SATURDAY'S PREVIEW...

UNLV (2-2/0-0) looks to win its first three home games for the first time since 2000 when it opens Mountain West play by hosting **New Mexico (2-2/0-0)** in what is the league debut for both teams ... The Rebels are coming off a bye while the Lobos fell to Liberty at home, 52-33 ... UNLV is 13-23 in conference openers, including 9-9 when they take place at home ... Rebel head coach **Tony Sanchez** is 3-0 in MW lid-lifters making him the first UNLV leader to win his first three ... With starter **Armani Rogers** out this week because of injury, it has now been 22 years since the same quarterback has started every game of a season for the Rebels (**Jon Denton** 1996) ... UNLV is the only team in college football with two rushers in the nation's top 25: QB **Armani Rogers** is ninth with 122.0 YPG while RB **Lexington Thomas** is 14th with 116.3 YPG and is in third place on the school's career rushing yards list with 2,953 ... #LightningLex, who needs 197 more yards to move past two-time All-American **Mike Thomas** into second place on UNLV's career rushing list, has run for at least 100 yards in three of four outings this fall and is within one such game of tying **Tim Cornett** (16 in 2011-14) for second on the school's all-time list ... As a team, UNLV sits third in the nation with 336.5 yards per game rushing behind only option-based attacks Navy and Georgia Tech ... Under new coordinator **Tim Skipper**, UNLV's defense has already equaled its QB sack total from a year ago with 11 in four games.

REBELS vs. LOBOS NOTES...

UNLV's thrilling 38-35 victory in the meeting last fall gave the Rebels a 12-11 lead in the all-time series ... UNLV has taken six of the last eight vs. UNM, including three of the last four at home ... The Lobos, however, won the most recent Las Vegas meeting, 31-28, in 2014 ... UNM has passed for exactly five combined yards in the last two meetings with UNLV, including zero last fall in Albuquerque ... Eight of the last 13 games played between the two programs have been decided by 7 points or less ... These schools played five straight seasons (1978-82) when UNLV first thought itself headed to the Western Athletic Conference ... Ironically, the teams never met while both actually were members of the WAC (1996-98) ... While four UNLV staffers coached or played at New Mexico State (HC **Tony Sanchez**, director of strength & conditioning **Sean Manuel**, DL coach **Tony Samuel** and OC **Barney Cotton**), the only current member of the staff who coached at UNM is first-year safeties coach **Al Simmons**, who spent 2015-17 with the Lobos.

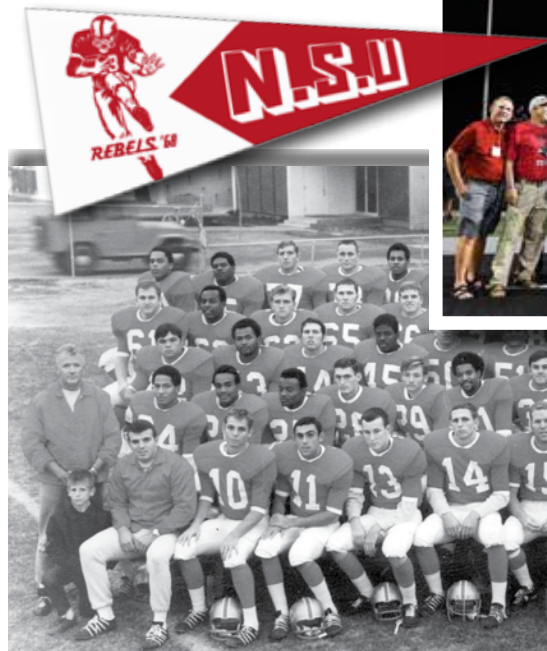

HAPPY 50TH, NSU REBELS!

UNLV honored the 50th anniversary of its first football team at the home opener vs. UTEP. That 1968 squad of Rebels was still a year away from being known as UNLV -- as it played a lone season under the name Nevada Southern University. NSU -- led by original coach **Bill Ireland** -- played its home games at old Cashman Field and enjoyed stunning success for a fledgling college squad, winning its first eight games, including a 69-0 pasting of Cal Tech, before falling by four points in the season finale to Cal Lutheran. The team was part of the inaugural class inducted into the UNLV Athletics Hall of Fame in 1987.

