Headlines

→ The 'Dogs own a six game winning streak against the Lobos, the longest win streak against any MW team. Fresno State leads the all-time series 12-4.

→ Fresno State has won 14 of its last 17 games. The Bulldogs have outscored their opponents 30.4 to 14.3 over those last 17 games.

→ For the fifth time in seven seasons in the Mountain West, the 'Dogs have started conference play 2-0 after wins over Nevada and Wyoming. They will seek to go 3-0 for the third time as a member of the MW having done so in 2013 and 2017.

→ With a win over the Lobos, the Bulldogs will pick up their sixth win of the season and gain bowl eligibility in back-to-back seasons.

→ Key Stat: Fresno State ranks No. 2 in the FBS in takeaways with 17 (12 INT/5 FR) while New Mexico ranks No. 105 in the FBS in turnovers lost with 13 (8 INT/5 FL).

→ Recipe for success: Fresno State ranks 14th in the FBS in 3rd down conversion percentage and ranks seventh in the FBS in 3rd down conversion defense.

→ Fresno State and LSU share the nation's lead in limiting opponents under 30 points in consecutive games - they share that lead with 17 straight games.

→ Fresno State's scoring defense ranks No. 2 in the FBS limiting opponents to 13.5 ppg.

→ LB Jeff Allison ranks T-No. 15 in tackles per game in the FBS averaging 11.0. He's posted 66 total tackles for the 'Dogs with the next closest checking in at 37 (George Helmuth).

→ Fresno State used its third different group of starters on the offensive line against Wyoming and did not give up a sack. Overall, the Bulldogs have allowed four sacks this season ranking T-5th in the FBS in sacks allowed (0.67/game).

Fresno State and Wyoming to meet for the 17th time

Saturday's game will be the 17th meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Lobos. The 'Dogs currently lead the series 12-4 and own a six game winning streak against the Lobos, the longest win streak against any MW team.

Fresno State vs. New Mexico MW Meetings

The 'Dogs are currently 5-3 in Albuquerque with wins in 1988, 1993, 1998, 2012 & 2014. Fresno State's most recent trip to New Mexico came in 2014 when the 'Dogs left with a 35-24 victory over the Lobos (sixth-year senior wide receiver Delvon Hardaway started in the contest making three catches for 15 yards).

The two teams have met nine times before as conference opponents with the 'Dogs winning four of five games as WAC foes from 1992-95 & 1998 before the two became conference foes again in the Mountain West in 2012. In four meetings as MW opponents, the 'Dogs are a perfect 4-0 with two wins on the road and two wins at home.

The 'Dogs have won six straight meetings over the Lobos & 10 of the last 11 contests, dating back to 1990, with New Mexico's lone win in that stretch coming at home in 1994.

Scouting the New Mexico Lobos

New Mexico enters Saturday's contest against the Bulldogs with a 3-3 overall record and a 1-1 mark in the Mountain West coming off a heartbreaking 20-18 loss at Colorado State on Saturday that saw the Rams kick a game-winning field as time expired in regulation.

New Mexico is currently second in the MW in scoring offense at 38.2 points per game and fourth in the MW in total offense averaging 432.8 yards per game. The Lobos average 234.3 yards passing per game (8th in MW) and 198.5 yards rushing per game (4th).

Junior quarterback Sheriron Jones, a transfer from Tennessee, leads the Lobos with 955 yards passing and has tossed 12 touchdowns which ranks sixth in the MW. On the ground, redshirt senior running back Tyrone Owens leads the team with 424 rushing yards and has six rushing touchdowns to rank third in the Mountain West. Four other Lobos have rushed for more than 100 yards this season and the Lobos' 290 rushing attempts rank second-highest in the MW behind Air Force (377).

Junior wide receiver Elijah Lilly leads the team with 317 receiving yards and four touchdowns. Lilly has 15 receptions this season and his 21.1 yards per reception leads the conference and ranks eighth in the nation. Senior Delane Hart-Johnson also has caught four touchdowns and has a team-high 19 receptions to go along with 270 yards.

On the defensive side of the ball, New Mexico ranks ninth in the MW in total defense allowing 443.2 yards per game. The Lobos are 11th in the MW in pass defense allowing 271.4 yards per game passing while eighth in rushing defense allowing 171.8 yards rushing per game. New Mexico is seventh in scoring defense allowing 31.0 points per game, a mark three opponents have reached.

Senior linebacker Evahelotu Tohi has a team-high 43 tackles along with 4.0 tackles for loss, two interceptions, two pass breakups and a forced fumble. The Lobos defense has 15 sacks, nine interceptions (second in the MW) and three fumble recoveries this season.



Revisiting the 2017 Fresno State-New Mexico matchup

Recording its second shutout of the 2017 season, Fresno State pitched a 38-0 shutout at Bulldog Stadium on Oct. 14 in the most recent meeting against New Mexico.

The 'Dogs totaled 526 yards as quarterback Marcus McMaryion passed for 299 yards while Josh Hokit (70), Jordan Mims (65) and McMaryion (52) each rushed for over 50 yards.

Jamire Jordan and KeeSean Johnson each went over 100 yards receiving as Jordan caught three passes for 108 yards and two touchdowns while Johnson made five receptions for 105 yards and a touchdown.

Fresno State's defense held New Mexico to 322 yards limiting the Lobos to 213 yards passing and 109 rushing yards.

Only four of the Lobos' 14 offensive drives made their way into Bulldog territory as New Mexico missed a field goal, lost a fumble, threw an interception and turned it over on downs on those four drives.

One win from gaining bowl eligibility

With a win over the Lobos, the Bulldogs will pick up their sixth win of the season and gain bowl eligibility in back-to-back seasons.

Fresno State has played in bowl games in 28 seasons and has earned its sixth win in that season's sixth or seventh game on 10 occasions (1937, '40, '61, '82, '85, '89, '91, '01, '05, '13).

The Bulldogs are 13-15 all-time in 28 bowl games and have played in 14 bowl games since 2000.

'Dogs off to a 2-0 Mountain West start

For the fifth time in seven seasons in the Mountain West, the 'Dogs have started conference play 2-0 after wins over Nevada and Wyoming.

Fresno State won the first two MW games in each of its first three seasons in the league and the last two years, but only twice, 2013 and 2017, have the 'Dogs won their third MW game. The 'Dogs started MW play 7-0 in 2013 and 4-0 in 2017.

Dogs wrap up nonconference schedule 3-1

Fresno State closed its regular season nonconference schedule with three wins for the first time since 2013.

