919-20 and 1920-21 teams were considered national champions?**

The 1919-20 Quakers went 20-0 during the regular season, clinching the EIL title with a four-overtime win over Princeton (tied for the most OTs played in program history). Penn then met the Western champion, the University of Chicago, in a best-of-three series to determine the national champion and won the series 2-1. The 1920-21 team went 21-2 overall, the only losses coming by a point at Cornell and by two points vs. Penn State. Both of those Quakers teams were retroactively named national champion by the Helms Athletic Foundation.

• **Penn's home court, The Palestra, has hosted 48 NCAA Tournament games?**

The first were the East Regional in the tournament's first year, 1939. The most recent took place in 1984, when Penn hosted an opening-round tripleheader.

The Palestra also hosted the last Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (A.I.A.W.) national championship game, in 1982, as Rutgers beat Texas, 83-77. The following year, the NCAA took over the women's basketball national championship.

• **Three former Penn players are currently Division I head coaches?**

They are Matt Langel (Colgate), Fran McCaffery (Iowa), and Andrew Toole (Robert Morris).

• **When Penn beat Delaware State on December 27, 2017, the Quakers set an NCAA Division 1 record?**

Penn had 10 different players hit three-pointers in the 105-52 win at The Palestra, breaking the previous mark of nine set three times, first by Dartmouth in 1993 and most recently by Michigan in 2008.


• **Hall of Fame coach Chuck Daly was once the head coach at Penn?**

Before he won a pair of NBA titles as head coach of the Detroit Pistons in 1989 and 1990, and before he headed up the “Dream Team” at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Daly spent six years at the Quaker helm, going 125-38 (including a 74-10 Ivy League mark) and winning four Ivy titles.

• **Penn can count among its alums the Executive Director of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), Jim Haney?**

He graduated in 1971 and earned the Bus McDonald Award (Most Inspirational Player) as a senior. The Quakers were 68-13 (38-4 Ivy, 9-3 Big 5) during Haney's career, including a staggering 53-3 (28-0 Ivy, 8-0 Big 5) his last two years.

Penn is the most recent Ivy League team to reach the Final Four; the Quakers did it in 1979.


