# NATIONALLY RANKED

Utah State and Fresno State are firmly in the *Associated Press* Top 25 and Amway Coaches' Poll after opening the season with 8-1 records.

The Aggies are ranked No. 14 in the AP Top 25 and No. 16 in the Amway Coaches' Poll. This is the first season since 2012 that Utah State has been ranked and only the fourth team to be ranked in program history.

Fresno State is No. 16 in the AP Top 25 and No. 17 in the Amway Coaches' Poll. This is the second consecutive season the Bulldogs have been nationally-ranked (No. 25 on Nov. 26 AP Top 25).

The Mountain West has two teams ranked in the top 16 of the AP Top 25 for the first time since the final 2011 poll.

### **BOWL ELIGIBILITY**

Boise State, Fresno State, San Diego State and Utah State are eligible for the postseason after reaching the six-win mark. Boise State is bowl-eligible for the 17th consecutive season, which is the longest streak among the Group of 5. Fresno State is bowl-eligible for the second consecutive year under head coach **Jeff Tedford**. San Diego State is bowl eligible for the ninth consecutive season, while Utah State has earned postseason eligibility for the fifth time under head coach **Matt Wells**.

Hawai'i, which is idle in Week 11, hosts UNLV on Nov. 17 and can become bowleligible with a victory. The Rainbow Warriors haven't played in the postseason since 2016. A Nevada victory over Colorado State on Saturday, Nov. 10 will give the Wolf Pack postseason eligibility for the first time since 2015.

# **MOVING UP THE CHARTS**

#### 1,000-YARD RUSHER

Wyoming senior RB **Nico Evans** rushed for 108 yards in his first three seasons in Laramie before bursting onto the scene in 2018. Heading into Week 11, Evans ranks second nationally in rushing yards per game (145.8) and fourth in total rushing yards (1,166).

This season, Evans has recorded six 100-yard performances, including a career high 192 yards on the road at Hawai'i.

Evans is the only Mountain West running back to eclipse the 1,000-yard rushing mark this season.

# **UTAH STATE'S HOT START**

Utah State is off to its first 8-1 start since 1965 and are 5-0 in Mountain West play for the first time since joining the league. The Aggies are currently riding an eight-game win streak, which leads the league and is tied as the fifth-longest active streak nationally.

Utah State hosts San José State on Saturday, Nov. 10 (2 p.m. MT on Facebook), looking for its first nine-game win streak since 1960 (nine).

Utah State has scored at least 40 points in seven of its eight victories, scoring 60plus points on three occasions. The Aggies rank second nationally in scoring offense, averaging 50.1 points per contest. The Mountain West record for total points in a season is 608 by BYU in 2001. Utah State is sitting at 451 points scored through nine games.

### FRESNO STATE'S WIN STREAK

Fresno State is off to its best start (8-1) since 2013 when the Bulldogs won 10 straight games to open the year. The Bulldogs have won seven consecutive games, an active streak which is seventh-longest nationally.

Fresno State has found success on both sides of the ball, averaging 40.4 points per game (13th in FBS) and limiting opponents to just 12.3 points per game (second in FBS). The Bulldogs are one of three teams nationally to rank in the top 15 in scoring offense and defense, joining Alabama and Clemson.

#### NOT JUST A FLASH IN THE PAN

Below are a couple notes about Mountain West teams with continued success:

- On Saturday, Sept. 8, the Mountain West won three games against the Pac-12 (Nevada beat Oregon State, Fresno State over UCLA and San Diego State defeated Arizona State) in the same weekend for the first time since September of 2008.
- The Mountain West has won four consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy, Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).
- In the last three seasons, San Diego State has racked up 39 victories, which is the most among the Group of 5 and sixth-best nationally, trailing only Alabama (50), Clemson (49), Ohio State (43), Oklahoma (42) and Wisconsin (40).
- Head coach Rocky Long has led the Aztecs to a bowl game in his first seven seasons. Long is the all-time winningest head coach in Mountain West history (136-100).
- Boise State has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West. Since 2010, BSU has compiled a 12-9 (.571) record against current Autonomous 5 programs. The Broncos have defeated Arizona, Arizona State, Georgia, Oregon, Oregon State, Utah, Virginia, Washington and Washington State.
- Boise State has been nationally-ranked for at least one week for the 17th consecutive season.
- Boise State has made 16 consecutive postseason appearances, the longest streak among Group of 5 institutions and sixth-best nationally.
- Over the last 14 seasons, the Mountain West owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences (.560), trailing only the SEC (.628).

# **MOUNTAIN WEST'S 20TH FOOTBALL SEASON**

Led by the vision of then-Colorado State President Dr. Albert Yates, the Mountain West was formed when presidents of eight institutions - Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming - decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference.

