**A LOOK AT THE 2015 MOUNTAIN WEST SCHEDULE**

The 2015 Mountain West football schedule is comprised of 97 games, including 48 Conference matchups. The scheduling format for the 12-member football lineup consists of five intra-divisional games and three cross-divisional contests. Each institution will play four home and four road Conference games. This is the third year of the initial four-year cycle in which each member institution will play every other Mountain West opponent home and away. In 2015, the cross-divisional opponents will flip from the first two years, with teams playing their new opponents from the other division.

The 2015 schedule will play out over 14 weeks, concluding on Sat., Dec. 5 with the Mountain West Football Championship Game to be played at the home stadium of the highest-ranked of the two divisional champions.

The non-conference slate features 22 games against teams that earned bowl berths in 2014, including Arizona, Arizona State, Auburn, BYU (4 games), Minnesota, Mississippi, Michigan State, Navy, Northern Illinois, Ohio State, Penn State, South Alabama, Texas A&M, UCLA, Utah (2 games), Washington (2 games) and Wisconsin. Nine non-conference opponents finished ranked in last year's final USA Today/Coaches' and Associated Press Top 25 polls, including national champion Ohio State, #5 Michigan State, #10 UCLA, #13 Wisconsin, #14/12 Arizona State, #17/19 Arizona, #19/17 Ole Miss, #20/21 Utah and #23/22 Auburn.

**FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH**

The Mountain West is home to five of the 13 youngest head coaches at the FBS level. Boise State's **Bryan Harsin** (38), Nevada's **Brian Polian** (40), Colorado State's **Mike Bobo** (41), UNLV's **Tony Sanchez** (41) and Utah State's **Matt Wells** (41) are among the group of 13 coaches who were born in 1973 or later.

**NO FLY ZONE**

The Boise State starting secondary has recorded more career interceptions than any other starting secondary in the nation. Made up of **Darian Thompson**, **Donte Deayon**, **Jonathan Moxey** and **Dylan Sumner-Gardner**, the Broncos have 39 career picks. Thompson has 18 career interceptions, the most among FBS defenders and tied for most by a MW defender all-time, while Deayon has 17 career interceptions, which is tied for the second-most in Mountain West history and tied for second-most among active NCAA defenders. Moxey has the other four interceptions for Boise State.

UNLV rewrote its program record book and the Mountain West's as they rolled to an 80-8 victory over Idaho State on Sept. 26. This was Rebels' head coach Tony Sanchez first collegiate victory. Below is a look at what the Rebels accomplished this weekend...

TWO NEW HEAD COACHES JOIN MW RANKS IN 2015

For the second consecutive year, the Mountain West welcomes two new head football coaches. Colorado State will be under the direction of **Mike Bobo**, while **Tony Sanchez** takes over at UNLV. Both are first-year head coaches.

Bobo comes to Colorado State from the University of Georgia, where he had spent the previous 14 seasons, including the last eight as offensive coordinator. Bobo's 14-year stint at Georgia, where he was a quarterback in the late 1990s, began in January, 2001, when head coach Mark Richt hired him as quarterbacks coach. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2007. During his time at UGA, Bobo helped lead the Bulldogs to 135 victories, including two Southeastern Conference championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles and eight bowl victories. Prior to his time with the Bulldogs, Bobo began his coaching career at Jacksonville State (1999-2000).

Sanchez spent the last six seasons leading Bishop Gorman (Las Vegas) High School on an overall record of 85-5 and six consecutive state 4A championships. In his six seasons at Bishop Gorman, Sanchez saw 34 of his players earn collegiate football scholarships, including 25 to FBS programs. Prior to his stint in Las Vegas, he coached at Ocate High School in Las Cruces, N.M. and Irvin High School in El Paso, Texas. His lone collegiate coaching experience came in 1996 as he was an undergraduate assistant at New Mexico State, the school where Sanchez was a two-year letterwinner.

FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACHES IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

The Mountain West has welcomed 24 new head coaches over the last 16 seasons. Former BYU head coach Gary Crowton and current Boise State head coach **Bryan Harsin** have posted the most victories and highest win percentage among the group with 12 victories and an .857 win percentage in their inaugural years in 2001 and 2014, respectively. Harsin became the first to conclude his inaugural season by winning the Mountain West Championship Game, the first of two outright MW Championships in program history. Harsin is the only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State. Harsin is one of three first-year coaches to win at least 10 games in their inaugural season, joining Crowton (12 wins, 2001) and Urban Meyer (10 wins, 2003).

MOUNTAIN WEST IN THE POSTSEASON

The Mountain West sent a record seven teams into postseason bowl games in 2014, posting a 3-4 record (.429). Overall, the Mountain West has earned 69 bowl bids since 1999 and holds a 38-31 (.551) all-time record. The league has also posted an overall postseason mark of at least .500 in eight of the last 11 seasons.

The 2014 postseason marked the eighth straight year the MW has sent at least five teams to bowls and 11th time since the league's inception in 1999. It also marked the second straight year that six or more MW squads advanced to the postseason.

Over the last 11 seasons, the Mountain West has captured the Bowl Challenge Cup four times and owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences with a 31-23 mark (.574) during that span. The MW is the only conference to win the trophy four times since the award's inception in 2002-03.

For the second consecutive year, the Mountain West had seven bowl-eligible teams - Boise State (12-2), Colorado State (10-3), Air Force (10-3), Utah State (10-4), Nevada (7-6), San Diego State (7-6) and Fresno State (6-8). This ties the conference record for most bowl-eligible teams. The MW has boasted at least five bowl-eligible teams 11 times since the league's inception in 1999.

**WEEK 1  
OFFENSIVE**

**Nick Stevens, QB, Colorado State**

- In his first career start, completed 20-of-28 passes (71.4 percent) for 289 yards and five touchdown passes (all career highs) in Colorado State's 65-13 victory over Savannah State.
- His five touchdown passes went to five different receivers.
- The five touchdown passes tied for the second-most in CSU history, and the most by a Rams quarterback making his debut start. Played in only two and a half quarters due to the score.

**DEFENSIVE**

**Calvin Munson, LB, San Diego State**

- Recorded a team-high 11 tackles (3 solo), two interceptions (both returned for a touchdown - 19 yards and 67 yards) and 2.5 tackles for loss in San Diego State's 37-3 win over San Diego.
- Became the first player in school history and fourth since the inception of the Mountain West in 1999 to have two interceptions returned for a touchdown in a single game (SDSU has been playing football since 1921).
- The two interceptions returned for a touchdown ties an NCAA single-game record for a linebacker and are tied for the second most among all players.
- The two interceptions were more than every player in the country in Week 1 except for teammate Damontae Kazee and West Virginia's Karl Joseph (both had three).
- The fumble recovery was the first of his career.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

**Andrew Rodriguez, WR/PR, Utah State**

- Returned eight punts for 136 yards in Utah State's season-opening 12-9 win against Southern Utah.
- His 88-yard punt return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter proved to be the game-winning score. Overall, he returned a USU and MW record eight punts for 136 yards against SUU.
- Rodriguez's 88-yard punt return is tied for the second-longest in Mountain West history.
- The 88-yard punt return for also is a Maverik Stadium record and the third-longest in Aggie history trailing Kevin Robinson, who returned a punt 90 yards for a touchdown at Troy in 2004, and Dale Leatham, who also returned a punt 90 yards for a touchdown at Wichita State in 1950. Robinson held the previous Maverik Stadium record with an 87-yard punt return for a touchdown against San José State in 2005.
- The previous MW record was also seven by Scott Harding (Hawai'i) in 2014.

**WEEK 2  
OFFENSIVE**

**D.J. Johnson, RB, Air Force**

- Rushed for 103 yards for his first-career 100-yard game on a career-most 21 carries in Air Force's 36-17 victory over Mountain West foe San José State.
- Tied his career-high with three rushing touchdowns all of which came in the fourth quarter.
- Scored on a 13-yard run to put the Falcons ahead 23-16 with 12:29 left in the game and followed with a one-yard run on fourth-and-goal to give the Falcons a two-score lead.
- Clinched the game with his final touchdown on a career-long 34 yard run with 3:43 left in the game.
- Six carries went for touchdowns or first downs, including five in the fourth quarter.
- Had 12 carries for 82 yards and three touchdowns in the fourth quarter.