After defeating FCS foe, Idaho, 77-13, the Bulldogs next two matchups were against Power 5 opponents - at Minnesota (Sept. 8) and at UCLA (Sept. 15) - which Fresno State split, and concluded play with a 49-27 win at home against Toledo. Throw out the Bulldogs drubbing of Idaho and the numbers are still stellar against two P5 opponents and a Toledo squad that won the MAC championship a season ago.

• FS offense averaged 424.3 yards per game versus its opponents 317.3 yards per game

Last season, under Tedford's captain system, four juniors (now seniors) represented the Bulldogs as game-by-game picks. Those players were James Bailey (5x), KeeSean Johnson (4x), Kyle Riddering (3x) and Micah St. Andrew (1x).

Six games into the 2018 season, Juju Hughes (Minnesota/Nevada) and Jeff Allison (UCLA/Wyoming) have been pegged first-time team captains.

Impact walk-ons

Fresno State currently has four individuals making starts who began their respective careers as walk-ons at Fresno State (all four are now on scholarship).

It starts with a senior linebacker and team captain George Helmuth. In addition, junior defensive linemen Jasad Haynes and Mykal Walker did so, as well as senior center Micah St. Andrew.

This N' That

- Fresno State started conference play 2-0 for the second-straight season and fifth time in seven seasons as members of the Mountain West (2012-14, 2017).
Fresno State now shares the nation lead with LSU in the most consecutive games allowing 30 points or less after former leader Wisconsin gave up 38 points to Michigan.
KeeSean Johnson extended his nation-leading streak of consecutive games with at least one catch to 42 games.
Fresno State has not allowed a touchdown in two straight games, matching last year's two-game run shutting out New Mexico 38-0 on Oct. 14 and holding San Diego State to 27-3.
Overall, the 2017 defense held opponents out of the end zone for 11-straight quarters starting with the fourth quarter on Oct. 7 at San Jose State until the third quarter on Oct. 28 against UNLV.
It had been since 1990 that Fresno State held an opponent out of the end zone for two-straight games when the Bulldogs did so in 2017. They've now done it in back-to-back seasons.
Blake Cusick placed four of his five punts inside the 20-yard line against Wyoming; two were inside the 10-yard line. (25, 14, 13, 8, 3)
Fresno State has registered an interception in four-straight games and in five of the six games this season. The only game the Bulldogs did not record an interception was in Fresno State's only loss, at Minnesota.
Fresno State used its third different group of starters on the offensive line against Wyoming and did not give up a sack. Overall, the Bulldogs have allowed four sacks this season.
Marcus McMaryion is tied with Mark Barsotti (1991) for fourth all-time at Fresno State in rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in a season with seven.
Jeff Allison recorded his ninth career game with 10-plus tackles in game with a team-high 13. It was the 13th time he has led the Bulldogs in tackles in 20 career starts.
Jared Rice caught a career-best seven receptions against Wyoming.
After limiting Nevada to zero explosive plays last time out, Fresno allowed just two against Wyoming.
It was the second straight game in which Fresno State has shut out an opponent in the second half after shutting out Nevada in the second half last week.
Fresno State has now won 14 of its last 17 games.

Avoid 3rd-and-longs

Fresno State's offense converted 6-of-14 third downs (42.9 percent) against Wyoming, which slightly dropped its season average to 48.8 percent (40-of-82) from an even 50 percent entering the game. Despite that, the Bulldogs own the 14th best third down conversion percentage in the FBS.

The Bulldogs had their poorest outing on third downs at Nevada on Oct. 6 converting just 3-of-13 and produced a season-low 271 yards offense, but faced five situations of third-and-10 or more - more than the previous four games combined. Last time out, Fresno State found themselves with third-and-long twice, both in the second quarter. One was a third-and-25 due to an offensive pass interference call, the other was a third-and-13 that was converted with a 16-yard toss from Marcus McMaryion to Jared Rice in a drive that eventually turned into six points.

With one of the top third down conversion rates in the country, a part of that is due to Fresno State being faced with third-and-long only 11 times of the 82 times they've faced a third down.

Game predictor?

When the Bulldogs get off to fast starts, they are tough to beat. In the Tedford era, Fresno State is 12-1 when scoring first and 15-1 when holding a halftime lead.

In those 12 wins when they have scored first, Fresno State has outscored its opponents in the first quarter 118-20 in those games.

In six games in 2018, the 'Dogs have scored on the game-opening drive three times while the defense has made life tough for its opponents holding them to three points in six games. The 'Dogs opened up games against Idaho, UCLA and Toledo with scoring drives.

McMaryion moving his way up the record book

Quarterback Marcus McMaryion ran for two touchdowns on Saturday in the 'Dogs 27-3 win over Wyoming and now has seven rushing touchdowns this season and is tied with Darwin Thompson (Utah State) to lead the Mountain West.



Dinuba

They call him Dinuba (die-new-bah). Marcus McMoryion, often called Dinuba by his teammates, returned to the Central Valley last season to play for the Bulldogs after three seasons at Oregon State. He was 9-2 as the starter, leading the Bulldogs to an appearance in the MW Championship game and a Hawai'i Bowl victory against Houston after getting his first Bulldog start on Sept. 30, 2017 vs. Nevada. McMoryion accomplished all that after joining the team on Aug. 12, 2017, midway into training camp. He was eligible immediately as a graduate transfer. Now, with a full spring, summer and fall camp under his belt, the sky is the limit.



Since becoming the first Bulldog quarterback to complete better than 60 percent of his passes in a season since Derek Carr (2013) last year, McMoryion is even more accurate in 2018 completing 71.4 percent of his throws, going 130-of-182 over six games.

→ McMoryion's completion percentage (71.4%) ranks 5th in the FBS while only one of the four in front of him have more attempts. → McMoryion enters the New Mexico game with 80 consecutive pass attempts without throwing an interception. He has tossed just two over six games on 182 attempts this season.

→ McMoryion ranks 24th in the FBS in completions per game (21.67). → The best single season completion percentage in school history is 68.7 set by Derek Carr in 2013.

Plug and Play

In spite of Fresno State using its third different group of starters on the offensive line against Wyoming, they did not give up a sack. In total after six games, the Bulldogs have allowed just four sacks this season. They've kept a clean sheet twice, at Minnesota and hosting Wyoming, and allowed one apiece in the four other contests.