Mountain West football began its 20th season last Saturday as Hawai'i defeated Colorado State, 43-34. The Rams, who are an original member of the MW, played in the first-ever Conference game on Sept. 16, 1999 as BYU hosted CSU.

- In the 19 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant eight times.
- .@USUFootball is ranked No. 14 in the @AP\_Top25 & No. 16 in the Amway Coaches' Poll, while @FresnoStateFB is No. 16 & No. 17, respectively.
- The @MountainWest has two teams ranked in the top 16 of the @AP\_Top25 for the first time since the final poll of the 2011 season.
- .@BroncoSportsFB, @FresnoStateFB, @USUFootball & @SDSUFootball are all bowl-eligible. The @MountainWest has sent at least five teams to the postseason in 11 consecutive years.
- .@HawaiiFootball and @NevadaFootball can become bowl-eligible with victories.
- .@USUFootball has opened the season 8-1 for the first time since 1963. In league play, the Aggies are 5-0 for the first time since joining the @MountainWest.
- .@FresnoStateFB ranks second nationally in scoring defense, limiting opponents to 12.3 points per game.
- .@FresnoStateFB is off to its best seven-game start (8-1) since going 9-0 in 2013.
- .@USUFootball leads the nation with 8 non-offensive touchdowns (4 special teams, 4 defense).
- .@BroncoSportsFB Brett Rypien is the FBS' active leading passer with 12,655 yards. He is the only active FBS QB with more than 12,000 career passing yards.
- .@BroncoSportsFB Brett Rypien ranks second in @MountainWest history with 12,655 career passing yards. Rypien needs 236 passing yards to take the top spot.
- .@FresnoStateFB WR KeeSean Johnson leads the nation with at least one reception in 45 consecutive games, the fourth-longest streak in @MountainWest history.
- .@wyo\_football's Andrew Wingard enters the week with 436 career tackles, just 19 shy of setting the @MountainWest record (New Mexico's Carmen Messina -454).
- .@wyo\_football RB Nico Evans ranks second nationally in rushing yards per game (145.8) and is fourth in total rushing yards (1,166).
- .@SDSUFootball ranks fourth nationally in rush defense, limiting opponents to just 83.1 yards per game. In the season opener, the Aztecs held Stanford's Bryce Love to 29 rushing yards.
- The Aztecs' 39 victories in the last three years are the sixth-most nationally and the most among the Group of 5, trailing only Alabama (50), Clemson (49), Ohio State (43), Oklahoma (42) and Wisconsin (40).
- Earlier this season, @AFFootball head coach Troy Calhoun became one of just two head coaches to win 50 Mountain West games, joining @SDSUFootball's Rocky Long.
- .@USUFootball PK Dominik Eberle tied two NCAA single-game records on Sept. 8
  against New Mexico State: points scored kicking (24) and most field goals from
  50-plus yards (3).
- .@FresnoStateFB defeated UCLA 38-14 on Sept. 22, earning its first victory against an Autonomous 5 opponent since Sept. 15, 2012 (Colorado, 69-14).
- .@FresnoStateFB defeated Idaho 79-13 in the season opener. The 79 points are the second-most scored in a single game in @MountainWest history.
- The @MountainWest has won four consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy and Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).
- .@BroncoSportsFB has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West.
- .@CSUFootball scored 25 unanswered points on its way to defeating Arkansas (34-27) on Sept. 8. This is the first @MountainWest victory against a SEC opponent since 2011 (Boise State over Georgia).
- In the season-opener against Troy, @BroncoSportsFB senior cornerback Tyler Horton tied an FBS single-game record with two fumble returns for touchdowns.
- .@SDSUFootball has compiled a 39-11 record over the last three seasons. The Aztecs are searching for their fourth consecutive 10-win season, which would be the longest-stretch in program history.

# facebook.

During the 2018 college football season, through a partnership with Stadium, the Mountain West will have seven games air exclusively on Facebook, a social media platform with more than 1.3 billion daily active users.

The seven-game package features four nonconference contests and three Conference showdowns. Utah State will be featured on Facebook on five occasions, while Air Force and Fresno State, which was predicted to win the MW West Division, will also have nonconference games broadcast by the social media platform. Air Force will open the 2018 Facebook MW package on Saturday, Sept. 1 at Noon MT when the Falcons host Stony Brook.

In 2017, six MW football games that aired on Facebook reached more than 17 million fans, led by Utah State at Wyoming on Oct. 14, which reached 4.6 million fans.

# FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

Host Determination: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. The host site will be determined no later than the Sunday following the conclusion of the regular season.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

1. Head-to-head result between the tied divisional champions.

#### 2. If still tied:

If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings will be used; -0R-

If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season; -0Ř-

If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used; -OR-

If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.

If still tied, the best record against common Conference opponents. 3.

4 If still tied, the team with the highest overall winning percentage (Conference and non-conference excluding exempt games).

5. If still tied, a coin toss will be conducted by the Commissioner.
