Headlines

→ Fresno State celebrates homecoming when New Mexico comes to town for the first time since 2013.

→ The Bulldogs own five-straight wins in their series with the Lobos, the longest win streak they own against any Mountain West team.

→ Fresno State is 2-0 in Mountain West play for the first time since 2014. Its last 3-0 start was in 2013.

→ Juju Hughes was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Monday after filling up the stat sheet vs. San Jose State with six tackles (4 solo), 2.0 TFLs, 1.0 sacks, one forced fumble, one interception and one QB hurry.

→ Key Stat: Fresno State enters its game against New Mexico with a rushing defense that ranks 19th in the FBS, allowing just 107.2 yards per game, while the Lobos, known for its ground attack, enters the game averaging 266.8 yards per contest with its option offense.

→ In the Lobos last trip to Bulldog Stadium, Fresno State set a school and Mountain West record with 822 yards of total offense in its 2013 victory over the Lobos.

→ Junior quarterback Marcus McMaryion is the first quarterback since Jim Arellanes in 1995 to win his first two starts under center as a Bulldog.

→ The Bulldogs rank No. 12 in the FBS and No. 2 in the MW with just five turnovers lost.

→ The 'Dogs rank No. 30 in the FBS in turnovers gained; their 11 turnovers in five games have already surpassed their season total of nine in 2016.

→ Last Saturday at San Jose State, Fresno State did not allow a chunk play (an explosive play for more than 20 yards) for the first time since September 29, 2007 vs. Louisiana Tech.

→ Thirty-four Bulldogs have seen their first game action while at Fresno State this season.

Scouting the New Mexico Lobos

New Mexico is coming off its lone bye week of the season. They are off to a 3-2 start and a 1-1 mark in Mountain West play. In road games, UNM is 1-1.

UNM ranks fifth in the Mountain West in total offense, averaging 428.6 yards per game, 266.8 yards coming on the ground (12th in nation/2nd in MW) and 161.8 through the air. Redshirt senior quarterback Lamar Jordan leads the team with 474 yards passing and three touchdowns while adding 132 yards on the ground. Coltin Gerhart and Tevaka Tuioti have also seen action under center combining to throw for 335 yards and three touchdowns.

UNM is known for their ground game, owning 228 rushing attempts this season vs. 95 passing attempts. Five different players have more than 20 rushing attempts and that attack is led by senior tailback Richard McQuarley. He has rushed for a team-high 301 yards (12th in MW) and ranks third in the conference with five rushing touchdowns (all five in the Lobos' last game vs. Air Force - tying a single-game program record). As a team, the Lobos have scored 12 touchdowns on the ground vs. six times through the air. The offense is averaging 30.4 points per game.

On defense, the Lobos rank fourth in the Mountain West in total defense surrendering 345.6 yards per game and allows 24.6 points per game. UNM ranks third in the MW in rushing yards allowed, only giving up 125.4 yards per game (and five TDs), but New Mexico has been susceptible to their opponents' passing games allowing 220.2 yards per game (eighth in the MW) and 11 touchdowns through the air.

Redshirt senior safety Jacob Girgle leads the team with 36 tackles (17 solo) and has added one tackle for a loss. The Lobos' defense has created eight turnovers on the season with four interceptions and four fumble recoveries. Girgle leads the defense with two interceptions.

Senior punter Corey Bojorquez leads the MW and ranks third nationally with a 47.2 yards per punt average. Bojorquez has totaled 21 punts on the season with nine going over 50 yards and has a season-best of 77 yards against New Mexico State.