**DEFENSIVE**

**Weston Steelhammer, DB, Air Force**

- Recorded six total tackles and led the defensive effort of holding San José State to just 16 points in the Air Force victory over the Spartans.
- Had one quarterback sack and a career-high three tackles for loss for 12 yards.
- Registered an interception in the fourth quarter to seal the game with the Falcons up by two scores.
- His three tackles for loss are the most by an Air Force player this season and gives him 4.5 TFL for the year.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

**Wyatt Bryan, K, Colorado State**

- In Colorado State's 23-20 overtime loss to Minnesota, connected on a 37-yard, game-tying field goal as regulation expired, sending the game into overtime.
- Trailing 13-7, hit a 26-yard field goal late in the third-quarter, part of a 10-point swing that gave the Rams' the lead until the final minute of the game.
- Made two extra-point kicks.

**WEEK 3  
OFFENSIVE**

**Jeremy McNichols, RB, Boise State**

- Scored three rushing touchdowns in Boise State's 52-0 victory over Idaho State.
- Ran for 69 yards on 15 carries.

**DEFENSIVE**

**Jerrold Garcia-Williams, LB, Hawai'i**

- Recorded a career-high 15 total tackles, including 12 solo, in Hawai'i's 47-27 victory over UC Davis.
- His 15 tackles are the most in a game by a UH defender since Corey Paredes vs. New Mexico State on Nov. 22, 2010.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

**Tanner Vallejo, LB, Boise State**

- Played a key role in preserving Boise State's first shutout since 2011.
- Blocked one punt and field goal in Boise State's 52-0 win against Idaho State.
- His blocks came on consecutive drives, as he blocked and then recovered a Bengal punt inside the 30-yard line at the beginning of the second half. On the next Idaho State possession, blocked a 36-yard field-goal attempt to keep the Bengals scoreless.

**WEEK 4  
OFFENSIVE**

**Tyler Ervin, RB, San José State**

- Rushed for a San José State single-game record 300 yards on 42 carries and three touchdowns in the Spartans 49-23 victory against Fresno State.
- Also had four receptions for 45 yards and totaled 345 all-purpose yards in the contest.
- The 300 rushing yards and 345 all-purpose yards are the most by a FBS player this season.
- Outgained the Fresno State team by himself, 345 all-purpose yards to Fresno State's 247 yards of total offense.
- The 300 rushing yards are the most by a senior in a single game in Mountain West history, and are the third-most overall in league history.

**DEFENSIVE**

**Dameon Baber, DB, Nevada**

- In his first collegiate game, recorded 10 tackles (3 solo) and two interceptions as Nevada won on the road at Buffalo 24-21.
- Picked off a pass in the end zone in the third quarter to thwart a Buffalo scoring opportunity and keep the Wolf Pack in the lead 17-13.
- With under two minutes remaining in the game and Nevada leading by just three points (24-21), Buffalo was once again driving into Wolf Pack territory. On 4th-and-15 from Nevada's 47-yard line, Baber tallied the game-clinching interception.
- First Wolf Pack player to record multiple interceptions since Markus Smith against Hawai'i on Sept. 21, 2013.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

**Rashaad Penny, RB/KR, San Diego State**

- Returned two kicks for a career-high 137 yards in San Diego State's 37-21 loss at Penn State.
- Averaging 68.5 yards per return and finished with a career-high 192 all-purpose yards on just three touches.
- His 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the second quarter tied the game a seven.
- The kick return TD was his second this year, matching Colin Lockett (2012) for the most in a single-season in SDSU history.
- Recorded one rush for a career-long 55 yards. It was also the longest run against a Penn State since Nov. 23, 2013.
- Also added two solo tackles on special teams.

