#GoLobos at a Glance (#UNMvsUTSA)

The Game:

The University of New Mexico Lobos (8-4, 6-2 MW) will take on the UTSA Roadrunners (6-6, 5-3 CUSA) in the 2016 Gildan New Mexico Bowl. The Lobos will be making their fourth appearance in the game, the most of any team. UNM is 1-2 overall in the game, and it's UNM's second straight bowl game. UTSA is playing in its first bowl game as the program is in just its sixth year of existence.

The Coaches:

The University of New Mexico Lobos are coached by Bob Davie, who is 26-36 in his fifth season with the Lobos, and he is 61-61 overall in his 10th season. He spent his first five seasons as a head coach manning the Notre Dame Fighting Irish and this is his fifth bowl game as a head coach. For the Roadrunners, Frank Wilson is in his first season and this is UTSA's first bowl appearance. His record is 6-6 overall.

Series History:

The Lobos and the Roadrunners will meet for the third time, with each team winning on the other teams' home field. The first meeting was a 21-13 UTSA win in Albuquerque in 2013, and in 2014 the Lobos returned the favor with a 21-9 win over UTSA in the Alamodome.

Bob Davie Interview Opportunities

Coach Davie has several media availability times during the week. He is available after practices on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. He also meets with the local media on Tuesday at noon as part of UNM's weekly fall sports media luncheon (other fall sport coaches meet with the media at 11:30 a.m. prior to Davie speaking).

For South Dakota (Thursday game), the entire week is pushed backwards two days.
 For Boise State week (Friday game), the entire week is pushed backwards one day.

New Mexico Media Luncheon

The New Mexico Media Luncheons are Tuesdays from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Coach Davie is available at approximately noon. Audio and video clips from Davie are available at www.golobos.com. The press conferences are also streamed on GoLobos.com by LoboTV. Please note that the Mountain West no longer will conduct a football coaches teleconference. The luncheon is on the Zia II level of the West Pressbox.

New Mexico Player Interview Opportunities

All player interviews must be arranged through the UNM athletics communications office. The main time for interviews is after practice. Wednesday is the last day for player interviews, and Tuesday is the last day for quarterback interviews. For lengthier interviews, please call the communications office to arrange, which we are happy to do, working around class schedules. These will normally take place in the communications suite in the Maloof Center.

Postgame: The UNM locker room is closed. Requested players will be brought to an area to be determined after home games and outside the locker room for road games.

For road games, all interviews will be posted to UNM's Media Dropbox account, along with selected highlights. These are provided for your usage, but please credit LoboTV.

Fans can call 866-350-4309 to ask coach Davie a question. The Lobo Coaches Show will be on ROOT Sports. The show does move around a little due to non-Saturday games and Presidential debates.

Game Credentials

Regular UNM media will receive game credentials prior to the start of the season. For media members with season credentials, that pass also serves as a parking pass for the Baseball East or Baseball South lot across from the stadium.

Visiting team media should request single-game credentials through their team's media relations office. Parking passes for the Baseball East and media lots will be needed.

Media members not associated directly with a team can email requests to fmercog@unm.edu. Please have these Wednesday of game week (Tuesday for Friday night home games).

For media members picking up credentials at will call without parking passes, it is located in the Northeast corner of the stadium by Gate 7 or 8. For media members picking up with parking passes, credentials will be located at the University Drive entrance to the Baseball & Pit East lots with the parking attendant. This should allow you to get your credential without having to wait in line or deal with parking on the north side of the stadium.

Voting for the Wuerffel Trophy is performed by a National Selection Committee that includes college football television and print media, industry notables, former head coaches and prior Wuerffel Trophy recipients. The formal announcement of the 2016 Wuerffel Trophy recipient will be on Dec. 6, 2016, at the National Football Foundation's press conference in New York City.

While Adcock has ended his playing career due to injuries, it doesn't diminish his well documented service and academic feats. Soon to be a four-time Mountain West All-Academic selection, Adcock is a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-District selection. His voluntarism extends to the nation of Ghana, where he three times has traveled abroad to volunteer, including the building of the Christian Adcock & Sons Christian Hospital in Ateiku.

McQuarley Into Second

Richard "Rock" McQuarley's 16 rushing touchdowns have him second on the single season rushing touchdowns list. McQuarley is three rushing touchdowns away from tying DonTrell Moore for first on the all-time single season list and teammate Teriyon Gipson has 12 and is tied for 11th.

Get'em In Third Down and the Defense Does the Rest

During UNM's final seven-game stretch in which it went 6-1, there have been a number of great marks to look at, but maybe none better than UNM's third down defensive efficiency. Through the first five games of the season, UNM's opponents were converting 29 of 66 attempts, converting at 43.9%. Since then however, UNM has held it's opponents to just a measly 34.2% as opponents are a combined 27-for-79. Air Force was just 3-for-11, ULM 7-for-17, Hawai'i 2-for-13, Nevada 3-for-10, Utah State 4-for-11, Colorado State 1-for-4 and Wyoming 7-for-13. Conversely, over those seven games UNM is converting at a 50.6% mark, going 48-for-90, a mark of 53.3%.

Not Giving Things Away

For the season the Lobos have committed just 14 giveaways, six interceptions and eight fumbles lost, with just one coming over the last three games. Not turning the ball over has been a hallmark of the Bob Davie era, amazing for an option team. In three of Bob Davie's first four seasons at the helm of the Lobos have ranked in the top five in fewest giveaways. Currently this Lobo team with 14 giveaways would rank tied for second for fewest giveaways in a single-season, behind the 1996 team that suffered just 12 turnovers. Continuing to Roll in Mountain West play

Over its last 17 Mountain West games going back to 2014, the Lobos are 12-5 in conference play. This 12-5 mark is a winning percentage of .706, and the 12-5 record is tied for the best over that time frame in the Mountain Division, a division that this year was rated higher than the SEC East. So, how much progress have the Lobos made under Bob Davie? There might be no better single stat than this... New Mexico has won 12 conference games in the last 17. To get to the previous 11 conference wins, you would have to go back 60 games as UNM was 12-49, which is a winning percentage of .197, and it's also back into the presidency of George Bush.

TnT Explodes for 1,000 Yards Each

For the first time in school history, UNM has two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season. Tyrone Owens became the 19th Lobo to hit the 1,000-yard mark against Colorado State, and teammate Teriyon Gipson eclipsed the mark against Wyoming and sits at 1,209 for the season. Of the previous 18 times that UNM has ever had a 1,000-yard rusher, it has happened over 18 different seasons. The Gildan New Mexico Bowl will see two 1,000-yard rushers for UNM on the field at the same time for the first time in school history.