With two centers banged up, UNLV started redshirt freshman **Jackson Reynolds** vs. Prairie View A&M and the walk-on played every offensive snap. Reynolds, a graduate of Foothill High School in Henderson, NV, is the son of former Rebel offensive lineman **Jerry Reynolds**. After walking on to the program himself, the elder Reynolds lettered from 1990-93 and was taken in the sixth round of the 1994 NFL Draft before playing three years with the New York Giants. Another new Rebel, Arizona State transfer **Alex Perry**, is the son of former UNLV safety **Archie Perry**, who played the 1991 season alongside Jerry Reynolds.

REBS SET TO RECEIVE MAX EFFORT



With quarterback Armani Rogers sidelined by an injury, fellow-sophomore Max Gilliam is scheduled to make his first D-I start Saturday vs. New Mexico. A former Cal signee, Gilliam (pronounced GILL-um) left the Golden Bears for Saddleback College for the 2017 season and led the Gauchos to a 7-3 record. He signed at midyear with the Rebels and took part in spring practice with his new team. Gilliam has appeared in three games this fall and completed his lone pass attempt vs. UTEP. When he takes the first snap vs. the Lobos, he will become the sixth different Rebel to start behind center during the Tony Sanchez era. When Rogers took the first snap in the first game of 2017, he became the 11th different quarterback in the last 14 years to start a UNLV season opener.

HEAD COACH @UNLVSANCHEZ

Tony Sanchez, who built a national powerhouse at Las Vegas' Bishop Gorman High School, is now well on his way to creating another consistent winner in town as the 11th head coach in UNLV football history.

Named to the job on Dec. 11, 2014, Sanchez in 2015 became the first Rebel coach to win at least three times in his first season since Hall of Famer John Robinson in 1999. Sanchez also became only the third UNLV coach to win the fabled Fremont Cannon by defeating in-state rival Nevada, Reno in his debut campaign and the first to do it on the road. Under the new staff, the Rebels also became competitive on a near-weekly basis, either leading or trailing by just a touchdown during the fourth quarter in nine of their 12 games.

The improvement continued in 2016 when UNLV won four games and again in 2017 with five victories. That marked the first time in program history the Rebels won more games than the previous season for three straight years -- and impressive streak that is currently matched by just two other FBS programs.

Enjoying the encouraging early results, UNLV recently rewarded Sanchez with a contract extension that will take him through at least the 2021 season. Sanchez, who turned 44 in January, became a rising star in coaching circles after spending the previous six seasons leading Bishop Gorman to an overall record of 85-5 and six consecutive state 4A championships to go with a top-25 national ranking each year. His 2014 top-ranked Gaels squad finished 15-0 and won the mythical national championship.

Sanchez was well decorated for his efforts in his final season with the Gaels, being named USA TODAY's All-USA Coach of the Year as well as the U.S. Army All-American Bowl National Coach of the Year and the Rawlings National High School Coach of the Year. His overall record as a head coach was 120-26 after having also spent five seasons leading California High School in San Ramon, California, before coming to Southern Nevada. He also was part of staffs at Onate High School in Las Cruces, NM, and Irvin High School in El Paso, TX.

The winning head coach at the 2014 All-American Bowl in San Antonio, Sanchez saw 41 of his players earn collegiate football scholarships during his time in Las Vegas, including 31 to FBS programs. Now he has attracted national attention as only the fifth man in the modern era of college football to go from the high school level directly to the position of head coach of an FBS team.

Sanchez's first major statement as the leader of the Rebels was to quickly attract a top-notch, experienced staff. Dividends from the impressive list of assistants joining Sanchez began immediately as just over a month later, the group secured a recruiting class that was ranked in the upper half of the Mountain West Conference by multiple national outlets. One year later, the Rebels' class was one of the program's best ever as it included a school-record 10 three-star signees. His most recent class was ranked fourth in the 12-team MW.

One of the youngest head coaches on the FBS level, Sanchez is a 1992 graduate of Granada High School in Livermore, CA. A decorated two-way player, he went on to become a standout receiver at Laney College in Oakland before transferring to New Mexico State. He would letter two seasons for the Aggies and finish his senior campaign with 42 receptions for 546 yards, including grabbing five passes for 80 yards at Sam Boyd Stadium when he played against UNLV on Nov. 18, 1995. His first taste of coaching came the next season when he served as an undergraduate assistant at his alma mater.

