MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

2019 MW FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME SET

Boise State will host Hawai'i in the 2019 Mountain West Football Championship Game by virtue of having a higher Conference win percentage. Being played on Saturday, December 7, at Albertsons Stadium in Boise, Idaho, kickoff is set for 2 p.m. MT/11 a.m. HT and the game will be televised on ESPN for the fourth consecutive year.

Led by head coach **Bryan Harsin**, the Broncos (7-0 MW, 10-1 overall) clinched the Mountain Division last Saturday after defeating Utah State (56-21). Boise State is hosting the MW Football Championship Game for the third consecutive year and fourth time overall.

Under fourth-year head coach **Nick Rolovich**, the Rainbow Warriors (5-3 MW, 8-4 overall) are West Division Champions for the first time in program history. Hawai'i secured its spot in the championship contest after defeating San Diego State last Saturday evening (14-11) and holds the tiebreaker over both SDSU and Nevada, should the Wolf Pack win their final game of the regular season.

AUTONOMOUS FIVE WINS

In 2019, the Mountain West has picked up wins against opponents from the ACC (Florida State), Big Ten (Purdue), Pac-12 (Arizona, Colorado, Oregon State and UCLA) and SEC (Arkansas, Missouri and Vanderbilt).

The nine victories against autonomous five opponents are the most since 2008 (10), which is the league record for wins over A5 opponents.

In 2019, the Mountain West has the most nonconference autonomous five victories among all FBS conferences. A conference-by-conference breakdown is below:

More autonomous five notes below:

- Air Force, which went on the road and beat an undefeated Colorado team on Sept. 14, earned its first autonomous five victory since 2010.
- Boise State has defeated an autonomous five opponent in seven of nine seasons since joining the Mountain West. This season, the Broncos got a season-opening win at Florida State.
- Hawai'i, which defeated Arizona and Oregon State, won back-to-back autonomous 5 games for the first time since 2006-07.
- Nevada has defeated an autonomous five opponent in back-to-back years (Oregon State in 2018). The Wolf Pack's victory over Purdue (Aug. 30) is the first time a MW team beat an opponent from the Big Ten since 2010.
- San Diego State owns the highest win percentage nationally against the Pac-12 since 2016, compiling a 5-1 (.833) record.
- San José State defeated Arkansas (31-24) on Sept. 21, the Spartans' first autonomous 5 victory since 2006.
- UNLV went on the road and dismantled Vanderbilt 34-10 on Oct. 12, earning its first autonomous five victory since 2008 (Defeated Iowa State 34-31 on Sept. 20).
- Wyoming, which defeated Missouri on Aug. 31, earned its first A5 victory since Nov. 8, 2008 (Tennessee).

BOWL ELIGIBILITY

The Mountain West has seven bowl eligible teams for the first time since 2016. This is the fourth year in league history with at least seven bowl eligible teams.

On Oct. 12, Boise State became eligible for the postseason with a 59-37 victory over Hawai'i. The Broncos have been selected for a bowl in 17 consecutive years, a streak that is best among the nonautonomous five and is tied with Wisconsin for fifth-longest streak nationally.

On Oct. 19, San Diego State earned a road win over San José State, making the Aztecs bowl eligible for the 10th consecutive season.

On Oct. 26, Air Force and Wyoming both became bowl eligible. Air Force, which is eligible for the postseason for the first time since 2016, defeated Utah State, while Wyoming, which earned its fourth-consecutive postseason eligibility, knocked off Nevada.

Nevada earned bowl eligibility with a road win against nationally ranked San Diego State on Nov. 9. The Wolf Pack is bowl eligible for the second-consecutive season.

On Nov. 16, Hawai'i reached bowl eligibility for the second-consecutive season and third time under head coach **Nick Rolovich** with a road win at UNLV. Utah State's 26-21 victory over Wyoming gave the Aggies a postseason berth for the eighth time in nine seasons.

