

NEW MEXICO 73, BOISE STATE 72

Matchup Notes:

- Starting lineup: Anthony Mathis, Dane Kuiper, Makuach Maluach, Vance Jackson, Carlton Bragg
- The Lobos now lead the all-time series 11-5 with a 6-2 advantage in The Pit against the Broncos
 - Wednesday's contest marked the second game in the series to be determined by a single point. The previous game was at Boise on Feb. 12, 2014 where Boise State edged the Lobos by a score of 71-70.
 - The last time the teams played in Albuquerque, it was also a one-possession game, with Boise State winning 73-71.

Post-game Notes:

- Four Lobos finished in double figures: junior Corey Manigault (19), redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson (12), redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg (11), sophomore Keith McGee (11).
- The Lobos went on an 8-0 run from 14:12-12:09 in the first half that stretched an 8-10 deficit to 16-10 lead.
 - During the run, McGee and Kuiper both hit threes and Manigault finished at the rim.
- Senior Anthony Mathis finished with six points after shooting 2-of-4 from behind the arc. Mathis has connected from deep in 22 consecutive games this season, tied for fourth in program history.
 - Mathis has now made 100 threes this season, topping his previous season high for threes made at UNM with 98 last season.
 - He is now just three, 3-pointers shy of breaking the UNM program record for most threes made in a single season. The current record holder is Kevin Henry with 102 during the 1998-99 season.
- The UNM defense shattered its season average for blocks per game (3.6), racking up six blocks.
 - Bragg registered three blocks, tying his previous season high set against Wyoming on Jan. 19.
- Wednesday's game marked the Lobos' smallest margin of victory on the season and brought an end to a three-game losing streak in games decided by one to four points.
 - The last time the Lobos won a one-possession game was the season opener on Nov. 6, 2018 vs CSUN.
- UNM outrebounded Boise State 35-29 and is now 9-3 when outrebounding its opponents including 5-3 in conference play.
 - The Lobos have collected 30 or more rebounds in all but five games this season.
- The Lobos finished with 17 assists. The Lobos have recorded double-digit assists in eight consecutive games, marking the longest streak this season.
