A LOOK AT THE 2018 MOUNTAIN WEST SCHEDULE

The 2018 Mountain West football schedule is comprised of 97 games, including 48 Conference matchups. The scheduling format for the 12-member football lineup consists of five intra-divisional games and three cross-divisional contests. Each institution will play four home and four road Conference games. 2018 marks the second year of the current four-year cycle and the sixth year overall featuring the current rotation.

The 2018 schedule will play out over 14 weeks, concluding on Sat., Dec. 1 with the Mountain West Football Championship Game featuring the two divisional champions.

The nonconference slate features 24 games against teams that earned bowl berths in 2017, including Arizona State, Arkansas State, Army (three games), Florida Atlantic, Michigan State, Missouri, Navy (two games), New Mexico State (three games), Oklahoma State, Oregon, Stanford, Toledo (two games), Troy, UCLA, USC, Washington State (two games) and Wisconsin.

Five nonconference opponents finished ranked in last year's final Associated Press Top 25 and USA Today/Coaches' polls, including #7/6 Wisconsin, #12/10 USC, #14/14 Oklahoma State, #15/16 Michigan State and #20/19 Stanford.

BUILDING ON 2017

Last season, Fresno State became only the second FBS program in history to go from double-digit losses one season (1-11) to double-digit wins the next (10-4), joining Miami (Ohio) from 2010.

Mountain West teams have recorded the nation's largest win improvement in the last two seasons. Fresno State had a nine-game win improvement in 2017, while Wyoming tied for the best nationally with a six-game win improvement in 2016.

This season, Fresno State has opened the season 2-1, with victories over Idaho (79-13) and at UCLA (38-14). The Bulldogs lone loss came at Minnesota.

NCAA RECORD-TYING PERFORMANCE

On Sept. 8 against New Mexico State, Utah State junior placekicker **Dominik Eberle** tied two NCAA records, helping lead his team to a 60-13 victory. The native of Nuremberg, Germany, connected on all six field goals he attempted and was a perfect six-for-six on PATs. The 24 points tied an NCAA record for points scored in a single game by a kicker. Eberle also tied a single-game NCAA record for most field goals made from 50-plus yards with three.

In all, Eberle made field goals from 44, 32, 51, 21, 51 and 51 yards. The six made field goals set a Mountain West single-game record.

UNLV'S RUSHING ATTACK

UNLV enters Week 5 with the second-ranked rushing attack nationally, averaging 336.5 yards on the ground per game. The Rebels are led on the ground by senior running back **Lexington Thomas** and quarterback **Armani Rogers**.

- Armani Rogers ranks ninth, and is second among FBS quarterbacks, with 122.0 rushing yards per game.
- Lexington Thomas ranks 15th nationally, rushing for 116.3 yards per contest.
- The Rebels are the only FBS team with multiple players averaging at least 100 rushing yards per game this season.
- Thomas is 785 rushing yards shy of becoming the program's career leading rusher. Earning that would also place Thomas in fifth-place all-time in Mountain West history.

HAWAI'I BRINGS BACK THE RUN-N-SHOOT OFFENSE

This season, Hawai'i brought back the Run-N-Shoot offense, a style they used from 1999-2011. Below are some of the Rainbow Warrior's offensive highlights:

- In the season opener at Colorado State, UH threw for 418 yards and rushed for another 199 yards. The 617 yards of total offense is the Rainbow Warriors' highest output in a single-game since Nov. 23, 2013 (624 yards at Wyoming).
- In the Conference-opener against the Rams, sophomore QB Cole McDonald set a program record for passing yards (418) in a starting debut. The record was previously held by now-head coach Nick Rolovich, who threw for 367 yards vs. Portland State in 2001.
- In a home-opening victory against Navy, McDonald threw for 428 yards and six touchdowns. He is the first Mountain West QB to throw for 400 yards in backto-back games since Colorado State's Garrett Grayson in September of 2014.
- Hawai'i ranks ninth nationally in passing offense (353.4 yards per game).
- The Rainbow Warriors are off to their best five-game start (4-1) since 2007, when they went 12-0 in the regular season and earned a spot in the Sugar Bowl.