Fresno State vs. New Mexico – The Series

Fresno State and New Mexico will face each other for the first time since 2014 on Saturday. The Bulldogs lead the all-time series 11-4, has a 7-1 edge in intra-conference games and is 6-1 all-time when playing the Lobos at Bulldog Stadium. The Bulldogs are 3-0 vs. New Mexico in Mountain West games, winning on the road in 2012 (49-32), at home in 2013 (69-28) and again on the road in 2014 (35-24). In the Lobos last trip to Bulldog Stadium, Fresno State set a school and Mountain West record with 822 yards of total offense in its 2013 victory over the Lobos. The Bulldogs had a knack for comebacks in its two MW victories on the road, the Bulldogs found themselves down in a second-quarter 21-0 hole in 2012 before going on to win 49-32. That was biggest come-from-behind victory since Dec. 18, 1982 in the California Raisin Bowl II victory over Bowling Green when the 'Dogs also came back from a 21-point deficit. In 2014, Fresno State came back from 10-down in the first half to spoil the Lobos' homecoming game with a strong second half, where it held UNM to only 93 yards in the final 30 minutes after giving up 289 in the first half.

- The series started with a home-and-home series in 1947-48, which the teams split.
- Fresno State set a school record for points in a game vs. New Mexico, winning 94-17 on October 5, 1991.
- The Bulldogs also tied an NCAA-record on October 5, 1991 for points scored in a quarter with 49 in the second quarter - a record that still stands.
- Fresno State has won five-straight games vs. UNM (1995, 1998, 2012-14). The longest win streak the Bulldogs own against a team from the Mountain West.
- In Fresno State's 11 all-time wins against UNM, they averaged 46.4 points per game in those wins.

Jeff Tedford vs. the Lobos

As the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981 and 1982, Fresno State did not face New Mexico. However, while Jeff Tedford was coaching for the Bulldogs, the Lobos were on the opposing sideline five times - once as a volunteer coach (1988) and four times while a full-time assistant (1992-95).

The streak is over, the Bulldogs have a Mountain West Player of the Week

It had been since November 10, 2014 since Fresno State had a student-athlete named a Mountain West Player of the Week - LB Kyrie Wilson. On Monday, sophomore defensive back Juju Hughes broke that streak as he was named the league's defensive player of the week after filling up the stat sheet vs. San Jose State.

Stat Line: 6 tackles (4 solo), 2.0 TFLs, 1.0 sacks, 1 forced fumble, 1 interception, 1 QB hurry

- Hughes grabbed his first career interception in the first quarter, the Bulldogs' second team interception vs. San Jose State, to set the 'Dogs up with a first-and-10 at their own 47. It led to seven points off the forced turnover.
- In the fourth quarter, Hughes forced a sack/fumble, both firsts in his career (recovered by Emeka Ndoh). It was recovered on the SJSU 21-yard line. It turned into three points off of the turnover.
- He also set a single-game TFL career-high with 2.0 in the win.

Mountain West Player of the Week History

- Fresno State has had a Mountain West Player of the Week 23 times (Hughes the 23rd) since joining the league in 2012.
- The Bulldogs had a MW Player of the Week 21 times over their first two seasons, and two since. Derek Carr accounts for six of those selections in 2012-13.
- The last time Fresno State had an offensive player of the week selection by the league was on Nov. 25, 2013 after Derek Carr threw for 527 yards and seven touchdowns against New Mexico - the last time the Lobos visited Bulldog Stadium.

The key stat to Saturday

Fresno State enters its game against New Mexico with a rushing defense that ranks 19th in the FBS, allowing just 107.2 yards per game, while the Lobos, known for its ground attack, enters the game averaging 266.8 yards per game with its option run game. New Mexico's run game ranks 12th the nation while its passing game ranks 115th, producing just 161.8 yards per game through the air.

→ Fresno State has not allowed an opposing running back to surpass 100 yards this season.

The Quarterback

After sophomore quarterback Chason Virgil led the Bulldogs under center for the first three games of the season, junior Marcus McMaryion made his second consecutive start of the season at San Jose State on Oct. 7 after his first was at home against Nevada on Sept. 30.

→ McMaryion played the entire game in each of the last two contests after only seeing a combined 70 snaps in the Bulldogs' first three games.

→ QB Returners...

• Of the five quarterbacks on the Fresno State roster, Virgil is the only Bulldog in the group that was a member of the team a season ago. He has started 14 games in his career.

→ QB Newcomers...

