A LOOK AT THE 2015 MOUNTAIN WEST SCHEDULE

The 2015 Mountain West football schedule is comprised of 97 games, including 48 Conference matchups. The scheduling format for the 12-member football lineup consists of five intra-divisional games and three cross-divisional contests. Each institution will play four home and four road Conference games. This is the third year of the initial four-year cycle in which each member institution will play every other Mountain West opponent home and away. In 2015, the cross-divisional opponents will flip from the first two years, with teams playing their new opponents from the other division.

The 2015 schedule will play out over 14 weeks, concluding on Sat., Dec. 5 with the Mountain West Football Championship Game to be played at the home stadium of the highest-ranked of the two divisional champions.

The non-conference slate features 22 games against teams that earned bowl berths in 2014, including Arizona, Arizona State, Auburn, BYU (4 games), Minnesota, Mississippi, Michigan State, Navy, Northern Illinois, Ohio State, Penn State, South Alabama, Texas A&M, UCLA, Utah (2 games), Washington (2 games) and Wisconsin. Nine non-conference opponents finished ranked in last year's final USA Today/Coaches' and Associated Press Top 25 polls, including national champion Ohio State, #5 Michigan State, #10 UCLA, #13 Wisconsin, #14/12 Arizona State, #17/19 Arizona, #19/17 Ole Miss, #20/21 Utah and #23/22 Auburn.

NO FLY ZONE

The Boise State starting secondary has recorded more career interceptions than any other starting secondary in the nation. Made up of Darian Thompson, Donte Deayon, Jonathan Moxey and Dylan Sumner-Gardner, the Broncos have 33 career picks. Thompson and Deayon both have 15 career interceptions, which is tied for the second-most in Mountain West history and tied for second-most among active NCAA defenders. Moxey has the other three interceptions for Boise State.

TWO NEW HEAD COACHES JOIN MW RANKS IN 2015

For the second consecutive year, the Mountain West welcomes two new head football coaches. Colorado State will be under the direction of **Mike Bobo**, while **Tony Sanchez** takes over at UNLV. Both are first-year head coaches.

Bobo comes to Colorado State from the University of Georgia, where he had spent the previous 14 seasons, including the last eight as offensive coordinator. Bobo's 14-year stint at Georgia, where he was a quarterback in the late 1990s, began in January, 2001, when head coach Mark Richt hired him as quarterbacks coach. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2007. During his time at UGA, Bobo helped lead the Bulldogs to 135 victories, including two Southeastern Conference championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles and eight bowl victories. Prior to his time with the Bulldogs, Bobo began his coaching career at Jacksonville State (1999-2000).

Sanchez spent the last six seasons leading Bishop Gorman (Las Vegas) High School to an overall record of 85-5 and six consecutive state 4A championships. In his six seasons at Bishop Gorman, Sanchez saw 34 of his players earn collegiate football scholarships, including 25 to FBS programs. Prior to his stint in Las Vegas, he coached at Onate High School in Las Cruces, N.M. and Irvin High School in El Paso, Texas. His lone collegiate coaching experience came in 1996 as he was an undergraduate assistant at New Mexico State, the school where Sanchez was a two-year letterwinner.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

The Mountain West is home to five of the 13 youngest head coaches at the FBS level. Boise State's **Bryan Harsin** (38), Nevada's **Brian Polian** (40), Colorado State's **Mike Bobo** (41), UNLV's **Tony Sanchez** (41) and Utah State's **Matt Wells** (41) are among the group of 13 coaches who were born in 1973 or later.

FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACHES IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

The Mountain West has welcomed 24 new head coaches over the last 16 seasons. Former BYU head coach Gary Crowton and current Boise State head coach **Bryan Harsin** have posted the most victories and highest win percentage among the group with 12 victories and an .857 win percentage in their inaugural years in 2001 and 2014, respectively. Harsin became the first to conclude his inaugural season by winning the Mountain West Championship Game, the first of two outright MW Championships in program history. Harsin is the only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State. Harsin is one of three first-year coaches to win at least 10 games in their inaugural season, joining Crowton (12 wins, 2001) and Urban Meyer (10 wins, 2003).

