MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

NATIONALLY RANKED

Utah State and Fresno State cracked the *Associated Press* Top 25 and Amway Coaches' Poll after opening the season with 7-1 records.

The Aggies are ranked No. 18 in the AP Top 25 and No. 20 in the Amway Coaches' Poll. This is the first time since 2012 that Utah State has been ranked and only the fourth team to be ranked in program history.

Fresno State is No. 20 in the AP Top 25 and No. 23 in the Amway Coaches' Poll. This is the second consecutive season the Bulldogs have been nationally-ranked (No. 25 on Nov. 26 AP Top 25).

San Diego State, which has compiled a 6-2 record to open the season, is receiving votes in both national polls, while Boise State (6-2) is receiving votes in the Amway Coaches' Poll.

BOWL ELIGIBILITY

Boise State, Fresno State, San Diego State and Utah State are eligible for the postseason after reaching the six-win mark. Boise State is bowl-eligible for the 17th consecutive season, which is the longest streak among the Group of 5. Fresno State is bowl-eligible for the second consecutive year under head coach **Jeff Tedford**. San Diego State is bowl eligible for the ninth consecutive season, while Utah State has earned postseason eligibility for the fifth time under head coach **Matt Wells**.

Hawai'i, which hosts Mountain Division leader Utah State on Nov. 3, can become bowl-eligible with a victory in Week 10. The Rainbow Warriors haven't played in the postseason since 2016.

MOVING UP THE CHARTS

UTAH STATE'S HOT START

Utah State is off to its first 7-1 start since 1965 and are 4-0 in Mountain West play for the first time since 2013. The Aggies are currently riding a seven-game win streak, which leads the league and is tied as the fifth-longest active streak nationally.

Utah State travels to Hawai'i on Saturday, Nov. 3 (6 p.m. HT on Spectrum Sports and Stadium apps), looking for its first eight-game win streak since 1960 (nine).

Utah State has scored at least 40 points in six of its seven victories, scoring 60-plus points on three occasions. The Aggies rank third nationally in scoring offense, averaging 49.4 points per contest. The Mountain West record for total points in a season is 608 by BYU in 2001. Utah State is sitting at 395 points scored through eight games.

RECEIVING DUOS

Hawai'i wide receivers **John Ursua** and **Cedric Byrd** have combined for 22 receiving touchdowns this season, a figure that leads the nation. Ursua leads all FBS players with 14 receiving touchdowns, while Byrd is tied for ninth nationally with eight. Boise State's duo of **A.J. Richardson** (seven) and **John Hightower** (six) are tied for the 10th-highest total nationally.

NOT JUST A FLASH IN THE PAN

Below are a couple notes about Mountain West teams with continued success:

- On Saturday, Sept. 8, the Mountain West won three games against the Pac-12 (Nevada beat Oregon State, Fresno State over UCLA and San Diego State defeated Arizona State) in the same weekend for the first time since September of 2008.
- The Mountain West has won four consecutive games against an opponent from the American Athletic Conference (Boise State over UConn, Hawai'i over Navy, Fresno State over Houston and Air Force over Navy).
- In the last three seasons, San Diego State has racked up 38 victories, which is the most among the Group of 5 and sixth-best nationally, trailing only Alabama (49), Clemson (48), Ohio State (42), Oklahoma (41) and Wisconsin (39).
- Head coach Rocky Long has led the Aztecs to a bowl game in his first seven seasons. Long is the all-time winningest head coach in Mountain West history (135-100).
- Boise State has defeated an Autonomous 5 institution in six of seven seasons since joining the Mountain West. Since 2010, BSU has compiled a 12-9 (.571) record against current Autonomous 5 programs. The Broncos have defeated Arizona, Arizona State, Georgia, Oregon, Oregon State, Utah, Virginia, Washington and Washington State.
- Boise State has been nationally-ranked for at least one week for the 17th consecutive season.
- Boise State has made 16 consecutive postseason appearances, the longest streak among Group of 5 institutions and sixth-best nationally.
- Over the last 14 seasons, the Mountain West owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences (.560), trailing only the SEC (.628).

MOUNTAIN WEST'S 20TH FOOTBALL SEASON

Led by the vision of then-Colorado State President Dr. Albert Yates, the Mountain West was formed when presidents of eight institutions - Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming - decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference.

Mountain West football began its 20th season last Saturday as Hawai'i defeated Colorado State, 43-34. The Rams, who are an original member of the MW, played in the first-ever Conference game on Sept. 16, 1999 as BYU hosted CSU.

- .@USUFootball is ranked No. 18 in the @AP_Top25 & No. 20 in the Amway Coaches' Poll, while @FresnoStateFB is No. 20 & No. 23, respectively.
- .@BroncoSportsFB, @FresnoStateFB, @USUFootball & @SDSUFootball are all bowl-eligible. The @MountainWest has sent at least five teams to the postseason in 11 consecutive years.
- .@HawaiiFootball can become bowl-eligible with a victory in Week 10 against Utah State.
- Earlier this season, @AFFootball head coach Troy Calhoun became one of just two head coaches to win 50 Mountain West games, joining @SDSUFootball's Rocky Long.
