NEVADA HOSTS NEW MEXICO IN MOUNTAIN WEST TILT AT MACKAY STADIUM

Nevada returns to Mackay Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 10, hosting New Mexico in a Mountain West contest ... Kickoff is set for 4 p.m. PT between the Wolf Pack (2-3, 0-1) and Lobos (3-2, 1-0) ... The game will be broadcast digitally by the Mountain West Network, powered by Campus Insiders, with Ari Wolfe and Darius Walker on the call ... Nevada is coming off a 23-17 loss to rivals UNLV, while New Mexico defeated in-state rivals New Mexico State, 38-29, last week ... The series history between the Pack and Lobos is tied, 2-2-1 ... This is just the second meeting between the two programs as MW foes ... Saturday's game will feature two of the top five rushing attacks in the MW, as New Mexico ranks second (290.0) in rushing yards per game while Nevada ranks fifth (196.6) ... The Wolf Pack played in front of 29,551 fans last week in the Battle for the Fremont Cannon, marking the ninth-largest crowd in Mackay Stadium history ... Nevada suffered just its second defeat in the past 11 meetings to the Rebels ... True freshman FS Dameon Baber recorded an interception against UNLV and now leads the nation in interceptions by freshmen despite playing in just two games Senior DE Lenny Jones tallied 2.0 sacks against UNLV, improving to seventh in the Wolf Pack's record book for career sacks with 17.0 ... Senior RB Don Jackson is just 62 all-purpose yards away from hitting 2,000 in his Wolf Pack career ... Junior WR Hasaan Henderson is three receptions away from his 100th career catch at Nevada.

Student-athletes are generally not available for telephone interviews unless pre-arranged through the Nevada Athletics Communications office.

Coach Brian Polian and selected studentathletes will be available on a weekly basis at a press conference on Tuesdays, beginning at 11:30 a.m. Requests for student-athletes for the press conference must be submitted no later than 3 p.m. on Mondays to the Nevada Athletics Communications office.

Generally, the Nevada Media Services office will live-stream the Tuesday press conference via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference.

CREDENTIALS

All requests for credentials & parking passes for Wolf Pack football games should be made through the Nevada Media Services Office no later than 48 hours before game time. Please fax credential requests on company letterhead to (775) 784-4386. Media can reach the Mackay Stadium press box (second level on the west side of the stadium) by using the elevator or the stairways on the north and south ends of the building.

WEEKLY RADIO SHOW

Brian Polian's weekly radio show with Ryan Radtke is on Wednesday evenings from 7-8 p.m. and will be held at the Little Waldorf Saloon across from campus. It is available in Northern Nevada on ESPN Radio 94.5 and an archive will be posted on the Mountain West Network within 24 hours. In addition to Polian, Radtke will interview assistant coaches and players on the show.

Postgame Interviews

In general, no coaches or student-athletes are available to media on the field or en route to the locker room, with the exception

of the live, originating television broadcast if pre-arranged. Nevada's locker room is closed to the media.

Interview requests should be submitted to Chad Hartley of the Nevada Athletics Communications office no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter. Assistant coaches are not available after games. Generally, the Nevada Media Services office will live-stream the post-game press conference via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference.

Home games:

Postgame interviews will be conducted in the Peteresen Athletic Academic Center (which will also serve as a photographer work area during games). Coach Polian will be available to media after the NCAA's 10-minute cooling off period, followed by selected student-athletes.

Road games:

Polian and selected student-athletes will be available outside the visiting locker room or in the designated visiting media interview area after the cooling off period.

MEDIA WORK AREA

The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, ethernet and phone lines available during the game and up to one and half hours after the conclusion of each game. The postgame interview area at the Petersen Athletic Academic Center is similarly equipped. Media may work in either location but are asked to work in the Peteresen location if working more than 90 minutes postgame. The Mackay press box will also serve as a game and media operations location postgame so the Petersen location will likely be a quieter work environment after the conclusion of the press conference.