MOUNTAIN WEST IN THE POSTSEASON

The Mountain West sent a record seven teams into postseason bowl games in 2014, posting a 3-4 record (.429). Overall, the Mountain West has earned 69 bowl bids since 1999 and holds a 38-31 (.551) all-time record. The league has also posted an overall postseason mark of at least .500 in eight of the last 11 seasons.

The 2014 postseason marked the eighth straight year the MW has sent at least five teams to bowls and 11th time since the league's inception in 1999. It also marked the second straight year that six or more MW squads advanced to the postseason.

Over the last 11 seasons, the Mountain West has captured the Bowl Challenge Cup four times and owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences with a 31-23 mark (.574) during that span. The MW is the only conference to win the trophy four times since the award's inception in 2002-03.

For the second consecutive year, the Mountain West had seven bowl-eligible teams - Boise State (12-2), Colorado State (10-3), Air Force (10-3), Utah State (10-4), Nevada (7-6), San Diego State (7-6) and Fresno State (6-8). This ties the conference record for most bowl-eligible teams. The MW has boasted at least five bowl-eligible teams 11 times since the league's inception in 1999.

WEEK 1 OFFENSIVE

Nick Stevens, QB, Colorado State

- In his first career start, completed 20-of-28 passes (71.4 percent) for 289 yards and five touchdown passes (all career highs) in Colorado State's 65-13 victory over Savannah State.
- His five touchdown passes went to five different receivers
- The five touchdown passes tied for the second-most in CSU history, and the most by a Rams quarterback making his debut start. Played in only two and a half quarters due to the score.

DEFENSIVE

Calvin Munson, LB, San Diego State

- Recorded a team-high 11 tackles (3 solo), two interceptions (both returned for a touchdown - 19 yards and 67 yards) and 2.5 tackles for loss in San Diego State's 37-3 win over San Diego.
- Became the first player in school history and fourth since the inception of the Mountain West in 1999 to have two interceptions returned for a touchdown in a single game (SDSU has been playing football since 1921).
- The two interceptions returned for a touchdown ties an NCAA single-game record for a linebacker and are tied for the second most among all players.
- The two interceptions were more than every player in the country in Week 1 except for teammate Damontae Kazee and West Virginia's Karl Joseph (both had three).
- · The fumble recovery was the first of his career.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Andrew Rodriguez, WR/PR, Utah State

- Returned eight punts for 136 yards in Utah State's season-opening 12-9 win against Southern Utah.
- His 88-yard punt return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter proved to be the game-winning score.
 Overall, he returned a USU and MW record eight punts for 136 yards against SUU.
- Rodriguez's 88-yard punt return is tied for the second-longest in Mountain West history.
- The 88-yard punt return for also is a Maverik Stadium record and the third-longest in Aggie history trailing Kevin Robinson, who returned a punt 90 yards for a touchdown at Troy in 2004, and Dale Leatham, who also returned a punt 90 yards for a touchdown at Wichita State in 1950. Robinson held the previous Maverik Stadium record with an 87-yard punt return for a touchdown against San José State in 2005.
- The previous school record for punt returns in a game by an Aggie was seven by Kelley Deist against Southern Mississippi in 1974.
- The previous MW record was also seven by Scott Harding (Hawai'i) in 2014.

WEEK 2 OFFENSIVE

D.J. Johnson, RB, Air Force

- Rushed for 103 yards for his first-career 100-yard game on a career-most 21 carries in Air Force's 36-17 victory over Mountain West foe San José State.
- Tied his career-high with three rushing touchdowns all of which came in the fourth quarter.
- Scored on a 13-yard run to put the Falcons ahead 23-16 with 12:29 left in the game and followed with a one-yard run on fourth-and-goal to give the Falcons a two-score lead.
- Clinched the game with his final touchdown on a career-long 34 yard run with 3:43 left in the game.
- Six carries went for touchdowns or first downs, including five in the fourth quarter.
- Had 12 carries for 82 yards and three touchdowns in the fourth quarter.

