SIMPLE GUIDELINES: Prioritize each cadet's educational pursuits and rehabilitative treatment; make sure underclass cadets have ample chance to acclimate with their class schedules and military squadrons; and simple to follow cadets during intramural and intercollegiate athletic practices and games

PRACTICES:

Air Force Football Practices- Frequently opening Air Force Academy football practices allow faculty, followers and our service members a chance to be in the midst of drills led by our coaches and performed by the cadets. In the bigger scope, this access provides the opportunity to observe the training of officer candidates during an Academy mission element. Open practice guidelines include refraining of scouting for an opponent or reporting during practices to include injuries or tactics.

Cell Phone Use- Out of respect for those attending or participating in practices, while on the practice field during workouts please silence cell phones. If you need to take or make a call, please exit the field before doing so. Thank you!

Video/Photography: Video and photography during practices can be done by those who are first cleared through the Air Force athletic communications staff. August 4 - August 26 video and photos can be taken during pre-practice and periods 1-5 each day. Starting August 28, video and photographers cleared through the Air Force athletic communications staff may shoot film during pre-practice and periods 1-5 on Mondays and Tuesdays.

Player and Coaches Availability- Open practices make it very easy to observe team members during athletic activities at the Air Force Academy. Player interviews are prioritized by each cadet's academic, military, squadron and leadership obligations in addition to any needed physical rehabilitation/treatment. Because treatment time may be necessary, players must physically complete the previous practice or game.

Seniors and Juniors: From August 4-9 (prior to the start of the fall semester), seniors and juniors will be accessible on the field after each practice. When the Fall semester begins, August 12-26 up to eight juniors or seniors will be available following Monday, Tuesday and Saturday practices. From August 28 through September 19 eight junior or senior cadets will be accessible on Mondays on the field immediately after practice. Tuesdays eight others will be available before practice from 1:00-1:30 pm. Sophomore and freshmen are available following each game in which they play.

Coaches: All coaches are available immediately on the field after practice from August 7-9 (prior to the start of the fall semester). When school starts coaches are available from August 12-26 following Monday, Tuesday and Saturday practices. Assistant coaches are available Mondays after practice from Aug. 28 to Sept. 18.

Troy Calhoun: Head Coach Troy Calhoun is available after each practice from Aug. 4-9. Once school starts he is available following Monday, Tuesday and Saturday practices. Starting August 28, Coach Calhoun will also be available following Monday practices and before Tuesday practices from 12:30-1:00 in the Air Force Academy media room.

THE LAST MEETING

(Oct. 15, 2016)

New Mexico defeated Air Force, 45-40, in historic Cotton Bowl Stadium in Dallas, Texas. The Lobos scored on seven of their first eight possessions and led throughout the game. The Falcons kept the game close throughout, but were never able to overcome New Mexico despite out-gaining them 531-443. Teriyon Gipson rushed for 140 yards and a touchdown and Tyron Owens added 126 yards and a score to lead the Lobos. Lamar Jordan hit three of six passes for 70 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for 51 yards. Air Force was led by Jacobi Owens, who rushed for 106 yards and a touchdown. Nate Romine hit 12 of 24 passes for 280 yards and two touchdowns. Jalen Robinette matched a career high with seven catches for 182 yards and a score.

THE LAST TIME AT NEW MEXICO

(Nov. 28, 2015)

New Mexico defeated Air Force, 47-35, to close the regular season for both schools. The Lobos raced to a 31-14 halftime lead behind a pair of long touchdown runs by Jhu Pressley. New Mexico extended the lead to 34-14 late in the third quarter before Air Force raced back to make it a one score game, 34-28, behind a pair of touchdowns by Tim McVey. New Mexico answered with a Lamar Jordan touchdown to make it 40-28 late in the fourth quarter. McVey scored his fifth touchdown of the game to make it 40-35 with 3:08 remaining, but the Lobos recovered an onside kick and added a late touchdown to make up the final margin. New Mexico rolled up 512 total yards, including 377 rushing, and held the ball for 34:28 of the game. Pressley finished with 170 yards rushing and three touchdowns to lead the team. Air Force was led by McVey, who became the first player in school history to have 100-plus yards rushing and receiving with 105 yards rushing and two touchdowns and 157 yards and three touchdowns receiving. Claude Alexander had 12 tackles to lead the defense.