THE BLITZ

Nevada head coach Brian Polian and two players are available each week at the Wolf Pack's Blitz luncheon, which is usually hosted at the Peppermill Hotel-Casino. Doors open at 11:30 a.m. and the cost is \$17. This luncheon is open to the media and general public. The luncheons begin Monday, Sept. 12 and run through Nov. 23.

PARKING

Media parking permits for gameday are available via the Nevada Media Services Office are generally for level two of the West Stadium Parking Complex. Levels five and six are free and open to the public. Local television satellite trucks have designated parking near the main (southwest) entrance to the stadium. These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.





HEAD COACH BRIAN POLIAN (@BrianPolian)



As Brian Polian enters his third season as the head coach of the Nevada football team, the production of his tenure in Reno continues to emerge.

The spring semester in 2015 produced the first team average of a B or better in the classroom in program history. The Wolf Pack combined

for a stellar 3.05 GPA. Nevada football's APR score – a metric used by the NCAA to chart academic success and promote higher graduation rates – is on the rise with a single-year 958 in the most recent report and projected scores expected to rise into the 970s (1,000 is a perfect score).

Every member of the 2014 senior class has already graduated, or will this year. That from a team that challenged from the West Division title in the Mountain West and went to the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl – the ninth bowl game in the last 10 years for the Wolf Pack program.

In 2015, Polian's Wolf Pack returns just 13 seniors but has a large junior class emerging and another heralded recruiting class contributing depth to the program. As the new culture of Wolf Pack football continues to grow, Nevada looks to again compete for a Mountain West crown.

The Polian era of Nevada football was ushered in on Jan. 11, 2013 with the hiring of Brian Polian to serve as the 25th head coach in the history of the Wolf Pack program.

At 40 years old and in his third season as a head coach, Polian is still one of the youngest head coaches at the FBS level. He brought to Nevada an impressive football pedigree that includes coach-

ing stops at Notre Dame, Stanford and Texas A&M as part of a 18-year coaching career.

A treacherous schedule in 2013 led to a 4-8 record in Polian's first year with five Wolf Pack players earning All-Mountain West honors with Joel Bitonio and Brock Hekking named to the first team and Brandon Wimberly, Charles Garrett and Chase Tenpenny earning second-team recognition.

Eight members of Polian's program earned distinction for the their work in the classroom with Academic All-MW accolades. And four players earned the Mountain West Scholar-Athlete Award for earning a grade-point average of 3.5 or higher during the 2013-14 academic year.

The tide turned from year one to year two as Polian's program reached new heights on and off the field in 2014. The success on the field was evident with a seven-win season that included a win over Pac-12 foe Washington State at Mackay Stadium. Nevada also scored impressive road wins at BYU, Hawaii and San Jose State and capped the regular season with a dominating win at UNLV, returning the Fremont Cannon to its home in Cashell Fieldhouse.

In Polian's first two seasons, Nevada also had two players, Joel Bitonio and Nigel Haikins, inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hampshire Society, which honors significant achievement on the field and in the classroom.

Nevada has also sent nearly 10 players onto NFL rosters or into training camps over the past two seasons under Polian, highlighted by Bitonio's second-round selection and dominating rookie season, with the Cleveland Browns.

In June of 2015, Polian was selected to represent the Mountain West Conference on the inaugural CFO Competition Committee.

MACKAY STADIUM RENOVATION PROJECT



Project Features for 2015

• A two-story, 2.800-square foot restroom facility is being built in the southwest corner of the stadium and will be available for the 2015 season.

Project Features for 2016

- 4,156 total new seats will be added to the stadium, while 7,513 bleacher seats will be removed.
- 3,880 chairback seats will be added; 2,860 to the west side; 1,020 to the east side.
- An 8,000 square-foot Stadium Club will be added and will serve as the focal point of hospitality at Mackay. The members-onl, full-service hosting area will include a fullservice bar and kitchen
- 38 brand new loge boxes will be added to Mackay Stadium.
- Aisles will be widened and handrails will be installed.
- 12 east side boxes will be converted to indoor/outdoor seating.