DEFENSIVE

Weston Steelhammer, DB, Air Force

- Recorded six total tackles and led the defensive effort of holding San José State to just 16 points in the Air Force victory over the Spartans.
- Had one quarterback sack and a career-high three tackles for loss for 12 yards.
- Registered an interception in the fourth quarter to seal the game with the Falcons up by two scores.
- His three tackles for loss are the most by an Air Force player this season and gives him 4.5 TFL for the year.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Wyatt Bryan, K, Colorado State

- In Colorado State's 23-20 overtime loss to Minnesota, connected on a 37-yard, game-tying field goal as regulation expired, sending the game into overtime.
- Trailing 13-7, hit a 26-yard field goal late in the third-quarter, part of a 10-point swing that gave the Rams' the lead until the final minute of the game.
- Made two extra-point kicks.

- On Sept. 12 at BYU, Boise State lost only its 12th game when nationally ranked in either the AP or Coaches Poll. Overall, the Broncos have compiled a 92-12 record when ranked.
- Broncos defensive backs Darian Thompson and Donte Deayon have both registered 15 career interceptions, which are the second-most in Mountain West history behind Eric Weddle's (Utah) 18. The Boise State teammates are tied for the second-most active career INTs among all FBS defenders.
- Boise State QB Brett Rypien, a true freshman, made his collegiate debut on Sept. 18 against Idaho State. Rypien, who was forced into action due to an injury to Ryan Finley, completed eight-of-nine passes for 126 yards. He engineered three Broncos scoring drives.
- Boise State played a true freshman QB (Rypien) for the first time since 1993.
 That season, Tony Hilde made his debut vs. Montana on Oct. 2.
- Broncos sophomore RB Jeremy McNichols and Alabama's Derrick Henry lead the nation with seven rushing touchdowns. Additionally, McNichols is fourth nationally averaging 16 points per game.

- Boise State boasts the highest win percentage since 2000. The Broncos have won 169 of 198 contests for a mark of .853.
- Entering Week 4, the Broncos have the second-best rush defense nationally, allowing only 45.7 yards on the ground per game. In the opener, Washington ran for 29 yards, BYU rushed for 72 yards on Sept. 12 and most recently Idaho State could only manage 36 rushing yards. The last time Boise State allowed a 100-yard rusher was Nov. 15, 2014 when San Diego State's Donnel Pumphrey ran for 147 yards.
- The Broncos have compiled an 8-5 record against current autonomous 5 conference institutions dating back to 2010. Boise State has defeated Arizona, Washington (twice), Georgia, Arizona State, Virginia Tech, Oregon State and Utah in that time.
- The Broncos have the nation's second-best rush defense, allowing only 45.7 yards on the ground per game.
- Virginia RB Taquan Mizzell has a catch in 24 consecutive games. Through three games, Mizzell leads UVA with 155 rushing yards and he has the second-most receiving yards with 233.

- New Mexico LB Dakota Cox is second among all active FBS defenders averaging 9.8 tackles per contest. In 24 games, Cox has racked up 237 total tackles.
- UNM WR Dameon Gamblin finished the Tulsa game (Sept. 12) with 131 yards receiving, the most by a wideout in the Bob Davie era. Gamblin has 15 receptions for 230 yards in 2015. Last season, 16 receptions were the most by a Lobo pass-catcher and 293 were the most receiving yards. A UNM receiver hasn't registered more than 300 receiving yards since 2008.
- Wyoming RB Brian Hill ranks eighth nationally with 412 rushing yards. After
 opening the season with only 31 rushing yards against North Dakota, Hill has
 rushed for 206 yards in the last two games. He has also rushed for at least 100
 yards in six of the last eight contests.