AIR FORCE LAST WEEK

#22/25 San Diego State defeated Air Force, 28-24, in Falcon Stadium in the Mountain West opener for both schools. The win is the seventh straight for the Aztecs in the series. Air Force took a 9-0 lead behind a Ronald Cleveland 29 yard touchdown run and a Luke Strebel 45 yard field goal. The game was delayed for one hour and 28 minutes due to weather and when play resumed the Aztecs took the lead, 14-9, behind a pair of touchdown runs from Rashaad Penny. Arion Worthman scored for Air Force following a blocked punt to put Air Force back in front. The teams exchanged touchdowns as the Falcons took a 24-21 lead with 6:16 remaining. Penny sealed it with his third touchdown run with 5:39 left to make up the final margin. San Diego State finished with 367 total yards, including 187 rushing. Penny led the way with 128 yards and three TDs on 20 carries. Air Force finished with 253 total yards, including 220 rushing. Parker Wilson led the way with a career-best 99 yards on 20 carries.

GAME NOTES FROM LAST WEEK

Team Notes

- Air Force uses game captains. The captains for the SDSU game were Santo Coppola, Alex Norton and Grant Ross.
- The official weather delay was 1:28 (one hour and 28 minutes)
- Air Force extended its school-record consecutive games scoring streak to 301 dating back to a 13-0 loss to Mississippi in the 1992 Liberty Bowl. The streak is the third longest active streak in the nation and the fifth longest in NCAA history.
- Air Force's two-point conversion is the first this season and the first since converting against South Alabama in the Nova Home Loans Arizona Bowl last season.

Individual Notes

- Junior Ronald Cleveland has scored a touchdown in four straight games. He scored on a 14-yard run in the bowl game last season, an 11-yard run against VMI, a 64-yard reception against Michigan and a 29-yard run against SDSU
- With his second-quarter field goal, senior Luke Strebel earned his 200th career point. He moved into ninth place on the career scoring list with 201 points, moving past QB Tim Jefferson who had 200 points from 2008-11.
- Junior fullback Parker Wilson set new career highs for rushes (20) and rushing yards (99). His previous highs were eight carries against Michigan and 48 yards vs. VMI.
- Senior linebacker Grant Ross tied his career high with 11 tackles. He also had 11 vs. Navy in 2016.
- Sophomore Mosese Fifita had the first sack and first forced fumble of his career and junior Danny Highland had the first fumble recovery of his career.
- Junior Garrett Kauppila's blocked punt is the first of his career and the first block by the Falcons this season. Air Force has blocked a kick in each of head coach Troy Calhoun's 11 seasons.
- Junior Kyle Floyd had a career high three pass breakups.

A LOOK BACK

Air Force finished the season 10-3 overall, completing just the seventh 10-win season in school history. The Falcons closed the season with a six-game winning streak which tied as the fifth-longest in the nation. Air Force defeated South Alabama, 45-21, in the Nova Home Loans Arizona Bowl to post its second bowl win in three years. Air Force also won the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy for a record 20th time overall and second time in three years with victories over Army and Navy.

Air Force had a .769 winning percentage which ranked 12th nationally and ended up one of just 25 teams in the nation with 10 or more wins. The Falcons finished the season ranked third nationally in rushing with a 317.4 per-game average. The team was fourth nationally in time of possession with a 34:03 mark and seventh in third-down offense at 50.5 percent. Air Force was also effective through the air, leading the nation in yards per completion (25.8) and finishing eighth in passing efficiency (163.58).