#HIGHLIGHTS

- The @MountainWest's nine nonconference autonomous 5 victories are the most nationally.
- .@BroncoSportsFB was ranked No. 20 in the Nov. 19 @CFBPlayoff rankings.
- Seven @MountainWest teams have either been nationally ranked or received votes in the Amway Coaches Poll in 2019, the most in Conference history.
- The @MountainWest has been nationally ranked in 17 of the last 21 CFP Rankings.
- In the past 15 years, the @MountainWest has been the top non-autonomous 5 conference nine times and second four times.
- In the 20 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant eight times.
- The @MountainWest has 29 nonconference victories this season, the secondmost all-time by the league. The Conference record is 30 (2014 & 2016).
- .@BroncoSportsFB has won at least 10 games in four consecutive seasons, the longest active streak among the nonautonomous 5.
- Since the @MountainWest created two divisions prior to the 2013 season, @USUFootball is the first team to win at perennial West Division powers Fresno State and San Diego State in the same season.
- .@GoAztecs' five victories over @pac12 opponents are the most for any nonautonomous 5 school against any autonomous 5 conference nationally.

CEMENTING NAME IN MW RECORD BOOK

- Boise State junior **Curtis Weaver** became the Mountain West's all-time sack leader on Oct. 5, recording three sacks against UNLV. Weaver enters Week 14 of the 2019 season with 34.0 career sacks, the most among active FBS defenders.
- In 2019, San José State QB Josh Love has recorded five 400-yard passing games, tied as the second-most in a single season in MW history. For his career, Love has six 400-yard passing performances, which is the second-most all-time.
- Utah State's Savon Scarver is tied for second in Conference history with five career kickoff return touchdowns, while San Diego State's Juwan Washington is tied for fourth with three. In 2019, Scarver is one of just eight FBS players with multiple kickoff return touchdowns.
- Utah State's **Dominik Eberle** has made 157 consecutive PATs, a Mountain West record. Additionally, on Nov. 16 Eberle became the Conference's all-time leader in career field goals (61).
- Wyoming's Austin Conway has returned 111 punts in his career, the most in league history. He also ranks fourth all-time with 931 career punt return yards.
- Wyoming linebacker Logan Wilson has 404 career tackles, the fourth-most by a Mountain West's defender all-time. Wilson's 404 tackles are the second-most among active FBS defenders.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

The Mountain West has sent at least six teams to the postseason in six consecutive years.

The MW, which has earned 96 bowl bids, including Boise State's 2018 appearance vs. Boston College, since 1999 and holds a 52-43 (.547) all-time record, owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games in the last 15 seasons among the 10 FBS conferences (.563), trailing only the SEC (.617).

FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

Host Determination: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

- 1. Head-to-head result between the tied divisional champions.
- 2. If still tied:
- If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking
 and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the
 host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the
 latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the
 regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings will be used;
- -OR-
- If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;
- -OR-
- If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;

-OR-

- If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.
- 3. If still tied, the best record against common Conference opponents.
- 4. If still tied, the team with the highest overall winning percentage (Conference and non-conference excluding exempt games).
- 5. If still tied, a coin toss will be conducted by the Commissioner.

The Mountain West has announced a new branding and marketing campaign for the conference to further define the MW's strong, energetic brand as it begins its 21st year as an NCAA Division I athletic conference.

The branding initiative has been in planning and development since February 2018. The Mountain West worked in partnership with Old Hat, a strategic marketing agency specializing in collegiate athletics, to develop a plan that would showcase the personality of the league.

Cradled among the most desirable locations in America, the Mountain West stretches to eight different states from the shores of the Pacific Coastline to the Rocky Mountains. The conference has long been known since its founding for its integrity and its commitment to the ideals of the student-athlete experience and the unique opportunities afforded to students at each institution.

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the Mountain West continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship.

Now in its 21st year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics. The Mountain West membership is comprised of 11 all-sport members: the United States Air Force Academy, Boise State University, Colorado State University, Fresno State, University of Nevada, University of New Mexico, San Diego State University, San José State University, UNLV, Utah State University and University of Wyoming. In addition, the University of Hawai'i and Colorado College participate in the Mountain West as single-sport members in football and women's soccer, respectively.