The Nevada athletics department is finalizing plans for the upcoming \$11.5 million renovation of Mackay Stadium.

The project, which was approved by the state's Board of Regents in December, began this spring with the construction of two-story, 2,800-square foot restroom facility that is expected to be done in time for the Sept. 3 season opener against UC Davis. The bulk of the stadium renovation will begin after this season and will be completed prior to the 2016 season.

The renovation will feature the construction of an 8,000-square foot stadium club on the west side and the installation of loge boxes, club seats and chairback seating on the east and west sides of the stadium. The plans also call for new ADA accessible seating areas and the widening of aisles with the installation of handrails to increase safety and fan experience at the stadium.

With all of the improvements, a re-seating process will be necessary as seating configurations in seven sections will be affected and capacity will be reduced. While the re-seating will not go into effect until the 2016 season, the process is set to commence in August. The athletics department has produced a 24-page guide and will launch a website dedicated to the project.

In terms of seating, the project includes 38 new four-seat loge boxes, 238 club seats and 3,880 chairback seats. A new elevator will be installed on the west side of the stadium as part of the stadium club project.

The project has been in the planning stages for more than three years as athletics department officials have worked directly with fan focus groups and analyzed data collected in fan surveys. The additional amenities will create new price points for the stadium. Nevada will remain one of the top values in the Mountain West Conference as its most expensive seat will remain in the bottom half of a comparison of the 12-team league.

LAST TIME THEY MET

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) - Nevada's Cody Fajardo threw three touchdown passes and ran for a career-high 186 yards on Saturday, Nov. 17, 2012 to help the Wolf Pack beat New Mexico 31-24 and end a three-game losing streak.

Fajardo hit Brandon Wimberly from 2 yards out for what proved to be the winning score with 4 minutes left in the third quarter for Nevada (7-4, 4-3 Mountain West). The Lobos (4-8, 1-6), who have lost five straight, got 72 rushing yards and two touchdowns from quarterback Cole Gautsche, but he didn't complete any passes.

New Mexico had a chance to tie it late in the fourth quarter after Dallas Bollema intercepted Fajardo and returned it 37 yards to the Nevada 14. But on third-and-7 from the 11, Jordan Hanson recovered a Crusoe Gongbay fumble with 4:17 left and the Wolf Pack ran out the clock with four first downs.

LAST TIME OUT

Tyler Stewart's pass on 4th-and-10 from the UNLV 47-yard line fell incomplete with just 35 seconds left in the game, and with that, Nevada suffered a 23-17 upset to its rivals UNLV on Saturday in the Battle for the Fremont Cannon. The Wolf Pack (2-3, 0-1) scored a pair of touchdowns in the fourth quarter but couldn't overcome a slow start against the Rebels (2-3, 0-1) in front of 29,551 fans at Mackay Stadium – the ninth-largest crowd in the stadium's history. Nevada suffered just its second loss to UNLV in the past 11 meetings between the two programs. Stewart passed for 202 yards and a score and ran for a career-high 61 yards while junior WR Jerico Richardson set season-highs with eight receptions and 87 yards. On the defensive side, senior LB Matthew Lyons posted a game-high 12 tackles while freshman FS Dameon Baber tallied his third interception in the past two games.

SERIES HISTORY

The series history between the Wolf Pack and Lobos is tied, 2-2-1. This is just the second meeting between the programs as Mountain West opponents, while the contest will be just the fourth meeting between the two in the modern era. Nevada is 1-0-1 against the Lobos all-time at Mackay Stadium. The Wolf Pack has won the last two games against the Lobos, posting a 31-24 win on the road in 2012 and a 49-7 victory at home in 2011.

• Only four Wolf Pack players have seen action in their careers against New Mexico; Seniors Lenny Jones, Bryan Lane Jr., Jordan Dobrich and Rykeem Yates saw the field in Nevada's 2012 victory against the Lobos. Jones started at defensive end in that game and posted one tackle.