- Wyoming has started 0-3 for the first time since 2012. That season, the Cowboys broke their losing skid in Week 4 with a 40-37 victory over Idaho.
- Cowboys DE Eddie Yarbrough has racked up 32 career tackles for loss, the second-most all-time by a Wyoming defender. John Fletcher, who played from 2005-09, is atop the list with 36 career TFLs. Among active FBS defender, the 32 TFLs are sixth-most.
- Wyoming registered a season-high three sacks on the road at Washington State on Sept. 19.
- Cowboys DB **Andrew Wingard** has recorded 14 tackles in the last two games, leading Wyoming with 12 total tackles in each game.
- Wyoming is looking to snap a six-game losing streak, the longest losing skid since 2010, when the Cowboys also lost six straight. The Cowboys haven't dropped seven consecutive games since the 2001-02 seasons, when they lost 12 in-a-row.
- Wyoming has won three in-a-row vs. New Mexico in Laramie. The last time the Lobos won in Laramie was 2008 (24-0).

- San Diego State hasn't defeated an autonomous 5 opponent on the road since 1999 (41-13 at Kansas).
- Overall, the Aztecs haven't won a road nonconference game since Sept. 28, 2013 at New Mexico State (26-16).
- On Sept. 19, the Aztecs did not register a takeaway for the first time in 16 games. The last time SDSU did not intercept a pass or recover a fumble was Nov. 30, 2013 at UNLV.
- SDSU RB Donnel Pumphrey ranks fifth among active FBS rushers with 2,868 yards. The 2,868 rushing yards are the fourth-most in program history. Pumphrey has rushed for more than 100 rushing yards in 14 career games, and the Aztecs are 10-4 in those contests.
- Aztecs K Donny Hageman connected on a 54-yard field goal on Sept. 19 vs. South Alabama, the second-longest kick in SDSU history and just outside of the Mountain West top 5. In the preseason, Hageman was named Preseason MW Special Teams Player of the Year.

- Penn State has won five consecutive non-conference home games dating back to Sept. 14, 3013, when the Nittany Lions lost 34-31 to UCF.
- The Nittany Lions average 124 passing yards per game, which ranks 124th nationally. Additionally, Penn State has only thrown one touchdown pass. On the ground, they average 203 rushing yards per game.
- The Penn State defense averages 4.3 sacks per contest, which is the third-best in the FBS. In the last two games, the Nittany Lions have recorded 11 sacks.
- The Aztecs are just the third current Mountain West opponent to play Penn State, joining Air Force and Utah State. The Nittany Lions have a 4-0 record against the MW, including 3-0 vs. Air Force.
- San Diego State head coach Rocky Long is serving as the Aztecs defensive coordinator for the seventh consecutive year, including all five years as the teams head coach. He is the only head coach in the nation that is both the head coach and defensive coordinator. Five other FBS head coaches also serve as offensive coordinators.

 this feat this season, including Utah State (Nick Vigil).
- Rufus is averaging 10.3 tackles per game, which ranks as the eighth-most among all FBS defensive backs.
- Wolf Pack RB James Butler eclipsed 100-yards rushing for the second time in his career when he rushed for 107 yards at Texas A&M. The 107 rushing yards are the second-most of his career, behind his 116-yard rushing effort vs. UNLV on Nov. 29, 2014.
- After throwing for a career-best 206 yards and two touchdowns at Texas A&M,
 Wolf Pack QB Tyler Stewart has put together consecutive games with multiple passing TDs for the first time in his career.

- Buffalo has picked off four passes and recovered four fumbles, which has led
 to the Bulls' 2.0 turnover margin, which ranks fourth nationally. These eight
 takeaways have led to 37 points.
- Last week vs. Florida Atlantic, Buffalo scored three defensive touchdowns. This
 is the first time the Bulls have accomplished this feat since becoming a FBS
 program in 1999.
- This is the first game in Nevada history to be played in the northeast.
- Nevada hasn't began a season 1-3 since 2011. That year, the Wolf Pack dropped games at Oregon, at Texas Tech and at Boise State, but they rallied to win their next five games and finished the year 7-6.
- Buffalo QB Joe Licata has thrown for 7,072 passing yards in his 36-game career. Licata's 7,072 passing yards are the sixth-most among active FBS QBs.

