A LOOK AT THE 2015 MOUNTAIN WEST SCHEDULE

The 2015 Mountain West football schedule is comprised of 97 games, including 48 Conference matchups. The scheduling format for the 12-member football lineup consists of five intra-divisional games and three cross-divisional contests. Each institution will play four home and four road Conference games. This is the third year of the initial four-year cycle in which each member institution will play every other Mountain West opponent home and away. In 2015, the cross-divisional opponents will flip from the first two years, with teams playing their new opponents from the other division.

The 2015 schedule will play out over 14 weeks, concluding on Sat., Dec. 5 with the Mountain West Football Championship Game to be played at the home stadium of the highest-ranked of the two divisional champions.

The non-conference slate features 22 games against teams that earned bowl berths in 2014, including Arizona, Arizona State, Auburn, BYU (4 games), Minnesota, Mississippi, Michigan State, Navy, Northern Illinois, Ohio State, Penn State, South Alabama, Texas A&M, UCLA, Utah (2 games), Washington (2 games) and Wisconsin. Nine non-conference opponents finished ranked in last year's final USA Today/Coaches' and Associated Press Top 25 polls, including national champion Ohio State, #5 Michigan State, #10 UCLA, #13 Wisconsin, #14/12 Arizona State, #17/19 Arizona, #19/17 Ole Miss, #20/21 Utah and #23/22 Auburn.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

The Mountain West is home to five of the 13 youngest head coaches at the FBS level. Boise State's Bryan Harsin (38), Nevada's Brian Polian (40), Colorado State's Mike Bobo (41), UNLV's Tony Sanchez (41) and Utah State's Matt Wells (41) are among the group of 13 coaches who were born in 1973 or later.

NO FLY ZONE

The Boise State starting secondary has recorded more career interceptions than any other starting secondary in the nation. Made up of Darian Thompson, Donte Deayon, Jonathan Moxey and Dylan Sumner-Gardner, the Broncos have 39 career picks. Thompson has 18 career interceptions, the most among FBS defenders and tied for most by a MW defender all-time, while Deayon has 17 career interceptions, which is tied for the second-most in Mountain West history and tied for second-most among active NCAA defenders. Moxey has the other four interceptions for Boise State.

TWO NEW HEAD COACHES JOIN MW RANKS IN 2015

For the second consecutive year, the Mountain West welcomes two new head football coaches. Colorado State will be under the direction of **Mike Bobo**, while **Tony Sanchez** takes over at UNLV. Both are first-year head coaches.

Bobo comes to Colorado State from the University of Georgia, where he had spent the previous 14 seasons, including the last eight as offensive coordinator. Bobo's 14-year stint at Georgia, where he was a quarterback in the late 1990s, began in January, 2001, when head coach Mark Richt hired him as quarterbacks coach. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2007. During his time at UGA, Bobo helped lead the Bulldogs to 135 victories, including two Southeastern Conference championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles and eight bowl victories. Prior to his time with the Bulldogs, Bobo began his coaching career at Jacksonville State (1999-2000).

Sanchez spent the last six seasons leading Bishop Gorman (Las Vegas) High School to an overall record of 85-5 and six consecutive state 4A championships. In his six seasons at Bishop Gorman, Sanchez saw 34 of his players earn collegiate football scholarships, including 25 to FBS programs. Prior to his stint in Las Vegas, he coached at Onate High School in Las Cruces, N.M. and Irvin High School in El Paso, Texas. His lone collegiate coaching experience came in 1996 as he was an undergraduate assistant at New Mexico State, the school where Sanchez was a two-year letterwinner.

FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACHES IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

The Mountain West has welcomed 24 new head coaches over the last 16 seasons. Former BYU head coach Gary Crowton and current Boise State head coach **Bryan Harsin** have posted the most victories and highest win percentage among the group with 12 victories and an .857 win percentage in their inaugural years in 2001 and 2014, respectively. Harsin became the first to conclude his inaugural season by winning the Mountain West Championship Game, the first of two outright MW Championships in program history. Harsin is the only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State. Harsin is one of three first-year coaches to win at least 10 games in their inaugural season, joining Crowton (12 wins, 2001) and Urban Meyer (10 wins, 2003).