The son of a career policeman in the Oakland area, Sanchez was born Jan. 25, 1974, at Travis Air Force Base in California while his father was serving in the military. He earned a bachelor's degree in family and consumer science from NMSU in 1998 and then his master's in special education in 2003. He and his wife, Tessie, have two children: daughter, Alyssa, and son, Jason.

QB1(HUNDRED)

While there have only been 16 games in history that saw a UNLV quarterback rush for at least 100 net yards EIGHT of those have happened since the start of the 2016 season. That list includes five from **Armani Rogers** -- highlighted by a school-record 193-yard effort in a win at New Mexico in 2017. Rogers' 103-yard night vs. UTEP meant he joined **Jason Thomas** as the only Rebel signal-caller to reach the mark three times in a career and then his 122 vs. PVAMU gave him the school record. He made it three straight this fall with 181 yards at Arkansas State.

ROGERS' RECORD PUSH ON PAUSE

Armani Rogers already has the UNLV record for yards rushing by a quarterback for a single game (former record 165 by **Hunkie Cooper** in 1991) with his 193 at New Mexico in 2017 and for a season with his 780 (former record 599 by **Jason Thomas** in 2000). Even after suffering an injury at midseason that cost him nearly three full games in 2017 and now missing this week's game, Rogers already stands second on UNLV's career rushing yards by a QB and figures to soon challenge Thomas' school record of 1,528 set in 2000-02.

SANCHEZ PART OF SELECT COACHING GROUP

UNLV's **Tony Sanchez** is just the fifth man in the modern era of college football to move directly from being a head coach at a high school to being head coach at a university that was part of what is now known as the FBS. Sanchez, of course, only had to move across the city after going 85-5 in six seasons while leading 2014 national champion Bishop Gorman High School in Las Vegas. **Jim Bradley**, who passed away in 2015, was the first to do it when he went across town to take over at NMSU.

Lexington "Lightning" Thomas didn't even start a game in 2015 but was so dynamic that he managed to tie the school freshman record for 100-yard rushing games in a season with three such outings. Thomas ranked ninth in the nation in 2015 with a per-carry average of 6.24 among all freshmen with at least 500 net rushing yards. In his sophomore season, Thomas added 642 more yards and led the squad with 11 total touchdowns (nine rushing). In the 2017 season opener, Thomas came off the bench again vs. Howard and went for 151 net yards en route to six century-mark games as a junior. In his senior season debut at No. 15 USC, Lex ripped off a 71-yard score as part of his 136-yard day in the Coliseum. His 127-yard night vs. UTEP in Game 2 and then a 124-yard effort vs. Prairie View A&M brought his current total to 15 in just 24 career starts. That puts him third on the school's career list for 100-yard games and just two away from tying a 44-year-old record set by **Mike Thomas**. "Lightning" scored at least two rushing TDs in six of the 12 games last season and now sits third in Rebel history with

33 career TDs with four more scores this fall. Lex has gone long as well. In fact, he had at least one run of 55 yards in six games in 2017 and one in 2018 after ripping off the fifth-longest run in program history in 2016 when went 85 yards at Central Michigan.

THE WATCH POWER

MAXWELL AWARD - QB ARMANI ROGERS

UNLV sophomore quarterback **Armani Rogers** was one of just 85 players in the nation named to the Maxwell Award Watch List, which was released by the Maxwell Football Club. The award is given to college football's top player at the end of each season. Oklahoma quarterback **Baker Mayfield** won last year's Maxwell Award. Rogers is one of five players from the Mountain West on this year's watch list and one of just 13 sophomores overall.



DOAK WALKER AWARD - RB LEXINGTON THOMAS



UNLV senior running back **Lexington "Lightning" Thomas** was one of 62 players named to the official Doak Walker Award Watch List. The award is presented annually to the nation's top college running back. Thomas, who is a unanimous choice for 2018 preseason first team All-Mountain West, needs 1,250 yards to pass Tim Cornett (3,733 from 2010-13) and become the school's career rushing king. Despite starting just 20 games as a collegian, he headed into the fall ranking third in UNLV history with 12 100-yard rushing games and needed six to break two-time All-American Mike Thomas' 44-year-old UNLV record of 17. The PwC SMU Athletic Forum Board of Directors will name 10 semifinalists in November, and three finalists will be announced November 20. The committee will cast a second vote beginning November 26 to determine the recipient.