**WEEK 5  
OFFENSIVE**

**Kent Myers, QB, Utah State**

- Rushed for a career-best 191 yards on a career-high 16 carries in Utah State's 33-18 Mountain West win over Colorado State.
- Completed 12-of-21 passes for 137 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions.
- Set a new Aggies record for most rushing yards by a quarterback.
- His 191 rushing yards are the most by a Football Bowl Subdivision quarterback this year.
- Recorded four rushes of 25 or more yards (34, 34, 27, 26).

**DEFENSIVE**

**Ryan McAleenan, LB, UNLV**

- Registered six tackles, a shared sack and an interception returned for a touchdown in UNLV's 23-17 victory over rival Nevada.
- Recorded a shared sack with teammate Tory McTyler in the third quarter for the Rebels' only quarterback takedown of the game.
- With UNLV leading 13-10 in the fourth quarter, McAleenan intercepted a pass and returned it 52 yards for a touchdown.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

**Logan Yunker, P, UNLV**

- Recorded eight punts for an average of 42.9 yards in UNLV's 23-17 win at rival Nevada.
- Pinned the Wolf Pack inside the 10-yard line on four different occasions.
- Registered three punts of 50-plus yards, including a long of 59 yards in the fourth quarter.

OFFENSIVE****Donnel Pumphrey, RB, San Diego State**

- Had a career-high 30 rushes for 148 yards (4.9 avg.), including three touchdowns in San Diego State's 28-14 win at Hawai'i. Also had two catches for 49 yards.
- His first two rushing touchdowns of 34 and 8 yards put the Aztecs up 14-0 just 5:50 into the game.
- His final touchdown of the game came on a 4-yard run at the beginning of the fourth quarter and extended SDSU's lead to 28-14.
- Had a career-long 36-yard reception, which came on a 3rd and 6 and led to his final touchdown.

**DEFENSIVE****Brodie Hicks, DB, Air Force**

- Recorded eight total tackles (five solo), one fumble recovery and a career-high two interceptions in Air Force's 31-17 victory over Wyoming.
- With a little more than a minute remaining in the third quarter and Wyoming at the Falcon five-yard line, Hicks recovered a Wyoming fumble to stop the drive and keep Air Force up 14-3.
- His solo and assisted tackle totals were both career highs, while the two interceptions and fumble recovery were the first of his career.
- Became the first Falcon since Weston Steelhammer in 2014 vs. Boise State to record three turnovers in a game, and just the third Air Force player in the last five years to accomplish the feat.

**SPECIAL TEAMS****Austin Lopez, K, San José State**

- Was a perfect 2-for-2 on field goal attempts and 3-for-3 on PATs as San José State halted a seven-game road losing streak with a 33-27 overtime victory at UNLV.
- Came into the game 1-for-3 on the season in field goals and made attempts of 30 and 34 yards. The 30-yard field goal gave San José State its first score of the game after trailing, 10-0. His second field goal with 6:22 left in the third quarter.
- Recorded five touchbacks on six kickoffs.

**WEEK 7  
OFFENSIVE****Cameron Coffman, QB, Wyoming**

- Completed 18-of-20 passes (90.0 percent) for 213 yards and three touchdowns in Wyoming's 28-21 victory over Nevada. Also rushed for 32 yards for 245 yards of total offense.
- His passer rating of 228.96 versus the Wolf Pack is an MW single-game high in 2015.
- Guided the Cowboys on an eight-play, 76-yard drive to start the second half that increased the Wyoming lead to 28-7.
- Led Wyoming on three long scoring drives of 65, 75 and 76 yards, plus adding a fourth scoring drive of 47 yards.

**DEFENSIVE****Kyler Fackrell, LB, Utah State**

- Recorded a season-high 11 stops (four solo), including 2.5 tackles for loss, in Utah State's 52-26 win against then-No. 21 Boise State.
- Recovered two fumbles as part of eight takeaways by Utah State. He also forced a fumble and had two quarterback hurries. The Aggies scored 35 first-half points off of Boise State turnovers.
- Helped anchor a Utah State defense that limited the Broncos to just 34 yards rushing as the Aggies had 10.0 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks.
- His first fumble recovery led to a late first-quarter touchdown that gave the Aggies a 17-3 lead. With less than two minutes remaining in the first half, Fackrell forced a fumble that was recovered by Utah State. The Aggies scored one play later to increase their lead to 38-10.