PROGRAM HISTORY

Nevada is in its 109th season of collegiate football, seeking win No. 531 in the program's strong history. The Wolf Pack sports an all-time record of 530-464-33 (.533). Since joining the FBS in 1992, Nevada is 154-130 overall and 99-66 in conference play.

JACKSON APPROACHING 2,000 CAREER ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

Senior RB Don Jackson boasts 1,938 career all-purpose yards at Nevada and is just 62 yards away from hitting the 2,000-yard milestone.

HENDERSON APPROACHES 100TH CAREER RECEPTION AT NEVADA

Junior WR Hasaan Henderson's third next catch will give him 100 career receptions at Nevada. Henderson boasts 97 receptions, 1,160 yards and seven touchdowns in 27 games with the Wolf Pack.

IMPORTANCE OF THE GROUND GAME

A key to the Wolf Pack's success under head coach Brian Polian's downhill rushing mantra has been establishing the ground game. Nevada is 11-2 (.846) when outrushing its opponent compared to 2-15 (.118) when being outrushed in the Polian era. This season, Nevada is 2-0 when leading in rushing compared to 0-3 when trailing.

- Magic Number, 200: Nevada is also 10-3 when rushing for at least 200 yards and is 3-14 when being held under 200 rushing yards under Polian.

A TALE OF TWO HALVES

The Wolf Pack was shutout in the first half against its rivals UNLV, marking Nevada's first shutout in the opening half since Dec. 1, 2012 against Boise State. The Rebels led, 246-103, in total offense in the first half while four of Nevada's first six drives began with its own 10 yard line.

Nevada stepped it up in the second half, limiting the Rebels to 55 yards of total offense on 23 plays while posting a 240-55 advantage in total offense in the second half. In the fourth quarter alone, Nevada posted a 171-16 advantage in yards.

PICK-SIX PROVES COSTLY IN BATTLE FOR THE FREMONT CANNON

Nevada pulled within three points of UNLV (13-10) with less than 11 minutes remaining in the contest, but a 52-yard interception return for a touchdown by Ryan McAleenan put the Rebels ahead 20-10. It marked Nevada's first allowed interception return for a touchdown since Oct. 4, 2014 against Boise State. The Wolf Pack is 0-4 in the Brian Polian era when allowing either a defensive or special teams touchdown.

BOY EMERGING AS ONE OF NATION'S TOP PUNTERS

Junior P Alex Boy has punted 32 times this season for 1,430 yards, ranking third in the Mountain West and 23rd nationally with a 44.7 yards per punt average.

- Of Boy's 32 punts, 17 have either been downed inside the 20-yard line (10) or traveled 50+ (7) yards.

CELIS MAKING STRIDES IN PUNT RETURN

Sophomore RB James Butler has rushed 66 times for a team-high 426 yards this season. Butler ranks fourth in the MW in average rushing yards per game (85.2) and 46th in FBS. Butler ran for a career-high 177 yards against Buffalo and eclipsed the 1,000 yard career rushing mark in the process.

- Nevada's offensive line featured the same starting five for the first four games of the season. Two of those starters aren't listed on this week's depth due to injury; Adam Khouri and Jeremy Macauley.
- Seniór LB Bryań Lane Jr. is slated to make his 30th career start at Nevada this Saturday.

MELCHER RETURNS TO THE FIELD

Sophomore WR Tucker Melcher made his first career appearance in the second half of Nevada's victory over UC Davis. The Reno native missed the 2014 season after suffering a serious brain infection that led to extendeded hospitilization. Now at full strength, Melcher is listed in the depth chart as a second-string F-WR.