MOUNTAIN WEST IN THE POSTSEASON

The Mountain West sent a record seven teams into postseason bowl games in 2014, posting a 3-4 record (.429). Overall, the Mountain West has earned 69 bowl bids since 1999 and holds a 38-31 (.551) all-time record. The league has also posted an overall postseason mark of at least .500 in eight of the last 11 seasons.

The 2014 postseason marked the eighth straight year the MW has sent at least five teams to bowls and 11th time since the league's inception in 1999. It also marked the second straight year that six or more MW squads advanced to the postseason.

Over the last 11 seasons, the Mountain West has captured the Bowl Challenge Cup four times and owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences with a 31-23 mark (.574) during that span. The MW is the only conference to win the trophy four times since the award's inception in 2002-03.

For the second consecutive year, the Mountain West had seven bowl-eligible teams - Boise State (12-2), Colorado State (10-3), Air Force (10-3), Utah State (10-4), Nevada (7-6), San Diego State (7-6) and Fresno State (6-8). This ties the conference record for most bowl-eligible teams. The MW has boasted at least five bowl-eligible teams 11 times since the league's inception in 1999.

WEEK 1 OFFENSIVE

Nick Stevens, QB, Colorado State

- In his first career start, completed 20-of-28 passes (71.4 percent) for 289 yards and five touchdown passes (all career highs) in Colorado State's 65-13 victory over Savannah State.
- His five touchdown passes went to five different receivers.
- The five touchdown passes tied for the second-most in CSU history, and the most by a Rams quarterback making his debut start. Played in only two and a half quarters due to the score.

DEFENSIVE

Calvin Munson, LB, San Diego State

- Recorded a team-high 11 tackles (3 solo), two interceptions (both returned for a touchdown 19 yards and 67 yards) and 2.5 tackles for loss in San Diego State's 37-3 win over San Diego.
 Became the first player in school history and fourth
- Became the first player in school history and fourth since the inception of the Mountain West in 1999 to have two interceptions returned for a touchdown in a single game (SDSU has been playing football since 1921).
- The two interceptions returned for a touchdown ties an NCAA single-game record for a linebacker and are tied for the second most among all players.
- The two interceptions were more than every player in the country in Week 1 except for teammate Damontae Kazee and West Virginia's Karl Joseph (both had three).
- The fumble recovery was the first of his career.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Andrew Rodriguez, WR/PR, Utah State

- Returned eight punts for 136 yards in Utah State's season-opening 12-9 win against Southern Utah.
- His 88-yard punt return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter proved to be the game-winning score.
 Overall, he returned a USU and MW record eight punts for 136 yards against SUU.
- Rodriguez's 88-yard punt return is tied for the second-longest in Mountain West history.
- second-longest in Mountain West history.

 The 88-yard punt return for also is a Maverik Stadium record and the third-longest in Aggie history trailing Kevin Robinson, who returned a punt 90 yards for a touchdown at Troy in 2004, and Dale Leatham, who also returned a punt 90 yards for a touchdown at Wichita State in 1950. Robinson held the previous Maverik Stadium record with an 87-yard punt return for a touchdown against San José State in 2005.
- The previous MW record was also seven by Scott Harding (Hawai'i) in 2014.

WEEK 2 OFFENSIVE

D.J. Johnson, RB, Air Force

- Rushed for 103 yards for his first-career 100-yard game on a career-most 21 carries in Air Force's 36-17 victory over Mountain West foe San José State.
- Tied his career-high with three rushing touchdowns all of which came in the fourth quarter.
- Scored on a 13-yard run to put the Falcons ahead 23-16 with 12:29 left in the game and followed with a one-yard run on fourth-and-goal to give the Falcons a two-score lead.
- Clinched the game with his final touchdown on a career-long 34 yard run with 3:43 left in the game.
- Six carries went for touchdowns or first downs, including five in the fourth quarter.
- Had 12 carries for 82 yards and three touchdowns in the fourth quarter.

DEFENSIVE

Weston Steelhammer, DB, Air Force

- Recorded six total tackles and led the defensive effort of holding San José State to just 16 points in the Air Force victory over the Spartans.
- Had one quarterback sack and a career-high three tackles for loss for 12 yards.
- Registered an interception in the fourth quarter to seal the game with the Falcons up by two scores.
- His three tackles for loss are the most by an Air Force player this season and gives him 4.5 TFL for the year.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Wyatt Bryan, K, Colorado State

- In Colorado State's 23-20 overtime loss to Minnesota, connected on a 37-yard, game-tying field goal as regulation expired, sending the game into overtime.
- Trailing 13-7, hit a 26-yard field goal late in the third-quarter, part of a 10-point swing that gave the Rams' the lead until the final minute of the game.
- Made two extra-point kicks.