Air Force defeated No. 19 Boise State for the third consecutive season and finished fourth in the Mountain West's Mountain Division with a 5-3 mark. The Falcons ended the year with a 5-0 mark in non-conference games. Senior safety Weston Steelhammer closed his career earning third-team All-American honors by the Associated Press and second-team honors by The Sporting News. He was also a finalist for the Lott IMPACT Trophy for community service, leadership and on-field performance. Steelhammer became the first Air Force player ever to earn first-team all-conference honors three times.

ROMINE SETTING MARKS

Romine ranks 15th in Air Force history in career passing yards with 2,178. He has hit 112 of 241 passes for 17 touchdowns and eight interceptions. His 17 touchdowns is just one away from breaking into the top 10 in school history. Romine has a 139.03 career efficiency mark with is sixth-best in AF history.

Quarterback Nate Romine became the 15th player in school history to surpass the 2,000-yard passing mark in his career last season vs. New Mexico. Romine hit 12 of 24 passes for a career-best 280 yards and two touchdowns. His 280 yards are the most by a Falcon since Dee Dowis threw for 311 vs. Notre Dame in 1989.

TOUCHDOWN TIM HAS 28 TOUCHDOWNS IN 30 CAREER GAMES

Senior running back Tim McVey leads the team and ranks fifth in the conference in rushing with a 68.0 average. He has led the Falcons in rushing in two of three games this season. McVey is sixth in the Mountain West in all-purpose yards with a 119.7 average.

McVey opened the season with a team-high 98 yards rushing and a touchdown on 10 carries to lead the Falcons past VMI, 62-0. McVey also led the Falcons with three catches for 77 yards. He rushed for a team-best 62 yards at #7 Michigan while returning three kickoffs for 45 yards. McVey rushed for 44 yards and a touchdown vs. #22 San Diego State.

McVey has made a career of big plays. He is averaging 24.6 yards per kickoff return which ranks 10th in Air Force history. He is also second in career receiving average with a 27.5 mark. McVey is the Air Force career leader in rushing average with an 8.3 mark. McVey rushed for 89 yards at San Jose State last season to become the 46th player in school history to top the 1,000-yard mark for his career. McVey ranks 34th in Air Force history with 1,353 yards. He has scored 28 touchdowns in 30 games during his career.

ROSS ONLY RETURNING STARTER ON DEFENSE

Senior linebacker Grant Ross is the lone returning starter on the defense. He is the top returning tackler from last season. Ross was third on the team in 2016 with 67 total tackles, including 28 unassisted. He is also the top returner in tackles for loss with 5.5 for 30 yards which ranked third on the team.

Ross is third on the team in tackles with 19 and leads the team with 3.5 tackles for loss this season. He had three tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss in the opener vs. VMI. Ross added five tackles and a tackle for loss at #7 Michigan. He added a season-high 11 tackles to lead the Falcons vs. #22 San Diego State. He is the active career leader at Air Force in tackles with 149, tackles for loss with 14.0 and sacks with 4.0.

STREBEL ONE OF 30 ON LOU GROZA AWARD WATCH LIST

Air Force senior Luke Strelbel is one of 30 players named to the Watch List for the 2017 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, announced by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission. Strelbel handled all the Air Force kicking duties last season, kickoffs, field goals and PATs. He led the conference and ranked among the national leaders in three categories. He tied for the national lead in PAT percentage (1.000), led the conference in kicker scoring (9.0) and was third overall in scoring. Strelbel led the conference and ranked ninth nationally in field goals (1.69). Strelbel was perfect in 51 extra point attempts and hit 22 of 25 field goals. His 22 field goals tied for second all-time at Air Force in a single season. He set a new Mountain West record for consecutive field goals with 22 dating back to last season before missing vs. Hawaii, breaking the mark of 19 set by Chris Manfredini of TCU from 2005-06. Strelbel's 22 straight was the longest streak in the nation.

While the Watch List highlights 30 of the best returning kickers in the country, the Groza Committee will be watching all FBS kickers during the season, and releasing a weekly "Stars of the Week" feature on www.lougrozaaward.com. All FBS kickers remain eligible to be selected as semifinalists.