• Marcus McMaryion joined the group late in fall camp, August 12, after transferring from Oregon State where he completed his undergraduate degree. The Dinuba, Calif. native played in 13 games as a Beaver, starting seven, while totaling 1,689 yards and 11 touchdowns. Last year, McMaryion started the last six games of the season which included back-to-back wins to end the year against Arizona and Oregon. He threw for 1,286 yards and 10 touchdowns in eight games on the year.

• Jorge Reyna, head coach Jeff Tedford's first commitment after taking the job, was the Metro League Offensive Player of the Year in 2016 after passing for 3,646 yards and 39 touchdowns at West Los Angeles College. He led all California junior colleges in completions, completion percentage and passing yards per game prior to joining the Bulldogs in the spring.

• The 'Dogs also added freshmen Kyle Lindquist and Brent Bailey to the depth chart.

McMaryion first two starts

Junior quarterback Marcus McMaryion is the first quarterback since Jim Arellanes in 1995 to win his first two starts under center as a Bulldog.

Arellanes started the Bulldogs' second game of the 1995 season at Cal, narrowly defeating the Golden Bears 25-24 in Berkeley, before not starting again until the 10th game of the season at home against UTEP, coming away with a 47-14 win over the Miners.

Tale of two halves

It's undoubtedly been a great start to the Marcus McMaryion era, earning wins with his first two career starts over the last two games. In each of those games, Fresno State raced out to big first half leads (31-14 vs. Nevada, and 21-0 vs. San Jose State). In those games, McMaryion is 31-of-39 for 405 yards passing and three touchdowns and zero interceptions in the first half. In the second half, McMaryion is 9-of-20 for 43 yards and one interception.

Experience paying off for offensive line

With 65 career starts along the offensive line entering the season, Fresno State has allowed just four sacks through five games in 2017. The 0.8 sacks allowed per game ranks No. 10 in the FBS and No. 2 in the MW. Ranking 96th with 2.58 allowed in 2016, this year's group which features only one first-time starter has held up against two teams which ranked in the top 20 in 2016 in sacks.

→ The 'Dogs have allowed more than one sack in a game just once this season (Alabama).

Rivers in the Valley

With his father Ron Rivers starring for the Bulldogs in the early 90's, Ronnie Rivers is making his own name in Valley this season.

In the season opener versus Incarnate Word, the Brentwood, California native became the first true freshman at Fresno State to start at running back in a season opener since 1980

Rivers has led the Bulldogs in rushing in all five of the team's games this season.

When Rivers made his return to the Bay Area on Oct. 7, the back rushed for a season-high 105 yards and two touchdowns.

Taking care of the ball

After committing three turnovers against Nevada, Fresno State did not turn the ball at San Jose State, the Bulldogs' second game this season without a turnover.

The Bulldogs rank No. 12 in the FBS and No. 2 in the MW with five turnovers lost.

An offense on the rise

The Bulldogs' offense is scoring 32.0 points per game through five games, ranking 53rd in the FBS and third in the Mountain West.

Fresno State's 32.0 points per game is its best average since its 2013 team that averaged 43.4 points per game.

First time participation/true freshmen starters

Thirty-four Bulldogs have seen their first game action while at Fresno State this season.

13 players have seen their first career starts in a Bulldog uniform this season.

17 freshmen have seen action for the first time, including seven true freshmen.

Locking down when it matters

When the Bulldogs have needed to get stops this season, they have been one of the stoutest in the Mountain West, ranking first in the league with an opposing third-down conversion rate of 30.0 percent (20-of-63), a stat which ranks No. 28 in the FBS. Incarnate Word went 3-of-16 on third down in the Bulldogs' opener, Fresno State stopped No. 1 Alabama six times (4-of-10) on third down and four times (3-of-7) at No. 6 Washington. The trend has continued since conference play has begun, holding Nevada to 5-of-17 and San Jose State to 5-of-13 on third down.

→ When opponents have faced fourth downs, the 'Dogs' defense has been particularly stingy, holding opponents to a 14.3 percent (1-of-7) conversion rate which ranks No. 7 in the FBS.