- Higgins caught eight passes for 125 yards and a touchdown last weekend vs.
 Colorado. He now has 13 career 100-yard receiving games, tied for the second-most in Mountain West history. BYU's Austin Collie holds the record with 17.
- With one more touchdown catch, Higgins will enter the Mountain West top 5 for career receiving TDs. Higgins enters Week 4 with 25 receiving TDs. UNLV's Phillip Payne (2008-11) holds the fifth-spot with 26 career touchdown catches.
- The Rams have played in back-to-back overtime games, both losses. They lost at home to Minnesota 23-20 and then fell to in-state rival Colorado 27-24.
- CSU hasn't allowed an opponent to score in the first quarter in 2015.
- Last week against Colorado, Rams RB Dalyn Dawkins rushed for 118 yards and hauled in 59 receiving yards, both career bests. He is the first CSU player to rush for at least 100 yards and catch 50 more since 2010 (Raymond Carter).

- This is Colorado State's first true road game of the season. The Rams opened with back-to-back home games before an in-state rivalry game against Colorado at Sports Authority Field at Mile High. The Rams have won three of their last four road contest, but dropped their most recent road game at Air Force (27-24 on Nov. 28, 2014).
- UTSA have nine turnovers through three games in 2015. The six lost fumbles and three interceptions have led to 59 points, including eight touchdowns.
- The Roadrunners have lost seven of their last 10 games.
- Since the UTSA football program began in 2011, the Roadrunners have never started a season 0-4.
- The Roadrunners have a 1-3 record against current Mountain West teams, with their lone winning coming against New Mexico on Aug. 31, 2013 (21-13). UTSA lost to San José State and Utah State when all three teams were in the WAC.

- Hawai'i has earned 10 victories against autonomous 5 institutions dating back to 2003, including a 2015 season-opening victory against Colorado (28-20).
 The Rainbow Warriors haven't defeated a Big Ten team since Nov. 25, 2006 vs. Purdue (42-35).
- Hawai'i RB Paul Harris broke off a 95-yard touchdown run in the third quarter
 against UC Davis (Sept. 19). This was the longest rush in school history and
 second-longest in Mountain West history. It is the longest run by a MW player
 since Oct. 29, 2011 when SDSU RB Ronnie Hillman went 99 yards for a score.
 Furthermore, Harris' 95-yard scamper was the longest among FBS players in

- The Rainbow Warriors are a perfect nine-for-nine when they enter the red zone.
 They have scored six touchdowns and kicked three field goals.
- Wisconsin has won nine consecutive games at Camp Randall Stadium, with its last loss coming on Nov. 30, 2013 vs. Penn State (31-24). The Badgers have won 34 straight nonconference home games dating back to Sept. 20, 2003. Their last loss was to UNLV on Sept. 13, 2003 (23-5). A win would tie Nebraska for the seventh-longest streak in NCAA history.
- The Badgers limit opponents to 304.7 yards of total offense, including 105.3 rushing yards per game.
- The Badgers have the second-highest home win percentage (.909) since the start of the 2004 season, behind Boise State (.972).
- Wisconsin's Joel Stave has compiled a 23-8 career record as the Badgers starting quarterback, a record that ranks third-best among active FBS QBs.

UNLV looks to earn its first win in the **Tony Sanchez** era. The last Rebels coach to no record his first victory within the first four games was Harvey Hyde in 1982.