Accomplishments are tabulated throughout the season and the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award will announce its 20 semifinalists on Thursday, November 2nd. From this list, a panel of more than 100 FBS head coaches, SIDs, media members, former Groza finalists, and current NFL kickers selects the top three finalists for the award by Tuesday, November 21st. That same group then selects the national winner, who will be announced on Thursday, December 7th during the Home Depot College Football Awards Show.

The 26th Annual Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, presented by the Orange Bowl Committee, recognizes the three finalists during a celebration in Palm Beach County, culminating with a gala awards banquet on December 4th.

The Award is named for National Football League Hall of Fame kicker Lou "The Toe" Groza, who played 21 seasons with the Cleveland Browns. Groza won four NFL championships with Cleveland and was named NFL Player of the Year in 1954. Although an All-Pro offensive lineman as well, Groza ushered in the notion that there should be a place on an NFL roster for a kicker.

Strebels led the conference and ranked among the national leaders in three categories last season. He tied for the national lead in PAT percentage (1.000), led the conference in kicker scoring (9.0) and was third overall in scoring. Strebels led the conference and ranked ninth nationally in field goals (1.69). He was perfect in 51 extra point attempts and hit 22 of 25 field goals last season. His 22 field goals tied for second all-time at Air Force in a single season. He set a new Mountain West record for consecutive field goals with 22 dating back to last season before missing vs. Hawaii, breaking the mark of 19 set by Chris Manfredini of TCU from 2005-06. FLOR LEADS FALCONS AGAIN

Senior linebacker Jack Flor leads the Falcons in tackles with 26 this season. He also has a tackle for loss, a sack and a forced fumble. Flor ranks ninth in the Mountain West overall and seventh among linebackers in tackles with an 8.7 average.

Flor has led the team in tackles in two of three games this season. He had a team-high eight tackles in the season opener vs. VMI and recorded a career-best 11 tackles, a sack and a forced a fumble against #7 Michigan to lead the Falcons. Flor added seven tackles vs. #22 San Diego State.

GRIFFIN HAS CAREER DAY AT MICHIGAN; CONTINUES FINE PLAY

Senior Marquis Griffin recorded a career-best 11 tackles at #7 Michigan, along with a tackle for loss and a pass breakup. Nine of his 11 stops were solo which is the most by a Falcon this season. His 11 total tackles ties as the most by a Falcon this season. Griffin added seven tackles and a pass breakup against #22 San Diego State last week.

Griffin is second on the team in tackles overall with 23. He is tied for third in tackles for loss with 1.5 while leading the team in pass breakups with three.

WORTHMAN PICKS UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

Junior quarterback Arion Worthman is third on the team in rushing with 160 yards and two touchdowns on a team-best 63 carries. He has hit 10 of 24 passes for 238 yards and three touchdowns and one interception.

Worthman opened the season with a solid performance against VMI, rushing for 33 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries while hitting eight of 12 passes for 172 yards and two touchdowns. 62 yards and a touchdown vs. #22 San Diego State.

Worthman has a 6-2 record in his career as a starter while averaging 90.8 yards rushing (173-727-6) and 95.8 yards passing (32-62-3-767-6) per game.

Worthman burst on the scene last season against Fresno State coming on in relief of an injured Nate Romine and rushed for 102 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Falcons to a come-from-behind win. He started the first game of his career at Army Nov. 5 and responded with an outstanding performance. Worthman rushed for 63 yards and a touchdown on 19 carries and recorded then career highs in every passing category. He hit six of nine passes for 195 yards and a career-long 46 yard pass that went for a touchdown. Worthman averaged 32.5 yards per completion. He was named National Football Foundation player of the week for his performance.

He led the Falcons to a thrilling win over Colorado State Nov. 12 in his second-career start, rushing for a then-career-high 143 yards and scoring on a career-long 54 yard run. He hit 3-8 passes for 49 yards. Worthman set new career highs in every rushing category while leading the Falcons past San Jose State, 41-38, Nov. 19. He had 28 carries for 215 yards and two touchdowns. His 215 yards are the 11th most in school history and fifth most by a quarterback. He is the first quarterback to rush for 200 or more yards since All-American Beau Morgan rushed for 217 vs. Fresno State in 1996.