**SPECIAL TEAMS****Carlos Wiggins, KR, New Mexico**

- Recorded a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in New Mexico's 28-27 victory over Hawai'i.
- He is the first player in MW history with three 100-yard KOR TDs.
- Caught three passes for 29 yards, including a 12-yard pass on 3rd-and-10 on the final game-winning drive.

**WHAT TO WATCH FOR**

- San Diego State and Utah State meet for the first time as Mountain West members. The Aztecs have rattled off eight consecutive wins in the series dating back to 1968. In those eight games, they've outscored the Aggies by 146 points. The last USU victory at San Diego State was in 1967 (31-25).
- Utah State's rush defense ranks sixth nationally, as the Aggies only allow 77.3 yards per game on the ground. Last Friday vs. Boise State, the Broncos only managed 34 rushing yards.
- Utah State has won 13 of its last 15 Conference road games, and under head coach **Matt Wells** the Aggies are 7-2 in Mountain West road contests.
- Aggies starting QB **Kent Myers** has a 8-1 record as a starter, including 3-0 this season. In the last three weeks, Myers is 47-of-70 for 554 yards and has thrown five touchdowns. He is also third on the team with 243 rushing yards.
- Against Boise State, Aggies LBs **Nick Vigil** and **Kyler Fackrell** combined for 25 tackles, including five tackles for loss and two sacks, three fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles.
- Vigil is tied for sixth nationally in total tackles per contest (11.0). On the season, he has racked up 66 tackles.
- In their last two games, the Aggies have scored 108 points. This is the most points scored by Utah State in consecutive contests since 2013. In the second and third week of the season, the Aggies scored 122 points. They tallied 52 at Air Force (Sept. 7) and 70 vs. Weber State (Sept. 14).
- Utah State searches for its first 4-0 start to Mountain West play since joining the Conference in 2013.
- Aggies are 16-3 all-time in Mountain West games.
- The Aggies' 18 forced turnovers this season are tied for fourth-most nationally and are the most in the Mountain West. California leads the country with 21 takeaways.
- Last Saturday vs. San José State, San Diego State RB **Donnel Pumphrey** rushed for 152 yards and one touchdown and added a receiving TD. Pumphrey has now recorded 17 100-yard rushing games, the second-most by a Mountain West player. New Mexico's Dontrell Moore holds the all-time mark of 26.
- Pumphrey is tied for fourth on the MW all-time career rushing TD chart with 36. His 39 total career TDs is tied for fifth in MW history.
- The Aztecs have won 16 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards and are 24-2 in the **Rocky Long** era when reaching 200-plus yards.
- The last time a MW foe racked up more than 400 yards of total offense against the Aztecs defense was Sept. 27, 2014 vs. UNLV (455). This is the longest active streak nationally as San Diego State is tied with LSU.

**WHAT TO WATCH FOR**

- Air Force and Fresno State meet for only the second time as Mountain West foes. In the first meeting, the Bulldogs were victorious 48-15. Three of the last four contests have been decided by six points or fewer.
- The Falcons are 1-1 at home against the Bulldogs, with their lone victory coming in 1994 (42-7).
- Last Friday vs. UNLV, Fresno State snapped a five-game losing streak, which was the Bulldogs longest losing skid since 2006.
- Bulldogs LB **Ejiro Ederaine** has racked up 41 tackles for loss in his career, which ranks fifth in Mountain West history. First place is held by San Diego State's Miles Burris (2008-11), who recorded 47 TFLs.
- Fresno State redshirt freshman QB **Kilton Anderson** recorded his second start last Friday vs. UNLV. Anderson is the fourth different Bulldog QB to start this season. Fresno State is the only FBS program with four different signal callers to record a start this season. Furthermore, going back to the 2014 Hawai'i Bowl, Fresno State has started five different QBs in its last eight games. In those contests, the Bulldogs have a 2-6 record.
- Bulldogs RB **Marteze Waller** has rushed for 2,768 yards and 22 touchdowns. His yardage ranks 12th among active FBS rushers.
- Air Force has scored in a school-record 277 consecutive games, which is the third-longest active streak in the nation and the seventh-longest in NCAA history. The last time the Falcons were held scoreless was in the 1992 Liberty Bowl vs. Ole Miss (13-0).
- The Falcons rank fifth nationally, averaging 312.2 rushing yards per contest. Air Force has rushed for more than 250 yards in five of six games this season.
- Dating back to 2014, the Falcons have won nine straight home games, with their last loss coming at the hands of UNLV (41-21) on Nov. 21, 2013. This is the ninth-longest win streak nationally, and third-best in the MW.
- Air Force hasn't dropped back-to-back MW games since the end of the 2013 season when it dropped three straight against New Mexico, UNLV and Colorado State.