- UNLV's nine-game losing streak is the second-longest nationally, behind New Mexico State, which has lost 13 consecutive games. The Rebels last win was on Oct. 10, 2014 vs. Fresno State (30-27 in OT).
- This is the longest UNLV losing skid since 2006, when the Rebels dropped 10 straight contests from Sept. 9 to Nov. 18.
- The Rebels have a 4-2 record against FCS opponents since the inception of the Mountain West in 1999. They have defeated Northern Colorado (2014) and Western Illinois (2013), since their last loss to an FCS-level opponent (Northern Arizona - 2012).
- UNLV is looking to avoid its first 0-4 start since 2004.
- In the last 16 games, UNLV has only lost four fumbles. The Rebels set a
 program record for fewest lost fumbles in 2014 with three, and they've only
 lost one this year (vs. UCLA).
- Idaho State has not defeated a current FBS-level opponent since beating Utah State, 27-24, on Nov. 18, 2000.

- Last week vs. Boise State, Idaho State WR Madison Mangum, the brother of BYU QB Tanner Mangum, had seven receptions for a season-high 98 receiving vards
- In their two losses, the Bengals have been outscored by 72 points, including 52 on the road at Boise State.
- Rebels WR Devonte Boyd averages 20.6 yards per reception, which ranks 10th nationally among all pass-catchers with at least 10 catches. On the year, Boyd has 11 receptions for 227 yards and two touchdowns.
- The Rebels have held their opponents to one fourth-down conversion on eight attempts (.125). The .125 conversion percentage ranks 15th-best nationally, but among teams that have faced at least five fourth-down conversion attempts, UNLV is second nationally.

- On Sept. 26, San José State and Fresno State will meet for the 79th time.
 The Bulldogs are the Spartans most common opponent. The two teams will
 be playing for the Valley Trophy, which was introduced in 2013. This trophy
 signifies the Santa Clara Valley (San José State) and the San Joaquin Valley
 (Fresno State).
- The Spartans defense ranks second nationally in pass defense, allowing only 73 passing yards per game. Over the last 15 games, SJSU is allowing just 108.9 passing yards per contest. It has been ranked in the top 5 nationally in this category every week since Sept. 20, 2014.
- The last player to throw for more than 200 yards on the SJSU defense was Fresno State's Brian Burrell, who threw for 207 yards on Nov. 8, 2014.
- Fresno State RB Marteze Waller ranks No. 10 among all active FBS players in career rushing yards with 2,495. This is the second-most in the Mountain West, behind San Diego State's Donnel Pumphrey, who has rushed for 2,868 yards.
- The Spartans have used three QBs this season, playing Joe Gray, Kenny Potter and Malik Watson. Gray has thrown for a team-high 361 yards, while Potter and Watson have thrown for 291 and 59 yards, respectively.

- Fresno State has also utilized multiple QBs in the first three games of 2015. Zack Greenlee and Chason Virgil have thrown for 313 and 298 yards, respectively. Greenlee has tossed six touchdown passes while Virgil has thrown three.
- The Spartans will look to snap a six-game Conference losing skid, a streak that started on Nov. 1, 2014 against Colorado State (38-31). SJSU has lost its lone Mountain West game of 2015, a 37-16 defeat at Air Force on Sept. 12.
- Since joining the Mountain West in 2012, the Bulldogs are 3-0 in Conference openers.
- SJSU RB Tyler Ervin has rushed for 341 yards and six touchdowns through three games this season, and he has caught one TD pass. The six rushing TDs match the number of rushing scores he had in his first three seasons.
- San José State won the 2013 home contest vs. Fresno State 62-52. The Spartans are looking to win two straight at home vs. the Bulldogs for the first time since 1984 and 1986.



2015 MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The 2015 Mountain West Football Championship game will kick off at 4:30 p.m. PT/5:30 p.m. MT on Saturday, December 5. ESPN2 will broadcast the title match-up.

HOST SITE DETERMINATION

Host Determination. The Conference Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Committee ranking. The site determination shall be made no later than the Sunday following the final week of regular-season games, utilizing the latest available CFP poll.