NOT JUST A FLASH IN THE PAN

Below are a couple notes about Mountain West teams with continued success:

- On Saturday, Sept. 8, the Mountain West won three games against the Pac-12 (Nevada beat Oregon State, Fresno State over UCLA and San Diego State defeated Arizona State) in the same weekend for the first time since September of 2008.
- The Mountain West has won three consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy and Fresno State over Houston).
- In the last three seasons, San Diego State has racked up 35 victories, which is the
 most among the Group of 5 and sixth-best nationally, trailing only Alabama (45),
 Clemson (44), Ohio State (39), Oklahoma (38) and Wisconsin (37).
- Head coach Rocky Long has led the Aztecs to a bowl game in his first seven seasons. Long is the all-time winningest head coach in Mountain West history (129-99).
- Boise State has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West. Since 2010, BSU has compiled a 12-9 (.571) record against current Autonomous 5 programs. The Broncos have defeated Arizona, Arizona State, Georgia, Oregon, Oregon State, Utah, Virginia, Washington and Washington State.
- Boise State has been nationally-ranked for at least one week for the 17th consecutive season.
- Boise State has made 16 consecutive postseason appearances, the longest streak among Group of 5 institutions and sixth-best nationally.
- Over the last 14 seasons, the Mountain West owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences (.560), trailing only the SEC (.628).

MOUNTAIN WEST'S 20TH FOOTBALL SEASON

Led by the vision of then-Colorado State President Dr. Albert Yates, the Mountain West was formed when presidents of eight institutions - Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming - decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference.

Mountain West football began its 20th season last Saturday as Hawai'i defeated Colorado State, 43-34. The Rams, who are an original member of the MW, played in the first-ever Conference game on Sept. 16, 1999 as BYU hosted CSU.

 50-plus yards (3).
- .@BroncoSportsFB is one of six teams that haven't thrown an interception this season.
- @FresnoStateFB defeated UCLA 38-14 last Saturday, earning its first victory against an Autonomous 5 opponent since Sept. 15, 2012 (Colorado, 69-14).
- .@FresnoStateFB defeated Idaho 79-13 in the season opener. The 79 points are the second-most scored in a single game in @MountainWest history.
- A @FresnoStateFB victory on Saturday vs. Toledo (7:30 p.m. PT on CBSSN) would be the Bulldogs best four-game start (3-1) since going 4-0 in 2013.
- The @MountainWest has won three consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy and Fresno State over Houston).
- .@BroncoSportsFB has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West.
- @SDSUFootball ranks second nationally in rush defense, limiting opponents to just 64.5 yards per game. In the season opener, the Aztecs held Stanford's Bryce Love to 29 rushing yards.
- @BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the fifth consecutive season, while @FresnoStateFB is favored to win the West Division for the first time since 2014.

- .@CSUFootball scored 25 unanswered points on its way to defeating Arkansas (34-27) on Sept. 8. This is the first @MountainWest victory against a SEC opponent since 2011 (Boise State over Georgia).
- In the season-opener against Troy, @BroncoSportsFB senior cornerback Tyler Horton tied an FBS single-game record with two fumble returns for touchdowns.
- .@SDSUFootball has compiled a 34-10 record over the last three seasons. The Aztecs are searching for their fourth consecutive 10-win season, which would be the longest-stretch in program history.
- The Aztecs' 35 victories in the last three years are the sixth-most nationally and the most among the Group of 5, trailing only Alabama (45), Clemson (44), Ohio State (39), Oklahoma (38) and Wisconsin (37).
- .@BroncoSportsFB is one of four Group of 5 teams that will not face a FCS opponent this season, joining UTSA, Miami (OH) and Northern Illinois.
- .@UNMLoboFB is one of only two FBS programs that hasn't attempted a field goal this season.

FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

Host Determination: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. The host site will be determined no later than the Sunday following the conclusion of the regular season.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

1. Head-to-head result between the tied divisional champions.

2. If still tied:

If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings will be used;

If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;

If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;

If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.

- If still tied, the best record against common Conference opponents.
- If still tied, the team with the highest overall winning percentage (Conference and non-conference excluding exempt games).
- If still tied, a coin toss will be conducted by the Commissioner.