Fresno State returned three starters with 71 career combined starts (Netane Muti, Christian Cronk, Micah St. Andrew) going into the 2018 season opener ... in doing so, the line tinkered with its lineup to the point that Fresno State joined Western Kentucky and UTSA as the only offensive lines in the nation to start the season with all five position starters each earning their first career starts at their respective position to start 2018 ... the change continued losing Muti to a season-ending achilles injury during the Bulldogs' week two contest at Minnesota. Cronk moved back to left tackle (where he started in 2016-17) in the absence of Muti and junior college transfer Nick Abbs slid in at left guard. A new lineup emerged against Wyoming, having St. Andrew and Boyer flip positions (center-right guard) while Logan Hughes picked up his first start at left guard since 2016.

→ Fresno State ranks T-5th in the FBS in sacks allowed (0.67/game). → Fresno State ranks T-6th in the FBS in tackles for loss allowed (3.83/game).

Stingy on third down

When third downs come, Fresno State's defense is at its best whether long or short yardage. The Bulldogs have held opponents to 26.1 percent on the third down this season...

→ In games 1, 3 and 5, the 'Dogs held opponents to less than 25 percent on third down, winning by a margin of at least 18 points in all three contests.

→ Fresno State held UCLA to a season-best 1-of-10 on third down on Sept. 15.

→ Third-and-short: Fresno State has held opponents to 4-of-12 on third downs when needing two yards or less. Two opponents have been held without a third-and-short conversion.

Defending the red zone

With opponents cashing in on just 54.5 percent of its trips to the red zone, that percentage that Fresno State's defense has defended ranks No. 1 in the FBS. In total, Fresno State's opponents have reached the red zone 11 times - which ranks as the second-fewest trips to the red zone in the FBS.

→ The six scores by opponents in the red zone are the fewest in the FBS.

→ Fresno State has stopped an opponent in the red zone in three of its five games. The Bulldogs held Idaho and Toledo to 1-of-3 on red zone chances.

→ The Bulldogs did not allow Wyoming to reach the red zone last time out, the first time they have held an opponent outside of the 20 this season.

Stifling Defense

After 20 total games in the Tedford era, the defense has actually been the hallmark of the "quarterback guru's" tenure. Fresno State has allowed opponents to 16.6 points per game under Tedford. Furthermore, the Bulldogs have not allowed an opponent to score 30 or more points since Sept. 16, 2017 at Washington (L, 48-16), a stretch of 17 straight games which is tied for the nation's longest streak with LSU.

→ Fresno State is one of four teams in the FBS to own a streak of double-digit games allowing 30 points or less.

Elite

Following a season in which the Bulldogs' defense was the program's best since the late 1980's, this year's group is on track to be even better. The Bulldogs are currently suffocating opposing offenses, holding them to 13.5 points per game, the second-lowest average in the FBS.

→ During the last 50 years, Fresno State has held opponents to 15.0 points per game or less during four seasons.

→ Only once has a Bulldog defense held opponents below 14 points per game for an entire season (1986 - 13.6).

Manufacturing takeaways

Through six games, Fresno State has produced 17 takeaways - which ranks third-most in the country (based on all teams and all games). The Bulldogs' 12 interceptions ranks tied for the second-most in the FBS. The Bulldogs turnover margin ranks tied for second-best in the country having turned the ball over six times - equating a +1.83 turnover margin.

→ 11 different Bulldogs have accounted for a takeaway this season. Jeff Allison, James Bailey, Patrick Belony and Mike Bell have each recorded two takeaways while Tank Kelly leads the team with three.

→ Fresno State has won the turnover battle in four of its six games this season, winning all four games.

Points off turnovers

Fresno State has recorded 69 points off turnovers through six games, a number that has already surpassed season totals from the past three seasons and 20 points away from the 2014 team's 89 point total over 14 games.

→ The Bulldogs had 38 points off turnovers in their contest against Idaho, scoring five touchdowns and a field goal. Looking back, it's the first time since 2013 that the Bulldogs posted 30 or more points off turnovers - having done so against Idaho scoring 35 points off turnovers in that game.

2nd half adjustments

If Fresno State's opponents think they have figured out how to maneuver against the Bulldogs' defense, time and time again the Bulldogs have proved they are making the right halftime adjustments to confuse the opposition's offense. Six games into the season, the Bulldogs have allowed only one first down (Toledo), and a total of 21 yards combined of the six second half drives they have faced.

Aerial pursuit

While Fresno State remains one of the top team's in the FBS in takeaways, its strength has been when attacking a team's passing game. The Bulldogs rank tied for No. 2 in the FBS in interceptions with 12. The Bulldogs' 2.0 INTs per game rank tied for No. 1 in the nation.

The fear of ball-hawking defenders has led quarterbacks to be off their game, holding them to the second-lowest passing efficiency in the nation at 91.7. Quarterbacks have been held to a 47.6 percent completion percentage and a 5 TD /12 INT ratio. No other team in the Mountain West has forced more interceptions than allowed passing touchdowns.

→ Eight different Bulldogs have hauled in an interception this season. Tank Kelly leads the team with three while Jeff Allison and Mike Bell have accounted for two.

→ Seven of Fresno State's picks have come from its secondary, three from its linebackers and two from the linemen up front.

→ Fresno State has defended 44 passes this season, 7.3 per game. Kelly has accounted for a nation-leading 16, doubling Bell's total, who ranks second on the team.

Holding the best backs down

Since Jeff Tedford took over in 2017, Fresno State has faced four players who entered their game with Bulldogs averaging over 100 rushing yards per game. Only one, Diocemy Saint Juste could cross the century mark. Fresno State held the four to an average of 61.8 yards below their averages they entered with. Nico Evans of Wyoming was the latest victim to be held below his season average (95 yards below his 2018 average).

→ In its 16 games against a team without a non-100-yard rusher, only Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts rushed for over 100 yards. His 154 yards is the most on the ground by a single player against a Bulldog defense under Tedford.

Keeping opponents out of the end zone

After not allowing Nevada to score a touchdown with a 21-3 victory on Oct. 6, which marked the first time this season that the Bulldog defense kept their opponent out of the end zone and first time overall since Oct. 21, 2017 (at San Diego State), the 'Dogs did the same thing a week later versus Wyoming in a 27-3 win. It was also the second straight week that Fresno State kept its opponents from scoring in the second half.

→ In 2017, Fresno State held its opponents to single digits four times, including two shutouts and three times without a TD. Wyoming was one of the four teams not to post double-digits against Fresno State in 2017 as they beat the Cowboys 13-7 in Laramie.