JONES LEADS CONFERENCE IN SACKS

Senior DE Lenny Jones and Fresno State's Ejiro Ederaine each lead the Mountain West with 4.0 sacks. On the season, Jones boasts 17 tackles, 4.0 sacks, 4.0 TFL, three passes defended and one forced fumble.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

The Wolf Pack offense has generated 24 explosive plays (15+ rushing/20+ passing) on the season. Last week, Nevada was held to three explosive plays, matching a season-low mark.

BUTLER SETS RECORD WITH 91-YARD RUSH

With Nevada backed up to its own four-yard line in the first quarter against Buffalo, James Butler broke free for a 91-yard rush down to the Bull's five-yard line. Butler scored on the very next play to tie the game at 7-7 with 3:07 left in the first quarter. Butler's long run marked the third-longest rush in program history and the longest non-scoring run in program history. Butler's 91-yard run is the second-longest rush in the MW this season.

NEVADA TABBED FOR THIRD PLACE FINISH IN WEST DIVISION

The conference coaches voted Nevada to finish third in the MW West Division in the preseason All-MW poll. The Wolf Pack earned 113 points, finishing ahead of San José State, Hawai'i and UNLV. San Diego State earned 27 first place votes and 177 points overall to lead the West Division, followed by Fresno State. The reigning conference champions Boise State earned 177 points and was predicted to finish first in the Mountain Division. Utah State was voted second, followed by Colorado State, Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico.

- In 2014, the Wolf Pack earned three first place votes and 130 points total, and was predicted to finish third in the West Division. Nevada went on to a 7-6 record, 4-4 mark in the conference and placed third in its division.
- In 2013, Nevada was predicted to place fourth in the MW Division before posting a 4-8 record, a 3-5 mark in league play and finishing fifth.

SEAU AND BOY NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST TEAM

Nevada landed two student-athletes to the Preseason All-Mountain West team, which was voted on by coaches at MW media days in Las Vegas. Senior DE lan Seau and junior P Alex Boy represented the Wolf Pack on the preseason all-conference squad.

TEAM CAPTAINS

The Wolf Pack named senior RB Don Jackson, sophomore LT Austin Corbett, senior LB Jordan Dobrich and senior DE Lenny Jones its team captains for the 2015 season in a vote by players. Dobrich becomes Nevada's first three-time captain in recent program history, while Corbett is just the second sophomore to be named a captain in recent Pack history.

THREE DOT REVIEW - THE 2014 SEASON

Nevada posted a 7-6 record last season, went 4-4 in Mountain West play and advanced to the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl ... Year two of the Brian Polian era saw Nevada improve by three victories and reach the program's ninth bowl game in the past 10 years ... The Wolf Pack's highlight victories includes; downing Pac-12 foe Washington State at a white-out Mackay Stadium, overturning a two-score deficit to win at BYU, dismantling San Diego State at home with a 16-point victory margin and returning the Fremont Cannon to Reno with a blowout win at UNLV to conclude the regular season Nevada went 4-4 in the MW and finished third in the West Division ... The Pack ranked fourth in the conference in scoring offense (29.2) and seventh in scoring defense (27.2) ... Nine players were named to the all-conference teams; senior DE Brock Hekking (2nd), junior DE Ian Seau (2nd), senior C Matt Galas (2nd), sophomore TE Jarred Gipson (2nd), sophomore P Alex Boy (2nd), senior QB Cody Fajardo (HM), senior LB Jonathan McNeal (HM), senior CB Charles Garrett (HM) and junior DL Rykeem Yates (HM).

RETURNING PLAYERS

The Wolf Pack returns 33 letter winners and 13 starters from last year's campaign, with starter being defined as a player who started in at least five games.

RETURNING COACHES

The Wolf Pack returns the entirety of its coaching staff from last season as Brian Polian enters year three of his tenure at Nevada. The Wolf Pack added a pair of graduate assistant coaches in Brad Rogers and Makana Garrigan.