Sanders Continues Amazing Season, Despite Lack of Groza Accolades

Jason Sanders, who missed out on the Groza Finalist list because he didn't kick enough field goals over the first eight games of the season, is a two-time Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week award winner. Sanders this week went 8-for-8 on extra points. He now is 11-for-12 on field goals and 59-for-59 on extra points. Combining kicks he is 70-of-71, and of players that have attempted 55 combined kicks, that 98.6% mark is the best in the FBS.

Just Call Him Mr. Touchback

Jason Sanders had seven touchbacks on nine kickoffs. Sanders is currently the national leader in touchback percentage as the Lobo junior has hit 67 of his 80 kickoffs for touchbacks, a mark of 83.8%. He is also second in the country in total touchbacks with his 67 (Virginia Tech's Joel Slye has one more at 68, on seven more kickoffs).

C-Note

Jason Sanders hit all eight of his extra points he attempted on Saturday, running his streak to 81 in a row. He is now in first place on the UNM consecutive PAT chart, surpassing Justus Adams, who hit 76 in a row over the 2012 and 2013 seasons.

Counting his streak with former kicker Zack Rogers, who hit 32, UNM has a current streak of 113 consecutive extra points made dating back to November 22, 2014. Sanders also is the UNM single-season record holder for most PATs in a season.

Also, UNM, a team that runs the ball, was the only one in the nation with three pass plays of 80 yards or more (and those all came in the last five games). Things That Didn't Exist...

The win over ULM gave Bob Davie at least two non-conference wins in each of his first five seasons at the helm of the Lobos. Amazingly, he is just the second Lobo coach to ever accomplish that feat. The only other Lobo coach to ever win at least two non-conference matchups in the same season was Ted Shipkey, who did it from 1937-41. Here are a few things that did not exist the last time a Lobo coach won at least two non-conference games in his first five seasons:

World War I (World War II hadn't started yet, so World War I was referred to as the Great War.)

Daylight Savings Time (started in 1942)

Anne Frank's Diary (she started writing it on her 13th birthday in 1942)

Stephen Hawking (he was born in 1942)

Color Film (Eastman Kodak invented it in 1942)

Chemotherapy (This was first tested in 1942 by Alfred Gilman, Louis S. Goodman and Frederick S. Philips)

Bob Davie is in his fifth season at The University of New Mexico, where he has led the program back-to-back bowls and a level of national respect. The Lobos under Davie have now won 11 of their last 14 regular season home games and have set a school record with 11 conference wins over the last two seasons. Last year UNM qualified for the 2015 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, the first bowl game for the Lobos since 2007.

Davie's 26 wins in his first five seasons already has him seventh on the career wins list at UNM, and he has helped the program achieve levels not seen in Albuquerque for many years. Yet it's how he has been able to do it that is what has Lobo fans excited for the program.

Davie has completely flipped and turned his rosters over, combining an energetic mix of talent from Texas and California while averaging nearly 25 native New Mexican players per season on the roster, with many of those major contributors.

After a big season in 2015 which saw UNM go 7-5 and tie for second place in the Mountain Division of the Mountain West, his team not only met that mark but surpassed it in 2016 as New Mexico went 8-4 overall and 6-2 in the Mountain Division, tying for first place and delivering UNM's first division title since 1997. The Lobos defeated three 2016 bowl teams in Air Force (45-40), Hawai'i (28-21) and Wyoming (56-35), giving the program six wins over bowl teams in the last two years after going seven straight seasons without a win over a bowl team. The 2016 Lobos feature the nation's best rushing attack, as UNM leads the nation in rushing yards, yards per game, yards per rush, and runs of 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60 and 70 yards. The 2016 squad has also set school records for total points scored, points per game, and it should surpass the school record for total offensive yards, needing fewer than 100.

The Lobos also tied for the most conference wins in a single season, going 6-2, a mark that was also accomplished in 1982 and 1997. In addition, the Lobos have excelled on national television, winning four games on ESPN's various networks, including a pair of games in November on ESPN2 with a 24-21 win at Utah State and 56-35 over Wyoming, a game in which UNM totaled 690 yards of total offense and 568 yards on the ground.

Defensively, UNM showed vast improvement in its rushing defense, going from 98th nationally to top 40. Dakota Cox led the team in tackles, marking the first time that a Lobo has ever led the team in tackles four straight seasons. Once again, New Mexico got three defensive scores, making UNM one of eight teams in the last two years to register three defensive touchdowns in 2015 and 2016. UNM's defense also had a stretch in 2016 where it allowed 350 yards or less in three straight game, the first time since 2007 it accomplished that feat. The Lobos had eight players earn All-MW honors, including four on the second team.

Last season was the start of UNM's resurgence under Davie, going 7-5 in the regular season and 5-3 in the Mountain West, good for second place in the Mountain West's Mountain Division and a berth in the 2015 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, which UNM fought down to the wire in a 45-37 loss to Arizona. UNM picked up four All-Mountain West honors, including a Second Team selection as a returner for Carlos Wiggins. The Lobos also picked up 19 Mountain West All-Academic honors, the second-highest total in program history.

An overall hallmark of the program under Davie has been special teams, as UNM's nine touchdowns on kickoff returns over his first five seasons are tied with Kansas State for the most in the FBS over that time frame.

And the success and improvement isn't just on the field ... it's off it. Under Davie, the Lobos have picked up 69 Mountain West All-Academic selections, including a program record 20 in 2014, and 19 in 2015, the second-best total for football in school history. UNM also had five Mountain West Scholar-Athletes in 2013, the second-best total among the MW's 12 football programs. In 2016, Garrett Adcock was UNM's first CoSIDA Academic All-American in eight years, earning first team honors.

Over his time, the Lobos have posted the second-highest single semester GPA in program history (Spring of 2016) and two of the top three Fall semester GPAs in program history (Fall of 2013 and Fall of 2015).

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — The University of New Mexico Lobos scored 31 unanswered points to wrestle away a quick lead by South Dakota, taking down the Coyotes 48-21 in the season opener for both teams. UNM's offense rolled up 615 yards, the 15th-best total in school history.

If the opening play is any indication of how a season will go, it's going to be explosive. Teriyon Gipson took the opening handoff and raced 75 yards for a touchdown just 12 seconds into the contest. South Dakota did have an answer, as they went 75 yards in five plays, and then after a fumble, USD went 90 yards in nine plays to make it 14-7 9:10 into the game.

To that point, the Coyotes had 165 yards of offense, but UNM's veteran defense took charge after that, limiting the USD squad to just 158 the rest of the game, 75 of which came on the only scoring drive of the final three quarters for the Coyotes.