WEEK 3 OFFENSIVE

Jeremy McNichols, RB, Boise State

- Scored three rushing touchdowns in Boise State's 52-0 victory over Idaho State.
- Ran for 69 yards on 15 carries.

DEFENSIVE

Jerrol Garcia-Williams, LB, Hawaiʻi

- Recorded a career-high 15 total tackles, including 12 solo, in Hawai'i's 47-27 victory over UC Davis.
- His 15 tackles are the most in a game by a UH defender since Corey Paredes vs. New Mexico State on Nov. 22, 2010.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Tanner Vallejo, LB, Boise State

- Played a key role in preserving Boise State's first shutout since 2011.
- Blocked one punt and field goal in Boise State's 52-0 win against Idaho State.
- His blocks came on consecutive drives, as he blocked and then recovered a Bengal punt inside the 30-yard line at the beginning of the second half. On the next Idaho State possession, blocked a 36-yard field-goal attempt to keep the Bengals scoreless.

WEEK 4 OFFENSIVE

Tyler Ervin, RB, San José State

- Rushed for a San José State single-game record 300 yards on 42 carries and three touchdowns in the Spartans 49-23 victory against Fresno State.
- Also had four receptions for 45 yards and totaled 345 all-purpose yards in the contest.
- The 300 rushing yards and 345 all-purpose yards are the most by a FBS player this season.
- Outgained the Fresno State team by himself, 345 all-purpose yards to Fresno State's 247 yards of total offense.
- The 300 rushing yards are the most by a senior in a single game in Mountain West history, and are the third-most overall in league history.

DEFENSIVE

Dameon Baber, DB, Nevada

- In his first collegiate game, recorded 10 tackles (3 solo) and two interceptions as Nevada won on the road at Buffalo 24-21.
- Picked off a pass in the end zone in the third quarter to thwart a Buffalo scoring opportunity and keep the Wolf Pack in the lead 17-13.
- With under two minutes remaining in the game and Nevada leading by just three points (24-21), Buffalo was once again driving into Wolf Pack territory. On 4th-and-15 from Nevada's 47-yard line, Baber tallied the game-clinching interception.
- First Wolf Pack player to record multiple interceptions since Markus Smith against Hawai'i on Sept. 21, 2013.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Rashaad Penny, RB/KR, San Diego State

- Returned two kicks for a career-high 137 yards in San Diego State's 37-21 loss at Penn State.
- Averaging 68.5 yards per return and finished with a career-high 192 all-purpose yards on just three touches.
- His 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the second quarter tied the game a seven.
- The kick return TD was his second this year, matching Colin Lockett (2012) for the most in a single-season in SDSU history.
- Recorded one rush for a career-long 55 yards. It was also the longest run against a Penn State since Nov. 23, 2013.
- Also added two solo tackles on special teams.

WEEK 5 OFFENSIVE

Kent Myers, QB, Utah State

- Rushed for a career-best 191 yards on a career-high 16 carries in Utah State's 33-18 Mountain West win over Colorado State.
- Completed 12-of-21 passes for 137 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions.
- Set a new Aggies record for most rushing yards by a quarterback.
- His 191 rushing yards are the most by a Football Bowl Subdivision quarterback this year.
- Recorded four rushes of 25 or more yards (34, 34, 27, 26).

DEFENSIVE

Ryan McAleenan, LB, UNLV

- Registered six tackles, a shared sack and an interception returned for a touchdown in UNLV's 23-17 victory over rival Nevada.
- Recorded a shared sack with teammate Tory McTyler in the third quarter for the Rebels' only quarterback takedown of the game.
- With UNLV leading 13-10 in the fourth quarter, McAleenan intercepted a pass and returned it 52 vards for a touchdown.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Logan Yunker, P, UNLV

- Recorded eight punts for an average of 42.9 yards in UNLV's 23-17 win at rival Nevada.
- Pinned the Wolf Pack inside the 10-yard line on four different occasions.