**WHAT TO WATCH FOR**

- Hawai'i has dropped five consecutive games on the road and 22 of last 23 road contests dating back to Nov. 12, 2011. Its last road victory was a 13-0 win at San José State on Nov. 15, 2014.
- Nevada has won four straight against Hawai'i, and three in a row at home. In the 19 total games between the Wolf Pack and Rainbow Warriors, 13 have been double-digit victories.
- Nevada is the only FBS program with two players that have rushed for more than 600 yards. **James Butler** has ran for 622 yards and two touchdowns, while **Don Jackson** has scampered for 613 yards and seven TDs. When it comes to national rushing yardage, Butler ranks 34th and Jackson is 36th.
- Hawai'i has been shut out three times in 2015 (Ohio State, Wisconsin and Boise State). The last time this occurred was in 1966 when the Rainbow Warriors were held scoreless by Air Force, Pacific and Utah State. Additionally, for the first time since 1998, Hawai'i was shut out in consecutive games (Arkansas State and SMU).
- Hawai'i has recorded five or more tackles for loss in six of seven games this season. On the year, the Rainbow Warriors have registered 39 tackles in the opponents backfield.
- Hawai'i DB **Marrell Jackson** is one of three FBS players to recover three fumbles this season. He joins Georgia State's Bobby Baker and Rice's Emmanuel Ellerbe. The three fumble recoveries are the most in the FBS.
- The Wolf Pack have recorded 11 sacks on the season, but haven't brought down the opposing teams QB in the past two games.
- Nevada's defense has recorded 22 pass breakups by 14 different players. The Wolf Pack are tied for fifth among FBS teams with 14 players registering at least one PBU.
- Last Saturday at Wyoming, Wolf Pack QB **Tyler Stewart** completed a career-best 27 passes for 287 yards, also a career-high. He also tossed two touchdowns, marking his fourth career multi-TD passing performance.
- Nevada averages 207.4 rushing yards per contest, while the Hawai'i defense allows its opponent to gain 226 yards on the ground per game. On the season, the Wolf Pack are 3-1 when outgaining its opponent on the ground.