→ Until 2017, it had been since 1990 that Fresno State held an opponent out of the end zone for two-straight games. They've now done it in back-to-back seasons.

Using non-traditional methods

Through six games, Fresno State has scored four touchdowns without the use of its offense, the latest coming by way of a 38-yard pick six by defensive end Mykal Walker against Toledo on Sept. 29. It was the second interception for a touchdown this season after Tank Kelly returned one 39 yards in the season opener versus Idaho. Jaron Bryant also scored twice on blocked field goal returns against the Vandals.

→ The four non-offensive touchdowns is the most for a Bulldog team since recording five in 2013.

A force in the middle

As one of the nation's leading tacklers a season ago with 126, middle linebacker Jeff Allison has continued 2018 where he left off. He is currently on pace to surpass his 2017 total as he leads Fresno State with 66 tackles - an average of 11.0 per game. He is 29 tackles ahead George Helmuth who sits in second for the Bulldogs.

Playing just over half of the season opener, he still led the Bulldogs in tackles, and a week later at Minnesota, Allison was everywhere racking up a career-high 15 tackles, one more than the 14 he produced in Week 2 last year at Alabama. At UCLA, Allison was one tackle short of leading the team once again with six. He returned to leading the team in tackles in week four with nine versus Toledo and again at Nevada with a new career-high 17 tackles, his second double-digit game of the season. With 13 tackles versus Wyoming, Allison led the Bulldogs for the fifth time in six games.

→ In 20 career starts, Allison has led the Bulldogs in tackles 13 times. He has collected 10 or more tackles on nine occasions.

→ Allison ranks third in the MW in tackles per game at 11.0, good for 15th in the FBS.

→ He began the season on both the Bednarik (top defensive player) and Butkus (top linebacker) Award watch lists.



Conference preseason predictions

The 'Dogs were predicted to finish first in the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2018 MW preseason poll and are coming off winning the West Division in 2017 after going 7-1 in conference play. It was the fourth time in six years the 'Dogs have won their division or a share of the Mountain West title since moving to the league in 2012.

→ The Bulldogs have been predicted to win their division twice before being picked to repeat as West Division champs in 2018. Previously when the 'Dogs were picked to represent the West in the MW Championship Game in 2013 and 2014, they did just that.

Not to be underestimated

Anthoula “Tank” Kelly has been everything that his name entails through the first six games of 2018. The senior cornerback has been a destructive force thus far providing big hits, big plays and has locked down opposing receivers. Kelly leads the Mountain West and the FBS in passes defended with 16 after recording four in each of the last two games. He is tied for the MW lead and ranks ninth in the FBS with three interceptions.

- Kelly is three passes defended ahead of second place Adrian Frye of Texas Tech.
- The 5-foot-10 defensive back has three interceptions, one blocked field goal and one forced fumble on the year. The Bulldogs have scored 21 points off of the fifth-year senior’s big plays.
- Kelly has recorded three firsts in his Bulldog career this season: return an interception for a touchdown, block a field goal and force a fumble.

The details

Preaching attention to detail and being disciplined, Jeff Tedford’s squad ranks in the top 20 in the FBS in fewest penalties (10th - 27), fewest penalties per game (13th - 4.5), fewest penalty yards (11th - 240) and fewest penalty yards per game (10th - 40.00). Fresno State ranks second in the Mountain West in each category.

- In 2017, the Bulldogs averaged 5.2 penalties per game and 43.6 penalty yards per game.

Flipping field position

One of the Bulldogs’ best assets through six games has been punter Blake Cusick. The junior has placed 60 percent, 18 of 30, of his punts inside the opponents’ 20-yard line forcing teams to put together lengthy drives to score points. Only four punts have been returned for a total of 16 yards.

- 18 of his 30 punts have been downed inside the opponents’ 20 yard line with 12 being placed inside the opponents’ 10-yard line.
- Fresno State ranks first in the Mountain West and 23rd in the nation in net punting at 40.6 yards.
- Through six games, Cusick has an average of 43.2 yards per punt which ranks third in the Mountain West.
- Eight of Cusick’s punts have gone for 50-plus yards.

Blake Cusick - Mortell Award (top field goal holder)

Junior Blake Cusick was named to the Mortell Award watch list on Aug. 16 given to the nation’s top holder. Now in its fourth season as an award, Cusick is one of 28 student-athletes on the watch list with the winner having the opportunity to raise money for a charity of his choice and is based on quality of cadence, fluidity of hands (catch to hold), position of laces, and post-hold celebrations.

KeeSean Johnson - Biletnikoff Award (top wide receiver)

Senior KeeSean Johnson became the third ‘Dog to be recognized this preseason as the wide receiver was one of 50 players nationally named to the 2018 Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List as announced by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation on July 19. Given to college football’s outstanding receiver at any position, the Biletnikoff Award was created and is sponsored by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation.

Marcus McMaryion - Maxwell (top player), Wuerffel & Johnny Unitas (quarterback) Awards

Senior Marcus McMaryion was named to the Maxwell Award watch list on July 16 given to the nation’s player of the year, the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List on July 26 given to the college football student-athlete who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement and finally on Aug. 14 was named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm watch list given to the nation’s top quarterback.

Netane Muti - Polynesian Player of the Year

Much different from a year ago, the Fresno State football team was picked to win the West Division by the media, announced by the Mountain West on Tuesday morning prior to the 2018 media summit getting underway at the Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas.

Fresno State turned the 2017 predicted order of finish upside down after being picked to finish last with a 10-4 run and a West Division crown guided by then-first year head coach Jeff Tedford. Now, the Bulldogs will make its run for a second-straight appearance in the MW Championship game as the favorite in Tedford's sophomore season.

This is the third time in six seasons (2013, 2014 and 2018) the Bulldogs have been the favorite to win the West since the inception of the divisional format instituted by the league to start the 2013 season. In the previous two occasions the Bulldogs were picked the win the West in the league's preseason poll, Fresno State carried out that forecast each time.

In addition to the predicted order of finish, the 2018 All-Mountain West Preseason Football Team was announced. This year's team included two Fresno State selections in senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson and junior linebacker Jeff Allison. Johnson was a 2017 second-team All-MW pick while Allison was the Bulldogs' sole first-team selection a season ago.

JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH

2ND SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)

Jeff Tedford, 56, was named the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history on Nov. 10, 2016. He enters his second season after engineering one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history in his first year back in the Valley.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the second team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship Game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award presented on behalf of the Football Writers Association of America in conjunction with the Allstate Sugar Bowl, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as interim head coach Eric Kiesau carried out his duties for the remaining two games following Tedford's introduction.