- Boise State has defeated Utah State in 12 consecutive contests. The last Aggies victory was Nov. 1, 1997 in Logan (24-20).
- When ranked in either the Associated Press or Coaches Poll, Boise State has compiled a 93-12 record.
- The Broncos have the second-best rush defense nationally, allowing only 60.7 vards on the ground per game. Through six games, Boise State has allowed 364 rushing yards. The last time Boise State allowed a 100-yard rusher was Nov. 15, 2014 when San Diego State's Donnel Pumphrey ran for 147 yards.
- Utah State's rush defense ranks 15th nationally, as the Aggies only allow 102.2 yards on the ground per game.
- Broncos defensive back Darian Thompson has tied the Mountain West record for career interceptions with 18. Thompson is tied with Utah's Eric Weddle. Bronco teammate Donte Deayon has picked off 17 passes, which is second-most all time. Thompson leads all active FBS defenders in career interceptions, while Deayon is tied for second.
- Broncos sophomore RB Jeremy McNichols is one of two FBS rushers with at least 12 rushing touchdowns this season. McNichols' 12 TDs on the ground are tied for the most nationally. McNichols is tied with LSU's Leonard Fournette.

- McNichols is the only FBS player to rush for multiple touchdowns in six consecutive games this season, and is the first to accomplish this feat since at least 2012.
- Boise State boasts the nation's highest win percentage since 2000. The Broncos have won 172 of 201 contests for a mark of .856.
- The Broncos have won four consecutive games since losing at BYU on Sept. 12, and in those victories, Boise State has won by a combined 180 points.
- The Broncos haven't committed a turnover in three straight games, an accomplishment that Boise State hasn't matched since joining the FBS ranks in 1996.
- Boise State is the only team in the FBS that ranks in the top 20 in both total offense (482.3) and total defense (259.5). The Broncos rank 19th in total offense and fifth in total defense.
- Utah State has won 13 of its last 15 Conference road games, and under head coach Matt Wells the Aggies are 7-2 in Mountain West road contests.
- Aggies starting QB Kent Myers has a 7-1 record as a starter, including 2-0 this season. In the last two weeks, Myers is 30-of-46 for 397 yards and has thrown two touchdowns. He is also third on the team with 181 rushing yards.

- UNLV is averaging 290 rushing yards in its last three games (870 yards). The Fresno State defense allows 211.2 rushing yards per contest.
- The Rebels haven't won in Fresno since 1983. That year, they defeated the Bulldogs 20-7, but have since dropped six consecutive games at Bulldog Stadium. A victory on Oct. 16 would give the Rebels their first back-to-back wins in the series since 1984.
- In the last 19 games, UNLV has only lost four fumbles. The Rebels set a program record for fewest lost fumbles in 2014 with three, and they've only lost one this year (vs. UCLA).
- The Rebels defense has intercepted 10 passes in 2015, which ranks as the
 fifth-most in the nation. The 10 picks, which have been recorded by nine
 different players, are three more than UNLV registered last season. The Rebels'
 nine players with an INT are tied with California for the most players with a
 pick this season.
- Fresno State is on a five-game losing streak, the longest by the Bulldogs since 2006. That season, they lost seven in a row from Sept. 9 to Nov. 1. The Bulldogs are looking to avoid their first three-game home losing streak since 2006, when they lost three in a row.

- Fresno State redshirt freshman QB **Kilton Anderson** recorded his first collegiate start last weekend vs. Utah State. Anderson is the fourth different Bulldog QB to start this season. Fresno State is the only FBS program with four different signal callers to record a start this season. Anderson completed 10-of-20 passes for 112 yards and one touchdown vs. the Aggies.
- Going back to the 2014 Hawai'i Bowl, Fresno State has started five different QBs in its last seven games. In those contests, the Bulldogs have a 1-6 record.
- Last Saturday vs. Utah State, Bulldog RB **Marteze Waller** scored his first rushing touchdown of the season, snapping an eight-game drought without a TD on the ground. It was the first rushing TD by any Bulldog this season. This was the longest stretch to open a season without a TD on the ground since 2000.
- For his career, Waller has rushed for 2,657 yards and 20 touchdowns. His yardage ranks 13th among active FBS rushers.