UNM was led by starting quarterback Austin Apodaca, who was nothing short of brilliant, rushing 41 yards on seven carries and going 12-for-16 through the air for 172 yards and two touchdowns. Both of those TDs were on brilliant catches. The first was over the middle by Matt Quarells, who caught a pass with a defender draped all over him and broke away for a 62-yard score. The second was at the end of a perfect two-minute drill as Apodaca hit Q' Drennan near the five yard line, leaping for the grab and then spinning into the end zone for his first career catch.

That made it 35-14 at the break and it was pretty much over from there as USD never really threatened.

Gipson, who scored on that opening 75-yard run, went 84 on his next touch to make it 14-14 just 59 seconds after USD went up 14-7. Quarells' catch gave UNM its lead for good, and then Richard McQuarley scored the first of his two touchdowns.

In the second half, Jason Sanders hit a pair of field goals sandwiched around USD's lone touchdown, but with the game at 41-21, McQuarley scored on a bruising 14-yard run through the middle for the final score of the game.

However, while the offense was rolling, the defense did as well over the final three quarters. Dakota Cox, who is looking to become the first player to lead the team in tackles all four seasons, got off to the right start with 14 tackles, 2.0 for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and an interception. Both turnovers he had a hand in turned into second half scores.

Overall, the Lobos recorded three sacks and six tackles for loss along with forcing three turnovers. After allowing two touchdowns on the first two drives, UNM forced five punts, two turnovers, a turnover on downs and two end of halves, getting 10 stops on the final 11 possessions, only two of which saw the Coyotes gain more than 20 yards.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. --- The New Mexico Lobos led for almost the entire game. They didn't have the lead when it counted though...the end. New Mexico State took advantage of a short field and scored on an 8-yard pass with 5:46 to go, and UNM's fourth and 15 try fell three yards short as New Mexico State won the Rio Grande Rivalry for the first time since 2011 with a 32-31 victory in front of 17,852.

After two straight seasons in which UNM needed second half comebacks in order to win, it was NMSU's turn to pull the same trick. The Lobos took the opening kickoff and marched right down the field without an issue, going 75 yards in eight plays with Teriyon Gipson barreling over from 12-yards out just 4:35 into the game. UNM would then lead for the next 49:44, but the Lobos never could put away NMSU, and that would prove costly.

The Lobos took a 31-22 lead with 14:04 remaining when on a fourth-and-goal play, quarterback Austin Apodaca fakes a handoff to Richard McQuarley, and pitched to Gipson who walked into the end zone.

New Mexico State drove to the UNM 28, but back-to-back sacks moved the Aggies out of field goal range at the 37, facing third and 19. Tyler Rogers however converted, hitting a 26-yard pass, setting up Parker Davidson's fourth field goal of the game to make it 31-25 with 10:12 to go.

The killer for the Lobos came on the next drive. Facing third and five, Apodaca threw behind his intended receiver, and instead of a first down, NMSU's Terrill Hanks picked it off, giving the Aggies life at the Lobo 27.

On third and 2 from the 8-yard line, Rogers hit Gregory Hogan for a touchdown, and Davidson, who missed an earlier extra point, hit this one for NMSU's only lead at 32-31.

UNM wasn't done. Starting from their 30, the Lobos got a key fourth down conversion to Chris Davis, Jr. to the NMSU 45, and with just over two minutes left, it looked like one more first down would give kicker Jason Sanders a shot at being a hero.

That shot never came.

A pass to Patrick Reed was incomplete, and then NMSU's only sack of the game made it third and 15. After another incompleting, UNM was left facing a fourth-and-15. Apodaca hit Gipson underneath for 12, falling three yards short, although a UNM penalty would have negated the gain. From there the Aggie ran off the final 1:28 for the win.

It looked early like NMSU would never stop UNM. After the opening 75-yard drive for UNM was answered with a field goal, the Lobos drove 80 yards, with Apodaca keeping and scoring from 23 yards out for his second career touchdown. From there, UNM's offense dried up in the first half, mustering only a field goal with 28 seconds left to lead 17-9.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. --- Rutgers scored 31 straight points, and despite UNM's defense limiting the Scarlet Knights to just 350 yards, the Lobos dropped a 37-28 decision in Piscataway in a game in which three long Rutgers touchdowns basically amounted to their offense.

The Lobos defensively allowed just 88 yards in the second half, but The Scarlet Knights took advantage of two short fields, getting fourth quarter field goals on drives that started at the UNM 35 and the UNM 16. UNM might have lost more than just the game as starting quarterback Austin Apodaca suffered an injury to his throwing shoulder late in the game on a sack.

Down 31-21 in the fourth, the Lobos made a game of it, converting a fourth down on the way to a touchdown as Richard McQuarley bolted in from 22 yards out to make it 31-28 with 12:06 to go. UNM went for the surprise onside kick, but Rutgers recovered at midfield, setting up a field position battle that eventually led to a field goal.

Needing nine points, UNM went for a late field goal, but it was missed, allowing Rutgers to take a knee and end the game.

Overall, UNM's defense allowed 350 yards, 155 on two long scoring plays, and then just 195 on the other 60 plays. Offensively, the Lobos rolled for 462 yards on 80 plays and holding the ball for over 38 minutes.

Everything went UNM's way early. Corey Bojorquez' first punt went 50 yards and was fumbled by Janarion Grant, with Bijon Parker recovering at the Rutgers 19-yard line. Daryl Chestnut scored on the next play to make it 7-0. After a drive that ended on fourth-and-one at the 20, UNM got on the board again when Apodaca had time and hit Patrick Reed for a 36-yard score.

Right before the quarter ended, Lamar Jordan somehow escaped a tackle and raced 52 yards for a touchdown and with 13 seconds left in the first quarter, UNM led 21-0. However, Rutgers got the first of three long scoring plays on a 75-yard pass from Chris Lovianoto to Jawuan Harris with three seconds left in the quarter.

The next drive saw some trickery as Grant, a receiver, threw a TD pass to make it 21-14, and then on the next offensive play, Robert Martin raced up the middle 80 yards to tie the game up. Rutgers took the lead with 1:04 left in the half when Grant made up for his earlier mistake on the fumbled punt with a 69-yard punt return for a touchdown, his eighth return for a TD in his career on either punts or kickoffs. That made it 28-21, although UNM had a shot to put point up at the end of the half, but Apodaca was intercepted on a deep ball at the three-yard line.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- New Mexico scored on the second play of the game, and never trailed after that, gouging San José State for 446 yards on the ground as the Lobos improved to 1-0 in Mountain West play at 2-2 overall with a 48-41 victory over the Spartans in front of a Homecoming crowd of 19,852 at University Stadium.