No fly zone

With a revamped secondary which includes three first-time starters, defensive backs coach J.D. Williams' group has produced six interceptions on the year through five games. With just one through the first three games, the secondary has come up with five INTs over the last two games. The 'Dogs have already surpassed the team's 2016 INT total, who had five, with six, and are three short from matching the 2014 and 2015 teams that produced nine, respectively.

→ With all six interceptions coming from defensive backs this season, that number has surpassed the interception totals for Fresno State DBs during each of the last three seasons. The duo of Tyquwan Glass and Shannon Edwards recorded five combined picks in 2015.

Don't throw his way

A season ago, defensive back Jaron Bryant was seeing playing time primarily on special teams as a true freshman. This August, the Bulldog sophomore seized one of two starting cornerback spots during fall camp. During the last two games, Bryant has showed why he earned the starting nod, producing three interceptions while returning one for a touchdown.

→ Bryant ranks No. 9 in the FBS in interceptions per game (0.8) and is second in the MW. → Against Nevada, he became the first Bulldog since L.J. Jones on Sept. 28, 2013 to grab two interceptions in a game. With an 18-yard return for a touchdown on his first-career pick, Bryant recorded the Bulldogs' first interception return for a touchdown since Shannon Edwards on Sept. 12, 2015.

→ Bryant is the first Bulldog since Phillip Thomas in 2012 to record three INTs in a two-game span.

Being opportunistic

Under first-year defensive coordinator Orlando Steinauer, a coach who had a reputation in the Canadian Football League for producing turnover-hungry defenses, Fresno State has already forced 11 turnovers through five games, nine of which have come during the last three games. The 'Dogs rank No. 30 in the FBS in turnovers gained, an increase of 96 spots from where they finished in 2016.

→ With nine turnovers forced over the last three games, it is the first time Fresno State has forced at least nine in that span since a three-game stretch on Nov. 8-29, 2014.

→ The Bulldogs 11 forced turnovers has already surpassed the team's 2016 total of nine.

→ Fresno State is currently on pace to surpass its turnovers gained total from each of the past four seasons (9 in 2016; 20 in 2015; 20 in 2014, 23 in 2013).

Creating havoc in the opposing backfield

At No. 6 Washington, Fresno State totaled 10 tackles for a loss, its most in a game since Nov. 29, 2014 versus Hawai'i when the team produced 11. Three weeks later, the Bulldogs totaled nine at San Jose State. Through five games, the Bulldogs have totaled 37 TFLs, 19 shy of their 12-game total in 2016. The 'Dogs 7.4 TFLs per game rank No. 23 in the FBS and No. 3 in the MW in 2017.

→ Four of Fresno State's five forced fumbles have come in their opponents' backfield.

→ 19 Bulldogs have recorded at least a half tackle for a loss this season.





Making opposing offenses say OH-no

Despite not being a starter, junior college transfer Emeka Ndoh's athleticism has been a problem for opposing offenses when he's been on the field, whether it's tracking down a quarterback, a running back in the backfield or covering a wide receiver in space. The 6-foot, 252-lb. defensive end currently leads the Bulldogs with four tackles for a loss, three sacks, two fumble recoveries and a safety.

→ Ndoh's two recovered fumbles ranks No. 5 in the FBS.

Camacho making the most of an opportunity

A season ago while Jimmy Camacho watched from the sideline, junior Kody Kroening went 15-of-17 on field goal attempts for the 'Dogs and was named a Lou Groza Award semifinalist and entered his senior season on the Groza Award watch list. Camacho, also a senior, came out on top of fall camp as the team's field goal kicker and went 2-of-2 in the season opener (8-of-8 PATs), including a then-career-long 47 yarder. On the year, Camacho is 10-of-13 on field goals, including a career-long 50 yarder at San Jose State, and is 18-of-18 on PATs.

→ With 2.0 field goals per game, Camacho ranks No. 7 in the FBS and No. 1 in the MW.

→ Camacho transferred to Fresno State in 2015 and split kicking duties with Kroening when the two were sophomores. Camacho went 2-of-4 as a sophomore and did not log an attempt as a junior.

