

Post-Game Quotes – 10/27 vs BYU

Coach Weir:

“I think, outside of the three-point shooting percentage, we played a pretty good basketball game. We won the turnover battle and we had more offensive rebounds than they did. We did a lot of things that we wanted to do, we just couldn’t make shots. And I thought we had some really good looks as well. Our quality of shot wasn’t bad, (but) we’re going to have to make those to win games.”

I thought the atmosphere was terrific, I thought it was awesome. I thought their volume was great and I felt it for sure. I hope the players did as well. It was a really neat game and I’m really thankful for all the people that gave us a chance.”

On Logwood’s performance: “Sam’s been great. He really wants this badly right now and I know he’s trying to maybe make up for things all at one time. I think you can feel his aggression, his commitment, his energy. As long as we can keep using him in the right way offensively and spreading the floor, I think he’ll keep having games like that. Him buying into what we’re doing has really allowed our team to, I think, be better than a lot of people think that we’re going to be this year.”

Sam Logwood:

“I honestly just felt a lot more comfortable. The new system that we’re in is just more my style of play. It allows me to be myself out there. We made a lot of mental errors, a lot of errors within the offense, but I feel like we got them out early, which will help us in the long run.”

“With Coach Weir, we do a lot more running and a lot more that’s physically demanding on our bodies. After practice we run, we condition. It’s something we take pride in, our conditioning and our shape. I personally feel like I’m in the best shape of my life, and I know a lot of the guys do as well.”

Joe Furstinger:

“Everyone (on the team) is really close and it’s really special this year. We’ve got all the pieces, and I feel really confident with this team.”