WOLF PACK RADIO COVERS THE SILVER STATE

The Wolf Pack Radio Network has added additional affiliates throughout the state and expanded its football pre-game show to 90 minutes this season. The show will break down the day's game, featuring interviews with Polian, Wolf Pack players and analysis of the Wolf Pack's opponents. RENO, Nev. - The Nevada football team opened its 2015 season with three consecutive touchdown drives en route to a 31-17 victory over UC Davis on Thursday night at Mackay Stadium. The Wolf Pack (1-0) used a 232-89 advantage in rushing yards to race past the Aggies (0-1) in front of 21,483 fans at Mackay.

Senior RB Don Jackson rushed for a game-high 124 yards - his fifth career 100-yard rushing effort - and junior QB Tyler Stewart completed nine of his first 10 passes before finishing with 206 yards of total offense and two touchdowns.

How It Happened: The Aggies received the opening kickoff and went on a 10-play drive that took 6:15 off the clock before stalling on a failed fourth down conversion. After a lengthy UC Davis drive to open the game, it was all Nevada for the remainder of the half.

The Wolf Pack offense started with three consecutive drives that went at least nine plays and 75 yards, as each ended in the endzone. It marked the first time since the 2010 season opener against Eastern Washington that Nevada opened a game with three straight touchdowns. Nevada also opened a 20-0 lead in the 2013 meeting with UC Davis.

Stewart marched Nevada down the field with a 75-yard touchdown drive in the team's offensive debut. Jackson punched the ball in

from the one-yard line to open a 7-0 lead. Nevada's next drive went 80 yards and was also capped by a Jackson run, this time from seven yards out. The Wolf Pack went up 21-0 on a two-yard touchdown pass from Stewart to junior TE Jarred Gipson.

The Aggies scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to tighten the score, but Nevada remained in control throughout the contest.

Player of the Game: Don Jackson only got the rock 13 times, but he put on a show when he had the ball, rushing for 124 yards on 9.5 yards per carry. Jackson scored early touchdown runs from one and seven yards out to help Nevada get in an early rhythm.

Jackson's effort led to his fifth career 100-yard rushing effort and his third-career multi-touchdown game.

Play of the Game: On 1st-and-goal from the seven-yard line, Jackson took a hand-off from Stewart in the shotgun and bounced over the right tackle. The Sacramento native appeared to run out of real estate on the sideline before shaking off two tackles and diving past the pylon on his second effort. The rushing touchdown gave Nevada a 14-0 lead with 11:47 left in the second quarter.

RENO, Nev. – Nevada had reason for optimism after recovering a fumble late in the second quarter and pulling within 21-13 at half-time against Arizona with a field goal as time expired.

The 20th-ranked Wildcats hit the boosters in the second half to quell Nevada's optimism. The Wolf Pack (1-1) fell by a 44-20 margin to Arizona (2-0) – who is ranked 20th in the Coaches' Poll and 22nd in the AP Poll – after being outscored 23-7 in the second half Saturday afternoon. Nevada suffered its first loss of the season in front of 24,355 fans at a whiteout Mackay Stadium.

Junior QB Tyler Stewart completed a career-high 18 passes with a pair of touchdown strikes and junior RB Don Jackson tallied 91 yards on 24 carries.

How It Happened: The Wildcats got off to a hot start, scoring twice in the game's opening six minutes to take an early 14-0 lead. Nevada settled for a field goal in the first quarter after having a touchdown called back on a penalty.

The Pack then pulled within 14-10 with 9:14 left in the second quarter as Stewart hit junior WR Jerico Richardson for a five-yard touchdown pass to cap a season-long 14-play drive. Arizona expanded its lead to 21-10 and then drove the ball to midfield on its next drive.

Senior DE Lenny Jones recovered a fumble – his fourth career fumble recovery – with 1:10 left in the half. Junior kicker Alex Boy split the uprights from 41-yards out as time expired, pulling Nevada to 21-13 at halftime. It was all Arizona from there on out, as the Wildcats used a 23-7 edge in scoring and a 320-127 advantage in total yards in the second half to race past Nevada.