LOU GROZA AWARD - PK EVAN PANTELS

UNLV senior **Evan Pantels** was one of just 30 players in the nation named to the 2018 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award Watch List, which was released by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission. Pantels headed into his final season as the team's starting kicker on field goals and extra points and is on target to threaten multiple UNLV career marks this fall. Going into his senior season, Pantels made a remarkable 100 of his 106 combined kick attempts (FGs and XPs) as a Rebel – hitting all 70 of his PATs – while his field-goal percentage of .833 tops the program's all-time list. In 2017, Pantels ranked first in the Mountain West and fourth nationally with 1.89 field goals per game, and second in the league and 21st in the country with 8.8 points per game.



POLYNESIAN COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD - OL JUSTIN POLU

UNLV junior offensive lineman **Justin Polu** was one of 50 players from around the nation named to the 2018 Watch List for the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award. The honor is presented annually to the most outstanding Polynesian college football player that epitomizes great ability and integrity. Polu (PO-lew) earned a spot on the list for the second straight year. An honors candidate as a returning starter, he is again listed No. 1 at right guard. Named 2018 Preseason Third Team All-MW by Phil Steele's and Fourth Team by Athlon, Polu started all 12 games and helped the Rebels rank 18th in the nation with 240.2 rushing yards per game.



EARL CAMPBELL TYLER ROSE AWARD - RB LEXINGTON THOMAS

For the third straight year, UNLV running back **Lexington Thomas** was named to the official watch list for the annual Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. The award honors the nation's top college football offensive player who was either born in Texas, graduated from a Texas high school or plays at a college located in the Lone Star State. The honoree must also exhibit the enduring characteristics that define the award's namesake -- former NFL running back great **Earl Campbell** (nicknamed the Tyler Rose) -- including integrity, performance, teamwork, sportsmanship, drive, community and tenacity. A 2015 graduate of Benjamin Davis High School in Houston, Thomas three times in 2017 earned an Earl Campbell Award Honorable Mention -- Sept. 12 after his 190-yard, three TD performance at Idaho; Oct. 3 following a 146-yard, two-TD effort vs. San Jose State; and Nov. 21 after going for 127 and two scores at New Mexico.

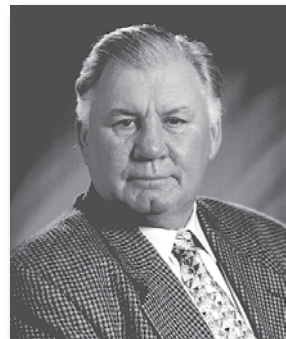
KALILI WEARING THE WIESNER JERSEY



Before UNLV's home-opening game vs. UTEP, senior cornerback **Jocquez Kalili** was recognized as this year's recipient of the Tom Wiesner Award (pronounced "WEEZE-ner). For the 17th consecutive year, coaches and seniors on the football team selected the player who best exemplifies the courage, enthusi-

asm, dedication and toughness of the late Mr. **Tom Wiesner**. Kalili, a Las Vegas native who originally walked on at Arizona

out of Desert Oasis High School, spent two years at Mesa Community College before joining the Rebels in 2017. Earning a scholarship for his final year at UNLV, Kalili had grabbed a starting spot at cornerback before suffering a season-ending injury last fall and is listed No. 1 at right corner heading into the season opener at USC. Kalili is the first CB to earn the Wiesner, which is designated with special stitching on the front of his jersey. A Wisconsin native and three-time letterman on the Badger football team, Mr. Wiesner sought his fortune out West and became one of the Las Vegas' leading businessmen, philanthropists, politicians and ambassadors. The founder of the successful restaurants that are part of Big Dog's Hospitality Group, Mr. Wiesner helped guide Rebel Athletics from their infancy and was inducted into the UNLV Athletics Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Contributor in 1994. Also a member of the Nevada Board of Regents, he died in 2002 at the age of 63 after a battle with Leukemia.