Limiting the BIG play

In Fresno State's 27-10 victory at San Jose State, the 'Dogs got their result with a stingy defense that allowed only 205 total yards of offense to the Spartans - 79 in the first half and 126 in the second half. While limiting SJSU to 3.5 yards per play on offense, Fresno State did not allow a single one of the 59 offensive plays run to go for more than 20 yards (known as a chunk play).

→ The last time Fresno State held an opponent to zero chunk plays in a game was on September 29, 2007 (vs. Louisiana Tech).

→ The 205 yards allowed by the Bulldogs were the fewest for an FBS opponent since Nov. 15, 2008 in a 24-17 win against New Mexico State.

Controlling the clock

One key to Fresno State's success in the opening weeks of the season has been in its ability to control games with the clock. The Bulldogs rank No. 9 in the FBS and lead the MW with an average time of possession of 33:48.

→ Fresno State is one of four teams in the top 10 which do not average at least 200 yards per game on the ground, and rank third among those teams at 155.8 yards.

→ Three teams ahead of the 'Dogs in time of possession run a triple option offense (Georgia Tech, Navy, Army).

Protecting the House that Sweeney Built

Fresno State opened Bulldog Stadium in 1980, playing its last game of the season, defeating Montana State 21-14. The first full season of play, 1981, was Jeff Tedford's first season as a Bulldog and he started the winning tradition at Bulldog Stadium. To date, Fresno State has the 19th-best winning percentage among all FBS teams at their current home stadium.

They play who back-to-back ?

Fresno State played back-to-back games during nonconference action against teams that played in the College Football Playoff in 2016, at Alabama and at Washington. The Bulldogs traveled to Tuscaloosa on Sept. 9 for a contest at No. 1 Alabama and fell 41-10, and the following weekend, in Seattle on Sept. 16, fell 48-16 to No. 6 Washington. Looking back on teams' previous schedules since the CFP started, it can be argued that no Group of 5 team has faced a tougher schedule in that time. In the three years of the CFP, there have only been three other teams that have had to face two reigning CFP programs in the same season - Auburn (SEC), Florida (SEC) and Florida State (ACC).

Summary table listing back-to-back opponents: Fresno State (2017—at Alabama, at Washington), Florida State (2017—at Clemson, vs. Alabama), Florida (2015—Florida State, vs. Alabama), Auburn (2017—at Clemson, Alabama; 2016—Clemson, at Alabama).

→ The Bulldogs' matchups with then-ranked No. 1 Alabama (week 2 rankings) and then-ranked No. 6 Washington (week 3 rankings) marked the first time in program history Fresno State played Top 10 opponents in back-to-back weeks. It was the third time in a season that Fresno State played two teams in the top 10 in the same season. The 'Dogs hosted No. 10 Wisconsin and went to No. 8 Boise State in 2008 and traveled to No. 10 Nebraska and hosted No. 5 Boise State in 2011.

Fresno State vs. No. 1 ranked teams

The Bulldogs faced the nation's No. 1-ranked team for the third time in the program's history on Sept. 9. The Alabama Crimson Tide defeated Fresno State 41-10 in front of 101,127 fans at Bryant-Denny Stadium and dropped to 0-3 all-time against top-ranked teams. The two previous occasions were against USC in 2005, falling 50-42, and against Oklahoma in 2003, dropping that contest 52-28. Interestingly enough, those two seasons (2003/2005) are also the only times that Fresno State has played the eventual Heisman Trophy winner in a season as OU quarterback Jason White picked up the hardware in 2003 and USC running back Reggie Bush took home the award in 2005.

Fresno State honors Derek Carr

At Fresno State's season opener, Derek Carr was in attendance to have his jersey retired - becoming the seventh person in the 95-year history of the program. He joins the likes of his brother David Carr, as well as Trent Dilfer, Henry Ellard, Dale Messer, Vince Petrucci and Kevin Sweeney. His brother David, and family, was in attendance as will as Fresno State alum and close friend Paul George for the celebration.

→ Fresno State is the only school that can claim selections for the NFL Pro Bowl (Derek Carr), NBA All-Star Game (Paul George) and MLB All-Star Game (Aaron Judge) from the last calendar year.





JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH

1ST SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)

Jeff Tedford, 55, was named the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history on Nov. 10, 2016 and was introduced to the Red Wave by Director of Athletics Jim Bartko at a press conference on Nov. 11, 2016.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies – a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as interim head coach Eric Kiesau carried out his duties for the remaining two games following Tedford's introduction.

Tedford, who is a proven winner on the West Coast, comes to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level – having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons, from there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League – a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the

Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 coach of the year twice, led the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Bellotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

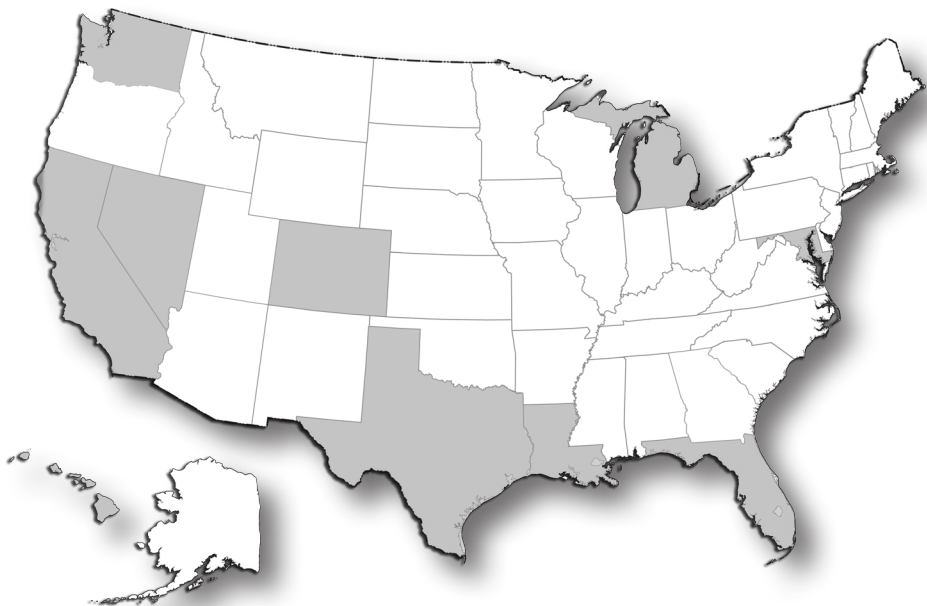

SEATTLE - A 27-point first quarter by the high-powered scoring offense of No. 6 Washington proved to be too much for Fresno State to overcome on Saturday night at Husky Stadium as the Bulldogs fell 48-16.

Fresno State (1-2) totaled 313 yards on offense with 151 in the first half and 162 in the second half. The 'Dogs finished with 194 yards through the air and 119 yards on the ground and totaled 18 first downs while possessing the ball for 32:55.

Sophomore quarterback Chason Virgil went 11-of-20 for 98 yards while junior Marcus McMaryion came on in the second half to go 10-of-16 for 96 yards. Senior wide receiver Da'Mari Scott had a team-leading five receptions for 40 yards and recorded his first touchdown of the season.

On defense, sophomore defensive back Mike Bell made a career-high nine tackles, including six solo, and also recorded 1.5 tackles for a loss. Linebackers Jeffrey Allison and James Bailey had five tackles apiece while Allison forced one of two fumbles on the evening by the 'Dogs.

How It Happened

With the Bulldogs receiving the ball to start the game, the 'Dogs picked up a quick first down on an 11-yard run by Rivers, but were stopped short on a third down setting up the first punt of the game by sophomore punter Blake Cusick.

After a quick three-and-out by the 'Dogs, Washington used back-to-back receptions of 17 and 50 yards, respectively, to reach the Bulldogs four-yard line. After what appeared to be a third down tackle by the Bulldogs on third-and-goal, a horse collar penalty wiped out the Bulldogs' positive momentum.

Washington extended its lead 20-0 on a seven-yard rush out of the Wildcat formation by Gaskin that was set up after a Bulldog turnover. After the 'Dogs were stopped on third-and-3 on their next drive, Cusick's punt was returned 77 yards by Pettis for a touchdown, to move the score 27-0 in favor of UW, as the senior wide receiver tied an NCAA record with his eighth career punt return for a touchdown.

