NATIONALLY RANKED

Utah State and Boise State are ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25 and Amway Coaches' Poll after opening the season with 9-1 and 8-2 records, respectively.

The Aggies are ranked No. 14 in the AP Top 25 and No. 13 in the Amway Coaches' Poll. This is the first season since 2012 that Utah State has been ranked and only the fourth team to be ranked in program history.

Boise State is No. 23 in the AP Top 25 and No. 24 in the Amway Coaches' Poll. This is the seventh week the Broncos have been ranked in 2018.

BOWL ELIGIBILITY

Boise State, Fresno State, Nevada, San Diego State and Utah State are eligible for the postseason after reaching the six-win mark. Boise State is bowl-eligible for the 17th consecutive season, which is the longest streak among the Group of 5. Fresno State is bowl-eligible for the second consecutive year under head coach **Jeff Tedford**. Nevada is eligible for the postseason for the first time since 2015. San Diego State is bowl eligible for the ninth consecutive season, while Utah State has earned postseason eligibility for the fifth time under head coach **Matt Wells**.

Hawai'i, which hosts UNLV on Saturday, Nov. 17, can become bowl-eligible with a victory. The Rainbow Warriors haven't played in the postseason since 2016.

- The Mountain West has sent at least five teams to bowl games in 11 consecutive seasons.
- Over the last 14 seasons, the Mountain West owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences (.560), trailing only the SEC (.628).

MOVING UP THE CHARTS

Boise State QB **Brett Rypien** is the new Mountain West all-time leading passer. Rypien, who has thrown for 3,048 yards this season, claimed the top spot in a victory against then-nationally-ranked Fresno State on Nov. 9. Below is a look at the MW top 5:

1,000-YARD RUSHER

Wyoming senior RB **Nico Evans** rushed for 108 yards in his first three seasons in Laramie before bursting onto the scene in 2018. Heading into Week 12, Evans ranks second nationally in rushing yards per game (145.8) and seventh in total rushing yards (1,166).

This season, Evans has recorded six 100-yard performances, including a career high 192 yards on the road at Hawai'i.

Evans is the only Mountain West running back to eclipse the 1,000-yard rushing mark this season.

UTAH STATE'S HOT START

Utah State is off to a 9-1 start and are 6-0 in Mountain West play for the first time since joining the league. The Aggies are currently riding a nine-game win streak, which leads the league and is tied as the fifth-longest active streak nationally. This is tied as the longest win streak by a USU team since 1960.

Utah State goes on the road to Colorado State on Saturday, Nov. 17 (Noon MT on AT&T SportsNet), looking for its longest win streak in program history.

Utah State has scored at least 40 points in eight of its nine victories, scoring 60-plus points on four occasions. The Aggies lead the nation in scoring offense, averaging 51.3 points per contest. The Mountain West record for total points in a season is 608 by BYU in 2001. Utah State is sitting at 513 points scored through 10 games.

ESPN'S FOOTBALL POWER INDEX

In ESPN's most recent Football Power Index (FPI), three of the top four Group of 5 teams are from the Mountain West, led by Fresno State at No. 19.

According to ESPN, (FPI) is a measure of team strength that is meant to be the best predictor of a team's performance going forward for the rest of the season. FPI represents how many points above or below average a team is. Projected results are based on 10,000 simulations of the rest of the season using FPI, results to date, and the remaining schedule. Below is a look at the top rated Group of 5:

NOT JUST A FLASH IN THE PAN

Below are a couple notes about Mountain West teams with continued success:

- On Saturday, Sept. 8, the Mountain West won three games against the Pac-12 (Nevada beat Oregon State, Fresno State over UCLA and San Diego State defeated Arizona State) in the same weekend for the first time since September of 2008.
- The Mountain West has won four consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy, Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).
- In the last three seasons, San Diego State has racked up 39 victories, which is the most among the Group of 5 and sixth-best nationally, trailing only Alabama (51), Clemson (50), Ohio State (44), Oklahoma (43) and Wisconsin (40).
- Head coach **Rocky Long** has led the Aztecs to a bowl game in his first seven seasons. Long is the all-time winningest head coach in Mountain West history (136-101).
- Boise State has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West. Since 2010, BSU has compiled a 12-9 (.571) record against current Autonomous 5 programs. The Broncos have defeated Arizona, Arizona State, Georgia, Oregon, Oregon State, Utah, Virginia, Washington and Washington State.
- Boise State has been nationally-ranked for at least one week for the 17th consecutive season.
- Boise State has made 16 consecutive postseason appearances, the longest streak among Group of 5 institutions and sixth-best nationally.
- Over the last 14 seasons, the Mountain West owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences (.560), trailing only the SEC (.628).

MOUNTAIN WEST'S 20TH FOOTBALL SEASON

Led by the vision of then-Colorado State President Dr. Albert Yates, the Mountain West was formed when presidents of eight institutions - Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming - decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference.

Mountain West football began its 20th season last Saturday as Hawai'i defeated Colorado State, 43-34. The Rams, who are an original member of the MW, played in the first-ever Conference game on Sept. 16, 1999 as BYU hosted CSU.

FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

Host Determination: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. The host site will be determined no later than the Sunday following the conclusion of the regular season.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

1. Head-to-head result between the tied divisional champions.
2. If still tied:
If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings will be used;
-OR-
If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;
-OR-
If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;
-OR-
If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.
3. If still tied, the best record against common Conference opponents.
4. If still tied, the team with the highest overall winning percentage (Conference and non-conference excluding exempt games).
5. If still tied, a coin toss will be conducted by the Commissioner.

The contest will be played at the home stadium of the regular season Mountain West divisional champion with the highest win percentage in Conference games only.