ONE-OF-A-KIND DESIGN

Sam Boyd Stadium underwent a \$1.2 million renovation on its field level in the summer of 2015 that included a new \$800,000 playing surface. Two rows of seats on both the West and East sides were eliminated to create a wider field and a new official stadium capacity for football of 35,500. The highlight of the project, however, was the installation of a new football field for the first time since 2003. The state-of-the-art, 100-percent Made in the USA, SPRINTURF synthetic surface features a shock pad for player safety. Given the advantages of a blank green canvas



with no sewn-in markings, UNLV head coach **Tony Sanchez** looked to go bold with the program's new field design and the Vegas-themed look made national news when the rendering was released. The world-famous "Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas" sign makes an appearance in the black end zones along with "REBELS" in red. Yardage numbers are displayed in a unique retro Las Vegas font and lay atop red and gray diamonds made famous in the iconic old Stardust hotel sign. The 50-yard-line markers are gray sunbursts taken from the top of the aforementioned Las Vegas sign. Finally, a gray strip borders the entire field. The entire design, including the Mountain West Conference logos and midfield UNLV primary logo, is painted by stadium personnel in the final weeks leading up to kickoff.





COMING IN 2019: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

UNLV Athletics announced the largest single gift in its history on Sept. 13, 2016, as the Fertitta Family pledged \$10 million toward the construction of a state-of-the-art football training facility, which will be known as the Fertitta Football Complex. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex is being built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park. Next year, the Fertitta Football Complex will become the day-to-day home of the program and include an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center and player lounge.

The **Fertitta Family** had the following statement: "We believe in the future of Rebel Football under Tony Sanchez's leadership and are proud to join others in the community in helping make this vital building block for the program become a reality."

A lead gift of \$2 million, which was previously the largest ever earmarked for UNLV Football and came from a donor who wished to remain anonymous, was announced in May 2016.

"As I've said since the day I was hired here, I am excited about the future of this program and its limitless potential," said head coach **Tony Sanchez**. "I want to thank the Fertittas for not just this amazing gift but also for everything they do in the community. I also want to thank everyone else who has stepped up with significant and important contributions as they help us turn Rebel Football into a national program."

REBELATIONS...

UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 17 years -- believed to be the longest drought in the nation. The last Rebel to do it was **Troy Mason**, who went 52 yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium ... Earlier this fall, UNLV defeated opponents by at least four touchdowns in back-to-back games (UTEP and Prairie View A&M) for the first time since elevating to NCAA Division I in 1978 and for the first time overall since 1975 when future NFL head coach **Ron Meyer's** squad beat Jackson State 39-2 and then Nebraska-Omaha 35-6 ... Against PVAMU, UNLV senior **Evan Pantels** saw his school-record streak of successful extra points snapped at 80 when his first attempt of the night hit the uprights. Pantels then missed a 24-yard field-goal attempt, which marked the first time he missed an attempt shorter than 39 yards in his collegiate career. Despite the miss, Pantels' field-goal percentage of .800 (32-40) still tops the program's all-time list ... Against UTEP, new UNLV punter **Hayes Hicken**, a graduate transfer from Utah, finished with a 56.2-yard average on five attempts. That mark ranked second on the Rebels' list for highest average in a game, trailing only College Football Hall of Famer **Randall Cunningham's** 58.0 average turned in vs. UNR in 1983. Hicken had another stellar night at Arkansas State with an average of 53.0 and currently stands fourth in the nation with an average of 47.8 ... UNLV senior DE **Roger Mann** is tied for third in the MW and 27th in the nation with 3.5 quarterback sacks. The former JC transfer came into the season with one sack as a Rebel ... Also leading the league and tying for 12th nationally is LB **Gabe McCoy** with his 7.5 tackles for loss. That total already is more than the team's leader in 2017 (DL **Mike Hughes** with 7.0) ... The Rebels got reacquainted with old foes this season during their non-conference schedule. UNLV opened the season with its second trip to the famed Coliseum to take on USC but first since 1997. The home slate featured their first meeting with UTEP since 1993, which is nothing compared to the time between games with the next week's opponent -- Prairie View A&M -- who last visited Las Vegas in 1974. The final non-conference game saw the Rebels travel to Jonesboro for the first time as the only previous meeting between UNLV and Arkansas State took place at Sam Boyd Stadium 23 years ago ... After **James Wofford's** 1997 school record for rushing yards in a season by a freshman (624) stood for two decades, the mark has been bested in back-to-back seasons. Rookie **Charles Williams** shattered it in 2016 with 763 yards only to see QB **Armani Rogers** put his name on top with 780 yards last fall ... UNLV has four current players (Rogers, Williams, **Lexington Thomas** and **Xzavier Campbell**) who have rushed for a combined 6,361 net yards in their careers. That hefty amount is even more impressive when you consider two of the four are in just their sophomore seasons in 2018 ... UNLV's coaching staff has five new faces this year, including four on defense. **Tim Skipper** came from Florida to take over defensive coordinator duties; veteran coach **Al Simmons** came over from New Mexico to lead the safeties; former Rebel player **Steve Irvin**, most recently at USD, is coaching the cornerbacks; while filling the new 10th assistant role is **Eric Brown**, who came from Idaho to direct UNLV's outside linebackers.

