San José State record: 1-3, 0-0 Mountain West. The Spartans concluded its non-conference schedule losing 44-10 at Iowa State on September 24.

New Mexico record: 1-2, 0-0 Mountain West. The Lobos are in the midst of a two-game losing streak. Preceding a bye week ending September 24, New Mexico lost at Rutgers, 37-28.

San José State head coach Ron Caragher: In his fourth season as the San José State head coach. Has a record of 16-25 with the Spartans. Overall, he is in his 10th season as a college head coach and has a 60-47 record. Caragher's first six seasons as a head coach were at the University of San Diego. He is 1-0 as a head coach against New Mexico.

New Mexico head coach Bob Davie: In his fifth season at New Mexico. Has a record of 19-34 with the Lobos. Overall, he is in his tenth season as a major college head coach and has a record of 54-59. He is 0-1 as a head coach against San José State.

Series history: San José State leads the series, 12-4-1. The Spartans have wins in each of the last three games since 1998. A year ago, San Jose State was a 31-21 winner in the first game these teams played as Mountain West opponents. The only other time these teams played in a conference contest was on September 26, 1998 when San Jose State defeated New Mexico, 37-20 in a Western Athletic Conference encounter. New Mexico's last win in the series was a 36-30 victory in Albuquerque on October 9, 1976.

Two Spartan greats led the Lobos: Dud DeGroot, the most successful head coach in San Jose State football history, and **Bob Titchenal,** captain of the 1939 undefeated Spartan team, would eventually become the football head coach at the University of New Mexico.

DeGroot compiled a 60-19-8 record during the 1932 through 1939 seasons. In his first season at San Jose State, the Spartans were undefeated for the first time with a 7-0-2 record. In his final season, San Jose State was 13-0 scoring 322 points while yielding just 29. His Spartans had eight shutouts that season.

DeGroot was New Mexico's head coach from 1950 through 1952. His teams compiled a 13-15 win-loss record topped by the 1952 team that posted a 7-2 overall mark. The 1952 Lobos had five shutouts and gave up just 46 points.

Titchenal was an All-American center at San Jose State and would go on to play in the NFL for Washington (1940-42) and for San Francisco (1946) and Los Angeles (1947) in the All-American Football Conference. He was New Mexico's head coach from 1953 through 1955. The Lobos were 12-15-1 in those three seasons including losses to San Jose State in 1954 (26-14) and 1955 (14-0).

Titchenal was San Jose State's head coach from 1957 through 1964. The Spartans had a combined 33-45-1 win-loss record in those seasons and lost to the Lobos in 1962 (25-13). The best-known player he coached was quarterback **Dick Vermeil** who would go on to lead the St. Louis Rams to the Super Bowl XXXIV championship.

Ron Caragher on KRTY FM/KLIV AM:

San José State head coach Ron Caragher is heard weekly on KRTY (95.3 FM) and KLIV (1590 AM, San José), Tuesdays at 6:30 a.m. (PT). Gary Scott Thomas and Julie Stevens serve as co-hosts. **Barry Sacks heading back to Albuquerque:** San Jose State defensive line coach **Barry Sacks** had the same coaching responsibilities during the 2014 and 2015 seasons at the University of New Mexico. In his lengthy coaching career, Sacks has stops in the states of California, Oregon, Nevada, Idaho and Colorado.

Last Mountain West road win: San Jose State's last Mountain West road win was a November 21, 2015 triumph at Hawai'i, 42-23. Since joining the Mountain West in 2013, the Spartans are 6-6 in conference road games.

Mountain West openers: Since joining the Mountain West, San Jose State is 0-3 in conference openers. The Spartans lost to Utah State in 2013, Nevada in 2014 and at Air Force in 2015.

San José State in top-20 for turnovers gained: For the third week in a row, San Jose State ranks in the top-20 for turnovers gained. The Spartans' nine turnovers gained is tied for 14th among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools. Despite not gaining any turnovers at Tulsa, San José State gained six turnovers in the Portland State win, two in the loss to Utah and one at lowa State.

A +6 turnover margin vs. Portland State: The Portland State win marked the first time since September 27, 2008 at Hawai'i that San Jose State completed a game with a +6 turnover margin. In the 20-17 win at Hawai'i, the Spartans came away with four interceptions and two fumble recoveries.

Opponents converting turnovers into points: San José State's opponents are making the most of a Spartan giveaway this season. San Jose State's 10 turnovers (seven interceptions and three fumbles) resulted in 57 opponent points in the first four games. Iowa State scored 23 points off of four errant Spartan passes that turned into interceptions.

The Spartans' nine turnovers gained produced 17 points in four games.

Stay awake with ZZ's: Zamore Zigler became the first San Jose State freshman since Jarrod Lawson to record two 100-plus yard rushing games in a season when he led all rushers with 104 yards on 24 carries at lowa State on September 24. His first 100-plus yard rushing game was in the Portland State game on September 10 when he ran for 111 yards on 15 carries.

San Jose State career rushing leader **Deoncé Whitaker** is the last Spartan freshman to record three 100-plus yard rushing games as a freshman.

First time starters: After four games, 12 players made their first major college start for San Jose State.