Worthman played perhaps the best game of his career in the bowl game vs. South Alabama. He rushed for 71 yards on 21 carries and recorded career highs in every passing category. Worthman hit 7-10 passes for 207 yards and a career-long 75-yard TD. He was named the bowl's most valuable offensive player.

CLEVELAND HAS SCORED IN FOUR STRAIGHT GAMES

Junior Ronald Cleveland has scored in each game this season and has a touchdown in four straight games dating back to last season. Cleveland has rushed for 78 yards and two touchdowns on six carries and has one catch, good for a career-long 64 yard touchdown at Michigan. He started the streak with a 14 yard TD run against South Alabama in the 2016 Arizona Bowl. He added an 11 yard TD run vs. VMI, the receiving TD at Michigan and a 29 yard TD run last week against San Diego State.

SCOTT THIRD IN MW IN PUNTING

Sophomore punter Charlie Scott ranks third in the Mountain West in punting with a 42.9 average. Scott has punted 14 times for 601 yards with long of 59, three fair catches, four downed inside the 20 and six punts of 50 yards or more. He has at least one punt of 50 yards or better in each game this season.

Scott had his best day of the season last week against San Diego State. He punted six times for a career-best 47.8 average with a career long of 59 yards and three fair catches. Scott had a solid debut to his career vs. VMI. He punted twice for a 41.5 average with a long of 53 yards. Scott punted six times at Michigan for a 38.5 average with two punts of 50-plus yards. Scott is a native of Greenwood Village, Colo., and attended Cherry Creek High School. Scott's older brother, JK, is a senior and the starting punter at Alabama.

SHAQ HAS BIG DAY AT MICHIGAN

Senior Shaquille Vereen had a big day at Michigan. Vereen had a season-high five tackles and recorded the first two tackles for loss of his career. His 2.0 tackles for loss are the most in a game by a Falcon this season.

WILSON HAS CAREER DAY VS. SAN DIEGO STATE

Junior Parker Wilson rushed for a career-high 99 yards on a career-most 20 carries last week to lead the team against San Diego State. The game is the first this season Wilson has led the team in rushing. He entered the game with 11 carries for 79 yards on the season.

Wilson is second on the team in rushing with 178 yards on 31 carries. He is averaging 5.7 yards per carry and has not been thrown for a loss.

Airpower Legacy Series

The Air Force football team will continue its Airpower Legacy Series this season with a helmet and uniform honoring the F-35 Lightning II, one of the Air Force's fifth-generation fighter. The football helmet was modeled after the helmet that F-35 pilots wear in flight. The helmet was unveiled to the football team for the first time today, while the uniform will be released at a later date. The first game that the Airpower Legacy Series will be worn will be released at a later date as well.

The Airpower Legacy Series began last season with the football team wearing an alternate uniform for the Georgia State game to celebrate the Tiger Shark teeth nose-art which has been represented on multiple Air Force aircraft dating back to World War II. During the WWII era, fighter plane pilots were called "Flying Tigers" and were part of the U.S. Army Air Corps, which later became the Air Force. The helmets worn for the game featured a shark-teeth design like those painted on the aircraft.

While last season's focus was on the past, the Falcons will honor the present, and future, of air power with the F-35 theme this season. The F-35 completed its first flight was in 2006. In 2012, the F-35 program increased to 30 aircraft. In 2016, the F-35A was declared combat ready by Gen. Hawk Carlisle, the commander of the Air Combat Command.

The helmet will have five different designs. On one side of every helmet will be the familiar Air Force logo often seen on aircraft, which includes the length-wise bars intersecting the roundel. On the other side will be a decal representing one of the five Air Force F-35-A operational fighter squadrons in the Air Force.