Tedford, who is a proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year twice, leading the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence, which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

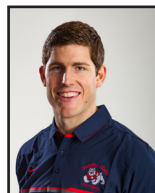

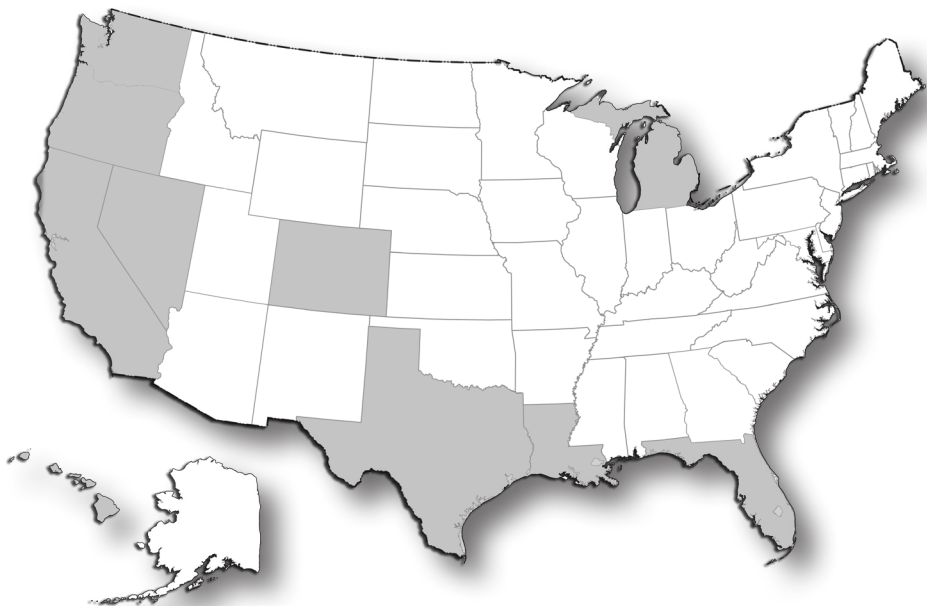

FRESNO, Calif. - Scoring its most points since 1991 using five interceptions, two special teams returns for touchdowns and one pick-six, the Fresno State football team rolled to a 79-13 season-opening rout of the Idaho Vandals on Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State (1-0) scored its most points in 27 years using a balanced offensive approach passing for 247 yards while rushing for 239 and seven scores on the ground.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion had an efficient passing night going 19-for-26 for 207 yards. The 'Dogs used a balanced attack on the ground as five running backs each went for better than 35 yards with Romello Harris leading the way with 47 followed by Saevion Johnson (45), Dejonte O'Neal (41), Josh Hokit (40) and Jordan Mims (36). Mims led the group with three touchdowns.



Senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson tallied his sixth career 100-yard receiving game going for 118 yards on six receptions while extending his consecutive games with a reception streak to a nation-leading 37 games.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team with six tackles while senior cornerback Tank Kelly had a pair of interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, five tackles and three pass breakups. Junior defensive tackle Jasad Haynes had five tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble while Jaron Bryant returned two blocked field goals for touchdowns.

How It Happened

The Bulldogs got the scoring started on their first offensive series of the contest going on an 11-play, 56-yard drive that saw McMaryion complete five of six passes for 42 yards connecting on passes to three different receivers, including three to junior tight end Jared Rice.

Facing a 3rd-and-5 from the Idaho 27, McMaryion connected on back-to-back passes for nine and 11 yards, respectively, to Rice getting the 'Dogs down to the Vandals 7. A six-yard gain by O'Neal got the Bulldogs on the doorstep of Idaho's goal line setting up a one-yard touchdown plunge by Mims.

After forcing the Vandals' to a second straight three-and-out, the 'Dogs took over at their own 20-yard line and marched down the field on a 12-play, 80-yard drive as the 'Dogs found little resistance from the Idaho defense. Faced with a 3rd-and-16 at their own 26, McMaryion found Johnson down the middle of the field for a 19 yard gain.

An 11-yard connection from Johnson and McMaryion on a 3rd-and-1 kept the drive alive and got the 'Dogs down to the Vandals' 28 and two plays later, the 'Dogs capitalized with a 26-yard scamper through the left side by O'Neal for his second career rushing touchdown.

The 'Dogs defense continued to wreck havoc as Haynes forced his first career fumble setting up the Bulldog's offense at the Idaho 19. After compiling 136 yards of offense on its first two drives, the Bulldog offense was only able to move four yards on its third drive setting up a 33-yard field goal by redshirt freshman kicker Asa Fuller who made his first career field goal to give the 'Dogs a 16-0 lead.

Holding the Vandals to negative 16 yards of offense on its first two drives, Idaho needed only two plays to drive 75 yards as quarterback Mason Petrino found wide receiver Jeff Cotton down the sideline for 73 yards to break up the 'Dogs shutout bid. The Vandals bobbled the PAT attempt as the Bulldogs led 16-6 with five seconds remaining in the first quarter.

Fresno State carried its hot offense into the second quarter going on a 7-play, 75-yard drive passing for 39 yards and running for 36 yards as Mims punched in his second touchdown run with a 12-yard scamper up the middle to extend the 'Dogs lead to 23-6.

The Vandals put together their most substantial drive of the game to that point with a 10-play, 46-yard drive down to the Bulldog 26 setting up a 36-yard field goal attempt by Cade Coffey, but Kelly broke through line blocking Coffey's kick as Bryant picked it up and returned it 74 yards putting the Bulldogs up 30-6.

The 'Dogs defense continued to pour it as Kelly picked off his second pass of the game stepping in front of a Petrino pass and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown to push the lead to 37-6.

Idaho made one final push to score in the first half going on a 9-play, 43-yard drive down to the Bulldog 22 to set up a 39-yard attempt by Coffey with one second remaining in the half. The 'Dogs special teams again came up clutch as redshirt junior Mykal Walker broke through the line for the block and was picked up by Bryant for 71 yards as Fresno State took a commanding 44-6 lead into halftime.

The Bulldogs added two touchdowns in the third quarter, a two-yard run by Mims and a 33-yard pass from Jorge Reyna to Derrion Grim (watch) on his first career attempt to take a 58-6 lead. The Vandals scored once more in the game in the third frame, a six-yard run by Isaiah Saunders to make it 58-13 in favor of the 'Dogs.