The 'Dogs looked to get on the scoreboard at the end of the first quarter, but a 48-yard field attempt by Jimmy Camacho sailed wide right. Washington extended its lead to 34-0 with a seven-yard touchdown pass from Browning to Pettis with 12:07 left in the first half.

After forcing the Huskies' first punt of the game, the 'Dogs took over at midfield and went on an eight-play 50-yard drive that was punctuated by a six-yard touchdown score from Virgil to Scott to get Fresno State on the board. Washington closed out its high-scoring first half with an 11-play, 75-yard drive that ended with an eight-yard touchdown reception by Gaskin from Browning. It was 41-7 at the break.

The second half started quickly for the Huskies, needing only two plays to score, as Browning and Pettis connected for a 73-yard touchdown pass. The 'Dogs were unable score touchdowns in the third quarter, despite the defense forcing fumbles on back-to-back drives and gaining possession in UW territory.

Camacho made his third field of the night in the fourth quarter, connecting from 31 yards, which resulted in the final score, 48-16.

FRESNO, Calif. - Behind 504 yards of total offense and three first half touchdowns from junior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson, the Fresno State Bulldogs won its Mountain West opener over Nevada 41-21 on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium.

Junior quarterback Marcus McMaryion, making his first start as a Bulldog, had a standout game behind center, passing for 296 yards on 24-of-32 passing and tossed two touchdowns. The Oregon State transfer went 20-of-23 in the first half for 260 yards. Johnson, a Biletnikoff award watch list candidate, made a team-high seven receptions for 104 yards and matched his career-high with three touchdowns.



On the ground, freshman running back Ronnie Rivers rushed for a season-best 82 yards on a season-high 12 carries and scored the 'Dogs lone touchdown on the ground.

Defensively, the secondary provided three turnovers as sophomore Jaron Bryant notched his first two career interceptions, one returned 18 yards for a touchdown, and senior Johnny Johnson, Jr. added another.

Junior linebacker George Helmuth had a career-high 10 tackles and added a sack and tackle for a loss. Linebackers James Bailey and Jeffrey Allison each had eight tackles apiece while sophomore defensive back Mike Bell added seven tackles, including three solo stops.

How It Happened

The first quarter saw the 'Dogs build an early 10-0 lead behind 120 yards of offense with 107 yards coming through the air. With Nevada winning the coin toss and deferring to the second half, Jamire Jordan received the opening kickoff and returned it 71 yards down to the Wolf Pack 29-yard line. Three plays later, McMaryion found Johnson for a 10-yard touchdown to give the Bulldogs an early 7-0 lead.

The Wolf Pack threatened to score on its second possession of the game driving down to the Bulldog 35-yard line before being forced to attempt a 45-yard field goal. Nevada's Spencer Pettit's kick was blocked by the Fresno State's James Bailey and recovered by DeShawn Potts. Taking over at their 25-yard line, the 'Dogs went on a 12-play, 63-yard drive down to the Nevada 12 setting up a Jimmy Camacho 29-yard field goal to put the 'Dogs up 10-0 at the end of the first quarter.

The Bulldogs continued to build their lead in the second quarter using a quick 63-yard strike from McMaryion to sophomore wide receiver Derrion Grim to get down to the Nevada 25. After a nine-yard rush by freshman running back Jordan Mims, a 16-yard pass from running back Josh Hokit to Johnson put the 'Dogs in front 17-0 - the running back's second TD toss this season.

Bryant's interception return, the first interception returned for a touchdown by a Bulldog since 2015, and a 40-yard strike from McMaryion to Johnson extended the Bulldogs lead to 31-0 with 2:08 left in the first half.

Nevada would not end the half quietly, answering back with back-to-back touchdowns within 19 seconds of one another under one minute remaining in the half. Gangii connected with Wyatt Demps for a 17-yard score and then after a fumble by Fresno State's Da'Mari Scott on the ensuing kickoff, Gangi wasted no time finding Trevion Armstrong in the corner of the endzone to cut the 'Dogs lead to 31-14.