Player of the Game: It's usually not a positive sign if a team's standout player is its punter, and that was the case for Nevada tonight. Junior Alex Boy set three career-bests and punted eight times for a 47.0 average. Boy – who was a consensus preseason All-Mountain West selection – set career-bests in longest punt (63), total punt yards (376) and 50+ yard punts (3). He also downed two punts inside the 20-yard line.

Play of the Game: With Arizona threatening to expand on its 21-10 lead late in the second quarter, the Wolf Pack defense had its backs against the wall. Nevada responded by forcing its first turnover of the season with just over a minute left in the half, setting up a Zuzo field goal as time expired. The Wildcat's Nick Wilson ran for a first down on 3rd-and-1, but senior LB Jordan Dobrich stripped the ball loose on the tackle. The ball bounced around before senior DE Lenny Jones fell on it for his fourth-career fumble recovery.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas – The Nevada football team showed plenty of heart and played an improved game from week two to week three before falling, 44-27, to 17th-ranked Texas A&M on Sept. 19 at Kyle Field.

The Wolf Pack was playing its first SEC opponent in program history and was also playing in front of the largest crowd it has ever been a part with 102,591 people at Kyle Field. Nevada represented itself well and can take positives from its performance after playing the Aggies tough for four quarters.

Sophomore RB James Butler broke the 100-yard rushing barrier for the second time in his career and junior QB Tyler Stewart passed for a career-high 206 yards. Despite some solid drives on both sides of the ball for Nevada, Texas A&M's 535 total yards and 44 points were too much to overcome on a sunny, muggy day in College Station.

How It Happened: Senior RB Don Jackson ran for a 31-yard TD on fourth down to tie the game at 7-7 early in the first quarter. Junior PK Brent Zuzo added a 27-yard field goal in the second half as Nevada went into the locker room trailing, 24-10.

Nevada played the Aggies close in the second half, as Texas A&M out-scored Nevada by just a 20-17 margin in the final two quar-

ters. Junior QB Tyler Stewart tossed a 27-yard TD pass to junior WR Hasaan Henderon and a nine-yard TD pass to senior RB Don Jackson

Texas A&M outgained Nevada by a 535-359 margin while Kyle Allen's four touchdown passes and Tra Carson's 137 yards rushing led the Aggies to the victory.

Play of the Game: Stewart and Henderson left no doubt about Nevada's play of the game. On second down from 27 yards out in the third quarter, Stewart lobbed a well-paced pass to the corner of the end zone. Henderson – on the fade route – leaned back and came up with a one-armed, back shoulder catch while he was falling down and being held by his defender near the corner pylon.

Player of the Game: Perhaps more-so than any Wolf Pack player, Hasaan Henderson looked at home against SEC competition. The 6-foot-5 wideout caught five passes for 69 yards and a score, while also forcing four pass interference/defensive holding penalties. Henderson was a threat throughout the contest.

BUFFALO, N.Y. – James Butler rushed for a career-high 177 yards and Dameon Baber recorded two interceptions in his first collegiate game, leading Nevada (2-2) to a 24-21 victory over Buffalo (2-2) on Sept. 26 at UB Stadium.

Baber's second interception of the game came with just 80 seconds left in the fourth quarter as Buffalo was driving into midfield, clinching a nail-biting victory in front of 19,072 fans. Nevada used a dominant ground attack to rush past the Bulls, racking up a season-high 289 yards on the ground. Butler ran for 177 yards on just 16 carries while senior RB Don Jackson posted 113 yards on 17 carries.

How It Happened: Both team's punted on their opening drive before Buffalo got on the board first. The Wolf Pack was able to turn the tide later in the first half on a pair of huge runs from its star running backs. Nevada's third drive started on its own four-yard line before sophomore Butler broke free for a 91-yard rush – the longest non-scoring run in Wolf Pack history. Butler found pay dirt one play later, tying the game on a five-yard rush. Jackson ran right through the heart of the defense on the next drive to score from 55 yards out and put Nevada in front, 14-7.

