

## ***NEW MEXICO 107, HOUSTON BAPTIST 88***

### Matchup Notes:

- Starting Lineup: Zane Martin, JaQuan Lyle, Vance Jackson, Makuach Maluach, Corey Manigault.
- Attendance: 10,423
- The Lobos now lead the series 3-0, with all wins coming in Albuquerque.

### Coach Weir Notes:

- Career Record: 73-41
- UNM Record: 45-35

### Post-game Notes:

- Five Lobos finished the game in double figures: Corey Manigault (21 points, fifth game this season), Zane Martin (19 points, seventh game this season), JaQuan Lyle (19 points, twelfth game this season), Makuach Maluach (19 points, seventh game this season) and Vance Jackson (14 points, fourth game this season).
  - At least two Lobos have seen double figure points in every game this season
  - Manigault has posted 20 plus points twice this season
- There has been four games this season where five Lobos have scored in double digits, and the team is currently on a two game streak of five Lobos registering double figures.
- Corey Manigault set a new UNM career high in field goals made (9).
  - His previous best was against San José State on February 26, 2019.
  - Manigault also tied his career high of one three made, which he has done once before.
- Zane Martin hit a career high in points at UNM, finishing with 19.
  - Martin's six assists is also a new UNM career high for the redshirt-junior
- Sunday's game marks the first time this season that all starters finished the game in double figures.
- The Lobos are now 8-0 when shooting at a higher field goal percentage than their opponent.
- The 107 point game marks the first time this season that the Lobos have broken 100 points.
  - The last time they posted 100 plus was on February 28, 2018 versus Colorado State (108-87).
- UNM now improves to 9-0 at The Pit this season. The last time the Lobos were 9-0 at home was in the 2010-11 season.
- The Lobos forced 14 turnovers from the Huskies which they capitalized for a total of 27 points, which more than doubles the points Houston Baptist scored off of turnovers (10 turnovers forced, 13 points scored).
- For the third time this season, the Lobos scored 50+ points in the second half (54).
  - In each of these games, the team's second half performance was at least 11 points higher than the first half.