Garin Justice is the lone newbie on offense, taking over the offensive line after spending last season FAU ... Four players, two from each side of the ball, were voted UNLV football's permanent team captains for the 2018 season. After a vote by players, sophomore quarterback **Armani Rogers** (Los Angeles, CA/Hamilton HS) and senior running back **Lexington "Lightning" Thomas** (Houston/Davis HS) will represent the offense while junior linebacker **Gabe McCoy** (Pittsburg, CA/Pittsburg HS) and senior safety **Dalton Baker** (Las Vegas/Bishop Gorman HS) will lead the defense this fall. Rogers is one of only seven sophomore team captains in college football this season.

NO. 15 TROJANS PULL AWAY LATE

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - Playing at the famed LA Memorial Coliseum for only the second time, the UNLV football team opened its 51st season Saturday afternoon by giving No. 15/15 USC all it could handle before the Trojans pulled away with 24 points in the fourth quarter for a 43-21 victory.

Competing in sunny and humid conditions, UNLV got off to a miserable start, fumbling away the football on the very first play of the season. The Rebel defense responded, however, holding the Trojans to a subsequent field goal – the first of four three-pointers for the home team in the first half alone.

UNLV twice quieted the crowd by taking the lead before halftime, first when **Lexington Thomas** raced for a 71-yard touchdown on a fake reverse to make it 7-6; and then when **Armani Rogers** found **Kendal Keys** for a 31-yard scoring strike to make it 14-9. The Trojans eventually led by five at the break and, after a scoreless third quarter, outscored UNLV 24-7.

THE TURNING POINT: Leading 14-12, UNLV had all the momentum late in the second quarter while driving to the USC 20-yard line. That's when the Rebels missed a 39-yard field goal attempt and the Trojans responded with a 79-yard touchdown drive to take a 19-14 lead, which they never relinquished.

STAT OF THE GAME: USC kicker Chase McGrath made all five of his field goals and four extra points for 19 total points. The five three-pointers tied the record by a UNLV opponent (BYU's Owen Pochman in 1999).

REBEL OF THE GAME: Lightning struck at the Coliseum when **Lexington Thomas** ran for 136 yards on just 14 carries. It marked the senior's 13th career 100-yard effort, which ranks third in school history and moves him to within four of tying the Rebel record of 17 set by Mike Thomas in 1973-74.

REBEL NOTES

- UNLV outrushed USC 308 to 219 on the day.
- Lexington Thomas' 71-yard scoring scamper marked the ninth touchdown of 55 yards or longer by the senior, including seven in just the last 13 games.
- Quarterback Armani Rogers, who graduated from Los Angeles Hamilton High School, rushed for 82 net yards despite being sacked five times, and threw for two touchdowns despite finishing with just 97 yards through the air.
- UNLV PK Evan Pantels' 39-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter marked the first time the senior missed an attempt of 39 or shorter as a Rebel, having come in 23 of 23 under 40.
- The Rebels pulled off a fake punt to set up a touchdown in the second quarter when Evan Austrie ran for 36 yards and the first down.
- Senior captain safety Dalton Baker turned in 11 total tackles while junior cornerback Jericho Flowers finished with 10 to go with two pass breakups.
- Opening on the road vs. a ranked opponent for the first time since 2011, the Rebels fell to 5-40 all-time vs. ranked opponents and 4-16 vs. Pac-12 opponents who were in the league at the time of the game.