AIR FORCE HEAD COACH TROY CALHOUN

Troy Calhoun is in his 11th season as head coach at Air Force where he has a 78-55 overall record and a 45-35 mark in Mountain West play. He has led Air Force to nine bowl games, including a school-record six straight from 2007-12. Calhoun led the program to a 10-3 mark in 2016, just the seventh 10-win season in school history. Air Force won the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy for a record 20th time and won a bowl game for the second time in three seasons. He led the Falcons to an 8-6 overall record in 2015 and the Mountain Division championship and first-ever MW title game appearance. The Falcons were 6-2 in conference play.

Calhoun is the only coach in the 100-plus year history of service academy football to lead teams to at least seven wins and a bowl game in each of his first five seasons. Calhoun has twice been semifinalist for the National Coach of the Year award for his efforts on and off the field (2007, 2010).

Calhoun came to his alma mater in 2007 and took over a program that had three straight losing seasons. Air Force finished the 2007 season 9-4 overall and placed second in the Mountain West Conference with a 6-2 mark in Calhoun's first year. The Falcons earned their first bowl bid in five seasons, advancing to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl in Fort Worth, Texas. The five-game turnaround from the previous season was the largest in the nation by a first-year head coach and tied as the third-largest overall in the nation.

Calhoun was named the conference's coach of the year for his efforts. In addition, he was named coach of the year in Region 5 by the American Football Coaches Association and was one of eight finalists for national coach of the year honors. Calhoun followed with back-to-back 8-5 overall records and fourth place conference finishes with 5-3 marks in 2008 and 2009. The team earned bids to the Armed Forces Bowl each season and posted the school's first bowl victory since 2000 with a 47-20 win over Houston in 2009.

In 2010 the Falcons posted a 9-4 overall record and recorded their fourth straight top four conference finish with a 5-3 mark. The Falcons were nationally ranked for the first time since 2003 and posted a victory as a ranked team for the first time since 2002. The team capped the season with a 14-7 win over George Tech in 2010 Independence Bowl to earn a second-straight bowl victory.

Air Force posted a 7-6 record in 2011 and qualified for the Military Bowl. The Falcons were 6-7 in 2012 while finishing fourth in the conference with a 5-3 mark. Air Force played in its fourth Armed Forces Bowl to extend the school's record of consecutive bowl games to six dating back to 2007.

Calhoun led the Falcons to new heights in 2014, posting a 10-3 overall record and a fourth place finish in the Mountain Division with a 5-3 mark. The eight-game turnaround from a 2-10 mark in 2013 is a school record and tied as the best in the nation. The Falcons capped the season with a record 19th Commander-in-Chief's Trophy and a victory over Western Michigan in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Calhoun brought a wealth of experience and impressive resume at the collegiate and professional levels that is flooded with success at every stop to the Academy. Calhoun came to the Academy after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Houston Texans in 2006. The Texans were one of only two NFL teams to triple their number of wins from the previous year.

Calhoun became a well-rounded NFL coach, working as a defensive assistant, special teams assistant and offensive assistant with the Denver Broncos from 2003-05. He began his NFL coaching career by serving as the defensive assistant under defensive coordinator Larry Coyer in 2003. Prior to the NFL, Calhoun was an offensive coordinator for six seasons on the collegiate level. He began his coaching career at Air Force, where he worked as a graduate assistant from 1989-90. He started at quarterback for the Academy in 1986 and was one of only two freshmen to letter for the 1985 team that finished fifth in the final polls with a 12-1 record that included wins over national powers Notre Dame and Texas.

Calhoun served his country from 1989-95 as an active duty officer in the Air Force. He was the Falcons' recruiting coordinator and the junior varsity offensive coordinator in 1993-94. He moved to Ohio University in 1995 where he served as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons. Calhoun was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1997. Calhoun moved to Wake Forest in 2001 and remained there prior to his stint with the Broncos.

Groomed on the basics of integrity and passion, Calhoun is a native of Roseburg, Ore., and was raised in a home where both kids graduated from the Air Force Academy and were varsity letter winners on nationally-ranked teams. He and his wife, Amanda, live in Colorado Springs and have two children, Tyler (15) and Amelia (13).