- Air Force and Colorado State are playing for the Ram-Falcon Trophy. Since the trophy was first awarded in 1980, the Falcons hold a 21-14 series lead.
- Colorado State WR Rashard Higgins has caught a pass in 31 consecutive games, every contest he has played in.
- Higgins, who is the only active FBS receiver with over 3,000 career receiving yards, has 15 100-yard receiving games, tied for the second-most in Mountain West history, behind BYU's Austin Collie (17). Last week he was limited to three receptions for 42 yards. This was the fewest receiving yards by Higgins in the last 16 games.
- Higgins ranks fourth in the Mountain West for career receiving TDs (27). Boise State's Matt Miller (2004, 07-08) and Wyoming's Jovon Bouknight (2002-05) are tied for third with 29 career TDs.
- CSU LB Cory James has recorded 23 career sacks, which ranks as the fourthmost in program and Mountain West history. James' 23 sacks are the most among active FBS defenders.
- The Falcons have scored in 276 consecutive games, an active streak that ranks third nationally and is the seventh-longest in NCAA history. The last time Air Force was shut out was in the 1992 Liberty Bowl vs. Ole Miss (13-0).

- Air Force is looking to begin Mountain West action 3-0 for the first time since 2010. That year, the Falcons knocked off BYU, Wyoming and Colorado State before losing to San Diego State. Colorado State looks to avoid its first 0-3 start to its Mountain West campaign since 2012.
- Falcons DB Brodie Hicks picked off two passes, the first two of his career, and recovered a fumble last weekend vs. Wyoming. This performance earned him Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- The Falcons have the fifth-ranked rush offense in the FBS, averaging 320.8 yards per contest. In five games, Air Force has carried the ball 297 times for 1,604 yards and 16 touchdowns.
- Air Force defense ranks fifth nationally, averaging 3.6 sacks per game. The Falcons have 18 sacks on the year and have registered at least three sacks in seven consecutive games, dating back to Nov. 28, 2014 (vs. Colorado State).
- Since the start of 2012, the Falcons are 2-10 on the road in Conference games.
- The Rams have used two QBs in five contests this season. Nick Stevens has thrown for 1,190 yards and 10 touchdowns, while Coleman Key has completed 21 passes for 251 yards and three TDs.

- Four of the five contests between Nevada and Wyoming have been decided by seven points or less. The first contest played between the two institutions (1937) was decided by two points. In 1997, the Cowboys won by four points and then in 2000 and 2012 the Wolf Pack won by seven points.
- Wyoming has lost nine consecutive games, which is the second-longest losing streak nationally behind New Mexico State (15). The last Cowboys victory was at Fresno State on Nov. 1, 2014 (45-17). This is their longest losing skid since the 2001-02 seasons, when they lost 12 in a row.
- Cowboy RB Brian Hill rushed for 128 yards on a career-high 24 carries last weekend at Air Force. This is Hill's eighth career 100-yard performance, which he has done within the last 11 games.
- HIII ranks fifth nationally, and second in the MW, with 797 rushing yards. He has eclipsed his freshman performance of 796 rushing yards and is on pace to become Wyoming's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2008 (Devin Moore - 1,303).
- Wyoming DE Eddie Yarbrough has racked up 33 career tackles for loss, the second-most all-time by a Cowboys defender. John Fletcher, who played from 2005-09, is atop the list with 36 career TFLs.
- The Cowboys haven't started a season 0-7 since 1939.

- Last Saturday vs. New Mexico, Nevada rushed for 351 yards and three touchdowns. The 351 yards on the ground are the second-most in the Brian Polian era. For the second time this season, RBs Don Jackson and James Butler both rushed for more than 100 yards.
- Nevada is the only FBS program with two players that have rushed for more than 500 yards. James Butler has ran for 571 yards and two touchdowns, while Don Jackson has scampered for 569 yards and six TDs. When it comes to national rushing yardage, Butler ranks 35th and Jackson is 36th.
- In the last two games, the Nevada defense has held its opponents to an average of 287 yards of total offense, including 136 yards through the air. Last weekend, the Wolf Pack held the Lobos rushing attack, who entered the contest ranked ninth nationally in rushing offense, to 135 yards. This was the fewest yards on the ground by New Mexico since Sept. 15, 2012 (84 - at Texas Tech).
- Last Saturday vs. the Lobos, Nevada's offense set season-high marks in points (35), total offense (517), first downs (30), yards per play (7.1), rushing yards (351) and touchdowns (5).

