#### IN THE NATIONAL POLLS

Boise State, Fresno State and Utah State are all receiving votes in both the Amway Coaches and Associated Press Top-25 preseason polls.

The Broncos are looking to extend their streak of consecutive years nationally ranked at least one week to 18.

Last season, the Mountain West was the only non-autonomous 5 conference with three nationally-ranked teams in the final polls.

#### A LOOK AT THE 2019 MOUNTAIN WEST SCHEDULE

The 2019 Mountain West football schedule is comprised of 97 games, including 48 Conference matchups. The scheduling format for the 12-member football lineup consists of five intra-divisional games and three cross-divisional contests. Each institution will play four home and four road Conference games. 2019 marks the third year of the four-year cycle and the seventh year overall featuring the current rotation.

The 2019 schedule will play out over 15 weeks, concluding on Sat., Dec. 7 with the Mountain West Football Championship Game featuring the two divisional champions. The championship contest will be broadcast on ESPN with kickoff set for 2 p.m. MT/1 p.m. PT/11 a.m. HT.

The nonconference slate features 19 games against teams that earned bowl berths in 2018, including Arkansas State, Army (three games), BYU (three games), LSU, Marshall, Minnesota, Missouri, Northwestern, Notre Dame, Oregon, Purdue, Toledo, Vanderbilt, Wake Forest and Washington.

#### **HONORING GRADUATES**

Many Mountain West student-athletes who already hold a degree will have a little something extra on their jerseys beginning with the 2019-20 academic year.

Mountain West student-athletes who have earned a degree, but have remaining eligibility will see the MW logo on their jersey replaced with one that incorporates both the MW mark and the word "graduate."

#### #HIGHLIGHTS

(NOTES FROM AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST IN 280 CHARACTERS OR LESS)

- The @MountainWest has won five consecutive games against an opponent from the @pac12 (Nevada over Oregon State, Fresno State over UCLA, San Diego State over Arizona State, Fresno State over Arizona State and Hawai'i over Arizona).
- The @MountainWest has won four consecutive games against an opponent from @American\_FB (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy, Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).
- The @MountainWest has been nationally-ranked in 14 of the last 18 College Football Playoff Rankings.
- The @MountainWest is 1-0 against autonomous 5 opponents in 2019. The league single-season record for victories against A5 opponents is 10 (2008).
- In the past 15 years, the @MountainWest has been the top non-autonomous 5 conference nine times and second four times.
- In the 20 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant eight times.
- @BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the sixth consecutive season, while @FresnoStateFB is favored to win the West Division for the second consecutive year.
- @BroncoSportsFB has won at least 10 games in three consecutive seasons, tied as the longest active streak amongst the nonautonomous 5 (Troy).
- @BroncoSportsFB has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of eight seasons since joining the @MountainWest. The Broncos will take on Florida State on Saturday evening.
- @FresnoStateFB and @wyo\_football enter the 2019 season riding four-game win streaks, tied for the fifth-longest active streak nationally.
- @wyo\_football hosts Missouri on 8/31. The Cowboys are searching for their first victory against an Autonomous 5 opponent since Nov. 8, 2008 (Def. Tennessee, 13-7).
- @HawaiiFootball WR Cedric Byrd II racked up 224 receiving yards vs. Arizona on Aug. 24. Only one MW player has recorded back-to-back 200-yard receiving games, Fresno State WR Davante Adams in November 2013.
- @USUFootball QB Jordan Love has started 19 games and in those contests the Aggies are averaging 42.2 points, which is 2nd in the nation among active signalcallers with at least 15 starts #10veForHeisman
- @BroncoSportsFB's Curtis Weaver has 20.5 career sacks, just two away from tying for fifth all-time in @MountainWest history. The league record is 28.5 by Jan Jorgensen (BYU) and Jerry Hughes (TCU).
- @wyo\_football's Logan Wilson enters the season with 316 career tackles, the second-most in the nation among active defenders. Wilson is 80 tackles shy of entering the @MountainWest's top-5.
- @USUFootball kicker Dominik Eberle has made 122 consecutive PATs, the second-most in @MountainWest history. Eberle has not missed a PAT in his collegiate career.

#### POSTSEASON SUCCESS

The Mountain West has sent at least six teams to the postseason in six consecutive years.

The MW, which has earned 96 bowl bids, including Boise State's 2018 appearance vs. Boston College, since 1999 and holds a 52-43 (.547) all-time record, owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games in the last 15 seasons among the 10 FBS conferences (.563), trailing only the SEC (.617).

#### FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

**Host Determination**: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

- 1. Head-to-head result between the tied divisional champions.
- 2. If still tied:
- If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking
  and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the
  host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the
  latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the
  regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings will be used;
- -OR-
- If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;
- -OR-
- If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;
- -OR-
- If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.
- 3. If still tied, the best record against common Conference opponents.

4. If still tied, the team with the highest overall winning percentage (Conference and non-conference excluding exempt games).

5. If still tied, a coin toss will be conducted by the Commissioner.

The 2019 Mountain West Football Championship game will be played on Saturday, December 7 at 2 p.m. MT/1 p.m. PT/11 a.m. HT. The contest will be played at the home stadium of the regular-season Mountain West divisional champion with the highest win percentage in Conference games only. ESPN will broadcast the matchup for the fourth consecutive year.

The Mountain West has announced a new branding and marketing campaign for the conference to further define the MW's strong, energetic brand as it begins its 21st year as an NCAA Division I athletic conference.

Designed to make clearer the league's purpose, vision and values the conference has adopted "At the Peak" as its tagline. The new high-impact moniker resonates the league's personality and uniqueness as one of the elite conferences in college athletics.

The branding initiative has been in planning and development since February 2018. The Mountain West worked in partnership with Old Hat, a strategic marketing agency specializing in collegiate athletics, to develop a plan that would showcase the personality of the league.

Cradled among the most desirable locations in America, the Mountain West stretches to eight different states from the shores of the Pacific Coastline to the Rocky Mountains. The conference has long been known since its founding for its integrity and its commitment to the ideals of the student-athlete experience and the unique opportunities afforded to students at each institution.

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the Mountain West continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship.

Now in its 21st year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics. The Mountain West membership is comprised of 11 all-sport members: the United States Air Force Academy, Boise State University, Colorado State University, Fresno State, University of Nevada, University of New Mexico, San Diego State University, San José State University, UNLV, Utah State University and University of Wyoming. In addition, the University of Hawai'i and Colorado College participate in the Mountain West as single-sport members in football and women's soccer, respectively.