It took just two plays, 75 yards on the ground and 55 seconds for UNM to take the lead for good. Teriyon Gipson went for the first 61 yards, and Tyrone Owens finished the drive with 14 more and quickly it was a 7-0 lead and a harbinger of things to come. Both Gipson and Owens rushed for 100 yards, Gipson's fourth 100-yard rushing game of his career, and Owens' first.

UNM got a quick three-and-out and went right down the field again, with Gipson scoring from 40 yards out to make it 14-0. San Jose State responded with two touchdowns, a 75-yard jaunt by Zamore Zigler and a 21-yard end around by Tim Crawley, but the second extra point was blocked by Nik D'Avanzo, keeping UNM in the lead 14-13.

The teams traded touchdowns in the second quarter, UNM with the first of Richard McQuarley's three rushing scores and San José State with a Crawley 65 reception, but UNM would score the next 20 points.

Up 21-20, McQuarley scored again from a yard out, and then after a missed SJSU field goal, Jason Sanders ended the half with a career-long 45 yarder to give UNM a 31-20 lead.

Sanders added a field goal on UNM's first drive of the third quarter, and then the defense got a big play when Austin Ocasio, who had just checked in at linebacker, dropped into coverage and picked off Kenny Potter and zig-zagged his way to a 37-yard touchdown, and UNM led 41-20 after three.

San José State however wasn't done. Deontae Cooper scored on a short run, and then after an interception, he scored on a 45-yard screen pass to cut the lead to 41-34 with 9:27 left. However, UNM's defense forced three-and-outs on the next two Spartan drives, and UNM then put together a drive to salt the game away, going 79 yards in six plays, with McQuarley scoring on third down for a 48-34 lead with 2:54 left.

San José State got a late touchdown with 31 seconds left, but the ensuing onside kick went out of bounds, allowing UNM to take one knee and end the game.

The Lobos racked up 491 yards of offense, including 446 on the ground. UNM also dominated time of possession, holding the ball for 37:07. Defensively UNM allowed 41 points, but held San José State to just 2-for-9 on third down, and scored on an interception. UNM also forced six three-and-outs in the game, including two after the Spartans closed to within 41-34 in the fourth quarter.

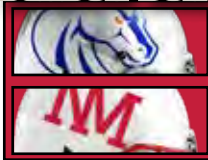

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Boise State exacted a measure of revenge against New Mexico as Brett Rypien looked every bit the part of a first team all-conference quarterback, going 21-for-28 for 391 yards and five touchdowns in first half as the No. 19 Broncos defeated the Lobos 49-21.

The loss dropped the Lobos to 2-3 overall and 1-1 in the Mountain West, with a date with Air Force in the Cotton Bowl on tap next Saturday at 1:30 p.m. Mountain Time in a game on ESPN News.

Both teams went 3-and-out on their opening possessions, but BSU went on top 7-0 after an 81-yard drive aided by two 15-yard face mask penalties on UNM and a dropped interception. The drive ended with the first of five touchdowns from Rypien as he hit Cedrick Wilson on a fade in the end zone. Those penalties would be a theme throughout the evening as UNM was whistled for a season-high 12.

The Lobos were able to tie the game on its next drive as after Lamar Jordan rushed three times, converting on third down, he handed the ball to Tyrone Owens, who raced up the gut untouched for a 62-yard touchdown, tying the game at 7-7, but that was the last time it would be tied.

BSU would score touchdowns on its next five drives of the half, pushing the lead to 42-7 at the half. BSU would score on its opening second half possession before UNM finally was able to answer in the fourth quarter. Most of those touchdowns were from the arm of Rypien, who threw touchdown passes of 7, 53, 54, 8 and 35 yards, two to Thomas Sperbeck and three to Wilson.

The Lobos finally ended the run of points when Jujuan Lawson, who entered at the start of the fourth quarter, led the Lobos on a 14-play, 82-yard drive as he rushed over for a touchdown on fourth down. UNM added one last score with 20 seconds left when Lamar Jordan came in and hit Anu Somoye for a 12-yard score, Somoye's first career touchdown.

New Mexico, which won the turnover battle in last year's game 4-2, threw an interception to end the first half and didn't force a turnover in the game.

The Lobos did keep up the good work on the ground, rushing for 382 yards on 61 carries, and limiting Boise State to just 65 yards on the ground on 29 carries. However, the air was a different story as Boise State went 21-for-30 for 391 yards, while UNM was just 4-for-15 for 39 yards.

Jordan led the way with 139 yards, Tyrone Owens added 82 and Jujuan Lawson had 62.

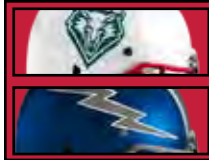

DALLAS, Texas --- In a game in which the offenses were the stars and main attraction, it was UNM's defense that came up huge time and again in the fourth quarter when it needed it. The Lobos, holding onto a 45-40 lead, twice made fourth down stops in the final three minutes, and the offense ran for 373 yards as New Mexico evened its record at 3-3 with a 45-40 win over Air Force, a team receiving votes in the national poll.

The Lobos also improved to 2-1 in the Mountain West, and have now won seven conference games in the last two seasons.

Up 35-27 at the break, the Lobo defense forced an immediate three-and-out to open the half, and Lamar Jordan and company went 80 yards in nine plays, with Richard McQuarley scoring UNM's third 1-yard TD of the game, making it 42-27. Air Force answered with a 20-yard touchdown pass on third-and-16, making it 42-34. The Lobos then got a key score late in the third when after the offense stalled, Jason Sanders bombed a 49-yard field goal that easily had another 15 yards on it. That career-long kick made it 45-34, and kept the game at two scores.

From there the defenses took over. The Lobos forced a punt after a first down, but UNM's offense stalled as Lamar Jordan went out with a hamstring issue, forcing Austin Apodaca into the game for the first time since injuring his collar bone at Rutgers. The Lobo offense would go four straight drives without a first down, forcing UNM's defense to have to answer.

Answer they did.

On the next drive the Lobos forced a three-and-out after one of Nik D'Avanzo's 2.5 tackles for a loss. After another punt, the Lobos finally allowed a score as Air Force went 54 yards in seven plays, cutting the lead to 45-40. The two-point conversion pass was knocked away, keeping it a five-point margin.

Air Force got the ball back with 3:45 to go at its own 37, but the Falcons lost one yard on the drive, with three straight incompletions giving UNM the ball at the Air Force 36. UNM couldn't get the first down it needed and punted to the 12-yard line, and Air Force with 1:54 left had one last shot.

