- .@BroncoSportsFB has defeated an Autonomous 5 team in five of six seasons since joining the @MountainWest. BSU's next chance for a A5 win is on Sept. 22 vs. Virginia.
- .@AFFootball is tied for 5th nationally with a 7-game win streak, trailing only Oklahoma (12), USC (11), Old Dominion (8) & Coastal Carolina (8).
- .@GoAztecs have won 34 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards as a team.
- .@CSUFootball QB Nick Stevens leads the nation with 985 passing yds through three games. Stevens has thrown for at least 300 yds in 4 straight games.

- .@GoAztecs RB Rashaad Penny rushed for 216 yds at Arizona State, the 5th-most nationally in a single game this season.
- On Sept. 11, @GoAztecs RB Rashaad Penny became the 1st @MountainWest Player to win 2 of 3 weekly awards in the same week.
- Penny is the only FBS player to score a receiving, rushing and kick return TD in a single game this season.
- .@CSUFootball's 31-point win over Oregon State on Aug. 26 is the largest against an Autonomous 5 opponent in program history.
- .@CSUFootball's 31-point victory is the 5th-largest by a @MountainWest member over an Autonomous 5 team since 2010.
- .@CSUFootball has sold a program-record of more than 15,000 season tickets as of the beginning of August. The previous school record was 11,500.
- .@BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the fourth consecutive season.
- .@GoAztecs are the first team in MW history to be selected as unanimous divisional champs in back-to-back seasons.
- .@BroncoSportsFB has won 24-consecutive nonconference home games, the last loss came on Dec. 28, 2005 vs. Boston College.
- .@MountainWest institutions have recorded Top-25 victories in three of the last four years heading in 2017.
- .@SJSUSpartanFB is 1 of 3 teams nationally to play at least 3 opponents ranked in the preseason top-25 polls in the first 4 weeks.
- .@SJSUSpartanFB is seeking its first win against a ranked opponent since Nov. 29, 2013 (#16 Fresno State, 62-52) as it takes on Utah on Sept. 16.
- In the 18 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant 8 times.
- .@wyo_football DB Andrew Wingard ranks 3rd nationally in career average tackles per game (9.54).
- .@BroncoSportsFB has produced a 1,000-yd rusher in eight straight seasons, which is tied with Auburn as the longest active streak in the nation.
- Against Western Carolina, @HawaiiFootball blocked 3 kicks, a program record. In 2016, UH led the @MountainWest with 4 blocked kicks all season.
- @BroncoSportsFB opens MW play on Sept. 14 vs. @UNMLoboFB. The Broncos have won 17 consecutive conference openers.

NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

San Diego State RB Rashaad Penny earned Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance at Arizona State on Sept. 9. Penny rushed for a careerhigh 216 yards and 3 total touchdowns. The native of Norwalk, California, accounted for 353 all-purpose yards.

Penny is only the 11th Mountain West player and second Aztec to earn Walter Camp weekly honors since the awards inception in 2004, joining former LB Calvin Munson (Sept. 6, 2015).

JOSH ALLEN ATTENTION

Wyoming junior quarterback Josh Allen is one of the nation's top quarterbacks and he has the national interest to accompany the talent.

After the 2017 NFL Draft, ESPN NFL Insider Adam Schefter said of Allen, "one personnel director told me this weekend, you can put it in the books, Josh Allen will be the No. 1 pick in the NFL draft next year."

If Allen were selected with the top pick, the Mountain West would have the most No. 1 overall selections among Group of 5 conferences.

JOHN URSUA'S BIG DAY

Hawai'i sophomore WR John Ursua caught 12 passes for 272 yards at UMass on Aug. 26. This is the fourth-most receiving yards in program history and fourth-best in Mountain West annals. Ursua's 272 receiving yards are the most by a MW pass-catcher since Thomas Sperbeck's (Boise State) 281 yards on Nov. 14, 2015.

According to Pro Football Focus, Ursua caught all 12 passes from the slot.