- New Mexico has won five consecutive contests against Hawai'i, four of which have been double-digit victories. Prior to the Lobos win streak, the Rainbow Warriors rattled off nine straight wins from 1983-1991.
- Last Saturday vs. Nevada, New Mexico ran the ball 37 times for 135 yards.
 This was the fewest yards on the ground by a Lobos team since Sept. 15, 2012 (84 at Texas Tech).
- Entering Week 7, the Lobos have the 11th-ranked rush offense, averaging 264.2 yards per contest.
- Also, last weekend the Lobos threw for more yards (138) than they rushed for (135). This is only the second time this has happened in the Bob Davie era.
- The Lobos enter their contest vs. Hawai'i with the 10th-best fourth-down conversion percentage (.833) in the FBS. New Mexico has converted on 10-of-12 attempts, and among institutions with double-digit fourth-down attempts, it ranks third.
- Rainbow Warriors senior LB Julian Gener racked up 19 total tackles against San Diego State on Oct. 10. This is the fourth-most by an FBS defender in a single

- game this season, and the most by a Hawai'i player since 2007.
- UNM WR Dameon Gamblin has 24 receptions for 313 yards in 2015. Last season, 16 receptions were the most by a Lobo pass-catcher and 293 were the most receiving yards. Gamblin is the first UNM receiver with more than 300 receiving yards since 2008 (Chris Hernandez - 428).
- Hawai'i has been shut out three times in 2015 (Ohio State, Wisconsin and Boise State). The last time this occured was in 1966 when the Rainbow Warriors were held scoreless by Air Force, Pacific and Utah State. Additionally, for the first time since 1998, Hawai'i has been shut out in consecutive games (Arkansas State and SMU).
- Hawai'i has recorded five or more tackles for loss in five of six games this season.
- Hawai'i DB Marrell Jackson is one of three FBS players to recover three fumbles this season. He joins Georgia State's Bobby Baker and Rice's Emmanuel Ellerbe. The three fumble recoveries are the most in the FBS.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

Next Week

- San Diego State has won seven of the last 10 contests vs. San José State. Additionally, 28 of the 38 total games have been double-digit lopsided victories.
- San Diego State's Rashaad Penny has a 37.5 kickoff return average on 11 returns in 2015. Penny is one of three players to return two kicks for touchdowns this season, which leads the nation. Penny leads all active FBS players with a 29.5 career kickoff return average.
- The Aztecs have scored in the opening quarter in 13 of the last 14 games.
- Aztecs RB Donnel Pumphrey is one of six active players to rush for more than 3,000 yards in his career. Pumphrey has logged 540 carries for 3,196 yards and 35 touchdowns. Pumphrey's rushing yards rank fourth-best among active FBS players.
- Pumphrey rushed for 148 yards and three touchdowns at Hawai'i on Oct. 10. This was Pumphrey's 16th 100-yard rushing performance of his career, which ranks second-most by a SDSU player and second all-time by a MW rusher. New Mexico's DonTrell Moore holds the MW record, registering 26 100-yard games in his career.
- The Aztecs have won 15 straight games when rushing for more than 200 yards, and are 23-2 under head coach Rocky Long when accomplishing this feat.
- The Spartans defense ranks third nationally in pass defense, allowing only 117.2 passing yards per game. Over the last 18 games, SJSU is allowing just

- 117.6 passing yards per contest. It has been ranked in the top 5 nationally in this category every week since Sept. 20, 2014.
- Last Saturday, UNLV became the first team to throw for more than 200 yards on the SJSU defense since Fresno State (207) on Nov. 8, 2014.
- Spartans RB Tyler Ervin, who has rushed for more than 100 yards in four games this year, enters Week 7 second nationally in rushing yards (874) and tied for third with 11 rushing TDs.
- On the year, Ervin has also recorded 222 receiving yards, 287 kick return yards and four punt return yards. In total, he has 1,387 all-purpose yards, the most in the FBS.
- Ervin has scored at least one touchdown in each of the Spartans first six games in 2015. The last SJSU player to score in six consecutive games was Sheldon Canley in 1990. Canley recorded a TD in seven straight games to end the
- Last Saturday vs. UNLV. Ervin led the Spartans' with 249 all-purpose vards and scored two touchdowns, including the game-winning score in overtime. For this performance, Ervin earned Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll accolades for Week 6.
- Spartans punter Michael Carrizosa leads the nation with 52.1 yards per punt on 22 boots. On the year, 12 (54.5%) of Carrizosa's punts have landed inside the opponents' 20-yard line.