The Bulldogs extended their lead to 38-14 in the third quarter as Rivers punched in a five-yard score on the ground to finish off a six-play, 56-yard drive and Camacho's second field goal of the night from 27 yards out ended the Bulldogs' scoring for the contest. A late touchdown by the Wolf Pack made the final score 41-21, earning the Bulldogs their largest margin of victory in a conference opener since 2011.

SAN JOSE, Calif. - The Fresno State football team regained control of the Valley Trophy on Saturday evening with a 27-10 victory at San Jose State, topping the Spartans behind three first-half touchdowns, and a stifling defense that allowed just 205 yards and forced four turnovers.



"It's always nice to come away with a victory," said head coach Jeff Tedford. "We can get a lot better, but it's great to bring the trophy home. That's something we talked all week about, and we take pride in that."

While the defense laid the foundation, Fresno State's (3-2, 2-0 MW) running game paved the way offensively. Freshman running back Ronnie Rivers had a season-high 19 carries for a season-best 105 yards and added two rushing scores. Fellow freshman running back Jordan Mims added 12 carries for 49 yards and sophomore Josh Hokit rushed 10 times for 43 yards as the 'Dogs tallied a season-high 212 yards on the ground.

Junior quarterback Marcus McMaryion, making his second-straight start, finished 15-of-26 through the air for 136 yards, spreading the ball around to four receivers. Junior KeeSean Johnson had a team-high 52 yards on two receptions, including a 45-yard gain in the first quarter, while senior Da'Mari Scott matched his season-high with seven receptions for 45 yards.

On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore defensive back Juju Hughes filled up the stat sheet finishing with six tackles (four solo) and added two tackles for loss, a sack, interception and a forced fumble. Senior defensive tackle Malik Forrester added six tackles, three tackles for loss, two sacks and forced a fumble as he wreaked havoc on the Spartan offense all night. Sophomore linebacker Jeffrey Allison had a team-high nine tackles, five solo, and a tackle for loss.

How It Happened

The Bulldog defense came out tough from the start of the game, forcing two turnovers in the first nine minutes of action as sophomore defensive back Jaron Bryant and Hughes each picked off passes from Spartan quarterback Josh Love. The first scoring drive for the 'Dogs started at their 44-yard line as they put together a 14-play, 56-yard drive, capped by a Rivers' 15-yard rush, that took 6:03 off the clock.

With the Spartans getting the ball back, Hughes picked off a Love third-down pass for his first career interception. The Bulldogs took over at their own 47-yard line, and after a 10-yard run by Rivers and a five-yard rush by Mims, McMaryion connected with Johnson down the middle of the field for a 45-yard gain down to the SJSU 8-yard line. Three plays later, Rivers rushed for his second score of the game with a three-yard plunge up the middle to put Fresno State in front 14-0.

Holding a 152-44 advantage in yards and holding the ball for over 10 minutes after the first quarter, the 'Dogs continued to pound the rock in the second quarter putting together a season-long 17-play, 80-yard drive that ran 8:04 off the game clock. Running the ball 15 times on the drive, Rivers rushed five times for 39 yards and Mims carried it five times for 23 yards as the drive ended with a 1-yard touchdown run by Hokit.

With the 'Dogs holding its opponent scoreless in the first half for a second time this season, Fresno State held a 285-79 advantage in yards in the first half. The Spartans got on the scoreboard in the third quarter capitalizing on its best starting field position of the game, starting at the Bulldogs' 49-yard line as SJSU put together a nine-play drive that finished with a six-yard pass from Love to Josh Oliver.

Senior Jimmy Camacho extended the Bulldogs' lead to 24-7 lead with a 38-yard field goal with 13:40 to play in the fourth quarter. The Spartans' Bryce Crawford nailed a 51-yard field goal to bring it back within a two possession game, but after a short kickoff was recovered by the 'Dogs at the SJSU 38-yard line, the 'Dogs gained five yards before Camacho hit a career-long 50 yard field goal to complete the scoring for the Bulldogs.