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (1-1) scored 24 second-quarter points to run away from visiting UTEP (0-2), 52-24, on a hot Saturday night at Sam Boyd Stadium.

winning the turnover battle 3-0. It marked the first time UNLV hosted a team that was a member of Conference USA at the time of the game.

Facing the Miners for the first time since 1993, the Rebels took their home opener by rushing for 414 yards and

The Rebels produced two 100-yard rushers as running back **Lexington Thomas** went for 127 and two scores and quarterback **Armani Rogers** totaled 103 and one touchdown on the ground. Rogers also threw three touchdowns – all to different receivers – as UNLV twice built its lead to 35 points.

THE TURNING POINT: With both teams driving up and down the field early, UNLV held the Miners to a field goal, which kept the Rebels ahead 14-10. That allowed UNLV to eventually build a 38-10 halftime advantage.

STAT OF THE GAME: Four different UNLV running backs finished with at least 70 yards on the ground and all of them posted per-rush averages of at least 6.7 yards.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Armani Rogers completed only six passes but three of those went for touchdowns. He also rushed for 103 yards on just 10 carries.

REBEL NOTES

- Game time temperature was 106 degrees at 6 pm PT.
- By making all seven of his extra points vs. UTEP, UNLV senior Evan Pantels broke the school record for consecutive PATs. The former record was 75 set by Kyle Watson in 2008-09. Pantels has now made all 80 his attempts.
- Pantels also made his one field-goal attempt (35 yards) to finish with 10 total points vs. the Miners.
- Sophomore quarterback Armani Rogers threw for three touchdowns in a game for the first time as a Rebel.
- Rogers finished with 103 net yards rushing on just 10 carries (including one TD). It marked his third 100-yard rushing game as a Rebel, which tied the school record by a quarterback (Jason Thomas had three from 2000-02).
- Senior Lexington Thomas posted his 14th 100-yard rushing game with 127 on 17 carries, including TD runs of 40 and four yards. He now sits just three scores away from tying Mike Thomas (1973-74) for the most in UNLV history.
- Thomas also moved up one spot on the career rushing yardage list. His total of 2,747 ranks fourth in school history.
- New UNLV punter Hayes Hicken finished with a 56.2-yard average on five attempts. The former Utah transfer is a junior graduate transfer.
- UNLV senior safety Dalton Baker finished with a game-high 14 total tackles.
- The Rebels' 414 yards rushing was the sixth most in school history and most since going for 517 vs. Idaho State in 2015.
- The 52 points scored by UNLV tied for the 18th most in school history and fourth most under head coach Tony Sanchez.

RUSHING REBELS WIN SECOND STRAIGHT

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (2-1) improved to 2-0 at home for the first time in a decade with a 46-17 victory over Prairie View A&M (1-3) Saturday night at Sam Boyd Stadium.

Sophomore Armani Rogers tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns and broke the UNLV mark

for 100-yard rushing games by a quarterback in a career with his fourth century-mark game as a Rebel. Senior running back Lexington Thomas had a game-high 124 yards rushing and a score. Senior end Roger Mann led the way on defense, notching a pair of sacks as part of his four-tackle night that also featured a forced fumble and recovery.

Facing the Panthers for the first time since 1974, UNLV led 20-0 after the first quarter and went into halftime leading 34-0 powered by three straight rushing scores by Rogers.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV boasted two 100-yard runners for the second consecutive week (Rogers with 122 and Thomas with 124) en route to out-rushing PVAMU 318-99.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Armani Rogers became the first Rebel to rush for four touchdowns in a game since 2013 and the fifth in history. He was the first quarterback to get four and also threw for another score.

- Thomas' one-yard rushing TD gave him 32 in his career, which put him six short of Mike Thomas' UNLV record of 37 set in 1973-74.
- When PVAMU kicked the ball out of the end zone after a bad snap late in the game, it marked UNLV's first safety since a game vs. Northern Illinois in 2014.
- UNLV senior Evan Pantels saw his school-record streak of successful extra points snapped at 80 when his first attempt of the night hit the uprights. Pantels then missed a 24-yard field-goal attempt, which marked the first time he missed an attempt shorter than 39 yards in his collegiate career.