Fresno State completed the scoring with three more touchdowns in the fourth quarter as a pair of 'Dogs scored their first career touchdowns. S. Johnson had a five-yard plunge up the middle followed by a 27-yard run by Harris before S. Johnson found the end zone one more time with a one-yard run.

MINNEAPOLIS - The Fresno State football team lost a heartbreaker at Minnesota on Saturday evening, falling 21-14 at TCF Bank Stadium.



After converting a fourth-and-3 from the Minnesota 10-yard line, Fresno State was set up with first-and-goal from the Golden Gopher 4-yard line with 1:24 remaining in the game. The 'Dogs pulled a play out of the book from 2017, a halfback pass attempt from Josh Hokit to try and knot the game. But this one, intended for tight end Jared Rice in the back of the end zone, was intercepted by Minnesota defensive back Antonio Winfield Jr. to dash the Bulldogs' hopes of winning their first game on Big Ten soil since defeating Illinois 53-21 in 2009.

Fresno State was stymied for much of the first half by the Gophers' defense, totaling 104 yards offense, but came alive in the second half. Entering the third quarter trailing 10-0, the Bulldogs scored two touchdowns in the second half and took a one-point lead in the fourth quarter, 14-13. Minnesota regained the lead with 3:28 left in the contest and it proved to be enough to win the game.

Fresno State senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 23-of-32 through the air for 205 yards with a pair of touchdowns and his first interception of the season while adding 15 yards on the ground. Sophomore running back Jordan Mims led the 'Dogs rushing attack with 41 yards on 10 carries. The Bulldogs rushed for 87 yards as a team. On the receiving end, senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson led the team with six receptions for 89 yards and a touchdown while Rice added five catches for 31 yards and a score.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison had a career-high 15 tackles while junior safety Mike Bell chipped in a career-best 11 tackles, including five solo. The Bulldog defense did force one turnover in the third quarter as senior cornerback Tank Kelly forced a fumble that was recovered by senior defensive lineman Patrick Belony. The Bulldogs manufactured their first points of the game off that turnover.

How It Happened

Minnesota started the scoring on its second offensive drive by manufacturing a lengthy 14-play, 80-yard drive that ran 7:17 off the clock. Gopher redshirt sophomore Seth Green punched the ball in from one-yard out to give Minnesota a 7-0 lead.

Facing its first deficit of the season, the 'Dogs looked to get its offense going, but McMaryion threw his first interception of the season on the ensuing possession to give Minnesota the ball back at the Bulldogs' 41-yard line.

The 'Dogs defense came up big allowing only one yard after that turnover and nearly had a turnover of their own as Allison snagged a pass attempt on third-and-9, but was unable to stay in bounds. Minnesota finished the half with a 10-play, 55-yard drive that ended with a 53-yard field goal by Emmitt Carpenter to take a 10-0 lead into the locker room.

After the teams traded punts to start the second half, the Bulldogs defense produced their first turnover of the game deep in the Gophers' own territory. Anthoula Kelly forced the fumble and Patrick Belony pounced on top of it to spurn the Bulldogs' offense. Fresno State took advantage going on a four-play, 17-yard drive to score with 20 seconds remaining in the third quarter to pull within three, 10-7. Rice capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown catch from McMaryion.

Carpenter added his second 50-plus yard field goal of the game (50 yards) to put Minnesota ahead 13-7 before a quick strike by the 'Dogs gave Fresno State its lone lead of the game.

The 'Dogs went on a five-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion connecting with Johnson for 45 yards to push the 'Dogs in the lead, 14-13.

The lead was short-lived as the Gophers, as they did all game, pounded the ball on the ground for a 10-play, 74-yard drive that ate up 4:52 off the clock. Green ran in from three yards out and after a successful two-point conversion, the Gophers held a 21-14 lead. The drive was kept alive after a 13-yard completion along the sideline on a third-and-nine by a scrambling Zack Annexstad in Minnesota territory. That was followed by a 15-yard sideline infraction penalty called on Fresno State to set the Gophers up at the Bulldogs' 28-yard line.

Facing a fourth-and-3 from the Gophers 10-yard line, McMaryion found Justin Allen for six yards and a first down to extend the game, but after a timeout, the Gophers came up with the play that seal the game.

PASADENA, Calif. - Led by senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion's five total touchdowns on Saturday night at the Rose Bowl, the Fresno State football team defeated UCLA 38-14 in front of 60,867 fans with a large contingent being the Red Wave that filled up the visitors section in the southeast endzone.



With four touchdowns on the ground, McMaryion became just the second Fresno State quarterback to rush for four touchdowns in a game - joining Mark Barsotti's feat in 1989. McMaryion finished 22-of-33 passing for 270 yards and added a 10-yard touchdown pass to senior tight end Kyle Riddering.

The Fresno State defense was again stingy, forcing four UCLA turnovers while limiting the Bruins to 270 yards of offense with 151 yards through the air and 119 yards on the ground.

How It Happened

Fresno State got its offense going from the outset as the 'Dogs received the opening kickoff and went on a 13-play, 75-yard drive that burned 4:57 off the clock as McMaryion ran in a one-yard touchdown run (watch) to cap the drive.

After holding UCLA to 17 yards on five plays on their first offensive possession, the Bulldogs got the ball back and continued their hot offense with a 8-play, 75-yard drive that was finished by McMaryion finding Riddering down the left hash (watch) to put the 'Dogs ahead 13-0.

For a second straight week, Belony recovered an opponent's fumble as the senior defensive tackle hopped on a Bruins' botched snap at the UCLA 38-yard line (watch). The 'Dogs offense continued to hum along going down the field on a 6-play, 27-yard drive that finished with a 28-yard field goal by Asa Fuller (watch) to extend the 'Dogs lead to 16-0.

The Bruins took advantage of forcing a McMaryion fumble to strike quickly on a 45-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson to wide receiver Theo Howard, but that would be all the scoring for the Bruins the first half.

The Bulldogs took a 16-7 lead into the locker room at halftime and UCLA continued to take advantage of Fresno State miscues early in the second half. A botched punt return by Johnson set UCLA up at the Bulldogs' 17-yard line. The Bruins' capped the short scoring drive with a two-yard touchdown run by Bolu Olorunfunmi to cut the 'Dogs lead to 16-14 with 12:59 left in the third quarter.