If one divisional champion was ranked ahead of the other divisional champion in the CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If, in that same scenario, the divisional champion that was the highest-ranked in the CFP poll loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite of selected computer rankings following the games of November 29 will be used to determine the host.

If no Mountain West teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee poll, a composite of selected computer rankings following the games of November 28 will be used to determine the host.

Host Tie Breaker. In the event of a tie in the latest CFP Selection Committee ranking or the composite of selected computer rankings, the following comparison procedure shall be used (in order as necessary) to determine the site of the game:

- a) If one team was the winner of a Conference game between the two teams, it shall be the Championship Game host.
- b) If a tie still exists, winning percentage against common Conference opponents shall determine the Championship Game host.
- c) If a tie still exists, winning percentage against the next highest-placed common opponent in the Conference based upon (in order): 1. order of finish in the respective divisions, 2. record in all Conference games, and 3. most recent composite of selected computer rankings, proceeding through the Conference, will break the tie.
- d) Coin toss.

Divisional Champions. A divisional champion shall be the team with the highest winning percentage in all Conference games, both inter-divisional and intra-divisional, in the division. (Adopted January 2013)

a) Tie Games. A tie football game shall count as half-a-game won and half-a-game lost in the standings

[Note: A team ineligible under NCAA or Mountain West rules for post-season (bowl) competition shall not compete in the Championship Game.]

DIVISIONAL TIEBREAKERS

Tie Between Two Teams. In the event of a percentage tie for a divisional championship between two teams, if one team was the winner of the Conference game between the two teams, it shall be the divisional champion.

If no game was played between the two tied teams, or that game ended in a tie, the following comparison procedure shall be used to break the tie:

- a) Winning percentage in games played within the division.
- b) Winning percentage against the next highest-placed team in the division (based upon the team's record in all games played in the Conference), proceeding through the division.
- c) Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
- d) Highest CFP ranking (or the composite of selected computer rankings if neither team is ranked in the CFP rankings) following the final week of Conference regular-season games.
- e) Overall winning percentage against FBS opponents.
- f) Coin toss.

Tie Between More Than Two Teams:

In the event of a percentage tie for a divisional championship between more than two teams, the following comparison procedure shall be used to eliminate all but two tied teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure shall be used:

- a) Winning percentage in games played among the tied teams.
- b) Winning percentage in games played against division opponents.
- c) Winning percentage against the next highest-placed team in the division (based upon the team's record in all games played in the Conference), proceeding through the division.
- d) Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
- e) Highest CFP ranking (or the composite of selected computer rankings if neither team is ranked in the CFP rankings) following the final week of Conference regular-season games

MW AND THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

MW BOWL SYNOPSIS

The number of postseason appearances for the Mountain West will be driven by on-the-field performance, starting with the opportunity to play in the national semifinals or another New Year's Day bowl game as part of the COLLEGE FOOTBALL College Football Playoff arrangement. The highest-rated champion from among



the five non-contracted conferences (American, C-USA, MAC, MW, Sun Belt, or chosen by the playoff selection committee) is guaranteed a slot in the system. In the 16 seasons since the league's inception, the Mountain West's champion or a current MW member has secured that position 12 times, placing teams in the Fiesta (3), Rose and Sugar (2) Bowls during that period.

The MW also has agreements with six (6) different bowl games that in any given year will generate as many as six (6) postseason opportunities for its member institutions. These include primary positions in some or all years with the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Gildan New Mexico Bowl, Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl, San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl and Hawai'i Bowl - and a secondary position with the Cactus Bowl.

The Mountain West will collaborate with the bowl partners to place all eligible teams with consideration given to matchup, geography and historical considerations (e.g., last time a team participated in any bowl or a particular bowl). NOTE: The MW is the primary backup for the Ticket City Cactus Bowl if the Big 12 or Pac-12 does not fill.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

In its second season, the College Football Playoff format remains unchanged: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and the national championship game played in a different city every year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

THE SELECTION COMMITTEE

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performances during the regular season, including strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game.

THE ROTATION

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.