Both teams traded field goals as Buffalo's Adam Mitcheson connected from 33 yards and Nevada's Brent Zuzo split the uprights

from 38 yards. The second half turned into a defensive stalemate as Nevada was held scoreless in the third quarter while Mitcheson hit a career-long 43-yard field goal to pull Buffalo within 17-13. Baber's first interception of the game – which he picked off in the end zone – set up a 12-play, 80-yard scoring drive that proved to be vital for the Pack. Jackson scored from 10 yards out for his second touchdown of the game, putting Nevada ahead, 24-13 with 10:25 left in the game. Buffalo pulled within a field goal of Nevada with a 75-yard touchdown drive in just over two minutes. Licata's five-yard touchdown rush and two point conversion made it 24-21 with 8:06 left in the game. Alex Bertrando recovered a fumble and Baber tallied another interception to preserve Nevada's win.

Player of the Game: What a way to make an entrance. In his first collegiate game, true freshman Dameon Baber started at free safety for the Wolf Pack and made two of the biggest plays of the game with key interceptions. Baber also reached double figures in tackles, posting 10 on the day.

Play of the Game: Midway through the first quarter, Buffalo downed a punt at Nevada's own four-yard line. On the first play of the drive, the Union paved a hole for Butler and the sophomore running back sprinted 91 yards to the Bulls' five-yard line. It was Nevada's third longest rush in program history.

RENO, Nev. – Tyler Stewart's pass on 4th-and-10 from the UNLV 47-yard line fell incomplete with just 35 seconds left in the game, and with that, Nevada suffered a 23-17 upset to its rivals UNLV on Saturday in the Battle for the Fremont Cannon.

The Wolf Pack (2-3, 0-1) scored a pair of touchdowns in the fourth quarter but couldn't overcome a slow start against the Rebels (2-3, 0-1) in front of 29,551 fans at Mackay Stadium – the ninth-largest crowd in the stadium's history. Nevada suffered just its second loss to UNLV in the past 11 meetings between the two programs.

Stewart passed for 202 yards and a score and ran for a career-high 61 yards while junior WR Jerico Richardson set season-highs with eight receptions and 87 yards. On the defensive side, senior LB Matthew Lyons posted a game-high 12 tackles while freshman FS Dameon Baber tallied his third interception in the past two games.

How It Happened: The 41st edition of the Battle for the Fremont Cannon got off to a rough start for Nevada as the Wolf Pack was shutout in the first half for the first time since Dec. 1, 2012. UNLV's Keith Whitley scored on a 37-yard touchdown run in the first half and the Rebels took a 13-0 lead into the locker room on a 12-yard touchdown rush by Kurt Palandech just before half.

Junior PK Brent Zuzo split the uprights from 27-yards out in the third quarter and Nevada later pulled with three points (13-10) with 10:47 left in the fourth quarter on Stewart's 22-yard touchdown pass to Richardson. UNLV quickly reclaimed momentum though with a game-clinching play as junior LB Ryan McAleenan intercepted a Stewart pass on 2nd-and-6 and ran 52 yards to paydirt, putting the Rebels ahead 20-10 with 8:27 left in the game.

The Wolf Pack refused to go down without a fight and drove nine plays and 75 yards on the ensuing possession to pull within 20-17. Stewart went 4-of-4 on the drive for 49 yards before senior RB Don Jackson tallied a one-yard touchdown run – his sixth of the season.

Player of the Game: A pair of seniors on the defensive side led the Wolf Pack on Saturday night. Senior LB Matthew Lyons was all over the place and was Nevada's most-frequent tackler, posting a gamehigh 12 tackles. Senior DE Lenny Jones also came up clutch, posting four tackles, 2.0 sacks and one pass breakup.

Play of the Game: The Wolf Pack drove to UNLV's 22-yard line with just under 11 minutes in the game facing a 13-3 deficit. On 1st-and-10, Stewart found junior WR Jerico Richardson on a middle post route for a 22-yard touchdown reception.