After a holding penalty and a short completion, Air Force's Nate Romine somehow flipped an underhanded toss to Tim McVey for a 20-yard gain to the Air Force 40 with just over a minute to go, but the defense forced four straight incompletions with breakups by Lee Crosby and Dakota Cox. UNM then took two kneel downs to end the game.

It looked like there were going to be fireworks in the daytime of the Texas State Fair, as the Cotton Bowl turf saw plenty of offense to the tune of 974 combined yards. UNM scored a season-high 35 points in the first half as Lamar Jordan and the offense had the option working.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- In an amazing coincidence that defies statistics, the Lobos lost the opening coin toss for the seventh time in seven games this year. That was about the only thing that didn't go UNM's way on this night.

The Lobos picked off a pass and scored on the third play of the game and the squad got eight touchdowns from eight different players as New Mexico rolled to 622 yards of offense and an easy 59-17 win over ULM. The win pushed UNM to 4-3 on the season and dropped ULM to 2-5, and it sets up a big game on Saturday night in Honolulu against Hawai'i, a 34-27 double-overtime winner over Air Force on Saturday.

The 622 yards for UNM marked the second time this season that the team eclipsed the 600-yard mark, and the third time under Bob Davie. It tied for the 11th-most yards in school history, equaling the amount UNM picked up against Utah in 1971. It was the most yards since getting 633 against Utah in 2003.

ULM had the opening possession, and on third-and-1, Will Collins, a freshman making his first career start, was picked off by Jadon Boatright right at the 40-yard line. Boatright raced in from there with a touchdown on his first career interception. UNM then forced a three and out and UNM wasted little time making it 14-0 as Richard McQuarley scored to cap a four-play, 72-yard drive, and the rout was on.

UNM would score two more times in the quarter, on a 6-yard Teriyon Gipson run and an 83-yard run by Tyrone Owens, the fifth-longest run in school history, to give UNM a commanding 28-0 lead after one quarter, and it was basically on cruise control from there. Even when things didn't go right, they sort of went right.

After a 10-yard catch with 12 second left in the half for a touchdown to make it 34-3, UNM picked up a 15-yard penalty and then a 10-yard penalty, making the extra point the equivalent of a 45-yard field goal. Didn't matter to Jason Sanders, who went 8-for-8 on PATs, hit a 36-yard field goal and 10 touchbacks on 10 kickoffs.

Up 35-3 at the break, UNM received the opening kickoff for the second half, and Elijah Lilly made ULM pay, taking the kick at the 7-yard line, racing around the left side, breaking a tackle and scampering in for a 93-yard touchdown. The reigning Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week, Lilly extended UNM's streak to seven straight years with a kickoff return touchdown.

UNM took the lead all the way up to 52-3 after a Diquon Woodhouse touchdown and Sanders' field goal before ULM scored two fourth quarter touchdowns within a minute of each other on a 1-yard run and then a 30-yard pass after a fumble, UNM's third lost fumble of the game.

Daryl Chestnut capped the scoring with a 4-yard touchdown run.

Overall, UNM rushed for 476 yards on 51 carries, and Lamar Jordan and JuJuan Lawson combined to throw for 146 yards through the air. Defensively, UNM allowed just 235 yards, the lowest total to an FBS opponent since a 16-14 loss at New Mexico State when UNM allowed just 208 yards to the Aggies.

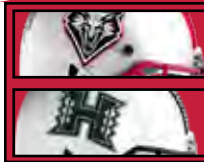

HONOLULU, Hawaii --- In a game that felt like a defensive play would win it ... a defensive play won it. Daniel Henry zipped through the line and forced a Diocemy Saint Juste fumble and Lee Crosby scooped and scored from 46 yards out as New Mexico won its third straight for the first time since 2007 as UNM beat Hawai'i 28-21 in a game marred by torrential rain throughout.

After Crosby's and Henry's heroics, UNM needed one more stop defensively, and the third time on the drive was the charm. Hawai'i methodically moved down the field after Crosby's touchdown with 8:53 left, converting two straight fourth-and-2 opportunities. After an eight-yard pass to the UNM 8-yard line, Nik D'Avanzo and Donnie White teamed up to hold Steve Lakalaka to a yard on third down, setting up another fourth down opportunity. With the clock winding down and under 2:30 to go, D'Avanzo knifed through the Hawai'i line and took down Lakalaka for no gain after a measurement.

From there, UNM needed two first downs and Diquon Woodhouse, Teriyon Gipson and Tyrone Owens combined to get them, giving UNM a hard fought win on the island of Oahu.

Tied at 14-14, UNM took the lead late in the third quarter when Owens burst up the middle and got a tremendous downfield block from Matt Quarells and scored to make it 21-14, pushing him over the 100-yard mark in the process. The Rainbow Warriors (4-5, 3-2 MW) answered with a 56-yard drive to tie it at 21-21 as Lakalaka scored from four yards out.

UNM punted after that, but a big tackle on coverage by Bijon Parker set up the stage for the ensuing run plays by Hawai'i and the fumble recovery that won it.

UNM went up 14-0 in the first quarter, scoring on runs by Richard McQuarley of 1-yard and 11 yards by Teriyon Gipson. Hawai'i answered with 14 in the second quarter, scoring on a 6-yard quarterback run and a 2-yard run on a fake field goal at the halftime gun.

Lamar Jordan started for UNM and was 4-for-6 for 58 yards and a pick in the first half. Austin Apodaca came in for the second half and was 7-for-9 for 26 yards, but his accuracy opened up the middle of the field, allowing Owens to take advantage.

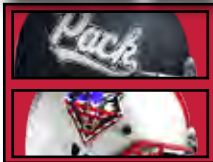

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- It wasn't exactly "Easy Like Sunday Morning", but it sure finished on Sunday morning. Thanks to a hellacious thunder storm that knocked out power briefly at University Stadium and delayed the game at halftime nearly two hours, the University of New Mexico Lobos clinched bowl eligibility for a second straight season with a 35-26 win over the Nevada Wolf Pack, a team that soundly defeated UNM a year ago.

The win moved the Lobos to 6-3 overall and 4-1 in the Mountain Division of the Mountain West, keeping pace with Boise State for a tie for second place. The Lobos remained one game behind Wyoming for first place in the conference. It also gave UNM its first four-game winning streak since the 2004 season, when UNM won five straight.

The Lobos will now go bowling for a second consecutive year, only the fourth time that's happened and the first since the team went three straight times, in 2006 and 2007.