Fresno State's offense got back to firing as it was in the first quarter halfway through the third quarter, closing the game with 22-answered points over the final 24 minutes. It started with an 8-play, 73-yard drive that was punctuated by a one-yard touchdown run by McMaryion (watch), his second of the game, and a successful two-point conversion pass from Jorge Reyna to Gunner Javernick (watch) to put the Bulldogs out front, 24-14, at the 6:19 mark in the third.

The defense played its part in the Bulldogs' late explosion as Allison snagged his first career interception to put the Bulldogs' offense at the 49-yard line (watch) to start their next scoring drive. The 'Dogs used a 5-play, 51-yard drive that was capped by McMaryion's third rushing score of the night, a one-yard plunge (watch), that put the 'Dogs up 31-14 with 3:43 to play in the third quarter.

Allison kept the 'Dogs defensive pressure up and grabbed his second interception of the game (watch) on the Bruins' next offensive possession. The Bulldogs made it three straight scoring drives capped by a McMaryion touchdown, this time a two-yard score (watch) that proved to be the final score of the game as Fresno State walked out of the Rose Bowl with a 38-14 win.

FRESNO, Calif. - Using a run of 42 unanswered points, Fresno State overcame an early 13-7 deficit to roll to a convincing 49-27 win over Toledo on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State, who finished nonconference play with a 3-1 record, accounted for a season-high 554 yards of offense in the contest with 368 yards through the air and 186 yards rushing.

After picking up the offensive player of the week award after his last performance against UCLA accounting for five total touchdowns, senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion produced five more scores, tossing a season-high four through the air while running for one on the ground. McMaryion completed 24-of-31 passes for 368 yards, the most by a Bulldog quarterback since Derek Carr passed for 404 against Utah State on Dec. 7, 2013.



Sophomore running back Jordan Mims made a career-high six receptions for 126 yards and became the first Bulldog running back since Paris Gagne on Dec. 31, 2000 to account for 100 or more receiving yards in a game.

On the ground, Mims and junior running back Josh Hokit each accounted for 59 yards as the 'Dogs ran the ball 38 times in the game for an average of 4.9 yards per carry.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the team in tackles for the third time this season making nine stops in the game. Senior defensive back Anthoula Kelly made a career-high seven tackles while accounting for three of the Bulldogs' five pass breakups in the game while junior defensive end Mykal Walker returned a 38-yard interception for a touchdown (watch), a sack, 2.5 tackles for loss and a pass breakup.

How It Happened

For a third time this season, the 'Dogs took their first offensive drive for a touchdown going on a 12-play, 75-yard journey down the field that ended with a four-yard touchdown run by Mims (watch). McMaryion went a perfect 7-of-7 for 58 yards connecting with five different teammates as junior tight end Cam Sutton made his first career reception with an 18-yard gain.

After being held to six yards and a three-and-out on its first drive, Toledo wasted little time responding with a 10-play, 75-yard drive that finished with a 19-yard touchdown pass from Rockets' quarterback Mitchell Guadagni to running back Shakif Seymour.

With the total yardage at 98 yards for each side and the score tied 7-7 after the opening quarter, Toledo opened the second quarter with a 36-yard run by Guadagni followed by a 15-yard personal foul penalty that sent the Rockets down to the Bulldog 30. The Bulldogs' defense held strong from that point, holding Toledo to a 46-yard field goal by Jameson Vest that gave the Rockets' a 10-7 lead.

With the Bulldogs trailing for the first time since Sept. 8 at Minnesota, McMaryion found Johnson on a bubble screen that he took upfield for 24 yards before McMaryion was intercepted for only the second time this season as Toledo defensive tackle Reggie Howard batted McMaryion's arm to force the ball in the air and into the awaiting arms of defensive end Jamal Hines.

It did not end in six points, but Toledo took advantage of the 'Dogs miscue connecting on a 43-yard field goal by Vest that extended the Rockets' lead to 13-7.

The 'Dogs responded to the Rockets' pair of field goals in a hurry with a 6-play, 76-yard drive in 1:43 to re-gain a one-point advantage, 14-13. McMaryion found Mims who scampered for 55 yards after a short pass, and on the ensuing play connected with Johnson on a seven-yard bubble screen that he took to the end zone to push the Bulldogs ahead.

One three-and-out later forced by the Bulldog defense, allowed McMaryion to guide the offense to a 6-play, 78-yard drive that featured a season-long 21-yard run by Hokit and a 36-yard flip from McMaryion to Jamir Jordan that was finished off by a two-yard touchdown toss from McMaryion to senior tight end Kyle Riddering to put the 'Dogs ahead 21-13.

The defense again made life tough for the Rockets as junior defensive end Kwami Jones came up with his first sack of the season that forced the Rockets to punt, which was returned by Ronnie Rivers for 18 yards as the sophomore running back made his season debut.

The next Fresno State score was set up by McMaryion finding Mims out of the backfield down the right sideline for a 47-yard touchdown that gave the 'Dogs their third straight touchdown and pushed the lead to 28-13.

After gaining 346 yards of offense in the first half with 286 yards coming through the air and 60 yards on the ground, the 'Dogs opened the second half and put together a 6-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass from McMaryion to Johnson in the left corner of the end zone to push the 'Dogs lead to 35-13.

On the drive, McMaryion went 3-for-3 for 64 yards finding Johnson for a 39-yard connection that pushed him into eighth all-time in program history in receiving yards passing Isaiah Burse (2010-13).

The 'Dogs added two more touchdowns in the third quarter as Walker's 38-yard interception return was the Bulldogs' fourth non-offensive return for a touchdown this season and was the second interception returned for a touchdown this season by a Bulldog.

McMaryion added his fifth touchdown of the game with a six-yard rush to 24:48 in the third quarter to give the 'Dogs a 49-13 lead (watch). Toledo added two fourth quarter touchdowns as Eli Peters connected with Jon'Vea Johnson for a 54-yard score followed by a 24-yard score.

RENO, Nev. - Behind stout defense from the Bulldogs and two touchdowns from sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers, Fresno State defeated Nevada 21-3 in its Mountain West opener on Saturday evening at Mackay Stadium.

Holding Nevada to only a field goal in the contest, the Fresno State defense forced three turnovers and limited the Wolf Pack to 3.8 yards per play on offense.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion went 20-of-28 passing, completing better than 70 percent of his throws for the fourth time in five games. He racked up 241 yards and tossed two touchdowns.



