

POST-GAME NOTES: UNLV 80, NEW MEXICO 69
JAN. 8, 2019

- UNLV now leads the series 34-25.

Post-game Notes:

- There were nine ties and 17 lead changes in this game. This serves as the most lead changes and ties in a Lobo game this season.
 - Prior to Tuesday's contest, the most amount of lead changes was nine against Iona on Nov. 13, 2018, while the most ties were six in the first game against CSUN.
 - Although there were 17 lead changes, the Lobos still led for 19:40 (49.2 percent of the game).
 - UNM's largest lead of the game came with 56 seconds left in the first half at 42-33 off of a Vance Jackson jumper.
- Four UNM players scored in double digits including: Vance Jackson (14), Corey Manigault (13), Carlton Bragg (12) and Makuach Maluach (12).
- UNM shot less than 30 percent from behind the arc (22.2 percent). The last time the Lobos shot under 30 percent was against St. Mary's on Dec. 7, 2018 (15.4 percent).
- Three out of six Lobos were perfect from the free-throw line.
 - Maluach went 4-for-4, Bragg 2-for-2 and Pinchuk made his only attempt.
 - As a team, the Lobos shot 86.4 percent from the line, going 19-for-22.
- Eight of the nine Lobos that played in the game recorded at least one point.
- Anthony Mathis was one assist short from tying his career high of five.
- Anthony Mathis' previous career high of minutes played was 36. In Tuesday's game, he was on the court for 38 minutes.
- Corey Manigault had a season high of three steals.
- Manigault saw five more minutes on the court compared to his previous season high of 25 minutes. On Tuesday, he had a total of 30 minutes played.
- The best Lobo scoring run in the game was 8-0, which occurred from the 8:00 mark to the 6:13 mark in the first half, with all points attributed to Carlton Bragg.
 - During the run, UNM went from a three-point deficit at 26-23 to a five-point lead at 31-26.