Play resumed after a one hour, 49-minute delay at 10:43 p.m., and UNM's defense immediately forced a three-and-out, setting up UNM's offense. Under Austin Apodaca, the Lobos moved the ball right down the field as Apodaca mixed the pass and run well. However, on a fumble at the 4-yard line, Apodaca got hurt on the recovery, and Lamar Jordan, who started, entered back into the game. He promptly dashed into the end zone from the four to give UNM the lead for good.

Apodaca returned on the next series and hit Emmanuel Harris for a 44-yard touchdown on a third-and-six play, giving UNM a 28-14 lead. Nevada however, would answer with the next two touchdowns, but Nevada's kicking game, once a major strength, proved its undoing. After a Brandon Scott 19-yard touchdown catch, Spencer Pettit's extra point was blocked by Ryan Santos, keeping the margin at eight, 28-20.

Nevada's next offensive play went for a 57-yard touchdown to Ahki Muhammad, this with 11:31 to go. Needing a two-pointer to tie, Tyler Gangi's pass was knocked away by Nias Martin, keeping UNM in the lead at 28-26.

After another punt, UNM's defense, as it did when needed against San José State and Air Force during this streak, came through. Down just two and starting at its own 20, Nevada went nowhere in three plays. First, Kimmie Carson blew up James Butler on an inside handoff, and then he got in Gangi's face and forced an incomplection. On third down, Jadon Boatright knocked away a pass intended for Jerico Richardson, forcing a punt.

That was all UNM needed. Apodaca led a brilliant eight play, 57 yard drive for a touchdown to ice it away. After a run for no gain on the first play, he scrambled around, buying time until he found Cole Gautsche for a short gain. Apodaca then hit Dameon Gamblin with a big completion for a first down to the Nevada 43-yard line. From there, Gipson, who finished with 121 yards on the ground, gained three, and then Apodaca went for 29, sliding at the end to stay in bounds. He would score to seal it three plays later.

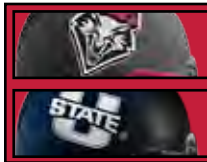

LOGAN, Utah --- There isn't a kicker in the FBS having a better season statistically than New Mexico's Jason Sanders. He proved that again on Saturday night. With the bright lights of ESPN2 on, Sanders hit a 40-yard field goal with 1:06 left in the game, giving UNM its fifth straight win, beating Utah State in Logan 24-21. The win moved the Lobos to 7-3 overall and 5-1 in the Mountain West, and into a first place tie with Boise State and Wyoming at 5-1 with two games to go.

Sanders' field goal was his third of the night and it capped a huge second half comeback as UNM was down 21-6 after the opening drive of the third quarter. The kick was set up after a beautiful drive that followed a goal line stand. With the game tied at 21-21, Utah State drove from its 37 to the Lobo 2-yard line, sitting at second and goal from the two. Three times the Aggies (3-7, 1-6 MW) handed the ball to short yardage back Tony Lindsey, and three times he was rebuffed.

First Dakota Cox nailed him at the line for no gain, and on third and goal, Lindsey got a yard before Daniel Henry brought him down. Facing fourth down and starting at an 18-yard field goal with just over 5 ½ minutes left, the Aggies went for the touchdown, and Nias Martin tripped Lindsey up, and Cox finished him off just in front of the goal line.

That gave UNM the ball 99 ½ yards away, and they eventually got 76, more than enough for Sanders. Facing a third and 4 from the seven, Teriyon Gipson took an option pitch for 11 yards and a first down, and then UNM methodically moved the ball down the field. The Lobos got a Gipson 15-yarder to give him 100 for the game and move into Aggie territory, and then a pass interference call put UNM in field goal range. Three plays later Sanders nailed his career-high third of the day to make it 24-21.

UNM then had to play defense, and they held. Utah State converted a fourth and 1 to midfield, and then got 33 yards on the next play, an 18-yard pass and a roughing penalty to put the Aggies in field goal range at the 19 with 22 seconds left. Utah State then saw Kent Myers complete a pass to Ron'Quavon Tarver for an apparent touchdown with 16 seconds left, but Tarver was called for offensive pass interference, moving the ball back to the Lobo 34.

Utah State then burned its last timeout, and that would haunt them. With 16 seconds left, Myers was forced the scramble and got 9 yards on first and 25, but instead of trying to spike the ball, Utah State sprinted its field goal unit on the field. However, with the ball on the hashmark away from the Aggie bench, they got the kick off after the whistle, but it was well short anyways.

UNM needed the comeback because it mustered just two Jason Sanders field goals in the first half, and that couldn't match Utah State which scored on a pair of short Lindsey runs on the opening two drives. The Aggies took the second half kickoff down the field and scored, again from Lindsey, making it 21-6 and setting up UNM's comeback.

The Lobos got back in it quickly. Apodaca led UNM 76 yards in 11 plays (the exact same as the winning field goal drive) and Gipson scored from five yards out. After a three-and-out, UNM again scored a touchdown with a 37-yard Apodaca to Q' Drennan pass starting the drive and Gipson ending it. That made it 21-19, and Richard McQuarley scored for a two-point conversion to make it 21-21.

FT. COLLINS, Colo. --- For the second straight year, New Mexico entered its 11th game of the season with a Mountain West title game shot firmly in play and Colorado State in the way. For the second straight year, Colorado State dashed UNM's dream. The Lobos, who could still tie for the Division title, allowed over 500 yards of offense for just the second time this season and the Rams ended their run in Hughes Stadium with a 49-24 win over the Lobos.

New Mexico, which dropped to 7-4 overall and 5-2 in the Mountain West, can still win a share of the Mountain Division title with a Boise State loss to Air Force on Friday night and then a win over Wyoming in the regular season finale. That game will kickoff at 8:15 p.m. in Albuquerque, and it has been selected for broadcast on ESPN2.

The Lobos for the second straight game found themselves down 14-0 after two possessions as Nick Stevens threw a 19-yard touchdown pass and then ran for a 14-yard score.

The Lobos answered with a solid drive of 51 yards on nine plays, including a key fourth down conversion. UNM got on the board when Austin Apodaca hit Dameon Gamblin in the back of the end zone to make it 14-7. UNM's defense then pitched a three and out, but UNM couldn't capitalize and CSU went down and scored again as Stevens scooted in from a yard out to make it 21-7. After UNM stalled again, Corey Bojorquez flipped the field, unleashing an 80-yard punt that was downed at the 2-yard line. However, after an incomplection (the only one of the game for CSU), a long run set up the Rams near midfield, and they eventually cashed in on a 14-yard Izzy Matthews run. UNM cut the lead to 28-10 at the break when Jason Sanders connected for a career-long 51 yard field goal.