The beneficiary to each of McMaryion's touchdown throws were senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson (27-yard TD) and Rivers (19-yard TD). Johnson had a team-high seven receptions for 65 yards and a touchdown while Rivers' TD grab was his sole reception on the evening. Junior tight end Jared Rice tallied a team-high and career-high 98 yards on three receptions which included a career-long 69-yard reception.

Defensively, the 'Dogs linebacker corps was outstanding as junior linebacker Jeff Allison led the way with a career-high 17 tackles, 10 solo, while adding half-a-sack and half-a-tackle. Senior linebacker George Helmuth added 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and 0.5 sack and fellow senior James Bailey tacked on 10 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and one sack.

The secondary ripped off three interceptions, with the wealth being spread around with senior cornerback Anthoula Kelly, junior strong safety Juju Hughes and junior free safety Mike Bell tallying one apiece.

How It Happened

With neither team able to generate much offense in the early going, the game was scoreless after the opening quarter. The 'Dogs edged the Wolf Pack in total yards, 73-58.

With the ball at the Nevada 30-yard line and a fresh set of downs to open the second quarter, Fresno State finished their first scoring drive with McMaryion finding Rivers in the flat for a 19-yard touchdown pass to cap a nine play, 69-yard drive that spanned four minutes, nine seconds.

Nevada responded to the Bulldogs' touchdown drive with an 11-play, 51-yard drive that resulted in a 41-yard field goal by Wolf Pack kicker Ramiz Ahmed to cut the 'Dogs lead to 7-3. Nevada converted a key 4th-and-2 with a 13-yard rush by quarterback Christian Solano which helped set up the Wolf Pack's only scoring drive of the night.

Later in the second quarter, Kelly intercepted Solano and returned it 43 yards to the Wolf Pack 11 for his third interception of the season. Unfortunately for the 'Dogs, a play later McMaryion's pass to Jamire Jordan was jarred loose from Jordan causing the 'Dogs only turnover on Saturday.

Hughes made it two Bulldog interceptions over the final 2:35 of the first half by picking off Solano on a 3rd-and-10 with 11 seconds remaining in the half to end the threat of a Wolf Pack score. Fresno State held a 7-3 lead heading into the locker room at the break.

Limited to only 125 yards of offense to that point, the 'Dogs broke out on its second offensive drive of the third quarter as McMaryion found Rice for a 69-yard reception, taken down at the Nevada 11 to ultimately set up the Bulldogs' next score. Nevada wouldn't make it easy for Fresno State as they were able to convert a 4th-and-1 from the Nevada 2 to increase the lead to 14-3. Rivers delivered the score with his second touchdown of the night punching it in on fourth down.

Bell became the eighth Bulldog this season to notch an interception early in the fourth quarter as the 'Dogs defense continued to wreak havoc on Nevada.

The 'Dogs added one final score with 8:28 to play in the fourth quarter as McMaryion found Johnson for a 27-yard score to give the Bulldogs a 21-3 lead. Nevada made one last push for the end zone driving the ball 61 yards on 16 plays over five minutes, but the defense stood tall forcing a turnover on downs at the Fresno State 10-yard line with 3:18 left in the game.

FRESNO, Calif. - The Fresno State football team defeated Wyoming 27-3 on Saturday evening at Bulldog Stadium to improve to 5-1 on the season and 2-0 in Mountain West play.

Fresno State's defense limited Wyoming to 221 total yards and forced one turnover while the Bulldog offense totaled 391 yards and did not commit a turnover.

Senior quarterback Marcus McMaryion accounted for four total touchdowns in the game, two passing and two rushing. He completed 22-of-32 passes for 287 yards and ran for a season-high 53 yards on seven carries. McMaryion has now accounted for 18 touchdowns this season - 11 passing and seven rushing.

Junior tight end Jared Rice had a career-high seven receptions for 94 yards and caught a touchdown while senior wide receiver KeeSean Johnson added five receptions for 51 yards. Sophomore running back Ronnie Rivers added 90 all-purpose yards with 53 yards receiving, 22 yards rushing and 15 punt return yards.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jeff Allison posted his third double-figure tackle performance of the season finishing with 13 tackles. Junior free safety Mike Bell made his second interception of the season and senior defensive end Emeke Ndoh added a tackle for loss and a sack.

How It Happened

Allowing their opponent to score first for only the second time this season, Wyoming opened the game with a 8-play, 47-yard drive that was capped by Cowboy kicker Cooper Rothe nailing a 44-yard field goal to give the visitors a 3-0 lead.

From that point forward, the Bulldogs' defense shutout the Cowboys and rolled to 27 consecutive points.

After Fresno State's opening drive was unsuccessful, the Bulldogs' next drive would take two plays as McMaryion found Rice for a 35-yard touchdown pass to take a 6-3 lead. The point after was missed.

The Cowboys outgained the 'Dogs 74-70 in the opening quarter, but the Bulldogs' defense held the Wyoming offense to 44 yards in the second quarter.

The Bulldogs' sole second quarter scoring drive covered 46 yards over 12 plays and five minutes, 48 seconds, that included converting a crucial fourth-and-1 with a three-yard carry by Jordan Mims to keep their drive alive. Three plays later they faced a third-and-13 from the Cowboy 37-yard line and McMaryion found Rice for 16 yards down to the 21-yard line and followed that with a 20-yard connection to Cam Sutton as the junior tight end nearly found the end zone reaching out for the score before being knocked out at the 1-yard line. After three plays of not finding the checkbook, the Bulldogs converted a second fourth down as they scored on fourth-and-goal with McMaryion sneaking it in himself to give Fresno State a 13-3 lead with 52 seconds remaining in the half. The half would close with the 'Dogs holding the 10 point lead.

The Bulldog defense forced Wyoming into negative four yards on its opening offensive drive of the second half and for the third time in the game, the 'Dogs started a drive in Wyoming territory. The Bulldogs proceeded to go on a 6-play, 47-yard drive that was capped with a three-yard touchdown pass from McMaryion to senior tight end David Tangipa to put Fresno State ahead 20-3.

The 'Dogs closed out the scoring for the night on its next offensive drive with a 6-play, 85-yard drive that was finished off with a six-yard touchdown run by McMaryion.

The third quarter was capped off with the 'Dogs forcing their only takeaway of the game as Mike Bell came up with an interception with 29 seconds remaining in the frame.

The Bulldogs had two drives in the final quarter for 71 yards, but were stopped on fourth down and forced to punt as neither side scored in the final quarter, marking the first time since the 'Dogs were at San Diego State in 2017, a span of 12 games, that saw no scoring in the final frame by either team.
