#HIGHLIGHTS

(NOTES FROM AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST IN 140 CHARACTERS OR LESS)

- The @MountainWest has two running backs rank in the top-5 nationally in total rushing yards: SDSU's **Rashaad Penny** (716) & Hawai'i's **Diocemy Saint Juste** (554).
- @SJSUSpartanFB LB **Frank Ginda** leads the nation with 14.6 tackles per game.
- @GoAztecs' win vs. #19/19 Stanford on Sept. 16 is the highest ranked opponent a MW team has defeated since Oct. 3, 2014 (Utah State over #19/18 BYU).
- @GoAztecs have won 34 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards as a team.
- @GoAztecs are ranked #19 in AP Top-25 & #21 in Amway Coaches Poll. The #19 AP rank matches the Aztecs' highest since 1978.
- @GoAztecs RB **Rashaad Penny** is the 1st player in @MountainWest history to win player of the week honors in four consecutive weeks.
- Penny ranks second nationally in rushing yards per game (179.0), total rushing yards (716) and all-purpose yards per game (230.0).
- Penny is the only FBS player to score a receiving, rushing and kick return TD in a single game this season.
- @GoAztecs have won 25 of their last 28 games. This .893 win percentage is third-best nationally in that timespan trailing only Alabama (.967) and Clemson (.935).
- @GoAztecs are 4-0 for the first time since 1981. It is the second consecutive year the @MountainWest has had a team jump out to a 4-0 start.
- @unlvfootball's **Devonte Boyd** needs 749 receiving yds to hold the @MountainWest record for career receiving yds.
- Boyd's 2,886 career receiving yards are the 3rd-most among active pass-catchers nationally.
- @USUFootball has blocked three punts in its last three games and 13 in the last five seasons.
- The Aggies rank third nationally and first in the MW with six fumble recoveries.
- @HawaiiFootball WR **John Ursua** ranks second nationally, hauling in 10 receptions per game.
- @CSUFootball's 31-point win over Oregon State on Aug. 26 is the largest against an Autonomous 5 opponent in program history.
- @CSUFootball's 31-point victory is the 5th-largest by a @MountainWest member over an Autonomous 5 team since 2010.
- @CSUFootball has sold a program-record of more than 15,000 season tickets as of the beginning of August. The previous school record was 11,500.
- @BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the fourth consecutive season.
- @GoAztecs are the first team in MW history to be selected as unanimous divisional champs in back-to-back seasons.
- @MountainWest institutions have recorded Top-25 victories in four of the last five years.
- In the 18 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant 8 times.
- @wyo\_football DB **Andrew Wingard** ranks fourth nationally in career average tackles per game (9.67).
- @BroncoSportsFB has produced a 1,000-yd rusher in eight straight seasons, which is tied with Auburn as the longest active streak in the nation.
- Against Western Carolina, @HawaiiFootball blocked 3 kicks, a program record. In 2016, UH led the @MountainWest with 4 blocked kicks all season.

NATION'S BEST RUNNING BACK

San Diego State RB **Rashaad Penny** enters Week 5 ranking second nationally in rushing yards per game (179.0), total rushing yards (716), all-purpose yards (230.0) and total touchdowns (9). The senior from Norwalk, California, is the first player in Mountain West history to win Offensive Player of the Week honors in four consecutive weeks.

Penny became the 11th MW player and second Aztec to earn Walter Camp weekly honors after his Sept. 9 performance at Arizona State. Penny rushed for a career-high 216 yards and 3 total touchdowns.

JOSH ALLEN ATTENTION

Wyoming junior quarterback **Josh Allen** is one of the nation's top quarterbacks and he has the national interest to accompany the talent.

After the 2017 NFL Draft, ESPN NFL Insider Adam Scheffer said of Allen, "one personnel director told me this weekend, you can put it in the books, Josh Allen will be the No. 1 pick in the NFL draft next year."

If Allen were selected with the top pick, the Mountain West would have the most No. 1 overall selections among Group of 5 conferences.

CONFERENCE OPENER

Week 5 will be the Mountain West opener for Colorado State, Fresno State, Nevada and UNLV. The Rams, who play at Hawai'i, have a 6-12 mark in MW openers.

The Bulldogs have a 3-2 record in MW openers, while the Wolf Pack, who will travel to Fresno this week, has an identical 3-2 record in league openers. Fresno State and Nevada joined the Conference prior to the 2012 season.

UNLV has won two straight league openers.

MOUNTAIN VS. WEST

The Mountain Division holds an all-time record of 50-29 (.633) against opponents from the West Division since divisional play was established in the Mountain West in 2013.