UNM couldn't get the opening second half stop they needed, but the offense was sparked by Lamar Jordan, who came in for the field goal drive and then led UNM on a pair of long scoring drives, the first capped by a Richard McQuarley touchdown and the second on a perfect pass to Gamblin for his second score.

Down 49-24, UNM inched closer when Tyrone Owens bolted around the left end for a 79-yard touchdown. The Lobos tried a pooch kick that CSU fell on, and they ran out the final 5:10 from there.

Offensively, after a rough first 25 minutes, UNM found its groove, rushing for 285 yards on 48 attempts and had 366 overall, but Colorado State rushed for 412 on just 42 carries and had 576 overall. Owens however went over the 1,000-yard mark, the 19th player to do so in school history.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- In the end, the numbers were truly staggering, but it's three small numbers that probably mean most to those associated with the Lobo football program, and certainly with the fan base.

Eleven.
Fifteen.
Nineteen.

Eleven is the number of conference wins in the last two seasons, a school record. Fifteen is the number of overall wins in the last two seasons, the third-most in school history. And 19. That's the number of years since the Lobos could lay a claim to a title, which they rightfully earned with a historic 56-35 win over Wyoming, giving the Lobos a share of the Mountain West's Mountain Division title.

Perhaps another key number was 29. That was the number of seniors that UNM had, and they went out in style. The game was never in doubt, and the numbers racked up by UNM's offense were truly staggering. The offense put up the second-most rushing yards in school history with 568, and tied for the second-most yards in total offense in school history with 690. The Lobos run up, down, over, around and straight through Wyoming's defense, gashing the Cowboys for 10 runs of 20 or more yards. Even UNM's passing game with Lamar Jordan helming the triple was nearly unstoppable as he went 4-for-5 for 122 yards and a touchdown.

That touchdown pass was UNM's only one of the game, a 49-yarder off a flea-flicker to Q' Drennan. But this day was about the running attack. The Lobos posted three 100-yard rushers with Teriyon Gipson scoring twice among his 13 carries for 217 yards. Lamar Jordan also rushed 12 times for a career-high 176, and Richard McQuarley had a career-best 121 on 15 carries.

The Lobos jumped out to a 21-0 lead with a pair of McQuarley opening quarter touchdowns and a Gipson run. Down 14-0, Wyoming actually drove all the way to the Lobo 9-yard line, but on second-and-6, an offensive pass interference penalty negated a touchdown. Then Nik D'Avanzo and Donnie White had back-to-back sacks, both for 13 yards in losses, and what was once second-and-6 became fourth-and-47. After a punt, UNM made it 21-0 just three rushes later and that effectively ended the game drama.

The Lobos defense was solid, allowing just 150 yards in the first half. Overall the Lobo defense had three pass breakups and three sacks for 32 yards.

UNM's special teams chipped in as Corey Bojorquez had another outstanding day with a 50.0 net. His second punt was over return man Austin Conway's head, which he fumbled. Alex Hart recovered at the 1-yard line, leading to UNM's final touchdown of the day, that being McQuarley's third.

1939 SUN BOWL

Playing in its first bowl game, the New Mexico Lobos were shut out by the Utah Utes 26-0 in the 4th Annual Sun Bowl at Kidd Field in El Paso.

(Note: The remainder of this story was written by Albuquerque Journal Sports Editor Paul Weeks and edited by UNM Media Relations.)

Like a kite that had flown too high, New Mexico's far-famed "dipsy-doo" football circus blew up and out of control before 13,000 disappointed Sun Bowl fans with a powerful tribe of Utah Indians (as they were called at the time) pouring on a humiliating 26-0 defeat.

The Utes matched their conservative style of the game as taught by Coach Ike Armstrong against the once-colorful attack of the Hilltoppers (as the Lobos were sometimes called) to claim gridiron superiority as Big Seven champions over the Lobos, co-champs of the Border league.

Never did New Mexico fall so miserably during the entire season as against the white-shirted tribe. Observers declared the team had conquered foes with power equal to the Utes, but there were no alibis for the Sun Bowl loss. It was on the same field that the Cherry and Silver met its first defeat of the season against Texas Mines (now UTEP).

Placed on equal ground before the fray, the two teams were as unevenly matched as a flyweight in the ring with a heavy. The Utes smashed across two touchdowns in the first quarter and followed it up with a 20-0 margin at the half. When New Mexico did not take advantage of breaks given them in the last periods, the Utes coasted in to another score, using two teams with equal results.

Though the bowl was not filled to capacity, more than 500 perched on the barren hills surrounding the field. The crowd stripped overcoats and concessionaires did a rush business in sun glasses because of the summery temperature. The tang of autumn football weather was entirely lacking.

A final quarter forward pass, starring tailback R.W. MacGruder of San Marcos, gave Southwestern of Texas a 7-0 victory over the University of New Mexico in the 9th Annual Sun Bowl.

The 37-yard toss from fullback R.L. Cooper clicked after the underdog New Mexico Lobos had beaten back the highly-touted ground game of Southwestern's Pirates through three quarters and eight minutes of the final period. The Pirates took the ball at the start of the fourth quarter on the 13. A pass, MacGruder to Cooper, made 27 and the two backs hit the line for a first down and MacGruder broke loose for 22 yards to the New Mexico 19.

Here New Mexico held and taking the pigskin, punted to the 46. Cooper passed to Hollon, Pirate end, for a first down and then to MacGruder for the winning tally.

The Lobos threatened only twice, in the second and third periods, but could not get beyond the Southwestern 16.

The game started under cloudy skies, but the sun broke through in the second half and playing conditions were nearly ideal.

The vaunted Southwestern defense held the Lobos to just four first downs and 48 yards total offense.

1946 SUN BOWL

**Jan. 1, 1946 • El Paso, Texas
New Mexico 34, Denver 24**

Don Rumley, a 19-year-old Navy reservist from Princeton, Ill., led New Mexico to a 34-24 victory over Denver University in the 11th Annual Sun Bowl. The 180-pound halfback passed for three touchdowns and rushed for another in the highest scoring game in the 11 years of this New Year's Day football event.

A crowd of 15,000 was on its feet throughout a 28-point fourth period in which New Mexico came from behind to capture its first bowl victory in three attempts. It was also the first victory for a Border Conference team in the El Paso game's history.

Denver, Big Seven champion, rolled up 10 points before New Mexico countered, and remained dangerous the last scoring its final touchdown with less than two minutes to play.

