RECEIVING VOTES

Three Mountain West teams are receiving votes in both national top 25 polls (AP Top 25 and Amway Coaches' Poll), led by San Diego State. The Aztecs currently sit at No. 28 in the AP Top 25 and No. 29 in the Amway Coaches' Poll.

Also receiving votes is Fresno State and Utah State. All three teams have compiled 5-1 records to open the season.

BOWL ELIGIBILITY

Four Mountain West teams can become bowl eligible with a victory in Week 8:

- Fresno State A win at New Mexico on Saturday would make the Bulldogs bowl eligible for the second consecutive year.
- Hawai'i With a victory against Nevada on Saturday would make the Rainbow Warriors bowl eligible for the first time since 2016.
- San Diego State A win against San José State would give the Aztecs bowl eligibility for the ninth consecutive year, including the eighth time under head coach Rocky Long.
- Utah State A victory over Wyoming in the Bridger's Battle contest would give the Aggies bowl eligibility for the second consecutive season and the fifth time under head coach **Matt Wells**.

MOVING UP THE CHARTS

HAWAI'I BRINGS BACK THE RUN-N-SHOOT OFFENSE

This season, Hawai'i brought back the Run-N-Shoot offense, a style they used from 1999-2011. Below are some of the Rainbow Warrior's offensive highlights:

- In the season opener at Colorado State, UH threw for 418 yards and rushed for another 199 yards. The 617 yards of total offense is the Rainbow Warriors' highest output in a single-game since Nov. 23, 2013 (624 yards at Wyoming).
- In the Conference-opener against the Rams, sophomore QB Cole McDonald set a program record for passing yards (418) in a starting debut. The record was previously held by now-head coach Nick Rolovich, who threw for 367 yards vs. Portland State in 2001.
- In a home-opening victory against Navy, McDonald threw for 428 yards and six touchdowns. He is the first Mountain West QB to throw for 400 yards in backto-back games since Colorado State's Garrett Grayson in September of 2014.
- Hawai'i ranks 15th nationally in passing offense (322.3 yards per game).
- The Rainbow Warriors are off to their best eight-game start (6-2) since 2007, when they went 12-0 in the regular season and earned a spot in the Sugar Bowl.

UTAH STATE'S HOT START

Utah State is off to its first 5-1 start since 1978 and are looking for its first 3-0 start in league play since 2013. The Aggies have opened the season with a 6-1 overall record since 1974.

A large part of the Aggies' success has been the offense. Utah State is one of just two FBS teams averaging more than 50 points per game. The Aggies, who rank second nationally in scoring offense (51.7), have scored at least 50 points in three games this season.

The Mountain West record for points in a season is 608 by BYU in 2001. Utah State is sitting at 310 points scored through six games.

WINNING STREAKS

San Diego State and Utah State are both riding five-game win streaks heading into Week 8. The Aztecs dropped their season opener on the road at nationally-ranked Stanford, while the Aggies lost in Week 1 at nationally-ranked Michigan State.

The five-game win streak is the 11th-longest active streak nationally. Meanwhile, the Aztecs have won six consecutive MW games, which ranks as the seventh-longest active FBS streak.

The Aggies haven't won six straight games since 2012.

NOT JUST A FLASH IN THE PAN

Below are a couple notes about Mountain West teams with continued success:

- On Saturday, Sept. 8, the Mountain West won three games against the Pac-12 (Nevada beat Oregon State, Fresno State over UCLA and San Diego State defeated Arizona State) in the same weekend for the first time since September of 2008.
- The Mountain West has won four consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy, Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).
- In the last three seasons, San Diego State has racked up 37 victories, which is the most among the Group of 5 and sixth-best nationally, trailing only Alabama (48), Clemson (46), Ohio State (42), Oklahoma (39) and Wisconsin (38).
- Head coach Rocky Long has led the Aztecs to a bowl game in his first seven seasons. Long is the all-time winningest head coach in Mountain West history (134-99).
- Boise State has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West. Since 2010, BSU has compiled a 12-9 (.571) record against current Autonomous 5 programs. The Broncos have defeated Arizona, Arizona State, Georgia, Oregon, Oregon State, Utah, Virginia, Washington and Washington State.
- Boise State has been nationally-ranked for at least one week for the 17th consecutive season.
- Boise State has made 16 consecutive postseason appearances, the longest streak among Group of 5 institutions and sixth-best nationally.
- Over the last 14 seasons, the Mountain West owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences (.560), trailing only the SEC (.628).

MOUNTAIN WEST'S 20TH FOOTBALL SEASON

Led by the vision of then-Colorado State President Dr. Albert Yates, the Mountain West was formed when presidents of eight institutions - Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming - decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference.

Mountain West football began its 20th season last Saturday as Hawai'i defeated Colorado State, 43-34. The Rams, who are an original member of the MW, played in the first-ever Conference game on Sept. 16, 1999 as BYU hosted CSU.

During the 2018 college football season, through a partnership with Stadium, the Mountain West will have seven games air exclusively on Facebook, a social media platform with more than 1.3 billion daily active users.

Utah State will be featured on Facebook on five occasions, while Air Force and Fresno State, which was predicted to win the MW West Division, will also have nonconference games broadcast by the social media platform. FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

Host Determination: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the divisional champion with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. The host site will be determined no later than the Sunday following the conclusion of the regular season.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

1. Head-to-head result between the tied divisional champions.

2. If still tied:

If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings will be used; $-\Omega R$ -

If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season; -OR-

If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used; -OR-

If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.

3. If still tied, the best record against common Conference opponents.

4. If still tied, the team with the highest overall winning percentage (Conference and non-conference excluding exempt games).

5. If still tied, a coin toss will be conducted by the Commissioner.

The 2018 Mountain West Football Championship game will be played on Saturday, December 1. The contest will be played at the home stadium of the regular season Mountain West divisional champion with the highest win percentage in Conference games only. ABC, ESPN or ESPN2 will broadcast the matchup.