The San Jose State freshman QB phenomenon: Josh Love became the fifth San Jose State freshman of any kind to start a game at quarterback since 1972 NCAA legislation for the reinstatement of freshmen eligibility. Prior to Love, **Adam Tafralis** in 2004 was the most recent freshman to begin a game at quarterback.

Love's appearance was the 12th time a San Jose State freshman started a game at quarterback since 1972. **Doug Allen** (1984, one); **Greg Centilli** (1988, two), **Marcus Arroyo** (1998, five) and Tafralis (2004, three) were the other occasions a freshman started at quarterback for the Spartans.

Improved kick return coverage: San José State is ranked fourth in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in defending kickoff returns at 14.2 yards per return.

In his first season as the Spartans' kickoff specialist, **Michael Carrizosa** has 15 touchbacks credited in 21 kickoffs (71.4 percent). A year ago, the Spartans finished 118th in kickoff yards per return allowing 25.3 per return and had 27 touchbacks on 69 attempts (39.1 percent).

Promising pass rush: San José State has eight quarterback sacks after four games. The Spartans began the season with four quarterback sacks in the Tulsa game. A year ago, the Spartans did not get their eighth sack until the ninth game of the season.

Linebacker **Frank Ginda** is tied for 43rd nationally with a 0.75/game average. He has quarterback sack in each of the first three games. Last year's team leader was defensive end **Eugene Taylor** who finished the season with 3.0 sacks.

100-catch Spartans: Billy Freeman, listed on the John Mackey Award preseason watch list, became the 28th San Jose State player and second this season to reach the 100-reception threshold in a career. He is just the third San Jose State tight end with 100 or more career receptions.

In the season opener at Tulsa, wide receiver **Tim Crawley** caught his 100th pass as a San Jose State player.

66 points for the Spartans: San José State's 66 points in the Portland State win rank as the fifth highest scoring game in school history since 1946. The two highest are the back-to-back games against the University of Mexico to end the 1948 and open the 1949 seasons.

A 400-plus yard ground game: San Jose State's 409 yards rushing in the Portland State win are the most by a Spartan team since a 476-yard performance on October 28, 2006 when San Jose State rushed for 476 yards in a win over Louisiana Tech. The 409 figure is the eighth time a San Jose State team rushed for at least 400 yards in a game and ranks eighth on the school's single game rushing list.

The 409 rushing yards rank as the 11th best single-game total in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in games played through September 24.

Two 100-yard rushers: For the first time in 15 years, two San Jose State players rushed for at least 100 yards in the same game in the Portland State victory. Graduate student **Deontae Cooper** with 126 yards and one touchdown on 18 carries and redshirt freshman **Zamore Zigler** with 15 carries for 111 yards and two scores reached the 100-yard plateau.

Long runs leave marks: Two of San Jose State's nine touchdowns in the Portland State game came on runs of 87 yards by **Malik Roberson** and 74 yards by **Zamore Zigler**. Roberson's touchdown burst matches UCF's Adrian Killins for the third longest run in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2016 and ties the sixth longest rushing play in school history.

The two long touchdown runs for Roberson and Zigler mark the first time San Jose State rushed for two touchdowns in one game of 70 or more yards.

Brothers on the field at the same time: In two of the first four games (Tulsa and Iowa State), brothers **Jeremy Kelly** and **Jermaine Kelly** played as defensive backs together. Though San José State has had other brother combinations on the same team in the last seven years, the last time two brothers played on the field at the same time was in the 2009 season when defensive end **Carl Ihenacho** and his younger brother, defensive back **Duke Ihenacho**, were starters for the Spartans.

Crawford 10-for-10: Bryce Crawford joined an exclusive group of San Jose State kick scorers with 10 successful kick-scoring attempts in a game. He was 9-for-9 on PAT attempts and converted a 22-yard field goal against Portland State. The single-game school record for PATs in a modern-era San Jose State game since 1950 is 10 by **Jeff Carr** against Rice on October 2, 2004. Another Spartan with at least 10 successful kick-scoring attempts in a game is former San Francisco 49ers kicker **Joe Nedney** who was 7-for-8 in PATs and kicked three field goals in a 64-45 win over Pacific in 1991.

Season captains named: Wide receiver **Tim Crawley**, linebacker **Christian Tago**, quarterback **Kenny Potter** and safety **Maurice McKnight** were named team captains for the 2016 season. McKnight is the only non-senior among the four. Tago, yet to play a game this season while recovering from an injury, was one of four team captains last season.

Seven get the scholarship word: On August 20, seven players were placed on scholarship. Tight end **LeVander Brown**, wide receiver **Tre Hartley**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, quarterback **Josh Love** and linebackers **Mark Amann**, **Alex Manigo** and **Epie Sona** were informed after the team's scrimmage. Love is a redshirt freshman; Hartley and Hawkins, sophomores; and Brown, Amann, Manigo and Sona, seniors.

The graduate transfer: Running back **Deontae Cooper** from the University of Washington and wide receiver **Dontonio Jordan** from Stanford University are two graduate transfers on the 2016 San José State football team.

San José State's 99th season: The 2016 season marks San José State's 99th playing college football. According to available records, the Spartans began playing football in 1893, but did not have games in 1894, 1897, 1901-20 and 1943-45.

New home stadium name: Recently, San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) agreed to a 15-year naming rights agreement for Spartan Stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.