A 63-yard dash with an interception sent fullback Rudy Krall over with UNM's first score in the second period. Krall and Rumley engineered a 70-yard drive to set up the next score when Rumley scooted in from nine yards for a 13-10 Lobo lead.

Then, after a scoreless New Mexico third period, when Denver had regained the lead at 17-13, Rumley whipped out two aerials for touchdowns to sub end William Moseley and a third to Lavon McDonald.

One reason the Lobos were Sun Bowl champs is a story of gridiron heroism. It's about Fred Doar, UNM's star center, chief linebacker and kicker.

The 210-pound Navy trainee was on the bottom of a heap in the first play of the game. After that he played outstanding ball stopping Denver backs time after time. But teammates noticed their captain wasn't "talking it up" as usual. In fact, he was silent. X-rays after the game showed that Doar had broken his jaw in two places on the first play.

Blue skies and a blazing sun made it baseball weather for the game. Nearly 16,000 short-sleeved customers heard a minister intone a prayer dedicating this game to the nine members of the Lobos' 1939 Sun Bowl team who left the football field to die on the battle field during World War II.

The University of New Mexico Lobos came from behind to earn a 13-13 tie with Montana State College in the first San Diego Harbor Bowl before a crowd of 7,000.

Both teams displayed a flashy brand of football which kept the fans on edge throughout.

New Mexico opened the scoring soon after the game started when Hubert Hackett connected on a 26-yard pass to Lou Cullen. Hackett's place kick was wide.

Montana State surged back shortly after the second period started sparked by Neil Brooks 48-yard dash from scrimmage to paydirt. The placekick was blocked but Gene Bourdet picked up the ball and ran over for the extra point (allowed at this time).

Bill Nelson set the stage for the next score when he took Bourdet's short pass at midfield and streaked 42 yards down the sideline to the Lobo 8. After three plays netted just one yard, Bourdet passed to Ken Card on fourth down putting the Bobcats in front. The kick was again blocked.

The Lobos tied the count early in the fourth quarter as Cullen and quarterback Bryan Brock combined to engineer a 75-yard drive on the ground and through the air. Brock scored from two yards out cutting over tackle. Hackett's kick was good to knot the score.

The Lobos had a chance to win the game in the final minutes. UNM drove to the Montana State 12, however, Brock was thrown for a 12-yard loss. Hackett eventually tried a field goal from 35 yards out but failed.

New Mexico struck for early touchdowns in both the first and third quarters to defeat Western Michigan, 28-12 in a chilled Aviation Bowl football game.

Freezing weather, including sleet and snow, nearly grounded the inaugural (and only) Aviation contest and limited the contest to approximately 4,000 fans even though advance sales had surpassed 5,000.

New Mexico drove for two touchdowns to open the game and to also open the second half. Then it capitalized on Western errors to add the two other touchdowns.

Two fumble recoveries in the first quarter helped set up the second touchdown of the game. Chuck Cummings intercepted a pass and streaked 43 yards for the final Lobo touchdown.

Quarterback Jim Cromartie plunged for three yards for New Mexico's first touchdown. Halfback Bobby Santiago picked up the second touchdown from 10 yards out, and Bobby Morgan also went over from the 10 for the third score.

Santiago, who suffered bruised ribs at the end of the first half and saw only limited action in the second half, was voted the top back of the game. Santiago gained a total of 86 yards and had a 60-yard touchdown run nullified by a clipping penalty. Cummings was voted the outstanding lineman.

"Our kids were really up," said UNM head coach Bill Weeks. "They came to play and they hit hard and executed well throughout. Santiago and Cummings were outstanding and I felt that Bobby Morgan had his best game of the year."

New Mexico would lose its first bowl game in 36 years, 20-14, on Arizona's home field. The Cats struck first, scoring on Kelvin Eafon's 15-yard touchdown run midway through the first quarter.

UNM took almost no time in the second stanza to knot the score. Graham Leigh ran 17 yards for a first down, then tossed a 15-yard TD pass to senior Milton Thomas. Colby Cason's PAT tied the score at 7-7 and completed the eight-play 69-yard scoring drive.

On Arizona's next possession, quarterback Brady Batten threw for 51 yards and Trung Canidate ran for 13 more, including a three-yard touchdown, which allowed the Wildcats to reclaim the lead, 13-7. UA missed the PAT.

The Lobos marched right back down the field, reeling off a 14-play, 45-yard drive. UNM could not cash in on its possession, however, as Colby Cason missed a 37-yard field goal.

The second half began in a disastrous fashion for the Lobo offense, as it went three-and-out on its first possession, then Leigh threw two consecutive interceptions. The resiliency of the UNM defense was the only thing preventing Arizona from increasing its lead, as the Lobos forced the Wildcats to punt on each of their first two series.

After Leigh's second interception of the quarter - his third of the game - UA capitalized. Canidate rushed for 30 yards, culminating with Eafon's 1-yard TD. The score upped Arizona's lead to 20-7 with 2:07 left in the third quarter.

Once again, UNM would not allow Arizona to keep its momentum. Leigh found Brian Messer for a 35-yard gain on the Lobos' first play from scrimmage. Two plays later, Leigh found Chris Shelton over the middle for an 18-yard gain to the Wildcat four. Leigh found paydirt on the next play, and with the five-play, 60-yard drive, New Mexico was right back in the game, trailing only 20-14.

New Mexico would get one more chance to stage a rally, taking over at the UA 48 with 5:31 remaining. On second-and-nine, Leigh dropped back and spotted Pascal Volz flashing across the middle downfield. His pass sailed just a bit, however, landing right in the arms of Wildcat DB Kelly Malveaux to seal it for the Cats.

MARKEL BYRD 1995-2015

Markel Byrd, a sophomore safety from San Diego, California, was tragically killed in a single car accident near Gallup, New Mexico on Tuesday, December 22, 2015. Byrd was driving home for the holidays with his girlfriend when their car suffered a blowout on I-40.

"This is an absolute tragedy. Markel Byrd was an outstanding person and student-athlete and we will miss him," said Head Coach Bob Davie. "I was with the family late Tuesday night and obviously they are devastated. Our thoughts and prayers go to them. Markel will forever be a member of our family."

Byrd redshirted in 2013 and played safety for two years, recording 91 career tackles, four interceptions, four passes broken up, two tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble. In 2015 he tied for the team lead in interceptions with three, and he was eighth on the team with 44 tackles.

At Byrd's memorial service, Coach Davie announced that both Byrd's number 22, as well as the number 1, would not be worn for the next two seasons, which would have been Markel's junior and senior season. In May of 2016, Byrd was awarded with his degree in liberal arts from UNM.