**WHAT TO WATCH FOR**

- San José State has won six of the last seven meetings, including two in a row, with New Mexico. Six of the last seven contests between the Spartans and Lobos have been decided by nine points or less.
- A San José State win over New Mexico would give the Spartans their fourth win of the season, one more than in 2013 when the team finished with a 3-9 overall record. It would also give them their third Mountain West victory, the most since 2013 (5).
- New Mexico has recorded a takeaway in 16 of its last 17 games. This season, the Lobos have 14 takeaways, which is third-best in the Mountain West.
- The Lobos are 3-0 this season when rushing for 300 yards, and 1-3 when rushing for fewer than 300 yards. UNM rushed for 197 yards against Hawai'i last Saturday for its first win when not gaining 300 yards on the ground. It was also the Lobo's first victory under head coach **Bob Davie** when rushing for under 200 yards.
- In Davie's first three seasons, UNM was 0-16 when trailing after the first quarter. The Lobos are 2-0 this season (New Mexico State and Hawai'i).
- Lobos KR **Carlos Wiggins** scored on a 100-yard kickoff return vs. Hawai'i. It was his third 100-yard return, the most in Mountain West and New Mexico history, and overall it was his fifth kickoff return for a touchdown, extending his MW and UNM record.
- Among active FBS players, Wiggins ranks third with a career kick return average of 28.4 yards on 75 returns. His five career touchdowns are tied for second nationally.
- The Spartans lead the nation in fewest passing yards allowed per game (121.0) and rank 17th in passing efficiency defense (98.2 rating). Over the last 19 games, SJSU is allowing just 119 passing yards per contest. It has been ranked in the top 5 nationally in this category every week since Sept. 20, 2014.
- The Spartans could only manage seven points and 148 yards of total offense in last Saturday's loss to San Diego State. The last time a Spartan team was limited to less than 200 yards of total offense was on Nov. 20, 2010 at Hawai'i (164 yards). In 2014, the Spartans were held to seven or fewer points on four occasions.
- Through seven games, San José State has 16 rushing touchdowns, eclipsing the team's total of 11 in 2014 and 12 in 2013. The last time the Spartans scored 20 or more rushing touchdowns in a season was in 2004 when they had 22.
- Spartans RB **Tyler Ervin** ranks eighth nationally with 896 rushing yards. He is just 104 yards shy of becoming SJSU's 11th 1,000-yard rusher.
- On the year, Ervin has scored 13 total touchdowns, including 11 on the ground, which is the second-most by a Spartan since at least 2001. Former WR Chandler Jones caught 15 TDs in 2013. The program single-season touchdown record is held by Johnny Johnson, Jr., who scored 19 times in 1988.

**WATCH TO WATCH FOR**

- Boise State has defeated Wyoming in all four contests in Boise. In those games, the Cowboys haven't scored more than 20 points, averaging only 13 points per contest.
- Boise State returns home for its first game since Oct. 3 when it defeated Hawai'i 55-0. The Broncos have registered back-to-back home shut outs.
- The Broncos haven't allowed an offensive score on The Blue since the 5:31 mark of the fourth quarter in the 2014 Mountain West Championship game, a span of 185 minutes and 29 seconds.
- The last time Boise State suffered back-to-back losses was in the 2013 Hawai'i Bowl (Oregon State) and the 2014 season-opener vs. Ole Miss. The Broncos haven't lost back-to-back games in the same season since 2007, when they dropped the final two contests at Hawai'i (39-27) and vs. East Carolina (41-38).
- Last Friday at Utah State, the Broncos had eight turnovers (five fumbles lost and three interceptions), which are the most by Boise State in a single game since Oct. 28, 1989 at Montana (12). That game the Broncos threw 10 interceptions and lost two fumbles.
- Even though he missed the Broncos last game, RB **Jeremy McNichols** ranks fourth nationally with 12 rushing touchdowns. McNichols has recorded two rushing TDs in each game he has played this season.
- Wyoming snapped a nine-game losing streak, which was the second-longest in FBS, with a home victory over Nevada (28-21) last Saturday. The Cowboys will attempt to snap a four-game road losing streak at Boise State. Their last road victory was at Fresno State (45-17) on Nov. 1, 2014.
- Cowboys RB **Brian Hill** rushed for 188 yards vs. Nevada, his ninth 100-yard performance in the last 12 games. Hill ranks fourth nationally with 985 rushing yards through seven games. His 140.7 yards per game ranks sixth in FBS.
- With 15 rushing yards at Boise State, Hill will become Wyoming's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2008, when Devin Moore scampered for 1,303 yards.
- Wyoming DE **Eddie Yarbrough** has racked up 33.5 career tackles for loss, the second-most all-time by a Cowboys defender. John Fletcher, who played from 2005-09, is atop the list with 36 career TFLs.
- The Cowboys have played 26 freshmen this season, including 16 true freshmen, which ranks tied for third nationally and first in the Mountain West.
- Wyoming QB **Cameron Coffman** leads the Mountain West with 1,504 passing yards and 14 touchdowns. Coffman's six interceptions are tied for second-most in the Conference.



## 2015 MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The 2015 Mountain West Football Championship game will kick off at 4:30 p.m. PT/5:30 p.m. MT on Saturday, December 5. ESPN2 will broadcast the title match-up.