The 2015 Mountain West Football Championship game will kick off at 4:30 p.m. PT/5:30 p.m. MT on Saturday, December 5. ESPN2 will broadcast the title match-up.

HOST SITE DETERMINATION

Host Determination. The Conference Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Committee ranking. The site determination shall be made no later than the Sunday following the final week of regular-season games, utilizing the latest available CFP poll.

If one divisional champion was ranked ahead of the other divisional champion in the CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If, in that same scenario, the divisional champion that was the highest-ranked in the CFP poll loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite of selected computer rankings following the games of November 29 will be used to determine the host.

If no Mountain West teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee poll, a composite of selected computer rankings following the games of November 28 will be used to determine the host.

Host Tie Breaker. In the event of a tie in the latest CFP Selection Committee ranking or the composite of selected computer rankings, the following comparison procedure shall be used (in order as necessary) to determine the site of the game:

- a) If one team was the winner of a Conference game between the two teams, it shall be the Championship Game host.
- b) If a tie still exists, winning percentage against common Conference opponents shall determine the Championship Game host.
- c) If a tie still exists, winning percentage against the next highest-placed common opponent in the Conference based upon (in order): 1. order of finish in the respective divisions, 2. record in all Conference games, and 3. most recent composite of selected computer rankings, proceeding through the Conference, will break the tie.
- d) Coin toss.

Divisional Champions. A divisional champion shall be the team with the highest winning percentage in all Conference games, both inter-divisional and intra-divisional, in the division. (Adopted January 2013)

a) Tie Games. A tie football game shall count as half-a-game won and half-a-game lost in the standings

[Note: A team ineligible under NCAA or Mountain West rules for post-season (bowl) competition shall not compete in the Championship Game.]

DIVISIONAL TIEBREAKERS

Tie Between Two Teams. In the event of a percentage tie for a divisional championship between two teams, if one team was the winner of the Conference game between the two teams, it shall be the divisional champion.

If no game was played between the two tied teams, or that game ended in a tie, the following comparison procedure shall be used to break the tie:

- a) Winning percentage in games played within the division.
- b) Winning percentage against the next highest-placed team in the division (based upon the team's record in all games played in the Conference), proceeding through the division.
- c) Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
- d) Highest CFP ranking (or the composite of selected computer rankings if neither team is ranked in the CFP rankings) following the final week of Conference regular-season games.
- e) Overall winning percentage against FBS opponents.
- f) Coin toss.

Tie Between More Than Two Teams:

In the event of a percentage tie for a divisional championship between more than two teams, the following comparison procedure shall be used to eliminate all but two tied teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure shall be used:

- a) Winning percentage in games played among the tied teams.
- b) Winning percentage in games played against division opponents.
- c) Winning percentage against the next highest-placed team in the division (based upon the team's record in all games played in the Conference), proceeding through the division.
- d) Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
- e) Highest CFP ranking (or the composite of selected computer rankings if neither team is ranked in the CFP rankings) following the final week of Conference regular-season games

MW AND THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

MW BOWL SYNOPSIS

The number of postseason appearances for the Mountain West will be driven by on-the-field performance, starting with the opportunity to play in the national semifinals or another New Year's Day bowl game as part of the College Football Playoff arrangement. The highest-rated champion from among the five non-contracted conferences

the five non-contracted conferences (American, C-USA, MAC, MW, Sun Belt, or chosen by the playoff selection committee) is guaranteed a slot in the system. In the 16 seasons since the league's inception, the Mountain West's champion or a current MW member has secured that position 12 times, placing teams in the Fiesta (3), Rose and Sugar (2) Bowls during that period.

The MW also has agreements with seven (7) different bowl games that in any given year will generate as many as seven (7) postseason opportunities for its member institutions. These include primary positions in some or all years with the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Gildan New Mexico Bowl, Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl, San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, Hawai'i Bowl and the Arizona Bowl - and a secondary position with the Cactus Bowl.

NOTE: The MW is the primary backup for the Ticket City Cactus Bowl if the Big 12 or Pac-12 does not fill.

<u>ABOUT THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF</u>

In its second season, the College Football Playoff format remains unchanged: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and the national championship game played in a different city every year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

THE SELECTION COMMITTEE

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performances during the regular season, including strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game.

THE ROTATION

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.