### HOST SITE DETERMINATION

**Host Determination.** The Conference Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Committee ranking. The site determination shall be made no later than the Sunday following the final week of regular-season games, utilizing the latest available CFP poll.

If one divisional champion was ranked ahead of the other divisional champion in the CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If, in that same scenario, the divisional champion that was the highest-ranked in the CFP poll loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite of selected computer rankings following the games of November 29 will be used to determine the host.

If no Mountain West teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee poll, a composite of selected computer rankings following the games of November 28 will be used to determine the host.

**Host Tie Breaker.** In the event of a tie in the latest CFP Selection Committee ranking or the composite of selected computer rankings, the following comparison procedure shall be used (in order as necessary) to determine the site of the game:

- If one team was the winner of a Conference game between the two teams, it shall be the Championship Game host.
- If a tie still exists, winning percentage against common Conference opponents shall determine the Championship Game host.
- If a tie still exists, winning percentage against the next highest-placed common opponent in the Conference based upon (in order): 1. order of finish in the respective divisions, 2. record in all Conference games, and 3. most recent composite of selected computer rankings, proceeding through the Conference, will break the tie.
- Coin toss.

**Divisional Champions.** A divisional champion shall be the team with the highest winning percentage in all Conference games, both inter-divisional and intra-divisional, in the division. (Adopted January 2013)

- Tie Games. A tie football game shall count as half-a-game won and half-a-game lost in the standings

[Note: A team ineligible under NCAA or Mountain West rules for post-season (bowl) competition shall not compete in the Championship Game.]

### DIVISIONAL TIEBREAKERS

**Tie Between Two Teams.** In the event of a percentage tie for a divisional championship between two teams, if one team was the winner of the Conference game between the two teams, it shall be the divisional champion.

If no game was played between the two tied teams, or that game ended in a tie, the following comparison procedure shall be used to break the tie:

- Winning percentage in games played within the division.
- Winning percentage against the next highest-placed team in the division (based upon the team's record in all games played in the Conference), proceeding through the division.
- Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
- Highest CFP ranking (or the composite of selected computer rankings if neither team is ranked in the CFP rankings) following the final week of Conference regular-season games.
- Overall winning percentage against FBS opponents.
- Coin toss.

### Tie Between More Than Two Teams:

In the event of a percentage tie for a divisional championship between more than two teams, the following comparison procedure shall be used to eliminate all but two tied teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure shall be used:

- Winning percentage in games played among the tied teams.
- Winning percentage in games played against division opponents.
- Winning percentage against the next highest-placed team in the division (based upon the team's record in all games played in the Conference), proceeding through the division.
- Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
- Highest CFP ranking (or the composite of selected computer rankings if neither team is ranked in the CFP rankings) following the final week of Conference regular-season games

**MW BOWL SYNOPSIS**

The number of postseason appearances for the Mountain West will be driven by on-the-field performance, starting with the opportunity to play in the national semifinals or another New Year's Day bowl game as part of the College Football Playoff arrangement. The highest-rated champion from among the five non-contracted conferences (American, C-USA, MAC, MW, Sun Belt, or chosen by the playoff selection committee) is guaranteed a slot in the system. In the 16 seasons since the league's inception, the Mountain West's champion or a current MW member has secured that position 12 times, placing teams in the Fiesta (3), Rose and Sugar (2) Bowls during that period.



**COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF**

The MW also has agreements with seven (7) different bowl games that in any given year will generate as many as seven (7) postseason opportunities for its member institutions. These include primary positions in some or all years with the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Gildan New Mexico Bowl, Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl, San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, Hawai'i Bowl and the Arizona Bowl - and a secondary position with the Cactus Bowl.

**NOTE:** The MW is the primary backup for the Ticket City Cactus Bowl if the Big 12 or Pac-12 does not fill.

**ABOUT THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF**

In its second season, the College Football Playoff format remains unchanged: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and the national championship game played in a different city every year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

**THE SELECTION COMMITTEE**

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performances during the regular season, including strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game.

**THE ROTATION**

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.
